

Negro Is Appointed Special Assistant By President-Elect

By GARNETT D. HORNER Star Staff Writer

NEW YORK - President-elect Richard M. Nixon's search for a Democrat to be U.S. representative to the United Nations in his administration has turned to Sargent Shriver, who is considering taking the position, informed sources said today.

Shriver, a brother-in-law of the late President Kennedy and current U.S. ambassador to France, met with Nixon for nearly two hours here Sunday; evening and consulted members of the Kennedy family in Washington and elsewhere yesterday.

A source indicated that Shriver was having difficulty making up his mind whether or not to accept Nixon's offer and that he returned to Paris yesterday without having reached a decision on taking the U.N. post.

On his arrival in Paris, Shriver was asked about the U.N. post. He said that any report on what he and Nixon discussed would have to come from Nixon.

Meanwhile, it was learned that Nixon was preparing to announce one or more major staff appointments today. There was appointments today. There was no official indication who would be involved of There was some special arrival and the position of the position

Other speculation centered on Daniel P. Moynihan, director of the Harvard-MIT Center for Urban Studies and a former assistant secretary of labor under President Kennedy, as a possible assistant to the president to coordinate urban affairs in the Nixon administration.

Yesterday, Nixon named the first Negro to his White House staff. Robert J. Brown, head of a North Carolina public relations firm and a leader in the civil rights organizations, was named to be a special assistant to the president with "general duties."

The appointment of William

Safire, who has headed his own New York public relations firm since 1960, as another special assistant to the president also was announced last night by Ronald L. Ziegler, Nixon's press assistant.

The U.N. representative job in his administration was first offered by Nixon to Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey, a few days after the Nov. 5 election in which Nixon defeated Humphrey, the Democratic candidate.

Among others, Shriver conferred with Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., in Washington vesterday. The senator was flying to Boston this morning and could not be resched for comment.

Other sources reported, however, that Shriver was consulting Sen. Kennedy and other members of the Kennedy family about the possibility of accepting the Nixon Job offer.

President-elect Nixon has named William Safire, aged 38, of New York as a Special Assistant who will be a speech writer and work on "policy and program development." (U.S. News and World Report, 12-23-68)

According to Bureau files in 1965 William Lewis Safire was president of a public relations organization known as Safire Public Relations, Incorporated, 375 Park Avenue, New York, New York. He was born on December 7, 1929, at New York City. He participated in the 1959 American National Exhibition in Russia as a member of Tex-McCrary, Incorporated, New York City. He was vice president of this public relations firm which was headed by the well-known John Regan ("Tex") McCrary.

While Safire was connected with Tex-McCrary, Incorporated that organization was involved in several Registration Act investigations involving the Dominican Republic which were conducted by the Bureau. The July 12, 1958, issue of "Editor and Publisher" alleges that Safire, a vice president of McCrary's office, was involved in exposing the use of microphones in a Washington, D. C., hotel by reporter Jack Anderson, associate, and others. This was a well-publicized side issue to the appearance of Bernard Goldfine, Boston textile millionaire, before the Special House Subcommittee on Legislative Oversight. According to the above article. Safire's assignment was to track down and catch committee investigators suspected of "bugging" the hotel rooms of Goldfine and those of McCrary's organization. (105-77346-251)



The Book Review Digest for October, 1968, described the book "The New Language of Politics" as an anecdotal dictionary of catch words, slogans and phrases-political usage.

The Book Review Digest for 1964 reveals SAFIRE was co-author of a book entitled "Plunging Into Politics." This book explains how to become or support a candidate on the national, state or local level. It also gives advice on how to build a campaign, staff it with willing hands and finance it with contributions.

Additional references at the Library of Congress reflect he was the author of two additional articles entitled "The Relations Explosion" and "Public Relations Publicity" these articles concern the public relations field.

The following investigation was conducted by IC b6 b7C on January 10, 1969.

The files of the Evening Star Newspaper, Washington, D. C., contains a newspaper clipping, dated December 10, 1968, which furnishes information relative to the appointment of WILLIAM LEWIS SAFIRE as a Special Assistant to President elect NIXON and that he was a special assistant during the election campaign.

It further revealed SAFIRE is an author who has headed his own New York public relations firm since 1966. His latest book "The New Language of Politics," which was published in 1968 was mentioned.

On January 14, 1969, SA WILLIAM E. TRAINOR, JR., caused a search to be made of the Library of the "Washington Daily News" and no additional information was located therein other than that set forth above from "The Evening Star."





The Harris Committee invesigation of influence in government turned into a multi-ring performance that slipped so far out of control that the probers were forced into an all-day session to pick up the pieces. Washington police and the FBI came into the case. Goldfine was excused from testifying on the appointed day. The Boston millionaire and free-spender pleaded that he was too tired and excited to do so: he had reason to be because he had been up most of the night, expressing his indignation. When last photographed in the early hours of Monday morning he hadn't had time to change from his goldthreaded robe and pajamas into a testifying suit.

Newsmen in the Cast

Newsmen functioned as "extras" in the production that saw the Capital rivaling Hollywood with all the trappings, the cast, and the scenarios to produce a full season's fare of mystery, intrigue, and comedy. The rapidly shifting panaroma picked up a newspaper reporter and a House committee investigator in the act of "bugging" a room occupied by Goldfine's new public relations counsel.

Jack Lotto, former newspaperman employed by Goldfine, succeeded Tex McCrary, New York public relations man who put the show on the road with Goldfine's prepared statement to the committee. Then McCrary retired, explaining he had been performing an act of friendship for Goldfine's attorney, Roger Robb, and was not on the pay-

Midnight Call

Lotto began earning his retainer soon after reaching Washington. Sunday night he called newsmen, summoning them for a 12:30 a.m. press conference. Upon arrival they were told by Lotto and Attorney Robb that a former Washington policeman, Lloyd B. Furr, had undertaken to discover whether Lotto's room was "bugged" by hostile interests.

From that point on, the drama unfolded without hitch: Furr solemnly announced that the room was, indeed, "bugged." Then another member of the party noted that the door leading to the next space was raised an inch off the floor, and that a man's shoes could be observed pacing the floor. This was Furr's cue to grab a handy wire coat hanger, sprawl on the floor and begin fishing under the door. With a jerk, he pulled the small microphone into Lotto's room, whereupon Bea Duprey, a model who carries the title of Gold-fine's "press receptionist," made her entry, glanced at the microphone, and emitted a dramatic self as "a former ace reporter" scream.

With the help of an assistant manager, he gained admission and with the troupe of reporters and camera men taking up the rear he confronted Shacklette and Anderson. Police eventually arrived, responsive to calls from one of Lotto's entourage. They patiently explained there was no criminal law violation, hence no police action was indicated.

Next Set

Goldfine came to the door and, glancing at a piece of paper, proclaimed his indignation, saying: "This is worse than Russia and worse than the Gestapo. I'm shocked beyond words. I intend to move out of the hotel in the morning."

The next installment came when Miss Mildred Paperman, Goldfine's secretary, reported her room had been rifled over the week-end in her absence from Washington and that papers her boss intended to present to the Harris Committee in response to its demand, were missing. An 11:30 a.m. press conference was called to announce this development. Miss Paperman knelt and opened bags and bundles obligingly while camera shutters clicked.

A reporter suggested Goldfine might be happy to get rid of some of the papers and Lotto replied heatedly: "I'm not even going to answer that!"

"Thank you, Mr. Hagerty," the reporter quipped.

The police returned with fingerprint experts and detectives who promptly went into their official routine. Since papers destined to a Congressional committee were said to be involved. the FBI also sent men.

Lotto's 'Credentials'

"I guess he knew me mostly from my jobs as an investigative reporter," Lotto, who is 37, reasoned.

Better to acquaint the press with him, Lotto distributed reprints from the Dec. 22, 1956 edition of EDITOR & PUBLISHER in which his exploits, some of them resulting in journalism prizes, were detailed.

One of the incidents in which he expressed pride was participation in "bugging" a room oc-cupied by Richard M. Nixon, then a U.S. Senator. Nixon had brought together for face-toface confrontation, Whittaker Chambers and Alger Hiss. A hearing aid pressed against the closed door with the instruments volume tuned up, turned that trick, Lotto related.

The activities of Lotto and others in behalf of the Goldfine story prompted the House committee to competitive action. It engaged Raymond William Martin, 25, as an administrative assistant to answer press inquiries. Martin's background consists of studies at the Henry W. Grady School of Journalism and work for small Georgia newspapers and as a staff member in the office of Rep. John J. Flynt of Georgia.

The McCrary Story

John Reagan "Tex" McCrary, chairman of Tex McCrary, Inc., public relations, entered the Goldfine case as "a favor to a friend," he told E&P this week.

After setting strategy he considers successful, Mr. McCrary and Jerry Finkelstein, the PR firm's president, arranged for hiring two men to carry on, and the McCrary organization pulled out to return to the business of handling fee-paying clients. A fee offered by Goldfine's staff was declined.

"I have no regrets," Mr. Mc-Crary said of the episode that put his name on front pages. But he did ask to have emphasized that politics was not involved in his own or firm's entry into the bizarre affairs of the Boston textile man, his gifts to Sherman Adams, assistant to President Eisenhower, and others in politics.

"I am a life-long Republican," he said. "Mr. Finkelstein is a life-long Democrat.

Aims to Tell Whole Truth

"I feel strongly that no American likes a lynching, Mr. Goldfine's or anybody else's. The telling of the whole truth through the press was a restraining influence on a House committee that badly needed public relations counsel and which has finally hired a young man who today has the toughest job in the country."

The last reference was to Raymond William Martin, 25, hired by the Harris Committee.

"You have nothing to fear if you tell the whole truth to the press, because the press is ultimately fair," Mr. McCrary continued. "As professionals, we tried to tell the truth directly to the press, the public, and the committee, and in that order."

Mr. McCrary personally knows Roger Robb, Washington attorney, and member of Mr. Goldfine's legal staff. On June 26, Mr. Robb asked "Tex" for the loan of a man to help him on the case. William Safire, vicepresident of the McCrary office, was sent to Boston to dig up biographical material on Mr. Goldfine. From there he Republic Aviation Corp. went to Washington to be joined by another staff man, George Britt, formerly of the New York World-Telegram & Sun. There, with Mr. McCrary, the strategy was set: (1) to keep the Harris committee off balance by careful timing of releases of filmed statements and testimony to pull the punch out of committeeplanned headlines; (2) to stress the immigrant-boy-who-madegood theme by setting up personal interviews between Mr. Goldfine and top newsmen; (3) to track down and catch committee investigators suspected of "bugging" Goldfine and Mc-Crary rooms in hotels.

Counter-Intelligence

On July 2, Mr. Safire and Mr. Britt, with an attorney and news Photographer, began the

On Saturday the McCrary staff men had withdrawn to New York, after arranging for Mr. Robb to engage Jack Lotto, who once had worked for Mr. Finkelstein on the Civil Service Leader of New York, and Philip Brennan, an independent Washington PR counsel.

Mr. McCrary, a former newsman and editor, said he liked working with newspaper men. He related how he and Merriman Smith, United Press International, broke the story on Mr. Goldfine's tax deductible gifts on Wednesday, July 2. Mr. Mc-Crary and Mr. Robb had interviewed Mr. Goldfine. When they came out of his room, Mr. Smith was waiting. From Mr. Robb's notes, Mr. Smith composed a statement while Mr. McCrary typed. As soon as the typing was finished, Mr. Smith took one copy, Mr. McCrary the carbon. At 7:18 P.M. they both reached for telephones. Mr. Smith dictated his copy to UPI, Mr. Mc-Crary to Associated Press.

Mr. McCrary began his career as copy boy for the old New York World-Telegram. Prior to World War II he was for six years editorial chief of the New York Mirror.

McCrary clients include Continental Baking Co., Cenco Instrument Co., New Haven Railroad, Waterman Pen, Fifth Avenue Coach Co., Continental Industries, U. S. 

BUCHANAN has the highest respect for SAFIRE and considers him a very intelligent, capable, competent person who is completely dedicated to his position and the President. The appointee is an honorable, honest, trustworthy person whose personal habits are above reproach. SAFIRE is a devoted family man. BUCHANAN considers the appointee a loyal American citizen and favorably recommends him.
