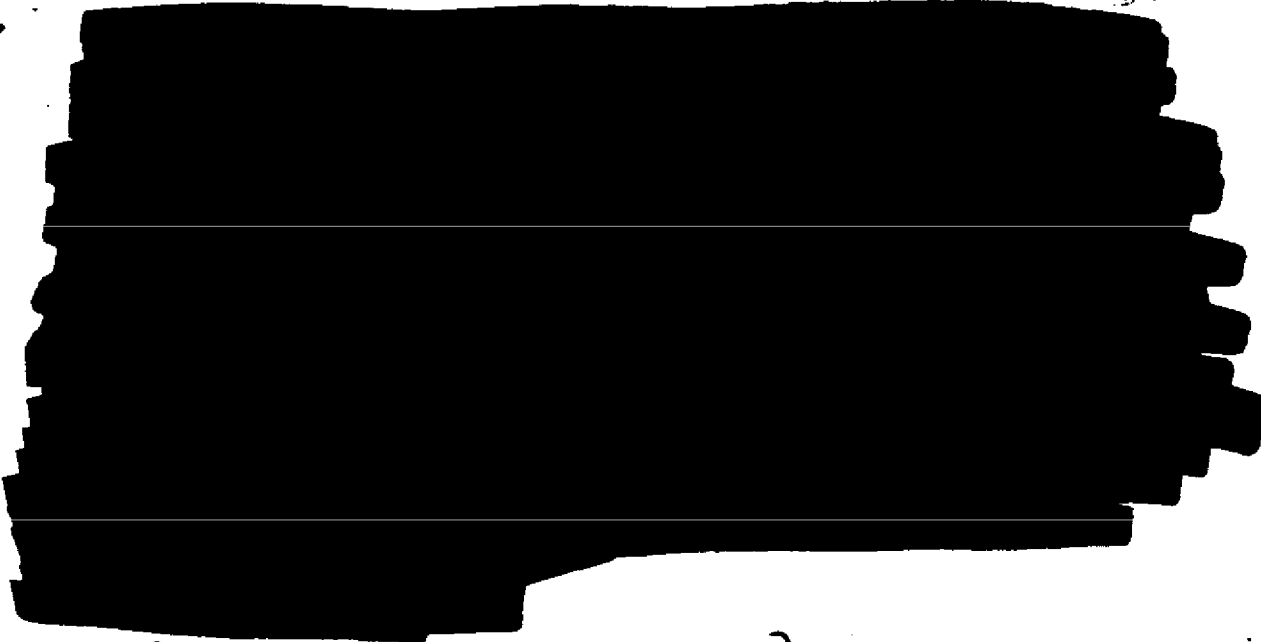

activity took place at the Kent Commune on 4/13/71:

At 2:15 pm, HOWIE EMMER contacted 1-212-228-5626
and a female indicates it is ABBIE's residence. EMMER
identifies himself as HOWIE from Kent and wants to speak
to ABBIE, but the girl does not know if he is there. ABBIE
is not there and EMMER indicates he has contacted ABBIE's
residence several times, but has not heard from ABBIE.

At 4:36 pm, ABBIE (HOFFMAN) contacts the Kent
Commune for HOWIE (EMMER), but he is not there. ABBIE
indicates that he knows what HOWIE contacted him for,
namely, to come to Kent for 5/4/71 (anniversary of the
shooting of the Kent students last year) and the girl who
answered says - yes.

ABBIE indicates he could say he was coming to
Kent, but the chances are real slim. First of all, he is
involved in a heavy legal struggle in order to keep his
bail from being revoked because he went to Ireland. This
is to be decided within the week and this is the first hurdle
ABBIE has. The second is that ABBIE has to speak in Iowa
the night before (5/3/71) so if HOWIE wants to put him on the
program for the 5/4/71 Kent activities, that is OK and

ABBIE will try to get there, but he is not going to guarantee it. In other words, do not base the whole program on ABBIE coming to Kent, but he will really try to get there. That is all he can promise. ABBIE adds that things do not look good because of his bail problems and other commitments he has made.

ABBIE does not know what is going to happen in Washington during the May Day Activities, but he will be there on the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd and they might be in jail, you know what I mean. May 4th is a very tough date but he will try to get there.

The unknown female asks ABBIE what happened to the tape they sent him and he indicates it was not good quality, there was too much giggling and it should have been done in a studio with an engineer so it would be done professionally. ABBIE did not think their tape was used.

ABBIE asks if they got the book he sent them and the girl indicates they did this morning with everyone being very excited about it.

ABBIE ends by indicating that both he and ANITA (ph) hope they can come out to Kent.

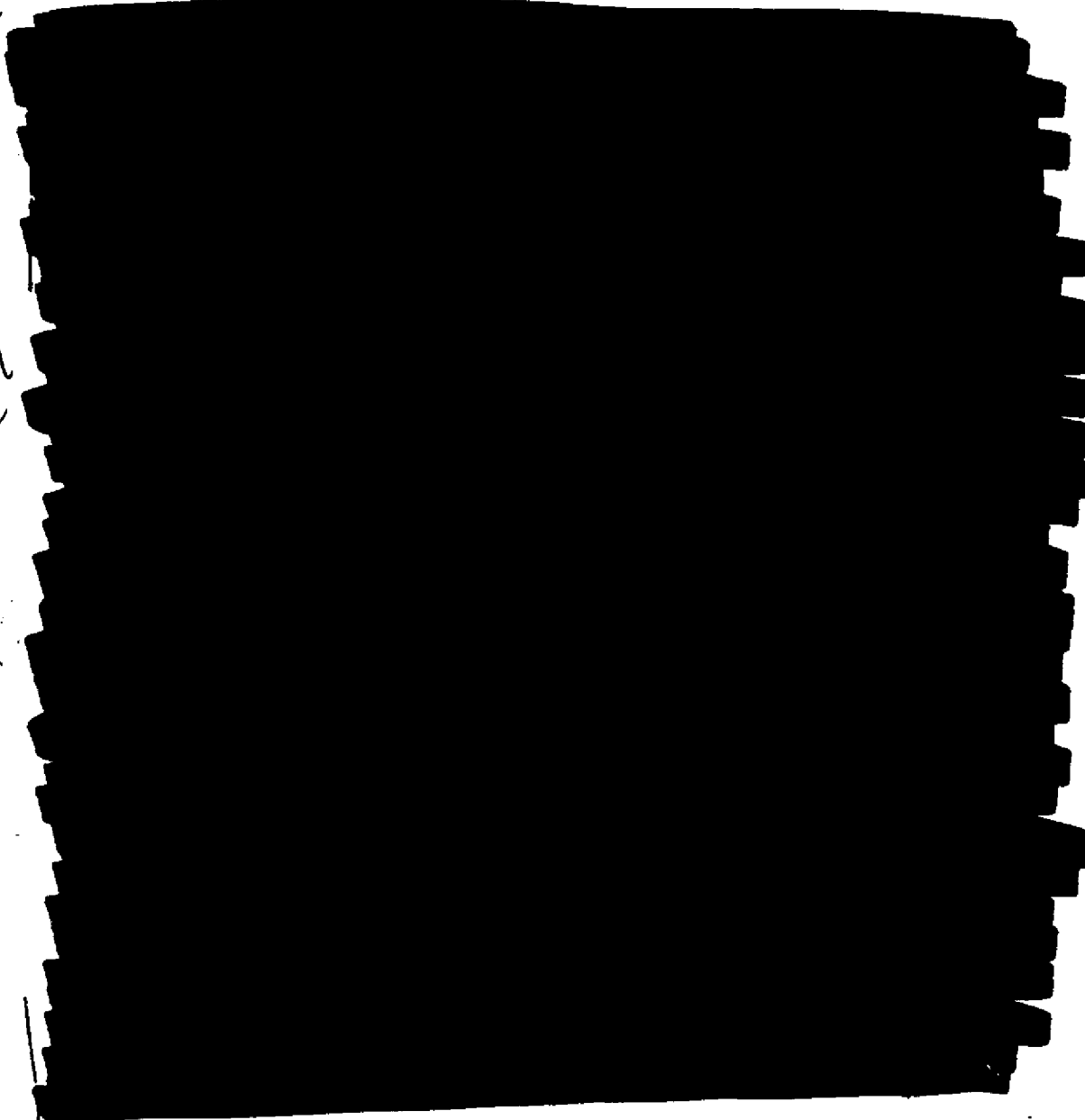

RENNIE DAVIS

RENNIE DAVIS was found guilty in the United States District Court, Northern District of Illinois, Chicago, Illinois, during February, 1970, of violation of a Federal Anti-Riot Statute, arising out of his participation in the riots during the Democratic National Convention held in Chicago, Illinois, in August, 1968. On February 20, 1970, DAVIS received 23 individual and separate criminal contempt citations regarding the above trial, and was sentenced to two years, one month and nine days regarding these citations. DAVIS was incarcerated in the Cook County Jail, Chicago, but was released on \$25,000 bond on February 28, 1970, pending appeal.

[REDACTED] on April 13, 1971, that ABBIE HOFFMAN was recently telling some people that HOWIE EMER of Kent, Ohio, wanted him to come to Kent on May 4, 1971, but HOFFMAN did not think he could make it because he was in a heavy legal struggle in order to keep his bail from being revoked. HOFFMAN was scheduled to speak in Iowa the night before (May 3, 1971) and HOFFMAN felt that if the people at Kent wanted to put him on the program it would be okay but he did not want the entire program built around him. HOFFMAN was going to try to get to Kent for May 4, 1971, but he could not guarantee it.

ABBIE HOFFMAN

ABBIE HOFFMAN was found guilty in the United States District Court, Northern District of Illinois, Chicago, Illinois, during February, 1970, of violation of a Federal Anti-Riot Law Statute, arising out of his participation in the riots during the Democratic National Convention held in Chicago in August, 1968. On February 20, 1970, HOFFMAN was sentenced to five years imprisonment and fined \$5000. As a result of the trial, HOFFMAN was also found guilty on February 14, 1970, of 23 separate criminal contempt citations and sentenced to 8 months imprisonment. On February 28, 1970, the U. S. District Court of Appeals, Seventh Circuit, Chicago, Illinois, ordered that HOFFMAN be released on \$25,000 bond.

[REDACTED] on April 29, 1971, that one of the people going to Washington, D. C., for the May Day activities in that city on May 1 - 3, 1971, had been instructed by one of the people affiliated with the Kent Yippie movement to try to get people in Washington to come to Kent for May 4 - 6, 1971. Any of the people in Washington who were interested were to be furnished with telephone numbers in Kent to call when they arrived; also, these people should be told to avoid use of Route 43 from the Ohio Turnpike to Kent because of road construction.

This individual also indicated that the people in Washington should be told that the rumors that KSU will be closed on May 4 - 6, 1971, are bull ---- (obscene) as the town and school will be open.

If any of the people coming to Kent from Washington are stopped it was suggested that they give phony names and that they not be intimidated by the police. This individual did not feel that more than 50 to 100 people in Washington would be interested in coming to Kent and it would not have any adverse effect on the overall Washington activities as there would probably be a million or more people there for May Day anyway. All they want in Kent is a couple of thousand people for their May Day activities. The plans for Kent May Day are mainly to close the KSU ROTC Building by civil disobedience and then go from there, such as doing spontaneous things. In addition, they were trying to get ABIE HOFFMAN to come to Kent for the May Day program as a speaker, but he is on probation and is having trouble trying to travel. Another possible speaker might be DAVE DELLINGER.

BLACK PANTHER PARTY
also known as
BLACK PANTHER PARTY
FOR SELF DEFENSE

According to the official newspaper of the Black Panther Party (BPP), the BPP was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by Bobby G. Scale, BPP Chairman, and Huey P. Newton, Minister of Defense, BPP.

The official newspaper, called "The Black Panther," regularly states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to as "pigs" who should be killed.

The newspaper, in its issue of September 7, 1968, had an article by the then Minister of Education, George Murray. This article ended with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is revolutionary culture. Charge. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

The BPP newspaper, issue of October 5, 1968, had an article introduced with the following statement: "We will not dissent from American government. We will overthrow it."

David Hilliard, Chief of Staff, BPP, in a speech at the San Francisco Polo Field on November 15, 1969, said: "We will kill Richard Nixon."

David Hilliard, in "The New York Times," issue of December 13, 1969, was quoted as follows: "We advocate the very direct overthrow of the government by way of force and violence."

In the issue of April 25, 1970, the BPP newspaper had an article by Minister of Culture, Emory Douglas, as follows:

"The only way to make this racist US government administer justice to the people it is oppressing, isby taking up arms against this government, killing the officials, until the reactionary forcesare dead, and those that are left turn their weapons on their superiors, thereby passing revolutionary judgement against the number one enemy of all mankind, the racist U. S. government."

The BPP Headquarters is located at 1046 Peralta Street, Oakland, California. Branches of the BPP, and Committees to Combat Fascism, under control of the BPP, have been established in various locations in the USA.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

Students for a Democratic Society, commonly known as SDS, came into existence at a founding convention held during June, 1962, at Fort Huron, Michigan. From an initial posture of "participatory democracy," Marxist-Leninist ideology of various shadings became predominant during 1968-1969 with debate centering on how best to create a revolutionary youth movement. SDS moved from involvement in the civil rights struggle to an anti-Vietnam war position to advocacy of a militant anti-imperialist line linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. All major factions within SDS embrace Marxism-Leninism and identify internationally with China, Cuba and North Vietnam as countries leading the worldwide struggles against the United States. However, the Soviet Union was regarded as imperialist and with the Communist Party, United States of America, "revisionist" in nature.

SDS operated under a national constitution which called for an annual National Convention (NC) and quarterly National Council meetings wherein programs were initiated and debated. Three national officers were elected annually with a National Interim Committee to run the organization. Regional offices and college chapters elected delegates to the national meetings but each functioned independently on local matters. Its official publication "Fire" (formerly "New Left Notes") last appeared in December, 1969.

Internal factionalism of serious proportions developed during 1968 - 1969 and the following three factions evolved as a result of a split at the June, 1969, NC: Weathermen, Worker Student Alliance (WSA), and Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM). The effect of the split on SDS chapters throughout the country was divisive. Some allied with one or the other of the three major factions. Others, unable to identify with any faction, disassociated with SDS completely and changed names.

The SDS national office in recent years was located at 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. It was closed in February, 1970.

The Weatherman and RYM groups no longer consider themselves associated with SDS, and the WSA group refers to itself as the true SDS.

REVOLUTIONARY YOUTH MOVEMENT

67D [REDACTED] that the Revolutionary Youth Movement II (RYMII) faction of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) held a national conference at Atlanta, Georgia, from November 26 to 30, 1969. At this conference it was decided to form a new organization to be known as Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM), characterized as a mass anti-imperialist youth organization, said organization being proposed as separate and distinct in form and content from SDS. The "Principles of Unity" adopted by the conference included a struggle against white supremacy and male supremacy; fights against imperialism, anticommunism, fascism and oppression of youth; and support of the right of self-determination of all "oppressed nations," also support of the right of all "oppressed and exploited" peoples "to armed self-defense." It was agreed that RYM would not be a Marxist-Leninist organization; however, source said this was decided in order to indicate an organization broad enough in form to be acceptable to everyone. A temporary National Steering Committee (NSC) made up of eight females and two males was elected to govern RYM until national officers could be elected during the Spring of 1970.

RYM publications have listed the RYM National Office (NO) at Post Office Box 5421 and Post Office Box 77012 C, both Atlanta, Georgia, and a second source has advised that the NO has no office space but would probably be considered as located at Apartment 27, 1067 Alta Avenue, Northeast, Atlanta.

[REDACTED] that women dominated the founding conference and have continued to dominate NSC meetings to the point that "women's liberation" has apparently become the RYM's principal issue - also that RYM's poor financial condition has resulted in its failure to publish a paper. During early 1970, RYM has decided to cater to the working class rather than youth, since the potential for social revolution lies in workers.

WORKER STUDENT ALLIANCE/PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY

670 [REDACTED] that at the National Convention (NC) of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) held in Chicago, Illinois, during June, 1969, a split arose between the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and the National Office (NO), the NO becoming known as the Weatherman faction. The PLP faction drew the largest support among those in attendance at the NC.

[REDACTED] that during late Summer, 1969, the PLP faction of SDS established its National Headquarters (NH) on the second floor of a loft-type building at 173A Massachusetts Avenue, Boston, Massachusetts. The campaign on which the PLP faction centered was to build a worker student alliance or a campus worker student alliance. Thus, they adopted the names of Worker Student Alliance (WSA) or Campus Worker Student Alliance.

[REDACTED] that the "New Left Notes," printed in New York City, is the official publication of the WSA faction.

[REDACTED] that within the SDS, the WSA is a caucus of which the PLP constitutes the leadership.

[REDACTED] during demonstrations staged in the Boston area during the Spring and Summer of 1970 by the NH, the main theme of previous demonstrations staged by the NH shifted from protestations of the Vietnam War and other United States foreign policy matters to attacking domestic issues such as racism and unemployment and demonstrating support of the "workers' struggle."

PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY

"The New York Times" city edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) which had been known as the Progressive Labor Movement.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1962 by Hilton Rosen and Mortimer Schear after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line."

67D [REDACTED] that the PLP held its Second National Convention in New York City, May 31 to June 2, 1968, at which time the PLP reasserted its objective of the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxism-Leninism.

[REDACTED] that at the Second National Convention Hilton Rosen was unanimously reelected National Chairman of the PLP and Levi Laub, Fred Jerome, Jared Israel, William Epton, Jacob Rosen, Jeffrey Gordon, and Walter Linder were elected as the National Committee to lead the PLP until the next convention.

The PLP publishes "Progressive Labor," a bimonthly magazine, and "Challenge-Desafio," a monthly newspaper.

WEATHERMAN

Initially called the "Action Faction," Weatherman came into being immediately before the June, 1969, Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) National Convention (NC). At this NC Weatherman won all three national officer positions and a majority of the National Interim Committee as well. Subsequently, they took over the SDS National Office (NO) in Chicago, and controlled its funds, paper and national records. Although internal struggle existed until late 1969, Weatherman for all major purposes controlled SDS nationally from June, 1969, until its NO closed in February, 1970. At this time it no longer considered itself part of SDS.

The term Weatherman emerged from an ideological paper prepared by its leaders entitled "You Don't Need a Weatherman to Know Which Way the Wind Blows" ("New Left Notes" June 16, 1969). This statement outlined the basic stance of Weatherman: Marxist-Leninist in content but with strong advocacy that action not theory would bring about revolution in the United States. This posture was complemented with an international identification to the Cuban revolution and Castro's statement that the duty of a revolutionary is to make revolution.

During October, 1969, Weatherman riots in Chicago resulted in more than 200 arrests for riot action and related charges. A program of armed struggle was finalized during a December, 1969, "War Council" wherein terrorist tactics and political assassination were contemplated. The basic strength of Weatherman was then revealed to be some 300 - 350 nationally and geographically apportioned to the Midwest, New York, and some Northwest.

As its rhetoric of violence escalated, Weatherman leaders increasingly discussed the necessity of an underground operation wherein more than 95 percent of the organization would be submerged; "affinity groups" of three - five members would function independently. In February, 1970, Weatherman leaders announced a program of "strategic sabotage" with police and military installations as primary targets.

Tafe advised that routine motions by the defense regarding dismissal of charges, request for a bill of particulars, examination of prospective jurors, and request for an indefinite continuance were all denied. The court took under consideration defense motions for discovery and inspection and regarding the electronic surveillance issue; rulings will be handed down at a later date.

Abbie Gets His Nose Fixed

As Abbie Hoffman puts it, his nose happened to hit a cop's nightstick during the Mayday demonstrations while the rest of his face was busy beating up the poor stick. His nose got scrunched by its efforts, and so like any good Jewish Yippie leader, he's getting it fixed.

What do you call a nose job for a Yippie? Martha Mitchell would probably call it radical surgery.

As Abbie tells it from his bed at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine's hospital in the Bronx, it isn't beauty he seeks but breath. "I had a slipped disk and I had 20 stitches taken in my head and I had a broken nose," he said nasally recalling the fight with the nightstick. "And in the past two months I've been to doctors. So I just had an operation. Deviated septum job. I couldn't breathe through my

nose so well so I could operate. It was all el smasho."

"Also, I did develop an infection. One more step . . ." His voice trailed off ominously, and the heart of the FBI man tapping on the phone skipped a hopeful beat.

Hoffman was arrested while allegedly taking part in the Mayday traffic stoppage. He was later indicted on charges of crossing state lines to incite a riot and interfering with an officer.

Abbie claims he interfered with the officer in the same way his nose beat up the stick. "He tackled me from behind, rolled me over and hit me five or six times in the face with a club. That's the last that I remember."

His lawyers have considered a countersuit which would seek to wring from the government more than the price of a nose job. But someone has stolen the evidence and J. Edgar's men

aren't known to be investigating the theft.

"We had six photos of me getting clubbed," Abbie said. "They were at the People Peace Treaty office and some kids from Long Island ran off with them as souvenirs."

A nose job being a six-day affair, the patient says he's killing time by working on a new book. "I'm doing a sequel to 'Steal This Book: Bankrobbery Made Easy.' No kidding," he kidded. "I've all these interviews with bankrobbers."

Time for a closing line. "Listen, man, I gotta go. I gotta watch 'The FBI.' They're looking for a personal friend in this episode."

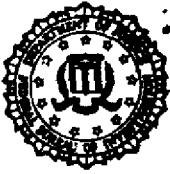

Attached to this memorandum is a copy of a two page motion filed August 27, 1971, with the United States Court of Appeals (USCA), Seventh Circuit, Chicago, by Thomas M. Haney, local Chicago counsel for Hoffman. The motion was furnished on August 30, 1971, by Assistant United States Attorney James Breen, Northern District of Illinois, and is self-explanatory in nature concerning the request by Hoffman for USCA permission to travel to Jamaica during the last week in September, 1971, and again for the period November, 1971, through February, 1972.

In connection with this request, and the reason therefor, it might be noted Hoffman was a convicted defendant in the so-called Conspiracy Seven trial, Chicago, which took place over the period September, 1969, through February, 1970, and involved those persons earlier indicted for violation of the Federal Antiriot Statute, as a result of actions surrounding the August, 1968, Democratic National Convention, Chicago. In addition, at the conclusion of that trial, Hoffman was cited for contempt of court by the presiding trial judge, these contempt citations resulting from actions and statements of Hoffman in court during its course. On February 15, 1970, he was ordered incarcerated without bond in Cook County Jail, Chicago, as a result of the above.

On February 28, 1970, he was ordered admitted to bond by the USCA, however, was instructed to advise the United States Marshal, Chicago, of all travel outside the State of his residence, and to secure permission of the USCA for all

Appellant Abbott H. Hoffman moves for the entry of an order granting him permission to travel to Jamaica during the last week of September 1971 and again for the period from November 1971 through February 1972.

In support of this motion the appellant states:

1. He intends to travel to Jamaica during the last week of September 1971 in order to locate a place of residence for himself and his family for the period from November 1971 through February 1972; after locating such a residence in September he will return to the United States.

2. He intends to reside in Jamaica during the period from November 1971 through February 1972 with his family, for the following reasons:

- a) He has undergone several physical injuries during the past several months and would like this opportunity to recover his health.
- b) His wife recently gave birth to their first child, and he feels that his wife should have a period of rest.

c) He intends to be writing a new book during this period.

He intends to reside in Jamaica during this period but acknowledges that he may have to travel to the United States on one or more occasions to consult with his attorneys or for other legal matters.

3. He does not yet know where he will be staying in Jamaica during the last week in September but he will notify the U. S. Marshal as soon as he knows where he will reside or where he may be contacted. His place of residence during the period from November 1971 through February 1972 will depend on the success of his efforts in September to obtain a suitable residence for the later period.

4. He does not know the exact dates of his travel yet, but he will notify the U. S. Marshal as soon as his plans are confirmed.

5. He acknowledges that it is somewhat early to apply to this court for permission to travel to Jamaica during the period from November 1971 to February 1972, but he feels that there would be no need for him to go to Jamaica in September unless he knows that he will have the permission of this court to travel to Jamaica again during the later period, since the only purpose of his first trip is to locate accommodations for his later trip.

WHEREFORE, the appellant respectfully requests the entry of an order as set forth above.

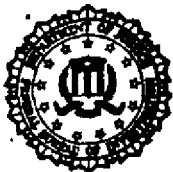

That information was contained in a motion filed August 27, 1971, with the United States Court of Appeals (USCA), Seventh Circuit, Chicago, on behalf of Hoffman, along with a request for court approval of that travel.

On September 8, 1971, Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) James Breen, Northern District of Illinois (NDI), made available a copy of a supplemental motion filed September 7, 1971, with the USCA on behalf of Hoffman. HIRSCHMAN, attorneys for subject, appeared before Judge J. Attached concerns telephonic inquiry by Hoffman's attorney, Leonard Weinglass, directed to our San Juan office, regarding nature of inquiries re Hoffman in the Virgin Islands.

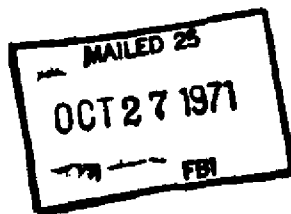

Reference is made to Chicago memorandum of September 17, 1971, under Hoffman's caption, which reflected the approval by the United States Court of Appeals, (USCA), Seventh Circuit, Chicago, of a request by Hoffman for Court permission to travel to and subsequently reside in the United States Virgin Islands (USVI) during the last week of September, 1971, and in the period November, 1971 through April, 1972.

On October 18, 1971, Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) James Breen, Northern District of Illinois, advised that on October 15, 1971, a motion had been filed on Hoffman's behalf with the USCA, which motion had requested court authorization of travel to the USVI on October 22, 1971, to remain through April, 1972. The motion had noted the prior court approval of residence in the USVI, commencing November, 1971, however, Hoffman indicated his desire to leave the United States earlier than November, as he had now obtained a residence in the Virgin Islands, and was able to leave the country at this time. While in the USVI in the period of this residence, his address would be 1441 Frenchmans Bay, St. Thomas, Virgin Islands, 00801.

On October 19, 1971, Breen advised that the USCA in an order dated October 18, 1971, had granted Hoffman permission to depart for the Virgin Islands on October 22, 1971, as requested, and for the period indicated.

Reference is made to New York (NY) memorandum dated October 8, 1971, setting forth information that Abbott Hoffman had returned to New York City (NYC) from St. Thomas, United States Virgin Islands. b7c

On October 15, 1971, [redacted] Pan American Airways (Pan Am), 200 Park Avenue, NYC, advised that according to records of Pan Am, "Hoffman, A. and Mrs." traveling with an infant, 3 months old, were booked with Pan Am to leave NYC for St. Thomas, United States Virgin Islands, on Pan Am Flight 269 at 10:15 a.m. on October 22, 1971. This flight was scheduled to arrive at St. Thomas at 1:50 p.m. on October 22, 1971.

[redacted] further advised that Abbott Hoffman had no return space.

On October 22, 1971, Special Agents (SAs) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) observed Abbott Hoffman board Pan Am Flight 269 at 9:55 a.m. with his wife, Anita Hoffman, and infant at John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFKIA), Queens, NY. This flight departed NY at 10:15 a.m. and was scheduled to arrive at St. Thomas, United States Virgin Islands at 1:50 p.m.

On October 22, 1971, the SAs of the FBI reviewed the records of Pan Am at the Pan Am Departure Terminal, JFKIA, Queens, NY, which disclosed that "Mr. A. Hoffman" boarded Pan Am Flight 269 en route to St. Thomas, United States Virgin Islands, departing at 10:15 a.m. on October 22, 1971. Hoffman utilized Pan Am Ticket Number 026190292039, Coupon Number 1, a one way ticket, which had been purchased through Travel Horizons Unlimited in NYC on October 20, 1971. "Mrs. A. Hoffman and Infant" boarded this flight
