For the information of the Bureau, while conducting a neighborhood investigation regarding the original letters received [redacted] it was determined that additional individuals in this neighborhood also received similar type letters which appear to be from the same writer.

On 9/27/76, [redacted] turned over a letter received by him which letter was addressed to [redacted] [redacted] This letter was written on a memo type sheet of paper with the [redacted]

[redacted] [redacted] had no suspects but believes the writer is a female, based on the wording of his letter. He also stated that there is a building on the [redacted] with the address of [redacted] [redacted] which is occupied by "Puerto Ricans and hillbillies"

and he would not be surprised if someone in this building did not write the letter. [redacted] pointed out that whoever wrote the letter obviously does not know [redacted] [redacted] in view of the way the letter was addressed.

Investigation at [redacted] revealed that there is no [redacted] at this address. Investigation continuing to determine if this business has moved or is possibly out of business. Chicago is also obtaining a list of residents of the [redacted] Street address from the Postal Inspectors Office.

On 9/28/76, [redacted] [redacted] turned over a letter received by them addressed to [redacted] [redacted] at their address. [redacted] advised that they are the sole [redacted] [redacted] had no specific suspects but stated that they would not be surprised if someone residing at [redacted] was not responsible for the letter. They explained this by saying that this building is occupied by a bunch of young trouble makers.

On 9/28/76, [redacted] [redacted] turned over letter and envelope addressed to the [redacted] at this address. The letter [redacted] [redacted] have been many complaints concerning the noise and the type of people frequenting the [redacted] [redacted] did not take the letter seriously and figured it was just someone in the neighborhood complaining about the [redacted] [redacted] stated he does [redacted] in the neighborhood and had no suspects as to who was responsible for this letter.

[redacted] had no specific suspects other than they feel it is someone who is well acquainted [redacted] is a long time resident of this neighborhood.
