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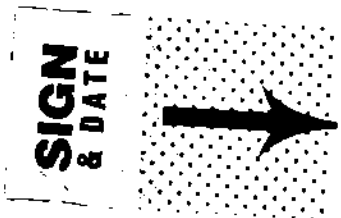

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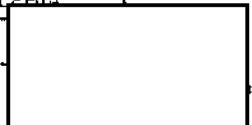

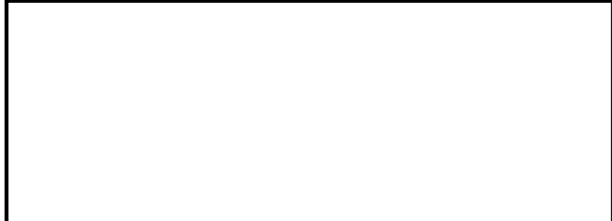

ON FRIDAY, MARCH 21, 1980, AT APPROXIMATELY 9:50 PM
PHILADELPHIA POLICE RESPONDED TO A RADIO CALL: "HOSPITAL
CASE, SHOOTING, 934 SNYDER AVENUE" (ANGELO BRUNO'S
RESIDENCE). PHILADELPHIA POLICE OFFICER [REDACTED]
ARRIVED AT THE SCENE AND OBSERVED A 1978 CHEVROLET CAPRICE,
MARGON COLOR, WITH WHITE MALE SITTING IN FRONT PASSENGER
SEAT APPARENTLY DEAD WITH A SHOTGUN WOUND TO THE HEAD.
ANOTHER WHITE MALE, IDENTIFIED AS [REDACTED] AGE [REDACTED]
OF [REDACTED] WAS PRESENT
ON THE SCENE AND TOLD POLICE THAT HE HAD JUST DRIVEN
ANGELO BRUNO FROM COUS RESTAURANT, 11TH AND CHRISTIAN
STREETS, PHILADELPHIA, AND WAS PARKING HIS AUTOMOBILE WHEN UN-
KNOWN PERSON SHOT BRUNO AT POINT BLANK RANGE THROUGH OPENED
FRONT PASSENGER WINDOW. [REDACTED] WAS ALSO STRUCK IN THE [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] BY STRAY PELLETS. [REDACTED] ADMITTED TO
ST. AGNES HOSPITAL IN GOOD CONDITION. BRUNO WAS PRONOUNCED
DEAD AT THE SCENE AT 11:27 PM BY [REDACTED]
PHILADELPHIA OFFICE OF MEDICAL EXAMINER. CRIME SCENE
CONDUCTED BY HOMICIDE UNIT OF THE PHILADELPHIA POLICE
DEPARTMENT (PHPD). PHILADELPHIA FBI PRESENT AT THE SCENE
DURING CRIME SCENE INVESTIGATION. NUMEROUS WITNESSES IN
IMMEDIATE NEIGHBORHOOD ADMITTED HEARING TWO BLASTS, ALTHOUGH

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NO ONE SAW UNSUB OR ANY STRANGE VEHICLES OR ACTIVITH IN AREA PRIOR TO MURDER, WITH EXCEPTION OF ONE [REDACTED]

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[REDACTED] ADVISED HE RAN OUT OF NEARBY RESIDENCE AND SAW ANGELO BRUNO IN THE ABOVE-DESCRIBED CAR AT WHICH TIME [REDACTED] WAS WALKING UP STEPS OF BRUNO RESIDENCE. [REDACTED]

ADVISED HW SAW UNSUB, WHITE MALE, APPROXIMATELY 6'1", WITH 3/4 LENGTH GREEN TRENCH COAT, RUNNING FROM VICINITY OF MURDER. [REDACTED] COULD FURNISH NO ADDITIONAL DETAILS

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AND IT IS BEING POINTED OUT THAT FRIENDS OF [REDACTED] WHO WERE PRESENT DID NOT OBSERVE UNSUB RUNNING FROM SCENE AND IT IS NOTED [REDACTED] AND ASSOCIATES ARE

NARCOTIES USERS AND HAVE BEEN IN TROUBLE WITH LOCAL AUTHORITIES ON PREVIOUS OCCASIONS. NO OTHER WITNESSES OBSERVED ^{ANY} PERTINENT DATA IN CRIME SCENE AREA.

CRIME SCENE BEING RECONDUCTED AT THIS TIME ^{BY} PMPD HOMICIDE WHICH WILL INCLUDE RE-INTERVIEW OF NEIGHBORHOOD, SEARCH OF ROOFTOPS AND SEWER DRAINS, FOR WEAPON UTILIZED IN THIS MURDER.

NUMEROUS RELATIVES, LCN MEMBERS, AND BRUNO ASSOCIATES ARRIVED AT RESIDENCE AND FAMILY MEMBERS AND ASSOCIATES WERE UNCOOPERATIVE TO LOCAL HOMICIDE INVESTIGATORS.

FOR INFORMATION OF THE BUREAU AND RECEIVING OFFICES, THE BRUNO LCN FAMILY DURING RECENT MONTHS HAS BEEN ALIGNED ^{INTD} WITH TWO FACTIONS THAT OPPOSE EACH

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OTHER, ONE BEING THE BRUNO GROUP AND THE OTHER BEING THE PHIL TESTA GROUP. THOSE ASSOCIATES THAT APPEARED AT THE BRUNO RESIDENCE FOLLOWING THE MURDER CONSISTED OF THE BRUNO FACTION. THESE LCN ASSOCIATES OF THE BRUNO FACTION, UPON LEAVING THE RESIDENCE, TRAVELLED TO THE HILTON HOTEL, TENTH AND PACKER AVENUE, SOUTH PHILADELPHIA, WHEREIN THEY OBTAINED A ROOM AND SPENT THE ENTIRE NIGHT. SURVEILLANCE COVERAGE WAS INSTITUTED AND NUMEROUS LCN ASSOCIATES OF THE FACTION WERE IDENTIFIED ENTERING AND LEAVING THE HILTON HOTEL DURING THE TEN-HOUR PERIOD FOLLOWING THE MURDER. ALL DURING THIS TIME PHIL TESTA AND HIS ASSOCIATES WERE OUT OF POCKET AND NOT OBSERVED AT THE RESIDENCE OR THE HILTON HOTEL WHERE THE BRUNO FACTION WAS MEETING.

AT 10 AM MARCH 22, 1980, FBI PHILADELPHIA MET WITH PHILADELPHIA HOMICIDE DIVISION AND ORGANIZED CRIME UNIT (OC), PHPD, AND FULLY DISCUSSED ALL INVESTIGATION AND ACTIVITIES TO DATE. PHILADELPHIA HOMICIDE DIVISION, UNDER THE DIRECTION OF CHIEF FRANK SCAFIDI, EXTREMELY APPRECIATIVE OF FBI PRESENCE AND PARTICIPATION AND INSTRUCTED ALL PHILADELPHIA POLICE OFFICERS ASSIGNED TO THIS INVESTIGATION TO FULLY COOPERATE WITH FBI PHILADELPHIA. IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THIS MEETING, FBI AGENTS, ALONG WITH PHPD

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DISBURSED TO MEDICAL EXAMINER'S OFFICE TO OBSERVE AND
PRESERVE EVIDENCE DURING AUTOPSY. FBI AGENTS AT THIS
LOCATION [REDACTED]

TESTA APPEARED ON SCENE, REFUSED TO UNLOCKE TRUNK OR GLOVE COMPARTMENT AND CLAIMED WORK RECENTLY DONE ON VEHICLE AND FIRE POSSIBLY STARTED IN ENGINE COMPARTMENT. LOCAL FIRE DEPARTMENT CONTINUING INVESTIGATION THIS PHASE.

EXTENSIVE SURVEILLANCE ACTIVITY BEING CONDUCTED BY PHIADELPHIA OFF-PREMISE SQAUDS COVERING LCN MEETINGS TAKING PLACE TODAY. AT APPROXIMATELY [REDACTED]. SURVEILLANCE TEAM PICKED UP FRANK SINDONE AND JOSEPH CIANCAGLINI, BOTH FROM THE BRUNO FACTION, MEETING AT PHILA. RESTAURANT WITH PHIL TESTA. Candidate Menaced, Car Torched

By BOB WARNER

A Northeast Philadelphia man, running for leader of the 56th Ward, says he received a threatening phone call early yesterday morning, just as firemen were cleaning up after the apparent firebombing of his car.

Police reported heavy damage to the 1979 Mercury, owned by John Sabatina, 33, an employe of the Redevelopment Authority. They said someone apparently had soaked some cardboard in a flammable liquid, placed it on top of the car, then set it afire.

THE INCIDENT occurred around 1 a.m. in front of Sabatina's home on Emerson St. near Bradford in Rhawnhurst.

While the car was still burning, Sabatina said, he got a telephone call from an unidentified man who told him to quit his campaign for ward leader.

"He told me to get out of the race or my house would be

next," said Sabatina.

"I told them to go to hell, then they told me next time they'd put a .45 behind my ear."

Sabatina leads a slate of 51 candidates seeking seats on the ward's Democratic committee. Lined up against his faction is a slate put together by Rose Stanger, daughter of Traffic Court President Judge Dominick Iannarelli.

STANGER TOLD THE Daily News she hadn't heard about the firebombing. She said she had decided not to run for ward leader and was throwing her support to the incumbent, Manny Reshes. Reshes is a compromise leader elected in 1978, when Sabatina previously tried to take over the ward.

Hours before the firebombing, Sabatina's slate had decided to endorse Wendell Young, president of the Retail Clerks Union, for the Democratic nomination for Congress in the 4th District.
