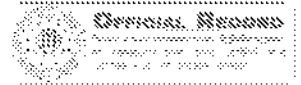

Details:

(U//~~LES~~) FBI San Antonio opened captioned Full Investigation based on information that on 03/02/2018, an unknown subject placed an explosive device on the front porch of [Redacted] Austin, TX, which caused the death of Anthony Stephan House.

(U//~~LES~~) On 03/02/2018, at approximately 7:00AM, Austin Police Department (APD), Austin Fire Department (AFD) and Austin Emergency Medical Services (EMS) responded to [Redacted] Austin, TX in reference to an explosion. Upon arriving on scene, AFD and EMS units observed the victim, Anthony Stephan House, lying at the front of the house. Neighbors from the adjacent houses were on-scene and attempted to render first aid. Initial responding units observed screws, bolts, shrapnel and damage to the entry way of the house, consistent with an explosion.

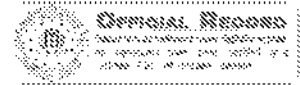

Synopsis: (U) To close captioned Full Investigation.

Details:

(U) FBI San Antonio opened captioned Full Investigation based on facts that Mark Anthony Conditt, predicated Subject of captioned investigation constructed, transported and placed six explosive devices in violation of 18 USC 842, resulting in two homicides and three attempted homicides.

(U//~~FOUO~~) 03/02/2018, Conditt placed an explosive device on the front porch of [Redacted] Austin, TX. At approximately 6:55AM, Central Standard Time (CST), Anthony Stephan House, walked out of his front door and picked up a cardboard box containing the device. (U) At approximately 11:49AM APD received a report of an explosion at [redacted] Austin, TX, resulting in the serious injury of a female resident. SABT and ERT resources were divided and directed to [redacted] TFO [redacted] responded as the JTTF on scene lead investigator for [redacted]

(U) EMS and AFD responded to the scene prior to APD and FBI arrival. EMS transported the victim, [redacted] DOB: [redacted] [redacted] to Dell Medical Center.

(U) TFO [redacted] along with Austin Police Bomb Technicians approached the front of the residence at [redacted] where a large debris field was located near the front door of the residence. TFO [redacted] observed nails and other fragmentation that had also been observed at the address on [redacted] TFO [redacted] contacted SSA [redacted] and advised him of the situation on [redacted] TFO [redacted] observed a large amount of pieces of white PVC pipe, as well as pieces of metal galvanized pipe. TFO [redacted] located the farthest piece of evidence from the seat of the blast and expanded the perimeter to ensure evidence security. FBI ERT combined with ATF explosive examiners, Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS), and APD homicide detectives to process the interior and exterior of the residence.

(U) On 03/12/2018, APD, FBI San Antonio and ATF, established a unified command post at the Austin, Travis County Combined Traffic Emergency Communications Center (CTECC). CTECC was staffed with investigators, intelligence analysts, public information officers, command elements and members of Travis County District Attorney's Office and United States Attorney's Office. Support elements responded to the Austin Resident Agency's (ARA) area of responsibility (AOR) from field offices throughout the United States.

. Also on 03/18/2018, Conditt entered a Kinkos / FedEx Store in south Austin and shipped two explosive devices.

(U) On 03/19/2018, one device detonated in the FedEx facility located at 9935 Doerr Ln. Schertz, TX. The second device shipped by Conditt was detected at the FedEx processing center located at 4117 McKinney Falls Pkwy. Austin, TX and rendered safe by law enforcement.

(U//~~FOUO~~) On 03/20/2018, FBI San Antonio identified Conditt through video, vehicle records and retail purchase records.

(U) Summary/Conclusion

(U//~~FOUO~~) After Conditt was identified, [redacted] conducted air and ground surveillance on Conditt's residence. Through research into [redacted] it was learned Conditt drove a Nissan Pathfinder, [redacted] in addition to the Ford Ranger.

FBI, APD SWAT, and DPS located Conditt in Round Rock, TX. Conditt was parked in a hotel parking lot with the engine running. Conditt left the parking lot and was forcibly stopped by two APD SWAT vans. Conditt used an improvised explosive device to kill himself when law enforcement officers attempted to approach his vehicle and was pronounced dead at the scene.

(U) On 03/21/2018, Search Warrants were executed on Conditt's residence and multiple vehicles. During the search, numerous electronic devices were seized for analysis.

(U) Between 03/02/2018 and 03/23/2018, FBI San Antonio covered 633 investigative leads in relation to captioned investigation. Numerous

persons of interest were identified through Crimestopper tips, FBI Public Access Line tips and investigative action. [redacted]

[redacted] until Conditt was identified. On 03/23/2018, unified command operations at CTECC were demobilized.

(U//~~FOUO~~) During this investigation, FBI San Antonio submitted 634 leads requiring investigative action, served 82 federal Grand Jury Subpoenas, executed 10 search warrants, served over 40 2703D orders, acquired and processed 147 items of evidence to include video and computer analysis and documented 2227 serials in the main case file.

(U//~~FOUO~~) FBI San Antonio analyzed multiple phones, electronic media and computers seized in Conditt's residence and vehicle. The electronic media did not identify any co-conspirators or radical ideology leading to Conditt's motivation to commit the bombings.

(U) FBI San Antonio has completed baseline collection against this subject in accordance with established WMD and DIOG Section 7 guidance. No known associates that had potential criminal violations or priority threats to national security warranting further investigation were identified. FBI San Antonio is closing captioned matter. In the event additional co-conspirators are discovered regarding captioned subject, FBI San Antonio will consider re-opening this investigation.

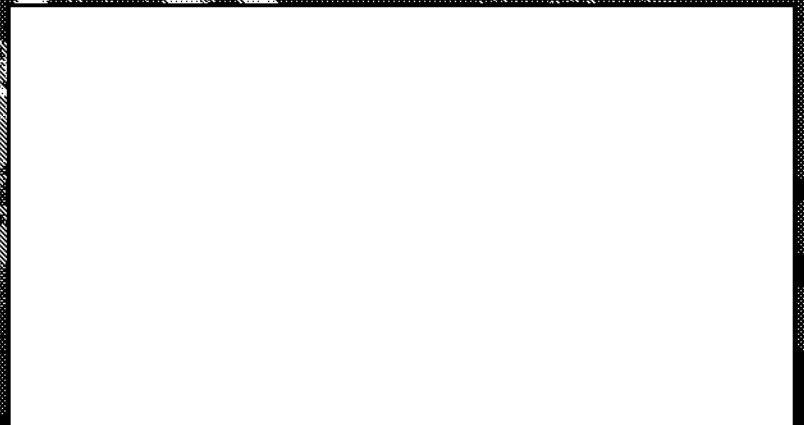

Anthony Stephan House died after the explosion on his front porch around 6:55 a.m. on the [redacted] March 2, on the [redacted] [redacted] explosion was an isolated incident. Now, they are investigating them as related, and re-classified House's death from "suspicious" to "homicide."

"We do see similarities and believe these cases are linked and do have," Manley said. He acknowledged that both victims were African-American. He said at this point police are not ruling out that these incidents could be hate crimes, but cannot confirm at this time that they were.

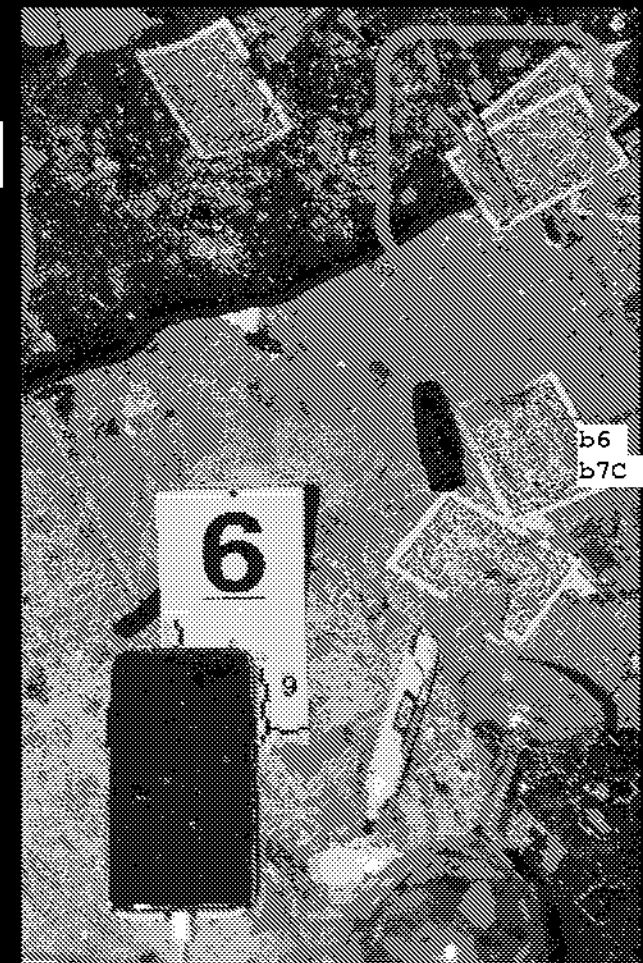


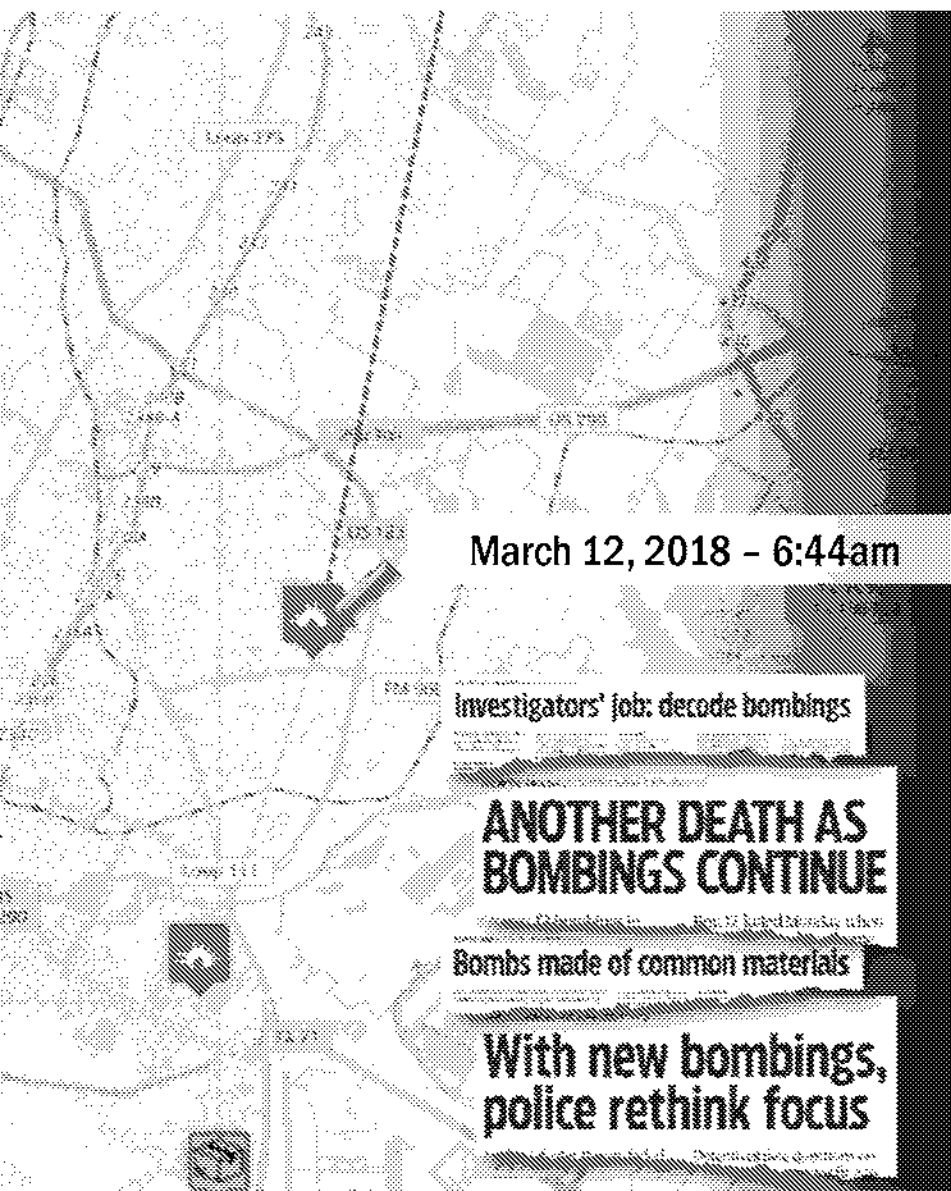

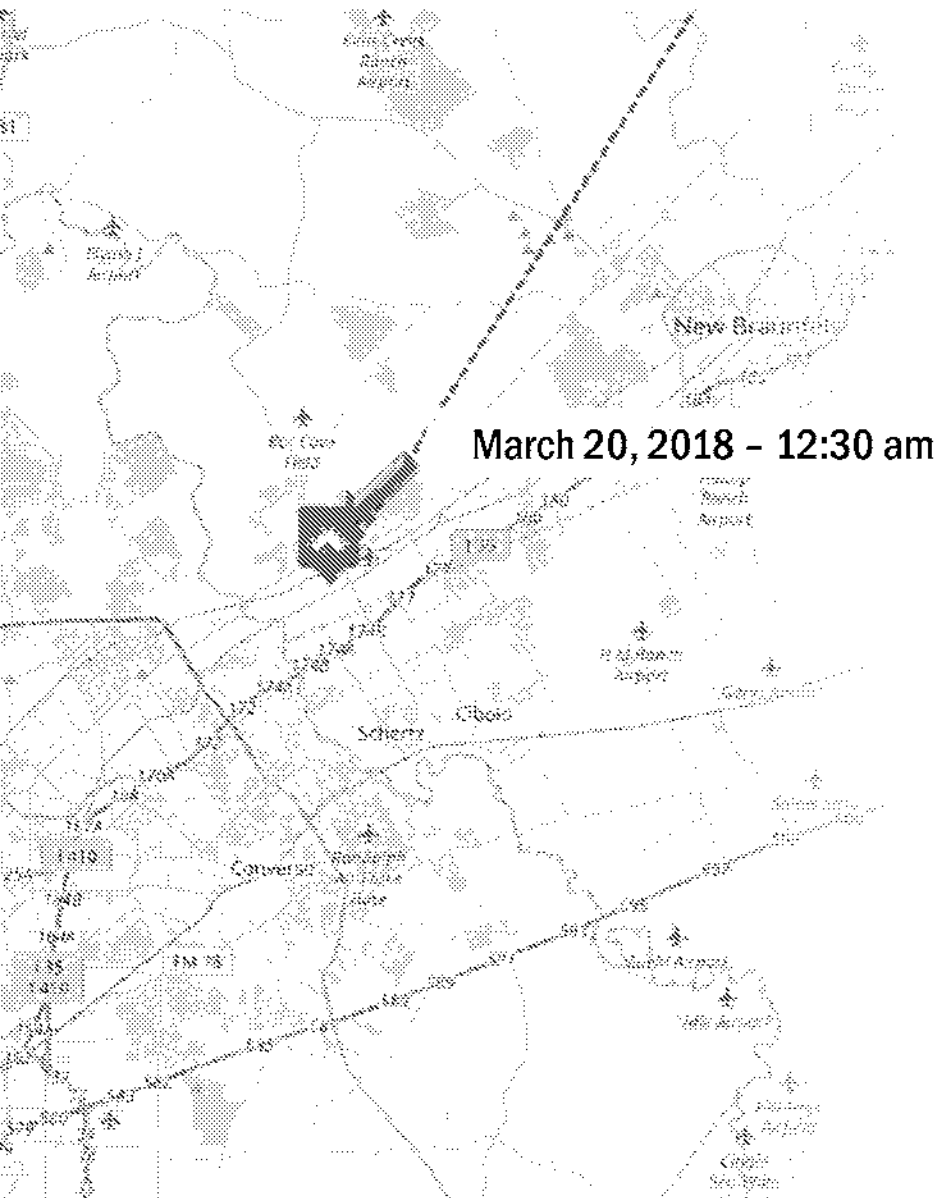
FOURTH BOMBING - TRIPWIRE

The fourth explosion happened around 8:30 Sunday night in the [redacted] [redacted] Austin/Travis County EMS reports 2 men were hurt in the blast. They were taken to an area hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

This bomb appears to have been triggered by a trip wire, a development police say is concerning because it demonstrates an evolution in the bomb maker's skills.

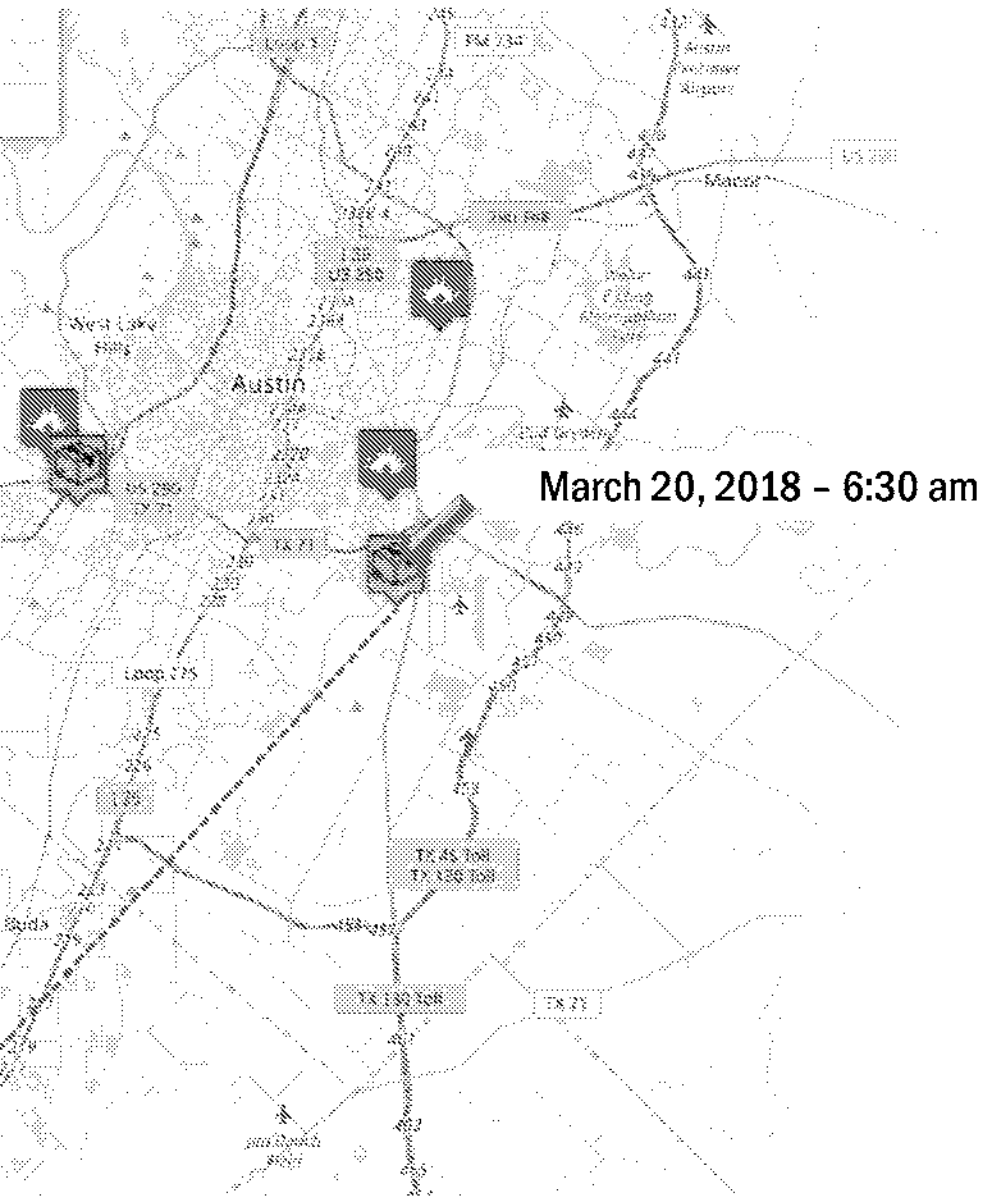

Location: FedEx ground sorting facility located in Schertz, Texas (approximately 75 miles south of Austin)

A package exploded on a conveyor belt in a FedEx Ground facility in Schertz, Texas.

Federal officials confirm the package was shipped from Austin and was heading to an Austin address when it exploded.

One worker who was nearby reported ringing in the ears. That was the extent of injuries in the blast.

SUSPICIOUS PACKAGE FOUND

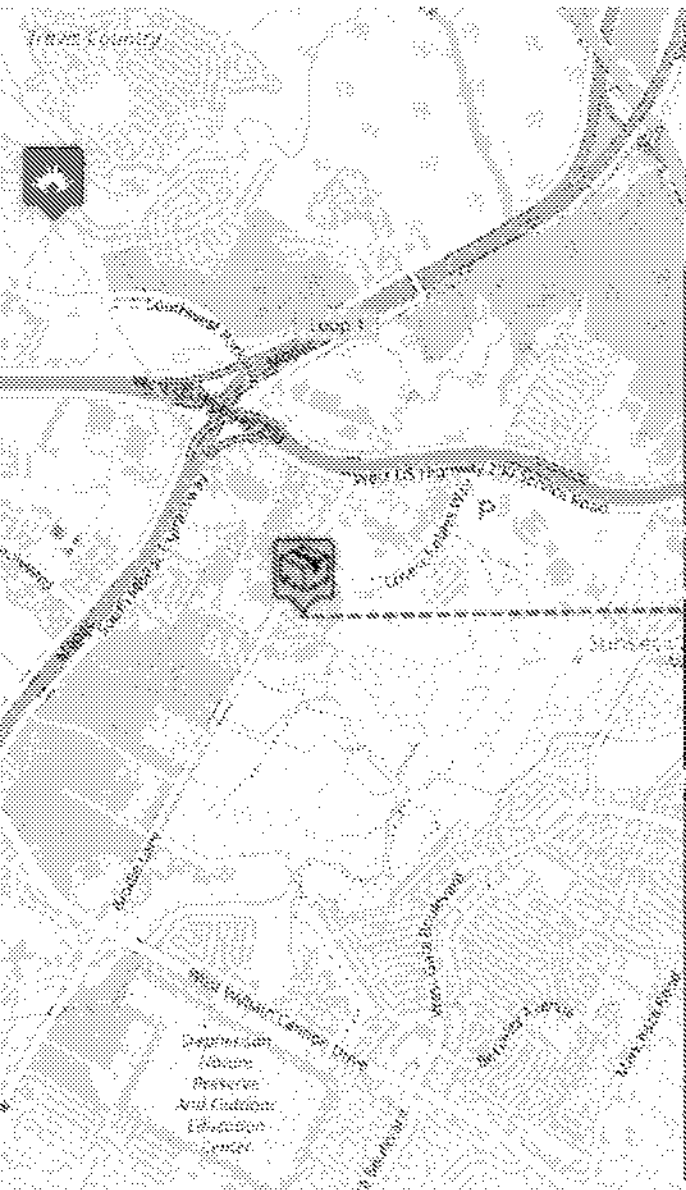
The FedEx facility on McKinney Falls, near ARIA, was evacuated after a suspicious package was found following the explosion in Schertz.

An employee at the facility tells KXAN they were evacuated around 6:30 a.m.

Austin Police Chief Brian Manley said the package inside the facility was believed to have been shipped from the Brodie Lane location at the same time as the package which exploded in Schertz.



- **March 20, 2018, second FedEx package identified at FedEx processing center near Austin airport**
- **Addressed to the office manager of a Med-Spa located in downtown Austin—white female**
- **Identified from where the package was shipped which lead to the video of the suspect**



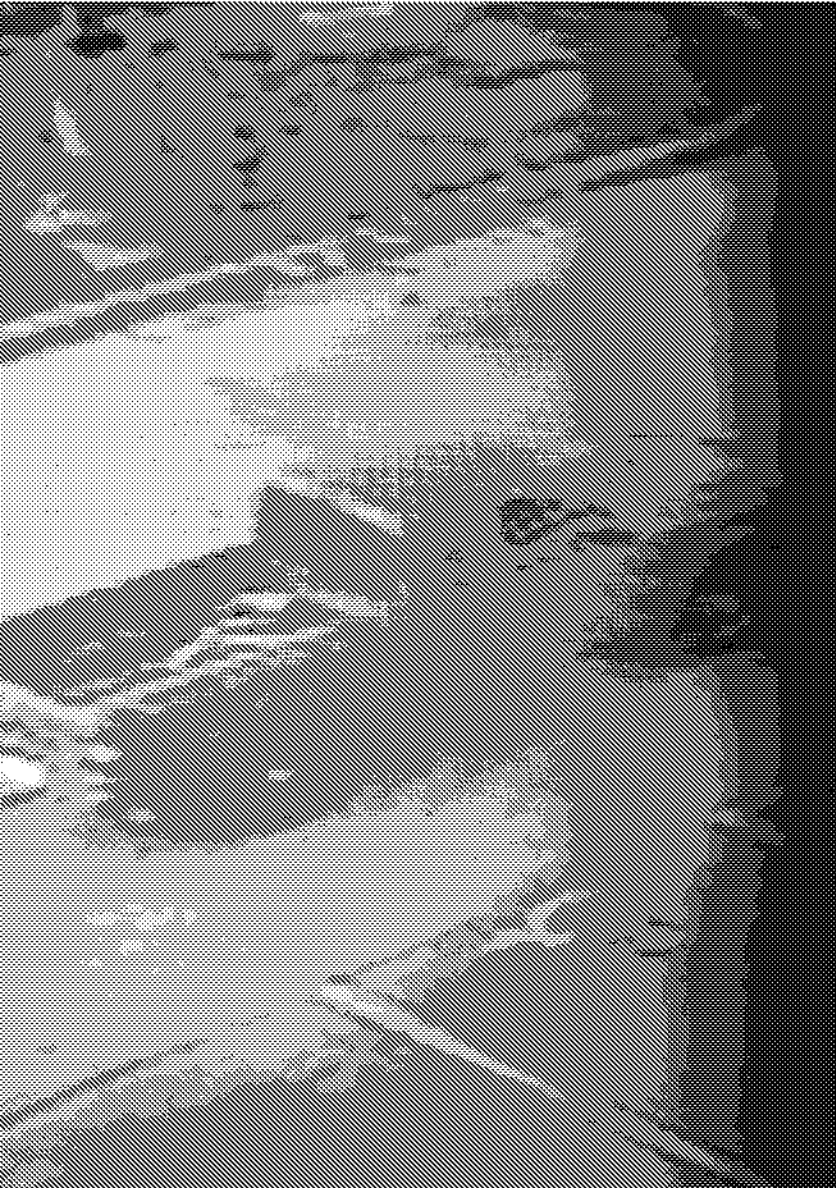

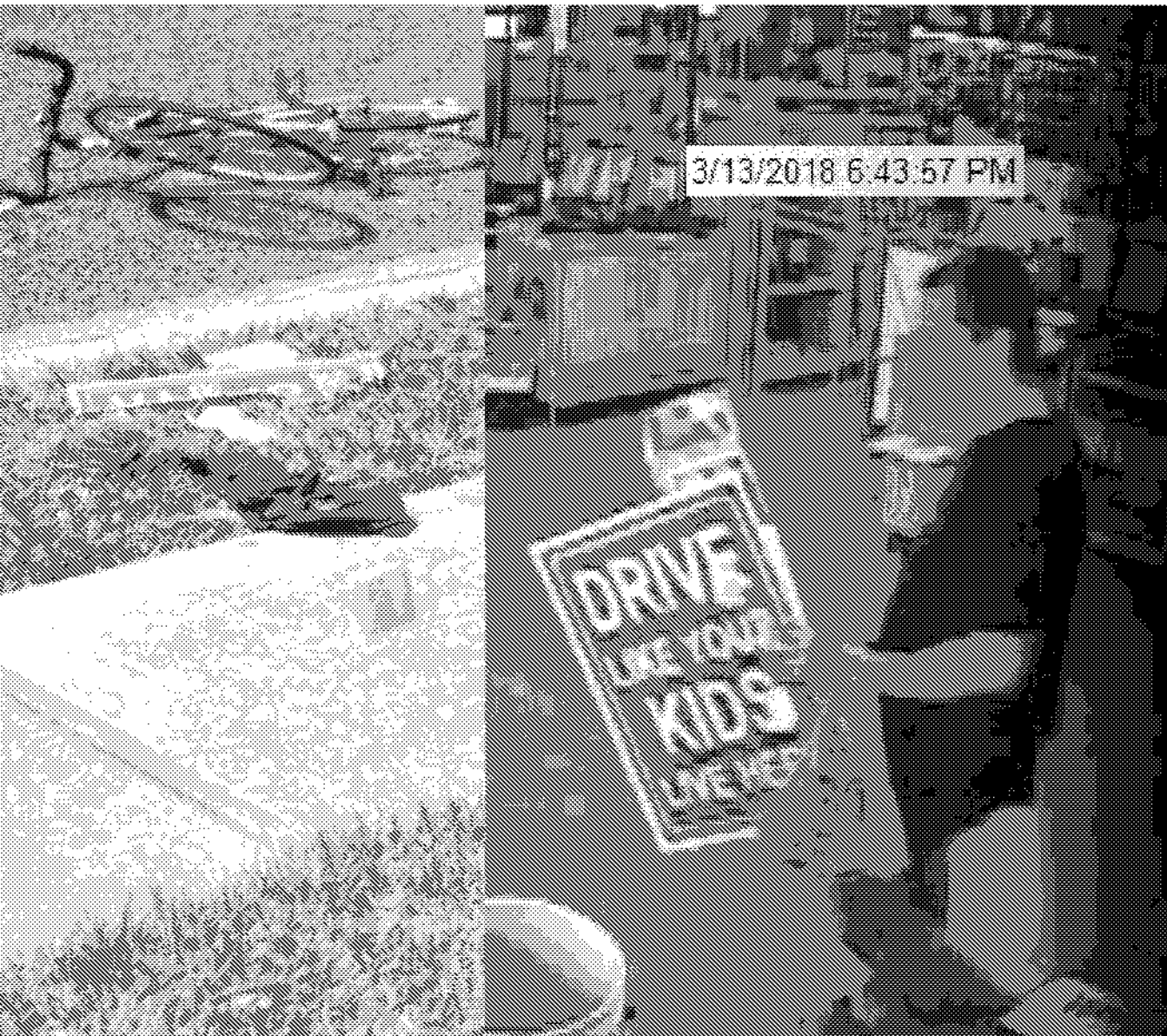
PACKAGES DROPPED OFF

Federal officials say two packages were dropped off at a FedEx Office on Brodie Lane around 7:30 Sunday night.

The packages then made their way to a FedEx facility in Schertz, Texas to be processed.



- Agents retrieved parking lot surveillance footage from another business near FedEx
- Witness identified suspect as driving this truck, a red Ford Ranger



- On March 20, 2018 agents learned that the male in this picture had purchased the gloves and sign from Round Rock, Texas Home Depot
- Paid cash
- Male got into a red pickup truck to leave store

- Afternoon of March 20, 2018, law enforcement analyzed receipts from a local electronics retailer and compared it to Texas motor vehicle registrations Ford Rangers
- Found "Mark Conditt" had purchased battery holder matching those used in all of the bombs
- The only "Mark Conditt" in the Texas DL database resided in Pflugerville
- Conditt had NOT been identified in investigation prior to March 20, 2018

CLOSING IN ON CONDITT

- Law enforcement surrounds Conditt home while paperwork being drafted
- Miscommunication with fire/EMS resources resulted in an ambulance being dispatched to the residence
 - EMS knocks on the door!?!
 - Bomber not home. One of his two roommates answers the door



- Two unknown individuals arrive at bomber's home, go to the door, quickly leave, and drive towards a FedEx drop-box
- Bomb dog was reported to have hit on FedEx drop-box nearby
- Law enforcement surrounds them, questions and releases them.

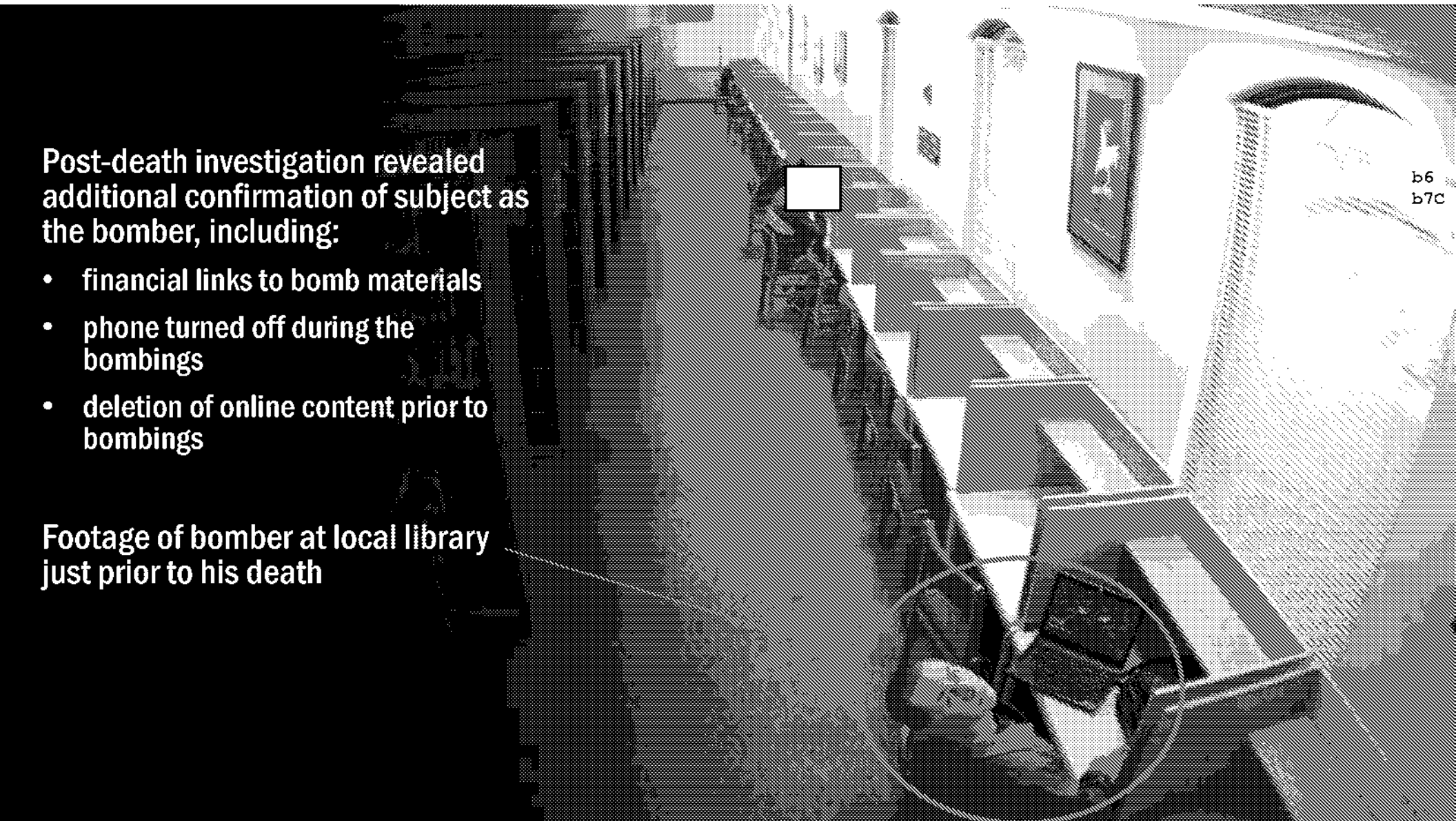


SEARCH OF CONDITT'S HOUSE

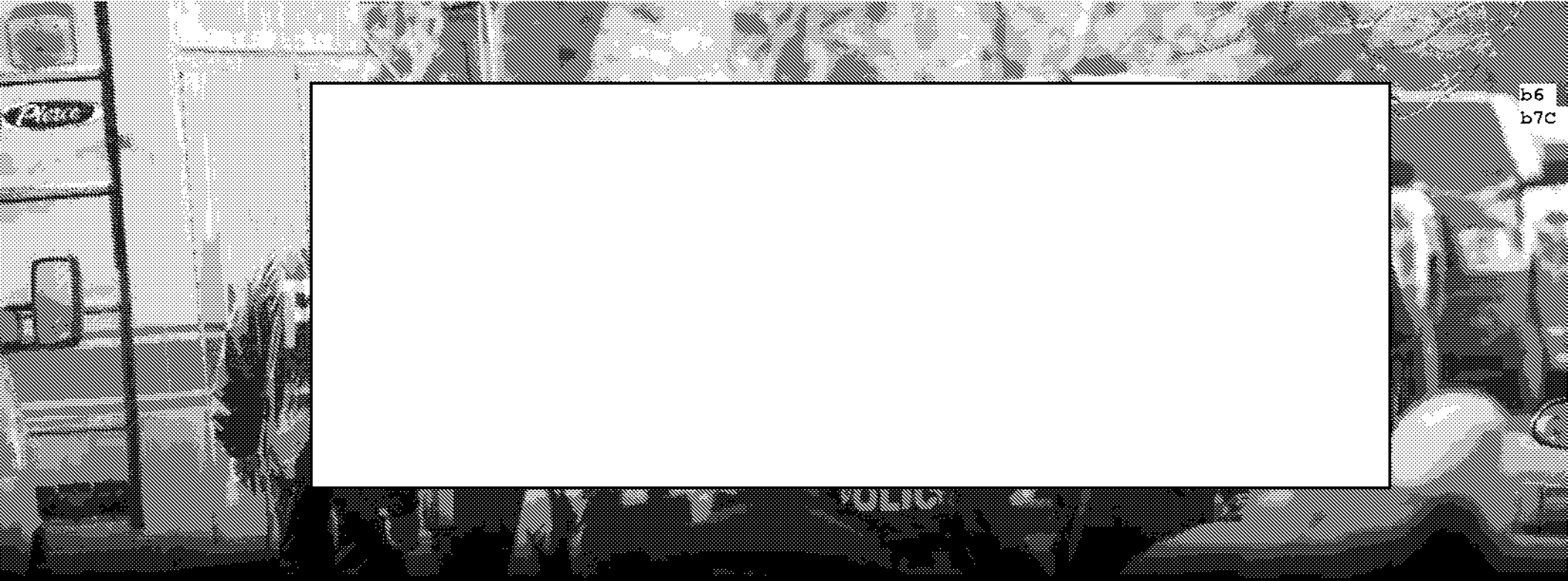

FBI ASSETS SUPPORTING BOMBING INVESTIGATION IN AUSTIN, TEXAS

The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) deployed more than 600 personnel to Austin, Texas in support of the seven bombing incidents in March 2018. The bombings killed two and injured four victims. The seventh bombing ended with a third fatality – the subject himself. With the Austin Police Department (APD) as the lead law enforcement agency on the case, the FBI worked together with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), the U.S. Postal Service and the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) to support the operation from a joint command center at the Combined Transportation Emergency Communications Center (CTECC), located in Austin, Texas. [REDACTED]

Critical accomplishments on scene:

- FBI Evidence Response Teams participated in the collection of evidence at 11 crime scenes.
- FBI SWAT assisted APD in executing a warrant at the subject's residence.
- FBI's investigative efforts resulted in the location of the subject in his vehicle, which enabled APD to contain him. This kept him from entering the highway and injuring others.

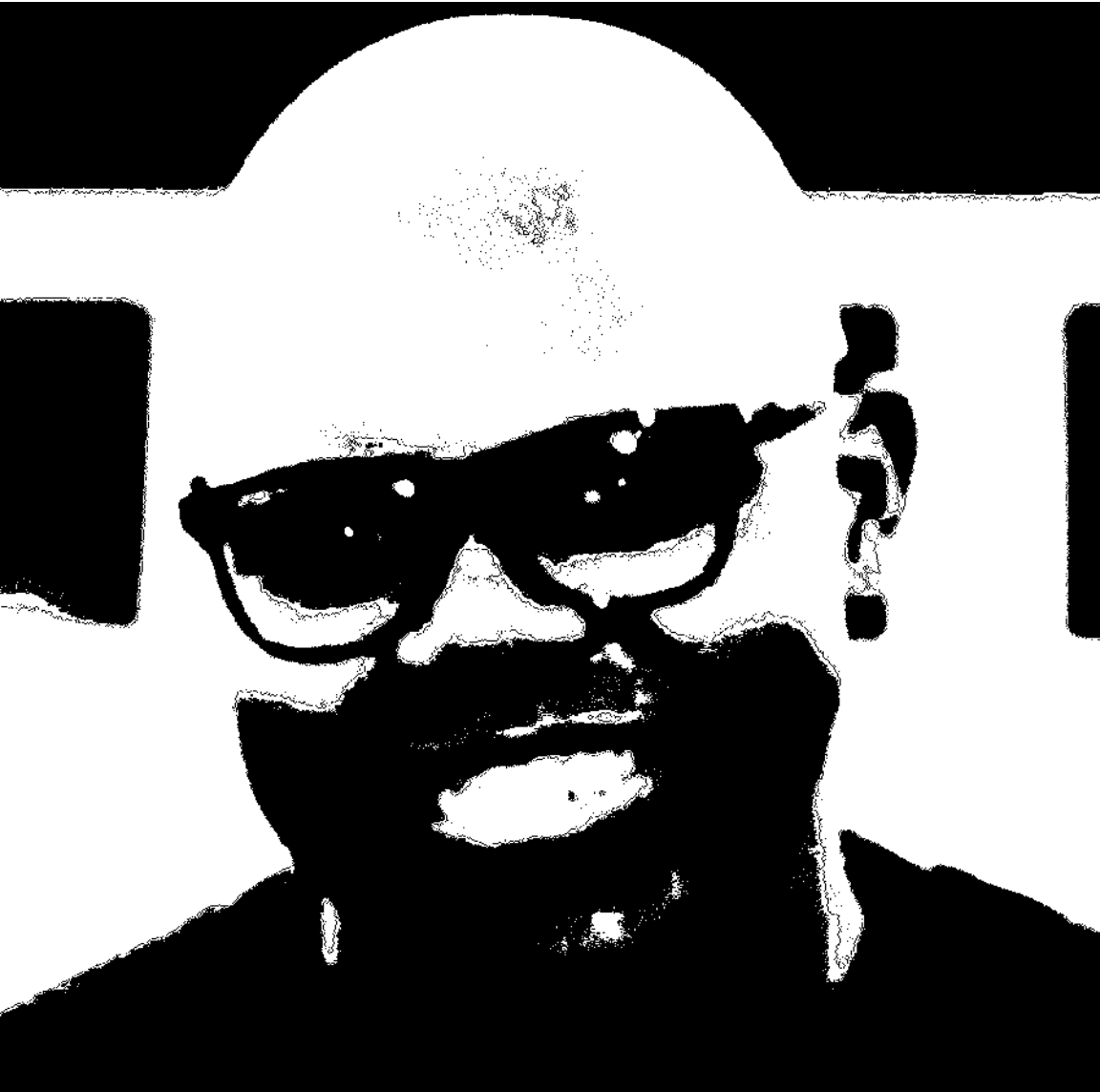

AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT, ATF AND FBI SEEK INFORMATION ON PACKAGE BOMB MURDERS

Austin, TX - Chief Brian Manley, Austin Police Department (APD), Special Agent in Charge (SAC) Christopher Combs, San Antonio Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), and SAC Frederick J. Milanowski, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), Houston Field Division, announced the three agencies are now offering a reward of up to \$100,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person(s) responsible for the package bombs which recently injured and killed several Austin residents. An additional \$15,000 reward has been offered separately through Texas Crime Stoppers.

More than 500 law enforcement personnel are actively involved in the investigation. Homicide detectives, bomb technicians, forensic mappers, chemists, intelligence and forensic analysts, K9 explosive and accelerant detection teams, evidence recovery teams, the FBI's Critical Incident Response Group, and the ATF's National Response Team are all collaborating to identify those responsible.

The investigation is focusing on three package bomb explosions which killed two and injured two victims. Authorities believe the three incidents are related.
