BY WAY OF BACKGROUND, DURING LATE EVENING HOURS OF DECEMBER 6, 1991, AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT AND FIRE DEPARTMENT PERSONNEL RESPONDED TO THE SCENE OF A FIRE AT THE "I CAN'T BELIEVE IT'S YOGURT" STORE LOCATED AT 2949 WEST ANDERSON LANE, AUSTIN, TEXAS. UPON EXTINGUISHING THE FIRE, REPRESENTATIVES OF THE AUSTIN FIRE DEPARTMENT (AFD) LOCATED THE BADLY BURNED AND BOUND BODIES OF FOUR (4) YOUNG WHITE FEMALES IN THE REAR OF THE BUSINESS. AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT (APD) HOMICIDE DETECTIVES ALONG WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE BUREAU OF ALCOHOL, TOBACCO AND FIREARMS (ATF) WERE CALLED TO THE SCENE.

THE INITIAL ASSESSMENT OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES INVOLVED IS THAT THE FOUR VICTIMS WERE BOUND AND MURDERED FOLLOWING THE APPARENT ROBBERY OF THE BUSINESS. A FIRE WAS THEN STARTED AT THE BUSINESS LOCATION IN AN APPARENT ATTEMPT TO DESTROY ANY/ALL EVIDENCE.

INTENSIVE INVESTIGATIVE EFFORTS HAVE BEEN ONGOING IN AN AS YET UNSUCCESSFUL EFFORT TO SOLVE THIS MOST SERIOUS CRIME.

IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT THE ROBBERY/MURDERS OF THESE FOUR (4) YOUNG PEOPLE, RANGE IN AGE FROM 13-17 YEARS, HAS BEEN DESCRIBED AS ONE OF THE MOST SERIOUS AND HEINOUS CRIMINAL ACTS IN THE HISTORY OF AUSTIN AND THE CENTRAL TEXAS AREA. EXTENSIVE MEDIA ATTENTION HAS BEEN DIRECTED TOWARD THIS MATTER AND ONGOING EFFORTS BY LAW ENFORCEMENT TO SOLVE THE OFFENSE. A REWARD OF \$35,000 IS CURRENTLY OFFERED FOR INFORMATION LEADING TO THE IDENTIFICATION, ARREST AND CONVICTION OF THE SUBJECT(S) RESPONSIBLE FOR THIS OFFENSE.

TO DATE, APD HAS SOUGHT THE ASSISTANCE OF MULTIPLE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES, INCLUDING ATF (ARSON ASPECT OF INVESTIGATION) AND TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY (DPS) WITH SPECIFIC CONCENTRATION ON DPS INTELLIGENCE UNIT,

ON DECEMBER 20, 1991, APD, ATF AND DPS HELD A WORKING CONFERENCE AT DPS HEADQUARTERS, AUSTIN, TEXAS, TO REVIEW AND THOROUGHLY ANALYZE ALL AVAILABLE EVIDENCE DEVELOPED IN THIS MATTER TO DATE AT THE REQUEST OF APD AND DPS - LIEUTENANT [REDACTED] [REDACTED] THE SAN ANTONIO DIVISION FBI PROFILING COORDINATOR AND TWO (2) ADDITIONAL INVESTIGATIVE PERSONNEL FROM THE AUSTIN RESIDENT AGENCY.

ON DECEMBER 19, 1991 AND DECEMBER 23, 1991, SAC, SAN ANTONIO WAS BRIEFED REGARDING THIS MATTER AND REQUESTED FBI ASSISTANCE. SAC, SAN ANTONIO IS STRONGLY IN SUPPORT OF PROVIDING ON-SITE NCAVC ASSISTANCE TO THE CAPTIONED APD HOMICIDE INVESTIGATION AS A PRIORITY EFFORT.

# Slaughter of four girls in capital yogurt shop has officials stumped



AUSTIN (AP) - Police are awaiting a concrete lead, parents are angry and whoever killed four teen-age girls still is at large.

It has been more than three weeks since the four teen-agers were found tied up and shot to death at a Northwest Austin yogurt shop. Police said that although they had received nearly 1,000 calls, they still had no suspects.

"I'm feeling some anger now and want to see the SOB's caught," said Bob Ayers, the father of one of the victims.

On Dec. 6, police responded to a fire at an I Can't Believe It's Yogurt shop. They found the four bodies in the back of the store. Police believe the fire was started to cover up the murders.

The victims, who police say each were shot once in the back of the head, were Jennifer Harbison, 17; her sister, Sarah Harbison, 15; Eliza Thomas, 17; and Amy Ayers, 13. Jennifer Harbison and Thomas were store employees.

"I'm sorry to say there's little evidence," said Lt. Andrew Waters. "It's getting very frustrating. We've run through most of the phone tips

we've had. The information has dried up and we haven't gotten anything."

The FBI's behavioral sciences experts are compiling a profile of possible suspects and the state's Department of Public Safety already has developed a profile.

The Las Cruces, N.M., Police Department, which has been trying to solve a similar case since Feb. 1990, also contacted the Austin police.

As part of their own research, police have researched recent parolees with a history of attempting to hide crimes with fires. But, Waters said, none of the efforts yet have led to any suspects.

"We've questioned a lot of people and taken statements from a lot of people, but nothing firm has developed," Waters said. "We're still hopeful that the right information could come in at any time."

"We feel that at this point there's bound to be somebody who's heard something about it, at least second-hand. These kinds of things can't be kept quiet. It's got to be almost impossible."

If a person provides information through Crime Stoppers, they are eligible for up to \$37,000 in reward money.

On Friday January 3rd, 1992, The Austin Police Department formed the I.C.B.Y. Task Force consisting of the following law enforcement agencies:

Austin Police Department  
Austin Fire Department  
Federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms  
Federal Bureau of Investigation  
Texas Department of Public Safety  
Travis County Sheriff's Office  
Travis County District Attorney's Office

The goal of the task force is to identify, arrest and prosecute those responsible for the murders of the four young girls at the "I CAN'T BELIEVE IT'S YOGURT" store on December 6th 1991, in Austin, Travis County Texas. To reach this goal the task force developed a major crime assessment based on an in-depth examination of the details of the crime.

Central to the development of this assessment is the expertise of the Texas Department of Public Safety Intelligence Unit, The F.B.I.'s National Center for the Analysis of Violent Crime, based in Quantico, Virginia. Assessments are developed as a result of in-depth research of similar crimes both nationally and internationally.

An assessment of the crime was developed which outlined probable personality characteristics of the offenders. When multiple offenders are involved in a crime, one has a more dominant personality than the others. Research indicates similar crimes are committed by similar personalities who lead similar life styles. The method and the manner in which crimes are committed often relates directly to the personality characteristics of the

offender. The prepared assessment speaks primarily to the dominant offender's personality.

The assessment of the "I.C.B.Y. Murders" are as follows:

Although the race of the offenders in this case is difficult to determine, it is probable that the killers are white, although other races cannot be eliminated on this basis alone due to the fact that other races frequent this commercialized area.

The age of the offenders is difficult to establish, but in all probability they are in their late teens to mid twenties; if they are older they will still function socially and emotionally within this age range.

The offender would have consumed alcohol and/or drugs prior to the offense and would have continued their use afterwards.

It is doubtful that the offender completed high school and he would have been considered an underachiever with less than average grades. He would have been a major discipline problem for school officials as well as his parents.

This offender definitely resents any form of discipline, i.e., parents, school, employment, police, etc.

This offender has an explosive personality and angers easily, especially when drinking alcohol and/or using drugs. He is an impulsive person who acts without considering the consequences of his acts.

Any physical confrontations he may become involved in will only occur when he is in a "sure-win" situation such as having the advantage over someone with less strength. Before any confrontation with any adult male, he must have the security of having his friends present.

This offender in all probability is unemployed, or if employed, will be in a menial type employment not requiring contact with the public. This offender will have a history of frequently changing jobs and his work records will reflect that he is less than a dependable employee with higher

than average absenteeism.

This offender will usually live in some sort of "dependent" relationship with an older person, possibly a parent upon whom he is partially financially dependent.

This offender frequents the area of the yogurt shop and is familiar with roadways and stores in the vicinity.

The offender's personal appearance will be in accord with his peer group but it will appear "thuggy" to the conservative element of the community. He has little pride in his personal appearance such as his hair, clothing, etc.. In other words, he presents himself to be what he is, a thug.

The offender in all likelihood has a past criminal history.

This offender is a very unpredictable, impulsive type of individual who will act without considering the consequences.

He will be abusive in any relationships he may have with females, and he will probably seek out females who are younger and less adequate than himself.

In all probability, the offender is a resident of the area.

This offender has no remorse or concern that he has killed the victims. He is under a tremendous amount of stress from fear of detection and apprehension because the commission of this crime may not have gone as planned. The offender is very concerned about the loyalty of his accomplices because he knows they regret their involvement in this crime. In cases such as this in which there are multiple offenders, many times disharmony will develop between the offenders as their stress level rises along with their increased paranoia, causing them to doubt each others loyalty. Because of their paranoia they will maintain close contact with each other for a period of time even though at some point there may be a falling out between the offenders that could lead to violence.

Immediately after leaving the scene, the offenders would have gone to a secure location to clean up or change clothes even though the crime scene does not indicate that they would have a lot of blood on them.

There is a possibility that the offenders returned to the area that same night to observe the police and fire department personnel at the scene.

It is doubtful the offenders are employed, but if so, they would not have worked the following day or possibly several days afterwards even if they were scheduled to do so. If they did go to work afterwards, it would have been to avoid community suspicion of their involvement in this crime.

To escape the tremendous stress of the situation, the offenders may have temporarily left town, and would have given reasons to those who know them that would appear to be legitimate.

Based upon a review of the analysis of Lt. [REDACTED] the NCAVC concurred in his assessment that captioned matter involved two offenders, one a dominant and one a weaker personality. Additional details of the analysis were disseminated by Lt. [REDACTED] to the FBI Austin, NCAVC and APD, and will not be repeated here.

By referenced SA teletype, the SAC, San Antonio requested immediate consideration for an on-site NCAVC consultation and assistance at Austin, in an effort to provide full FBI support in this priority investigation. Pursuant to that request, SSA [REDACTED] travelled to Austin, Texas on January 3, 1992.

In Texas, SSA [REDACTED] met with APD, Austin Fire Department, TDPS, Austin FBI, and forensic laboratory officials. An overview of the services provided by the NCAVC, with emphasis on captioned matter was discussed, as well as a point by point presentation and explanation of the crime scene analysis prepared by Lt. [REDACTED]. The behavioral viewpoint expressed in this analysis was unanimously accepted by those present at this meeting. Additionally interview and interrogation techniques were extensively discuss, as well as the use of Scientific Content Analysis (SCAN), Behavioral Analysis Interview (BAI), and other investigative techniques, in the event that a suspect is developed. Media releases designed to increase the stress level of the offender were also discussed.

Following the meeting, police, fire and FBI officials met with family of the victims and shared the status of the investigation to the extent possible. Continued FBI support and assistance in this case was pledged by FBI Austin and the NCAVC.

**This man and his accomplices killed these four young girls at the I Can't Believe It's Yogurt! store on West Anderson Lane on December 6, 1991.**

According to the police this man is probably white and between the ages of 17 and 28. If he is older, he still acts like a young man and seems socially and emotionally immature. He's probably a high school dropout and an underachiever. He was probably a major discipline problem at school and is likewise probably a poor and unreliable employee who misses work frequently, if he is employed at all. If he does have a job he probably did not come to work the following day and possibly for days after December 6.

The killer has no remorse or concern that he killed these girls. However, at this time he is under tremendous stress and fear that he will be discovered and arrested because of this crime, which probably did not go as he had planned. This man is very concerned about the loyalty of his partners because he knows that they regret their involvement in this crime. **THE KILLER AND HIS PARTNERS ARE PROBABLY STICKING CLOSE TOGETHER** to be sure that one of them doesn't talk about this crime. As the pressure on them mounts from the continuing investigation they may become extremely anxious and watchful of each other causing further stress on the relationship. This stress may lead to violence.

The killer and his accomplices may have temporarily left town soon after December 6th in order to avoid the tremendous stress of this situation. They may have returned recently to Austin.

The killer has an explosive personality and angers easily, seeming to become much more angry than a situation calls for. This is especially so when he has been consuming alcohol and/or drugs. He is impulsive and acts without considering the consequences of his acts. He would probably only confront another individual if surrounded by his buddies and only acts boldly if he is in a "sure-win" situation.

This man probably lives in North Austin. He frequents the area of the yogurt shop and West Anderson Lane and is familiar with the shops and streets of the area. He probably lives with some older person such as a parent on whom he is financially dependent. He may have a girlfriend who is younger and less adequate than himself; if so, he most probably abuses this woman.

# Thousands protest abortion

Led by the Knights of Columbus in their plumed hats and colorful robes, thousands of Texans from around the state marched up Congress Avenue on Saturday to join the annual anti-abortion Texas rally for Life at the Capitol. Speakers at the event said they were heartened by the expectation that the U.S. Supreme Court will agree to some restrictions on a woman's right to abort her child. But they warned that the real battle — winning passage of anti-abortion legislation in each state — lies ahead. And they repeatedly

chastised Texas' two top officials — Gov. Ann Richards and Lt. Gov. Bob Bullock — for opposing such measures.

The Supreme Court on Tuesday agreed to rule on Pennsylvania's abortion law. Most observers predict the conservative court will limit the constitutional protections for abortion rights set in the landmark 1973 decision *Roe vs. Wade*.

"Abortion takes the lives of 82,000 Texans a year," said Lisa Salcedo of the Texas Right to Life Committee. "We must take action. We must elect pro-life candidates to every elected office."

# Despite critics, workers' comp law appears to be accomplishing goals

After a full year in effect, the state's new workers' compensation law appears to be working as intended: Claims costs are down, and fewer workers are hiring attorneys to seek compensation for on-the-job injuries. The organized labor and lawyers, who fought the repeal of the law in 1989, have won the first round of a lawsuit to overturn it. The statute's "success" comes at the expense of injured workers. The law took effect Jan. 1, 1991, and even supporters say it will take at least two years before it can be fully implemented. But their first reports are good. "The most important thing is grabbing hold and not letting go," said Sen. Bob Glas-

gow, D-Stephenville, chairman of the Legislative Oversight Committee on Workers' Compensation.

For example, the State Board of Insurance recently surveyed 30 insurance companies that collect about 80 percent of the annual \$4.1

billion in premiums for workers' comp. The board looked at all claims, regardless of how much time was lost from the job, and compared the first half of 1991 with the first half of 1990.

The study found that the number of claims dipped 1.2 percent under the new law. And the cost of compensating injured workers dropped 10.9 percent — from \$668.1 million to \$595.3 million.

Moreover, according to the most recent figures from the Texas Workers' Compensation Commission, employees filed about 11 percent fewer claims for the first 11 months of 1991 than for the same period of 1990. The number include only cases where employees missed at least a week of work. The new law is not responsible for the decline.

During the late evening hours of December 6, 1991 (Friday), Austin Police Department (APD), and Austin Fire Department (AFD), personnel responded to the scene of a fire at the "I Can't Believe It's Yogurt" Store at 2949 West Anderson Lane, Austin, Texas. Upon extinguishing the fire, AFD personnel discovered the badly burned bodies of four female, teen-age victims. They had been bound and executed utilizing a firearm(s). Two of the victims were employees of the store and the other two were friends who had stopped to help them close up. The victims were active in Future Farmers of America (FFA) Programs and were of good reputation.

This matter is being investigated by the Austin Police Department and Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, assisted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on an as needed basis. This involvement has included the assistance of the FBI Behavioral Science Unit to prepare a criminal profile of the offender(s). This profile, prepared in conjunction with Lieutenant [redacted] Texas Department of Public Safety (TDPS), suggests that there are probably at least two offenders and that the incident initially began as a robbery. It is believed that the offenders are white, males, and that one has a dominant personality. This individual is probably between the ages of 17-26, or had a maturity level in this range. He is probably a high school dropout and underachiever, as well as a major discipline problem. If he is employed, he is probably a poor and unreliable employee who did not come to work the day following the murders. He has an explosive personality, angers easily and

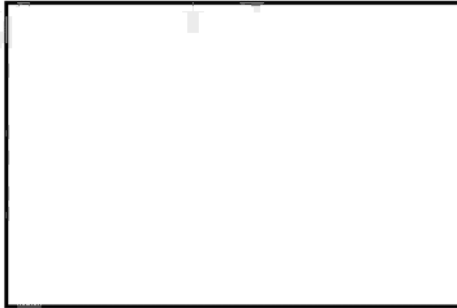

It was explained to AUSA [redacted] that the FBI has been providing assistance to the Austin Police Department at their request as a Domestic Police Cooperation matter, but that departmental regulations restrict the FBI's ability to conduct active investigation in purely Domestic Police Cooperation matters. AUSA [redacted] was in agreement that the above incident is a possible violation of the Hobbs Act and that the FBI has the authority to conduct active investigation to ascertain if there has been a violation of this statute. Accordingly, the FBI will conduct appropriate investigation in cooperation with the Austin Police Department and Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms.

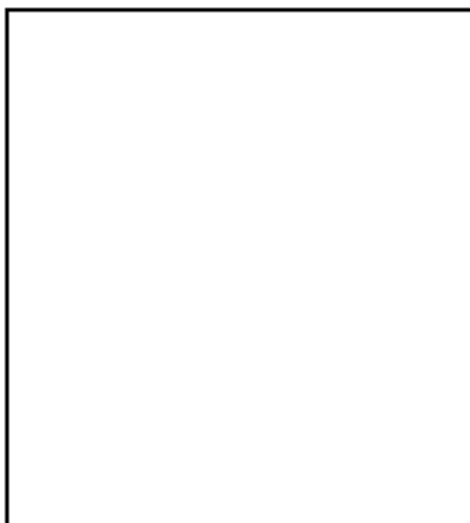

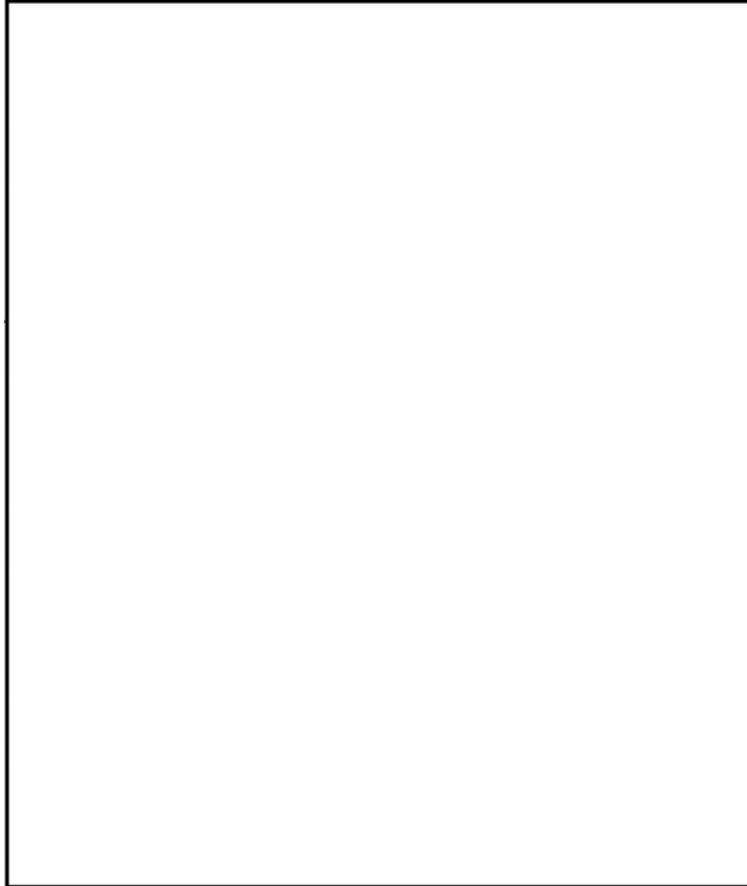

Detective [ ] has continued working the investigation concerning the murders in Las Cruces, New Mexico and he advised there were enough similarities between the two murders that he will maintain contact with the Austin Police Department and is contemplating making a trip to Austin, Texas, to share similarities between the two cases when time becomes available. Specifically, Detective [ ] advised the similarities included the weapon used, the fact the victims were taken to the back to be murdered and the location was subsequently burned following the murders. Detective [ ] further advised it was his understanding the projectiles were destroyed in the murders which occurred in Austin, Texas and a task force in Texas investigating these homicides is actively pursuing leads concerning suspects unknown to Albuquerque Division.

Detective [ ] advised if the task force in Texas is unable to complete its investigation without developing a viable suspect, he will consider traveling to Austin, Texas and share first hand details of his case with those of the Austin, Texas case.
