
Dear Sir:

The Division is in receipt of a letter dated April 3,
1934, from Alvah Todd, Fingerprint Expert, Box 1722, Casper,
Wyoming, wherein he makes inquiry as to whether Fred Barker and

It is not clear from Mr. Todd's letter why he has made

interview Mr. Todd for the purpose of obtaining from him any in-
formation in his possession concerning the whereabouts of any of
