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

A photograph of Arthur R.Barker identical with the one appearing in the American Bankers Association Protective Bulletin undoubtedly will be found in the files of the Identification Unit. If such is the case it is suggested that the American Bankers Association at New York City be advised of its error, and that they be provided with a proper photograph of HARRY CAMPBELL for publication in their bulletin.

Smith MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR Candy Re: Bremer Case Oureon. I telephoned Mr. Miller at the Kansas City Office with reference to the escape of the above from the Bureau Agents. Mr. Miller stated that

a complaint was filed against Leo charging him with harboring Volney Davis, and the Agents proceeded to Leo's apartment for the purpose of arresting him; that the Agents who comprised the party were as follows: Shanehan, Bryce, Parry, Scott and (fifth Agent not remembered). There was also a Deputy Sheriff with the party, this Deputy having lived in the same apartment house.

Mr. Miller stated that the Agents and the Deputy proceeded to the apartment occupied by Leo, and there were three men in the apartment. He stated that while he is not sure as to how the situation was arranged, he believes that two of the Agents went inside while three remained outside and the Deputy remained across the street. Mr. Miller further stated that he has not had a chance to get the complete facts from the Agents. and does not know how they came to apprehend one of the men in the apartment and let the other two escape; that, however, it is his understanding that some one in the beer place must have tipped the men off.

I instructed Mr. Miller to immediately ascertain the names of all the Agents participating in this raid, get statements from them in detail as to their activities on the time in question, and forward to the Bureau as soon as possible a complete telegraphic summary of the circumstances; that the statements of the Agents should be forwarded via air mail and special delivery to the Bureau immediately thereafter. I instructed him to give this metter his immediate and personal attention.

With reference to the men in custody, Mr. Miller stated that this man has not as yet been fingerprinted, but is known to the Sheriff's Office there. I instructed him to immediately fingerprint this man and send his prints in so that we might be positive as to who the man is. I further instructed Mr. Miller to have this man thoroughly questioned as to the robberies of the banks at Okemah, Oklahoma and Drexel, Missouri, reminding him that Doyle had stated that these men were implicated in the robbery of the bank at Okemah

and since it is known that at least six men participated in the robbery of the bank at Okemah, it is possible that the men in question are implicated; that although the man has been picked up, our work does not stop there in that we have to have some evidence to substantiate and justify our actions. I instructed him to have this angle of the matter pursued with vigor.

There is transmitted herewith the fingerprints of an individual by the name of Harold Jene Miller, who was reported by informant Enoch Seal, City Marshal, Poplarville, Miss., as being identical in likeness with subject William Weaver, I. 0. 1238. This individual is teaching dancing around Poplarville and Picayune, Miss., and living at the Peach Tree Hotel, Picayoune, Miss. and voluntarily submitted to the taking of the aforementioned fingerprints.

Harold Jene Miller, while bearing some resemblance to the description of subject Weaver, was not found, from finger-prints to be identical.

Kindly compare these prints with records of the Identification Unit of the Federal Bureau and ascertain whether this individual is wanted,

No information relative to Davis or Emphell could be obtained at Las Veget and Boulder City, Nevada. Officers and contacts there advised they would notify Salt Lake City office immediately if they we are seen. H.J. McSherry, Alcoholic Unit, Treasury Department, identifies Campbell by him about Reno, Neveda. identifies Campbell's picture as individual recently seen, William Brooks, formerly Sheriff, now Postmaster, St. George, Utah, was interviewed. He advised that on the morning of March 1, 1935, the clerk in the office failed to change the month calendar, and for a few hours the mail read that morning as 2-29-35; that while his slerk Earl Cannon was in the process of sorting the mail; he moticed an airmail stamp of the old style, which he commonly refers to as a "54 stamp". The postmaster states that Cannon brought the letter to him and that he permitted it to go on its way. He advised that he 2 - Los Angeles. 2 - Chicago. 2 - Salt Lake. did not know who deposited this letter in the post office. A photograph of Volney Davis was exhibited to Postmaster William Brooks, and he stated that he never saw anyone of that likeness about St. George, whereupon photographs of Harry Campbell, Alvin Karpis and numerous other associates of these individuals were exhibited to Mr. Brooks, and he stated that the only one who was familiar was Harry Campbell, who he believes he positively saw at St. George, possibly in the Post Office; that for some time there was a letter held at General Delivery, addressed to Harry Campbell, and that this letter was called for on March 1, 1935, or possibly a day before this day, or the day after, but the Postmaster was of the opinion that it was about the first of the month.

Relative to the stamp which was used on this letter, the Postmaster stated that all stamps were collected months and months ago of this type, and that a 6¢ stamp has been in use, and this is the first time that he noticed one passing through the Post Office for over a year. He stated that it might possibly come from some small Post Office located down in Arizona, or some mining camp away out in the interior of Nevada or Utah, but that none of them were sold around that vicinity at the present time. Mr. Brooks further stated that the country directly south of St. George is in Arizona, and that it was pretty bad country between St. George and Flagstaff; that numerous bad men have hidden out there, and it would be a logical place for Davis to hide if he was really wanted very bad by the Government or any particular State.

Earl Cannon, Post Office Clerk, advised that on the morning of March 1, 1935, he failed to change the month and date on the cancalling machine, and that for a number of hours that morning it read as 2-29-35; that while in the process of cancalling stamps, he noticed a 5¢ airmail stamp and that said letter was addressed to somebody in Kansas City, Mo.; that he showed the stamp to the Postmaster, who told him to permit it to go through, Mr. Cannon states he has been at the Post Office for about 12 years, and that he is familiar with all people calling for mail, whereupon photographs of all individuals were exhibited to him in connection with this case, and he picked out the picture of Harry Campbell as being the only person resembling anyone of the group, who he believes he has seen in and about St. George recently. Mr. Cannon further recalls that there was a letter for Harry Campbell for General Delivery for some time, and that someone called for it around the first of the month. He further stated that he could not possibly recall. where anyone could secure a 5¢ stamp, airmail, as they are totally foreign to that Post Office, but that possibly someone who bought a supply in a mining camp might still have them, and the letter might have come in through that channel. However, he said that is the first one he has seen of that type for over a year.

Lity Marshal at St. George. All photographs of the so called Bremer, mob were exhibited to him, and the only one that he could pick out as resembling anyone seen recently in the tisinity of St. George was Harry Campbell. He stated that all other photographs were unfamiliar to him. He believes that possibly ten or fifteen days ago a man appearing like Campbell was seen on the street by him in St. George. To the best of his recollection he was short, thin type of fellow, with a face like the photograph of Harry Campbell exhibited to him by this agent.

The Sheriff advised that the only construction work being done in that vicinity was by C.D. Alsop, who is operating under the name of the Arrowhead Oil Co., said company at the present time wild catting on oil wells on Covernment land in that vicinity.

stated that the picture of Volney Davis was familiar to him; that about two or three weeks ago two men drove up to the Escalante Well in an automobile, description of the car unknown, possibly a Ford, and one of them came up to the well base and asked him for employing, stating that he could do most anything; that he refused to hire the man and got back in the car and drove away. Mr. Alsop states that this man positively looked like the photograph of Volney Davis. He further stated he has not seen this man about the vicinity of St. George since that time, and he further stated that he did not recall seeing any of the other individual whose photographs were exhibited to him, which included alvin Karpis, Harry Campbell, Dr. Moran, and all other available pictures of the so-called Bremer mob.

E.J. Pickett, District attorney, St. George, Utah, was interviewed, and all photographs of the Bremer mob were exhibited to him, but he could not identify any of them as resembling any stranger seen in the vicinity of St. George, in recent months. He stated however, that if he received any information of any strangers hiding out in that vicinity, he would immediately communicate with the Salt Lake City Bureau office.

All filling stations, the Liberty Hotel, the Arrowhead

Hotel, and garages in St. George, were canvassed, but no one could recall seeing any of the Bremer mob as reflected by the photographs, in their places of business.

Sheriff John H. Cottan and Postmaster William Brooks were furnished with additional photographs of Volney Davis, Alvin Karpis and Harry Campbell, and they advised that in the event they see or hear anything that might be of interest to the Government in connection with these individuals, they would immediately call the Salt Lake City Bureau office.

At the various hotels, particularly the Liberty and the Arrowhead, the writer purchased sirmled stamps, but they were of the ordinary 6¢ type. None of the filling stations were carrying any stamps, that were called upon.

While enroute to Les Vegas, Nevada, from St. George, Utah, the writer stopped at all tourist camps, but none of the attendants at these places could recollect seeing anyone resembling the photographs of Harry Campbell, Volney Davis, or Alvin Karpis, and other members of this mob, passing through there recently.

以外,接触的基次,有数约 At Las Vegas, Mevada, the writer contacted Deputy Sheriff Homer Grove, who is considered a reliable person in the Sheriff's office. He stated that after viewing all photographs in the possession of the writer relative to the Bremer case, that the face of Volney Davis and Harry Campbell were familiar to him; that these individuals were in Las Vegas some time back, possible a year and a half ago, but he has not seen them about that vicinity since. He spent practically all night making the various clubs and liquor and beer rooms with H.J. McSherry and D.W. Doyle agents of the Alcoholic Unit, Treasury Department and a number of these places they raided, but no one resembling any of the Bremer mob was seen in these places. Mr. Grove advised that he will make constant repeated efforts practically every evening until the late hours of the morning, attempting to ascertain whether any of the individuals desired by the Government were at Las Vegas at the present time.

D.W. Doyle, Alcoholic Unit, Treasury Department, who is attending Court and making investigations at Las Vegas, Nevada, advised that all photographs exhibited to him were unfamiliar to him, with the exception of Harry Campbell, who he thinks he possibly saw in Reno. He accompanied by H.J. Sherry, and Deputy Sheriff Grove, spent practically all night of March 6, visiting places where liquor was being sold, and gambling was going on, but they reported the following morning that they were unable to find any of the persons desired by the Government.

H.J. Sherry, Alcoholic Unit, Treasury Department, stationed at Reno, Nevada, was in Las Vegas, Nevada, and all photographs were exhibited to him and he stated that the only face that was familiar was that of Harry Campbell, whom he stated he had seen previously at Reno about a year and a half ago when there was a bunch in town, and he stated that some time during the last few days he has seen this face in Reno, possibly at the Bank Club. He stated he was returning to Reno in the next 24 hours and would attempt to locate this individual if possible.

Bill Wright, 431 Fremont St., Standard Oil Station, Las Vegas, Nev., who greases practically all automobfles stopping at that station for that type of work, advised that the photographs of the Bremer

mob were totally unfamiliar to him, but that he would keep a sharp watch and immediately notify the Salt Lake City Bureau office should he see any of these individuals. This individual is considered very reliable, he is related by marriage to Special Agent K. Deaderick.

A confidential informant, who has previously supplied favorable information to the Salt Lake City office, was contacted at Las Vegas, and he advised that he was making all the night clubs and places of entertainment in Las Vegas, but none of the persons who are members of the Bremer mob have been seen there by him. It is to be noted that all photographs of this mob were previously furnished this informant by Special Agent C.E. Weeks of this office on a previous visit to Las Vegas, Nevada. He stated that in the event he saw anyone who resembled any of this mob he would immediately communicate with the Salt Lake City Bureau office.

At Boulder City, Nevada, the writer contacted
W.H. Trimble, Chief Ranger, and exhibited to him all photographs of
the Bremer mob, and personally contacted Warren Corley, Fred Parkinson,
C.F. Peterson, O.P. Senter and W.E. Lukens, Rangers, who frequently
visit the Dam Site, and observe all employees of the Six Companies.
Chief Trimble and these rangers advised upon viewing all photographs
in possession of the writer, that the individuals were unfamiliar
to them. They however stated that they would keep a close watch on
all new arrivals, which were very few, at the Dam, and if they received
any information they would immediately communicate with the Salt Lake
City office of the Bureau. In this connection it might be stated
that the writer personally visited The Meadows, which is operated
by Frank Conaro, a notorious character, which is located in Las Vegas,
Boulder Dam Highway, the Red Rooster located on the Salt Lake highway,
such places being the rendevous of undesirables in Boulder City and
Las Vegas.

He also stated that his concern sells vests almost entirely only to local Police Departments and Sheriffs' offices. He went on to say that because of the large number of raids being made by various gangs on these Police Departments and Sheriffs' offices, it would be impossible to determine from what particular office certain vests were taken.

It will be noted from the above information that no further checking can be made as to the final disposition of these vests or to determine how they came into the possession of the parties from whom they were recovered by us.



When asked if we would rent it my husband said, "no". Then the friend said he could get seventy-five or a hundred dollars a month for it, and they were nice people. Then we said we needed money too badly to refuse.

They left the hote PERPARED telly paying the friend two months in advance. We had no opportunity to see them, they seemed in such a hurry.

Just as this house was finished a few years ago, the Bank of Bay Biscayne in Miami failed and we lost every cent of cash we had in the world.

We all know the world is better off without these Barkers.

They were imposing on us too. They didn't rent the house next door (one that had belonged to our grandmother) and they were using it for their servants. They were told they couldn't rent or use our motor-boat and they were using it constantly. They owed for the last month's rent and I even had to pay a six weeks electric light bill of theirs, for they didn't change the metor to their name.

At first we felt we couldn't open the house to the public. It seemed as the these bullets went through our hearts almost. On opening the house we put up a big sign saying "It proves crime does not pay". Think there is a splendid lesson here which we try to bring out. When one sees how the government's bullets went through iron, steel, two by fours, walls, closets and the entire house just riddled, it surely shows the tremendous power, strength and protection of our government and the utter weakness and folly of crime.

All who see the house say they surely are glad to see the government getting rid of such people. Then they ask what the government is going to do about fixing up the house. My answer is from my heart and I tell them "I can't help but feel a government that stands for Justice will do the right thing by innocent people. I know our government doesn't want innocent people to suffer. When the whole world is blessed by being rid of these people, we too should be blessed, and not stand a financial loss".





He stated that last evening, the office sent May Green, a confidential informant, out to interview Mrs. Harrison, mother of Willie Harrison. At this time, Mrs. Harrison indicated that there was a detective next door. In this connection, Mr. Norris informed that Agent Buchanan of the St. Louis Office is in fact maintaining surveillance of this place from a spot next door. He requested advice as to whether or not this surveillance should be discontinued. I informed him that in view of the above facts, it would not seem desirable to maintain this surveillance. Mr. Norris stated that the only doubt in his mind is whether or not he should be removed immediately, since this action might tend to throw the suspicion of Mrs. Harrison on May Green, the informant. Mr. Alt stated that he granted such authority, in that the plane to be used is merely a commercial one; that Mr. Brown will return to Havana in the morning.


Mr. Alt stated that Agent Brown informed him that they have the car which belonged to Karpis there, and he wanted to talk to the United States Attorney about confiscating this car and bringing it back to the United States, which he thinks can be done under the Cuban laws; that he also thinks that the Cuban authorities will let us have a very valuable motor boat which Karpis had. Mr. Alt stated that Brown has instructions to the effect that unless he is instructed to the contrary, he is to proceed to Miami at 2:30 this afternoon and telephone Mr. Alt immediately upon his arrival at Miami; that in the meantime, he is to do nothing about the car or the motor boat; that in this connection, he can be reached through Mr. Hanson at Miami.

With reference to the property down there, Mr. Alt stated that he would assume full responsibility for the shipment of the money and the diamonds. With reference to the boxes of clothing, etc., I told him to turn these over to the coroner, who is the one to administer such matters. With reference to the other luggage, bags, etc., I told him to write a letter to the coroner informing him that this material will be returned to him as soon as it has been checked.

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Re: FRED AND KATE BARKER, Killed While Resisting Arrest.

On January 8, 1935 the Chicago Office of the Division of Investigation took into custody Arthur R. Barker. Subsequently his apartment was searched and there was found a map of the State of Florida on which were pencilled markings around Ocala, Florida, and Lake Weir. This information coincided with that furnished by Byron Bolton alias Monte Carter, who was also taken into custody by the Chicago Division Office on the evening of January 8, 1935 coincident with the killing of Russell/Gibson while resisting arrest. In giving the information relative to the whereabouts of other members of the Barker-Karpis gang, Bolton was unable to furnish specific names and directions. He did, however, state that the hideaway was located in the central northern part of Florida on an inland fresh water lake famous to persons in that community by reason of the fact that an alligator known as "Big Joe" lived in it. Bolton also advised that members of the gang had participated in deer hunts on the trip made to Florida shortly before his apprehension and three deer had been killed, and that Arthur R. Barker and Russell Gibson had brought a considerable portion of the deer carcasses to Chicago with them.

It was on this information that a squad of fourteen Agents from the Chicago Division Office proceeded to Jacksonville, Florida, and within two days after their arrival had located the house on Lake Weir near Oklawaha, Florida. Investigation in the vicinity disclosed that this house was occupied by Fred Barker and his mother, Kate Barker and that it had been frequented by numerous other persons, usually late at night. Arrangements were made to surround the house on the morning of January 16, 1935. The Agent in charge of the raiding party approached the front of the house around 7:00 A.M. and commanded Kate Barker, who appeared at the front door, to surrender. She was heard to say "Let it go", whereupon the Agent was fired upon, about fifty shots striking the ground in the vicinity where he was standing. The other Agents immediately returned the fire, which appeared to be coming from a second floor window. The firing continued for approximately four hours, after which the house was entered and the bodies of Kate and Fred Barker were located in a second floor bedroom. Both had been firing machine guns which were found on the floor next to their dead bodies. A quantity of guns and appropriation and four bullet-proof vests were recovered Dries DESTROYED RECORDED

The local coroner, after a hearing, held that the decedents had come to their deaths while resisting arrest by the use of firearms.

Investigation disclosed that the house occupied by Fred and Kate Barker was rented under the name of T. C. Blackburn from Carson Bradford, who is President of the Biscayne Kennel Club. It appears that members of the Barker-Karpis gang had been associating with Joe Adams, General Manager of the Biscayne Kennel Club and also Manager of the El Comodoro Hotel in Miami, Florida.

Reference is made to recent communications concerning a letter received by the manager of the Beaumont Apartments, 3028 Baltimore, Kansas City, Missouri and mailed at St. George, Utah, the handwriting of which has been identified by the Bureau's Laboratory as that of Volney Davis.

As the Bureau has been previously advised, arrangements gave been made with the manager of the Beaumont Apartments, Mrs. Schupan, whereby the personal effects left by Davis in the apartment have been stored in a locker in the basement of the building. Mrs. Schupan, upon receipt of any inquiries concerning these personal effects, will advise the inquirer that the key to the locker has been misplaced and in endeavoring to locate the key she will have an opportunity to communicate with this office. She has been furnished with the home telephone numbers of the writer and of Special Agents H. E. Andersen and W. E. Miller in addition to the office telephone number, in order that we may receive immediate notification regardless of the time of day or night such inquiries might be made. In addition, this office is contacting Mrs. Schupan periodically to determine whether or not there has been any developments which she has not reported. From my contact with this woman I am of the opinion that she will cooperate to the fullest ex

During my telephone conversation with Ar. Temm on Merch 1935, I requested advice as to the desirability of stationing Agents at the Beeumont Apartments against the possible return of Paviz. 1435 that time Mr. Temm advised me that he did not consider this procedure necessary in view of the fact that it might tie up the Agents

extended period. I realize that this is true and that the probability of the return of Davis to this address is perhaps not very great. However, I don't think that we should take any chance of missing him should he return, or of obtaining all possible information should he send someone else for the clothing.

The Beaumont Apartments are approximately 22 blocks from this office, and, roughly, the same distance from that section of Kansas City in which most of the Agents assigned to this office reside. Should a telephone call be received during the day time it would be possible to have Agents proceed from the office to the apartment in approximately 20 minutes. About the same time would be required for Agents to proceed from their residences to the apartment. However, in such an event those Agents proceeding from their homes would not be in a position to have any arms, except their side arms.

I can't help but believe that the safer procedure in handling this matter would be to station two Agents at the Beaumont Apartments for a period of not to exceed thirty days in order that there might be no possibility of a slip-up in this matter. Such a procedure would not be desirable from the standpoint of tying up those Agents, but I do not think that we should overlook any possibilities. I would, accordingly, appreciate the advice of the Bureau in the matter.

> On January 22, 1935 an indictment was returned at St. Paul, Minnesota charging Alvin Karpis and others, including an individual known as "Whitie", who has since been identified as one Bruno Austin, with conspiracy to kidnap Edward G. Bremer.

RE: BRUNO TAUSTIN alias

The Bureau during its investigation, looking to the apprehension of Austin, learned that he had been arrested by representatives of the State's Attorney's office at Chicago, Illinois on January 20, 1935 on charges of robbery and bond jumping. Investigation disclosed that Austin, whose correct name is Bruno Putis, was closely associated with Russell Gibson. Gibson was shot and killed while resisting arrest at Chicago, Illinois on January 8, 1935. Austin was arrested on January 20, 1935 just after he had been married.

On November 28, 1932 Austin was sentenced to six months in the House of Correction at Chicago, Illinois and fined \$100 for the crime of auto larceny. On April 16, 1934 he was arrested by the Police Department at Berwyn, Illinois on charges of assault to kill. This case was later dismissed. On June 9, 1934 Austin was arrested by the Police Department, Chicago, Illinois on charge of robbery with a gun and was released under \$10,000 bond and failing to put in an appearance as required, and under this bond was again arrested on January 20, 1935, as related above.

The Federal Government is proceeding against Austin as one of the conspirators in the kidnaping of Edward G. Bremer.



Nathan telephoned from the Kansas City Office requesting my advice as to the continuance of the surveillance being maintained at the apartment formerly occupied by the alleged *Leo". Mr. Nathan stated that the rent on the apartment was up last night, and the manager of the house wants to try to re-rent the same. He further stated that the story about the nitro glycerin being in the apartment has gotten through to the papers, possibly through the Sheriff's Office, and he believes it highly improbable that any of the parties in question will return. He stated that they abandoned the apartment completely when they fled, and only a small amount of clothing remains, which clothing is claimed by Spike Lane, who is in custody; that Lane is trying to get a lawyer to claim the same for him. I informed Mr. Nathan that under the circumstances, it would seem advisable to discontinue surveillance of this apartment; that as far as the personal property is concerned, we will have absolutely nothing to do with it. With reference to the nitro glycerin, Mr. Nathan informed that rather blaring headlines have appeared in the papers about it; that he believes the information emanated from the Sheriff's Office there, although

the Sheriff's Office denies that they gave out the information. He further informed that the representative of the Hercules Powder Company took the nitro out of the apartment and blew it up; that two of the containers actually contained nitro, while the other did not. Mr. Nathan stated that he is forwarding to the Bureau clippings about this matter together with a letter of explanation of the circumstances surrounding its discovery and disposition.

Mr. Nathan stated that he would discontinue surveillance of the sapartment immediately.


Dear Sir:

I am transmitting herewith communication dated February 19, 1935, over the signature of William S. Cuthbert, Cormissioner of Public Safety, Atlantic City, which is self explanatory, together with my reply thereto.

You will note Ir. Cuthbert has referred to the fact it has been rumored there is some feeling between the Bureau and his department because of the rumor that the Atlantic City Police Department does not cooperate; also the Commissioner's statement to the effect that all of the members of his department are at our disposal at all times, and my reply that such feeling is mutual.

I intend to make a trip to Atlantic City as soon as possible in order to make the Commissioner's acquaintance, as well as the Chief of Police, and other officials.

The rumors referred to by the Commissioner of Public Safety apparently are the outgrowth of the recent investigation in the Alvin Marpis Case at Atlantic City. You will recall that the Atlantic City Police at first refused to turn over the Buick Sedan recovered from Karpis and later voluntarily turned the car over after some correspondence between this Bureau end the Atlantic City Police Department. I feel quite certain that any unfriendly feeling by this department has now been disspelled ***CORMAN**

nay rest assured this feeling is mutual.





Special Agent in Charge, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Dear Sire The Bureau has received your letter of Yebruary 27, 1935, with which you enclosed a letter addressed to you on February 19 by William 8. Cuthbert Director of Public Safety, Atlantic City, New Jersey, together with a copy of your reply thereto, dated February 27. It is noted that your reply indicates that proper cooperation has been afforded the Bureau by the Atlantic City Police Department and by Mr. Cuthbert. As a matter of fact, it appears that Mr. Cuthbert, if newspaper reports are correct, criticized the Bureau for failing to advice him of the identities of the persons who went to Atlantic City from Florida and or who developed to be Alvin Karpis and Harry Campbell. The facts of the matter are that the Bureau did not know the identities of the persons occupying the stolen car in question and, further, that the dangerous character of the individuals was elearly brought out in the police broadcast. It is unfortunate that Director Buthbert was critical in this matter since, as stated, the Bureau could not have furmished the identities of the persons proceeding to Atlantic City. In any event, it is felt that, before writing a communication such as you addressed to Mr. Cuthbert concerning a matter of cooperation, you should communicate with the Washington headquarters of the Bureau in order that you may be furnished any h available information concerning a matter of this kind. The author of both of these communications is Cassius M. McDonald with aliases, a Subject in the Alvin Karpis with aliases; et al - Edward George Bremer - Victim - Kidnaping case.

The above mentioned letters were mailed to Assistant United States Attorney 7. Sanders Gramling by the aforementioned jailor, who in turn handed them to Special Agent B. F. Fitzsimons, Resident Agent, Miami, Florida, who transmitted them to the Jacksonville Office. Agent Fitzsimons conferred with the Post Office Inspector at Miami, who advised that inasmuch as the letters had not been placed in the mails prior to their interception they could be opened and the contents noted, after which Agent Fitzsimons opened the letter addressed to Mrs. McDonald, portions of which appear to be attempts on the part of Cassius McDonald to coach her as to possible testimony in his behalf, particularly concerning his activities on or about December 29, 1934. This letter also contains remarks concerning you and statements alleged to have been made by Special Agent in Charge Hanson of the Birmingham Office and Agents McKee and Brown while they were in this district conducting investigation in this case. Special Agent in Charge Larson of the Detroit Office, as well as other Agents, is mentioned. Reference is also made to

Levis, Weshington, D. C., both of which letters bear the return address of Kehoe and Kehoe, Attorneys, Miami, Florida. It is noted that these letters were intercepted by the feiler at the Dade County Jail, Miami, Florida, on March 8, 1935, when they were found in the possession of Federal prisoners who were about to be removed from the Dade County Jell to the Federal Penitentiary in Atlanta, Georgia.

There is also returned herewith one photostatic copy of the letter which was apparently taken from the envelope eddressed to Ers. Edith G. EcDoneld. A typewritten transcript has also been made, copies of which ere inclosed berevith for your information and for the distance information of Special Assistant to the Attorney General Falter L. Berlow. You should consult Br. Berlev concerning the propriety of returning the original letters to the jailor at the Dade County Jail with instructions that they be held by him, later to be introduced in evidence should they be desired.

Glidden was put at night a good deal, and would come in often very late at night, although he never seemed to have any activity in the day time. There were also frequent visitors at the Gotschall home at this time, mostly cars bearing California license plates;

About the time of the Bremer kidnaping, Glidden and his wife

returned to the Gotschall home, not having been there since the summer of 1933, and at this time Glidden left his wife at the Gotschall home and went on to Hinneapolis according to information received by Moline. About Tebruary 8 or 9, Glidden's wife left the Gotschall home and flew to Minneapolis by plane. She explained her haste in getting to Kinneapolis by saying that her husband was ill at Minneapolis. In a few days both Glidden and his wife returned and stayed at the Gotschall home for a few days more, and then left again. Moline said that he had seen Glidden come into the driveway of the Cotschall home once very late at night with the headlights of his car turned off, and that Midden always seemed to avoid people.

Glidden and his wife next returned to the Gotschall home about the first of November, 1934, and on this visit stayed about one week. Moline took the license numbers on Gliddens car at this time, and found that they were Utah and plates for 1934, No. 116-49. At this time, Mrs. Gotschall asked Moline's 12-year old son to mail a letter for her at the post office, and it was a letter addressed to Mrs. George H. Gilbert, Salt Lake City, Utah.



Burkish is a niece of the well known and highly respected attormey, CHARLES D. KKISO, Eleby Building, New Albany. It was further learned from Mr. Darneal that Mrs. Burkish is a woman of ... good character but one who has suffered a mental breakdown and consequently, is not mentally well balanced. In this connection Agent was informed that Mrs. Burkish has a penchant for amateur; detective work; that she is reported to have taken a correspondence course in detective training; that she is a garrulous sort of a person, rather silly at times, giddy in thought and an unfortunate young woman of poor judgment; that she has many good personal qualities, however, and is harmless; that because she is morally sound herself, it is probably a fact that this has a bearing on her determination to assist in the detection and prosecution of crime. Mr. Darmeal added that he has known Mrs. Burkish many years; that she has visited him home on several occasions; that he has listened to her ramblings on crime and social injustices at different times; that she entertains the firm comviction that the properly constituted law enforcement agencies for the most part are not homest and therefore are insincere in their efforts to control orise. 400

Agent located Mrs. Burkish at her home, now located at 414 North First Street, New Albany. She appears to be a woman in rather poor financial circumstances but nevertheless gracious. neat, refined and orderly. She mentioned having written to the Director at Washington on several occasions because of her faith in the sincerity and power of the Federal Bureau of Investigation to detect and suppress crime; that the letters mentioned and her telegram since incorporated in the Bureau letter of reference dated February 9, 1935, were sent because of her lack of knowledge of the existence of the Indianapolis Office of the Bureau; that she sincerely believes that subject Karpis is engaged in a fake world-wide lottery in connection with one JOE ADAMS, recently arrested by the Federal Government in Florida, a friend of Karpis and a former resident of Jeffersonville, Clark County, Indiana; that Karpis, when he made his escape in Florida several weeks ago was transported to Louisville, Kentucky, via airplane, by one W. E. STAPIES, resident of Louisville, and hid in the Seelbach Hotel in the latter city. Mrs. Burkish admitted that she has no first-hand knowledge that such is a fact; that she does not know Mr. Staples; that the information mentioned by her was submitted by a close friend, one MISS IRENT GRAYBROOK, 501 State Street New Albany; that Miss Graybrook is "a skilled and clever detestor of crime"; that she has a great deal of faith in the lady. 
