

MEMORANDUM FOR MR TAMM

RE: Stoll Case.

Mr. Ulric Bell, Washington Representative of the Louisville tourier Journal, telephoned and advised that there is a rumor going around in Kentucky which has been sent back to Washington through inquires to different newspapers including the Cincinnati Inquirer and the Herald Post in Louisville to the effect that through pressure applied on the Department by Ambassador Bingham, the Department has let up on its chase for Robinson. I advised Kr. Bell that the rumor was one hundred percent untrue, and that if anything, we are putting more pressure on it. I further stated that I did not understand why Ambassador Bingham would have anything to do with it.

I further advised Mr. Bell that I was in New York, and that there were some rumors in New York that Robinson was in Harlem passing some of the ransom money; that we were bearing down on that angle, but unfortunately the race riots came just a few days after this rumor; that this upset any rumor that he was in Harlem because it was not safe for any white person to be in Harlem.

I advised Mr. Bell that there were three cases that we were concentrating on at the present time, the Stoll Kidnaping Case, the apprehension of Karpis, and the apprehension of Raymond Hamilton, desperado of the Southwest. I stated that Karpis is the leading man left in the Premer Case. Mr. Bell inquired if Hamilton was a killer and I stated that he was one of the worst killers, but that he wanted by the Bureau for robbing a National Guard Armory.

Mr. Bell stated that he did not put any confidence in the above rumor, but he did want to send some positive item to the effect that it was positively untrue. He further inquired if he could say that the number of men working on the Stoll Case had been increased. I stated that it would be perfectly all right for him to say that.

During my absence from the city your ecomonication of March 11, 1935, relating to Cassius M. McDonald, was received at the Bureau and was not brought to my attention until I returned to the office. I regret that some delay has occurred in giving proper attention to your letter.

Cessius M. McDonald was taken into custody at West Palm Beach, Florida on February 7, 1935 and was subsequently removed to Miami, Florida, where he was held upon charges contained in an indictment returned against him in the Federal Court at Jacksonville, Florida on February 7, 1935, charging McDonald and various other individuals with harboring Alvin Kerpis in Florida. You will undoubtedly recall that Alvin Kerpis was indicted at St. Paul, Minnesota on January 22, 1935, charged with the kidnaping of Edward G. Bremer of St. Paul, Minnesota, and that Karpis has been a fugitive since that time.

I have been advised that Cassius K. McDonald was released on a bond of \$15,000 on March 12, 1935.

I have personally reviewed the facts involved in the charges against Cassius McDonald and as convinced that he is the individual who perticipated in the harboring of Karpis in Florida and actually assisted in the negotiation of a quantity of the money paid as a ranson to the kidnapers of Kiward G. Bremer. I am certain that this is not a case of mistaken identity and that Cassius McDonald actually perticipated in the offenses charged.

There appears to have been some error in the handling of the telegram which you addressed to Inspector James S. Kgan of the Bureau, in which you made inquiry concerning the charges against Cassius McDonald. I sincerely regret that your telegraphic inquiry did not receive a proper and immediate response.



Through the above address, Mae Fatheree was located at 815 Saint Francis Street, Mobile, Alabama, and she stated that she answered the advertisement of the "Get Acquainted Correspondence Club" of Denver, Colorado, furnishing her name to be added to their list, purely as a matter of fun; that afterwards, she received two letters, one from a man in California and another in Kansas or Nebraska, but that she did not answer or preserve them, and that she was now unable to recall the names. After being asked if the same DETAILS was Harper or any known alias of Volney Davis, she replied in the negative and stated that she would be able to recall the handwriting if shown a sample. She was shown the photostatic copy of the letter written by Davis as Harper, and immediately informed that the same was not that of the persons who wrote to her but once. When shown the group photograph of the Subjects in this matter, she failed to identify the same as any person she knew or had seen. Miss Fatheree seemed very sincere throughout the interview and responded to all questions wery quickly. Mr. Alt telephoned from the Jacksonville Office and advised that this morning at Miami, Florida, Dolores Delaney and Wynona Burdette were sentenced to five years each in an institution to be designated by the Attorney General, on charges of harboring Alvin Karpis. I remarked that it was my understanding that the maximum sentence under the harboring statutes was two years. Mr. Alt stated that he was under that impression also, but he had asked one of the Agents to confer with the United States Attorney about this point in order to avoid a comeback, and he has just received a call from the United States Marshal advising that the sentences as given above are correct; that is, five years each. Mr. Alt mentioned that there were two or three counts in the indictment against these women, and this may account for the length of the sentences. Mr. Alt further stated that there are no qualifications to the sentences; that is, no time suspended and no probationary periods. Special Agent B. F. Fitzsimons, Resident Agent at Miami, Florida, today advised that on March 25, 1935, Federal Judge Halsted L. Ritter, at Miami, Florida, signed an order directing the Superintendent of the Western Union Telegraph Company, Miami, Florida, to produce before the Clerk of the District Court, Miami, Florida, the original telegram.

Judge Ritter in signing the order declined to make it returnable prior to Monday, April 1st, 1935, on which date the Western Union Telegraph Company must show cause why the telegram should not be delivered, if it is not in fact, produced before the Clerk.







It is noted that while the writer of the letter stated he did not have a photograph of himself available at that time, there was a anapshot photograph of a sun enclosed in the letter. The photograph is not a likeness of Volney Davis. However, this circumstance might not be of importance.

It is noted that the description furnished by the writer of the letter would in a general way fit Volney Davis. Also the name Clarence interson might be an alias used by Davis since he has been in the hebit of using a Scandinavian names for his aliases, especially the alias Hanson. Recently Esther Williams, 119 North Topping Street, Kansas City, Missouri, with whom Davis corresponded under the alias Hanson and who had received calls thought to be from Volney Davis, stated that during the second week of Earch, 1935, she



The envelope containing the letter and photograph, which was presented by kins Henders m, had already been opened by her and the contents had been handled. However, the letter has not been handled since it reached this office nor has the photograph. The letter and its contents are being forwarded to the Bureau with two copies of this letter in order that a fingerprint analysis may be made. Agents of this office are concucting further interview with Margey Henderson at Kansas City and she is to be requested to reply to the letter, furnishing suitable details in order that further correspondence may be had with the writer of the letter and that purty will be encouraged in his suit for the present. It is noted that carboin details are given by Clarence Anderson indicating that he has worked as a shipping clerk for Weshburn and Grosby in some smaller town, mane not mentioned, and that in December, 1933, he was transferred by that company to its brunch at Chicago, Illinois. It is indicated by Anderson that he has worked for Mushburn and . Grosby for over eight years.
