Fitzgibbons Manhattan Company, Inc., jobbers and distributors of coin-operated machines, at 2306 Amsterdam Avenue, New York City.

On their mailing list appears the name of Charles Stephens with address at 920-1/2 South Boston Street, Tulsa, Okla. They state they sent Mr. Stephens a form letter advertising their coin-operated machines on November 24, 1934, and that this is undoubtedly the communication which was later forwarded to Mr. Stephens at the 618 South Rockford Street address in Tulsa, Okla. that they have had no reply from Mr. Stephens; that they have no personal knowledge of Stephens or Harry Campbell, and do not recognize the photographs of Harry Campbell, Valney Davis, Fred Barker, Alvin Karpis, Arthur R. Barker, Russell Gibson, or Dr. Joseph P. Moran; that in May, 1934, they ran an advertisement.

They furnished several copies of the circular letter which they sent to Mr. Stephens, and one copy of this letter is being forwarded to the Oklahoma City office with copy of this report.

A search of the files of the Motor Vehicle Department of the State of Connecticut and Metropolitan New York City was requested by Communications in regard to 1934 Ford V-8 Sedan, motor 899,365, which had formerly been reported sold to E. J. Powell of Toledo, Ohio, and to whom Ohio 1934 plates had previously been issued; also with regard to 1934 Chevrolet coupe, motor No. 4,135,550, serial 1-DAC-313,359.

Replies received were that these two automobiles had not been registered in 1934 in Metropolitan New York City or the State of Connecticut.

It was requested that a stop card be placed so that the New York office would be notified in the event that these cars are registered during the rest of 1934 or 1935.

Further reference is made to Division letters of October 13, 1934, and October 24, 1934, instructing that arrangements be made with police chiefs or persons in charge of identification bureaus in the larger cities of the District for the purpose of causing a search to be made for previous arrests, etc., which might be helpful in bringing about the location and apprehension of members of the Barker-Karpis gang, etc.

In addition to the police departments already contacted, as listed in report of Special Agent S. W. Hardy, New York City, November 10, 1934, Special Agent C. I. Lord contacted the Connecticut State Police at Hartford, Conn., and placed "wanted" notices reflecting the finger prints and photographs of the individuals mentioned in Division letter above referred to with Captain Stiles of the Connecticut State Police. Captain Stiles had the Identification Unit of the Connecticut State Police searched, but without results as to the subjects mentioned.

Special Agent V. D. Garvey contacted the officers in charge of the identification bureaus of the police departments located in Jersey City, Newark, Hoboken, and Elizabeth, N. J., in the same manner, leaving the photographs and data, and ascertaining that there was no information available in the files of these organizations on any of the parties being sought in this case other than the data which had already been placed in their files at the request of the New York Division office.

For purposes of the record, at Jersey City, N. J., Lt. John Mahoney, in charge of the record room of the Jersey City Police Department was contacted; at Newark, N. J., Capt. George Callon of the Newark Police Department was contacted; in Hoboken, N. J., Detective Dennis McFeely, officer in charge of the Criminal Records of the Hoboken Police Department was contacted; and at Elizabeth, N. J., Lt. G. Steffens of the Identification Bureau of the Elizabeth Police Department was contacted. The New York Division office telephone number and case file No. had previously been inserted on all of the above identification orders left at the abovementioned police departments. This was done prior to the reallocation of the New Jersey territory to the Philadelphia office.

Special Agent Binns of the New York office in a similar manner placed the "wanted" notices and identification orders with regard to the parties whose apprehension is desired in this case with Capt. Streck of the Mineola, L. I., Police Department, and Capt. Streck searched his records ascertaining that there was no previous record in his files concerning the parties involved in this case.

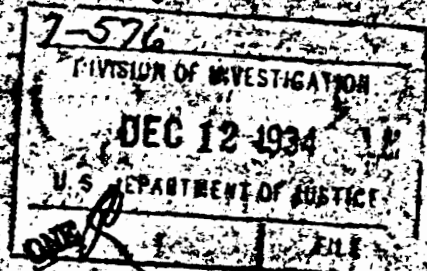

This will confirm telegram of even date to you in reply to your
 night letter of December 8, 1934, making reference to the report of
 Special Agent M. G. Spear, Kansas City, Missouri, December 4, 1934,
 particularly information appearing in the first paragraph of page two
 thereof relative to information to the effect that Fred Barker was
 supposed to be in Ensenada, California, or Malibu, California, going
 under the name of Fred Barton.

D. C. Deaver, member of the Kansas State Highway Patrol, from
 whom the original information was obtained by Special Agent H. A. Dietz,
 was reached by telephone at Topeka, Kansas, in an endeavor to verify the
 place in California where it was alleged Fred Barker was. Mr. Deaver
 advised that his information was now found to be incorrect; adding that
 he did not obtain this information from an informant, but that the same
 was based upon mere rumor, the source of which he did not disclose other
 than to state that he was now of the opinion that there was nothing to the
 information. In view of this statement of his he was asked relative to
 the statement that Karpis was supposed to be at Gainesville, Illinois,
 and he advised that that was likewise unfounded, adding, however, that
 he thought probably Subject Arthur R. Barker was in the vicinity of
 Joplin, Missouri, having obtained this information from the Missouri State
 Highway Patrol some six weeks ago. It may be noted that the Kansas City
 Division office is aware of the fact that Walter Grammer of the Missouri
 State Highway Patrol has spent considerable time around Joplin, Missouri,
 in the belief that "Doc" Barker may possibly come there at some time as
 George M. Barker, father of Subjects Barker, resides there. Due to the

past cooperation it is believed that the Missouri State Highway Patrol will furnish any information it obtains in this respect to the Kansas City Division office.

It was explained to Mr. Deaver that this Division is exceedingly anxious to bring about the apprehension of the Barkers and Karpis at the earliest possible date and, accordingly, all possible information and tips were being followed rapidly and thoroughly. He advised that he and the Kansas State Highway Patrol are very willing to cooperate in this respect, adding that he will be down in Tulsa, Oklahoma, in the near future and in the event he obtains any information while en route there relative to any Subjects in this matter, he will furnish the same to Special Agent in Charge Dwight Brantley at Oklahoma City, known to him.

In view of Mr. Deaver's further statement in this matter, it is suggested that the Chicago and Los Angeles offices disregard the leads set out in the report of Agent Spear, Kansas City, December 6, 1934, predicated upon information set out in paragraph one, page two of that report.

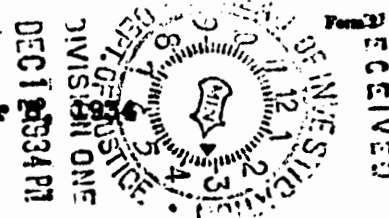

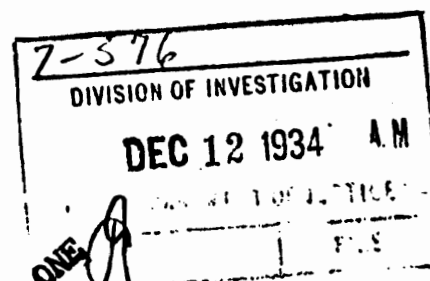

Special Agent M. G. Scott, while in Topeka, Kansas, on a recent road trip, called at the office of the Kansas State Highway Patrol and in a general discussion with Herbert Odell, who is a member of the State Highway Patrol, Henry Ruth, who has charge of the equipment of the Patrol, and with one of their stenographers, name unknown, ascertained that John W. Spaulding is a member of the State Highway Patrol and that all of the State Highway Patrolmen bear the title of Inspector. He has been employed by them for about a year, it appears, and is a graduate of the Naval Academy at Annapolis, having graduated in 1916. Due to the fact that he wanted to see action, he resigned from the Navy and went into the Army, in which he saw action overseas during the World War.

During the conversation with the above-mentioned individuals, Agent Scott brought in Spaulding's name on several occasions. Although none of the three mentioned had anything in particular to say regarding him, they did not say anything that would reflect upon his character or ability as a patrolman. It was also ascertained that Major Wint Smith, who has charge of the State Highway Patrol, details some of his best men to do the work outside of the state, and that it is known that these men are thought to be very reliable. It is believed that Spaulding is one of the men in whom Major Smith has quite a bit of confidence.

Division had been attempting to locate him, and stated it had caused him quite a bit of embarrassment, and had he known it was the Division of Investigation he would have immediately communicated with one of its offices.

He was questioned specifically concerning Russell Gibson and shown photographs of Gibson, but he stated he did not know Gibson nor any one named Roy Gray or Slim Gray. He was also shown photographs of Joseph P. Moran, William Weaver, Jess Doyle, and Harry Sawyer, and stated in each instance that he did not recognize the photographs. He was apparently truthful in these statements.

With further reference to Gibson, Hall states he (Hall) knows a racketeer in Chicago named Louis Alterrie, having met him on several different occasions while in Chicago and gone to several parties with him. He also knows Tom Burke, who is secretary for Alterrie. He stated, however, that his contact with Alterrie was purely social.

With reference to his connection with Attorney Sam Friedman of Hannibal, Mo., Hall stated that during the past summer while he had three concessions at the Irish Village of the World's Fair, he became acquainted with Dolfus Dolnig, who is owner of the Coin Publishing and Novelty Company of Chicago, and who married a daughter of Mr. Mills, owner of the Mills Novelty Company of Chicago. In order to have more slot machines placed around the territory of Hannibal, Mo., he contacted Attorney Sam Friedman around July 1, 1934, at which time he stayed one night in Hannibal, later returning to Chicago where he called Friedman from the office of Dolnig, being telephone number Monroe 0328. He also stated that Dolnig called Friedman relative to the slot machines and at no time did he have any further connection with Friedman. He emphatically denied that he had ever called Friedman concerning any automobile and knew nothing of Gibson's abandoning a Ford coupe in Hannibal. It was thought possible by Mr. Newby and reporting agent that Hall's connection with Alterrie may have led some people to believe that he, Hall, knew Gibson. Hall stated he would be personally willing to give any information concerning Gibson if he knew him.

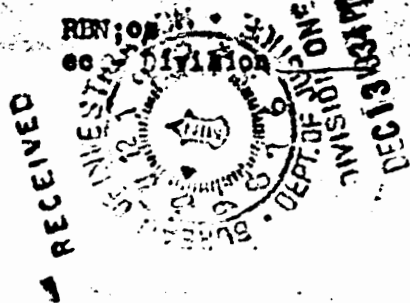

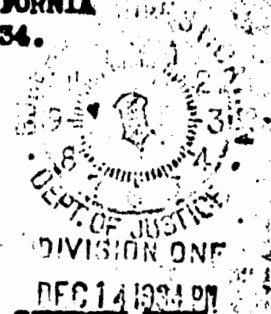

This is to confirm a telephonic conversation had between Special Agent R. D. Brown of this office and Special Agent M. C. Spear of your office, on December 12, 1934, concerning the presence of subject Russell Gibson alias Slim Gray in Kansas City at the present time.

Please be advised that on December 12, 1934, Special Agent John L. Madala of this office interviewed subject Oliver A. Berg alias Izzie at the Illinois State Penitentiary at Joliet, Illinois, where he is serving a sentence of the remainder of his natural life for robbery with a gun. Subject Berg has made a complete statement concerning his part in the exchanging of the Bremer ransom money through "Boss" McLaughlin in Chicago during April of 1934. He also advised on this occasion that he has received definite information to the effect that Slim Gray went to Kansas City two or three days ago and also that he was driving a Cadillac car, model unknown at the present time.

When pressed for the source of his information, Berg advised that a few hours prior to Agent's visit he was visited by his sister, Mrs. Armin Kuhn, and a very good friend of his. He refused to divulge the name of this friend. At any rate, he advised that his sister informed him that her daughter, Helen Kuhn, had seen and talked with Slim Gray in front of the Bismark Hotel, where she is employed, on the night of December 10, 1934; that on this instance Slim, who is "sweet" on Helen, waited for her and upon seeing her offered to drive her home. According to Ollie, his niece does not want to have anything to do with Slim and in this connection she refused, giving the excuse that she had an appointment with a girl friend to go to a movie. Slim then informed her that things were too hot for him in Chicago, and that he was leaving for Kansas City that night. Helen advised that he was alone and was driving a Cadillac car.

Ollie further stated that his friend likewise told him that Slim had gone to Kansas City Monday night and in this connection stated that three members of Slim's mob have been arrested by the States Attorney's office in Chicago and for this reason he was getting out of town, as things are too hot for him.

Berg advised that he does not know when Slim will contact in Kansas City, but indicated that it is very likely that his family and his wife's family will know of their whereabouts. He stated that Slim will not reveal his location to any one except his intimate friends and relatives and Ollie expressed the opinion that Slim's whereabouts might be learned through surveillance of his and his wife's relatives.

It is the belief of this office that the foregoing information, as furnished by subject Berg, is in all probability correct, and for this reason it is respectfully requested that your office conduct an immediate and discreet investigation, looking toward the location and apprehension of subject Russell Gibson.

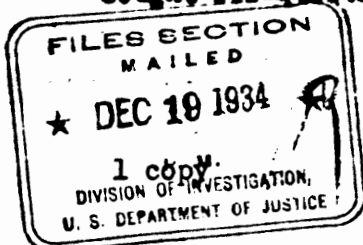



She claims she did not know the GREENS previous to the meeting at Sheridan Road. During the fall of 1932 GREEN went to his home somewhere in Kentucky, name of town not recalled; that during this time MAE had a boy friend by the name of DANNY who was employed at the Chicago Motor Club. She was unable to recall this party's last name. PATRICIA and husband then moved to Wellington Street in Chicago.

Later, GREEN made inquiries of the HAYWORTHS as to the whereabouts of MAE but was unable to locate her and then went to Washington, D.C.. PATRICIA did not see MAE until the later summer of 1933 at which time she lived with PATRICIA for a short time at the Wellington Street address. MAE stated that she had been living with friends at Calumet City, Illinois. MAE went to Washington, D.C., about the first part of September, 1933. PATRICIA received a letter from MAE stating that she was going to marry GREEN and she had secured employment in a dining room at one of the large hotels at Washington. The last letter PATRICIA received from MAE was postmarked 10-17-1933, Washington, D.C., in which she advised they were living at 1402 Eye Street, N.W.. She is reasonably sure as to the exactness of the dates mentioned above.

PATRICIA has been at Moorhead since last July and her husband, ROBERT HAYWORTH, can now be located at Francisville, Indiana. Relative to Calumet City, MAE confided to PATRICIA that the friend she stayed with at Calumet City, was a former bootlegger, gambler and gangster, but never mentioned his name to her nor did she meet him. From her conversation with MAE, she believes him to be about 35 or 40 years old.

She further stated that GREEN is a gambler. MAE told her, her maiden name was SCHULMAN and that she formerly lived at St. Louis, Missouri. MAE is a waitress and is believed to be a member of the waitresses' union. PATRICIA stated she does not correspond with her. She cannot recall ever hearing MAE mention the name of WILLIAM HARRISON, nor any of the members of the BARKER-KARPIS GANG. These individuals, she claims, are not known to her. She further stated that MAE GREEN was a liar and never placed much confidence in her statements. She is of the opinion that her husband cannot supply any additional information.

The following description of MAE GREEN was secured:

An envelope received from Mrs. R.C.Green, by Patricia, is being furnished the Chicago Office.

Postal authorities at Moorhead do not recall MRS. HAYWORTH'S recently receiving any mail from Washington, D.C..

The interview was conducted under the pretext that agent was a friend of MAE GREEN. MRS. HAYWORTH was not reluctant in furnishing any of the above information. She advised that she did not consider MAE a very close friend of hers.

ROBERT and PATRICIA HAYWORTH are not known as police characters in East Grand Forks, Minnesota, or Grand Forks, North Dakota.

No leads are being set out in this report, same being left to the discretion of the Chicago Office.

A hand printed anonymous letter was received at the St. Paul Office, stating that, if interested in the apprehension of kidnapers, it would be well to observe one, A. ARVIDSON family at the end of Myrtle Street, and H. Huth on Prosperity Street, L. Dokemoe on Winthrop, concerning which Special Agent R.N. Franke of the St. Paul Division Office conducted the following investigation.

Reference is made in this letter to observe one, A. ARVIDSON, family at the end of Myrtle Street on East Larpenier. Agent, on November 1, 1934, checked the 1934 St. Paul City Directory, which discloses that an ALBERT ARVIDSON (wife's name IDA) lives at 2006 Butler Avenue, South St. Paul; that an ALICE E. ARVIDSON, a maid, resides at 1834 Princeton; that an ARTHUR C. ARVIDSON (wife's name RUTH) is a cutter for the Peter Westlund Company, and that he lives at 955 Albermarle; that an ARTHUR F.M. ARVIDSON is a carpenter and lives at 483 East Maryland Street. Myrtle Street is one block south of University Avenue and runs from Cleveland Avenue to the city limits (almost) which is near Emerald Street. East Larpenier is in the opposite end of town and is the city limits. Evidently, the party writing this letter did not know the streets very well.

This anonymous letter also states to watch a H. HUTH on Prosperity, and also a RAY HUTH. The 1934 St. Paul City Directory discloses that a HAROLD T. HUTH (wife's name JULIA) is a laborer for the Jacob Schmidt's Brewing Company, and that he resides at 1357 Prosperity Avenue. The Directory does not disclose a RAY HUTH. Agent found at 1357 Prosperity that this place is now vacant. Agent interviewed Mrs. Caroline Vik who lives at 1355 Prosperity, which is next door. She stated that she has been living there for not quite two months; that previous to her, there was a family living next door at 1357 Prosperity by the name of COUPLIN,

but that they moved out a couple of weeks after she moved in. She told agent that the lady across the street, no doubt, might be able to furnish some information.

Agent interviewed Mrs. J.H. CARLSON, 1350 Prosperity Avenue, which is across the street from 1357 Prosperity Avenue. She stated that on several occasions she had talked to the woman who lived at 1357 Prosperity; that they had a boy about five years old and a girl about three; that this family lived there about two or three months early this spring; that they moved down on Seventh Street somewhere near the brewery; that she never talked to the husband at all; that the wife seemed to be a very nice lady; that she never heard anything bad about this family at all, and as far as she knows, they seemed to be alright.

On November 1, 1934, agent also interviewed MRS. HAROLD J. BROWN, 1361 Prosperity, which is next door to 1357. She stated that MR. HAROLD HUTH and his wife, JULIA, did live next door, but that they moved away about August 1st or 15th; that the HUTH family was living next door when she moved in her present house; that he worked for Schmidt's Brewing Company, and also was putting in a lot of extra time on Sundays and evenings; that he seemed to have a good income, but that they seemed to spend their money at a fast rate and in a very foolish manner and had nothing to show for it; that they had a little boy about seven years old and a younger girl; that they never had any parties and seemed to be nice neighbors; that he had a Chevrolet car; that the HUTH family did not have any company except her mother would come around now and then, and a brother of Mr. HUTH would come around. MRS. BROWN stated that on one occasion, MRS. HUTH mentioned the fact that her husband had been in an accident on Wabasha Street, and had his skull fractured, and that they got a lot of money from the insurance company or construction company at that time. MRS. BROWN stated that the HUTH family never seemed to act suspiciously; that on another occasion, MRS. HUTH remarked that her husband had a brother who was living with a woman, but was not married to her; that this brother was also a drinker; also, MRS. BROWN stated that MRS. HUTH had said that her father and mother were separated. Other than this, MRS. BROWN thought they were nice people, and never heard anything against them.

There are not many houses in this locality at 1357 Prosperity Avenue, as it is very near the north city limits, and most of the land out there is pasture.

Reference is made in this letter also to watch a rumrunner, CHARLEY BUCKLES, whose real name is supposed to be BUCKHOLTZ. The 1934 St. Paul City Directory discloses that a CHARLES BUCKLES, whose wife's name is AGNES, is a carman for the Great Northern Shops; that he lives at 122 West Sycamore. The name BUCKHOLTZ does not appear in this Directory.

Agent found 122 West Sycamore to be a small, yellow, frame house, and the only house on this side of the block, except for a lumber office which is on the corner of Rice and Sycamore. Agent went to a home at 123 West Sycamore which is directly across from 122, and there an elderly woman came to the door. Agent inquired of her as to who lived across the street and she stated that BUCKLES lived there. Agent disclosed his identity to her then, and she then told agent that if he wanted any information he should go across the street and see the BUCKLES people themselves, and she thereby closed the door on agent. Agent observed that there was an elderly man and a young boy and girl in the house also, as they were eating in the kitchen. 129 West Sycamore had a sign on the front which stated "Mumps", so agent did not go in there.

Agent then went to the Schultz Lumber Company Office, which is located on Rice and Sycamore. Agent did not disclose his identity but talked to some man who was in the office who stated that BUCKLES has been living at his home there for over a year and that he bought the place; that he has three children and that the oldest is about ten years; that BUCKLES worked for the Great Northern except when they get laid off, and that he has been with them for some years; that he seems to be a very nice man; that he always seems to be fixing something around his house so as to make it look better; that just lately he built on an additional room in the back, and that during the summer he had painted this house. This man stated that as much as he knows of them they are very nice people, and has never heard anything against them. However, this man stated that the people who lived in the house before BUCKLES did, were bootleggers, and that also after them a couple of fellows lived over there for a short time who were supposed to be in the bootlegging business.

Agent interviewed Mrs. Packerman who runs a grocery store at 93 West Sycamore, which is about half a block from the home of BUCKLES. Mrs. Packerman stated that the BUCKLES purchased groceries from their store; that MR. BUCKLES works for some railroad company; that MRS. BUCKLES is a very honest and nice woman; that they pay cash for whatever they get except once in a while when they run short of money, and then they charge, and as soon as MR. BUCKLES is paid, MRS. BUCKLES will come over and pay the small bill; that the boy has a paper route, and MRS. BUCKLES also helps him collect because there has been some trouble with another lad who is also trying to collect on this route; that there are three children in this family, one is about seven, the other about three, while the oldest boy is about thirteen. Mr. Packerman stated that she has been in this grocery store business for one year, and that BUCKLES moved in over there about the same time she started the business. Mrs. Packerman stated also that she recalls MRS. BUCKLES once stating that there used to be some people living in her house previously who used to sell booze, as a lot of people used to come and inquire for this former family.

Agent asked Mrs. Packerman as to who lived across the street from the BUCKLES family, and she stated that a GRUBNER family lived there; that there are two boys and a girl; that this family is a deadbeat, and that they have beaten her out of eleven dollars for groceries; that Mr. Grubner seems to be a very heavy drinker. This is the house where the lady closed the door on agent.

Reference is made in this anonymous letter to one, L. DOKEMOE, on Winthrop, near the Stillwater tracks and east Larpenter, who is to be watched. Agent checked the 1934 St. Paul City Directory, which disclosed that a LOUIS B. DOKMO, wife's name, INGA, is a cabinet maker for the Lampland Lumber Company, and that he resides at 1652 Winthrop Avenue. While agent was in this vicinity on November 1, 1934, he ran across the United States Mail Carrier #34, who stated that his name was H. A. Harrington. He stated that he has delivered registered letters and packages to this family, and as far as he knows, they are o.k.; that he is not very intimate with the family at all; that this family seems to have a couple of children also. There are only a few homes in the vicinity of the DOKEMOE family, inasmuch as they live one block south of East Larpenter Avenue, which is the city limits, and most of the vicinity consists of pasture lands and a golf course. Agent went to 2024 Larpenter which is close to the DOKEMOE home, but no one was home there. Agent then went to the home of MRS. G. P. VAN KLECKS, 2046 East Larpenter, which is close to the DOKEMOE home. She stated that she has been living in her present home for the past three years, and that the DOKEMOE people are very fine neighbors; that they purchased their home from a brother of MR. DOKEMOE; that there are three boys at home with the parents; that he is a cabinet maker and at present is working for the Grand Construction Company at jobs now and then; that he does not seem to have a steady job but that he tries to get work whenever possible; that the family are very nice people, and are also very religious as they go to the same church that she, MRS. VAN KLECKS, does. She stated that she has never heard anything bad against this family.

On November 1, 1934, agent went to the Identification Unit of the St. Paul Police Department, and there Sid Moore checked his records and stated that they have no criminal record for HAROLD T. HUTH, RAY HUTH, A. ARVIDSON, LEWIS B. DOKEMOE, nor for CHARLES BUCKES, or BUCKHOLTZ.

A further check of the Telephone Company revealed that the telephone number Emerson 3621 is listed in the name of MRS. EMILY GORDON, 1704 Scheffer Street, St. Paul; that Elkhurst 0988 is in the name of JAMES HARRINGTON, 929 Goodrich Avenue, St. Paul; that Main 6660 in Minneapolis is listed in the name of LORRAINE RAE, 209 West 15th, Apartment 1, and that Cherry 3580, Minneapolis, is listed in the name of WALTER BROWN, 122 Highland, Minneapolis, Minnesota.

MISS ALICE V. CONRAD, who accompanied MRS. SAWYER to Twin Lakes, Minnesota, subsequent to MRS. SAWYER'S release at Chicago, and who claims to be employed by her as a practical nurse, was interviewed by Special Agent J. E. Brennan at her apartments, 601 South 9th Street, Minneapolis, Minnesota, on December 7, 1934. She stated that about a week ago she was visiting friends in Chicago, Illinois, and while there received a communication from MRS. HARRY SAWYER'S attorney requesting that she immediately return to her home on a very urgent matter and that her expenses would be paid. She stated that she returned to Minneapolis and waited three or four days until she heard from anyone connected with MRS. SAWYER, and that a red-headed attorney, whose first name is JACK, and whose last name she is unable to recall, called on her and asked her to sign a transfer of title to Chevrolet Coach, Engine #2029084, which she had purchased in her own name for MRS. SAWYER; that this transfer as prepared by the attorney was to some name like ADAMS; that she refused to sign this transfer as she had previously been instructed by Special Agent in Charge Ladd, St. Paul Division Office, not to transfer title to this car to anyone but MRS. HARRY SAWYER, who had paid for it; that she was informed that she would hear something further regarding this matter in the near future, but since that time she has received no communication whatsoever, nor seen anyone, regarding the transfer of the car. She stated that she has no information as to the whereabouts of HARRY SAWYER, or his wife, GLADYS, but that if she hears from either of them, or from their attorneys, she will communicate with the St. Paul Office.

Apartment 44, El Paso, Texas, relative to the matter, but that the 31935 deal did not go through. He stated that Monty Carter always drove a Ford sedan or coach, and stated he would not drive any other car, he always talked about Fords; that one time Mrs. Tweedale asked George Zeigler what his business was and he said he had been in the taxi business with a brother-in-law and said it never paid to be in business with a relative; that George Zeigler seemed to be the boss and have Monty Carter under his domination. Mr. Mabry related that at one time George Zeigler slapped the face of Monty Carter's little boy, Mose Carter, and that Monty Carter turned all colors but controlled himself, and finally told Zeigler that no matter what they had been to each other in the past to never do that again.

Mr. Mabry said it was quite doubtful that Monty Carter or his wife would write to him, although they had entertained the Carters in their home, but that in the event they should hear from them he would immediately notify the Denver office, and stated that should Monty Carter call upon him at Trinidad at any time, he would immediately cause his arrest.

Robert L. Caskey, 427 Pine Street, stated he would immediately notify the Denver office in the event his family received Christmas cards from the Carters, and would cause Carter's arrest in the event he ever stopped to call upon him at Trinidad.

Mrs. Anna Caskey was interviewed at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. Solomon J. Shadel, and she stated that in the event she should receive a Christmas card from the Carters she would immediately inform the Denver office.

The envelope containing this letter bears a Memphis stamp and was posted at 6:30 p. m. on December 10, 1934.

The addressee of this letter, Mr. Stanley Rogers, is the Sheriff of Oklahoma County, located in this city. It is my understanding that Sheriff Rogers is offering a reward for the apprehension of Gibson for whom he holds a warrant for the armed robbery of a bank messenger and escape. The amount of the reward is unknown and I was unable to obtain the same before our conversation due to the absence from the city of the Sheriff.

This will confirm my long distance telephone conversation at 6:38 P. M. December 14, 1934, in which you advised that Special Agent Sorola, in making investigation at Alexandria, Louisiana, in connection with J. H. PEDEN and DONALD C. PEDEN, had been informed that one of these persons resembled the photograph of Alvin Karpis, and requested that his photograph, and photographs of other members of this mob, be displayed to persons in Tallahassee, Florida, to determine whether either of the Pedens resembled any one of the persons connected with the Bremer kidnaping gang.

At the conclusion of my telephone conversation with you, I forwarded a strip of photographs reflecting those of Alvin Karpis, Volney Davis, Fred Barker, Arthur R. Barker and Harry Campbell to Sheriff Frank Stoutamire at Tallahassee, Florida, requesting that he immediately, by telephone, advise the Jacksonville office whether either of the Pedens resembled any one of the Karpis mob.

By long distance telephone at noon today, December 15, 1934, Joe Campbell, Chief Deputy Sheriff, Tallahassee, Florida, advised that he had exhibited aforementioned photographs to the Postmaster and post office clerks. These post office employees are the only ones known to have seen the Pedens when they were in Tallahassee. They advised that possibly one of the Pedens--they could not tell one from the other--might in some way resemble the photograph of Karpis but they would not be able to make even a tentative identification.

Mr. Campbell advised that the Pedens in Tallahassee some time prior to March of this year rented Post Office Box 462; that they have only been in Tallahassee once since that time. On March 27, 1934, they ordered their mail forwarded to Gainesville, Florida; on April 12, 1934, to Fort Myers, Florida. Between April 19 and May 16, 1934, they ordered their mail forwarded to Palm Beach, Florida. The best and only descriptions available of the Pedens are contained in the Birmingham office letter to the Jacksonville office dated November 9, 1934, and are being included herein for the information of offices that did not receive this letter:
