

Mr. Connelley called and stated that they have located alm p-which has been identified as Doc Barker's man, on which is marked Ocala, Florida, which is the largest point near Lake Weir, and on another map of Florida, Lake Weir is surrounded by a pencilled ring. He stated that from the description given them by Monte/Carter, and how to get to this point, it appears to be via Highway 41, which would corroborate the story told before by him; that he had not seen the map prior thereto. The map was secured from the apartment rented by Doc Barker. He stated that Carter has given them a "line-up" on the kidnaping, as to who kidnaped him (Bremer), who held him, and who negotiated for the ransom money, those involved being Volney Davis, Campbell, the Barker Brothers, and Karpis, Carter's part being in connection with the hide-out, which was arranged by "Shotgun" Reigler through Elmer Farmer; that the place is in Bensenville (?) at two houses, that one of the families there at the time of the kidnaping is still residing there; that the other person who could advise as to what occurred is now living in town. Mr. Connelley stated he had in mind sending to the point - himself, Brown, Campbell and Jones - (R.L. to leave about 1:00 o'clock by chartered plane to Jacksonville, there to establish a headquarters, Jacksonville being the largest city near the point in question. They will arrive tonight about 7:00 o'clock and check the matter tomorrow morning; that the other men will leave on the 10 o'clock train tonight, the men being Wolfe, McDade, McKee, McLaughlin, Medala, Ryan, Sullivan, Melvin, J. C. White and Muzzey. /0 C Those left at the office will be LaFrance, Peterson, Durant, McIntyre, Walsh, Metcalfe, Chaffitz, Gillespie, McRae, Tillman and Winstead. Mr. Connelley stated they are still? maintaining the observation of who Volney Davis will undoubtedly con tact. He stated Peterson will be left in charge, and that of course Durant and McIntyre will be there, both of whom are very substantial. Mr. Connelley stated they would take with them two rifles and a machine gun; the men going out tonight on the train will take three machine guns, two rifles, 2 shot guns, a gas gun, 3 vests, 2 sets of cuffs, flash lights and flood lights. I advised that our Thompson submachine guns were not much good against a bullet-proof vest. Mr. Connelley stated≥ he had three Springfield rifles, and that the Jacksonville Office would undoubtedly have two rifles; that rifles will be the firearms needed; inasmuch as the ground in Florida is very level. Mr. Connelley advised he would wire when he reaches Jack-

Reference is made to verbal request of January 16, 1935, through Mr. Tamm, that immediate inquiry be made to ascertain all data pertaining to Harold/Alderton, who is reported to be receiving \$27.00 per month compensation from the Veterans Administration and is allegedly from Bensonville, Illinois. Further, to obtain all data pertaining to one Bitty Bishop, who it is alleged received treatment for a paralytic condition during the summer of 1934 at the Edward Hines Hospital, Chicago, Illinois. Bishop is also reported to be from Bensonville, Illinois.

Special Agent Burruss has been informed by Mr. J. W. Barnes, Solicitor's Office, Veterans Administration, that there is no record in the Veterans Administration of either party. In making this search, Mr. Barnes made contact with several branches of the Veterans Administration, including the records of Spanish - American War veterans.

Mr. Barnes also made inquiry at the Adjutant General's Office of the War Department with the view of ascertaining if there is any service record of one Harold Alderton or one Bitty Bishop. The War Department has reported that no World War service record could be found pertaining to either.

The results of the inquiries made by Agent Burruss were verbally reported by me to Mr. Tamm's office, January 16, 1935.

Re: ALVIN KARPIS with aliases, et al, EDWARD GEORGE BREMER, Victim, Kidnaping

Please find enclosed herewith two photostatic copies marked Exhibit #1, made of a rough drawing of the hide-out used for the purpose of holding the victim in this case, while he was in the custody of subjects. As you have been previously advised, this hideout is located at Bensonville, Illinois, approximately twenty miles west, and six miles north of the loop in Chicago.

The dwelling in which Bremer was held appears to have been a barn at one time. The front section, as indicated in the drawing in Exhibit #1, is comprised of two stories, while the back portion is shedlike in appearance, and one story in height. The red arrow indicates the entrance into the single story structure; the room in which Bremer was kept is located to the right of the entrance, and approximately directly opposite the window shown in the single story structure, and on the opposite side; in other words, adjacent to the alley.

Also enclosed will be found two photostatic copies each marked Exhibit #2, which were made from a rough drawing showing the general contour of the vicinity of the house in which Bremer was kept a prisoner, and which is self-explanatory.

At the present time, Agents of the Chicago Division Office are in possession of the house in which Bremer was kept, and are taking photographs of the interior, as well as securing exact measurements of the interior and the location of the various rooms, entrances, windows, and other particular points of interest.

Information has been received by the Chicago Division -Office that at the time Edward G. Bremer was held by the kidnapers at Pensenville, Illinois, they stored their ear or cars at a garage owned by Biddy Bishop. This garage is supposed to be about a helf a block from the hideout in question. At the present time Bishop is not residing in Bensenville, Illinois, and it is known that he is a War veteran; therefore, a check of the records of the Hines Ferorial Hospital, Hines, Illinois, was made and the following information disclosed:

Edward R. Bishop was admitted to the Hines Hospital on April 7, 1934, and discharged after maximum benefit received on the Kay 23, 1934. At the present time he is not receiving compensation ami the records of the hospital reveal that he is suffering from paralysis. The records further reveal that at the time of his admission to the hospital he was residing at 191 South York Street, Bensenville, Illinois. However, the records further disclose a letter unier date of July 19, 1934, from krs. Mward Ray Bishop, Prospect and Fifth Avenue, Tomahawk, Wisconsin. This letter reveals that at that time Bishop was residing with his relatives at this address. The letter further stated that they did not expect to stay at this address but a short time,

It is respectfully suggested that Edward R. Bishop, who in all probability is Biddy Fishop, be located and interviewed and exhibited photos of the Barker-Karpis gang and questioned for any information that he might have concerning their activities.

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TANK

I telephoned Agent in Charge Hanson at Birmingham and informed him of the fact that our Agents have been engaged in gum battle since early this morning with members of the Barker gang near Ocala, Florida. I remarked that I am concerned lest our Agents are in need of additional equipment and reinforcements. I stated that Mr. Lacour has already proceeded to Ocala by plane with additional equipment, but in the meantime, I am desirous of sending in more men in case the battle lasts until nightfall. Upon my inquiry, Mr. Hanson stated that he has seven Agents in his office. I instructed Mr. Hanson to proceed at once by plane to Jacksonville; to inform Mr. Alt as to the time of his arrival there, so that he, Mr. Alt, can meet the party at the airport with the latest information; that of course if the battle is over by that time it will not be necessary to continue on to Ocala, but if not, it will be necessary to go on to Ocala. I cautioned Mr. Hanson to take with him men who are properly qualified to handle such a situation, and to equip the Agents with high-powered Monitor rifles. Mr. Hanson stated that he has four such rifles. I also suggested that he take machine guns and the inflammable type of bullets.

Mr. Hanson stated that he would not be able to take more than six men. He will wire the Division as to the time of his departure.

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TAKM

I telephoned Agent in Charge Stapleton at Charlotte and informed him of the gum battle now being participated in by our Agents and members of the Karpis-Barker gang at Lake Weir, Florida. I stated that Mr. Hanson is leaving Birmingham immediately with six men, for Jacksonville, and I wondered how the Charlotte Office is equipped with Agents to handle such a situation. Mr. Stapleton stated he felt there would be only two Agents in addition to himself who would be so qualified, one of whom is Agent Whitten.

I instructed him to charter a plane immediately and proceed to Jacksonville with these two Agents, making arrangements to use the same plane after reaching Jacksonville. I told him to advise Mr. Alt as to the time his plane will arrive at the Jacksonville airport so that Mr. Alt can meet him there with further instructions. I instructed Mr. Stapleton to take with him high-powered rifles, ammunition and particularly inflammable bullets. I also told him to take flares for the purpose of lighting up the surrounding territory at night.

Colonel Gates telephoned with reference to the affair down in Florida and stated that the Associated Press insists that there were three people killed down there. I told him that Fred Barker and his Mother were the only people killed. The Colonel inquired if we had any pictures of these people. I told him that I had sent pictures of these people around to Mr. Suydam this morning. I further informed Colonel Gates that the battle lasted for five hours, beginning around 7:00 A.M., and lasting until about moon; that the only occupants of the house, Fred Barker and his Mother, were killed; that there was no one captured.

I told the Colonel that I did not believe there would be any further releases on the affair today.



MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

I called Mr. Nathan in connection with the Bremer case and advised that you could not see why eight more Agents were needed out there; that the records show there will be still 37 men there after the group go out with Connelley. Mr. Nathan stated that he believed they were needed in connection with the guard duty and that a number of men are tied up on spots. I asked that he secure and advise me of the exact number of men so engaged.

I also advised that you were concerned about the treatment the individuals in custody are receiving out there; that you would like the word to get through the underworld that when a fellow gets into the hands of the Department of Justice it is "just too bad" for him. He advised that #5 had not been saying anything.

I asked whether he had been able to observe any particular qualifications in this connection on the part of any of the newer Agents. He stated he had not had a chance to observe them as yet; that Brown and McKee, although not new Agents, had impressed him very favorably.

Mr. Nathan called me back to advise of the number of Agents on guard duty and those tied up on spots. He stated there were 14 on guard duty, 6 on plants, one processing fingerprints, one at the Piquett trial, and 4 on the road, which leaves only eleven available for general work or anything else. I advised that you had stated no more men would be sent in for the time being.

Mr. Nathan stated he would be leaving Chicago on Monday night for Oklahoma City, and that he would be able to get back in Chicago by Thursday afternoon, RECORDED





Fred Barker was connected with the Bremer kidnaping. I told him that Fred Barker was one of the kidnapers; that it was my opinion that we should not disclose the evidence in our possession at this time, because there are other kidnapers involved who are not as yet in custody.

Mr. Suydam further stated that he has had a query as to whether Harry "Doc" Campbell is connected with this case. I told him that I did not think we should at this time disclose the names of the other parties involved in this case for the reason that we are looking for them, and such publicity would only serve to put them on guard.


MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TANK

I telephoned Mr. Stanley and told him that after talking with both Chicago and Mr. Connelley in Florida, it was my opinion that the story relative to the capture of Doc Barker could be released sometime tomorrow; that, however, it was desired that we be able to get the man back into Chicago before the story is broken, after which it was my desire that immediate proceedings be initiated to indict all members of the Barker-Karpis gang, including the members killed today.

I told Mr. Stanley that it was my desire that he get in touch with the United States Attorney at St. Paul and inform him that to-morrow morning representatives of this Division from Chicago would be there to present to him evidence for an indictment against the entire gang; that although there is no grand jury in session at the present time, the United States Attorney would have to call one at once; that it is very important that this indictment be returned immediately. If this indictment is returned at once, when we arraign Doc Barker, we will be in a position to charge him with a complaint followed by an indictment.



Mr. Alt telephoned from Jacksonville and stated he had learned through telephonic inquiry at Ocala that the local authorities were proceeding to Lake Weir, the scene of the shooting, and that the Sheriff was having the road blocked; that most of the firing was coming from the outside of the house, there being little from the inside.

Mr. Alt further advised that Mr. Lacour's plane will be ready to leave Jacksonville for Ocala in fifteen minutes; that Mr. Lacour is equipped with 2 Monitors, another rifle and a thousand rounds of ammunition. I asked if he also was equipped with the inflammable bullets. However, Mr. Alt understood that Mr. Connelley did not want bullets of this type.

I stated that Mr. Hanson is leaving Birmingham by chartered plane with six Agents and Mr. Stapleton is also proceeding to Jacksonville with Agents.

I instructed Mr. Alt to have Mr. Lacour establish contact with him immediately upon arrival at Ocala, so that Mr. Hanson and Mr. Stapleton can be given the latest information upon arrival at Jacksonville.

Mr. Alt understood that nobody had been injured. I asked him to verify this, because of course this is my greatest concern. I also instructed that Mr. Lacour inform Mr. Connelley of the arrival of the reinforcements.







I telephoned Mr. Ladd at Chicago and advised him that you had received the impression that the Chicago office was not making very vigorous efforts to make the subject, who is being held there, talk.

Mr. Ladd assured me that he would personally see that the subject was given the proper attention and that he would be vigorously questioned.

I then inquired as to the hideout. Mr. Ladd advised that they have the place mentioned by Monty Carter located; that it is an old barn located about twenty miles from the office; that the surrounding country and sounds answer the description given by the victim, the only discrepancy being that the steps to the above building lead up while the victim stated that the steps to the building where he was kept led down; that there is a man living in the place, but it is not believed that he is the man who was there while the victim was kept there as they have information that that individual has since moved to another part of the town. Mr. Ladd stated that further activity with regard to the hideout was being held up pending the outcome of the lead down in Florida as it was feared that if anything was done in this connection it might ruin that lead.

Wr. Connelley telephoned from Jacksonville and advised me that he was making arrangements to "break" the case down there; that the situation is fairly good from a physical standpoint, the house in question is in the middle of a group of four houses end stands about 150 yerds from the highway, being about halfway between the highway and the lake. The house on one side of the house in question is empty and on the other side it will be necessary to have the occupants leave. Mr. Connelley advised that the ground was quite level and that there was no natural protection whatever around the house; that there was a motor boat located tied to a pier in front of the house and this angle could be nicely covered. Mr. Connelley also stated that they had plenty of equipment, including gas equipment.

I advised Mr. Connelley of the information conveyed to the Division relative to the inquiry of the Chicago American as to subject Number Five and of the fact that this subject was being moved this evening into Detroit.

Mr. Connelley stated that he was desirous of talking with Mr. Ladd relative to several persons whom he wanted taken into custody. I advised Mr. Connelley that I would talk with you regarding the proposed raid and would call Mr. Connelley back.

Rindly be informed that Mr. Mathan telephoned from
the Chicago Office this morning with further reference to the
Earpis-Barker case and stated that Gibson, of course, had been
killed and that the individual that he had reported to you during
the night as Willie Marrison was not in fact this individual; that
his true name is Bryon Bolton, alias Monty Carter, a minor member
of the Karpis-Barker gang and is supposed or alleged to have
received his cut of the Bremer ranson money in making arrangements
for the hideout; that they also have in custody three women. Mr.
Mathan stated that the press realises that they have some women
in custody but do not know their identity; that the true identity
of these women is as follows:

Clara Cibson - wife of the deceased Gibson. Mildred Kuhlman Buth Heidt.

Mr. Bathan stated that in all probability Mildred Kuhlman was living with Doc Barker and that Ruth Heidt, according to her statement, alleges that she was visiting the other two women. However Mr. Mathan believes that possibly she was the girl friend of Bryon Bolton, alias Monty Carter.

He further stated that the Grime Conference with regard to the Bremer case which was scheduled to be held at Chicago today will not go forward this morning in view of the fact that most of the men were up all night and that arrangements have been made for the Agents reporting to attend this conference to find them plenty to do until the conference starts; that it is entirely probable the conference will be held this afternoon. If mot, it will go forward withint any question tomorrow.

Concerning the Allen Cressler Bomberger kidnaping case, Mr. Mathan stated that this case had been entirely washed out in view of the fact that the victim 'phoned the Chicago police at 3:30 A.M. this morning stating that he had been released near the Great Borthern Hotel in Chicago and arrangements were made for Agents of the Chicago Office to have him immediately brought to the Chicago Office. Mr. Mathan states he has conferred with the victim and does not believe his stery. He claims he was kidnaped, taken to Indianapolis, brought to Chicago and released without any reason being paid.

Mr. Mathan states that under a little pressure he believes the true story of this case could be ascertained, but that he does not believe it would be advisable in view of the prominence of the victim's parents and that he is more convinced than ever at this time that there was actually no kidnaping involved in the case at all. He stated that the parents of the subject were on their way to the Chicago Office in order to obtain custosy of the victim and that he will be released shortly; that he furnished several leads which will be checked thoroughly.

Mr. Eathan stated that he will hold shortly another session with the press and furnish them with information concerning Bryon Bolton, alias Monty Carter, but will give no information to the press relative to the women in custody; that, of course, no information would be given out relative to the apprehension of Earpis.

He stated that a Coroner's inquest would be held this sorning relative to the shooting of Gibson and arrangements have been made for Agent Brown to attend, in view of the fact that Brown was at the scene during the shooting; is friendly with the investigator for the Goroner, and will tell the facts as they actually occurred; that is, that Gibson came out of the house araed and that five or six Agents fired - the identity of the person or persons that actually hit Gibson, of course, being unknown.

Mr. Mathan further stated that everything was well under control and that he would communicate with you later on in the day.

Mr. Connelley called in connection with the Bremer case. I advised him concerning the inquiries received in Chicago from a newspaper reporter as to thether we had #5 in custody, which was, of course, denied, but that the reporter requested a copy of the identification order. I advised him that #5 was being taken to Detroit tonight in order that if the publicity does break we can beat a writ.

I advised that you were afraid if Connelley went ahead with his plans there, there would be publicity, if there was any shooting, and we would, of course, have to take the people before the Commissioner then and we won't have the hide-out; that, if it possibly could be done, you wanted to work out a plan so that when Connelley is about ready to strike down there they could go out in Chicago and see if they have the right place, so that if we have to file on these people when we do get them we will have that location. Mr. Connelley stated that he was planning to make theraid at six o'clock tomorrow morning; that he was satisfied that he had seen Fred Barker and Kate Barker; that they had just found the place at about 11 o'clock; that there is another fellow there, probably Ray or Campbell; that there are at least two women there, one of whom may be Winona. Connelley suggested that his idea would be for the Chicago Uffice to take the hide-out at the same time the raid is conducted, which would be 5 o'clock their time, so that there will be no way for publicity to get down and spoil the raid. I advised that you were afraid, if there was publicity down there because of any shooting, and we did have to arraign these people right away, we would not have any Federal jurisdiction. Connelley stated that we have the indictment, which I advised will not "hold water". I advised Mr. Connelley that I would give him further instructions later in the Efternoon, through Mr. Alt.

Mr. Coulter called and stated he had just conferred with United States Attorney Sullivan and his assistant concerning the Bremer case. The United States Attorney has agreed that he can get a Grand Jury working by Monday, January 21st and that he will return indictments in the case. The names of the 26 persons were given to him and after reviewing the evidence for some time he concluded that it was an impossibility to return an indictment against a dead person; that he had had several cases of this kind; that he did not see how he could indict the four who are dead, although he would give the matter further consideration. He stated in the event these people are named in the indictment, it will be set out just what each of them did; but thet he will decline to indict the deceased persons unless the Department instructs him to do so. Those persons who the United States Attorney will indict are: Alvin Karpis, Arthur R. Barker, Volney Davis, Harry Cempbell, Elmer Farmer, Harold Alderton, William Weever, Harry Sawyer, William Harrison, Ollie Berg, Joseph P. Moran, "Whitiem (full name not known), John Joseph McLeughlin, William E. Vidler, Phillip J. Delaney, John Doe, Richard Roe, Byron Bolton, Jimmie Williams, Jesse Doyle, Edna Murray, Myrtle Eaton. Mr / Coulter stated the United States Attorney has indicated that he will return two indictments - the substantive charges being against Karpis, Barker, Davis, Campbell, Farmer, Alderton, Weaver, Sawyer, John Doe and Richard Roe. I asked what was meant by John Doe and Richard Roe, and he replied these were two men who had just been discovered and apparently acted as guards at the hideout. Their identity is unknown at present, but Mr. McIntyre has a description of these men. A conspiracy charge will be named in the indictment against the 22/hamed above; a substantive charge will be entered against the 10 named above, in the second indictment. "Whitie" is any associate of John Doe and Richard Roe, and nothing is known concerning them -Jesse Doyle is an associate of these men and nothing is known concerning him, except that he is also and associate. Sullivan suggested that McIntyre write a summary after each name, setting out the evidence against them, and the part taken by them. I advised this should be done immediately.
