Illinois. I have owned the property at this address for the past
16 years. I inherited the lot from my dad, and I first built a barn
on it and the turned the barn into a house. At the present time I
have a mortgage of about \$2300.00 on this home, and I also ose for
beek taxes and assessments. I have insurance on this home for \$2500.00;
Since my wife died 7 years ago, I have been living in the room which is as
the north end of the house. For about the past 4 years, my daughtor
liarriet, and her husband \$4. [Reed] knothed have been living uputairs.
Far ld Alderton and his mother kinnie Alderton beguied the 5 rooms
domastairs for about the past 5 years or so. Some time during kay,
1934, I ordered them to move out because they work 17 months behind
in their rent, which was supposed to be \$30.00 a m ath, I rented this
home to then furnished.

Alderton was a switchman for the Chicago, Kilmaukee and St. Faul Railroad Co. at Bensenville, Illinois, before he roved into my home, and as long as he lived at my address he was troubled with heart trouble, and I think he used to do a lot of gambling. when he end his mother left my place they stated they sere going to Indiana at some bothing beach that on old fellow had there. The name of the town I am unable to recall. Fre. Alderton stated to me that she owned land in Indiana, and was attempting to sell it, and alle would then pay me my back rent; that Alderton is supposed to have returned to Bensenville during July or thereabouts, 1934, as this is what I heard from some of the boys around town, as Alderton .. is well known in Bensenville. I understand that Alderton was married but has been divorced, a d has two children, one child being born shortly after he care out of the mar. Barold Alderton bas a brother, leon alderton, who works for some telephone company in Indiana, and he has two girls, one about 8 years, and the other about 10, and his children have on several occasions visited at the home of Herold.

Semetime during December, 1933 or January, 1984, Harold's mether was gone for about 3 or 4 weeks, and then wane back home, and then went sway again. It seems to me she did not stay home long the second time, and if I remember, she stated she was going either to Detroit or to Indiana to sell her property. During this time till she was gone, I noticed that all the shades in the house work pulled down for sametime. I make not suspicious of anything because I knew that Harold was home alone, and because of the fact that he used to stay out quite a bit. I thought he might be alcoping during the daytime. I do not remember him having any visitors there during that period of time, nor do I recell of any automobiles ecming there. While Harold's mother was gone, the light bill ran up to about \$18.00 or so, as the electric light man from the Public Service Company told me this when he was there bhe second time. This was about the time when the shades were pulled down, and that Mrs. Alderton was gone.

A couple of months before the Aldertons moved out, I make advised by Mrs. Alderton that about 2 o'clock one morning some one repped at her door, and she did not admit them, but, however, later on she learned that it was some member of the Dillinger gang.

I have been shown photographs, and I am unable to make any identications.

A reilroad men by the name of "Trenchie", who is a switchmen for the same reilroad company at Bensenville, is a good friend of Alderton, and might know of his whereabouts.

When the country went wet, Herman Languth, who lived on Bose Street about one block from my house, handled the agency for Birks beer, and he took in Harold Alderton as an agent, and purchased Alderton a Hupmobile 8 coach, black color. I understand this car was registered in the name of Alderton, and I believe that he still has this car. This car he used to park out in the yard, and never kept it in the garage.

Er. Cord, a barber is now living dometairs at 180 May
Street, and has been for the past 5 months. I have omed a part
chow and collie dog for the past 5 years, and farold Alderton also
raised cockerel spanishs while he lived at this address. I believe

that Aldertons purchased their groceries from either the National or A. & P. stores in Bensenville. About a month after Alderton poved out, I papered the living form, the north bedsoom, and the southwest bedroom, but I did not paper the small bedroom, which is south of the bathrow. This new tall paper i purchased from Sears Roebuck & Co., Chicago, but as to the wall paper in this small bedroom I sannot result where same was purchased, her shen this room was last papered.

I, EDEARD REID MOSCHEL, without any threats or promises having been made to me, voluntarily make the following statement to V. W. Peterson, whom I understand to be a Special Agent of the Division of Investigation, United States Department of Justice.

I, together with my wife, Harriet Baucke Moschel, and her father, Herman Baucke, reside at 180 South May Street, Bensonville, Illinois. My father-in-law, Herman Baucke, owns this place. There lived on the second floor at 180 South May Street, Bensenville, Illinois, with my wife for a period of over four years, having moved there about Labor Day in 1930.

When I moved to 180 South May Street at the time indicated the lower part of the house situated at that address was occupied by Harold Alderton and his mother, Minnie Alderton. Earold Alderton was formerly married but is separated from his wife, and he lived at 180 South May Street, Bensenville, Illinois, together with his mother, until approximately May, 1934. Prior to moving to 180 South May Street, Bensenville, Illinois, Harold Alderton was employed as a switchman for the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Railroad in Bensenville. To my knowledge he did not work during the time that he resided at 180 South May Street, Bensenville, Illinois.

I remember having read numerous newspaper accounts during January of 1934 to the effect that one Edward George Bremer had been kidnaped in St. Faul, Kinnesota. At the time that Bromer was being held by his kidnepers I noticed that there was a visitor in the Alderton home. At that time Minnie Alderton, the mother of Barold Alderton, was absent from home. I knew that someone was visiting in the Alderton home, however, because I could hear that the tollet in the ilderton home on the first floor at 180 South May Street, Bensenville, Illinois, was being flushed a greater number of times than usual. I also noticed in that even though Harold Alderton was absent from his home, there was the always someone present in the house. Under ordinary circumstances, when Herold Alderton was home the window shades would be pulled up. However ever, during the time that the papers were carrying the account that Broner was still being held by his kidnepers, I noticed that the shades to the windows of the Alderton home were always pulled down. I also noticed that almost immediately after Bromer had been released according to newspaper accounts, that the suspicious circumstances surrounding

the actions of the occupants of the Alderton home seasof.

The identity of the visitor or visitors at the Alderton home at the time indicated was not known to me, and I did not see any of the people who may have been staying with the Alderton family at the time.

Within possibly two days or so after I moticed that the visitor or visitors at the Alderton home had departed, Harold Alderton left the place, estensibly to visit the place where his mother was staying in Indiana, the name of the town not being known to me. About two weeks later Harold Alderton and his mother, Minnie Alderton, returned to their home at 180 South May Street, Bensenville, Illinois.

During the time that Harold Alderton lived at 180 South
May Street, Bonsenville, Illinois, I noticed that a number of toughlooking characters visited him at his home. The only close associate
of Harold Alderton known to me is one Kimer Farmer, who also resides
in Bensenville, Illinois.

During the time that Harold Alderton lived at 180 South May Street, Bensenville, Illinois, he raised cockerel spaniel dogs. He kept one female called "Dot" all the time, and usually had five or six pups around the place. Each of the pups also had a name but these are not known to me.

Since December 19, 1935 I have been employed by the Illimois Emergency Relief, and I am still employed by that commission.
From December, 1935 until April 1, 1934 I left home each morning to
about 7:00 or 7:15 A.M., and returned home each night about 6:00 P.M.

I was formerly married to Ruby Moschel, who now resides at 409 North High, Celena, Illinois. My two children, Jeanne Moschel, age 16, and Donald Moschel, age 15, live with Ruby Moschel at the given address. I have no children by my present wife.

Harold Alderton has two children, a girl about 11 or 12 years of age, and a girl, age 9 years. To the best of my recollection neither of the Alderton children nor my own children visited at 180 South May Street, Bensenville, Illinois, during the months of December, 1933 to February, 1934.

However, Carol Barnes, age 6, who is the daughter of my wife's sister, Mrs. Helen Barnes, calls at my home practically every day. This child undoubtedly called at my home almost every day during the months of December, 1935 to February, 1934, and two other children who live in the neighborhood and who are about the same age usually accompany Carol Barnes to my home.

I made the above statement of my own free will, efter which I have read same, and to the best of my knowledge it is true.

I, ira. Edward Reid Hoschol, age 28, of 180 Fouth May Street, Sensenville, Illinois, sake the following voluntary statement to J. H. Bathis and R. J. Abbaticohio, Jr., who I know to be Special Agenta, Division of Investigation, U. S. Department of Justices

I have been married for aix years and I live at the above address with my husband and my father, Hornan Baucke, who came the house. Since October of 1930, we three eccupied the second floor of the dwelling and my father rents out the lower floor. In either kurch or April of 1939 the lower floor was rented to a Ers. Limin Allderton, who is about fifty-four years of age and her son, Eurold, the rental being \$50,00 a month.

By husband, who formorly worked for the Chicago, Kilmankee & St. Paul Railroad, has known Harold Allderton for approximately twelve years, the latter having period as a switchman in the railroad yards at Bensenville. In either May or June of 1984 the Alldertons moved from our house to some place in central or southern Indiana and left owing my father about seventeen months back rout.

Since I have lived with my father, neither of the Alldertons were regnelarly employed. However, it is the general existence of the neighbors and of mycelf that these individuals were selling beer and liquer. They apparently operated at all hours, having a master of visitors, nearly all ten; mostly those who worked for the above-named relirond. I have also heard that Harold guabled at various places in Benconville and made some money that may. I also know that the Alldertons raised cocker spaniels and sold them as a further means of livelihood. By father allowed these people to remain in the house without paying rent for so long a time for the reason that Erc. Allderton many times mentioned the fact that she exceed some property, which I believe was land, somewhere in Indiana, which property she was about to sell and intended to pay my father the back rent out of the proceeds thereof.

Although these people left our house last somes without telling me where they were going, kro. Allderton told my father that they were going to a summer report somewhere in Indiana, where Earold was to take charge of the boots and the fishing. We have not heard from them wince they left, although Harold has been in Bensenville on several eccasions, the last to my knowledge having been in the early full of 1934, at which time he talked with kro. Emil Gorlow, who lives two doors from me on Kay Street, telling her that he intended to return to Bensenville to live probably in Hovesber of 1934.

Barold Allderton has a brother Leon, about thirty-two years of age and married, who has a position with the telephone company, I believe, as wire chief, in Kokono, Indiana. At the time the Alldertons neved from our

house, Leon and his wife come to Bonsenville and noved their affects from by house in his conjunt Hurold's cor, which he had owned from approximately the fall of 1925, was a blank Hurobile Seden, 5-Personger, either a 1980 or 1921 model.

Also, the shader in all of the windows in this portion of the house were drawn at all times during this ... period. During the time that these people were at the house, Pro-Alldorton was not thore, she having gone away approximately two works by before and beging returned for one day only about three days prior to the time that they arrived. Herold Allderton told my husband and myself several days before these people apparently arrived that be had just from taken his nother to the depot, she having departed for Indiana, I think that the wort either to visit her other son, Leon, or to the hors of her sister, whose first pear is Hora on! whose husband was called that. I believe that these people live in either Kokono or Eurica, Indiana,

The first circumstance that caused me to believe that there were paramage visiting Berold commend on what I believe a Wednesday evening, when my husbani knocked at the Alliertons' entrance to the house to request bounthing of Berold. At this time Burold, instead of inviting my husband into the house as wes his custon, requested that he wait a minute, them closed the door between the kitchen and living room and left my husband standing outside while he went into the house and get him whatever was requested, probably a bettle of bear. By husband told as about this and we concluded that Barold gust have company.

It was, I boliovo, on the next day, which I think was knurday, that I noticed that the blinds to all of the Alldertone' windows were drawn. During the entire three weeks, during which those blinds resained drawn. I heard no voices downstairs, but once in a while heard footstops. My impression at that time was blat there were a marker of people downstairs but that they were purposely being quiets. One might I heard a mas cough in the bedroom, which is below that of sypelf and husband. During this three-wook period I noticed no stronge car near our house.

The fact that poople are cooking domestairs is never noticeable to us. However, these people could not have cooked on the gas stove as the gas was shut off during this period, but night have cooked on electric plates, of which there was one, which was furnished the Alliertons with the apartment. I believe that this occurred for the reason that after those people left the inspector for the electric light company called to check

the wiring and electric meter, stating that the bill was unusually large, presumbly for the month of January, it summing around \$15,00.

As I have stated, the only person that I ever saw leaving the Alldertons' entrance during this period, was fareld, he leaving the house each day as was his custom at this time at around 1:00 P. H., usually driving off in his car. I persly saw him return, so conclude that he returned during the evenings. However, one day I saw him come in with a bug which apparently contained processes and also a newspaper. Marold never acted in a suspicious morner during these trips.

At one time during the three weeks, as I was passing the one entrance to the Alliertons' portion of the house, I saw the fingers of what appeared to be a men's hand pulling back the blind on a living room window, Bomoone apparently had looked out to see who was passing.

At the end of one day, at the conclusion of this period, I heard a number of drawers benging demantairs around \$100 or \$400 P. M., it then being dark. I then heard a our drive up to the Alidartons' entrance and looking out of my kitchen window observed that it was a large, dark-colored Sedan then without lights. It was headed toward the back of our house. I then saw a men, who had apparently come out of our house, walk around the front of the our with a suitouse in his hand and place the cuitouse in the left rear door of the car. I can describe this man only as being of medium height, about \$'9", wearing a dark, soft hat, an evercoat, and being of rather stocky build, weighing probably at least 170 pounds. After observing this I stopped looking out the window but heard the voices of at loast two men talking, apparently beside the car, after which I heard the saw drive away. This car drove away scretime between 5450 and 6400 P. M.

Botsech fifteen minutes and half on hour later, I heard a cor come back to
the same entrance and remombered that if it were the same our it would
have had time to have gone to Elahurst and back. I morely glanced out of
the window at the cor to see whother or not it was my husband returning
and my impression is that this was the same our which I have just described.
At this time I heard no voices, nor did I hear anyone enter the cor, now
did I see the car drive samy again. However, about half hour after this
my husband some home and I do not know whether the car was still stending
there when he arrived. I told my husband that I guessed the company had
left. It was probably on the following day that I next ass Harold Allderton,
who acted as usual. I did not ask him any questions relative to the
persons who had apparently been visiting him.

I estimate that it was not until about two or three weeks later that Mrs. Alldorton again came back to our house. It was on the day following the departure of this car as above-continued, that I saw in the papers Edward G. Broner had been released by the kidnapers and I discussed with my

bushend the possibility that Aldertons' visitors might have been holding him at our house, but we decided to say nothing about It, as we believed it would be bost for our sufety if we minied our own business. During the time those people were at the house I had not at any time heard that talephone ring, although I believe that they had one which was connected.

The Special Agents have shown me a number of photographs of various individuals and have requested that I night point out any that I have seen before, whether a visitor of Eurold Alldeston or not. However, I can only say that I believe that I have seen the men known as Harry Sanyer and William Harrison. I do not know where I have seen then, nor do I recall that they ever visited Harold Alldeston. I can also say that the faces of Fred and Arthur R. Barker are funding to no, but I believe that I have seen their pictures possibly in the newspapers setter than the men themselves.

I son describe Baroli Allderton as follows:

Harold's nort intinate acquaintence in Benneaville is, I believe, Elmer Farmer, at whose towern Barold often visited. I do not know the manual of any other good friends of Berold in Benneaville, but know that he was well know to the experity of the relired men there.

I have reed the foregoing statement, consisting of four and one-half typeritten pages and now state that the facts contained therein are true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

MELADRANDUM FOR SPECIAL AGENT IN CHARGE E. F. CONNELLAY

In interviewing Monty Carter today the following information was obtained from him by the writer and Special Agent J. L. Madala. The information is brief and not in detail at this time, due to the fact that Monty is mentally fatigued due to lack of sleep and anxiety.

He first advised that the principal reason for his giving the following information was to prevent the possible killing of more Special Agents. He, therefore, furnished the following information with reference to the present location of the remaining members of this gang. He advised that "Doe" Barker and Slim Gray left Chicago, Illinois, om the night of December 25th; that he did not know where they were going, but that they drove Ford V-8 sedan, bearing Illinois license plates No. 1-256-251.

He advised that he, Monty, and Willie Harrison left Chicago, Illinois, in Ford V-8 Victoria, bearing Illinois license plates No. 1-289-927. on 12/19/34, for Mismi, Florida, arriving there on about 12/22/34, where he spent Christmas with his wife and children at the Dorn Hotel, where they are now living. He advised he picked his wife and children up at St. Petersburg, Florida, where they were residing at the time, and took them to Miami. He stated Willie Harrison stayed at the El Comodoro Hotel, which he believes is managed by Joe Adams, who, according to Monty, is the gang's Florida contact; that he gathered this information through conversetion with Willie Harrison, who is well known to Adams. He advised that 4.4 when he left Chicago, Illinois with Willie Harrison he informed Doc Barker of his intentions of going to Florida to visit his family and Doc Barker suggested that he take Willie Harrison with him; that he, Monty, believes that Doc Barker sent Willie Harrison with him in order to watch him, as it is his opinion that members of the gang do not trust him implicitly as they do Harrison. He advised that he saw no members of the gang while at Viami, Florida.

He stated that he and willie Harrison left Miami, Florida, to return to Chicago, Illinois, on 1/2/35; that the first day they drove from Kiami, up Highway #41 to Lake City, Florida, where they spent the first night; that the distance was considerably more than 400 miles; that they started the next day about 10:00 o'clock in the morning and drove until approximately 2:00 o'clock that afternoon on Highway #41 to a point approximately 30 to 50 miles South of Macon, Georgia, where they stopped at a pecan ranch, having more than 4,000 acres of pecan trees; that this pecan ranch was near Lloyd's Pecan Ranch, which is also near Macon, Georgia. He was unable to give any further information as to the exact location of

this pecan ranch, but stated it could be easily located by inquiry at ar mear Macon, Georgia. He advised that while at this pecan ranch at about 8:00 P.M. on the second day after their departure, Blim Gray and Doe Barker drove up to their ear; that he and Willie were surprised to see them, but it is possible that Willie Harrison had made contact with Joe Adams of the El Comodoro Hotel, in Miami, who had possibly arranged this meeting without his, Monty's, knowledge. He stated that the car being driven by Slim and Doe was not dusty or dirty; that they advised they had "left", place of departure not known, at 8:00 s'clock that morning. When questioned as to the place of Doe and Slim's departure, Monty Cartar made the following comments relative to its location:

He stated that during his return trip both ears kept somparatively close together and that he over heard conversations between Willie Barrison Doc Barker and Slim, during which they talked about "the lake", which they described as a large fresh water inland lake, somewhere near Jacksonville, Florida, as they mentioned going into Jacksonville; that the conversation indicated that this lake was considerably remote from any town; that it was in that section of Florida where good deer hunting can be found as they stated they killed three deer and that they brought back to Chicago with them a considerable portion of deer carcass; that they also brought back fresh water fish which they had saught. He stated that they appeared very much interested in an old alligator in this lake known throughout that community as "Big Joe" that the boys had attempted to catch this alligator and had placed a small pig in a barrel for bait, but that "Big Joe" got the bait and did not get caught. He further advised that the boys had motor boat on this lake; that they lived in either one or two houses of the lake. He addised that he gethered that the lake was not far distant from Highway 41. As to the identity of the members of the gang now at this lake, Monty advised that from the a nversations he had with the boys, Alvia Marpis, Harry Campbell and Fred Barker are at this lake. He stated he elso overheard a conversation to the effect that Freddie Barker has a small Buick coupe with him and that the car is not hot; that the license plates were obtained in Tennesses. He advised that it is his opinion that this lake can be located by driving from six to eight hours south of Highway #41 from Macon, Georgia, and making inquiries in that vicinity concerning a lake in which there is an alligator famous to persons in that community known as "Big Joe". He further advised that he recalls that Slim and Boc had picked some coconuts near the lake, which they had brought back with them, and further that Slim made the comment that it waswonderful country for hunting and fishing, and that he would like to live there. \$1. **(4.**) (4.) He further advised that Willie Harrison told him that during the late summer of 1934 he was in Havana, Cuba, where he saw Ray Karpis and Dolores; that persons known to him only as Art and Jimmie, who operate a large gambling establishment just outside the city of Cleveland, Ohio, have

a gambling concession in Havana, and that willie spent some time at this place. He stated that it is his belief that when members of the gang were "jumped up" at Cleveland, Ohio, by Federal officers, they immediately went to Havana, Cuba, where they were given protection through contacts of Art and Jimmie. He stated that he does not know definitely whether or not other members of the gang other than Willie and Karpis were at Havana, but expects that they were,

With reference to Willie Harrison he stated that Willie frequently makes trips to Detroit, Michigan, where he sees a man by the name of Cash, who is a prominent man and whom he, Monty, believes changed a portion of who is a prominent man and whom he, Monty, believes changed a portion of the ranson money; that Willie also sontacts persons in Toledo, Ohio, known to him only as Art and Shimmy; that the gang's contact in San Francisce to him only as Art and Shimmy; that the gang's contact in San Francisce is "Soap", other name unknown. He further advised that he has recently heard Doc and Blim make the remark that they wonder where "Sealion", whe heard Doc and Blim make the remark that they wonder where "Sealion", whe is Harry Sawyer, is now located, and that Willie spoke up and stated that is Harry Sawyer, is now located, and that Willie spoke up and stated that "Sealion" is now probably working for Frank Foster, the gang's New York City contact; that he has heard the boys state that Gladys Sawyer is now with Harry.

standing that Volney had some trouble with other members of the gang and standing that Volney had some trouble with other members of the gang and has not been with them since the early summer of 1934. He further stated he has heard no mention made of Volney Davis and has no idea as to his whereabouts. However, he advised that Volney Davis is a wanderer and drives continually from one city to another, wrecking many automobiles.

Monty Carter then furnished the following skeleton information soncerning the Bremer kidnaping:

He advised that on January 7, 1934, he received a telegram and \$50.00 from Fred Goetz, whom he had known for several years, instructing him to come to Chicago at once; that upon his arrival in Chicago, Goetz asked him to take care of his wife for a few days and help her move when this action became necessary. He advised that Goetz failed to mention the nature of the "job" he was going onend that it was his understanding that Goetz asked the pob" he was going onend that it was his understanding that Goetz asked that to come to Chicago in order that he, Goetz, might fulfill his promise him to come to Chicago in order that he, Goetz, might fulfill his promise to set up Monty in a tavern business in Chicago. He advised that he lived at Goetz home and that after being there for about a week he drove with Goetz to Bensenville, Illinois, where they went to a house where the gang Goetz to Bensenville, Illinois, where they went to a house where the gang Was holding a kidnaped man. He advised that this was the first that he had learned concerning the kidnaping. He advised that he saw at this house Ray Karpis, a man known to him as "Lapland Willie" (Bill Weaver) and Doc Barker. He advised that he later learned that this house is a rebuilt barn;

is unpainted and has a two car garage in the front, which garage is a part of the house and sonstitutes a part of the first floor of the structure; that the garage is on the North side of the house, which is a two story effair; that there is an spartment on the garage second story where a man and his wife resided, who are still living there and whom he believes have two children. Be stated that in the rear of the house, first floor, lived a manby the name of Ellerton, who was unmarried and lived alone in the three rooms of that section of the house. He stated that in order to enter the house it was necessary to step up two or three steps; that Ellerton is a friend of Elmer Farmer of Bensenville and that Fred Goetz had Elmer Farmer arrange for the hideout. He stated that the house is the second house from the corner just off York Street on a street, the name of which he cannot recall, but that there is a filling station on this atreetnear this house end this street is a street which passes the roundhouse. He advised that the above des-? cription would undoubtedly lead Agent's directly to the place, as there is no other house similar to it in Bensenville. He advised that when entering the house, the portion occupied by Ellerton, it is necessary to enter from the side and to pass through a kitchen before entering a small living room, and that a bedroom is located to the left of the living room when entering the door, where victim Bremer was held. He advised he did not see Bremer while in this room of the hideout as the doors were closed on each occasion of his two visits. He stated that he understands that Ellerton is no longer residing in this house, but still lives in Bensenville and can easily be located. He described him as being about 40 years of age, slender build, sandy hair, blue eyes and of Scotch descent; He stated that Ellerton has a spanish dog which he recalls the boys called "Pancho". It will be recalled that victim Bremer often heard the name "Pancho" mentioned. 🦈

He stated that on the occasion of his second visit to the hideout, which was on or about February 7th, he was requested by Fred Goetz to drive his, Goetz', car a 1953 model Chevrolet coupe, to the hideout up in Bensenville; that upon arriving there he found Fred Goetz, Dog Barker, Bill Weaver and Harry Campbell; that he saw Fred Goetz and Bill Weaver take victim Bramer, who had goggles on his eyes, from the hideout to the Chevrolet coupe, after which they drove away. He advised he understands that they drove to a point a few miles away, where they entered the Buick sedan belonging to one of the Barkers, which was used in the kidnaping. He further stated that members of the gang parked their automobiles in the garage located withing the house above mentioned. He stated he never saw Elmer Farmer at the hideout.

Konty advised that Fred Goetz and other members of the gang told him that Doc Barker, Harry Campbell and Bill Weaver returned victim

Bremer to Rochester, Minnesota from Bensenville, Illinois; that the range notes were all prepared by Fred Goets; that the payoff and release were arranged by Fred Barker, Volney Davis and Alvin Karpis. He advised that Fred Goets told him that the fingerman in the case was Harry Sawyer.

Monty stated that he played no other part whatsoever in the kidnaping; that he stayed in Fred Goetz'house, took care of his wife, moved Mrs. Goetz soon after the kidnaping into enother apartment, and on the day after Bremer's release was given \$3,000 by Goetz, after which he returned to Phoenix, Arizona, where his family was residing.

Monty further stated that he understands that Dolores Delansy is to have a baby this month; that he does not know what arrangements have been made for her hospitalization. He also stated that he recalls members of the gang stating that Alvin Earpis was driving a Pontiac soupe.

Carter advised that upon having some rest he might be able to recall further details which would possibly give a better location of the gang's present hideout and that he will go into more detail concerning the kidnaping.

I, ELER FARER, do make this free and voluntary etatement to K. R. Kcintire, Special igent, Division of Investigation, U. B. Dept. of Justice, without any threats or promises of any kind, in the knowledge that the same may be used egainst me,

My full name is Elmor Charles Parmer, born Preirie du Chien, Fis., on March 10, 1893. I will be 42 yrs. of age on March 10, 1935. My perents are both deceased. At about 8 yrs. of age my family moved to Chicago where I grew up. I attended school at Cyprus and 12th Street, Chicago, a Catholic school, and then attended Hays school at Lacvitt and Fulton Streets. I attended school as far as the 8th grade, and no Surther.

In 1915 or 1916 I started buying and selling "hot" cars. In 1918 I was convicted on this matter and sentenced to serve two years in the Illinois State Conitentiary at Joliet, Ill. I should say that I was sentenced to serve from one to trenty years and actually served two years.

I have one brother, James Farmer, living with me at 194 addison St., Bensonville, Ill. I have one sister, Mrs. Gifford (Dlanghe) Bratandt, 275 Nevsca St., Limburgt, Ill.

ly brother James is now oper ting a Tavern called Miner's Tavern at 126 h. Gr on St., Bensonville, Ill. I am associated with him. I also have some slot mechines operating at various taverns. I operated a few "speak-easies" during Prohibition days.

I have known George Zeigler, alies Fred Goetz, for the past six or seven years. I met seigler through a "rum runner" nemed Eurold Conliss through whom I sought liquor im trohibition days. Zeigler was a syndicate man.

to my tavern. In speaking of playing golf I told Zeigler that I was a member of the Mohark Country Club, located on Irving Fark Boulevard and Church Woad in Du Price County. They both wanted to play golf there, so I arranged for their membership. This was my first meeting with Monte Carter. This is the only club I ever got seigler or Carter into.

Monte Carter and I knew each other largely through the slop machine business. He had alot machines in apploton, wis. He usually ment to Phoenix, Arisona, in the winter time for his health.

I have known Harold Allerton (whose same might be spelled Alderton) for about 10 years. He was a switchmen for the Chicago Milwaukee & t. Paul Ry at the Terminal in Bensonville, Ill. He is a world for veteran, having been efflicted with gas during the war. He receiver compensation from the Covernment. He was treated at the Great Lakes Maval Training Station, I believe. His home town is Marion, Indians. He has a brother who works for a telephone company in Indians. Allerton loft Bensonville, Illinois in the early summer months of 1934 and went to Marion, Ind. Allerton had lived with his mother in Bensonville, Ill., in a house, the address of which is not known to me, but which house I can identify as a house in which Edward George Browner of St. Paul, Minnesota was held a kidnap victim.

Shortly before Christman of 1953, George Zeigler und another men, whom I now identify from photographs as being Fred Barker. came to my caloon known as "Elmer's Tavern". They were riding in a 1932 Chevrolet Coupe owned by George Zeigler. Fred Barker was introduced to me as "Freddy". Zeigher said he would like to got a place out there (meening Bensonville) where he sould keep some men for a week or ten days. I said I didn't have a place. Then Goetz said "How about Allerton-is he still living over there?" I said, "Yes". Then Goetz said, "Well, maybe we can got a place up there for the men to stay." (It is understood that Boets and Zeigler are one and the same man.) As I recall I went up to Allerton's and got him and brought him down to my seloon to talk with Teigler. Zeigler made it plain to me that he had some "hot" people he wanted to hide out for a few days. Then Reigler and fred Barker made their arrangements with Allerton, they gave Allerton the same explanation. Zeigler told Allerton that they would be in any time soon.

I saw Zeigler, Fred Berker and a party from whose photograph
I recognize as /lvin K rpis, alias Ray, around Benconville and
around Allerton's house several times before Bremer was kidnaped.
I was in Allerton's house with either Ray Farpis or Fred Barker

before Brever was held in Allerton's house. On these visits I has permitted to go snythere in the house. In the part of the house in which Allerton lived there were five rooms, one large front bedroom, on the morth, two small bedrooms on the west, one living room on the east and one kitchen on the south. I did not notice any guns in this house until scratims after the middle of January 1936. Between the first time that I met fred Barker and Zoigler in my saloon when they asked about a house and the middle of January 1936, I hav Zeigler, Fred Barker and Ray Karpis, on frequent occasions, either at my seloon or at the Allerton home.

about the middle of Johusry 1934 Herold Allerton same to my saloon and told me that the boys at Allerton's house wented me to buy then some groceries. I think Allerton had a list of the groseries I was to buy. As well as I recall, alterton tes alone when he brought this mecause to me. "Allerton said to re. "The boye care in last night. They brought a fellow ? in with thorn-his head is hurt, but they have fixed him up all right". Then allerton and I bought the groceries in Elmhurst nt the A & P store and took them to Allerton's house. "I didn't go incide the house. They got me to buy the groceries. because Allerton dirn't have an automobile in which to carry them. A the time so bought the grocories, allers on told we me to bring up a case of beer and some whiskey. Ifter dark that night I took a case of beer and some liquor to Allerton's house. I saw no sutomobiles. I work inside the house and saw a man from whose photograph I identify as Harry hampbell, Toe Barker and May Torpio and Allerton. There were two others here whom I cannot identify. The first four new montioned were in the kitchen, and as I came in, the latter two men walked into the living room and closed the door. I had previously met Dog Barker in my saloon with Seiglor. He was introduced to me 44.7% us Thor. On this particular hight when I brought the beer to the boys I remained there only a short time. I heard nothing of any connequence discussed. The living room door was closed to me and I sensed that I was not to go in there.

On the following might, or porhous two nights later, Fred Berker; and Seigler came to my soleon, and they asked me if everything was all right. I understood their inquiry to mean whether the less had been around. I told them everything was all right.

Then they asked me to take them up to Allerton's house. They work driving the 1922 Chevrolot Coupe of seigler. The only explanation I can give as to why they mented me to drive my car up should of them to Alerton's house that night, was to find out if I was on the square with them. Both seigler and Fred Barker were dremed in business men's clothes. Is went into Allerton's house. It remained in the kitchen with Allerton and Barry Tempbell, while register and Fred Barker went into the living room and slowed the door. They remained in there about 20 or 30 minutes. By this time I had noted in the newspapers that Fremer had been kidneped in it. Foul, and I was reasonably sure that Fremer had been kidneped in it. Foul, and I was reasonably sure that Fremer was being held in Alerton's house. Ifter Frem Barker and Leigler had been in the living room for 20 or 30 minutes they came out, selked outside. I followed them and then they said they would see me in a couple of days, so I wont on home.

A couple of nights leter Zeigler and Fred Barker again care to my scloon and had me take them to Allerton's home. The some thing happened as above noted. I saw the same group of persons there as noted a couple of evenings prior to this.

By this time I knew in my own mind that it was Eremer who was being held in the other room at Allerton's house. I had noted none items on this case in the papers and observed in the papers from time to time that ransom notes were being sent to the Bromer family.

Thout a week after Brever was brought to Allerton's home I was there and now harry Compbell and Allerton in the kitchen. Ray Kurpis came into the kitchen from the living room and as he opened the door I observed to unidentified men sitting in the living room. I also noted four or five mechine cums lying on a day bed in the living room.

I visited allorton's house three or four times a week during the time Brener was held there, and prectically every time I was there I saw Doc Barker, ay Karpis and Hairy Cambell. Most of the time I also saw the two unidentified men I have mentioned above. I saw Fred Barker and Jeigler come in frequently. They always gave the appearance of having business to transact in the living room. Fred Berker and Beigler were always dressed in business men's clothing while the others were dre sed in high boots, riding breaches, rough suede jackets and heavy shirts.

I often purchased groceries for the parties at Allerton's house. I bought groceries at all the stores in Tensonville and also in Fighuret. Allerton also purchased groceries, I purchased groceries at the request of Allerton and Teigler.

Two or three times while I was visiting the Alberton house I observed Reigler and Fred Rarker go into the room occupied by a remer, and when they came out I noted that they had handkerchaces tied about their necks, which they promptly untied upon soming to the kitchen.

The next day after Brener was brought to allerton's house, allerton told me that the gang was holding Brener of St. Isul. He told he they were holding Brener for ransom, but didn't any how much rene som would be decembed.

The only car I ever sow any members of this gong use Curing the time premer was held in Allerton's house, was the 1938 Chevrolet Coupe of seigler.

Allerton told me that he had rented the garage of "Blady"

Bishop is a former barber in Bonsonville, he is a Forld for voteren and a few months ago he suffered a stroke and was taken to the noward Rines Hospital. He is now in some other Covernment hospital. He is a former switchmon for the Chicago, Milwaukoe & St. Paul Ry. located at honsenville.

on one occasion I heard Forry compbell and fay Forpis explaining to sigler and fred Early that when they took him Incaning Trever) they but to hit him over the head because he wouldn't get out of his car as they ordered him to do. They said that his head was split open but that he would be all right. This conversation took place in the kitchen of Alberton's home.

Two or three times a week leigher and Fred Derker would some to me and ask me if everything was all right, meaning whether or not anyone suspected what was soing on with regard to Bremer.
I always told them that everything was all right.

On the day that Brower was released George Paigler care to my caloon at about 10:00 or 11:00 o'clock in the morning and said, "'ell, they're gone". He made it clear to me that he meant that the gang and Bremer who had been up at Allerton's place,

After the gang and Rremer departed from Rensonville, George Zeigler gave me a \$1,000 bill, (one thousand dollar bill) with which to buy slot rechines. I had en idee that he gave me this money in payment of my services to him and his friends during the time Bremer wes being held.

I, CLARA CIBSON, do make this free and voluntary statement to K. R. McIntire, Special Agent, Division of Investigation, U. S. Department of Justice, without any thrests of violence or promises of reward of any kind.

My maiden name is Clara Estelle Fisher. I have used the nickname "Sue." I was born in Kansas City, Missouri, April 8, 1900. My parents are Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Earl Fisher, 502 Myrtle Street, Fansas City, Missouri. I have four brothers, Joe, Frank, Griffeth, and Jack. I have one sister, Mrs. George Guymon, living in Chicago. I grew up with the Italian element in Kansas City on the northeast side. I became acquainted with Russell Gibson in Fansas City, Missouri, when I was about 15 years of age. At this time Russell was driving a taxi cab for John Lazia, known as the Red Riding Food Cab Stand. I knew John Lazia intimately myself. Lazia was about four years my senior. He also lived on the north side of Fansas City. Russell was intimately associated with Lazia until Russell and I left Fansas City, One of their frequent meeting places was the North Side Democratic Club of which Lazia was the "Boss" having formed that club. This club was composed of the best and worst elements in Kansas City.

Whenever Russell Gibson got in trouble Johnny Lazia would always front for him, and Lazia referred me to Ed Curtin, for legal advice. Curtin was the prosecutor there for twelve years, but is now dead.

I married Russell Gibson on February 24, 1923 at Independence.
Lissouri. At one time Russell was arrested in Fansas City, charged with participation in a bank robbery. He was released on this charge.
At another time he was arrested and convicted, charge with assault with a dangerous and deadly weapon. He was sentenced to serve two years in Jefferson City on this charge. Russell served one year of this sentence and was released.

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Upon his release from Jefferson Gity, he started "running liquor between Kansas City and Oklahoma City, Four or five months after his release from Jefferson City, Russell became involved in the robbery of a bank messenger in Oklahoma City. On this matter he told me that if he were ever caught and had lots of money he could beat the rap, but that he would get plenty of time 15 he didn't have money. Russell also told me that he had three policemen in Kansas City, lissouri, who would "front" for him, and testify that he, Russell Gibson, was in Kansas City, Missouri, on the date of the bank messenger robbery in Oklahoma City. While Russell was being held on this charge in the Oklahoma County jail, Gomer Smith, a big criminal attorney came to see Russell, who wanted \$10,000 for defending Russell. Russell was visited by John Lazia while in jail and Sheriff Stanley Rogers arranged a meeting between the two. At this time Lazia told Rogers that there were several persons in Kansas City who would testify that Russell was up there at the time of the robbery in Oklahoma City to which Rogers replied, "Well, I haven't anything but a tin can jail, and if I were innocent I wouldn't stay in it." Russell told me he never used a cent to buy his way out, but that he was playing dice on the upper tier with some negroes, when he cut a hold through a wall and escaped.

Had Russell lived he would have been 35 years of age January 14, 1935. His mother's name is Nancy Gibson, his father being Grant Gibson. Nother and father now divorced. His mother lives in Los Angeles. Russell has four sisters, Goldie, Ruby, Orpha, and Grace. His brother is Orville Gibson, an attorney now in Los Angeles.

Goldie Gibson is married and I don't know her name or address. Ruby Gibson works in a department store in Los Angeles, Orpha is now Mrs. G. W. Walls, living in Aurora, Illinois. Mr. Walls is a painter for a railroad company in Aurora.

Russell escaped from Oklahoma City in about August, 1929. I had been living in Chicago about four or five months before his escape. Then Russell came to Chicago. We first lived at the Florence Apartments on Winthrop, then we moved to 6808 Wayne, called the Waynewood Apartments, then in an apartment on Lunt and Paulina, then to 5710 Winthrop. While at this apartment Russell was arrested for robbery and was held in the Cook County jail for about a month. During the past two years we have lived at the following addresses under the following names: In May, 1932 we moved to 3638 Pine Grove Avenue and

lived under the name of Roy Gray. We lived here for 18 months. In November of 1933 we moved to 626 Waveland and lived there until April of 1934.

Russell knew a gambler called "Heimie" who had been in the penitentiary at Joliet and through him learned to know Ollie Berg. I also knew Ollie under the name of Izzy. Russell was afflicted with a social disease and was recommended to Dr. Joseph Moran by Ollie Berg. About a year ago I was in Moran's office on Irving Park Boulevard with Russell, at which time I saw "Boss" McLaughlin. Moran tole me this man was McLaughlin and that he was dying of diabetes. Moran told me that McLaughlin didn't have a penny and that medical service was given free. I saw McLaughlin only once. At Moran's office I met a young man called Jimmie whom Moran said he was going to put through school.

Ollie Berg never told me what he was wanted for, but said that if he were ever arrested again it would mean the rest of his life. I knew Ollie when I was living at 3638 Pine Grove and at 626. Waveland, and saw him later in Toledo, Ohio.

During April, 1934 while we, Russell and I, were living at 626 Waveland, Russell told me that I should leave the apartment and not return to it until he told me to return. Someone had told Dr. Moran that officers were checking all his, Moran's 'phone calls. Russell said he was going to leave too. He said to me, "I would let you stay here and talk to those men (meaning officers) if we were all right." Russell's mother was living with us at the time. He sent her back to Kansas City, saying, "They might find out who I am." Russell and I had agreed to meet through an Italian girl named "Vi". I don't recall her address. She is not a contact for any gang.

I then moved to a room around the corner from my Waveland address, Addison and Pine Grove, where I remained about two weeks. I then moved to the Florence Apartment Hotel, 5406 North Winthrop Avenue, Chicago, Illinois and lived here for about two weeks. Russell rejoined me here. He asked me how I'd like to take a trip and mentioned New York. He said he had been in Toledo, Chio, and that there were several big gambling houses opening up there and he might be able "to get cut in" there. He also said that since the World's Fair was opening up he might be recognized by policemen from Kansas City. We gave up our apartment here and drove in our 1934 Ford V-8 Coupe to Toledo. When Russell returned to take me to Toledo, I told him that

things were getting hot and that officers had been to the garage.

About one month later Russell went to the garage, and Fr. Miller, proprietor, told him that the officers had taken the Ruick and had given a receipt.

I stated earlier that Russell and I always arranged to

I stated earlier that Russell and I always arranged to meet one another through a girl friend named "Vi." This is wrong. We met through Ollie Berg.

Cur first night in Toledo was spent in a hotel where Doc Moran and Jimmie were staying. Russell suggested that we could get a cottage cut on "The Point" or an apartment. I preferred an apartment. Russell learned from a friend of his where we should a lock for an apartment. I didn't see or meet this friend. We got an apartment at the Collingwood Apartments. Russell had me rent this apartment while he waited outside. He gave me no instructions as to the location and kind of an apartment I should rent. Then Russell would come home late he would say he had been out to "The Point."

I remained in Toledo two or three weeks. While there I saw Dr. Loran, Jimmie and Ollie. I never saw "Shorty", otherwise known to me as Joe Morley. Ollie Berg came there after we did and returned to Chicago shortly. He and Russell were gambling partners. Ollie stayed at the Commodore Perry Hotel, the best in Toledo. Jimmie told me he had relatives in Toledo. While in Toledo, Russell and I were out to two places - one was a Chinese joint and the other a barny place which had not yet been finished. I don't recall hearing of the Casino Club, or of a Ted Angus. We also went out to a roadhouse making a specialty of serving fish.

At the above mentioned barny place, Russell, Dr. Moran, Ollie and Jimmie and I saw a woman on one occasion who the boys called "Mert." She was known to all the men in our party. I have been shown a photo of Lyrtle Eaton and this woman "Mert" resembles the Eaton woman strongly. Mert was drunk and didn't appear to be with any particular group of people. Dr. Moran told me this woman had to have a quart of liquor each day. Russell never advised me of the identity of this woman.

About a week after we reached Toledo, Russell made a four or five day trip to Hannibal, Missouri. He said he had an appointment with some men from Hansas City, He didn't tell me who he met or the purpose of the trip. He did not lose his car on this trip.

After remaining in Toledo for about three weeks I had a quarrel with Russell and came back to Chicago on the train alone.

While in Toledo Russell made money shooting clay pigeons .
I don't recall the name of this place. In Toledo, for Moran told me
he had some work to do, but never mentioned the nature of the work.

Upon returning to Chicago I took a room at the Hayes Hotel on the south side, remaining there about four days. I moved to a room on the 6400 block on Kimbark. At each of these places I used the name of either Clara or Sue Rogers. In Toledo I registered in the name of Mrs. J. Rogers. I contacted Russell about one week after I moved to the Kimbark Street room. Russell had just gotten into Chicago and was registered at the Harrison Hotel in the name of James Rogers. I stayed there with him for about a week and then we moved to Briar Place, the apartment being called Briar Way. We registered in the name of James Rogers. We lived here for four or five weeks. Ollie Berg visited us at this apartment. While at this apartment Russell made a trip. He didn't say where he was going or who he would meet, but said he would be gone for about a week. Ollie Berg might know. Russell's purpose in making this trip. A couple days after Russell's departure he returned, said he had been to Hannibal, Missouri, and that he was lucky to be back. He said someone "had put the finger on him there." I asked him how he knew and he said that two officers came into a saloon where he was sitting, and asked whose car that was out in front (meaning Russell's Ford coupe). Russell then walked out the back door and came home on a train, Russell said we ought to move to a new apartment because he had left some shirts in his car, and he might be traced through the laundry marks. We then moved to the Aldine Apartments on Aldine Street. I rented the apartment under the name of James Roberts. We remained here about a month. We then moved to the Diversey Plaza or Diversey Parkway Apartments on Diversey between Halsted and the Elevated lines. We lived here under the name of James Roberts for three or four weeks. During the time we lived here Russell's photograph appeared in a Detective magazine. This was in connection with the robbery of the bank messenger in Oklahoma City, and Russell's photo appeared opposite that of Cowboy Hays. Seeing this Russell wanted to move and asked me to sure to get into an apartment not having a switchboard and hotel service. He was afraid someone at the desk would recoznize him from his photograph. So I rented an apartment at the Surf Lane Apartments, 432 Surf Street, Chicago. We lived here in the name of James Roberts. previous to this time I had heard Ollie Berg and Russell speak of a fellow called Shorty, whom Russell told me was Joe Forley. Russell moved our things to the Surf Apartments in a car, a Ford Sedan, 1934 model, which he said he had borrowed from Joe, meaning Joe Morley. It was my understanding that Joe was either living with Ollie Berg or next door to Berg. Shortly after we moved to Surf Street, Joe Morley visited us. He visited us numerous times. He and Russell would sit up very late talking. I never heard their conversation. I was told to keep out of everything. Slim told me not to have "nose trouble." Joe Norley was very quiet and never talked

Just before we moved to the Surf Apartments, Ollie Berg telephoned and asked for Russell. Russell wasn't home so Ollie told me to tell Russell to stay home when he came in, that some parties had come in from out of town and wanted to see Russell. Russell told me that Jimmie and Joe had come to town. Ollie came over the next day and was/because they had dumped Jimmie off on him.

. About a month after we moved to the Surf Lane Apartments, Russell brought a man to live with us named andy, or Andrew Allen. Andy is the man who was arrested with me at my apartment at S912 Pine Grove on January 8, 1935. Andy was to stay with us until his wife came. Andy had been living at the Guyon, or Guymon Hotel, on the west side. Andy stayed with us for about a month before his wife and two children arrived. They then took an apartment in the Surf Lane. Ers. Allen was known to us as "Vi". Mr. Allen called her Viva. Before Mrs. Allen arrived, Russell, Andy and Joe Forley had several meetings in my apartment. All during the time we were at the Surf Lane, Andy, Russell, and Joe Morley would make numerous trips out of town. - Cocasionally William Parrison came to the Surf Lane with Joe Morley; On all of these trips Russell and Andy took their suit cases with them. There was one black bag in our apartment that Russell told me never to touch. He always took this bag with him and Andy on trips. It was an extremely heavy bag. I never looked inside this bag, but I am confident it contained guns.

Joe Morley was always with Russell and Andy on these trips, and they usually left from my apartment. The only car I ever saw them use was Joe Morley's Ford sedan, until andy bought his Ford coach. Around Thanksgiving Russell and Andy were making a trip and said they would be gone for about two weeks. They returned in two days and didn't say where they had been or why they returned so soon. On one

trip Russell stayed in a hotel next door to a police station. On the trip Andy and Russell made at Thanksgiving time, Mrs. Allen, Ruth Heidt and I had dinner at my apartment.

While at the Surf Lane we were visited several times by a fellow called "Whitie" but name not known. He was known to Andy and Russell, but Russell told me that "Whitie" was a stranger to almost all of them. Sometimes he came alone. "Whitie" was there at times when Joe Morley was at my apartment. "Whitie" seemed to be as well known to Joe Morley as to Russell and Andy. Russell told me that "Whitie" was broke and that Andy and Joe were loaning him money. "Whitie" was at my apartment with William Harrison and Harrison seemed to know "Whitie" as well as the others knew him. In all, I saw "Whitie" about six times. He is described as follows:

"Whitie" never made any trips with the boys, to my know-ledge. I have been shown photographs of Edward Wilhite, but this man is not identical with "Whitie".

Several trips were made out of town by Russell and Andy

while Andy's wife lived at the Surf Lane.

Russell had always slept with a small gun under his pillow, but when we were living at the Surf Lane, and when Russell was being visited by Farrison, Joe Morley and "Whitie" he always slept with a large rifle or shot gun beside his bed.

About December 1, 1934 Russell said he and Joe Morley and Andy were going to leave town and that he had another apartment for us; that william Harrison would move us. Our rent was up on December 15, 1934 at the Surf Lane, so we moved to the Shelldrake Hotel for about four days. We were to move to an apartment on 3912 Pine Grove. Harrison said he had been living there for some time. Some woman had been living in the apartment on Pine Grove because Harrison moved her dresses out when we moved in. In this apartment I noticed some new wiring and an extra plug on the wall and I asked Harrison if that was some of his work. He said that Joe Morley I drew the conclusion that they were living together.

It was about December 20, 1934 that we moved to 3912 Pine

While we were living on Surf Street, Harrison told me that
Joe Morley had fallen in love and was going to get married. Later,
Russell told me that Joe had gone to Crown Point, Indiana and had
gotten married. I've never seen Joe's wife, but understood she was
from the East. I asked Harrison if it was sudden, and he said Morley
had been going with the girl for some time.

At3912 Pine Grove I found an Illinois automobile license certificate in Russell's clothes, issued in the name of Bolton.
Russell told me that this paper was for Shorty's car.

Andy Allen lived with us at 3912 pine Grove. Cecasionally he would be gone over night. When we moved to 3912 pine Grove Avenue, Russell and Joe Morley made a trip, being gone four of five days, possibly less. He didn't tell me where he had been.

A few days before Christmas Russell asked me one night to prepare Andy's breakfast by 7:00 A. I. on the following morning, that Andy and Farrison were going to take a trip. He didn't say where Andy was going. Ruth Heidt heard Andy tell Russell that he, indy, would be back by January 4, 1935. Farrison was at my apartment the night before this trip and said he was going with Andy and said he was going to work wherever he was going.

About three days later Russell said that he and Joe Morley were going south, and that I should pack enough things to last him about three weeks. When andy left he said he was going to see his

family over the holidays. Russell returned two or three days after New Year's and said he had seen andy in Georgia. Russell brought back some deer meat and some fish - said he had fished one day. He also brought back some nuts. Russell said he and Joe Morley had rum into Andy and Harrison, coming home, while the latter were buying nuts. Russell said they had had car trouble on the way home; that they had no money, except a large bill which Morley had, and had they tried to cash this bill they might have gotten into trouble.

After the boys returned, andy continued to live with us Harrison and Joe Forley also visited us three or four times. On the
night of the raid on January 8, 1935 Joe Morley had dinner with us.
Morley remained with us about two hours. At about 8:00 P.M. Russell
took Morley to his home, and was gone for about an hour - then Russell
came home and we packed a box and he and I took the box over to the
new apartment. Then we returned home and about an hour later the raid
took place. The only parties in the apartment at the time of the raid
were Ruth Heidt, Andy Allen, Russell and I.

In July or August, 1934 while we were living on Diversey,
I first noted in the paper or in a detective magazine that Russell
was wanted in connection with the Bremer kidnaping. I asked him
what part he had in it. He denied any part in it, but I told him
where there is smoke there must be fire, and he said, "If they were to
arrest me tomorrow, they would take me to St. Paul and the most I could
get would be five years.

At the time of the raid on January 8, 1934 we were arranging to move to an apartment on 520 Surf Street. Ruth Heidt had been living with us. Russell and I were going to take a trip and since Andy didn't want to stay alone with Ruth Heidt, we got this apartment for Andy and gave Ruth \$50,00 to live on while we were gone. Andy gave me this money to give to Ruth. I got this apartment through an advertisement.

Russell and I were going to go to Kansas City, Missouri, to see how the case in Oklahoma City was progressing against Cowboy Hays.
Russell wanted to learn how much evidence they had against him, Russell.

I first met Ruth Heidt at the 554 Club in Chicago. She was
a hostess there. I later learned from Harrison that she was formerly
his wife. I learned that she was not going very well financially and
Russell and Andy asked me to take her in for a while until she could
find another job. She lived me at the Surf Street and Pine Grove
addresses. Russell, Andy and I visited the 554 Club three or four

times, but I never saw any persons whose photographs have been shown

I don't know where Harrison is at present, but on January 8, 1935, I heard Russell ask Joe Morley if Harrison got away all right, and Morley said he did. Apparently Harrison has gone out of town.

The state of the s At the time of John Lazia's death I asked Russell who killed him and the reason, and he said it was probably one of the younger set of Italinas who was jealous of Lazia's power; Russell said that whoever became "Boss" after Lazia's death would probably be the one who was responsible for his death.

During the time we were in Toledo either Jimmie or Russell told me that Dr. Moran was playing around with a colored cabaret entertainer. Dr. Moran said he was going to get married and go out to his sister in Colorado.

Among the persons known to Russell in Kansas City were:

Guy Given Cass Welsh Tom Pendergrast Solly Weissman John Lazia Booth Baukman James Aylward (attorney)

E. C. Reppert Gold Tooth Maxie Joe Bondi Ed Curtin (now dead)

I have known William Harrison under the name of Elmer Howe. When he returned from the south after New Year's Harrison told me he had been offered a job on a gambling table at \$25.00 a day. I asked him if it was in Georgia, and he said, "No - in Cuba." He said he might take this job. Harrison has the appearance of being an overgrown joking boy. He nicknamed Joe Morley, "Gabby" since he said so little.

During a telephonic conversation with Mr. Stanley, I informed him of the gum battle which the Atlantic City Police Department had early this morning with AlvinoKarpis and Marry Campbell. I told him that the two women who were with these men were apprehended, but the men got away in another car. I told him the women had given quite complete statements, and one of them indicated that Marry Campbell was fatally wounded by the gun fire of the Police Officers.

I further informed Mr. Stanley that we were taking every step in our power to effect the apprehension of these men.

I told him that at Chicago we have two full confessions in the Bremer kidnaping case; that Mr. Bremer has come down and identified the hidcout in which he was kept; that we have the men who arranged for the hidcout and kept the place supplied with food, etc.

The report of the Coroner's jury as of January 15 - 16, 1935, is to the effect that Fred Barker and Kate Barker came to their death at the hands of Agents of the United States Department of Investigation in the protection of their own lives while the said Fred Barker and Kate Barker were resisting arrest. This report was issued by the Coroner, F. E. Futch. Mr. Connelley stated he would secure a certified copy of this report and forward it to the Division. He stated there would be a little difficulty in connection with the money and personal property of the subjects, as the law there provides that the coroner shall take possession of their personal effects, to turn same in to the Clerk of the Court. The Coroner states if he fails to do this he might be subject to suit. Mr. Connelley states he had discussed the matter with you yesterday; that it is thought the thing to do is to get the United States Attorney to settle the metter with the Coroner. He stated he would immediately call Jacksonville and ask that that office send down either the United States Attorney or an Assistent, to Ocala. He stated that all of the Coroner's jury commended the Division on the work it had done, in "cleaning up the mob there", and also with reference to the activities of the Division in the past. Nothing of this commendation was in the verdict, however, Mr. Connelley having been personally advised of their attitude. I called Mr. Ladd in connection with the Bremer case.

He stated that the Agents got in this morning from Detroit and that he believes no one saw #5 at Detroit as it was dark when they got there and they took him right into the building; that the papers had called him several times this morning to see if we were going to make any statement about Barker in line with the story in the American and Ladd advised we had no comment to make.

I advised that you wanted the situation in St. Paul pushed and that he should try to get a special session of the Grand Jury. He stated he had told McIntyre that when he left and requested that when he had finished his conference he should have Mr. Coulter call me and give me what information had developed and also to call Ladd. I requested that Mr. Ladd personally call the United States Attorney and point out to him that we have the hide-out and that we are very anxious to get an indictment, but that he delay his call until we had the outcome of the conference. I advised that you thought we should include in the indictment "Ma" Barker, Fred Barker and everybody who participated in the case. Ladd stated he had given McIntyre these names and suggested that he have them included, as well as Slim Gray, the money changers, and all others.

I advised that Mr. Nathan would be back at Chicago about 2 o'clock this afternoon and that you desired that he go up to St. Paul and watch the situation there and do what can be done to push the thing right through. He stated he would have Nathan call me when he came in.

I advised that you feel there is a leak there in the office and requested that he look into it and see what he can find out, because this is the third successive time that the Chicago American has had an exclusive story on something we were doing; that you feel it might be coming from one of the clerical employees or stenographers. Mr. Ladd stated he had no suspicions of anyone there, but that he would carefully look into this matter.

I requested advice as to whether they were still keeping Elmer Farmer, and Ladd advised they are keeping him, Monte Carter, #5's girl, Clara Gibson, and the Heist girl. I asked what the purpose was in holding Clara Gibson now. He stated Connelley wanted her held for a while, at least until they had finished in Florida, in order that nothing would get out.

I asked whether any information had been obtained relative to Allerton, and he stated the Agents had called him from Marion last night advising that they had not been able to develop anything, and Ladd told them to check further this morning. I asked as to the manner in which Allerton moved his furniture from Bensenville, and Ladd stated he had been mistaken in this connection; that after he had talked with me he had questioned that bunch further and found that the place was furnished and that the same furniture is supposed to be there but is apparently rearranged; that some of the dishes that were there at that time were given to a daughter, and Ladd stated he believed they would be able to locate them; that the beds had been switched around and they are going to check carefully against the description given by Bremer. He stated further that after Allerton moved out the owner had the place re-papered and papered all the rooms except the one in which Bremer was held and the paper in that room is torn and cracked in the corner, as Bremer described it, and it is identical with the wallpaper we have.

At about 1:00 A. M. on January 20, 1935, SAC J. H. Hansom from Fismi, Florida, advised that it had been positively determined that Alvin Karpis and Dolorest Delaney left Mismi at 5:00 P. M. on Wednesday, January 16, 1935. Concerning this matter, it appears that the police department in Mismi has made some investigation and has broadcast the description of the ear in which they were traveling. Hanson stated that this car was a tudor Buick sedam, 1935 model, bought at Mismi, bearing 1935 license tag D-5306, motor number 4949155, serial number 2783525. It was bought at Mismi under the name of Leroy Corrison, 444 Main Street, Buffelo, New York. Hanson states that he talked to the doctor who treated Dolores Delaney and he said she was past due, the baby should have been born between January 14-18, that her pregnancy is not very noticeable. Karpis is now carrying a .45 automatic pistol and a rifle. Hanson also stated that the Fismi police had advised the Tampa and West Palm Beach police departments to be on the look-out for this ear. He suggested that all hospitals be checked between Fismi and Jacksonville. I advised him that I would arrange to check the hospitals north of Jacksonville.

Temediately at the conclusion of my telephone conversation with Hanson, I contacted Captain Cannon of the local police department and furnished him with a description of the car and occupants; however, I furnished no names. I requested that he broadcast this over the police chain radio, which he said he would do immediately. I also requested him that in the event this car was located the Jacksonville police department should be notified, who, in turn, would notify the Jacksonville office.

At about 7:00 A. M. on January 20, 1935, Captain Cannon contacted me by telephone, advising that the Jacksonville police department was in receipt of the following telegram, dated at Atlantic City, New Jersey:

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
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

MEMORANDEM FOR MR. TANK

Daring a telephonic conversation with Mr. Stanley, Mr. Stanley made inquiry concerning the outcome of the gun battle in Florida.

I informed Mr. Stanley that the coroner's jury brought in a verdict that Kate and Fred Barker were killed by Agents of the Department of Justice while resisting arrest.

I stated that we found in Kate Barker's pocketbook, ten-\$1,000 bills, quite a number of \$50 bills, and \$10 bills, and smaller money; that we found \$4,000 on Fred Barker in his money belt; and that we also got nine or ten guns and twentyfive boxes of ammunition. Mr. Stanley said that the money might be a part of the ransom money and I stated that it was doubtful, but that we were checking that angle now. I further stated that we had asked the United States Attorney at Jacksonville, Florida to either go to Oklawaha er send someone and take possession of the money, guns, and ammunition, because under the state law, the coroner is supposed to take possession of them.

Randall stated he did not know any of them by their names and was never introduced to them, but he had seen Joe Adams talking with them and he had spoken to them several times. The Ford coupe which Randall now has, and which car Karpis bought in Cleveland, was bought by him from Fred Barker for \$300. Mr. Hanson stated they now have this car. Randall claims Barker at that time used the name of Charles M. Bronson.

Randall also stated that he bought for Karpis the Buick sedan which he had; that Adams had brought Karpis over to Randall in the lobby of the hotel, and introduced him to him as Morrison, asking him if he would not do Karpis a favor; that Karpis told him the car he had picked out and gave him twelve \$100 bills, and that he bought the car and gave it to Karpis. Hanson stated they had found the bill of sale for the car in Randall's home. Randall further claims that on Tuesday or Wednesday of last week Winona Burdette had come to him at the race track where he worked and asked for a letter of recommendation to some hotel in Atlantic City; that there was no indication that they were leaving town hurriedly, so he gave them a letter to the hotel up there. He stated Winona Burdettewas with Karpis' girl at that time.


Randall claims that is all he knows about them, that he did not give them any other addresses and had no idea where they were going. Hanson stated they will continue to work on him and try to secure more information.

Judia He further stated that he had no papers reflecting the transaction with Ta Garage Blackburn as they had been forwarded to Ross D. Judd Sales, St. Charles, Illinois.

Interview was had with Mr. Fred E. Drew, Notary Public at 4141 Cottage Grove Avenue, who stated that he could not recall notarizing an application for the bill of sale for T. C. Blackburn inherence of 1984. He stated that he has mumbrous people calling on him to notarize papers, and it is impossible for him to remarker cach individual. He further stated that he had no record of the transaction.

MELORANDUM FOR MR. TAM

There was referred to me by Mr. J. Warnes of Unit 2, Mr. George Kelly, an attorney presently connected with the Emergency Relief Administration, who advised that he is a native of Atlantic City, New Jersey, and having read newspaper accounts of what had taken place with respect to Alvin Karpis, et al, there on Sunday morning, Jenuary 20th, and recognizing some of the men mentioned in the press dispatches, offered his assistance in the matter.

Mr. Kelly stated that he is a Democrat and has an "axe to grind" with the present Republican administration which is now in control at Atlantic City; that the "powers that be", one Enoch Johnson, Chairman of the Republican National Committee, is not really a politician but a gangster who has alined himself with the Republican party. He stated that the Danmore Hotel is notorious as a "cooling off place" for fugitives and is run by Dan Young and Bill Morley.

Mr. Kelly stated that he was not familiar with how Karpis and his associates made their contact in Atlantic City but ventured to state that it was through dog racing interests of Newark, New Jersey and Mami, Florida; that the Newark outfit is connected with the gamblers at Atlantic City, and that if Karpis and his associates went to Atlantic City with a letter of introduction from the interests at Miami, they would no doubt receive the protection of the local government at Atlantic City.

Mr. Kelly stated that there is a group known as the

Five Hundred Club located on Missouri Avenue in Atlantic City,
managed by "Doc" Coucci; that in the rear of the Five Hundred Club
are a number of apartments which can be used as hideouts; further,
that Sam "Cappy" Hoffman, who is presently on parole, having served
three years of a five-year sentence on State narcotic charges, has

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Mr. Kelly stated that had the name of Karpis been mentioned in the flash sent out from Florida, that the local police would have attempted to give protection to Karpis, inasmuch as he had apparently made the "right" contacts, namely, the Danmore Hotel and the Police Surgeon, Dr. Carl Soran. Mr. Kelly stated that from

his knowledge of Atlantic City he believes that in the event Karpis and Campbell were not seen proceeding from Atlantic City, it is quite possible they are now in hiding there. He stated that under ordinary circumstances when an alarm of a shooting affray in Atlantic City is given, the New Jersey State Highway Patrol receives this alarm immediately and generally takes steps to block the three main highways leading from Atlantic City; that augmenting this action, the local authorities at Atlantic City can immediately raise the three draw bridges, thereby preventing any escape.

Mr. Kelly suggested that representatives of this Division contact the Acting State Prosecutor at Atlantic City, Bobilicallister, a Democrat and an appointee of the Democrat Governor. Mr. Kelly stated that licallister is opposed to the local administration and will gladly cooperate in furnishing more detailed information respecting the above setup. Mr. McAllister is considered by Mr. Kelly as being very reliable and will keep his participation in the matter confidential.

Pursuant to your instructions, I telephoned Mr. Rham Whitley at the Philadelphia Office and furnished him briefly the foregoing information and instructed him to have Agents contact Mr. McAllister for any assistance he can render in the matter.

I was advised by Mr. Whitley that Special Agent in Charge E. J. Connelley and Special Agent J. L. Madala had arrived in Philadelphia and were presently questioning the two women who are now in custody there.

I advised Mr. Whitley that Duke Randall has been taken into custody for questioning by the Jacksonville Office.
