MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

Re: Bremer Case.

Mr. Brantley telephoned from the Oklahoma City Office and advised that a few minutes ago he had received a telephone call from Agent Paul Hansen at Tulsa, Oklahoma, who this morning had a conversation with Mark Whinnery, a brother-in-law of Wynona Burdette. Whinnery informs that last night he was up at a little town by the name of Purley, Oklahoma, visiting at the home of the Joneses, Mr. Jones having married a sister of Wynona Burdette. While he was at the Joneses, a car drove up to the house, honked, and in a few minutes a man came into the house. This man, according to Whinnery, was Harry Campbell. Campbell told the people who were in the house there that he was just passing through; that he regretted extremely that Wynona had gotten into some trouble; that he knew that he was responsible for her getting into trouble, and wanted some one of them to go somewhere (place not stated) to see what they could do for her; that he would finance the proposition, etc.

At this point in the conversation by Campbell, another car drove up to the house and honked, but no one came in. Campbell went out to the car, and in a few minutes returned and stated that he had to leave at once; that, however, he was returning on Wednesday, and in the meantime, they should think it over and decide what they would do about his proposal.

Whinnery does not know whether Campbell will in fact return, and, of course, Mr. Hansen does not know whether the information is authentic; however, Mr. Brantley assured me that every precaution is being taken and every step is being taken to cover the place starting tonight, or tomorrow night. I cautioned Mr. Brantley to make a cautious survey of the situation, and to have enough men present to handle any situation that may arise.

Mr. Brantley assured me that he would do this, and also stated that he would promptly advise the Bureau of any developments.

Reference is made to a letter addressed to the Bureau by Major Ceneral James S. McMinley, the adjutant General, Ear Department, Washington, D. C., dated October 16, 1934, in which it is stated that the fingerprints of Dr. Joseph P. Moran, alias Joseph B. and Joseph D. O Moran, contained on Identification Order #1232, September 14, 1934, had been found to be identical with those on file in the office of the Adjutant General for Joseph P. Moran who was admitted on May 15, 1917 to the First Reserve Officers' Training Camp at Leon Springs, Texas, as a civilian candidate for a commission.

This letter also states that a communication was received from Lieutenant Moran consisting of an application for adjusted compensation which was dated August 10, 1932. It is suggested that inasmuch as requests have been transmitted to the Laboratory for hand- , writing comparisons of various specimens with the writing of Joseph Foran, photostatic copies of any available documents bearing the handwriting of Koren and on file in the office of the adjutant General be obtained and forwarded to the Bureau.

Smith who is at Toledo, Ohio received information from a confidential source to the effect that subjects Campbell and Karpis split up about two weeks ago; that Campbell allegedly proceeded to his home at 818 South Rockford Street, Tulsa, Oklahoma, presumably driving his own car; that en route to Oklahoma he became involved in an automobile wreck and received slight injury.

The information received by Special Agent Smith was to the effect that Campbell is already at 818 South Rockford Street, Tulsa, Oklahoma, or is due to arrive there in the very near future.

At 4:20 p.m. today the writer communicated this information to Special Agent in Charge Dwight Brantley at Oklahoma City, who advised that a coverage is being maintained of the residence of Campbell, at Tulsa, Oklahoma, information having been received by the Oklahoma City office to the effect that Campbell is,

or has been recently, visiting at Tulsa, Oklahoma.

trial today. I will talk to him again tomorrow afternoon.



It has been noted that various field offices have been submitting rather lengthy reports without setting out any specific Aleads to other offices, merely indicating that all offices should review the report for any investigative activity necessary in their respective districts.

It occurs to me that in those instances where there are definite suggested leads from the information contained in such reports it would be more desirable if the reporting office should definitely indicate such leads. It is realized that the setting out of specific leads from voluminous reports of this character is difficult from a practical standpoint. However, it might be possible to avoid any confusion by having the stenographer use two note books, one of which would be employed only in setting down leads which are to be incorporated in the report. In this way the dictator could give the stenographer the leads as they occur to him during the dictation, and any confusion would be avoided.

RECORDED & INDEXED It is thought that the Bureau might desire to consider this suggestion with the idea of passing it on to the various Field Offices if it has any merit.

Report of Special Agent J. h. Hanson, Jacksonville, Fla., 1/20/35; report of Special Agent H. Ranstad, Mashington, D.C. 4/20/35; report of G. J. Martin, Phila, 4/10/35; report of A. A. John J. Meuting, New York City, 3/23/35.

DELAILS:

This is a joint investigation of Special Agents William Seery, w. Morgan, E. J. Gebbens of the New York Office, and B. F. Leekins and the writer, of the Fhiladelphia office.

Under date of April 16, 1935, Special Agent in Charge R. Whitley, New York City Office, telephonically communicated with acting Special agent in Charge L. I. Bowman, Philadelphia Office, informing him that Frankie Foster had made a telephone call from a hotel in Atlantic City, New Jersey, to his wife at 145 W. 58th Street, New York City, that Foster being a possible contact man of Harry Sawyer, it was thought that Foster should be covered while in Atlantic City and his activities in connection obtained.

In accordance with instructions, Special Agents E. E. Meekins and the writer proceeded immediately with a machine gun and necessary equipment to Atlantic City, N.J., and registered in the President Hotel, awaiting Agents from New York City. Upon their arrival at 2:20 A.M. on April 17th, 1935, and in a conference had, it as thought that the registers of the prominent hotels along the Lourdwelk be searched. A ent Seery informed that the call that came into Foster's apartment in New York City was from the unife and Fork Restaurant on the corner of Albany and Pacific Avenues; this is a famous restaurant in the vicinity of the President Hotel, and the pay station therein is used by the patrons.

As a result of investigation it was escertained that Foster was registered in the Ritz Carlton Hotel under the name of "Frank Prost", 145 M. 58th Street, New York City. In gaining the confidence of David Pierson and the clerk, Mr. William Gil Martin, who readily cooperated, the card of Foster was shown to Special Agent Gebben and the following data obtained therefrom; that on April 16, 1935, at 4:32 F.M., Foster alias Frost arrived in a private car in company with J. Howard and S. Singer, all registering from 145 M. 58th Street, New York City, and were given suite 430-431 and 432, at the rate of \$95.00 per day, under card 6144; that they left on the same date and that Foster returned in the evening along about 1 A.M., April 17th, 1935; that he occupied room 430 at the rate of \$6.00 per day.

Agents placed themselves in vantage points and Special Light Gebben remained in the rotunds of the hotel and in close proximity of the desk.

The writer relieved Agent Gebbens at 9:50 A.M. on April 17th, and Agent Gebbens then returned to remain with the writer; at approximately 10:20 A.M. Foster approached the desk at the of hotel and checked out, then going to the breakfast room. In the interim two men approached the desk and asked for "Frost", a " page was put in and Foster answered same, and greeted the men in , the lobby. They remained in the lobby approximately twenty minutes and then entered a green Buick car, bearing New Jersey license 1935 A-6750. The driver of this car was of Jewish appearance and also the men that attended him. They immediately proceeded to ride on atlantic Avenue and stopped in front of Goodelman's Liquor Store, directly across from the Police Station in Atlantic City, the small man exchanged greetings and the green Ewick turned left on Eighway 94. In the crowded roadway Special Agent Seery was compelled to furn his car to the right to avoid a traffic congestion and lost the tail. Special agent Seery suggested that a man be placed at the Railroad Station, and accordingly Agent Morgan took up his post in the early hours of the morning in the event Foster would use a taxi cab from the hotel to the Railroad Station and return to New York vie train. It was impossible for Agent Gebben to make the teil cars as he had remained in the lobby in order not to create any suspicion of Foster being followed.

The car was followed to Newark, New Jersey, and about 2:25 P.M. it pulled up in front of the Park Casino, an eating stand located on Meeker Avenue near the Lehigh Valley railroad tracks. Foster entered the Fark Casino and the driver remained in the car; five minutes later the car pulled up at the Taverm on the corner of Central Avenue and Meeker Streets, Newark, M.J., and another men entered, he did not resemble any of the mob. Making a right turn; from Meeker to Central, the Buick stopped in front of the Club Miemi, 116 Central Avenue. Three men entered the Club and remained in there approximately one and a half hours. In the meantime a call was made to New York Office informing the location of Frankie Foster and giving the number of the car in which he was riding.

At approximately 3:30 P.M., Forter accompanied by his two friends came out of the Club Mismi, entered the Buick car, and making a right turn on the street next to the Club Mismi, Agents were cut off by a red light and a traffic jam, but the street which the Buick had taken leads directly to the Pulaski Skyway and no doubt the Buick car was heading for the Holland tunnel.

Accordingly, Special Agent in Charge Whitley was informed in order that the tail could be taken up at the Holland Tunnel.

Special Agent Whitley also instructed Agents to return to Atlantic City to pick up the losse ends of the investigation.

In examining the records of the Ritz Carlton Hotel in a Atlantic City, it was ascertained that the following calls were made on April 16th from the suite which was occupied by Frank Foster alias Frost, and J. Howard and S. Singer:

2-1504 made at 7:57 a.m.

5-9350 " " 1:08 p.m.

4-9864 " " 1:08 p.m.

Long distance calls: Baltimore, Maryland - Wolf 3488, asking for Mr. Blink, made at 1:41 p.m., charge \$1.25.

Mr. David Pierson, Manager of the hotel informed that Foster has been a frequent visitor to the Ritz Carlton, that upon his arrival on the 19th of April 1935, Mr. Seymour Mathanson brought Foster to the main office and introduced him, stating that anything that he, Foster alias Frost, desired, he was to be given and Seymour Mathanson would stand good for it. (In this connection, Mathanson is a well known racketeer and gambler in and about Atlantic City, N.J., all information relative to him will be set out later in this report.) Further, that Sally Phillips, who makes visits to Atlantic City and is also a patron of the Motel is often seen in company with Foster; Mr. Pierson was quite sure that on April 16th, 1935, he saw Miss Sally Phillips and Foster leaving the hotel, walking toward the Mnife and Ford Cafe about 6 P.M.

Liss Fhillips card shows that she is registered from ... 115 Central Fark West, New York City; that she made two telephone calls, one to Endicott, N.Y., Number 2-5263, and one local call Number: 4-5569.

The persons called by telephone from the suite occupied by Frank Foster, J. Howard and S. Singer are as follows:-

2-1504 - Jacob Hess, 102 So. Martindale Avenue, Atlantic City, N.J. Mr. Hess is in business in Fhiladelphia, Pa., as the Maiss-Browd-Hess Brewing Company. Not much is known about Mr. Hess as being connected with any racket, but it is possible that his connections lead to Cauden, N.J., and Hewark, N.J.

2-1293 - Mr. Charles Hall, 109 Atherst Street, Ventnor, Lithantic Sity, N.J. Charles Hall known as Charlie Hall, is Extresident of the Thiladelphia Council. About three years ego he suffered a stroke and since that time he has been confined to his home at the address mentioned heretofore; has never been known to be in any form of racket although he was henchman for the Vare and mentioned "Exchine" in Flilauelphia.

5-9350 - this call was me e to Doctor Barr, 500 Club, 5 So. Missouri Avenue; Earr runs a "bookie joint" there, and is a cover for underworld characters, according to Detectives Pike and Croves of the Atlantic City Police Department.

4-9884 - is a telephone listed in the name of Elackman, 510 Club, 8.50. Missouri Avenue; Blackman is just a "front" for Doctor Flill Carr and is known as a "small town hoodlum", who runs a "bookie joint". Phil Carr who owns this organization was well connected with the Bill Dwyer mob in New York, and has connections with Taylor and Gunis, local fight promoters in Philadelphia, Pa., who are well known to the writer; however, Taylor and Gunis would not harbor criminals.

The Weiss-Browd-Hess Brewing Company in Fhiladelphia is a rejutable concern.

In connection with J. Howard who registered in with Foster, Detectives Fike and Groves, who are known to the writer, and have worked on several cases and been of valuable assistance to the Fhiladelphia Office, gave the following information: It is possible that he is a brother-in-law of Charles Goodelman who may be the same as Jacob Howard; he is known as the "Lystery" Lan" in Atlantic City. He is described:

six feet tall fair blue eyes Polish type, but evidently a Jew weighing about 190 pounds

As to 3. Singer known as Sun Singer, his residence is 100 bouth Providence Avenue, Atlantic City. Description given by Letective Fike is:

53 - 55 years
5'8" (stocky) from 1 1
190 pounds
grey hair
light complexion .
very large mose
wears rimless glasses
Jewish type

He has been before Federal Judge Avis on Federal Tax Evasion and was tied up with Mickey Duffy, Moe Newman and Silverberg. He is a local racketeer in and about Atlantic City and deals in alcohol.

In checking the car in which Foster was taken to New York, learing 1935 New Jersey license A-6752, Buick, it was ascertained that this was registered in the name of Horris Rosenberg, 54 Tallahessee Avenue, Atlantic City, N.J. Rosenberg is a "front" for Seymour Mathanson and his crowd. The car is actually owned by Seymour Mathanson. Rosenberg is a bootlegger and during Prohibition days operated the fast fleet of cars from the Drop into New York City after it was taken off of Rum Row and placed in the Catche. It was also ascertained that he is a nephew of Seymour Mathanson. In obtaining a photograph of Seymour Mathanson

he has been positively identified by Agent Meekins and the writer as the driver of the car in which Foster went to New York City. . .

As to Seymour Nathanson, he is one of four brothers who are all known bootleggers. Seymour Nathanson is also connected with the "hot" car racket, that he was convicted for stolen Cadillaes being transported from Atlantic City to Fittsburgh, Pa. It is possible that New York City has a file on this case. Seymour bethomson has done time in Atlanta, Georgia, for bootlegging, teing sometimed from Cunden, New Jersey, in the latter part of 1929, according to Detective Pike. Seymour Nathanson also resides at D4 No. Talladasses Avenue, Atlantic City, N.J., with Norris Rosenberg. He is the owner of a salpon at North Carolina and baltic Evenues, Itlantic City, and was connected with the Superior Ligion Company at Canden, N.J., and the Majestic Ligion Company also of Canden, N.J., in which the State Liquor Control Board of New Jersey has more than reorganize due to their bootlegging activities. There is also a connection with the Reo Liquor Company of Newark, N.J., according to Detective Pike.

As to Charlie Goodelman, he is the operator of the liquor store on Atlantic Amenue, directly across from the Police Station, and not Goodelman's Liquor Store. Goodelman is the type that would harbor criminals and has been in the "boose" racket nearly all his life.

Lith reference to the report of Special Agent G. J. Hartin, Thiladelphia, Pa., 4/10/35, in undeveloped leads, it has been ascertained that the former Chief of Police of Atlantic City, 1.J., and who is of Italian extraction, is Vincent Martino, 12 ... So. Lain Street, whose unlisted telephone number is 4-2366.

Vincent Martino has never been in the Police Department at Atlantic City, N.J., but often uses this guise to introduce friends, Martino stating that he is connected with the law enforcement officials of Atlantic City. Martino was interviewed under a guise and stated that he knew Duke Randall when he was working for Bennie Seibert, a night club operator in Atlantic City in 1931. To the best of Martino's knowledge, Randall comes from Newark, N.J., that he was a frequent visitor to the Douglas Hotel in that City, that he worked in the 500 Club and the Stebbins Club in Atlantic City, and that he is not known to be a "hoodlum",

but would do a favor for anyone of the "big-shots" in Atlantic City, that he is very fond of women and that the last time he saw him he was of the opinion that he had a social disease.

with reference to Peggy O'Neil, she worked at the Golden Slipper in Atlantic City and was in company with Duke Randall most of the time. They also had a connection at the Little Club, which was located at Missouri and Facific Avenues, Atlantic City; this club was owned by Benjamin Siprowits alias Sipers and Charles Cohen, Cohen is now deceased.

Duke Randall's name also appeared in lights over the club at Missouri and Pacific Avenues, at which time Randall was living at the Richmond Hotel at Mentucky Avenue. This hostelry, by reputation, was headquarters for a bootlegging outfit and especially for the Newark mots. It is located one block from the Danmore hotel, that Handall's connection at the Danmore Hotel was his contact man through Dan Young in Mismi, Florida.

Enoch Johnson, local political leader, who has apartments directly across from the Ritz Carlton Rotel, is at the present time of the North Sity and possibly can be contacted at the Motel Taft, or through telephone: Rittenhouse 7200. This information was obtained by Letective Tike and agent questions the telephone number in this instant case.

The tall newspaper photographer in the report of reference is one Mill Dodson who is prectically six feet six inches tall, and weighs 160 pounds. He is associate editor of the Atlantic City News, which is a scandal sheet. Due to this connection and also since Agent was in Atlantic City on a cover of Frank Foster alias Frost, it was thought that it would not be advisable to interview Dodson, as it would be only a matter of a few hours until he would run a column in his paper as to Agents being in the vicinity.

Dodson is known as a "chiseler" and a "dead-best", he usually hangs around cabarets for his own selfish aggrandizement.

The only lice Herris that is known in Atlantic City is connected with Sam Shapiro and is a "front" for bootleggers in the vicinity and had a connection through Pergy O'Reill mentioned heretofore. Shapiro is, at the present time, supposed to be in Newark, N.J.

There is no herely's Casino in Atlantic City.

Lir. M. L. Faxtol is unknown to Detectives Pike and Croves and is not listed in the Atlantic City telephone and city directory for the year of 1935. In this connection the Ventnor telephone and city directory was searched without results.

It is shown in the report of John J. Kenting, New York City, E/22/35, that the New Jersey Bell Telephone Company of Newark, N.J., should be contacted for telephone calls, as well as the Western Union for telegrams, which were sent or received from Mayerly E-2137 in the name of Mrs. J. Weisman, 2011 Chancellor Avenue, Newark, N.J., also, make arrangements with Lieutenant Thomas Dismond to make a tap on Weisman's unlisted telephone, number listed heretofore, and to cover his house. A letter is bein forwarded to the Eureau asking permission to make this tap at the present time.

Agents have made arrangements with Detectives Fire and droves and have furnished them with the pictures of all fugitives wented in the instant case, and connections will be made through certain hotels in Atlantic City, if by chance they put in appearance.








Mr. Whitley telephoned from the New York Office and advised that the efforts to cover Frank Foster had been unsuccessful; that Foster had eluded the Agents some place in the Pennsylvania Station; that he did not take the 9:30 train because the space on that train which he was supposed to occupy, was occupied by an entirely different person, this fact being checked. The other three members of the party; that is, Foster's vife and the man and woman who have been visiting them. left the station about 8:00 o'clock. Apparently after being away from the car for several minutes, they went over to eat, but the Agents lost Foster while they were inside checking up on the reservation. The Agents covered the car, however, and the three persons left the station in Foster's car about 8:00 o'clock, and Foster was not with them.

Mr. Whitley said that when Foster went into the station at about 7:30 o'clock, he carried no baggage, and carried no baggage when he came out of his apartment, and it appears that the Agents just lost him when he got in the station, and covered the wrong reservation. 



Kermit Heumphrey, an employee of Caneglio, was interviewed by this Agent at the Phi Alpha Delta House, the same having been arranged by Strohm. After Heumphrey had been assured that this Agent was making no official investigation of the illicit liquor traffic, he promised his full cooperation and was, therefore, given an Identification Order of HARRY SAWYER. He stated that he had heard of the man but had never seen him and promised to advise the Omaha Bureau Office of any information he might learn as to the present whereabouts of Sawyer. It was impressed upon him that all information would be kept in confidence.

A. C. (Dutch) Campbell readily agreed to assist Agent and he contacted Tony Caneglio through Senator R. C. Van Kirk, who explained to Caneglio the necessity of breeking up kidnaping and of his learning the present whereabouts of Sawyer through underworld channels. 





looking toward the apprehension of fugitives in this case, is being set out here for the information of all offices. It is being set out in the first person inasmuch as it is in that manner that the facts were taken down at the time the statements were made. It is as follows:

I am 56 years old, the place of my birth being Marion, Kansas, and the date 5-26-1898. My father's name was Nicholas Stanley and my mother's, Lou Stanley, nee Waddelle She now lives at Cardin, Oklahoma, with my sister Doris' boy, Mott Stuchlick. Stuchlick is not my nephew's right name but he assumed that name after my sister Doris married Earl Stuchlick, which occurred some time in either 1924 or 1925. I have four brothers:

Harry Stanley, 44 years old, who until 2-7-35 was living at 206 East Adams Street, Pittsburg, Kansas.

Fred Stanley, about 40 years old, who now lives in Florence, Kansas, I think, where he works in the oil fields.

Mott Stanley, about 39 years old. He lives in Commerce, Oklahoma, next to Pearl Squire's barbecue stand.

Gloyd Stanley, about 26 or 27. He lives in Sapulpa, Oklahoma, exact location I do not know.

My only sister is Doris Stanley, whose married name is Doris Stuchlick, she being the wife of Earl Stuchlick, My father died on 9-5-33 at his home in Cardin from a paralytic stroke.

When I was about 23, Volney Davis and I were sweethearts in Sapulpa, Oklahoma. At that time I was working at the Imperial Cafe, both as a waitress and cashier. Along in 1921 or 1922, Volney, who I knew mostly as "Curly" and "Whitey", was sentenced to the Oklahoma State Penitentiary at McAlester for life for the murder of a night watchman in Tulsa, Oklahoma. I believe "Doc Barker was sentenced to McAlester on the same charge.

Before going to the penitentiary, Volney was in the Tulsa County Jail for about a year, during which time I visited him every week. Shortly before he left for McAlester I went to Kamsas City and met Diamond Joe Sullivan, who was later electrocuted for murder in Little Rock, Arkansas, in 1924, for the murder of two policemen in Little Rock. Emory Connell, who was Doris' first husband, was also convicted on the same charge, but subsequently escaped from the Arkansas State Penitentiary at Little Rock, where he was awaiting electrocution. He was shortly afterward killed by a posse.

While in Kensas City, Sullivan and I lived in a furnished house around 35th and Prospect. He was running liquor and made many trips to Wichita. At this time Doris and Emory Connell were living in Chicago. We went to Hot Springs about three or four months later, taking my boy Preston with me. Preston's father's name is George Paden, whom I married in Carthage, Missouri; when I was sixteen years old. He was part Indian. I lived with him for about four or five months and divorced him in about 1916 or 1917 on grounds of cruelty.

While in Hot Springs, Joe Sullivan, myself, my son, Doris, Emory Connell and her son Mott, lived in a cottage in the mountains. About three weeks later Joe and Emory were arrested for killing two policemen in Little Rock and Doris and I, with the two children, left. Doris went to New Orleans where she later got into trouble with Melvin Stofer, Buzz Clark and Tom Morgan for larceny of an automobile. I went back to Cardin with both the children.

About two months later I went to Kansas City and stayed with Margaret Clinger, who had a flat at 8th and Tracy. She has since died. During this time I received \$2,000.00 from Dismond Joe's mother to use in obtaining an attorney for him for his trial at Little Rock. I paid him a visit twice while he and Emory Connell were in the death cell at the Arkansas State Penitentiary.

In 1924, with the money remaining from what Dismond Joe's mother had sent me, I bought furniture and rented an eight room flat at 1126 East 15th Street, where I sold home brew and had four rooms rented out. While there I met Jack Murray, whose right name I think was Klya He had done time in Leavenworth Penitentiary for white slavery and was only out a short time when I met him.

About a month or so later, I begen running around with him. He had a job driving a Yellow Cab. The police began raiding my place after finding out that I was Diamond Joe Sullivan's wife, so I sold the place to a man and his wife, whose names I don't recall. I had been paying \$35.00 a month rent, and recaived \$450.00 for the furniture.

I then went to Los Angeles by train with Jack Murray, where we lived in an apartment on Monroe Street. For about two weeks before we left, I had rented a small flat on 15th Street near Lydia, where Jack stayed with me off and on. The rest of the time he stayed with his mother, Mrs. Ely, who lived near

15th end Cherry and who had charge of the drapery section at Emery, Bird and Thayer Dry Goods Company of Kansas City, Doris lived with me on 13th Street and later came out to California and lived with Jack and me. While there I was arrested by Los Angeles detectives on a charge of selling mortgaged property, because a friend of Doris, Daisy O'Neili, had sold the furniture I left in the flat on 13th Street after Doris and I had left. I was in jail three days and then the charges were dropped. While I was in California I read that Emery Connell had been killed following his escape from a death cell at Little Rock, Arkansas.

Jack and I bought a Buick touring car in Los Angeles and he and I drove back to Kansas City. Doris had left about a week before I did by train for Chippewa Falls, Wisconsin, where Emory's body was brought for burial. She said that she wanted to see Max Connell, Emory's brother, about some clothes and things she had left in storage, I believe.

Jack and I took an apartment at the Bliss Apartments on 9th Street or 11th Street and about two weeks later a place at 1114 Troost, and bought the furniture already in the place. We paid \$450.00 or \$500.00 down and \$50.00 per month. We sold home brew downstairs, rented kitchenettes upstairs, and Jack and Earl Stuchlick ran a crap game and poker game in the back, Doris lived there with Jack and myself. I began to live under the name of Edna Murray at this address.

We were there three or four months and then the raids began again, so Doris auctioned the furniture off, or rather, ahe sold it to a second-hand dealer for about \$250,00. It was while we were at 1114 Troost that I first knew Mrs. Craft, who operated the Craft Cafe on 12th Street near Troost. I can't recall whether Doris ever worked for Mrs. Craft or not.

Jack and I stayed for a couple of weeks in an apartment in the 2700 or 2800 block on Harrison and I think Doris lived somewhere on Broadway with Earl Stuchlick. Then Jack and I went to Cardin, Oklahoma, and then to Picher for about three months, where we bought a half interest in a barber shop on Second Street. I believe the name was the DeLuxe Barber Shop. It was while we were living in Picher at the Vernon Hotel we were also transporting liquor between New Orleans, Louisiana, and Kanses City, Missouri. Doris and Earl were also doing the same. While in New Orleans I usually stayed at the Manderville Hotel in Manderville, Louisiana. Jack was arrested once in Clarksville, Arkansas, I believe, with a load of liquor. I escaped arrest by walking away when I

saw Jack being arrested. I took a train back to Joplin, Missouri, where we had moved about a month before from Picher, As near as I can remember, this was in the fell of 1924. We had a rented house on West 4th Street in Joplin.

In the spring of 1925 Jack and I came back to Kansas City where we lived with Doris and Earl around 56th and Broadway. Jack was sick at this time from the result of morphine that, I learned, he had been using for some time. About a month after we arrived in Kansas City, Jack and I took a small apartment on Jefferson Street around 13th or 14th. It was while we were living there that Jack and I were arrested for highway robbery of H. H. Southward. I got out on \$10,000.00 bond but Jack stayed in jail. The arrest was on the 6th day of April, 1925, and on October 1st I was sentenced to serve twenty-five years in the Missouri State Penitentiary. Jack received the same sentence.

In May, 1927, I escaped and was out for about four and a half years, during which time I was first in Kansas City, then in Junction City, Kansas, and then in Chicago, where I was finally arrested in September, 1931, in a reid in a beer joint near the 2200 block on Sedgwick Street. I was fingerprinted, found to be an escape and then returned to Jefferson City.

As will be noted by reference to Edna Murray's statement contained in the reference report, all information relative to her past associates and activities, over and above that set out in the body of this report, is contained therein.

Kr. and Krs. McKnight knew of no other person who sould furnish any information concerning the identity of the man who accompanied Curry and his wife to Mrs. Burry's home.

Mr. McKnight went to considerable detail in outlining the activities of Curry and his associates, but none of the information was any more definite than that contained in the referenced letter. He was questioned specifically concerning the allegation that Curry drove the car involved in the recent robbery of the bank at Neosho, Missouri, and stated that he drew this conclusion from the feet that one of the robbers fit Curry's description. From the interview it appeared evident that Mr. McKnight had no definite information of interest in this case. He sivised, however, that he would keep in touch with the relatives of Curry's wife and that if he secured further information. he will transmit same promptly to the Kansas City Bureau of fice.

Chief of Tolice A. J. Bishir, Wabb City, Missouri, was discreetly interviewed and advised that Guy Berry is honest and a good worker and so for on known has never ensuciated with underworld characters; that his

brother, Virgil "Eleckie" Berry, however, is a whiskey peddiar and mone too good to associate with the underworld, although he had never been convicted of any orime. Further discreet questioning disclosed that Mr. Bishir has had no receon to believe that Subject Karpis has been in the vicinity of Webb City in recent months.

During the interview Mr. Bishir was tactfully questioned concerning McKnight and stated that he is thoroughly benest and reliable; that he is always trying to assist the officers, but that for some reason none of his information has ever been found to be of value. Mr. Bishir added that McKnight is so envious to assist the officers that he fears that McKnight is too heaty in drawing conclusions in connection with the matters which he reports.

Ed Portley, Chief of Detectives, and L. A. Vandeventer, City Detective, Joplin, Missouri, advised that they are thoroughly familiar with the activities of Jack Curry, but have no resear to believe that he has any connection with Subject Karpis or any members of his gang. A photograph of Curry, bearing Joplin Police Department #4451, was secured and is being retained in the file of the Kansas City Bureau office.

It is noted that LeRoy Curry, alies Jack Curry, alies Jack
Lebb, alies Jack L. Curry, alies Jack Clark, alies H. H. Milks, alies Leroy
Lurry, elies J. C. Buck, alies Carl Buck; Ehelby Martin and Glenn Hawk are
subjects of Kansas City file 26-5067, involving a violation of the Actional
Motor Vehicle Theft Act, and that copies of the report of Special Agent
W. B. O'M honey, Kanses City, January 3, 1935, containing Curry's description
and criminal record, have been furnished to the Oklahous City of fice. The
United States Attorney at Kansas City, Missouri, declined prosecution in
that case.

Curry is also subject of Kansas City file 31-1981, which involves a violation of the White Slave Traffic Act in which Deisy Modglin, with alianes, was victim. It appears that copies of various reports in that matter were furnished to the Oklahoma City office.

Curry is also subject of Ennace City file 31-2596, which involves a White Slave Traffic Act investigation in which his present purported wife, Jessic Alice Carroll, alias Mrs. Jack Curry, alias Mrs. Jack Webb, was the victim. The United States Attorney at Topoka, Kansas, declined prosecution in that case due to back of aggrevating circumstances.

Although it is not believed that the information furnished by

McKnight is of material value, when an Agent is again in Webb City, Missouri, further efforts will be made to interview Mrs. Guy Berry and exhibit to her photograph of Subject Karpis for identification.

"wanted" notices on file with said department, with the exception of those covering Clyde Nimerick and Charles J.XFitzgerald, which were left on file. Special Agent Traub explained to Captain Mintiens that the identification orders are still in effect and that the temporary "wanted" notices were being removed to prevent confusion.

I have also been advised by Special Agent Henry A. Snow that he personally conferred with J. M. Wright, Identification Officer, Richmond Police Department, and left with him copies of the temporary "wanted" notices covering Clyde Nimerick and Charles J. Fitzgerald. Special Agent Snow also filed copies of the temporary "wanted" notices covering Clyde Nimerick and Charles J. Fitzgerald with Identification Officer Robert L. Jackson of the Petersburg, Virginia, Police Department.

I have also been advised by Special Agent Arthur McLawhon that he has caused the temporary "wanted" notices to be withdrawn from the Identification Bureau of the Roanoke, Virginia, Police Department. 

Harry Cook, proprietor of the Etowah Service Station and friend of Jos Adams, after viewing a picture of Duke Handall stated that Randall was the party that gave him the \$50.00 and said he was a friend of Joa Adams: that the statement "forget about Adams and the license plates" was not made by -

Cook furnished the following signed statement, the original of which is being forwarded to the Jacksonville Office.

"Itowah, Tenn. 4-25-35

I, Harry Cook make this supplemental statement to Special Agent H. F. Small to the one I gave him on 4-1-35. No promises or threats induced me to make either statement and I know they could be used against me ? in a court of law.

After viewing the picture of the party known as Duke Randall, which picture has been shown to me by Special Agent H. F. Small, I identify him as the thin faced fellow that visited my filling station and gave me \$50.00. This party is the same party that said he was a friend of Joe Adams, but I am positive that he did not make the statement "forget about Adams and the license

Our conversation was about those things which I mentioned in my previous statement, on 4-1-35, and at no time was any statement made by the party to "forget about Adams and the license plates" because such a statement would have made an impression on my mind, and I am sure I would have recalled such statement when I gave my first written statement on 4-1-35.

After the party known as Randall and the other man drove away from my station on that night I have never seen either since.

I am still at a last to explain why I was given the money and who the party known as Randall can be.

Louise Atkins, 1356 North View Avenue, N. E., relief operator for the Postal Telegraph Company, advised that she remembered the message in question distinctly, as she had seen races at the Biscayne Kennel Club at Miami. She stated that the best description she could give of the sender of the telegram was that he was middle aged and was neatly dressed in a grey suit. She further informed that he was with another man of about the same age, also neatly dressed, and both appeared to be in a hurry. Miss Atkins related that it was her opinion that the man came into send the message between trains, though she saw no baggage. Phetegraphs of subjects in this case, and associates, were exhibited to Miss Atkins and she was unable to identify any as the sender of the above telegrame.

Benjamin F. Johnson, 133 Carnegie Way N. W., room 216, produced a specimen of his signature and handwriting and same apparently did not compare with the handwriting on the telegram. Johnson stated that he has a son, Ben. Jr., who is 19 years of age, however, agent did not interview Ben Jr. in view of the apparent ages of the persons who sent the telegram in question.

Benjamin F. Johnson, 1010 E. Ponce de Leon furnished a copy of his signature and a comparison of same failed to indicate that it was similar to the hendwriting on the telegram in question. Johnson stated that he also has a sen Benjamin F. Johnson, Jr., who is 20 years of age. Agent did not interview this Ben Johnson Jr., in view of the apparent ages of the persons who sent the telegram.

The four Ben Johnsons above mentioned are the only white persons by that name in the Atlanta, Georgia, City Directory. The handwriting specimens of each of the Ben Johnsons mentioned above are being transmitted to the Bureau, by letter, for the purposes of having same compared with the handwriting specimens of subjects and suspects in this case.

One photostatic copy of the original telegram sent by Ben Johnson is being forwarded to the Jacksonville office while the other copy is being forwarded by the Birmingham office, under separate cover, to the Bureau Laboratory in order that same may be compared with specimens of the handwriting of the Karpis-Barker gange.

R. A. Sims, Assistant Cashier and Head of the Money Department, Federal Reserve Bank, advised, after examining his records, that the one-thousand-dollar bills having serial numbers F=00022457=1, F=00022463=1, and F=00022464=1 were shipped from the Federal Reserve Bank, Atlanta, Ga., to the Federal Reserve Bank, Havana, Cuba, on May 25, 1934, as part of two original unbroken packages containing 200 one-thousand-dollar bills each. Sims further advised that each of these two original, unbroken packages contained two "straps" of one hundred one-thousand-dollar bills. He stated that the particular shipment consisted of four hundred one-thousand-dollar bills, (\$400,000), all series of 1928, having serial numbers from F=00022401A through F=00022800A. Sims informed that it was reasonable for the Havana Branch to make the particular bills into packages of fifty each, or to make packages containing any number of the bills. Mr. Sims is the proper person to produce the above records on subposes if necessary.

Sims informed that the one-thousand-dollar bill having serial number F-00017095A, series of 1928, was shipped from the Federal Reserve Bank in Atlanta to the Federal Reserve Bank at Havana, on March 7, 1933, as part of five original packages containing 1,000 one-thousand-dollar bills (\$1,000,000).





On 4-22-35 Subject appeared before U. S. Commissioner Thompson, Kansas City, Missouri, for preliminary hearing, but the same was continued on that day to 4-4-35. On the latter date, with the consent of the U. S. Attorney and through the request of the defendant. the original bond on the Subject of \$7,500.00 was reduced to \$3,000.00. At that time the hearing was again set over until 4-18-35. On the latter date hearing was again continued until 5-7-35. It should be noted that these many continuances have been due to a great extent to the fact that witnesses needed for the preliminary hearing in this case are at the present time engaged in the trial of the Bremer case which is in progress at St. Paul, Minnesota. In this connection it should be stated that Assistant U_{\bullet} S $_{\bullet}$ Attorney Sam Blair on 3-22-35 advised the writer that in order to conduct the hearing in this case it will be necessary that a certified copy of the Bremer indictment be placed in his hands. The same was received from the St. Paul office and has been transmitted to Assistant U. S. Attorney Sam Blair. Mr. Blair also has advised this office that the testimony of the witnesses who testified before the grand jury regarding Jess Doyle at the time when the Federal indictment in the Bremer case was returned at St. Paul, namely on 1-22-35, would be necessary at the preliminary hearing on this Subject in order to establish identity. The St. Paul of fice has advised in this instance that the person so testifying was Special Agent K. R. McIntire and inasmuch as he is at the present time engaged in the Bremer trial at St. Paul this case has been continued and there is a strong likelihood that other continuances will be had.

On 4-13-35 Subject posted bond of \$3,000.00 before U. S. Commissioner and was released the same day from the Jackson County Jail, Kansas City, Missouri. Since 4-8-35, both while Subject was incarcerated in the Jackson County Jail and after her release, close contact has been had with her by the writer and Special Agent D. A. Bryce of the Kansas City Bureau office. She has admitted on several occasions that from approximately April, 1933, until January, 1935, she lived with Jess Doyle under the name of Mr. and Mrs. E. A. Conley.

By reference to the report of this Agent dated at Kansas City, Missouri, 4-25-35 in the Bremer case, it will be noted that in July, 1932, Jess Doyle and the Subject lived as Mr. and Mrs. K. A. Conley at the Tattershall Apartments, 3310 Broadway, Kansas City, Missouri. Likewise, through her admissions, both she and Doyle lived under the same name at 4112 Locust Street, Kansas City, Missouri. However, she stated that when she and Doyle moved to 23 Warner Plaza they assumed the name there of Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Stacey, she going under the name of Vinita Stacey. It will be recalled that the indictment naming Jess Doyle was not returned until 1-22-35 at which time both Subject and Doyle were living as Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Stacey at 23 Warner Plaza. However, the facts surrounding their living together as Mr. and Mrs. E. A. Conley prior to that time is being set out in the event it is

deemed useful by the U. S. Attorney to show that they have previously been living under assumed names.

Prior investigation in the Bremer case by Special Agent
Mr. Kremer of the Kansas City Bureau office has disclosed that Mr.
and Mrs. E. A. Conley resided at apartment 106, Senate Apartments,
Topeka, Kansas. At this time Doyle was driving a 1933 Buick Victoria
Coupe, motor #2859926, registered under the name of E. A. Conley. This
registration was dated 1-22-34. It was determined at Topeka, Kansas,
that Conley resided at apartment 106, Senate Apartments only a few
days, having left that residence, according to a forwarding order at the
Post Office, Topeka, on 1-24-34, directing that his mail be sent General
Delivery, Miami, Oklahoma. It was further determined by Agent Kremer
that the party who had rented the apartment occupied by Conley had also
used the name of J. S. Blakeley and that the apartment was rented on
1-16-34. As reference Blakeley furnished the name of Jones O'Neal Shoe
Company, Topeka, Kansas.

company and shows the address of Salina, Kansas. However, subsequent investigation at the Jones O'Neal Shoe Company disclosed that no one named Brown or Blakeley had been employed by that concern. These facts are being set out at this time in the light of pending prosecution against this Subject. It is deemed advisable that further contact be had at the above address in Topeka, Kansas, so that a possible identification can be made of the pictures of Jess Doyle and this Subject. The fact should be borne in mind that two aliases were in all probability used by Doyle and the Subject, namely that of E. A. Conley and J. S. Blakeley.

During the several interviews had with the Subject between the dates of 4-8-35 and 4-18-35 she has stated that she did not know Doyle under that name, but when asked for her reason for living with him under several different names had no satisfactory explanation for the same. This fact is being set out inasmuch as to substantiate this charge it will be necessary to show that in harboring Doyle subsequent to 1-22-35 Subject in this case knew him to be a fugitive and by the same token knew him to be Jess Doyle. Further close contact is being maintained with this Subject and in the event she signifies her willingness to make a written statement relative to the above facts, same will be reported.

Subject's complete criminal record received from the Bureau is being set out as follows:

As Doris O'Connor, alias Doris Johnson, alias Mrs. Emery Connell, #6993, arrested 8-4-23, P.D., New Orleans, Louisiana; charge fugitive from justice from Pine Bluff, Arkansas, wanted for grand larceny of an auto, also wanted at Little Rock for murder.

As Vinita Stacy, alias Vinita Stacey, #22790, arrested 2-5-35, P.D., Kenses City, Missouri; charge assault to kill with deadly weapon - shot a lady.

As Vinita Stacey, #2442, arrested 2-7-35, 8.0., Kansas City, Missouri; charge assault with intent to kill.

As Vinita Stacey, #452, arrested 5-7-35, U. S. Marshal, Kansas City, Missouri; charge Sec. 408a, Title 18, U.S.C.A.

Additional aliases: Mrs. E. A. Conley, Doris Stuchlik, Doris Stanley, Doris Connell, Mrs. J. C. Stacey.

For further facts concerning information furnished by Subject in this case relative to the investigation being conducted looking towards the apprehension of Subjects in the Bremer case, reference should be had to the report of this Agent dated at Kansas City, Missouri, 4-25-35, in the case entitled Alvin Karpis with aliases, Fugitive, I.O. 1218, et al, Edward George Bremer Victim, Kidnaping, Harboring, Obstruction of Justice, National Firearms Act.

KANSAS CITY OFFICE at Topeka, Kansas, should contact the Senate Apartments with particular attention being directed to apartment 106, which as is indicated in the body of this report was occupied by the Subject, together with Jess Doyle under the name of E. A. Conley, and possibly that of J. S. Blakeley, in January, 1934. Photographs of these individuals should be exhibited there so that a possible identification can be made.

At Kansas City, Missouri, will again contact the apartments located at 4112 Locust for the purpose of exhibiting photographs to the manager of that apartment where, by the Subject's own admissions, she lived with Jess Doyle during the latter part of 1934 as Mr. and Mrs. E. A. Conley.

At Kansas City, Missouri, at 23 Warner Plaza, will again contact.

Mrs. Miller, manager of those apartments, and obtain a written
statement relative to her identification of Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Stacey
as the Subject in this case and Jess Doyle.

At Kansas City, Missouri, will follow the results of the preliminary hearing in this case set for 5-7-55 and will report the same.

Reference is made to your letter dated May 1, 1935 reflecting the result of an interview with Arthur P. Burdette, brother of Binone Burdette, at Erie, Pennnylvania, wherein Burdette has offered to visit his sister with the intestion of obtaining from her information which will assist the Bureau in locating Harry Campbell and other members of the Barker-Karpis gange

It is noted that Burdette makes reference to a hide-out located comewhere in Arkaness, which information is synonymous with information furnished by the confidential informant of the St. Paul office. The Bureau feels that an opportunity should be given Burdette to obtain any information which will assist the Bureau in locating the hide-out reported to be in Arkaness or any other information which he may elicit from his elster, and to that end the Detroit office is instructed to contact the officials at the Federal Detention Home, Milan, Michigan and arrange for a visit by Arthur Petroit burdette to his sister. The arrangements should be such that Burdette will be permitted to visit his sister during regular visiting hours.

It is not desired that Winons Burdette suspect that the Bureau has arranged for the visit of her brother. When arrangements have been completed, the Detroit effice should direct a communication to the Pittsburgh office, advising it to this effect so that Burdette can be instructed to proceed to Milan, Michigan.



I am transmitting a clipping from the Wichita, Kansas, Beacon containing the headlines to the effect that a hunt was being made near Wichita for the purpose of locating Alvin Karpis.

Special Agent H. A. Dietz of this office is presently at Wichita. He informs me that he did accompany the two deputy sheriffs mentioned in the article in connection with an investigation of a routine nature to attempt to locate the subject of an impersonation case. This investigation had no connection with any possible leads on Karpis. As a matter of fact, Agent Dietz has no leads at Wichita concerning Karpis, although he has been making inquiries in Wichita for the purpose of endeavoring to get information concerning Volney Davis. These inquiries have been as a result of information form an informant to the effect that Davis might be found in the vicinity of Wichita driving a Ford Coupe with Missouri lisence. Agent Dietz, on my instructions, requested the assistance of Chief of Police Wilson and Chief of Detectives Hayes of the Wichita Police to determine the license numbers of those Ford Coupes seen in Wichita with Missouri licenses in order that they might be properly checked.

Agent Dietz informs me that he has had no contact of any kind with a representative of a Wichita newspaper and it accordingly appears that the story in question was purely the product of a reporter's imagination.

On April 29, 1935 an individual who declined to reveal his identity called at the Chicago Bureau Office and was interviewed by Special Agent V. W. Peterson. He stated that he has been located on the West Coast and proceeded to Chicago a few days ago from California, in the company of a prize fighter by the name of Jimmy Dugan. Jimmy Dugan is stated to have a sister in Chicago by the name of Helen Southwick.

This individual stated that while on the West Coast he became associated with one Walter Marks. It is claimed by the Informant that Walter Marks is a contact for important hoodlums including Alvin Karpis, and possibly other members of the Barker-Karpis gang. According to the Informant, Walter Marks served a sentence in the United States Penitentiary at McNeil's Island, after having been convicted in Seattle on a charge of using the United States Mails in a scheme to defraud. It is believed that he was discharged from this institution approximately July, 1933. Walter Marks is described by the Informant as

According to the individual who called at the Chicago Bureau Office, he is a physician and surgeon. He also claims to have engaged in prize fighting several years ago and is acquainted with Jack Dempsey.

The Informant was extremely guarded in his conversation with Agent Peterson, and attempted to conceal any information which might be used in determining his true identity. During his conversation, however, he admitted that he has served time in the United States Penitentiary at Leavenworth, Kansas. He also indicated that he was in that institution during the time of the prison break several years ago. He further stated that he was an interne in the hospital at the United States Penitentiary at Leavenworth when he was incarcerated in that institution.

The Informant stated that Walter Marks contemplates coming to Chicago within a period of ten days. Walter Marks has contacted the Informant with reference to performing a surgical operation on Alvin Karpis, according to the Informant, and upon the arrival of Walter Marks in Chicago the Informant will determine the present whereabouts of Alvin Karpis and will communicate with Agent Peterson through Helen Southwick, previously referred to. The Informant refused to provide information concerning where he might be located or to furnish any further information concerning himself.

The Informant is approximately forty years of age, about six feet one inch in height, weighs 230 pounds, has blue eyes, and sandy hair. The hair on the front of his head is rather thin.

The above information was telephoned to Special Agent in Charge R. B. Nathan of the Kansas City Office on the night of April 29, 1935 and a request was made that photographs of all individuals employed in the hospital at the United States Penitentiary at Leavenworth, Kansas in the position of an interne or physician and surgeon, who might answer the description of the Informant, be forwarded to the Chicago Bureau Office in order that the identity of the Informant may be ascertained.

An airmail special delivery letter was also directed on April 29, 1935 to the Portland Office requesting that a photograph be forwarded to this office of Walter Marks for possible use in the event this individual does come to Chicago and attempts to contact Alvin Karpis. The Informant stated that Alvin Karpis is located at the present time somewhere in the northern part of Wisconsin.

A considerable length of time was spent with the Informant. In most respects he appeared rational, used good English, and from his conversation it appears quite likely that he is a physician and surgeon, or at least is acquainted with the terminology used by that profession. The Informant stated that he has been engaged in the practice of medicine in the State of California and was recently acquitted on a charge of abortion.

The Informant appeared to be well acquainted with the underworld on the west Coast and in Reno, Nevada. He volunteered information concerning William Graham, Soap woreno, Tobe Williams, and other individuals who are well known in the underworld in that section of the country. He stated that undoubtedly William Graham caused Ray Frisch to be murdered and was of the opinion that Graham hired Lester Joseph Gillis to commit the murder for him.

The Informant also stated that Jack Sullivan is closely connected with William Graham in Reno, Nevada. In this connection, attention is directed to Page 11 of the report of Special Agent William R. Ramsey, Jr., San Francisco, California, dated December 12, 1934, in the case entitled John Paul Chase, with aliases, John Hamilton, with alias, I.O.1220, et al, National Motor Vehicle Theft Act, et al., wherein it is stated that Graham and McKay had three partners, namely, Ter Hall, 731 Gordon Avenue, Jack Sullivan, alias Scarlet, alias Scar Face Sullivan, and a man named Kendall, all of whom reside in Reno, Nevada.

It was claimed by the Informant that he was in the place operated by Jack Sullivan about five weeks ago at which time he observed a man talking to Sullivan. After the departure of this individual, the Informant was told that the man in question was Alvin Karpis.

The Informant stated that Walter Marks has "double crossed" him and that his motive in furnishing information in this matter is for the purpose of obtaining revenge against Walter Marks. According to the Informant, in the event Alvin Karpis is captured, he will provide a large amount of information implicating Walter Marks. It is the hope of the Informant to send Walter Marks to the penitentiary.

Although the Informant appeared rational in his conversation, it is possible that he may be slightly deranged. It is not known whether the information which the Informant provided has any value, but the same is being forwarded to you for whatever consideration which may be deemed advisable.

In the event any further information is furnished by this individual, appropriate action will be taken by this office.

With reference to the memorandum of Special Egent in Charge E. J. Connelley, dated April El, 1935, setting out therein a brief summary of the investigative work to be done in instant case by the Chicago Bureau office, the following leads are ones that immediately suggest themselves:

WITH REGARD TO VOLNEY DAVIS:

was acquainted with Volney Davis and Edns Aurray during the time they resided at Aurora, and she is well acquainted with numerous contacts of Davis at Aurora. She has provided valuable information in regard to Davis' activities at Aurora in the past, and it is believed that this contact should be maintained.

Pete DeKing, who formerly was engaged in the liquor business at Aurora, recently provided the information that the morning after Volney Davis escaped at Yorkville, Illinois, he, with "Biff" Weber, Bill Grady and John Barbo, alias "Bubbles", were playing cards in the Rex Cafe, Aurora, when it was raided by Agents from the Chicago Bureau ... office. Deking stated that during the course of the conversation had before the raid the remark was made by some one of the above-mentioned persons that Davis had left Ted Smith's Tavern and had gone to the William Ridgeway Tavern. This tavern is owned by a man named Twilliger and Rich Graham. Davis is reported to have either obtained a car at the Ridgeway Tavern or left a car there. To Agents' knowledge this matter has not been investigated. Deking stated that R. A. Milroy, former Assistant United States Attorney at Chicago, presently practicing law in Aurora, was in Ted Smith's Tevern shortly after Davis escaped at Yorkville and Davis asked Milroy to accompany him to the Ridgeway Tavern. Milroy is reported to be respectable and reliable, and it is suggested that he be interviewed.

Bill Grady is the owner of "The Mill", a tavern at Montgomery, Illinois, near Aurora. According to Pete DeKing, John Grady, son of Bill Grady, frequented the company of Edna Murray, unknown to Volney Davis, during the time that both of them stayed at Aurora. It is thought that John Grady should be interviewed. It is known that Bill Grady is acquainted with Volney Davis, Edna Murray, Bill Seaver and Myrtle Eaton.

With further reference to Davis, Special Zgent A. A. Mussey suggested that John Drew, who is reported as being presently employed with his brother, Gus Drew, in a gambling establishment at Joliet, Illinois, be interviewed. John Drew is reported to have formerly been very friendly with Preston Paden, son of Edna Murray, during the time Davis and the Murray woman resided in Aurora.

Paul Knur, who drives a beer wagon for a wholesale grocery store at 100 North State Street, Aurora, Illinois, is well acquainted with tavern owners and persons who formerly traveled with Volney Davis during the time that he stayed in Aurora. Knur is considered reliable. If any investigation is to be made at Aurora it is believed that Knur's services will be valuable.

WITH REGARD TO WILLIAM J. HARRISON:

Harrison's ex-wife, With Heidt, who was arrested at the apartment occupied by herself, Clara and Russell Gibson, and Byron Bolton, on the night that Russell Cibson was killed, has been residing at 5 Waltham Street, Hammond, Indiana, and is employed at the Liars Club Tavern, Calumet City. Although she denies it, previous investigation indicates that she has been in frequent communication with Harrison in the past two years. It is believed that she should be interviewed and her activities covered.

With regard to a report that Harrison is frequenting Cicero, Illinois, information has been obtained that a man named Duke at the Hy-Ho Club is hiding out a member of the Karpis-Barker gang. This information was obtained from informant that he is acquainted with a man named/Duke who has been engaged in bookmaking in and about Cicero, and states that he believes he can locate Duke. Mr. Connelley, before he left Chicago, expressed the opinion that this was an important angle in this case and should be developed.

In this connection the original information regarding Harrison's being in Cicero came from St. Louis. Missouri.

Babs Goran contacted recently in St. Louis and stated that Harrison could be located at the Twenty-Five Cent Club in Cicero, Illinois, and indicated that he had seen Harrison recently.

Expressed an intention to Moran at that time that she expected to visit Chicago.

If investigation at Cicero fails to develop any definite information of value indicating that Harrison is in that town, it is believed that if the can be persuaded to some to Chicago she can get in touch with Harrison if she so desires.

The master of ceremonies at the Town Club is named Kirby. He is an old-time vaudeville trouper who, during a easual conversation with Agent Sullivan, stated that he was acquainted with the Hicks Brothers. Agent Hicks of this office is one of the Hicks Brothers who played all the prominent theaters throughout the country. It is believed that through Kirby, who appears to be a keen-minded person, information may be obtained regarding possible connections of Harrison at Cicero. The Town Club, of course, is in Cicero.

Numerous contacts of Harrison at Hammond and Calumet City can be checked intermittently.

WITH REGARD TO DR. JOSEPH P. MORAN:

A review of the file indicates that Miss Bettyl Tracy, who is employed at the Civil Service Commission, City Hall Building, in Chicago, and who was engaged to Dr. Moran, is in all probability the best party at present through whom information concerning his whereabouts could be obtained. It is suggested that an attempt be made by Agents of this office to follow Miss Tracy when she leaves her office at about 5:00 P. M. in order to determine whether she is possibly contacting Dr. Moren at that time. Miss Tracy is known to Agent Chaffetz, who can point her out to other agents who are assigned to follow her.

Information appearing in the file indicates that Dr. Moran was at one time a physician for the Truck Drivers Union here in Chicago. It has been ascertained that a party by the name of Glavin is

now the head of that union, which is known as the outlaw organization. Since it is commonly known that this office is actively seeking Dr. Moran, it is suggested that Mr. Glavin be interviewed in proper manner by this office in order to determine whether he would furnish this office with any information that he might obtain concerning the present whereabouts of Dr. Moran.

Reference is here made to the suggestion set out in the report of Special Agent T. W. Dawsey, Nashville, Tennessee, dated Agril 19, 1955, Page 10, wherein it is suggested that a wanted notice be placed with the Asta Journal and the Medical Economic, medical publications which are reported to reach practically every doctor and every surgical supply house in the United States. Agent Chaffetz states that he recalls that some such arrangement was made in connection with the Stoll kidnaping case in an effort to locate Thomas H. Robinson, Jr.

Before such action is taken, however, it is believed that a discreet inquiry should be made at Spring Valley, Illinois, home of Dr. Joseph P. Moran and his brother, Dr. James Moran, to ascertain definitely whether Moran is visiting Spring Valley. Several reports from various sources have previously reached this office that Moran 🕾 occasionally visits his brother. Moran is reported to have promiscuously had immoral relations with former female clients, some of tender years, in and about Spring Valley, and due to his reputation of being w an abortionist, it is believed that he has many enemies in Spring and a Valley. It is believed that an investigation should be made at Spring Valley to locate persons inimical to Moran, of which, undoubtedly, 🔗 🔻 there are many. If this investigation proves unproductive it is thought that Dr. James Moran should be interviewed at the Chicago Bureau office and advised that insamuch as this Bureau has taken great care to keep his name from the public as a brother of Dr. Joseph P. Moran, as much as possible, he should cooperate by aiding the Bureau. Dr. James Moran is reported to have a fair reputation in the vicinity of Spring Valley. And If he fails to cooperate it is suggested that the above arrangement be made for publishing Dr. Joseph P. Moran's picture in the above-mentioned medical publications.

With regard to license numbers and automobiles, Special Agent.

T. M. McDade has this day dictated a summary report of the automobile known to have been used or owned by members of the Karpis-Barker saying and the license plates used thereon. 

With regard to Kahn's Stand, a barbeque place located en North Avenue near Elmburst, which stand has been mentioned as a place frequented by members of the Karpis-Barker gang, Volney Davis, after his escape from Yorkville, is reported to have stayed overnight in one of a few cabins operated by Kahn in the rear of his stand. Elmer Farmer kept company with one of the Kehn girls. The Kahn family have recently leased the premises for a rental of \$3,000.00, undoubtedly for a year or a longer period, and the whole family is expected to leave for Germany on or about May 10th. The suggestion was made to Mr. Connelley ______ approximately one month ago that Kahn should be interviewed but Mr. Connelley did not believe it advisable to do so at that time. However, inasmuch as the stay of the Kahn family in Cermany will be indefinite and it is possible that they may not return to the United States, it is believed that if the entire family is brought into the office and the members interviewed separately they may be able to provide valuable information regarding contacts and activities of the Karpis-Barker gang.

Street, Omaha, Nebraska, where he conducts the Polly Sales Company, handling amusement devices of various kinds. Mr. Pepper states that he has not handled any slot machines for the past four or five years and that in his business dealings he has never come in contact with Subject Harry Sawyer; that he has known the Sandlovich family all his life; that the boys in Lincoln who run the meat market, and also the one in the used car business, are upstanding eitizens and well thought of in the community. He further states that Subject Sawyer has been the black sheep of the family all his life and that the rest of the family have no use for him in any way, and he is of the opinion that none of the brothers or sisters would shield Subject and that they would help locate him if it were possible for them to do so.

Mr. Pepper further states that several weeks ago, Burt Polsky, who rums a pawnshop across the street from the Post Office in Lincoln, Nebraska, told him that his son had been over in the Post Office and had seen a picture of Harry Sawyer up on the Bulletin Board; that Polsky's boy had immediately gone to the Sandlovich family, who are also relatives of his, and had informed them of this picture being on display at the Post Office; that the Sandlovich brothers had then contacted the Postmaster at Lincoln, whom they know very well, and had asked him to take the picture down, or at least not leave it in such a public place, as it would harm them is many ways, that they had no use for this brother and did not want their own reputations ruined in the town where they had spent their lives. Mr. Pepper states that he does not know whether the Postmaster complied with their request or not.

Mr. Peoper appeared to be very honest and trustworthy, and stated that he would notify this office immediately if he heard of any word whatever as to Subject Sawyer's whereabouts.

Agent made several inquiries in the vicinity of Mr. Pepper's office, among business men who were acquainted with Mr. Pepper, and all recommended him very highly as to his honesty, and stated that he had a very good reputation in all his business dealings, although he did handle a product which was not very well thought of among a great many people.
