On August 2, 1935, a conterence was held at the Chicago Bureau Office between Mr. George A. Skultety, County Attorney, Fairbury, Nebraska and Special Agents John L. Madala of the New York Bureau Office and R. P. Shanahan of the Little Rock Bureau Office, in connection with the possible prosecution on State charges of bank robbery against Jesa Doyle.

As a result of this conference the opinion was expressed by Mr. Skultety that due to the absence of any definite identification of Doyle by employees of the First National Bank of Fairbury, Nebraska, and other witnesses to the said bank robbery, that a successful prosecution could not be initiated and completed solely upon the basis of the written statement of Doyle as contained in the report of Special Agent R. P. Shanahan dated at Kansas City, Missouri, 2/21/35. Mr. Skultety stated that numerous statements had been obtained from employees of the First National Bank of Fairbury and other witnesses, but that the same indicate only the presence of individuals other than Doyle as being participants in the above robbery such as Frank Nash, Earl Christman, Doc Barker, Alvin Karpis. However, no information is in the County Attorney's possession indicating that any identification of Jess Doyle could be made in the event he was tried by this matter.

The further opinion was expressed by Mr. Skultety that an interview by Agents of the Bureau with Volney Davis, now incarcerated at the United States Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas, might be productive of beneficial information so that more light could be cast upon the modus operandi of this robbery. In this way Mr. Skultety believes information may be obtained from Davis which can in turn be placed before the employees of the bank and other witnesses resulting in a possible identification of Jess Doyle. Consequently, it is requested of the Bureau at this time if the same be deemed advisable that an interview by Agents entirely familiar with the subjects of the above entitled case and all their associates be had with Volney Davis at the United States Penitentiary at Leavenworth, Kansas.

It has also been requested by Mr. Skultety that he be furnished with photographs and complete physical descriptions of the following:

Eddie Green, Earl Christman and Clyde Nemerick.

The Agents who were present at this interview with Mr. Skultety were also requested to provide the County Attorney's office at Fairbury, Nebraska, with the information contained in the report of Special Agent J. R. Green and R. B. Smith, dated at Omaha, Nebraska, 9/21/34. It will be noted by reference to this report that thorough inquiries among the employees of the First National Bank of Fairbury, Nebraska, and other witnesses to the robbery of that institution, were made in September of 1934 and are set out therein. Consequently, the permission of the Bureau is being requested at this time to supply Mr. George A. Skultety with a copy of the above information set out in memorandum form.

It should be noted that from the conference held on the above date that Mr. Skultety is extremely desirous of prosecuting Doyle in this matter, but is loath to proceed unless at least one identifying witness can be found so that corroboration of Doyle's statement can be effected.



MEMORANDUM FOR MR. EDWARDS.

Reference is made to the request of Mr. Tolson that ϵ complete history memorandum be submitted in the case of C. F. Hubbard, who was arrested by the Police Department, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, #27965, on July 9, 1935, for violation U. S. Internal Revenue Laws, and whose residence is given as Burlington, Wisconsin.

Our file #TBI-25198 discloses that C. D. Hubbard is identical with "Doc" Eaton. There are transmitted herewith copies of the complete criminal record of this individual as appearing in the files of the Identification Division.

It is noted that as Clarence Eaton, this individual was received at the State Prison, Stillwater, Minnesota, on May 13, 1926; charge, entering a banking room with intent to commit a felony; sentence, life. The information is contained in our files as to when this subject was percled.

When Eaton's fingerprints were received in the Bureau from the Police Department, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, reflecting his arrest on July 9, 1935, for violation U. S. Internal Revenue Laws, a wanted notice was located in his file to the effect that he was wanted for murder by the Sheriff at Ottumwa, Iowa. A wire was dispatched to the authorities at Milwaukee on July 10, 1935 advising that Eaton was wanted for murder. A wire was received in the Pureau from the Sheriff's Office on July 11, 1935, (Ottumwa, Iowa), Edvising that they had no case against Eaton as the witness was killed and no cooperative evidence was in their possession.

"Doc" Laton, alies C. D. Fubbard, was the husband of Myrtle Faton, wanted for questioning in the Bremer kidnaping case, and it is believed that a review of the Bureau's file on this subject will disclose additional RECORDED information.

Additional contacts made with former associates of Campbell and Karpis at South Coffeyville, Ponca City, Skiatook and Tulsa, Oklahoma. Campbell and one other man, probably Karpis stopped at a filling station in South Coffeyville, Oklahoma, about the first of May of this year, purchased gasoline, then apparently drove north, without making any particular inquiries. They were driving a 1935 model Ford V-8 Coupe but the license tag was not ascertained. DETAILS: In a further effort to ascertain the identity of the person who called to see Wynona Burdette at the home of her sister. Mrs.

Wilson, at Arondale, Oklahoma, Henry Daniels was again interviewed at Skiatook, Oklahoma. He advised that Jack Ivey, Jr., a part Osage Indian, had told him that Ray Roberson (not Ray Roberts as previously referred to) and another unknown man from Claremore, Oklahoma, had given Ivey a ride from Skiatook to his farm, about six or seven miles southwest of Skiatook, when they were on their way to Hominy, Oklahoma, which is near Arondale, about the time Wynona left Ponta City the last time with Harry Campbell.

Daniels said that he had been unable to secure any further information regarding the identity of who this alleged contact for Harry Campbell might be.

Ivey stated that he is positive that Roberson gave him this ride in January, 1935 and he positively fixes this approximate date by certain high school terms that he has in mind and that therefore, would be at a later date than the date in question, which was probably in November or the first part of December, 1934.

Ray Roberson, a squaw man and part Osage Indian, is presently living in Skiatook, Oklahoma, with an Osage Indian woman by the flame of Marsh. Roberson agrees fairly well with the description of the person who called at the Wilson home to see Wynona the night she left with Campbell?

Roberson was interviewed by the writer and stated that he was acquainted with Campbell; that he had kept company with Wynona's sister, Jinmy, two or three years ago and that he and Jinmy and Harry and Wynona had done a lot of drinking together; that he first met Campbell at the Jones home near Turley, Oklahoma; that "Dopey" Rogers, a younger brother of Cliff Robers of Skiatook, also part Osage Indian, was in this drinking party a couple of times. It might be stated here that this Rogers is now incarcerated in the Federal Penitentiary at Leavenworth, Kansas, and has been interviewed previously by agents of the Oklahoma City Office and is regarded as being solely unreliable, due especially to the fact that he is a habitual drunkard.

Roberson said that he had received no direct word of Harry Campbell for approximately two years. He said that he believes the two best contacts Harry Campbell has in Oklahoma are Cliff Rogers of Skiatook, and George ("Burr Head") Keady, of Tulsa, Oklahoma. Roberson asked concerning the amount the Covernment would pay for information leading to the apprehension of Campbell and Karpis and he was told that the Bureau would pay \$1,000.00 each for that information. He said that he has no idea that Campbell will try to get in touch with him, but if he does and if he receives any information whatever concerning Campbell or his activities he promised faithfully to advise the writer immediately, though he said that he would not advise any other person and did not want to be contacted again by other Bureau agents, and asked that his name be kept most confidentially.

While making inquiry at Skiatook, Oklahoma, the writer observed a 1935 model Terraplane Coupe, bearing 1935 Arizona tags # B5-F1, parked in front of the Man Rogers home. Inquiry from confidential sources concerning the identity of persons who would be visiting the Rogers family from Arizona met only with negative results. The Phoenix Office was thereafter requested to ascertain to whom this tag was issued and an July 21, 1935 the Oklahoma City Office was advised by the Phoenix Office that this tag was issued to Ret Haynie, 1702 East First Street, Tucson, Arizona, for 1935 Terraplane Coupe, motor \$113604, serial \$523044. It was later ascertained from a sonfidential source in Skiatook that Ret Haynie is the son of a cousin of Cliff Rogers, who is residing in Arizona, and further inquiries along this line did, therefore, not seem to be necessary.

Dr. Cliff Logan, Hominy, Oklahoma, advised the writer, config dentially, that he and John Cromer had been on two "parties" with Wynona and Jimmy Burdette; that after these so called parties, he was advised by Dick Connor, the Sheriff at Pawhuska, Oklahoma, that these girls were associating with notorious outlaws and he has not had any further contact with them. He was interviewed with the understanding that he is a close friend to Mr. and Mrs. R. D. Wilson, brother-in-law and sister of Wynona Burdette, of Arondale, Oklahoma. Dr. Logan said that he is not especially friendly with the Wilsons, though he is their family physician. He said, however, that John Cromer is friendly with both Mr. and Mrs. Wilson and he believes the Wilsons would tell Cromer if they know anything concerning the location of Campbell. Through inquiry made by Dr. Logan, he ascertained that John Cromer is now employed by a widow who operates a funeral home in West Tulsa, Oklahoma. Cromer will be interviewed in the future concerning any possible information he may have regarding Harry Campbell. The second second second second

All the same Hiram G. Raffensperger, Ponca City, Oklahoma, who is manager of the Public Market, advised the writer that he did not tell Jimmy Burdette that Wynona told him that it was Henry Daniels who saw her at the Wilson home in Arondale, Oklahoma. He said that he did not see this man but merely heard him inquiry for Wynona, and as it was dark he could not see who Wynona was talking to when she went out of the house. Raffensperger said that when he and Wynona left the Wilson home he was jealous of someone calling to talk to her and asked her who the man was and Wynona told him, as near as he can remember, that it was a "boy" whom she had known for several years who worked in a filling station in Skiatook, Oklahoma. Wynona, he said, did not tell him why this man called to see her and they did not discuss that angle whatsoever, as Wynona assured him that the call meant nothing to her as this party was an old friend of hers and not anyone she cared about. 2000年的 新国的 **经**

Jimmy Burdette, Wynona's sister, has left Ponca City and is presently residing with her sister, Mildred Jones, near Turley, Oklahoma. She was interviewed and said that she is satisfied that Hy Raffensperger told her that the man who called to see Wynona at the Wilson home was themry Daniels, though she says she could be mistaken regarding this, as Henry Daniels is an old friend of Wynona's and is the first person she thought of as being an old friend of Wynona's who lives in Skiatook, as stated before in reports by this agent Henry Daniels is employed in a garage and not in a filling station. Jimmy Burdette insisted, to the writer, that she has told all she knows about this matter and appears to be sincere when she says she would do anything in her power to assist this Bureau in apprehending Harry Campbell as she believes, as does all of her sisters, that if they could do something to assist in apprehending Campbell their sister may be released from Milam, Michigan.

Mildred Jones, Turley, Oklahoma, sister of Wynona Burdette, stated that she had received no information whatever of Harry Campbell and again assured the writer that she would communicate any information she receives immediately to the writer or to agent Kitchin, at Tulsa, Oklahoma.

A confidential informant at Skiatook, Oklahoma, who will hereafter be referred to as was interviewed by the writer and agent
Kitchin. He stated that he is well acquainted with Harry Campbell and
casually acquainted with Karpis and Phoenix Donald. This informant is a
gembler and has done a lot of drinking with Campbell and this fact is
definitely known to the Oklahoma City Office. first refused
to cooperate with the Bureau by promising to assist in giving any information he might come into possession of concerning Harry Campbell, but
after several hours of questioning this individual and talking to him
about his duty to his country he consented to advise either, the writer
or agent Kitchin of any information he receives concerning either of the
subjects in this case, for the confidential money which will be paid to
him for this service.

When this informant is in Tulsa, Oklahoma, he will be found around the Tulsa Hotel and if he calls either of these agents he will use the name if these agents endeavor to contact this man and it is necessary to leave a name they will also use the name. He has been advised concerning different ways he can contact these agents and it is believed that he will cooperate and furnish any information he receives, though he says he has heard nothing directly of Campbell since he left Oklahoma about two years ago and went north where he joined up with the Barkers.

The above informant, as well as the informants mentioned below in the two interviews, were especially careful to have these agents guarantee that their names would not be put into a report, and the Director is being advised in a personal and confidential letter concerning the identity of these men.

confidential informant who will hereafter be referred to was interviewed by agent Kitchin and the writer and after a long conversation with him he faithfully promised to advise either of these agents concerning any information. he receives of Campbell or his associates. is personally acquainted with Campbell, though he is not acquainted with Karpis. He has had a lot of dealings with Campbell and this fact is definitely known to the writer He advised, confidentially, that he has only seen Campbell once in about two and a half or three years and that this was about the first of May, 1935, when Campbell drove by the filling station in South Coffeyville, operated by Charlie McCabe and his brother Les McCabe, and filled his tank with gasoline. Campbell was driving and there was another man with him whom this informant described as being about the same physical description as Karpis and having a prominent chin. looked at several photographs of subjects in this case and selected the photograph of Karpis as strongly resembling the man that was with Campbell, though he said he could not be positive from the photograph. This man, he said, wore octagon shaped rimless eye glasses and he could not remember for sure how this man or Campbell was dressed. Neither of them got out of the car and they were driving a 1935 model black Ford Coups. In back of the seat were piled some coats and the informant said he did not observe any guns and did not try and to or think of observing the kind of a license tag that was on this car. They were driving from the south and apparently drove on north, as that is: the direction they went when they left this filling station. I

"Les", spoken of in the report of Special Agent S. L. Fortenberry dated 5/27/35, is Les McCabe, one of the McCabe brothers who works at the filling station where Harry Campbell purchased this gasoline. This informant is well aware of all the activities that goes on at this filling station and at the Silver Slipper, the night club at South Coffeyville, operated by the McCabe brothers. He is also close to Tom Hill, South Coffeyville, notorious hoodlum and it is believed, by agent Kitchin and the writer, that if he is ever able to obtain any information regarding Campbell or his associates that he will do so and immediately advise one of these agents. This informant further advised that Campbell has stopped several times with Gus and Dollie Hill of Coffeyville, Kansas; that this couple Tecently left for Colorado for Hill's health. He said that he does not believe that they havehad any contact with Campbell Suring the past two or three years.

was interviewed by agent Kitchin and the writer. This informant is acquainted with most of the hoodlums and outlaws in Oklahoma. He is well acquainted with Karpis, Phoenix Donald and C. J. Fitzgerald and is especially well acquainted with Harry Campbell.

they have been closely associated in a lot of illegal deals, upon numerous occasions. This informant is probably in a better position to obtain confidential in-

This informant is probably in a better position to obtain confidential information regarding underworld characters in Oklahoma than any other person. He stated that he has a very strong dislike for Karpis and for Phoemix Donald and that he would gladly put them on the spot for nothing, but he has a very kindly feeling toward Harry Campbell and hesitates about making any definite promises regarding what he will do regarding Campbell. He promised, however, definitely, before the close of the interview to advise one of these agents if he receives any information regarding the location or activities of any of the members of this mob, including Campbell, as he realizes that their arrest is inevitable and as he is hard pressed for money at the present he believes that he had just as well have the confidential money the Bureau will pay for these outlaws as anyone else. He is aware of how he can contact one of these agents and it is believed that he will cooperate fully.

has previously advised the writer that Ida White of Coffeyville, was a very close friend to Glenn Leroy Wright and also friendly to other mobsters.

In an effort to locate this woman at South Coffeyville, Oklahoma, Dutch Tolbert, of Coffeyville, Kansas, advised the writer that Ida White is now living in Joplin, Missouri, and that Bill Robinson, Manager of the R. and S. Chevrolet Company of Joplin will probably know where this girl is living. Wright and Campbell robbed this Chevrolet Company at one time and it is possible that Robinson may have some information concerning the contacts of this mob in Joplin, that may be of some use to the Kansas City Office. It is understood that Robinson was able to obtain restitution of practically all of the bonds stolen from him through some underworld source and for this reason it is thought that his services may be helpful to the Bureau in this case.

With reference to the "Mel" spoken of in the report of Special Agent S. L. Fortenberry, Detroit, Michigan, dated 6/27/35, inquiry at Tulsa disclosed that this "Mel" is Milton O. Brooks, who is a nephew of Clyde R. McKinzie, owner of the Acme Cab Company of Tulsa, and Brooks is smployed as a driver with that company. Brooks was interviewed by the writer and at first refused to make any admissions concerning his associations with Campbell. He later, however, advised that he had been very closely associated with Campbell and his associates for sometime and that he had even been on several jobs with them. He was arrested one time but has never been con-

victed of a felony and has never served time in any penitentiary. advised that Harry Campbell would be likely to visit Kr. and Krs. Lewis Webb, Tulsa, Oklahoma, Carrie Strickland of Tulsa, Mr. and Mrs. 2. D. who is about 55 years old, 5' 11" in height and will weightabout 215 pounds, the Carpenters, parents of Tommy and Gordon Carpenter of Berryville, Arkansas. Campbell also has a contact and a place where he has gone many times that he is sure is not generally known in Neosho, Missouri. This man's first name is Bert but his last name is not remembered by Brooks and Bert works, or at least did work for Pet Creamery at Neosho, Missouri. Bert has a brother by the name of Jess, who was a counterfeiter and who was killed by officers approximately two years ago, around either Neosho or Joplin, Missouri. Brooks said that he believed Campbell would be more likely to go to this Bert's home than any other place in this part of the country. Campbell also had another contact with a man and his sister who operated: the Stateline Filling Station, located near the Oklahoma Kansas State line at Caney, Kansas, on U. S. Highway #75, between Caney, Kansas and Bartlesville, Oklahoma. Brooks is of the opinion that the best contact in Oklahoma for Campbell is Burr Head Keady, of Tulsa, and further stated that he was also friendly with Cliff Rogers of Skiatook, Oklahoma. الأربان محريهم أسده وعارم والانهوج الأسترة فواي مثلا الرسطي ومرأ

Brooks asked that his name be treated in the most confidential way in this regard and he was assured that this would be. He likes Harry Campbell personally, he says, though he promised to furnish the writer with any information he receives concerning him, for the confidential money the Bureau will pay for this.

Other confidential informants which have previously been mentioned in reports by this agent were interviewed in Tulsa, Oklahoma, including Louie Jacobs Elmett Welch, Mr. and Mrs. McWhinery, Mr. and Mrs. Chuck Hughes, and Pansy Kingsbury. None of these persons had obtained any information regarding any of the members of this mob since they were last interviewed.

Fred Tindle, who is more commonly known as "Wetump", Ponca City, Oklahoma, is a night club operator there. He was interviewed by the writer and stated that he is acquainted with Harry Campbell and did not hesitate to say that he would be glad to furnish the writer with any information he receives concerning Campbell or any of his associates. He also inquired concerning the amount of money the Bureau will pay for this confidential information and he was told that the Bureau would pay \$1,000.00 each for Campbell and Karpis, for the confidential information resulting in their apprehension. Tindle said that he believed Cliff Rogers of Skiatook, Oklahoma and "Burr Head" Keady of Tulsa, to be Campbell's best friends and closest associates in Oklahoma.

J. R. Rhodes, of Fairfax, Oklahoma, advised agent John R. Welles that he was especially friendly with Tindle, who is mentioned above, and Charlie Davis, a former associate of Harry Campbell and believed that he could obtain information from both of these men concerning the location of Campbell. Rhodes also claims to be a close friend of Campbell and advised agent Welles that he will make a special effort to endeavor to secure some information regarding Campbell's location and advise either agent Welles or Special Agent in Charge Dwight Brantley, or agent Little, at the Oklahoma City Office. Rhodes has requested that he not be interviewed by any other agent except agent Welles.

If the Kansas City Office is unsuccessful in locating this place, it is suggested that some further effort be made by possibly having the informant in this case go and point out the home where Bert resides.

Will interview Bill Robinson, Manager of the R and S Chevrolet Company, for any information he can supply regarding Herry Campbell or his associates in Joplin.

Mr. Flexer of the State Department telephoned me and advised that he is in receipt of a letter from one of the Charge Diaffairs in Cuba inquiring as to the present status of the case against Heller. I informed Mr. Flexer that we are informed the trial of this case is coming up at the Fall term of Court in Florida. I told him we are further informed by the defense attorneys in this case that they expert to go to Havana on or about August 19, 1935, for the purpose of taking depositions to be used in the trial of this case.

Mr. Flexer stated that the letter advises that through casual conversation on the part of Heller at the Embassy at Havana, Heller advised that his attorneys have intimated they are going to stir up quite a commotion about this matter; that they are coming to Havana to take numerous depositions from various witnesses, and are going to try to prove that the Department of Justice exceeded that thority in connection with the investigation of this case. Heller stated in effect that he did not desire to go to the added legal expense to put on such a campaign, and further that he did not vant to become the "goat" of an attempt on the part of his attorneys to "show up" the Department of Justice. I remarked that this would appear to be a matter between Heller and his attorneys.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

Re: Alvin Karpis, with aliases, et al Kidnaping

Mr. Connelley, Mr. Newby, Special Agent R. D. Brown and myself have discussed in detail proposed investigative activity to be undertaken in the above entitled case. Mr. Connelley desires that Special Agent R. C. Suran, presently assigned to the San Francisco Office, Special Agent R. D. brown, presently assigned to the Cleveland Office and Special Agent Madals of the New York Office, be assigned to work under his direction, on this case. An air mail letter is being transmitted to the San Francisco Office, instructing Mr. Suran to report to Mr. Connelley at Chicago for special assignment of indefinite duration. It is not anticipated that Mr. Suran should be transferred to the Chicago Office at the present time for the reason that much of the work to be performed by him will probably be outside of the city of Chicago.

Appropriate instructions are being issued for the transfer of Agent Madels to Chicago.

A letter is being addressed to Mr. MacFarland at Cleveland, instructing him that Special Agent R. D. Brown is to be assigned exclusively to work on the Bremer case under Mr. Connelley's direction, and that Special Agent C. E. Smith should work with Mr. Brown on this case. Instructions will be issued for the cancellation of the transfer of Kr. Smith to Chicago.

It has been agreed that an effort will be made to place telephone trus upon the telephones of the labor racketeers in Chicago, Heeney, Donovan and rell. Heeney has recently had instelled in his residence an unlisted telephone and he is a known contact for the Barkers and probably for other hot criminals. He is also a leader in the Capone syndicate. If practical and possible, telephone taps will be placed upon the telephones of the Motion Picture Operators' Union, which is controlled by the Heeney-Donovan croud.

Asent Madala, upon his return to Chicago will work with informent in an effort to develop information concerning the whereabouts of the members of the Karpis Gang.

Appropriate efforts will be made to place position where she will be able to obtain information in Ohio, and con-

(e

sideration will be given, probably through Frazier Reams, Prosecuting attorney at Toledo, to have the Grady woman, who controls the operation of houses of prostitution in that city, placed in a position where she will have to furnish the Eureau with information concerning the whereabouts of Karpis or subject herself to state prosecution, it being alleged that she is receiving protection. This woman recently contacted an unscrupulous plastic surgeon in Chicago, for the purpose of having facial operations performed upon two fugitives, one of whom she described as being Alvin Karpis.

The situation is very promising in the Toledo District, where Agent Eroan has established a number of reliable informants, whose information indicates rather conclusively that Karpis and his associates are in that vicinity. Agent Brown has obtained the services of an informant who serves as a bor-tender in the Harvard Club, operated by politically powerful individuals in foledo, which will undoubtedly result in the Bureau's receiving information concerning the movements of the gang, in the event they return to the Harvard Club.

Detailed plans for the covering of leads in Chicago, Toledo, Cleveland and Des Moines, Iowa have been formed, which will be placed into operation by Mr. Connelley as soon as the Agents assigned to this case are available.

Wr. Connelley and I believe that the lack of concentrated activity upon known contacts of the Karpis mob for the past two months will have a beneficial effect in that it has allowed these contacts to "cool off" to such a point where the members of the mob will be more careless in contacting their former associates and by obtaining the services of informents who can be relied upon, it is felt that early results will accrue in this search.

Arrangements were made with Special Agent in Charge Brantley and Special Agent F. 5. Smith, both of whom were attending the re-training school, to endeavor to effect, through a reliable informant some "tap" upon the subterranean channels through which messages are smuggled into the State Penitentiary at McAlester, Oklahoma, to ascertain with whom and from there Karpis is corresponding. Repeated rumors have been received that Karpis is in communication through the "grape vine" with some prisoner in that institution.

Agent Frank Smith was authorized to return to Oklahoma City by way of Leaven worth, Kansas for the purpose of contacting private detective Glynn, a known go-between for many criminals, in an effort to

obtain some information on Karpis and his associates. Agent Smith was acquainted with Glynn some 25 years ago when Glynn was a police officer. Agent "mith is further going to attempt to obtain information from one Elmer Inman, who may be in a position to enable him to furnish information to the Bureau.

According to the records at the Bureau, guns bearing identical numbers are located as follows:

Please be advised that while in Chicago on August 2, 1935, I conferred with Special Agent in Charge D.M. Ladd concerning this informant and fully informed him of her attitude in the matter of assisting the Bureau in connection with this case as reflected in her letters to me, which indicated that she was very much dissatisfied working with another agent from the Chicago Office. Mr. Ladd expressed surprise at this information and stated that to his knowledge had cooperated with Special Agent D.P. Sullivan of that office to a great extent. At this time it was suggested that I contact in the hope of effecting some arrangement with her whereby any further contacts with her made by Agent Sullivan would not be against her will or to her dissatisfaction.

I met by appointment in downtown Chicago and she advised that arter I left Chicago she lost thorough interest in the case; that she had not intended to telephone the Chicago Bureau Office in the event she received further information with reference to Campbell and Harrison, but that Agent Sullivan had contacted her a few days after my departure and she agreed to work with him merely for the purpose

of not displeasing me. She further stated that Agent Bullivan had treated her very well and that although she has endeavored to follow his instructions she did not furnish him all developments in the case since my departure from Chicago.

At this point, advised that about a week after I left for New York City, Mike Mareno wisited her at her home and inquired when she was going to St. Paul, Minn. for Harrison. She further stated that Lillian Mareno told her that Mangum had inquired of her whether she knew whore was residing and then requested her to ha ve get in touch with him at her convenience. stated that Mangum did not indicate to Lillian Mareno why he wanted to see her but she, opinion that it is with reference to Harrison and possibly her trip to St. Paul, Minn.

I brought to the Chicago Bureau Office that night and introduced her to Mr. Ladd, and it was explained to her that the Bureau has appreciated her assistance in connection with this case and that it was hoped that she would continue to work with agents of the Chicago Office in spite of my not being in Chicago. She informed us that she will continue to assist the Bureau in locating the remaining members of the Barker-Karpis mob under the condition that I was to receive entire credit for her efforts. Mr. Ladd assured her of this, which apparently was to her satisfaction.





The one fragment of a lead bullet has two land and two groove marks visible but does not contain individual marks of the gun through which it was fired. 





Referring to conversation had by me on August 1, 1935 with Special Agent Hostetter of your office in regard to Jos Finnegen, places be edvised that Post Office Inspector McCarthy was interviewed relative to the alleged implication of Joseph Finnegen in the robbery of a messenger at Chicago in December, 1932.

Inspector McCarthy stated that the identity of the robbers in this case is unknown; that there is some indication that Gustainkler took part in this robbery. Information in the files of this office indicates that Charles JAFitzgerald aus likewise involved. Mr. McCerthy stated that it was known that a man named Joe handled some of the securities obtained in the robbery and suspicion fell upon Joe Finnegen. As a result thereof investigation was conducted at St. Louis, Missouri, and as a result of a fact town he tas traced to Mismi, Florida, where McCerthy arrested him and returned him to Chicago. He was questioned, and several witnesses saw him but could not identify him. Finnegan was released and is not manted by post office authorities.

McCarthy stated that Finnegan is described as follows:

McCarthy stated that Finnegan is afflicted with heart trouble.

Agent Sullivan, who interviewed Post Office Inspector McCarthy, was further advised that Finnegan, shortly after the death of Que Winkler, went to St. Louis and boasted that he was going to take ever the Capone syndicate. McCarthy stated that Finnegan was quite a braggart; that he has a wife and a daughter. His wife's maiden name was McCarthy, and she is described as being approximately 35 years of age and of slim build. The shild is a girl, approximately 15 or 14 years of age, and generally attends a Catholic school.

I am attaching hereto two copies of the fingerprints of Joseph Dewey Finnegan, obtained by Post Office Inspector McCarthy from the er Department, and two photostatic copies of a check drawn on the Treasurer of the United States, dated October 31, 1935, payable to Finnegan, in the sum of \$27.00, apparently for compensation. Finnegan's endorsement is on the back of this check. The address of 4418 M. 19th St., St. Louis, Missouri, according to Inspector McCarthy, is the residence of Finnegan's mother.

The only other information in the files of the Chicago office is a result of information obtained from an informant that William Kerin and "Baba" Moran were seen in an automobils with Florida license plates. These plates were checked, and it was ascertained that they were issued to Joseph Finnegam.

Photostatic copies of the above-mentioned check and fingerprint card are being forwarded to the Eureau and to the respective field offices as follows:

In connection with the information provided by Agent Hostetter that Kerin had contacted Finnegan in St. Louis, Information was contacted on August 1, 1935, and he advised that he was absolutely certain that Kerin was still registered at the Rienzi Hotel, Diversey Parkway, Chicago, and that he had seen Kerin at approximately 2:00 A.M. on the morning of August 1 and had seen him about the neighborhood on several occasions during the previous week. It is possible that

may have been mistaken in his identification of Kerin. However, this information is being provided the St. Louis Office so that they may definitely ascertain whether Kerin is visiting St. Louis.

For your information, the Callahan mentioned in this communication is Rerbert F. Callahan of 43 Tremont Street, Boston, who is a well known representative of gangsters in this city. It is this Callahan who arranged for the release of Meads at the time of his arrest by the Morthempton Police as set forth in the report of Special Agent P. M. Plunkett, at Boston, deted July 20, 1935, copies of which were furnished the Jacksonville Office. Callahan resides at 288 Pond, Boston. A separate investigation of the activities of this attorney and others in connection with the release of Meade is being conducted by the Boston Office. " "

It has been further determined that the Fred Ferrell at 24 Jordan Road, Brookline, Mass., also uses the name of Fred Flower. He resides at this address and apparently enjoys a good income, the source of which has not been determined since he has refused to state it to credit agencies in Boston. His occupation he has stated on different occasions as being an importer, a representative of a foreign paint concern and representative of an unnamed varnish corporation.

It is further noted in your letter that Post Office Inspector Graham was investigating the case of John Sutton with eliases. It would appear that this is the same man as the "Mr. Graham" mentioned in the enonymous communication.



This is to confirm telephonic conversation had with you by Special Agent D. S. Hostetter on August 1, 1935 in reference to William Kerin and his associate, Joseph/Pinnegan, both of whom are now located in St. Louis, Missouri.

William Kerin now resides at the Fairgrounds Hotel, 3644 Natural Bridge, St. Louis, and is driving a Graham-Paige coupe bearing 1935 Florida license B-5088. A surveillance of this individual indicates that he contacts Joseph Finnegan, who lives at #4004 Market St., St. Louis.

Subsequent investigation reflects that Finnegen was supposedly manager during 1935 of the 225 East Superior Club, #225 East Superior St., Chicago, Ill. Finnegan is now driving a Dodge Brougham bearing 1935 Florida license #45251 and is employed at the Mounds Country Club hear East St. Louis, Illinois.

Inquiries at the St. Louis Police Department revealed that on December 15, 1933 Kr. Jack Stahl, Post Office Inspector, Chicago, Ill., reported that on December 6, 1932 a group of individuals wearing masks held up and robbed letter earrier Fred Voslach of the Chicago, Ili. Post Office and that many of the bonds stolen in this robbery have been traced to one Jee Finnegan and at that time it was reported that Finnegan had left Chicago for St. Louis.

In reference to the Mounds Country Club, as mentioned above, it has been ascertained that Jack Langer is at present manager. It is recalled that Jack Langer was formerly manager of the Kit Kat Club in St. Louis and that Harrison supposedly accompanied by some of the instant mob, frequented this spot during 1934. It has been likewise accertained that Jack Langer was arrested on August 15, 1930 by the St. Louis Police Dept. at the Maryland Hotel in possession of a small arsenal.

For your further information an individual believed to be John Russell Moran contacted Villiam Karin at the Fairgrounds Hotel on August 4, 1935.

The above facts, as set out herein, are submitted for your information at this time, however, a complete report will be submitted within the near future in connection with the above investigation.



By letter dated 7/26/35 the Bureau sent to this office a copy of a letter received at the Bureau from John Syverson, Minot, North Dakota. Nr. Syverson in his letter advised that, on July 16, 1935 he saw ALVIN KARPIS on the streets of Minot. Mr. Syverson requested this Bureau not to disclose to local officials, the fact that he had given this information to this Bureau.

At Minot, N. D. John Syverson, President Cafe, Minot, N. D. stated that about 12:00 noon July 16, 1935 he saw a man walking West on First St. between Main street and First Avenue Southwest; that he is familiar enough with people in Minot to tell whether a person comes to Minot often; that he had not seen that person in Minot before; that he only saw that person once in Minot; and that the following is the way he would describe the person whom he saw:

Syverson stated that he had read the description of KARPIS there but that he let that influence him as little as possible in giving the above description.

Syverson stated that he had kept a sharp look-out for KARPIS since the time he saw the picture but that he had not seen him around since; that he, Syverson, had been out around the golf course watching people play as he saw in the description that KARPIS was a pretty good golfer or liked to play golf.

Syverson has lived in Minot, North Dakota for a little over seven years. He operated a sandwich shop for the first five years and has been operating a beer parlor since that time, He appeared to be fairly reliable.

William P. Brand on the General Delivery window at the Post Office advised that he is positive he delivered no mail to subject under name or any of aliases and that no forwarding address was left there.

Deputy Sheriff Lee advised that they had not seen or heard of KARPIS but that a sharp watch would be kept for him.

Syverson had no idea where the person he saw came from or where he went and could give Agent no idea as to the place he might have stayed while in Minot. There are any number of places in Minot where one could put up temporarily or permanently. Some of these places are not licensed and do not keep registers of persons staying there. The registers of the hotels and most likely "spots", where KARPIS would have stayed were personally checked for a period ranging from July 10, 1935 to date. No evidence of his having stopped there was found.



The Secretary of State presents his compliments to the Honorable the Attorney General and refers further to the latter's communication of May 27, 1935, concerning the desire of the Bureau of Investigation of the Department of Justice to obtain from Germany information in regard to an automatic pistol that has been recovered from a person taken into custody in connection with a kidnaping case.

The Secretary of State now transmits herewith in the above connection a copy of a despatch received from the American Consul at Leipzig, Germany, setting forth the action that has been taken by him in the matter and the results of such action.




Sir:

I have the honor to refer to Department's written instruction of June 5, 1935, transmitting copy of a letter received from the Attorney General, dated May 27, 1935, concerning the desire of the Bureau of Investigation of the Department of Justice to obtain information relative to an automatic pistol of 6.35 millimeter calibre, bearing serial number 140007 and reflecting the manufacturer's name, which appears to be the Deutsche Werke, A.G., Erfurt, Germany. It appears that this pistol has been recovered from a person taken into custody in connection with a kidnaping case in the United States. In accordance with the request of the Attorney General, the Consulate is directed to endeavor to obtain from the Deutsche Werke A.G., Erfurt, pertinent data that may assist in tracing the pistol into the possession of the person from whom it was taken.

Immediately upon receipt of the Department's instruction. I took up the matter with the Belleviel ...
sources of information in Erfurt and ascertained that the

Deutsche Werke A.G., which formerly manufactured pistols and other weapons, no longer existed there. I then took up the matter with the District Court (Amtsgericht) at Erfurt, which, at my request, sent the files of the AEG Deutsche Werke, Aktiengesellschaft (which was a subsidiary of the Allgemeine Elektrizitaets-Gesellschaft at Berlin, Germany), to the District Court (Amtsgericht) at Leipzig, where the files could be examined by a representative of the Consulate.

Upon examination of the said Court files, no information could be ascertained regarding the disposition of the pistol in question, which is supposed to have been manufactured by the Deutsche Werke A.G. at Erfurt. However, it appeared from the Court files that the AEG Deutsche Werke, Aktiengesellschaft, Erfurt, was also engaged in the manufacture of typewriters; that in January, 1930, this Company changed its name to "Europa-Schreibmaschinen A.G." having its main office at Friedrichstrasse 110-12, Berlin N. 24, and maintaining a sub-factory at Mainzer Hofplatz 13 in Erfurt. It could not be ascertained from the said files whether or not the latter firm was also engaged in the manufacture of pistols. Furthermore, a careful investigation revealed no trace of a pistol manufacturer in Erfurt having a name similar to "Deutsche Werke, A.G. .

The Consulate then wrote to the Europa-Schreibmaschinen A.G., Erfurt, and received from the Industrieanlagen G.m.b.H., Eurfuerstendamm 237, Berlin W 50, a letter dated July 6, 1935, of which the following is a translation:-

"The

"The Europa-Schreibmaschinen A.G., Erfurt, a considerable time ago purchased from us, as proprietary legal successor of the Deutsche Werke A.G., Berlin, a part of the Works in Erfurt owned by us. The Europa-Schreibmaschinen A.G., Erfurt, sent to us your inquiry of July 3 with the request to make a reply direct to you. From the records in our possession we have ascertained that the pistol described by you was shipped from the works in Erfurt on August 8, 1922. To our regret, however, it could not be ascertained to whom this pistol had been shipped at that time."

According to the foregoing it appears that it is impossible to ascertain from the records of the companies mentioned above into whose hands the pistol in question passed after it left the works in Erfurt.

According to the letter received by this Consulate from the Industrieanlagen G.m.b.H. at Berlin, it appears that while the records disclose the date the pistol in question left the works at Erfurt, they do not show the name and address of the consignee. As this seems somewhat strange, I have forwarded the consular files in this case to the American Consul General at Berlin with the suggestion that he make inquiries at the principal office of the Industrieanlagen G.m.b.H. for the purpose of ascertaining, if possible, whether there are any other records in existence which might disclose the name and address of the consignee of the shipment containing the pistol in question.


