Reference is made to the letter addressed to you
by the Cleveland Office under date of Oct. 23, 1935, referring
to certain information concerning a contact of ALVIN KARPIS
in Europe.

It is noted in this letter that Clarence Heber-
brand, William Mitchell, and William Fergus of Cleveland, Ohio,
are presently reported to be somewhere in Europe. The suggestion
is made in the event it has not already been done, that inquiry
be made of the State Department in Washington, D. C. in an
effort to ascertain to what point in Europe these individuals
may have proceeded.

It is further suggested that perhaps if it is deter-
mined what time these individuals will return to the United
States from Europe, an investigation at the point of disembarka-
tion might result in determining exactly what points these indivi-
duals visited in Europe, other than shown by the records of the
State Department, as no doubt their passports will be examined
by the immigration officials, and might possibly bear endorse-
ments showing the itinerary of these individuals in Europe. It
is not known whether this is done on passports, but it is believed
that inquiry should be made concerning same.

Badaracco in order to determine whether he is a contact of
William Elmer Meade. The report of Special Agent William J.
McNulty, New York, N.Y. dated October 3, 1935, requests
discreet interviews with Herbert Callahan, attorney, and
Frankie Duris, Westminister Hotel, both of Boston, Mass.,
with a view to securing data concerning Thomas O'Dell, a
close associate of William Elmer Meade, which might be
helpful in locating the latter individual. This report
also requests appropriate inquiries at the home of Edward
O'Dell of Lowell, Massachusetts in an effort to learn the
location of Thomas O'Dell, his brother, which might lead
to the apprehension of Meade.

It is desired that the above investigation be
given immediate attention and that your office submit
reports in this case at least twice monthly.

Apparently, I gave you to understand that a similar proceeding had been instigated by another field office of this Bureau. However, to my knowledge I know of no petition or Court Order requesting the Marshal to dispose of the car at Public Sales in a case of this nature.

On September 26th, 1935, Constable Frank Reavely, Ridgeway, Ontario, Canada, stated that a man's body had been washed on the shores of Crystal Beach, Ontario from Lake Erie; that the hands and feet were missing; that no clothes were on the body; that no hair was present; that his height appeared to be five feet eight inches to eight and one-half inches; that the weight would be between one hundred fifty to one hundred sixty pounds; thick chested; well shaped head rounded at the back with a receding forehead; jaws broad.

Constable Reavely further stated that there was quite a bit of fat present; that there was a cut on the right side of the abdomen giving the appearance of a wound or appendectomy; that the eyes were gone; that the body was decomposed so badly that the only identification which could be reliable would be the dental work, which was carefully checked by Dr. G. E. Teal, Ridgeway, Ontario, Canada.

Dr. G. E. Teal stated that a report of dental survey showed:

of the opinion that this unusual dental work would
be the best characteristic by which the body may
be identified.

Upper left second molar Mesial-Occlusal Amalgam filling
Lower right first and second Molars extracted
Lower right second Bicuspid Occlusal filling - Amalgam
Lower left first and second Molars extracted
Lower left third Molar Occlusal Amalgam filling and
small Buccal Amalgam filling
Apparently, lower right Cuspid area over-shot and there
is a possibility that the entire lower are protruded
Remainder of lower teeth were apparently in place but
are now missing

Dr. Teal further stated that he was of the opinion
that the hands and feet had been fastened with some brittle substance
such as wire, and, as the body began to decompose, the swelling of
tissue around the fastened part of the hands and feet forced the
joint to be severed; that, due to the weight of the head, it is usually
the first part to leave the body; that, while the body was decomposed
to some extent, he could not otherwise explain the hands and feet be-
ing missing.

Dr. G. R. Stewart, Ridgeway, Ontario, Canada, who made
an examination of the body, stated that the length of the Tibia was
fifteen inches; that the length of the Fibula was fifteen and one-
half inches; that the length of the Radius was nine and three-fourths
inches; that the estimated length of the body was five feet eight
to eight and one-half inches; that the length of the body from top
of head to ankle was five feet six and one-half inches; that he had
been dead at least four months and possibly a year; that the split,
open on right side of abdomen resembling an appendectomy, was the only
indication of external violence.

Dr. Stewart further stated that it was rather unusual
that the hands and feet would be missing in that decomposition is more
irregular and usually one entire side of the body decomposes first;
that the chest is the portion of the body which is more susceptible
to decomposition; that the head is usually the part to leave the body
first due to its weight; that it was highly possible that the feet and

hands of this man were tied to some weight and it was not until decomposition, assisted by the force of the water down the stream, that resulted in the loosening of the body from the weight and thus permitting the corpse to float; that, owing to the flow of Lake Erie, the body would have had to have floated West of Crystal Beach where it was found.

Roy Boughner, Undertaker, Ridgeway, Ontario, Canada, stated that the only possible means of identification would be the teeth as the body was in such a bad shape when received by him that he buried it at Ridgeway without an examination or preparation.

The teeth, which were extracted, are being forwarded to the Chicago office under separate cover, and it is desired that they be returned to the Buffalo office when they have served their purpose.

As Dr. W. C. Steele is a dentist and a friend of Moran, whom Moran asked to occupy adjoining offices in Chicago, Illinois, it is believed that Dr. Steele could furnish information as to whether or not these teeth were those of Dr. Joseph P. Moran, (see report of Special Agent K. R. McIntire, Chicago, Illinois, dated July 3rd, 1934, and the report of Special Agent F. C. Tillman, Chicago, Illinois, dated March 22nd, 1935, page 19).

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

Re: Death of Dr. Joseph
P. Moran.

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You will recall that the Bureau has been advised on numerous occasions of the death of Dr. Joseph P. Moran, the advice being, in effect, that he was murdered and his body thrown in Lake Erie.

The Bureau is in receipt of a copy of a letter from the Buffalo Office to the Chicago Office dated November 1, 1935, advising that on September 26, 1935, the body of an unidentified man was washed upon the shores at Crystal Beach, Ontario, Canada from Lake Erie. In the belief that this may be the body of Dr. Moran, Agents have obtained the teeth from this body and forwarded the same to the Chicago Office, requesting investigation through dentists who were known to Dr. Moran. This body was badly decomposed, the hands and feet being missing. A very complete description of the teeth has been obtained and it is believed that if this body is identical with that of Dr. Joseph P. Moran, it will be a rather simple matter to make an identification through the teeth.

DETAILS:

Assistant to the Attorney General, that he had certain information to the effect that ALVIN KARPIS is in hiding in Mexico. It was requested that [redacted] be interviewed with reference to this information.

[redacted] recently under investigation as an applicant for a departmental position, was interviewed at his office, [redacted] and he advised that in August of 1935, RICHARD E. DALTON, also known as DICK DALTON, of the old DALTON and JESSE JAMES gang, was telling him of some of his old experiences during his earlier life, and also advised him that he had spent several years in a penitentiary at one time.

[redacted] stated that he mentioned to DALTON that he, DALTON, should have some valuable information about some of the famous criminals of today, and DALTON answered that he did. [redacted] advised that at that point he asked DALTON if he knew where ALVIN KARPIS was, and DALTON at once stated, "Yes, he is in Mexico". [redacted] stated that he was afraid to go further with DALTON in this matter as to the location of ALVIN KARPIS.

[redacted] stated that DALTON was in New York at the time trying to sell some stock in an oil well, and he understood that DALTON came from some town in Mississippi but he did not know the name of the town. However, he recalled that DALTON was staying at the Great Northern Hotel on 57th Street while in New York City, and that DALTON told him that when he left New York City, he was going to Saratoga Springs to see Col. BRADLEY for a few days before returning South; that DALTON advised him that his (DALTON'S) wife was a cousin of the late Senator HUEY LONG.

[redacted] gave the following description of DALTON:

Age:	64 yrs.
Height:	6'
Weight:	225 lbs.
Face:	Full

[redacted] was unable to give any further information as to the location of KARPIS or where to get in touch with Mr. DALTON.

He advised that he wished that his name not be mentioned in this matter, and that it be kept absolutely confidential. [REDACTED] is of the opinion that DALTON would not be willing to give the Government any information, and that it would be difficult to get any information out of him, as he stated to him [REDACTED] that he was not a "cop" and would not furnish any information to "cops".

Mr. TIERMAN, Assistant Manager of the Great Northern Hotel, 118 West 57th Street, New York City, advised that the records of that hotel reflect that R. C. DALTON or R. E. DALTON registered at that hotel with his wife on July 21, 1935, and checked out on August 7, 1935; that DALTON and his wife were again registered at the hotel from August 17th to August 20th, 1935; that DALTON returned to the hotel with his wife on August 27th and remained until August 30th, 1935, when he checked out and has not returned. DALTON did not leave a forwarding address at the time he checked out. On each occasion DALTON registered at this hotel, he gave the name of Meridian, Mississippi as his home.

Mr. TIERMAN stated that from conversation with DALTON, he understood DALTON was in New York City trying to sell some kind of oil stock. When DALTON checked out of the hotel on August 30, 1935, he understood that DALTON was going up to Saratoga Springs, New York, for a few days. Mr. TIERMAN stated that DALTON was known around the hotel as Col. DALTON.

In the report of reference of Special Agent R. B. Donaldson, Jacksonville, Florida, dated October 14, 1935, request was made to trace certain guns which were found in the possession of WILLIAM WEAVER at the time of his apprehension at Allendale, Florida, on September 1, 1935.

On October 22, 1935, a letter was directed to the Colts Patent Firearms Manufacturing Company at Hartford, Conn., requesting information pertaining to the disposition of these guns.

Under date of October 23, 1935, this company advised that the .380 Colt automatic pistol #113038 had been shipped to the Brown-Camp Hardware Company of Des Moines, Iowa, on February 8, 1932; that the .380 Colt automatic pistol #112352 had been shipped to the Schaw-Batcher Company of Sacramento, California, on January 26, 1932, and that the .45 calibre Colt automatic pistol #345132 had been purchased by the U. S. Government and shipped to the Bush Terminal, Brooklyn, New York, on June 25, 1918.

By telephone it was ascertained from CLYDE WHITLATCH, Assistant in the Ordnance Officer's Office, Second Area, Governors Island, New York City, Telephone: Whitehall 4-8010, that guns shipped to the Bush Terminal in 1918 were for the War Department, and that his office at the present time did not have any records of these guns; that the only place to get such information, would be from the War Department.

On October 22, 1935, a letter was directed to the Winchester Repeating Arms Company at New Haven, Conn., requesting information from that company with reference to a Winchester shotgun model 42, Serial #3489.

Under date of October 25, 1935, the Winchester Repeating Arms Company advised by letter that Winchester slide action 410 gauge pump shotgun, model 42, Serial #3489 had been sold on June 29, 1933 to the Luthe Hardware Company, Des Moines, Iowa.

Mrs. SADIE WOLF, 1570 President Street, Brooklyn, New York, advised that during the summer months she operates the Greenland House at 60 Franklin Street, Saratoga Springs, New York; that she has probably 40 guests in her house at one time, and during the course of the summer had over 200 guests; that she is unable to tell where all her guests come from or what work they do. She advised that she does not recall any of her guests as having operated a concession at Riley's.

However, she stated that Mr. LEWIS BRAY, who lived at her house during the past summer, operated a hat checking concession at Jack's Night Club on Columbus Street, Saratoga Springs, New York; that this is a club solely for colored people. She recalled that some other man lived at her house for a short time who worked for the Chicago Club on Woodlawn Avenue, for a few days, but she was unable to recall his name.

Mrs. WOLF was questioned about having heard any remarks concerning KARPIS' presence in Saratoga Springs last summer, and whether or not some persons at her house tipped KARPIS off that officers were in Saratoga Springs looking for him. She advised that several newspaper stories came out to the effect that KARPIS was in Saratoga Springs, and that it was common gossip around her house, as well as elsewhere in Saratoga Springs, that the #1 Public Enemy had been in that vicinity.

She further recalled the fact that during a conversation one evening with Mr. BRAY in the presence of other guests, Mr. BRAY made the remark that KARPIS had been living in Saratoga Springs and had gotten away from the officers looking for him, but that she believed merely that Mr. BRAY had been reading the newspapers and made the remark during the course of conversation, as she and he were at that time talking about some deputy sheriff in Saratoga Springs who had that day embarrassed her at the railroad station, and that BRAY had stated to her that if the officers paid more attention to catching criminals than embarrassing respectable women, they would get better results.

Mrs. WOLF stated that all information in the possession of Mr. BRAY had been obtained from newspaper stories, and that he did not have any facts as to the whereabouts of KARPIS and knew nothing about tipping KARPIS off if KARPIS really had been in Saratoga Springs. She stated that if anyone in her house tipped KARPIS off, she never heard anything about it. Mrs. WOLF was unable to furnish Mr. BRAY'S address, stating that she only knew he came from New York City, and that he seemed to be a very respectable man. Mrs. WOLF seemed very anxious to furnish any information she had, and stated that if she ever received any information concerning KARPIS' whereabouts, she would at once notify the New York Bureau Office and have him arrested as she considers this the duty of every law-abiding citizen.

Mr. NEISTEIN, who operates a hardware store at 4523 Avenue D, which is not far from 810 East 8th Street, Brooklyn, New York, was interviewed under a suitable pretext, and advised that a Mr. HARRY SHEFFRON, a plumber, had lived at 810 East 8th Street for several years; that Mr. SAMUEL COOPER, a son-in-law of Mr. SHEFFRON, has lived at this address for the past several months; that Mr. SHEFFRON also has another son-in-law who lives with him; that one of the sons-in-law works for a steamship company, and that the other is with a vacuum cleaner company, but he was not certain whether Mr. COOPER was the one with the vacuum cleaner company or not; however, it was his opinion that that was Mr. COOPER'S business. He stated that S. H. Vacuum Cleaner Company, of 1314 Flatbush Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, was the name of the company, and that Mr. SHEFFRON owned a one-half interest with whichever son-in-law aided in conducting his business.

Vacuum Cleaner Company, Brooklyn, New York; that COOPER goes to work regularly every morning and returns home every evening.

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TAMM

Re: BREMER AND WEYERHAEUSER KIDNAPING
CASES

At about 4:15 P. M. on November 1, 1935, Thomas F. Kinder appeared in this office. He stated that he is living at the Gospel Mission Home on 5th Street and that he receives his mail at 1410 Eye Street, N. W., Washington, D. C.

Kinder advised me that Alvin Karpis and Harry Campbell are now in a district in Cleveland, Ohio, known as "Roaring Third", which is reported to be an old red light district in Cleveland. He stated that this Bureau would never catch them alive and that "Karpis is the bird to watch out for". He stated that he had just returned from New Mexico, Texas, and Colorado, but was unable to inform as to any information he had obtained out there with regard to the Bremer case. He was questioned closely as to the source of his information regarding Karpis. He stated that in Columbus, Ohio, he had recently talked with an unknown stranger who said he thought Karpis was in Cleveland. He could give no explanation for having conversed with this stranger concerning Karpis, except that it was merely a casual conversation. He was unable to furnish anything more definite on the subject.

Kinder further stated that the Bureau would find Mahan in the vicinity of Sonora, Arizona. He explained that some months ago while visiting in the southwestern portion of the United States, he was walking on a road between Tucson and Sonora; that a man on foot caught up with him, and that this man, without any provocation, pulled a gun and said, "Keep your head to the front you _____ or I'll blow your head off". Kinder stated that this man was positively Mahan. He gave the following description of this person: Age 25; height, 5' 9"; weight, 140; build, slender; hair, black; dress, blue shirt and overalls; wore glasses; appearance, acted as though he were half-starved. Kinder could give no explanation for

the peculiar conduct of this stranger in holding him up with a gun when he, Kinder, was completely unknown to the stranger. He explained that "Mahan" was carrying a small box in which there were certain metal objects; that he kept ahead of "Mahan" and walked faster than "Mahan" did, and that after he failed to hear the clinking of the metal objects in the box, he looked around and found that he was no longer being trailed.

Kinder stated that he had seen numerous photographs of Mahan, Karpis and Campbell; that he never forgot a face, and that if I would show him several photographs, he would select the photographs of Mahan, Karpis and Campbell. Accordingly, I chose five photographs, cutting off all identifying data. I chose the photograph of Joseph Burns, several views of Harry Campbell, and the photographs of Lawrence H. Barton, Alvin Karpis and Mahan. He studied the photographs very carefully and selected the photograph of Campbell as that of Mahan, positively identifying him as Mahan. I explained to Kinder that he had chosen a photograph other than that of Mahan. He looked at me in a quizzical fashion and stated, "Yes sir, and I didn't show you the photograph of Karpis, either". I then gave him the photograph once more to look at and he chose the photograph of Mahan as being identical with that of Karpis.

It is very apparent that this individual knows nothing concerning the Bremer and Meyerhouser cases, and appears to have a detective complex. I told him that if there was any further information which the Bureau desired to obtain from him, the Bureau would get in touch with him at the above mentioned address.

It did not appear to me that Kinder was well balanced mentally. He stated that he is now the subject of a blackmail plot, although he advised that he has no money and lives on a small pension paid to him by the Government. He also informed that wherever he goes, he is taken by everyone to be a secret service agent.

Kinder stated that if I wanted to know anything about him, all I would have to do would be to talk with Mr. Clyde Tolson. A memorandum from Mr. Clyde Tolson, contained in Bureau File No. 17-4129, reflects that an investigation of this man in 1932, indicated he was violently insane.



Reference is made to your letter dated September 9, 1935, containing a request to interview Henry Randall alias Duke Randall and Gregory I. Codomo, for the purpose of ascertaining the desired disposition of the automobiles obtained from them last winter in Florida, in connection with the above entitled case.

You are advised that when Special Agent W. D. Wills of this office interviewed Henry Randall he requested that the Ford Coupe obtained from him, be turned over to him at Newark, New Jersey, and at the time that the car is returned, Randall stated he would give a receipt for the same. He further advised Agent Wills that at the time the car was obtained by the Bureau, he turned over all papers relative to his ownership thereof. The permanent address of Randall is Room 18, Hotel Grant, 882 Broad Street, Newark, New Jersey.

Gregory I. Codomo, 173 Newark Street, Newark, New Jersey, advised Agent Wills that the Ford Sedan obtained from him last winter does not belong to him, that Randall had requested him to leave the car on the parking lot used by his (Codomo's) employer, Ben Siper. Codomo further stated that inasmuch as he does not own the Ford Sedan involved in the instant case, he does not desire the same returned to him, and that as far as he is concerned, the Bureau can dispose of the automobile in whatever manner it deems advisable.

Henry Randall also informed Agent Wills that just prior to the time Alvin Karpis, Harry Campbell, Dolores Delaney and Winona Burdette left Florida, Karpis told him that the girls were going to Atlantic City by train because Dolores was not able to travel by automobile, and that

The two girls then turned over to Randall the automobile keys and Certificate of Title. Some time later Randall requested Codomo to place the automobile in a parking lot used by Codomo's employer, Ben Sipore, and at the time the automobile was turned over to the Bureau it was located in this lot. Randall further stated that so far as he knows the Ford Sedan was owned by Harry Campbell and that he has no interest in it.

CHARACTER OF CASE: Kidnaping; Harboring; Obstruction of Justice; National Firearms Act.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS: Reports that Karpis and Campbell are frequenting points in Oklahoma seem to have no logical foundation as no definite information is obtained that either are in or have been in Oklahoma for some time. Several confidential informants interviewed but no definite information obtained except negative information. One confidential informant, who was considered reliable, now in jail in Kansas.

REFERENCE: Report of Special Agent Paul Hansen, Oklahoma City, dated 9-7-35; Bureau letter dated 10-7-35; letter from Oklahoma City Office to Bureau dated 10-17-35.

DETAILS: The letter of reference to the Bureau, dated October 17, 1935, discusses a plan by the Sheriff's Office at Tulsa, Oklahoma to place a telephone tap on the telephone of Mabel Crabtree, 3221 South Peoria Street, Tulsa, telephone number 4-3574. No further action has been taken regarding this matter, as it is believed that the Sheriff's Office at Tulsa hopes to obtain more information regarding some other case or matter they are interested in than the instant case. Sheriff Marrs, as well as Deputy Sheriff Tony Benson, has been contacted several times by the writer since the writing of the above-mentioned letter, and they have no further information or no more definite information to offer than is set out in this letter, copies of which were furnished to all interested offices. In spite of the fact that Benson advised this Agent that if the Bureau did not place this telephone tap he would do it personally, it has not been done, to date, and Sheriff Marrs stated to the writer that he had not been able to secure the consent of the telephone company at Tulsa, but believed that the Bureau would be able to do this. This Agent has endeavored before to interview Mabel Crabtree and her estranged spouse, Tommy Crabtree, but without success. They will be confidentially contacted in the near future by this Agent, as well as Morris Crabtree, for what information they have regarding the location of Karpis and Campbell.

Regarding the information set out in the above-mentioned letter concerning a plan to obtain money and bonds from a safe in the home of F. G. Vogel, Tulsa, Oklahoma, since the writing of this letter, this Agent, in conjunction with Joe Anderson's informant in this matter, who is in Ray, Oklahoma, about twenty or twenty-five miles east of South Coffeyville, Oklahoma, and is employed presently as a sort of administrative bookkeeper for the area having charge of thirteen counties in the northern part of Oklahoma. He is personally acquainted with Tom Hill, Al Sherwood, Les and Charlie McCarty, and other characters of South Coffeyville, Oklahoma, he having served as a sergeant in World War with most of these people. He has been friendly with them since the war and has made bond for several of them from time to time. He obtained information regarding this alleged plan to furnish Vogel or his wife until they were told where the safe containing the money and bonds was located, from Al Sherwood and this job was supposed to have been pulled by Sherwood, Tom Hill, Sam Coker, who has recently been released from the Oklahoma State Prison, and another individual whom the informant believes was to be Harry Campbell. After discussing this information with Ray, it was apparent to this Agent that the plan of having Harry Campbell participate in this job was mostly imaginative, as Ray admitted that he had no definite information to the effect that Campbell was to participate in this, but assumed that he was, inasmuch as Campbell is known to be "the best knob-knocker in this part of the country", and due to the fact that some characters in South Coffeyville had recently mentioned Campbell's name in a way that Ray believed they had had some recent contact with him. The most definite reason that Ray could give for the fact that Campbell has recently been in this part of the country is a statement a "dope-head", who hangs around Tom Hill, whose name he does not know, had made when he heard of the arrest of Tom Carpenter at Neosho, Missouri -- "Harry said Tommy would spill his guts when he was arrested."

This Agent, with Paul Signs, Assistant United States Attorney, at Tulsa, Oklahoma, talked with F. G. Vogel and endeavored to make an arrangement whereby officers could go into his home and wait for these criminals to come there in accordance with the alleged plan as reported above, but Vogel refused to allow this plan to be carried out, in indefinite terms. He stated that he was able to take care of himself and that he has a hired man who "sleeps outside and has a sawed-off shotgun and two six-shooters and can shoot plenty straight", and that he is "not going to have any strangers in my house after nine o'clock at night". He is an eccentric individual and set in his ways. As it is impossible to maintain an effective surveillance of this home from any other point, the plan was dropped for the time being and Joe Anderson stated that he was going to cause the arrest of Al Sherwood and probably Tom Hill in the very near future.

In this connection, it is felt definitely certain that Sam Coker, mentioned above, is personally acquainted with Harry Campbell and it is possible that he may have some connection with him now that he has been released from the penitentiary. Mr. Ray was requested to interview Coker, who apparently seems to be avoiding officers at the present time, for what information he has concerning the location of Campbell, and will advise this Agent on some future date.

[redacted] previously mentioned in reports by this Agent as a confidential informant at South Coffeyville, Oklahoma, was interviewed and advised that he had no other information than was disclosed at the time of his last interview by this Agent. [redacted] said that Harry Campbell did not know Tom Hill implicitly and that he has some doubts of Campbell contacting him as he comes to this part of the country. He believes, however, that he will contact this informant if he spends any time in Oklahoma or if he even drives through South Coffeyville, and this sounds entirely possible in view of the information furnished on a previous occasion by this informant to the effect that Campbell has stopped [redacted] as he was passing through South Coffeyville.

Pearl Stanley, who lives on a farm about six miles east of South Coffeyville, Oklahoma, and just inside of the line in Oklahoma, in a large two-story red brick house, has been known to harbor and protect members of the Barker mob. It is not known whether she knows Harry Campbell, but it is quite possible that she is acquainted with Karpis. Two different attempts have been made to interview her but due to heavy rains, it was not possible to get to her house. She will be interviewed in the near future by this Agent regarding what information she has or any help that she can give to locate Campbell and Karpis.

[redacted] South Coffeyville, Oklahoma, was interviewed again and advised that he had received no information regarding Karpis or Campbell. He manifested a willingness to continue to cooperate with this Agent and stated in a definite way that he is still of the same opinion regarding his willingness to put Karpis and Campbell on the spot if he is able to and will immediately communicate with the writer or with Gene Haverfield, Deputy Sheriff at Muratt, Oklahoma, if he receives any information of value. While talking with [redacted] generally about this matter, he mentioned "this boy", whom he has mentioned previously, and when asked who he referred to he said "this Letts boy". When asked where this boy is at the present time, [redacted] that he is in Wichita, Kansas with his brother, working for some second-hand furniture store as a repair man or upholsterer, [redacted] that he did not know exactly where this boy is living or the name of the store that he is working for. As stated before in reports of this Agent, it is felt definitely certain that this boy, whose first name is Milt or Milton, is the man who arranged with Campbell to meet Wynona Burdette at Ponca City late last year, and it is possible that he may be of some help in this case. Through inquiry of the Postmaster at South Coffeyville, Oklahoma and Coffeyville, Kansas, it was ascertained that the Letts family live on Route 2, out of Wann, Oklahoma. John R. Hendrickson, who is the mail carrier serving Route 2 out of Wann, was interviewed and stated that he has no definite information as to the address of Milt Letts but he believes that he is in Wichita, Kansas, probably living with a sister, whose name Hendrickson does not recall. Hendrickson will keep a watch on the mail going from, and which is received at the Letts farm, and believes that he will, in the near future, be able to obtain the address of Milt's sister in Wichita, or of where Milt and his brother are living and will immediately advise the writer. If this information is not received in the near future, Milt's mother will be interviewed regarding the matter.

Mr. J. D. Engle, Deputy Sheriff at Bartlesville, Oklahoma, directed a letter to the Oklahoma City Office which was dated October 21, 1935, and stated that he had some information that Harry Campbell hangs out quite often at the Ira Breckery farm, near Gilson, Oklahoma. The information is that Campbell is a loper-head and that several ropes hang around this place. Engle was interviewed by the writer and stated that his information came to him by a girl by the name of Gladie Carey, alias Jack Carey, who is employed as a domestic by Mrs. Butler, who is the manager of the operator of the Butler Drug Store at Gilson, Oklahoma. This girl, Engle says, goes to visit every Bible at the Lansing Prison in Kansas about once each month and stops to see him at Bartlesville on each of her visits. She advised Engle of Harry Campbell endeavoring to force her and Mrs. Butler to give him a ride to Oklahoma City upon one occasion when he was occupying the role of hitch-hiker near Gilson. Engle asked this Carey woman about the description of Campbell and was advised that he is a large man and will weigh 180 pounds and is probably 8' tall. It is felt that this information is entirely unreliable, and no further inquiries will be made along this line. After discussing this matter with the writer and being advised of the description of Campbell, Mr. Engle is also of the opinion that the information given him by this Carey woman is unreliable.

Oklahoma, mentioned previously as a confidential informant in this case, was interviewed and advised that he had no information regarding the activities of Karpis or Campbell. He expressed a willingness to continue to cooperate with the writer and will furnish any information he receives.

Mrs. Louis Webb, Tulsa, Oklahoma, was again interviewed and advised that she had received no information concerning Campbell or Karpis since the last interview.

With reference to the letter from the Bureau to the Oklahoma City Office dated September 16, 1935, numerous efforts were made to contact the informant at Tulsa, Oklahoma to endeavor to ascertain from his photographs if William Joseph O'Keefe is the same person as the "Stuttering Kid" mentioned by this informant in the report of this Agent dated September 9, 1935. He will be interviewed in the near future regarding this angle.

Melvin Brooks, previously mentioned as an informant in this case at Tulsa, Oklahoma has been arrested by operatives of the Kansas State Highway Patrol and is presently in the county jail at Sedan, Kansas, having plead guilty with Tom Carpenter there to complicity with Harry Campbell in a jewelry robbery. He has not been sentenced as it is the plan of the prosecuting attorney to use his testimony with that of Tom Carpenter to convict Tom Hill in some cases which it is felt Hill was implicated in with Harry Campbell, and these men some two or three years ago.

On October 25, 1935, the Miami Daily-News Record, of Miami, Oklahoma, carried a story concerning some man who is alleged to have endeavored to make some contact with a doctor in Miami to have his wounds treated, apparently gunshot wounds, and it was intimated in this article that it was being talked on the streets in Miami that this wounded man might be Karpis.

This article was written by Walter Jones, a reporter on this paper, who has written several other articles at different times mentioning the name of Karpis, when the information did not point to Karpis in any respect. Chief of Police Walter L. Young and two of his officers, Roy Dennis and L. E. Ellis, as well as Sheriff Eli Dry and his two deputies, Beason and Holsinger, were interviewed by Agents L. E. Kingman and the writer, and none of these officers had received any information whatever to the effect that this wounded man was thought to be Karpis. Chief Young advised that he received a call from some unknown person to the effect that two men, in a Chrysler automobile had driven up to a certain unknown filling station in the south part of Miami and inquired for a doctor; that one of the men had a lot of blood on him and that they had been directed to Doctor DeFarr's office, who is a reputable doctor in Miami and has his office in his residence in the 200 block East F Street, S. W., in Miami. This car apparently went to the DeFarr residence but as neither Doctor DeFarr nor any of his family were home at this time, they did not get any treatment and Doctor DeFarr advised Chief Young that if any man who is wounded calls for treatment, the Chief will be immediately notified.

Information was also received to the effect that Jack Painter and Leaman Keith, filling station operators at the Eagle Service Station in Afton, Oklahoma had seen this same car. These Agents interviewed Painter and Keith at Afton and they each advised that there were two men in a Chrysler Sedan, the model of which they did not know; that one man was sitting in the rear seat and the man who was driving asked if there was a good doctor in Afton, and when advised that there was only one doctor there, they asked about his address. Painter stated that he had consulted this doctor since then but had been advised by the doctor that no one had called to see him for treatment of any wounds. Painter and Keith were shown the pictures of several members of the Barker-Karpis mob and stated definitely that these two men were not any of the men whose pictures were shown them. When shown the picture of Karpis, they stated definitely that neither of these men could have been Karpis. They described these men much larger than either Karpis or Umbrell is.

On the night of October 24, 1935, the Silver Fox Night Club near Tipton Ford, Missouri, between Neosho and Joplin, Missouri, was burned and a watchman there, according to press reports, engaged in a gun battle with three men who, he says, were driving an Auburn car. It is felt by the Chief of Police at Miami, that as press reports indicated that probably one of these men was wounded by the night watchman, it is possible that the people who inquired for a doctor's aid at Miami could have been these men.

with reference to the letter from the Bureau dated October 9, 1935, regarding information which was furnished the Bureau by Doctor Fred B.

Sparks, a dentist at Ponca City, Oklahoma regarding one Wayne Harris, whom he believed to resemble Alvin Karpis. The writer contacted Doctor Sparks in his office at 415 Community Building, Ponca City, and no further information was obtained than is set out in Doctor Sparks' letter mentioned in the above letter. Wayne Harris, who is supposed to be a cook at the CCC Camp near Ponca City, Oklahoma, is still employed there and according to information furnished by Lieutenant S. L. Wade of this camp, Harris has been so employed at this same camp for about fourteen months. The fingerprints of Harris were on file and they were compared with the fingerprints of Karpis and there are no similarities whatever. Due to the definite information obtained regarding Harris, which points to the fact that he could not possibly be Karpis, he was not interviewed.

UNDEVELOPED LEADS:

THE OKLAHOMA CITY OFFICE will continue the investigation in this case by endeavoring to obtain information regarding the location of Karpis and Campbell and other subjects in this case, in Oklahoma, especially in the vicinity of Tulsa.

For the week ending November 2, 1935 there have been no developments in the set-up at Toledo, Ohio. The Chicago Office, however, has arranged for a plant and a surveillance of the home of John Karpavicz in Chicago. Special Agent L. G. Turrou has been sent to Chicago from New York to sit on a telephone tap on the telephone of the Karpavicz family in view of the fact that most of the conversations are held in either the Russian or Lithuanian language.

Information obtained indicates that Karpis will make every effort to see his child and will also attempt to send money to his parents for the proper care of the child.

It has also been shown that John Karpavicz has in his possession considerably more money than one receiving \$60 a month should appropriately have. It is believed that he is being furnished with funds by subject Alvin Karpis.

For the above mentioned reasons the plant and surveillance are considered desirable at this time.

Dearest Elmer:

Your usual Sunday letter, ol' dear, how are you getting along? I suppose you are outside this afternoon. I hope so anyway. It is a gloomy Sunday here, it is so damp and dark. Nick is a lot worse today and so the Doctor is going to take him to see a specialist tomorrow, but I doubt very much if anything can be done to help him. Cancer is a terrible thing. Did you ever think he would get anything like that?

Even though he did drink a lot I never thought of an affliction like that. He always speaks of you and always tells me how much he thinks of you. He cannot eat anything at all and now he cannot even drink milk, so it really is terrible to watch him slowly starving to death. He is so very thin too, and is showing his age too, after all, honey, he is 70 years old. Well, anyway, I will write and tell you what the specialist has to say. My mother has not called me since the other day. Guess she has forgotten me. I called that man up who helped me get in to Fields before and so I am going to go downtown and see him tomorrow afternoon, so perhaps he will be able to help me, heres hoping anyway.

I heard from Lil the other day and Mike is in Stateville, getting along O.K. I guess, she said to say "hello" to you.

Did you see the picture of that Mike Romano (who Sam had picked out for your lawyer) in the Herald-Examiner also one of some Judge and an item telling about him going to Hollywood to be a movie star? I guess he would have been as good as the other two we had.

How is Harold getting along and also Mr. McLaughlin? I often wondered how he got along down there. Well, honey, I guess my last letter was rather blue and I sure feel blue, but, I really should get a break soon and I do hope Fields take me back, dont you? I wonder why I never hear from Sullivan or McMeekin? Perhaps Sullivan is angry with you and feels you could have helped him. You know what those people are like and that might be the reason he ignored my letter, but I will write to him again and remind him. Ann does not write to me either, but perhaps she is busy. You know I told you she was going to go into the Government service this fall so perhaps she did. Well, dearest, news is rather scarce. I do not do much of anything to tell you about. You remember Father Mills, who was the priest in Bensenville? You know too he is in Chicago now at St. Boniface Church on Noble Street. I am going over to see him tomorrow night. My aunt wants me to and arrange to have him come to visit Nick just by accident and arrange with him to give him the rites of the Church. You know Nick has not been to Church for years and if he did not see the Priest before he died he never could be buried from the Church and he was very friendly with him you know, so we think he might talk to him. I guess, Elmer dear, you really know now that Nick is pretty sick. My sister Irene just called me and was telling me she had been into the show and do you remember that Grant Kenworthy,

Irma Burwood ran around with from Bensenville? He lived at Shaw's on Pine Ave and he caddied at Mohawk, just a young kid. Well, anyway he is an actor and is appearing at the Oriental Theatre in the loop this week. Our large town produced some prominent people, huh? I really think I will close and dearest, please write to me as soon as you can and lets not argue anymore why should we? So hoping you are getting along nicely and are well and until I hear from you, which I hope will be soon, will close with lots of love

Whenever you know that something can be done in your case, you can let me know, we certainly hope that you wont have to stay there long.

I was in Chicago yesterday to do some shopping, it was cold and raining so I came back early, I dont get into Chicago very often.

Havent seen Chub since last week, he'll probably be over tomorrow, he now weighs 210 lbs. Spading the garden would be what he needs, as he has he dont eat very much, but he dont get any exercise, thats why he is so stout. We take a walk most every evening unless the weather is too bad.

Wont you need heavy clothes for the winter and an overcoat when you are outside or do they furnish them. You must have been short of money as you only had five dollars. I would'nt smoke too many cigarettes as that isn't good for you.

Can you buy good candy. I made fudge the other day, remember the fudge you used to make and sell to me, that was funny.

I'll close now and will look for your letter next weak. We are well and glad you are feeling so well. Love from both of us.

Friday morning.

Dearest Elmer:

Your letter arrived this morning, somewhat late, but I was glad to hear from you as usual. I am glad you were out working and hope you continue to get out. I thought you would be glad to hear the case had been dropped, I am too and hope he does not bring it up again, if he does I do not intend to go to Court, subpoenas or not. I guess I was a "chump" to go, it made you angry and according to reports I get, Blanche and Gifford think I am a very terrible person, but Elmer, I did go and with the idea and the promise it would help you later on but that remains to be seen. I hope it does help you, I would like to see something done for you. I do not know anything about what McMeeken and the rest of those lawyers told you. McMeeken denies it now, so I guess we will just have to wait and see what happens. I am glad you are feeling so well. I guess I told you about a job I was supposed to get on the north side. I got the job but I just could not stand it. I had to work 11 hours a day seven days a week. No time out for supper at all and absolutely no time away from the fountain at all, and no supper at all and I had to stand up all of the time, so I lasted just the one day and felt terrible when I finally was through for the day. I would have received the large sum of \$12.00 a week for that torture. I think Chicago has me licked. Elmer, you can imagine what it is like living here with my aunt, for instance I heard Albert tell her yesterday he wanted his bed back, so he must have it, that lets me out. I was pretty certain that when I borrowed that money from Sue it would help a lot but my mother spent almost all of it foolishly, you know what I mean, so that left me right back at the same place. Gee, Elmer, I wish you were here with me, I guess you were just about the only one I had. I called my mother up today and thought perhaps Jacobsons might need a waitress but was very coolly informed they did not. I guess her and Jim will fix it up again, at least all indications show it. I hope so anyway, they might as well. Irene, her and him can get along. I am sorry if you think I am singing the blues to you, I feel so blue. We had the Doctor here for Nick and he says he has cancer of the throat, thats pretty awful. He was talking about writing to you yesterday. I wrote you a letter Sunday and after I had sealed it George and Mr. Wienold came to visit Nick. (I mean George Boedebeck) and George was telling me that all of the people who were up in St Paul from Bensenville are going up there for the trial, him included and he said that it is not coming up in court until January. It was supposed to come up in November, I wonder why they changed it? From your letter Jim finally wrote to you, didnt he? I suppose he has some old bills to pay. I dont feel any resentment towards Jim. Why should I?

You know Elmer, I did not go to Court to spite him nor anything else. I hope he goes along nicely out there, so dont think I did. My mother was telling me Kahns came back from Europe a few days ago. They had a nice trip, it lasted a long time. Nice to be able to do that, oh yes Mike Connors was telling everyone out in Bensenville about a ride you and him and Ann took to Barthell right after New Years, just before you went away. He would tell that now. I called up for Lil the other day but could not reach her but left word for her to call me. I would like to hear

how Mike is getting along. She still has his car so evidently she is keeping up the payments. I did not hear from Sullivan nor McMeeken since I wrote about three weeks ago, do you think I should write to Sullivan again? When you write tell me. I would like to see you and if I can, will try to get the money together somehow. Well, ol' dear, there is not so very much more news to tell you about. My cold is better, for which I am glad. So I guess I will sign off for a few days and will try and write to you Sunday, and I will remember that letters are held up in the office when I do not hear from you on Tuesday or Wednesday. I always think that you have not written to me but honey keep on writing to me. So dearest until I hear from you which I hope will be soon will close with lots of love.

Government's cooperation in protecting him insofar as possible.

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

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS: b7D [REDACTED] has no information relative to date of return of Fergus, Mitchell and Heberbrand from Roumania. Telephone number Adams 1231 listed to New Secor Hotel, Toledo, Ohio. Brown advises A. W. Sharp, while hard working, is always on the borderline. Investigation reveals Weaver purchased Chevrolet Sedan motor #4482615, serial #1-DA-06-43592 from Robison Chevrolet, Toledo, Ohio, under the name of Mrs. J. W. Osborne. Weaver using alias of J. A. Orhood traded Chevrolet Sedan, motor #4135550, serial #1-DA03-13359 to Jay Carter on July 24, 1934, the date he purchased Chevrolet motor #4482615 from Robison Chevrolet Company. Purchased Chevrolet, motor #4135550, March 23, 1934 at Des Moines, Iowa, from Ed. O'Dea Chevrolet Company. H. S. Holder advises man resembling Weaver purchased chow dog from him using the name of J. A. Orhood and paid for same with American Travelers check #T-3036311. Holder also advised name of George Harrison, who resembled Harrison, boarded a chow dog with him and an individual later called for the "Winfield" dog. Holder stated Slim Gibson resembled that man. Jefferson 1759-W probably number called by Warner. Confidential informant [REDACTED] advises Rem Holst now operating beer parlor at Point Place, Ohio. Confidential informant [REDACTED] advises Lu has left Edith Barry. Edith's maid resides at 431 Pinewood Ave., Toledo, Ohio.

DETAILS: AT CLEVELAND, OHIO

Confidential Informant of the Cleveland office was again interviewed on October 25, 1935, and advised that William "Billy" Fergus, William "Bill" Mitchell, and Clarence Heberbrand, in company with two Roumanians and a mechanic employed by the Mason & Company, slot machine manufacturers and vendors, had gone to Roumania to install slot machines, however, the government had revoked its contract and the deal had fallen through.

Further stated that Mrs. Mitchell had exhibited a cablegram to [redacted] which stated that Fergus, Mitchell and Heberbrand had left for Poland and would proceed home from three different ports. [redacted] was unable to advance any reason for the above-named individuals separating and coming home by different routes.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent H. D. Harris dated at Cincinnati, September 11, 1935, wherein he advises that the records of the telephone company at Dayton, Ohio reflects that Attorney John Egan called Adams 1231 at Toledo, Ohio, on July 1, 1935, which number is listed to the New Secor Hotel. During the time a tap was maintained on the telephone of the Casino Club in January of this year, it was noted that the telephone operators of the hotel frequently engaged in conversation with Annetta Smith, alias Apple Annie, check girl at the Casino Club. In view of that fact, agent did not deem it advisable at this time to ascertain the identity of the individual receiving the call.

AT LAKESIDE, OHIO

William Brown of Brown's Boat Livery at Erie Beach was interviewed relative to A. W. Sharp of Catawba Island and he advised that he had known Sharp for the past eight or ten years, becoming acquainted with him when Sharp was shipping peaches from his dock to Detroit, Michigan and Brown was hauling them by his boat.

Brown described Sharp as a hard-luck man but one who was

always looking for a way to make an easy dollar for himself. Sharp formerly operated a bowling alley and pool room, however, he gave it up as a losing proposition and owes a considerable number of people various sums of money. According to Brown, Sharp married Rose Gamble who gives music lessons in Port Clinton and vicinity and bears a very good reputation. They have one child, a daughter, who graduated from high school last year. Brown was unable to recall the daughter's name nor did he know much about her.

Continuing, Brown advised that he did not know any of Sharp's associates or what business he was presently engaged in, stating that Sharp, while he was ambitious, he was always on the border line.

AT CLYDE, OHIO

In reference to the 1934 Chevrolet sedan, motor #4482615, traded in by Weaver, Mr. H. W. Snyder, Vine Street, Manager of the Dummer Chevrolet Company, was interviewed and advised, after a check of his records, that no one by the name of J. W. Osborne had purchased any automobile new or used from him, nor did he have any record of any Chevrolet bearing the above motor number. Mr. Snyder further stated that the Dummer Company had salesrooms in Fremont, Port Clinton, and Oak Harbor as well as Clyde, Ohio.

AT FREMONT, OHIO

Mr. D. W. Dummer, owner of the Dummer Chevrolet Company, was interviewed and advised that the company at Fremont had not sold any Chevrolet bearing motor number 4482615.

Mr. G. W. Miller, Clerk of Court, County of Sandusky, was interviewed and after a check of his records, advised that the name of J. W. Osborne did not appear on his records, either as grantee or grantor on any bill of sale filed in the county.

AT OAK HARBOR, OHIO

L. H. Peters of the Dummer Chevrolet Company was contacted and advised that no automobile bearing motor number 4482615 had been handled by his organization.

AT SANDUSKY, OHIO

Reference is made to the summary report of Special Agent K. R. McIntire dated at Chicago, Illinois, April 10, 1935, wherein it states on pages 184 and 185 that Mrs. Fred Wilgrube, Route #1, Huron, Ohio, could testify that Weaver and Eaton, using the alias Orhood, had rented a cottage from her at Grand Forest Beach and of Mr. and Mrs. George Swanson,

also rented a cottage at the same place from her. Mrs. Wilgrube also found an application for registration of a chow dog sold by Mrs. A. H. Holder, 1105 Marlboro Street, Sandusky, Ohio, to J. A. Orhood on June 3, 1934.

Agent interviewed Mr. H. S. Holder, 1105 Marlboro Street, proprietor of the I'Jang Chow Kennels on Route #2, about one mile east of Sandusky, and after a check of his records stated that a J. A. Orhood, 3467 Edgewater Drive, Toledo, Ohio, had on about June 3, 1934, purchased a chow dog called "Scoogy" from him for \$20.00. Photographs of subjects of this case were exhibited to Holder and he identified the small insert photograph of Weaver appearing below the larger photograph of Weaver on the strip containing the photos of Moran, Weaver, Gibson, Doyle and Sawyer as greatly resembling the man who had purchased the dog.

Continuing, Mr. Holder stated that he remembered the incident as Orhood had stated he was living at Grand Forest Beach for the summer and argued with him about the price as he had asked \$25.00 for the dog and when Orhood stated he could get one at Steeds Kennels, just west of Toledo for \$20.00, rather than to lose the sale, he agreed to take \$20. Mr. Holder further stated that Orhood paid him with a \$20.00 American Express Travelers check, which he took from a pad of checks and filled it out in front of him. Holder stated that Orhood was alone at the time, but he gathered from his conversation that he had a woman with him.

During the interview, Mr. Holder stated that on August 25, 1934, a man by the name of George Swanson of Toledo had brought in a chow dog tied with an unusually heavy chain and requested the dog be boarded. Holder asked the man if the dog was vicious and the man exhibited a badly chewed left forearm and stated "the s-- of a b---- did that".

Continuing, Mr. Holder stated that on September 29, 1934 at 7:25 p.m. two men in a small coupe called and asked for the "Winfield" dog. After several minutes of discussion, Holder ascertained that they meant the dog Swanson had brought in, so he gave it to them. However, he did not like their looks and had his assistant, Thomas Baker, 1105 Marlboro Street, take the license number, which was a 1934 Illinois number 1-266-231.

Both Holder and Baker stated that the photograph of Willie Harrison greatly resembled George Swanson, and the photograph of Slim Gibson looked like the man who asked for the "Winfield" dog. Neither of them were able to say what the other man looked like as he remained in the coupe.

Agent questioned Mr. Holder relative to the American Travelers check and he stated that he had deposited it to his account at the Third National Bank in Sandusky.

Mr. E. B. Gangware, Cashier of the Third National Bank was interviewed and after a search of his records, stated that on June 7, 1934,

Mr. Holder had deposited an American Travelers check for \$20.00, same bearing #T-3036311 and on the same day the bank had forwarded same with a cash transmittal letter to their New York correspondent, the Chase National Bank.

Continuing, Mr. Gangware advised that whenever the bank needed Travelers checks they ordered same from E. M. English, Manager, American Express Company, 58 East Washington Street, Chicago, Illinois.

AT TOLEDO, OHIO

Agent communicated with Confidential Informant [redacted] and he stated that Rene Holst had returned from Atlantic City and was operating Ludy Fleming's beer parlor in Point Place, Ohio. Other than that, he had no information relative to the subjects of this case or their contacts.

In an endeavor to ascertain if the Chevrolet bearing #4482615 had been purchased or sold by Weaver in Toledo, or the vicinity, Agent, without disclosing his identity, checked the automobile sales register book in the Clerk of Courts office of Lucas County and it was noted that the Robison Chevrolet, Inc., 3015 Monroe Street was listed on July 24, 1934 as grantor and Mrs. J. W. Osborne as grantee on bill of sale #366697.

A further check of the records revealed that J. A. Orhood transferred title of a 1934 Chevrolet coupe on July 24, 1934 to Jay Carter under bill of sale #362714. Agent requested bills of sale numbers 366697 and 362714 from the clerk on duty and a review of same is set forth:

Bill of Sale #366697 reflects that on July 24, 1934 the Robison Chevrolet, Inc., 3015 Monroe Street, delivered to Mrs. J. W. Osborne of Clyde, Ohio, a new 1934 Chevrolet club sedan. Serial #1DA-0643592, motor #4482615, which car shall be hereinafter referred to as car #1. This bill of sale was witnessed by H. Barry and F. R. Streicher. A check of the City Directory lists H. Barry as a salesman for the Robison Chevrolet, Inc., and his residence as Maumee, Ohio. (It will be noted here that H. Barry is no doubt the salesman who also sold two cars to Arthur H. Barker in 1934, see report of Special Agent D. E. Hall, dated at Detroit, Michigan, 4/9/35.) The City Directory lists F. R. Streicher as a salesman for the Robison Chevrolet and his residence as 2451 Charlestown.

Your attention is called to the serial #1 DA 06435 set forth in reference letter of Special Agent in Charge E. J. Connelley, dated at Chicago, Illinois October 24, 1935 and the serial number obtained from bill of sale #366697 which is 1 DA 0643592, although there is a difference of two digits, the motor numbers are the same, and it is no doubt the automobile referred to.

Bill of Sale 362714 reflects that on May 14, 1934, J. A. Orhood, 3467 Edgewater Drive, Toledo, Ohio, filed a sworn statement of ownership for a 1934 Chevrolet coupe, serial #1 DA-03-13359, motor #4135550, and supported that sworn statement of ownership with a customer's copy of a car invoice bearing number 3548 from the Ed. O'Dea Chevrolet Company, 623 East Grand Avenue, Des Moines, Iowa. The car invoice which was stamped "paid in full" on March 23, 1934 and initialed H.R.H. and notarized by John Van Gorkom, set forth the following information:

This car will be hereinafter referred to as Car #2.

On July 24, 1934, J. A. Orhood, 3467 Edgewater Drive executed a bill of sale for car #2 to Jay Carter, 3303 Summit Street, and this bill of sale was witnessed by Blair Caldwell and H. Barry, and notarized by Blair Caldwell on July 24, 1934. The City Directory lists Blair Caldwell as a salesman residing at 1507 Kelsey Avenue. This bill of sale was filed in the Clerk of Courts Office on July 27, 1934.

However, it will be noted here that on July 23, 1934, one day prior to the date J. A. Orhood transferred his title to car #2 to Jay Carter, Jay Carter executed a bill of sale for car #2 to the Robison Chevrolet Inc., 3015 Monroe Street. This bill of sale was witnessed by Irene Taylor and Evelyn McPartland and notarized by Evelyn McPartland on July 23, 1934, and recorded in the Clerk of Courts Office on July 31, 1934. The City Directory lists Irene Taylor as a stenographer for the Robison Chevrolet Company, residence 340 Winthrop Avenue; occupation of Evelyn McPartland is listed as Clerk of the Robison Chevrolet Company, and her residence as 1415 Pinewood Avenue.

Agent checked the vicinity of 3303 Summit Street, the address given by Jay Carter, and found that no such number existed, A check

of the telephone and city directories failed to reveal the name of Jay Carter. A further check on Pontiac, Clifford and Adrian, all streets in the vicinity where 3303 Summit would be, did not disclose the name of any individual with a name the same or similar to that of any person previously mentioned in the files of this case.

In reference to the address 3467 Edgewater Drive, given by J. A. Orhood on his sworn statement of ownership, and to Mr. Holder of the I'Jang Chow Kennels, Agent checked this street and ascertained that there was no such number, the numbers on Edgewater beginning at 5303 and ending at 6343.

Car #2 has since been sold once on August 23, 1934 to Francis J. O'Toole, 3836 Upton Road, then on September 8, 1934 back to Robison Chevrolet and again on September 28, 1934, the Robison Chevrolet sold same to Olive Thacher of the Plaza Hotel in whose possession the records reflect the car still remains.

No effort was made at this time to contact the Robison Chevrolet, Inc., to ascertain how car #1 was paid for, what car was turned in on a trade, who the salesman was, or if Weaver could be identified, for the reason that previous investigations conducted by Bureau Agents at the Robison Chevrolet relative to cars purchased by Arthur Barker, has proved unproductive and it was felt that any inquiries made at the present time would, without a doubt, go back to Burt and Ted Angus who are known at the Robison Company.

Detectives Harry Manson and Merle Unkle were interviewed relative to Louis Levi and they advised that he was presently selling watches and German Luger pistols of which he seemed to have a goodly supply.

Manson stated that he expected to obtain the numbers of some of the watches and pistols and would advise Agent when he did.

The following information obtained from Detective Manson and Detective Unkle is set forth for future reference. Arthur Brown, 728 Humbolt Road, a Toledo police officer for the past seventeen years and a former member of Captain Timminney's Hoodlum Squad, was removed from same after testifying during the Arnoff (Toledo gambler) trial that Capt. Timminney was trying to control rather than eliminate gambling in Toledo. According to Manson and Unkle, Brown knows considerable about Timminney's connections and is the type of individual that if he was questioned closely would become so nervous that he would tell all he knew. His wife Gertrude Ritter is a former Toledo "racket" woman.

In reference to the telephone number Jefferson 1759 called by Frank "Whitey" Warner from the Allerton Hotel, Mr. R. E. Mewborn of the telephone company advised that Jefferson 1759 was a party line with the letters J and W. The J number was listed to Richard Mickle, 3387

Collingwood Avenue, Apartment C, a chemist at the Howard Manufacturing Company, and the W number was presently unlisted.

However, it will be recalled that Jefferson 1759-W was formerly listed to Rene and Thelma Holst, 3387 Collingwood Avenue, Apartment F, both of these parties have moved and it is doubtless the number Warner called.

Confidential Informant [redacted] was interviewed and stated that Lu had left Edith Barry's place about one week ago and had taken her child, Margaret, from Detroit and was presently residing with Gus Jacob at his home, 3508 Suder Avenue.

[redacted] was unable to advance any reason for Lu leaving Edith's, stating that he did not know whether it was permanent or temporary. However, [redacted] stated that [redacted] Edith had called Gus and asked him if Lu was there and although she was, Gus said no.

[redacted] further stated that Edith's maid had called [redacted] looking for her but was unable to find her. [redacted] stated that Lu had not been making much money at Edith's and had on occasion made a few calls unknown to Edith, out of Clara Miller's call house at 228 Seventeenth St.

[redacted]

Continuing, [redacted] stated that during the time Karpis and Campbell were at Edith's house, a girl known as "Peaches" was also there [redacted] that one night "Peaches" and Edith came in drunk and a fight started and both lost some hair and a lot of clothes in the melee, and "Peaches" accused Edith of being intimate with Walter the colored man. "Peaches" left shortly afterward and her present whereabouts is not known. However, [redacted] stated that he believes he can secure "Peaches" true name and address and Agent requested him to do so. It will be recalled here that during the time the tap was maintained on Edith's phone, someone called for "Peaches" and was advised by Walter that she was supposed to be in Milwaukee.

Agent questioned [redacted] about Edith's maid and was advised by him that he did not know her name [redacted]. Agent requested [redacted] to point out the house to him and found same to be 431 Pinewood Avenue. Without disclosing his identity, Agent made inquiry in the district and ascertained that Mrs. Margaret M. Arnold, a widow of Harvey, lived there. The vicinity around 431 Pinewood is colored [redacted]

Agent requested [redacted] to endeavor to draw [redacted] into conversation [redacted] and ascertain if possible, the reason she left Edith's, whether she intends to remain away from there, and any other information he could secure.

During the course of the conversation, [redacted] stated that [redacted] offered to take him at one time to a hideout that Ted Angus had in Canada. [redacted] stated that [redacted] did not tell him where it was at that time and he never went with her. Agent advised [redacted] to secure the location of the hideout if he could do so without arousing any suspicion.

THE CLEVELAND OFFICE, at TOLEDO AND CLEVELAND, OHIO, will maintain contact with its informants.

THE CLEVELAND OFFICE, at TOLEDO, OHIO, will, when it is deemed advisable, contact the Robison Chevrolet, Inc., 3015 Monroe Street, and ascertain the facts surrounding the sale of Chevrolet sedan, motor #4482615 to Mrs. J. W. Osborne, and the purchase of the Chevrolet sedan, motor #4135550 from Jay Carter on July 24, 1934, and July 23, 1934 respectively.

THE OMAHA OFFICE, at DES MOINES, IOWA, will, at the Ed. O'Dea Chevrolet Company, 623 East Grand Avenue, ascertain all the facts surrounding the purchase of Chevrolet sedan bearing motor #4135550, serial #1 DAO3-13359, and license #77-34648, by Weaver using the alias of J. A. Orhood, on March 23, 1934.

With reference to your letter dated October 14, 1935, please be advised that Special Agent J. E. Sharp, of this Office, interviewed Mr. E. W. Walling, manager of the Auto Sales and Service Company, McMinnville, Tennessee, on October 30, 1935.

Mr. Walling advised, in brief, that a man using the name of Robert Lyle Bosche had roomed with some people at Beersheba Springs, Tennessee, from about May 1, 1935, to July 15, 1935. This individual was accompanied by a woman. Beersheba Springs is a mountain resort, south of McMinnville. Bosche had negotiated for the purchase of considerable chicken hatchery equipment, had contracted for a fair-sized piece of land at Beersheba Springs, and had stated his intentions of building several cottages to rent to vacationists.

On July 14, 1935, Bosche appeared at the Auto Sales Company, and negotiated for the purchase of a Dodge Sedan, worth \$314.00. After giving considerable information about himself, he wrote a check for \$314.00, drawn on the First National Bank of McMinnville, where he claimed to have an account. This was accepted as a down payment on the Dodge, which was delivered to him on that date. The bank was closed at the time, and Mr. Walling was unable to make inquiry at the bank until Monday, July 16, 1935. He then ascertained that Bosche had no account, and

found that Bosche had left for an unknown destination on Sunday evening, in the Dodge automobile.

Mr. Walling checked all the references and information given by Bosche, and found it was all fictitious. Among this information was the facts that Bosche formerly resided at 1722 Jefferson Street, Memphis, Tennessee; that he was in the Bond, Stock, and Real Estate business; that he was formerly employed by the National Carbide Company at Springfield, Illinois; that he had purchased a car previously from the Jackson Motor Company, Jackson, Tennessee; that he had previously dealt with the Starr and Long Grocery Company, Deull Avenue, Memphis, Tenn., the Brown Brothers' Garage, Marquette Street, Memphis, Tennessee, and the Memphis Drug Company, Memphis, Tennessee; that his mother was Mrs. Carolina Bosche, Memphis Grove, Tennessee; that he was a Mason and an Odd Fellow; and that he had a \$2,500.00 life insurance policy with the National Life and Accident Insurance Company, at Memphis, Tennessee.

Mr. Walling stated that when he read about William Weaver and Myrtle Eaton being apprehended in Florida, where they were operating a chicken farm, he thought that these parties might be the individuals who had been at Beersheba Springs. He stated that after Bosche left Beersheba Springs, several parties had told him that Bosche carried suitcases which were suspiciously heavy, and that the parties with whom Bosche stayed suspected him of being a gangster.

Bosche is described by Mr. Walling as

Reference is made to letter from this office to the Director dated September 26, 1935 in the above matter.

Special Agent George J. Starr of this office reinterviewed Mr. Bertschinger, the proprietor of the Hudson Sporting Goods Company. The latter stated that they have made further search among their records but were unable to find any records covering the sale of Thompson Sub-machine guns, Serials #5791, 7880 and 7783. All of these records, he states, are among those which were seized by the police at the time of his arrest and have not been returned to him. He states in connection with the taking of these records and the failure to return same that when the records were taken the two city detectives who took the records also took two good revolvers as exhibits and have not returned these revolvers either. He is certain that he had no other transactions involving the sale of machine guns, other than those set out in the letter of September 26th with the one exception possibly of the machine gun bearing serial #7873, which it is claimed by L. Oppleman of Lynchburg, Virginia, was sold to the Hudson Sporting Goods Company for resale. At the time of the sale of the weapons to the Gary Hardware Company, Gary, Indiana, there was also a sale of some firearms to a coal company in Brooklyn which, however, subsequently was found to be a fictitious company. All of this occurred at about the same time and is all covered by the records seized by the police.

You will recall that on May 6, 1935 Bruno Austin, who was then a subject in the Bremer case, was discharged from custody at St. Paul, Minnesota on an Order of the Court. As a matter of interest to you, the Bureau is now advised that Bruno Austin was tried in the State Court at Chicago, Illinois on the charge of murder on October 11, 1935, was found guilty and on the same date was sentenced to serve life imprisonment. A motion for a new trial was immediately filed, which was to have been heard on October 25th. The Chicago Office will keep the Bureau advised and you will be informed of the results of this motion.

You will recall that counsel for Oliver A. Berg recently made a motion before Judge Joyce at St. Paul, Minnesota, for a reduction in the sentence of Berg, it being noted that he was sentenced to serve life imprisonment on the charge of Conspiracy to Kidnap Edward George Bremer. On October 25, 1935 the Assistant United States Attorney at St. Paul advised that Judge Joyce had informed him that he intended to deny that motion. In connection with this matter, when the motion was filed, the United States Attorney's Office at St. Paul requested the Bureau to furnish all available data concerning the criminal history and criminal activities of Oliver Berg. The files were immediately reviewed and all pertinent information was furnished to the United States Attorney's Office. It is felt that the weight of this information, which was considerable, had a marked bearing upon the opinion of the Judge in deciding to deny the motion. This opinion is expressed by this Agent because Judge Joyce had previously informed the United States Attorney's Office at St. Paul that he intended to reduce the sentence of Berg to forty years, in view of the fact that Berg did not actively participate in the abduction of Mr. Bremer.

The Chicago Office has transmitted to the Bureau two gunstocks which were made to be fastened on to the butt of an automatic pistol so that the same could be fired after the fashion of a rifle. The trademark of these gunstocks discloses they were manufactured by the Monarch Arms and Manufacturing Company of Los Angeles, California.

On January 8, 1935, when the apartment of Russell Gibson at Chicago, Illinois was raided after his death, Agents recovered therefrom two twenty-bullet clips for a .45 caliber automatic pistol which, it appears, were made of material identical to the above mentioned gunstocks. It is believed that these two twenty-bullet clips were manufactured by the Monarch Arms and Manufacturing Company, but in the absence of definite knowledge on this subject the Chicago Office, which has custody of these clips, is requested to examine the same to determine whether they were manufactured by the Monarch Arms and Manufacturing Company and so advise the Los Angeles Office and the Bureau immediately. In view of the fact that these two articles of firearms equipment were located in the homes of prominent gangsters, it is requested that the Los Angeles Office conduct a proper investigation concerning the Monarch Arms and Manufacturing Company so that the Bureau will be advised fully with regard to that company.

Please note the attached letter from the United States Attorney at Jacksonville, Florida, concerning the indictment pending in his district against William Weaver and Myrtle Eaton, growing out of the Bremer Kidnapping Case at St. Paul. The United States Attorney at St. Paul wrote the Department under date of October 18th, advising that the defendant Weaver has indicated a desire to enter a plea of guilty to the indictments pending at St. Paul provided he is given assurances that Myrtle Eaton will not be prosecuted by the Government. Mr. Sullivan states that the only evidence against Weaver at St. Paul will be the testimony given by Bolton to the effect that he saw Weaver on two different occasions at the hide-out; that if the Government could rely upon Miss Dehmer to give the evidence that she has indicated, the same would be of great value in corroborating the testimony of Bolton, but on the other hand if Weaver stood trial and became informed of the fact that Farmer and Alderton claimed that he, Weaver, was not one of the men guarding Bremer, the defense might subpoena these two men and make it a question for the jury as to whether Bolton was telling the truth or whether Farmer and Alderton were telling the truth as to Weaver being at the hide-out. Mr. Sullivan's letter may be found at the marked place in the attached file.

You will note what the United States Attorney at Jacksonville has to say with respect to the indictment in his district and that he indicates that the ends of justice would be better served if Weaver's proposal to plead guilty on the conditions mentioned should be accepted.

United States Attorney Holland advises that the facts in this matter were presented to a grand jury in his district for the reason "that we understood from the Bureau of Investigation that

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

Re: Two gunstocks found in apartment occupied by Gus Winkler.

There are transmitted herewith two gunstocks which are manufactured for the purpose of attaching the same to an automatic pistol so that the same may be fired from the shoulder after the fashion of a rifle.

These two gunstocks were located by Officer A. Schuetz of the Chicago Police Department in the apartment then occupied by Gus Winkler on September 24, 1933. They were given to the Chicago Bureau Office for such disposition as they cared to make of them, and are transmitted herewith in the belief that you may feel they will constitute an interesting exhibit for the showcases.

At the time the apartment of Russell Gibson was raided on January 8, 1935, there were found therein two twenty-bullet clips for a .45 caliber automatic pistol. It is my recollection that these clips were made of material identical with the material of which these gunstocks are made. I do not recall the name of the company manufacturing said clips, but it is believed they were made by the company making these gunstocks which, you will note, is the Monarch Arms and Manufacturing Company of Los Angeles, California.

In view of the fact that both of these pieces of equipment have been located in the homes of gangsters, a letter has been directed to the Los Angeles Office to make an appropriate investigation concerning the Monarch Arms and Manufacturing Company so that the Bureau will be advised fully in the premises.

to quash, a special demurrer, and a plea in abatement on behalf of SAWYER were entered, argued, and denied. Upon over-ruling these motions filed in behalf of SAWYER, no motions were filed in WEAVER'S behalf, and the pleas of both defendants of not guilty were re-entered.

On Nov. 5, 1935, the first day of the term, trial on all indictments pending in this District in this case were set for January 6, 1936.

In reference to Bureau letter dated October 31, 1935, interview was had with BRYON BOLTON. He stated that to the best of his recollection GEORGE ZIEGLER had complained of the number of persons participating in the division of the ransom money obtained from the BREMER family, during which he mentioned that \$5,000 had been set aside to be paid to TOM BROWN of the St. Paul Police Department. BOLTON stated that he had never heard of TOM BROWN and did not question ZIEGLER as to the purpose of this payment, and that this is the only information he has relating to TOM BROWN or any member of the St. Paul Police Department having been involved in the kidnaping.

It may be recalled that BOLTON has been interviewed on this same subject on several occasions heretofore, but no further information has ever been obtained from him indicating that he knew of the alleged participation of BROWN in the kidnaping.

With reference to Bureau letter dated October 26, 1935, relating to the possibility of obtaining further information from WILLIAM WEAVER, it may be stated that WEAVER has been endeavoring to make a proposition effecting the outcome of his case which will be acceptable to the Government, and as this has always been coupled with a request for definite information as to the sentence to be imposed upon him should he enter a plea of guilty, little or no information has as yet been obtained from him.

The Court has appointed Mr. A. Jerome Hoffman as his attorney, and Agent has been informed by United States Attorney Sullivan that Mr. Hoffman has made certain overtures toward disposing of the case against WEAVER without a jury trial.

The matter of endeavoring to procure information from WEAVER with respect to contacts between the Dillinger gang and

members of the KARPIS-BARKER gang will be pursued further. However, while WEAVER is quite loquacious, he has not been very talkative concerning his criminal activities or those of others, apparently feeling that he has information which he could better use as a means of trading for consideration in the disposition of the case against him.

The photograph attached to copy of letter from the Chicago Office to the Washington Field Office dated October 26, was shown to MYRTLE EATON who stated that the photograph was taken at a filling station operated by herself and WILLIAM WEAVER near Allandale, Florida, nearly a year ago; that she does not know the identity of the man in the left of the photograph, the second man being a Catholic priest who visits that section of Florida every year, the third figure that of Mr. Marsh, and the fourth figure that of herself, the fifth is Mrs. Marsh, and the man standing at the left front door of the Oldsmobile Sedan, which can be seen in the enlarged photograph but not in the small photograph, is WILLIAM WEAVER. She further stated that the Marsh's are from someplace in the east and visit that section of Florida every year.

This photograph was also shown to WILLIAM WEAVER, who stated that he knew Mr. and Mrs. Marsh as visitors from someplace he thought to be Pennsylvania or Ohio; that Mr. Marsh is a chicken breeder; that the second man from the left of the photograph is a Catholic priest, name unknown to him, and the man to the extreme left drove the car for this priest; that all of these four persons are winter visitors in Florida. He also identified photograph of MYRTLE EATON and that of himself standing alongside the Oldsmobile Sedan.

Dear Sir:

On the morning of October 26, 1935, Mr. C. W. Humphrey, Chief Clerk, U. S. Detention Farm, Milan, Michigan, telephoned the Detroit Office and advised that Mrs. R. D. Wilson, sister of Wynona Burdette, had appeared at the institution and requested permission to visit Wynona. Mr. Humphrey advised that he would delay the visit until Agents from the Detroit Office arrived to cover same, if it was desired to do so.

In the absence of SAC E. J. Connelley, SAC D. M. Ladd of the Chicago Office advised telephonically that it was desired that the conversation between Mrs. Wilson and Wynona Burdette be covered as thoroughly as possible. Accordingly, Special Agents J. Waldman and A. A. Muzzey were sent to the U. S. Detention Farm with a microphone set to cover the conversation.

In view of the fact that Saturday was men's visiting day at the Farm, Mr. Humphrey advised that the visiting room which had been used previously for the installation of the microphone set could not be used and in the time available, no satisfactory setup of the microphone set could be made elsewhere.

At Agent Muzzey's request, Mr. Humphrey stated he would allow the room adjoining the Superintendent's office to be used, in which room Wynona Burdette has been interviewed on previous occasions by Bureau Agents and in which room it was thought she would not become suspicious that her conversation with her sister was being overheard. Agent Muzzey concealed himself behind the file cabinets in

a corner of the room and overheard distinctly every bit of conversation between Mrs. Wilson and Wynona Burdette.

Mr. Humphrey before allowing Mrs. Wilson to enter the room with Wynona warned them against handshaking, kissing, and so forth, in accordance with prison regulations, and had previously arranged that a guard would pass on the outside of the room in which the visit was to take place in order to avert any suspicion that the visit was being covered.

A general conversation ensued between Mrs. Wilson and Wynona Burdette at first, which was of no informative value to the Bureau. They then talked about Wynona's clothes which were forwarded from Florida to Mrs. Wilson at Arondale, Oklahoma, and Mrs. Wilson advised that she had received them from a Government man by the name of Hanson who was very nice to her. In their discussion about the clothes, Wynona identified certain pieces as not belonging to her but belonging to "Mother" (Ma Barker). They then talked about a red ensemble which Wynona stated she had purchased in Florida as she and Harry had contemplated getting married at Tallahassee; that she and Harry were going to go straight and settle down in Tallahassee and that Fred Barker was going to supply them with the money.

① During the conversation concerning Harry, Mrs. Wilson stated that Harry had visited Mildred's but had not found Mildred at home and had left the sum of \$50 with somebody for Mildred. Mrs. Wilson stated that she cannot sleep nights; that she lies awake expecting Harry to put in an appearance at her home at any time and stated that she was scared to death that Karpis might be with him. Wynona told Mrs. Wilson that she did not think Harry knew where she lived but that he could find out; that she hoped Karpis was not with him if he ever did visit Mrs. Wilson because she, too, was scared to death of Karpis. She stated that Karpis was mean and that during the time they were in Florida, Harry would not even let her be around Karpis.

Mrs. Wilson then stated that she thought "Hy" had become a Government man (meaning that he was cooperating with the Department of Justice).

Wynona then said that she and Dolores Delaney -- Dolores particularly -- were going to try to get transfers to Alderson so that they might be on the ground, inasmuch as they are never allowed on the ground at the Detention Farm but are always kept in their cells or on the sun roof.

They spoke about their various relatives and before the visit terminated, Mrs. Wilson stated that she would ask Mr. Hum-

phrey for permission to visit Wynona again on Sunday, October 27, stating that she would remain in Milan over night and would go back to Oklahoma on Sunday. She told Wynona that she had arrived in Milan on Friday night, October 25, coming on the train from Tulsa, and that she had come alone.

Mr. Humphrey granted Mrs. Wilson another visit with Wynona on Sunday, October 27, and this visit took place in the same room as the visit on Saturday. The same arrangements were made, Special Agent Muzzey concealing himself again behind the file cabinets to overhear their conversation.

At this visit Mrs. Wilson spoke of the cheap living in Milan, stating that she had been able to get a hotel room for a dollar; that she had found the food was inexpensive and good and that she was happy that this was so inasmuch as she was afraid her money would not last until she returned home. She told Wynona that she had borrowed \$15 from Mr. Mills with whom she traded.

Wynona stated that she had sent some of her clothes to Mrs. Wilson from Milan. Mrs. Wilson then stated that she was not in Arondale at the present time; that she was living in Hominy, but that she was certain the package which Wynona had sent a few days previous to Mrs. Wilson's coming to Milan would undoubtedly be forwarded to her in Hominy.

They then spoke about the death of Clyde (Mildred's husband), Mrs. Wilson stating that she was positive Jim McConnell had killed Clyde and that the Gillespies knew about the killing; that Jim made it look like Clyde was drunk and had driven his car into a culvert but that, in fact, Clyde was hit on the head and had died as a result of the blow and being unconscious had lost control of the car and had run into the culvert; further, that the doctors had said there wasn't enough whiskey in Clyde to have made him so intoxicated that he lost control of the car.

Mrs. Wilson then told Wynona that Helen Lewis had asked her to say "hello" to Wynona and that Helen was living on a rice farm in Tennessee, on the borderline between Arkansas and Tennessee; that she had had a premature baby. She referred to Helen's husband as "Doc."

Wynona then asked Mrs. Wilson if the papers in Oklahoma had carried any stories to the effect that there were any holds on her. Mrs. Wilson stated that she had not seen anything in the newspapers about Wynona and Wynona stated that she knows there are three life sentences and bank holdups against Harry and that he was wanted in Oklahoma; that she hoped Harry had broken away from the

gang, stating that Harry would last longer if he had done so.

Mrs. Wilson stated that after Harry had visited Mildred, the Government men went to Mildred's home and stayed there for two weeks; that there were four of them there at night and two in the daytime and that Mildred's children had been taken away from the house. Mrs. Wilson said that she had gone to Mildred's and had noticed something suspicious and thought perhaps Harry was there, but when she went to get a drink of water she found it was only the Government men. She went on to say that Mildred had cooked for these men and they had purchased all the food. She said that Richard, her husband, had been questioned by the Government men and that they had also asked her whether she knew Harry Campbell and that she had told them she did not remember Harry Campbell. Wynona then said, "Remember when Hanson and another G-man came out one day, you know the one I mean, the heavy set one?" Mrs. Wilson replied, "Yes." Wynona then laughed but did not elaborate.

Mrs. Wilson then said that everybody knew Wynona did not go back to Harry Campbell willingly but that she was forced to go back with him. She again expressed her fear that Harry would visit her or Mildred again. Mrs. Wilson also said that Harry Campbell had visited his mother twice since Wynona had been incarcerated at Milan and Wynona seemed to indicate that she knew this. (2)

Wynona asked Mrs. Wilson whether she had received the letters which she had sent to her from St. Paul, Wynona stating that she had sent them to Blanche to give to Mrs. Wilson. Mrs. Wilson stated that she had not received the letters.

Wynona said she was going to try to get a parole; that a Government man had send a recommendation to Washington in an attempt to get a parole for her but she did not know whether that would do any good or not.

They then talked about Karpis, Wynona saying that Dolores certainly picked a lemon when she picked Karpis; that he was ugly, had big feet, long legs and a long face and was as mean as the dickens.

Wynona then asked Mrs. Wilson to take back to Oklahoma with her certain pieces of jewelry and articles of clothing, among which was a pair of pajamas belonging to Harry Campbell. Wynona asked Mrs. Wilson to keep these pajamas for her inasmuch as she wanted them for a remembrance of Harry in case she never saw him again. She also requested Mrs. Wilson to keep a watch chain of Harry's. It seemed evident that Wynona is still madly in love with

Harry Campbell, from the conversation had between her and Mrs. Wilson.



It is not believed that Wynona and Mrs. Wilson were aware or even suspicious that their visit was being covered in view of the fact that they spoke of intimate matters concerning women.

Mrs. Wilson stated, before her departure, that she would attempt to see Wynona again some time and that she might have some news for her about Harry.



the last they heard of the whereabouts of George Brown. That when they moved to their present location Mrs. John Carver and her sister Mrs. J. W. Sparks resented their moving to Mabton, Washington, as the sisters figured that they were being followed in an attempt to get a lead on George Brown. The Meadows both stated that the sisters never mentioned George Brown and that they would not furnish any information, if they had any, concerning his present whereabouts. Further they believed that any inquiry from them would be met with hostile answers. They advised that they doubted whether Mrs. Bell could furnish any information concerning the whereabouts of George Brown. They stated that though they were in Caney, Oklahoma, at the time of the shooting and knew both of George Brown's sisters; that they never saw George Brown, consequently they could not furnish a description of him.

Mr. Jesse Bell, husband of Lavenia Bell, advised that he had never met George Brown. That to his belief George Brown was dead, as his mother-in-law, Mrs. John Carver, had tried to locate him at various times but her efforts were unsuccessful. He advised that Mrs. John Carver was presently living at Port Orchard, Washington. On R.R. #1. Her house is located just below the Old Soldiers Home at the bottom of the hill. That this is near Annapolis, Washington, but that her mail is sent to Port Orchard, Washington. He could not furnish the correct address of Mrs. J. W. Sparks, another sister of George Brown, who presently lives in Seattle, Washington. He stated that a brother, Neil Brown, to his understanding was presently living in Winchester, Idaho.

Mr. Robert Ashley, Clerk at the Post Office, advised that the forwarding address of Mrs. J. W. Sparks was 3808 Genessee or Jenness Street, Seattle, Washington.

On November 6, 1935, Assistant United States Attorney
Harold E. Hanson of Madison, Wisconsin communicated with me by tele-
phone, at which time he advised that the Madison, Wisconsin Police
Department had provided him with the following information.

On May 23, 1935 a jewelry store, operated by R. W. Nelson,
330 State Street, Madison, Wisconsin, was burglarized. Subsequent to
the burglary of that jewelry store, Sam Johnson, alias John Samson,
alias Samuel Johnson, and Richard Graham were arrested in connection
therewith. A few days ago Johnson and Graham were convicted on a
charge of burglarizing the R. W. Nelson Jewelry Store. Information
was received by the Madison Police Department indirectly through Sam
Johnson and directly through his attorney to the effect that the
jewelry store was actually burglarized by Volney Davis. A part of the
stolen merchandise obtained at the time of the robbery of the R. W.
Nelson Jewelry Store was found in the possession of Johnson at the time
of his arrest. It was claimed, however, that Volney Davis came to
Madison, Wisconsin a few days prior to the burglary of the store and
rented an apartment under the name of G. L. Jordan at 126 East Wilson,

Mr. Hanson stated that the Madison, Wisconsin Police Depart-

Agent George Starr called the Laboratory by telephone from the New York office at 2:30 P.M. today and referred to the Browning Automatic rifles concerning which question has arisen as to the duplication of numbers appearing on rifles seized in connection with the Bremer Kidnaping case and certain rifles in the Rock Island Arsenal. Mr. Starr stated that one of the guns seized in the Bremer case and one of the guns from the Rock Island Arsenal have been disassembled at the Winchester factory and that the experts there have arrived at the conclusion that the rifle which they are examining and which was confiscated in the Bremer case is a genuine Winchester product, whereas the rifle from the arsenal is made from parts and probably assembled at the arsenal.

Mr. Starr indicated that he had received a telephone call from Major Hession this afternoon, during the course of which Major Hession, although reluctant to make a definite statement on the telephone, gave him to understand that it is the belief of the experts at the Winchester factory that the rifle from the Rock Island Arsenal was assembled at the arsenal probably to replace a missing rifle.

Mr. Starr stated that Major Hession was of the opinion it might be of benefit to have an expert from the Technical Laboratory proceed to the Winchester factory to examine the guns now disassembled there. I told Mr. Starr that I would look into the matter and advise him later in order that he might communicate with Major Hession.

I talked with Mr. Tamm this afternoon and advised him of the fact that Mr. Parsons will be absent from the city on subpoena for several days beginning tomorrow and that further I could not see why it would be necessary for a laboratory expert to go to New Haven inasmuch as the gun from the Rock Island Arsenal can be shipped to the Laboratory for disassembling and examination. This procedure would permit the examination of the gun by Mr. Baughman and other Bureau experts. Mr. Tamm agreed with this suggestion and indicated, however, that it would be advisable to have Mr. Starr proceed to the Winchester factory and to make a report on his interview there. Accordingly, I called the New York office and advised Mr. Whitley that Mr. Starr should go to the Winchester factory and submit a report.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR.

The Bureau is in receipt of the report of Special Agent John E. Brennan dated at St. Paul, Minnesota on October 7, 1935 in which it is shown that the .45 calibre Army revolver which was recovered from the possession of Weaver at his home in the vicinity of Allandale, Florida was in fact obtained by William Weaver from Tommy Carroll, deceased Dillinger gangster, more than a year ago.

This information is being submitted to you because it shows one more connection between members of the Dillinger gang and members of the Karpis-Bakker gang.

A letter has been directed to the St. Paul Office requesting that in their interview with William Weaver all information with regard to contacts between the two gangs be obtained.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

Re: Interlocking of the Dillinger and Barker - Karpis Gangs.

The files in the Barker - Karpis and Dillinger cases disclose the following interesting information with regard to the close contact between members of the Dillinger gang and members of the Barker - Karpis gang:

Alvin Karpis consorted with Dolores Delaney, while Tommy Carroll, of the Dillinger gang, consorted with the sister of Dolores Delaney, namely, Jean Delaney. As a matter of interest to you, it is also noted that the third Delaney sister is the wife of Albert "Pat" Reilly who was also a Dillinger gangster.

The files disclose that both gangs had mutual contacts with Harry Sawyer in St. Paul, Minnesota, it being remembered that Harry Sawyer took the place of Dapper Dan Hogan, who was murdered in gangland fashion. The Barkers had their contacts with Harry Sawyer for a considerable period prior to the advent of John Dillinger. The manner in which Dillinger made his contact with Harry Sawyer is not known, but it will be remembered that very definite information has been obtained that Homer Van Meter, Tommy Carroll, "Pat" Reilly and other members of the Dillinger gang were very friendly with Harry Sawyer.

Both gangs had mutual contacts with Louie Ceronaky, of Fox River Grove, Illinois. Ceronaky is perhaps the most notorious harborer of dangerous criminals who has ever come to the attention of the Bureau. [REDACTED] has given the Bureau splendid information with regard to members of these two gangs being harbored by Louie Ceronaky. Similar information has been obtained from various members of the Barker - Karpis gang and also from [REDACTED]

The two gangs also had mutual contacts with Joey and Robby O'Brien, who are alleged to be the operators of the Hi-Ho Club in Chicago, Illinois. It has been intimated from time to time that the O'Briens furnished members of the Barker - Karpis and also members of the Dillinger gangs with arms and ammunition. The Bureau has been unable to develop any specific information along this line.

Alvin Karpis & Harry Sawyer

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The two gangs also had mutual contacts with ~~Tom Brown~~, former Chief of Police at St. Paul, Minnesota. You will recall that Baby Face Nelson advised representatives of this Bureau that members of the Dillinger gang contributed substantial financial assistance to Tom Brown when he recently ran for election as sheriff of Ramsey County, of which St. Paul, Minnesota, is the county seat. Very positive information has also been obtained to the effect that Tom Brown on several occasions warned members of the Barker - Karpis gang to evacuate their apartments in anticipation of police raids. Brown also acted as an informer for members of the Barker - Karpis gang during the Bremer kidnaping period and was to receive a substantial portion of the ransom in payment for his services.

The Seafood Inn, near Elmhurst, Illinois, also appears to have been a place of mutual contacts for the two gangs. It will be remembered that after the shooting of John Hamilton in the vicinity of South St. Paul, Minnesota, on April 23, 1934, members of the Barker - Karpis gang and also members of the Dillinger gang met at the Seafood Inn where John Hamilton in a badly wounded condition was transferred from the automobile driven by Homer Van Meter to the automobile of Volney Davis and was then transported to the home of Volney Davis, 415 Post Street, Aurora, Illinois. Davis cared for Hamilton as best he could until Hamilton died on the night of April 26, 1934. Dillinger and Van Meter remained at the home of Davis during this period and did not leave his home until the night of April 29, 1934, after Davis had obtained an automobile through Elmer Farmer so that Dillinger and Van Meter could make a safe getaway. The persons burying Hamilton the night of April 26, 1934, were "Doc" Barker, Harry Campbell, John Dillinger, Homer Van Meter, William Weaver and Volney Davis.

Your attention is now directed to the close contact which Baby Face Nelson maintained with Frank E. Cochran, operator of the Air Service Garage, 241 South Virginia Street, Reno, Nevada. The presence of Baby Face Nelson in Reno, Nevada, to our knowledge, antedated that of members of the Barker - Karpis gang. Cochran was convicted and sentenced to a year and one day and to pay a \$2,000 fine on the charge of having harbored Lester Willis. Investigation of the Bremer case in Reno, Nevada, disclosed that in November and December of 1933 members of the Barker - Karpis gang had their automobiles repaired at the Air Service Garage in Reno, Nevada. At the time this investigation was conducted, Frank Cochran identified the photographs of several members of the Barker - Karpis gang.

You will also recall that Thomas C. Williams, alias Tobe Williams, of Vallejo, California, was convicted on the charge of having harbored Baby Face Nelson. In this connection your attention is directed to the fact that investigation in the Bremer case has disclosed that Alvin Karpis during February of 1933 had his tonsils removed at the hospital operated by Tobe Williams at Vallejo, California. This information was furnished by Williams voluntarily to an Agent of this Bureau. Williams has also advised that he became acquainted with Mrs. Kate Barker during the Spring of 1933 and that he visited with her at Lake Tahoe, Nevada. We also recalled having seen her on the street and talked to her subsequent to that time, when she advised him that she was in California having her eyes treated. He disclaimed any knowledge of the Barker brothers and denied knowing that Kate Barker was in any way related to the Barker boys.

It is interesting to note, however, that during the last days of September 1934, Baby Face Nelson, his wife and Fatsomagri visited Tobe Williams at Vallejo, California, at which time Nelson asked Williams where he, Nelson, could get in touch with Freddie and Ray, undoubtedly referring to Fred Barker and Alvin Karpis. Tobe Williams told Nelson at that time if he, Nelson, would return in the Spring of 1935, he, Williams, would be able to arrange a contact between Nelson and Freddie and Ray. At this time Tobe Williams introduced Nelson to a stranger. Nelson later advised Fatsomagri that this stranger was a good contact to get in touch with Freddie and Ray.

You will now recall that a .45 caliber Army automatic revolver which was found in the possession of William Weaver on September 1, 1935, at the time of his apprehension at Allandale, Florida, was obtained by Weaver, according to his own admission, from Tommy Carroll, deceased Dillinger gangster. Weaver alleged that he obtained this gun from Carroll more than a year ago.

Advised Agents of this Bureau that members of the Barker - Karpis gang were very friendly with the Graham - McKay outfit in Reno, Nevada. Investigation has also disclosed that members of the Barker - Karpis gang at several times after the Bremer kidnaping visited Reno, Nevada, with efforts being made to immediately dispose of some of the ransom money so that the gang would have some ready

cash and discussing arrangements whereby "Doc" Barker and Fred Gets would fly to Reno in order to dispose of a certain quantity of the money. Gets declined to fly to Reno for this purpose since he was not known to the proper persons at that place. Gets failing to make the trip, "Doc" Barker flew to Reno and returned with approximately ten one thousand dollar bills. One of these one thousand dollar bills was found on Fred Gets on March 20, 1934, at the time of his violent death on the streets of Cicero, Illinois. This bill, according to Edna Murray was a mate to another one thousand dollar bill which Volney Davis had in his possession at the time of the death of Gets. Baby Face Nelson acted as chauffeur for William J. Graham, of Reno, Nevada. He frequently brought cars of Graham's to the Air Service Garage where they were repaired by mechanics hired by Frank B. Cochran. It has been intimated and is strongly believed by Agents who have conducted pertinent investigation that Roy John Frisch was done away by Baby Face Nelson and John Paul Chase due to the solicitation of William J. Graham in order to prevent Frisch from testifying against Graham in a mail fraud case which was to be heard in New York City.

When Byron Bolton was taken to the County Jail at Chicago, Illinois, in August of 1935, he advised that Karpis had a contact on the West Coast known as "Soap" and that he had often heard members of the Barker - Karpis gang speak of this person, "Soap". "Soap" is identical with Anthony "Soap" Mareno, who is considered to be a dangerous criminal on the West Coast and who was a harbinger of Baby Face Nelson. Mareno was sentenced to serve six months in the county jail on the charge of conspiracy to harbor Lester Joseph Gillis.



DETAILS: Agent interviewed Lawrence Johnson, 446 North Beach Street, Daytona Beach, Florida, a clerk for and a brother to Gene Johnson, in Gene Johnson's Sport Shop at that location. Johnson stated that he has known the Osbornes for a period of about a year; that they on several occasions bought fishing tackle and sporting goods at the shop. Johnson stated that on Monday, August 26, 1935, he was talking to Jack London and others about selling Osborne a gun; that London advised him that he was suspicious of Osborne; that he had seen a picture in the Post Office that resembled Osborne, and that he had always been suspicious of the Osbornes being a retired bootlegger, as he had pretended to be. Johnson advised Agent that he thought that London was joking about the matter and that night he, in company with his wife, made a trip to the Post Office to see if there really was a picture there resembling

Osborne, finding none and he thought nothing more about the matter.

Upon being questioned about selling Osborne a gun, Johnson stated that they had in the shop an old Remington Automatic Shotgun which they had had for a period of about two years, and that on about August 16 or 17, 1935, he had loaned Osborne this gun and he liked it so well that he came back to the shop and stated he wanted to buy it, giving them \$50.00 in cash. Johnson did not have a record of the serial number of this gun and nothing more than a sales slip, dated August 16, 1935, showing the sale of a gun for \$50.00 cash.

Agent interviewed Jack London, 106 South Helena Street, Daytona Beach, Florida, who stated that he worked for the Florida Power and Light Company, and that his company had sold Osbornes about \$1,000.00 worth of electrical equipment, and that for some reason or other he had always been suspicious of Osbornes activities in that locality and on Monday, before Osborne's apprehension on September 1, 1935, he had made a remark to Lawrence Johnson that he thought Osborne was a wanted man, having seen a picture resembling him on the bulletin board at the Daytona Beach Post Office. London stated that he did not believe his identification certain enough to warrant his reporting the matter to the police, and that the fact that no reward was offered had nothing to do with his failure to report the matter.

London corroborated Johnson's statements as to the time this matter was brought to Johnson's attention. He stated that they were in fact talking about the sale of the gun in question to Osborne when he remarked of his suspicions, and then only in a joking way.

In view of the information obtained from Johnson, corroborated by London, no signed statement was taken from Johnson as to the circumstances in connection with his possible knowledge that Osborne was identical with Weaver or wanted by authorities. It is to be noted further that the gun in question was sold to Osborne on August 16, 1935, and the conversation in regard to Osborne's true identity did not take place until August 26, 1935.

On September 18, 1935, H. C. Merritt, Inspector, Immigration Border Patrol, Jacksonville, Florida, called at the Jacksonville Bureau Office and advised that on September 17, 1935, when he was in Daytona Beach, Florida, Mrs. Pappas, who operates the "New Yorker", a bar at Daytona Beach, informed him that during the summer and until about a month ago one Kenneth Hill had been around Daytona Beach and that when Weaver, alias J. W. Osborne, was living near Allendale, Florida, on one occasion Kenneth Hill was in her bar room when Weaver and his wife and child, Bobby, entered. Hill invited Osborne to have a drink, after which he

invited them to go for a drive; that she believes that possibly Kenneth Hill might have been connected in some way with Weaver or some members of his mob; that he had considerable money, much of it being in bills of large denomination, and that he would always have other people in Daytona Beach change the bills at the bank there for small bills; that at one time, while drunk, Hill is alleged to have stated that he formerly changed money in Cuba.

Agent interviewed Ethel Pappas at the "New Yorker Bar" in Daytona Beach, who gave practically the same information as that reported by Inspector H. C. Merritt. Upon being questioned about Hill's meeting Weaver in her bar, Mrs. Pappas admitted that she did not know that the man with the woman and child, who were greeted by Hill, was in fact Weaver, and upon being questioned further about the money Hill was sending to the bank to be changed, she stated that she at one time carried a \$100.00 bill, obtained from Hill, to the bank for change. Upon inquiry she was advised that the money was not counterfeit.

Mrs. Pappas stated that Hill left Daytona Beach about the middle of August, 1935, and that she did not know where he had gone, where he came from, or where he resided while in Daytona Beach. Mrs. Pappas gave the following meager description of Hill:

Name	Kenneth Hill
Age	45-50 years
Height	5' 4"
Weight	About 135 lbs
Hair	Grey
Eyes	Grey
Teeth	4 upper front gold.

There being no indication that Hill was connected in any way with Weaver or members of the Karpis-Barker mob, no further investigation is being made relative to Hill's possible identity.

On October 4, 1935, Jack Ollendike, 414 North Beach Street, Daytona Beach, Florida, by long-distance telephone, advised the Jacksonville Office that he had some information concerning a man he thought was wanted by this Bureau; that this individual's name was Webster and he came to Daytona Beach on the date that Weaver and Myrtle Eaton were apprehended near that city and he thought possibly there might be some connection.

Agent interviewed Mr. Ollendike at his place of business at the above-mentioned address and he advised that Webster had arrived in Daytona Beach some time prior to August 15, 1935, and had defrauded several other business men and himself out of considerable amounts of money; that he could show no connection whatsoever between Webster and Weaver, but he thought that possibly the Bureau would like to make some investigation in Daytona Beach since this man was such a clever crook and had defrauded so many of the local citizens.

Agent explained to Mr. Ollendike that until some Federal Law was violated the Bureau did not have any investigative jurisdiction in the case and that the matter should be referred to local officials.

On November 1, 1935, I advised you that Mr. Rolf Harbo of the Statistical Section had informed me that a news item had been carried in a Minneapolis paper to the effect that the Government was going to have some difficulty in removing Cassius McDonald from Detroit, Michigan, to St. Paul, Minnesota, in consequence of which the trial of Harry Sawyer and William Weaver would probably have to go forward without McDonald.

Authority having been granted by you, I called Mr. Clinton Stein, Acting Special Agent in Charge of the St. Paul Office, at 2:45 P. M., November 1, 1935. He explained that there was no foundation for the rumor that Cassius McDonald would not be removed, and explained that the United States Attorney had recently discussed the trial date in this matter with Mr. Justice Joyce and that it was anticipated the entire matter would not be called for trial until some time during the month of January, 1936, so that any difficulties arising out of the removal of Cassius McDonald would be "ironed out" before that time.

Mr. Stein stated that Mr. Sullivan, United States Attorney, St. Paul, now intimates he would like to have William Weaver plead guilty.

Since this telephonic call, the St. Paul Office has advised that the United States Attorney and Judge Joyce have tentatively arranged to have the trial in this matter come on in St. Paul, during January, 1936.



Muzzey, who is attending the current re-training school, that Muzzey speaks and understands conversational Lithuanian, he stating that he could understand conversations transpiring over a telephone, and accordingly Mr. Muzzey was instructed to proceed to Chicago by the first available railroad transportation. These instructions were issued to Mr. Muzzey at approximately 9:45 P.M. on November 6, 1935, and Mr. Ladd was advised that Mr. Muzzey would report in Chicago on November 7th, and further instructed to have Agent Turrou return to the New York Office.

General, dated Jan 12, 1923; these differences might be new writing habits acquired in the last 12 to 15 years.

had not been in contact with any of his previous associates during that time and had had no opportunity to receive any information concerning any of the remaining fugitives and that he had been employed most of the time in the mines and consequently could furnish no information of value.

Agent Farland called at the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, on 10-30-35 for the purpose of interviewing Ray Larson. The records at that institution reflect that Ray Larson had not been an inmate of that institution since 1930.

When interviewing convict Raymond Peele at the Kansas State Penitentiary, Lansing, he advised that Ray Larson was now serving a sentence at the U. S. Penitentiary Annex at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. At that institution Ray Larson, register #5870, was interviewed and he stated that he had no information that he could furnish the Government. He was very reluctant to answer any questions, stating that he had seventy-seven days to do and that he thought that he could do that time and wanted to be left alone; that he would not furnish any information even though he had it.

The records at the U. S. Penitentiary Annex reflect that Ray Larson had been interviewed on 9-14-34 by Special Agent R. P. Shanahan, formerly of the Kansas City office, and by Special Agents A. J. Norstrom and A. E. Farland of the Kansas City Bureau office on 9-26-34, at which time Larson advised that he had observed Karpis on the streets in Kansas City a short time prior to his incarceration, but at which time he had no definite information as to where Karpis could be located.

Agent interviewed Nicholas Delmore of Berkley Heights, N.J., at the office of his attorney Mr. Frederick M. Pearse, Newark, N.J. Information obtained from Delmore at this interview is as follows: that about December 1st, 1932, Delmore left for Reno, Nevada, where he registered upon arrival at the Riverside Hotel. He remained in this hostelry for a week or two and he then moved to an apartment located near the Riverside Hotel, where he remained, the address of which he was

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unable to recall, for a period of two or three months, and then moved to Jack Dempsey's house, also located in Reno. Delmore informed that he remained at Jack Dempsey's house the remainder of the time that he stayed in Reno, with the exception of the summer months, when he stayed at Lake Tahoe, his house being one that faces the number one hole on the golf course located at Lake Tahoe.

When questioned as to any knowledge of Slim Burns or any Burns brothers, Delmore informed that the only Burns that he met or knew while at Reno was a lawyer by that name, who represented Jack Dempsey's interests in Reno; that he was never closely associated with this lawyer Burns, but he had seen him several times, since he himself was staying at Jack Dempsey's hotel.

Delmore stated that Louis Marymont was fairly well known to him, since Louis operated the "Town House", a speak-easy in Reno, which place he frequented four or five times a week; that when he did frequent the "Town House", he would merely go there to drink or to meet some girlfriends, inasmuch as the "Town House" was the most popular place in Reno with the women. Also, that he met William Graham and James McKay at the "Bank Club"; that these men were partners who operated the games at the "Bank Club", and inasmuch as they would meet at this place, he grew to know them very intimately; that on occasions he would go out on parties with them, but these occasions were very infrequent.

As for other associates while in Reno, Delmore was able to name only one: a judge by the name of Bartlett and his family, consisting of a wife and daughter. As for Judge Bartlett's reputation, Delmore informed that he is a person of some prestige in and about Reno, and that he and his family are of the very highest type and so far as he knows, they are above reproach in any respect.

About September 1st, 1933, Delmore stated he returned east.

Mr. Pearse informed that for reasons that he did not wish to make known at the present time, Delmore did not return to the State of New Jersey until October 11, 1933.

It should be stated here that Nicholas Delmore and William Weisman, at the time they were in Reno, were fugitives from justice, having been indicted by the State of New Jersey for the murder of a Federal prohibition officer. Mr. Pearse represents both of these men and on frequent occasions during this interview, he advised Delmore not to answer. Delmore was advised not to answer interrogatories as: For what reason did you go to Reno, Nevada; did you use your own name while in Reno; and, particularly when asked if he knew William Golder. Mr. Pearse later explained these interruptions on his part, stating that Delmore had been acquitted of the murder charge but Weisman had not yet been tried and he did not want his client's position jeopardized. Mr. Pearse advised that he would not grant his permission for his client William Weisman to be interviewed by an Agent until he had been tried. He further stated that he thinks the indictment against Weisman will be dismissed on or about December 8th, 1935. - no reason was given for this statement.
