McLaughlin and State Representative James Campbell and subsequent conversations of the Mayor with other persons at 11.18 A.M., 11.40 A.M. and 11.51 A.M., where the Mayor indicates his confidence in the opinion that the legislative investigation of the administration "fizzling out".

Also note in the above calls that Mayor McLaughlin practically dictated to Rep. Campbell and State Senator Wheatley as to how they should vote on legislative matters. McLaughlin did practically the same thing in talking with State Representative Hollingsworth in the conversation over #648 at 9.47 A.M.

In the call at 10.20 A.M. over telephone #648, the Mayor agreed to fix a parking ticket for one of John Clements' "boys".



The calls recorded at 1:55 P.M. and 10:47 A.M. xxxxx pertain to \$25.0 gambling debt mentioned in yesterday's memorandum. It appears "Dutch" Akers is playing both ends in this case.

There are attached the logs for January 21, 1937 on the taps being maintained on telephones 125, 446 and 648 at Hot Springs Ark.


It appears from the telephone call made by Mayor McLaughlin at 9. 53A.M. to 2115 that this telephone is the unlisted telephone at the residence of William S. Jacobs. The subsequent telephone call made by Jacobs to McLaughlin at 9.54A.M. reflects their close association, it being noted that Jacobs is reported as practically controlling gambling at Hot Springs.

Your attention is directed to the telephone call over #648 at 10. 15A.M., wherein Carroll Hollingsworth reports to McLaughlin from Little Rock the status of the present legislative inquiry of the city administration at Hot Springs. From conversations previously overheard it appears that McLaughlin is the political "Boss" in Hot Springs and vicinity and controls and directs the official acts of Representatives James Campbell & Carroll Hollingsworth and State Senator Whatley.

Note that Chief of Detectives Herbert "Dutch" Akers is confined to his bed with an attack of "Flu".
