There are attached hereto the logs for January 4, 1937 covering the taps on telephones listed to the Chief of Police, City Jailor, and Mayor's Office, all located in the City Hall at Hot Springs, Arkansas.

Telephone number 2741 is the unpublished number of the Southern Club.

Note the calls recorded at 2:24 P.M. - 6:17 P.M. - ~~6:22 P.M.~~ ^{6:17 P.M.} They show that "Dutch" Akers has considerable influence with Chancellor Sam W. Garratt of the local Chancery Court. I wonder if this Miss Conners is Lou Conners, one of the subjects in the Kanmo Case.

It appears that the calls recorded at 2:43 P.M. and 4:06 P.M. are related to each other. It, however, is not known what the subject of their conversation was about.

The following conversation indicates a "fixing" of the Grand Jury probing the John Dickson case.

4:36 P.M. (1/4/46) Incoming on #128 J.L.M.

Ledgerwood: Is Dutch there -

Akers : Hello -

Ledgerwood: This is Verne - do you know the two colored fellows who are on that jury - one's name is Page.

Akers : Yes -

Ledgerwood: I wish you would contact them and tell them I want to see them in front of the City Hall at 8:30 in the morning.

Akers : O. K. Judge.

Note: The local newspapers disclosed that Will Page and E. I. Puckett are the two colored men on the Garland County Grand Jury probing the Dickson case.

A detailed memorandum was submitted by the writer on January 1, 1937, setting forth the above conversation, and the investigation subsequently conducted relative thereto.

Reference is made to that call ~~xxxxxx~~ recorded at 7:12 P.M. between Officer Curly Evans and Jimmie Phillips. The latter individual is an employee at the Southern Club, and the log shows that Curly Evans worked at the Southern Club on New Year's Eve. Phillips was probably referring to Evan's compensation for working that night when he said, "I'll leave it in an envelope up in front for you, and you can get it there."

Reference is made to that call recorded at 7:53 P.M. between Officer Jerry Watkins and Otis. The latter individual undoubtedly is Otis McGraw who is employed as some kind of a personnel manager at the Belvedere Club.

Note that conversation at 8:11 A.M. over the Mayor's telephone between Mayor McLaughlin and County Judge Elsa Housley. It indicates (maybe) the Mayor's stand on this Dickson case, and Judge Housley's reaction concerning it.

In explanation to that call at 10:05 A.M. between Mayor McLaughlin and Mr. Jack Holt, the present State Attorney General, please be advised that the newspapers have it that Dr. M. C. Evans of Hot Springs, an unsuccessful candidate for the senatorial nomination in the Thirty-first district filed a petition with Lt. Governor-elect Robert Bailey, challenging the right of Senator Walter Wheatley of Hot Springs to a seat in the Senate on the grounds that he once was convicted of violating the state prohibition laws. It would appear that the Mayor made the above call for Walter Wheatley to ascertain the attitude of Attorney General Holt in this matter., and also to take the opportunity to put in a good word for Wheatley.

That telephone call at 11:47 A.M. between Judge Ledgerwood and Mayor McLaughlin undoubtedly refers to the officers ~~xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx~~ who were suspended by the Mayor or who ~~were~~ expected to be indicted in connection with the John Dickson matter.

Witt Calls for Thorough Probe of Dickson Death As Grand Jury Convenes

Garland county's grand jury began an extensive investigation this morning into the ill-timed death of John Dickson, 32-year-old city jail prisoner whose death, his parents charge, resulted from mistreatment by members of the local police department.

More than 20 witnesses were scheduled to be examined, an authoritative source revealed this morning, and nearly half that many were questioned during the morning session.

The jury adjourned at 1 o'clock this afternoon and will not meet again until 9 o'clock tomorrow morning.

A large crowd of curious gathered about the court house, attracted by both the grand jury meeting and the meeting in the county courtroom of the Garland county Quorum court.

In issuing his charge to the grand jurors, Circuit Judge Earl Witt called attention to the reports of mistreatment of Dickson and declared: "These reports, if true, disclose an abusive treatment of this prisoner that not only deserves, but demands, your immediate full and fair investigation."

In addition to the Dickson case the grand jury also planned to probe into the alleged "torch death" of Mrs. Mary Cleo Grover, burned to death recently as she lay in bed in a Prospect avenue rooming house. Mrs. Grover's estranged husband, E. E. Grover, local masseur, is being held in jail without bond pending the investigation.

Judge Witt indicated that several other cases would also be presented to the grand jury. One estimate is that it might be two days before the grand jury completes its probe.

Judge Witt personally read his especially prepared charge to the grand jurors in which he emphasized the fact that "no officer has the right to abuse or mistreat a prisoner while in his custody." He added that such misconduct is not only a violation of the law, but also a violation of the sense of humanity itself.

The complete charge of Judge Witt to the jury follows:

"You have been called into session at this time primarily for the purpose of investigating the cause of the death of John Dickson, lately a prisoner confined in the city jail of Hot Springs. According to reports widely circulated, serious bodily injuries were inflicted upon him while in custody which caused or contributed to his death on Dec. 24th, 1936. These reports, if true, disclose an abusive treatment of this prisoner that not only deserves, but demands, your immediate full and fair investigation.

"Due notice of your investigation has been given to the interested parties with the request they provide you with such information they have as might be helpful to you. You will have no difficulty in ascertaining the nature and extent of those injuries. You should then endeavor to determine the cause of such injuries; whether they were inflicted upon him by an officers who had him in custody. And you should further determine whether such injuries caused his death or contributed to it.

"No officer has the right to abuse or mistreat a prisoner while in his custody. Such misconduct is not only a violation of the law, but it is as well a violation of that sense of humanity itself, possessed by every fair-minded citizen. It is the duty of an officer to provide protection for the prisoner in his custody; to shield him from harm or violence against those who might be evilly disposed toward him. And the officer who has the proper comprehension of his duties in this respect will provide such protection, even at the risk of danger to himself. Whatever the crime may be for which a prisoner is held, he has

the law will do all within his power to shield him from violence. And this principle and this law extends to that prisoner who himself, at some other time, may have assaulted the officer and inflicted upon him serious bodily injuries. You will find the case for your investigation at this time attended with such circumstances. Prior to the time of his arrest, either this prisoner or some of his confederates made a violent assault upon the Chief of Police of Hot Springs, who with other officers, was attempting to apprehend him. But this act, if committed by the prisoner, or by others acting in conjunction with him, would not excuse or justify the officers in mistreating the prisoner after his arrest. Such conduct should not, and will not, be tolerated in any enlightened community. In addition to the wrong done the prisoner himself, such practices, if continued, bring the offending officers into disrepute and render their testimony of no value to the state.

"If you find from your investigation that bodily injuries were inflicted upon this prisoner by officers who had him in custody, and that these injuries caused or contributed to his death, then you should charge such officers with the crime of murder or manslaughter, according as the circumstances may convince you of the degree of guilt of such parties:

"Reports in connection with this case indicate the prisoner was suffering with pneumonia and that his death may have been the result of this disease. Even though you may believe that the officers or some of them inflicted bodily injuries upon the prisoner, yet if you find that such injuries did not cause his death or contribute to it, then such parties could not be charged with either murder or manslaughter. If the death of the prisoner would not have occurred at the time it did except for the injuries at the hands of the officers, then such injuries would be considered a contributing cause of his death. But if you find that his death would have occurred at the time it did regardless of the injuries he received, then the persons responsible for those injuries could be charged only with the crime of aggravated assault."
