HAVANA, Feb. 4.—Technicalities embodied in the extradition treaty between the United States and Cuba were swiftly complied with today by the United States embassy and Cuban state department officials to permit President Carlos Mendieta to sign extradition papers for the return of Nathaniel Heller, American manager of the Hotel Parkview, to Brooklyn eart, next week, according to Guillermo Diblanck, subsecretary of state.

Two United States department of justice agents, Samuel K. McKee and Ralph Brown, with Cuban associates, are investigating alleged activities of the Karpis gang here. It is alleged that Heller last month purchased a palatial home at Varadero beach for Alvin Karpis. The residence was formerly owned by former Senator Viriato Gutierrez, a son-in-law of former President Gerardo Machado. The home and its fifty acre estate has an appraised value of more than \$50,000. Auto Is Confiscated.

Cables said to have been signed by Heller and addressed to Karpis at Miami and other cities in the United States, together with the automobile the hotel man is said to have purchased for the gang leader, were declared to have been confiscated by the department of justice agents.

They added that they have evidence that Karpis, accompanied by Heller, left Havana for Miami in September, 1934, remaining there until Dec. 5, when they returned here. The gang leader, the agents charged, registered at the Parkview hotel here and in Miami under the name of E. N. Wagner.

Claim \$25,000 Was Advanced.

Furthermore, the agents allege that Heller received from Karpis some \$25,000, according to documentary evidence confiscated. Heller has been held incommunicado since last Thursday.



Bremer Suspect Flees After Plane Is Forced Down in Illinois.

ARREST KEPT SECRET

Mrs. Stacey, Arragned in Street Shooting, Was Fugitive's Companion.

PITTSBURG, KAS., Feb. 7.—
(Special)—A man who gave his name as H. C. Stanley of Pittsburg, and two women, as yet unidentified, were arrested early Thursday by federal officers and local police. Officers said Stanley was a friend of Jess Doyle. The trio was captured after a running gun battle. The prisoners were being held incommunicado in jail here.

Because of a forced airplane landing and an order for a glass of beer by a federal agent, Jess Doyle, 34 years old, for whom a nationwide hunt had been conducted for several months by the department of justice, was at liberty somewhere in Illinois Thursday.

Doyle, who is a fugitive from a Bremer kidnaping indictment in St. Paul, was arrested by federal officers in Kansas City Wednesday afternoon.

The arrest came on information they obtained after Mrs. Vinita Stacey, 32, Doyle's companion, had not and critically wounded Mrs. Trances Taylor, 26, at Thirty-fourth freet and Gillham road Tuesday (ternoon.

Jumps Through Window.

They loaded Doyle into an airlane and started for Chicago. The lane was forced down near York-lle, Ill. The agents took him into restaurant at Yorkville and recoved his shackles. Needs \$16,500 in Bonds.

Justice Mazuch set her bond at \$15,000 on the assault charge and \$1,500 on the charge of carrying concealed weapons. She went to the county jail in default, still maintaining her silence as to the reasons for shooting.





BEER LEADS TO ESCAPE.

Federal Agent Unshackled Doyle in Front of Bar.

(By the Associated Press.)

AURORA, I.L., Feb. 7.—Jess Doyle, under indictment in connection with the Bremer kidnaping, alugged a federal department of justice agent last night and escaped by leaping through a window of a hotel.

Doyle was in the custody of two federal agents who were taking him from Kansas City to Chicago by airplane. The pilot, unable to locate the municipal airport, made a forced landing on the farm of E. L. Matiock of Yorkville, near Aurora and about fifty miles southwest of Chicago.

DOYLE A PRISONER

Jail at Girard, Kas., Holds a Man Identified as the Bremer Case Fugitive.

VOLUNTARY SURRENDER

His Car Mired in Flight After Battle, He Asks Farmer to Call Sheriff.

APARTMENT HERE IS FOUND

Mrs. Stacey's Key Fits Lock at 23 Warner Plaza, but Place Yields Nothing.

A man who has been identified as Jess Doyle was held last night in the county jail at Girard, Kas.

The 34-year-old gangster had been sought since he was indicted in the kidnaping of Edward G. Bremer, wealthy St. Paul banker. He was captured when mud halted his flight, following a battle with Pittsburg, Kas., officers earlier in the afternoon, near Cherokee, Kas.

Doyle surrendered without, resistance, after escaping from a police trap at Pittsburg at the risk of his life. Ross Armstrong, Pittsburg police chief, said Doyle had been "coming and going" at the home of Mr. and Mrs. H. C. Stanley for some time. Police and federal agents laid the trap for him Wednesday night, after it was reported Doyle had eluded six federal men "somewhere in the south part of Kansas City," Wednesday.

Showing Doyle the Way.

As the officers prepared to raid the Stanley home early yesterday, Doyle and Stanley appeared and drove away. The officers followed. Stanley, apparently showing Doyle the way out of town, soon turned back. The officers closed in and exchanged shots with Doyle. He escaped, and the officers returned and arrested the Stanleys and Edna Murray, who it was said had gone to Pittsburg with Doyle.

After his car became hopelessly mired twelve miles southwest of Pittsburg, Doyle walked to a farm house and told the farmer to call the sheriff


ILLINOIS SEARCH GOES ON.

Cummings Says Only That Man Who Fled Was Not Karpis.

(By The Ster's Lessed Wire Service.)
CHICAGO, Feb. 7.—Police within a radius of 100 miles of Chicago were searching tonight for the man who secaped from two federal agents Wednesday night at Yorkville, Ill., by slugging one and plunging through a closed window. The department of justice declined to reveal his name.

About the time of the Yorkville escape, the agents asked the police to be on the lookout for Jess Doyle, who has been indicted for the kidnaping of Edward C. Bremer of St. Paul. At 9:35 p. m., they notified the police to watch for a desperate man in the car taken by the Yorkville fugitive, and added the warning that one coming upon him should shoot to kill. It was assumed first that the man was Doyle. But a dispatch from Girard, Kas, tonight stated Doyle was in jail there with federal agents guarding him.

E. J. Connelly, in charge of the bureau of investigation here, said all inquiries must be sent to Washington. Homer Cummings, attorney general, said his information in the matter was fragmentary. He would state positively only that the man who fled was not Alvin Karpis, the latest nominee for America's public enemy No. 1.

RAGE BRINGS GANG WOE

VINITA STACEY HINTS AT CAUSE OF SHOOTING.

She Lost Her Head, the Woman Remarks, and Police Believe Shots Began Series of Trouble for Hoodlums.

A woman in a rage apparently precipitated the chain of sensational events the last few days that resulted in shootings, gun battles with federal agents and finally the capture of Jess Doyle, indicted in the kidnaping of Edward G. Bremer, St. Paul banker, and Edna Murray, an escaped convict since 1931.

Close-mouthed with Information, as gangdom is, Mrs. Vinita Stacey dropped a remark today at the county jail in a conversation with T. J. Higgins, chief of detectives, that made many of the events stand out clearly. Mrs. Stacey is held in connection with the shooting of Mrs. Helen Rush, also known as Frances Taylor, at Thirty-fourth street and Robert Gillham road Tuesday night.

"You're pretty wise, aren't you?" asked Higgins, almost in exasperation at the deft parrying of the prisoner.

"No, I'm not wise," she replied, smiling cryptically. "Look what I caused by losing my head."


Although Vinita Stacey did not elaborate, Higgins believes she meant by shooting Helen Rush she had "stirred up a hornet's nest." A gang of six men was being formed, police believe, with Doyle, John Langdon, Jack Rich and others planning to make Kansas City its headquarters

They believe Doyle was the occupant of the car and that he fled from Kansas City to Pittsburg im-mediately after he learned of the arrest of the Stacey woman. Federal agents became active in the Kansas City angle of the Bremer investigation as soon as the real identities of "Mrs. Rush" and Mrs. Stacey were established. Then the arrest of a man believed to be Doyle was announced Wednesday afternoon. Two agents of the division of investigation, department of justice. left the Kansas City airport at 3:30 o'clock Wednesday afternoon with their prisoner in a Chicago bound airplane. When it was gorunded near Yorkville the agents and their prisoner went to a Yorkville hotel.







OUTLAW ESCAPES MYSTERIOUSLY **EROM U.S. AGENTS**

Flees as One Buys Drink; Identity Shielded.

(Pictures on back page.) Police within a radius of a hundred miles of Chicago were searching last night for a man-name carefully suppressed by federal department of justice agents here but described as "a desperate character" — who escaped

from two agents Wednesday night at Yorkville, 58 miles southwest of Chicago, by slugging one agent and plunging through a closed window of a

A short distance from the scene of the slugging and his escape the fugitive found an automobile, its engine running, standing unguarded. In this car he fled toward Chicago. The car was discovered near Wheaton short-ly after dawn yesterday.

"Prison" Plane Forced Down.

The mysterious prisoner had been placed aboard an airplane in Kansas City, Mo., about midafternoon Wednes-day. Those in the plane with him were the two agents, whose names are believed to be Garrity and Trainor, and the pilot, Joseph Jacobson of Kansas He was heavily manacled, hand and foot.

Shortly before 7 p. m. Pilot Jacobson made a forced landing in a field on the farm of E. L. Matlock, near Yorkville, in Kendall county. Matlock and a neighbor, William Ford, who had heard the plane circling overhead. went over to the field and found the occupants uninjured.

They were just climbing out of the cabin. As soon as the prisoner was on the ground the agents removed his handcuffs and leg irons, according to the witnesses. This is another element of mystery in the affair—why the irons should have been kept on while the captive had no chance to ortunity developed.

Goes to Hotel Unmanacled.

In a Ford car, accompanied by the bwner, the two agents and their prisoner went to the Nading hotel in Yorkville. One agent, supposedly Trainor, went into a telephone booth and put in a call for the offices of the department of justice in Chicago. The other, Garrity, took his desperate but sunbound prisoner into the bar. ,
"What'll you have?"

"I'll take beer," replied the prisoner.
Looking on were the proprietor of
the hotel, Charles Leech; his wife, Elsie; Grace Larrison, a barmaid, and Russell Campbell and Quentin Blair, residents of Yorkville.

"Here's to you," said the agent, faising his glass. "And here's to you," said the

prisoner. With a swift motion he tossed the montents of the glass into the face of the agent, struck his captor a stagsering blow on the jaw, and plunged through the glass window. As the desperado went through the glass, the sprawling agent got to his feet, drew his pistol, and fired three times.

Escapes Bullets; Flees in Car. Apparently the shots were all snesses. The other agent at the thephone dropped the receiver and, with

Ms companion accompanying. out into the street. More shots were fired, but the fugitive eluded them. block away he found the car, the property of J. W. Bretthauer, a York-ville grocer. In this he drove away, a fact of which the agents were seemingly not aware for nearly an hour. They called the Joliet police, giving

the license number of the car, at 7:58 p. m. They called the Elgin police at 2:08 p. m., and the department of jus-Mce office here at \$:04.

The apparent importance to the department of justice of the man who fied was evidenced by the sending of about 30 federal agents to Aurora and to other towns.

The actions of the departmen of sustice agents in Chicago during the late afternoon and early evening wednesday had about them the rysterious air of "large things afoot." Four armed men went to the airport about 6 p. m. and met a large plane in which, it was reported, six men

Send Out Police Warning.

At 7 p. m., about the time of the Yorkville escape, the agents asked the police to be on the lookout for Jesse Doyle, desperado who has been indicted for the kidnaping of Edward G. 

DOYLE CAPTURED.

The two agents, whose names were not revealed took him to a hotel. While one phoned Chicago, the second took the prisoner to a bar.

There the man suddenly flung a stein of beer in the agent's face plunged through a glass window and escaped apparently unharmed by shots from the astonished agent's gun.

Federal agents found his trail Wednesday when Mrs. Helen Rush, fugitive in an attempted extortion case, was shot and critically wounded in Kansas City by Mrs. Vinita Stacey, Doyle's sweetheart. Police said the women had apparently quarreled over division of the gang's loot.
