INDIANAPOLIS, (P) — Federal Department of Justice agents had in their custody last night "one of the last remnants" of the shattered gang once headed by Alvin Karpis and the Barker brothers—Arthur and Fred.

Stepping quietly into a North Side tavern here Monday night, they seized, without any struggle, Anthony Joseph Amersbach, 40, wanted in Toledo, Ohio, for harboring members of the Karpis gang and as an accessory after the fact in the 1934 kidnaping of Edward G. Bremer of St. Paul. Amersbach, unarmed, was sipping a glass of cognac when the officers arrived. No announcement of the arrest was made until yesterday.

Kidnap Suspect Arraigned Here



Anthony Joseph Amersbach, 40 (center, Cleveland, charged with harboring Alvin Karpis and Harry Campbell, kidnapers of Edward Bremer, remained in jail here today in default of \$20,000 bond.

The prisoner protested against the high bond set by U. S. Commissioner Fae Patrick, and said he "could have made a \$10,000 bond."

Federal Judge Robert C. Baltzell today ordered the prisoner returned to Toledo.

Asked by the judge how his hair got so white, the prisoner replied: "by being in a legitimate business."

Amersbach was captured by agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation early yesterday in a North Side tavern. Herold H. Reinecke, head of the Indianapolis FBI office, said the arrest virtually completed roundup of the Karpis-Barker kidnap gang.

\$20,000 BOND HOLDS KARPIS GANG'S SHIELD

**Tony Amersbach Taken
Here After Flashing Roll
In Night Spots—Says
Bail Too Big.**

Accused of giving food and shelter to Alvin Karpis and Harry Campbell, kidnapers of Edward Bremer, Anthony Joseph (Tony) Amersbach, 40 years old, of Cleveland, O., was held here under bond of \$20,000 last night.

Bond was set at a hearing before Fae W. Patrick, United States commissioner. Amersbach protested the amount set for bond and asserted that he "could have made a \$10,000 bond."

Amersbach's display of large sums of money around taverns in and near the city in the last two months helped bring him to the attention of agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Two of them captured him as he sat in a North side tavern shortly before closing time yesterday morning. Amersbach had a tiny glass of cognac brandy and a \$10 bill on the table before him. He grabbed the bill but left the liquor.

Cleans Gang's Slate.

Jubilantly, Herold H. Reinecke, chief of the FBI here, asserted that the capture means virtual completion of the roundup of members of the notorious Karpis-Barker band of snatchers.

Mr. Reinecke said that Amersbach is charged with harboring the kidnapers at Parma, O., Feb. 24, 1935, and with being an accessory after the fact of the holding for ransom of the wealthy St. Paul (Minn.) banker in 1934. The pair alleged to have enjoyed Amersbach's hospitality now are serving life imprisonment on impregnable Alcatraz island for the kidnaping.

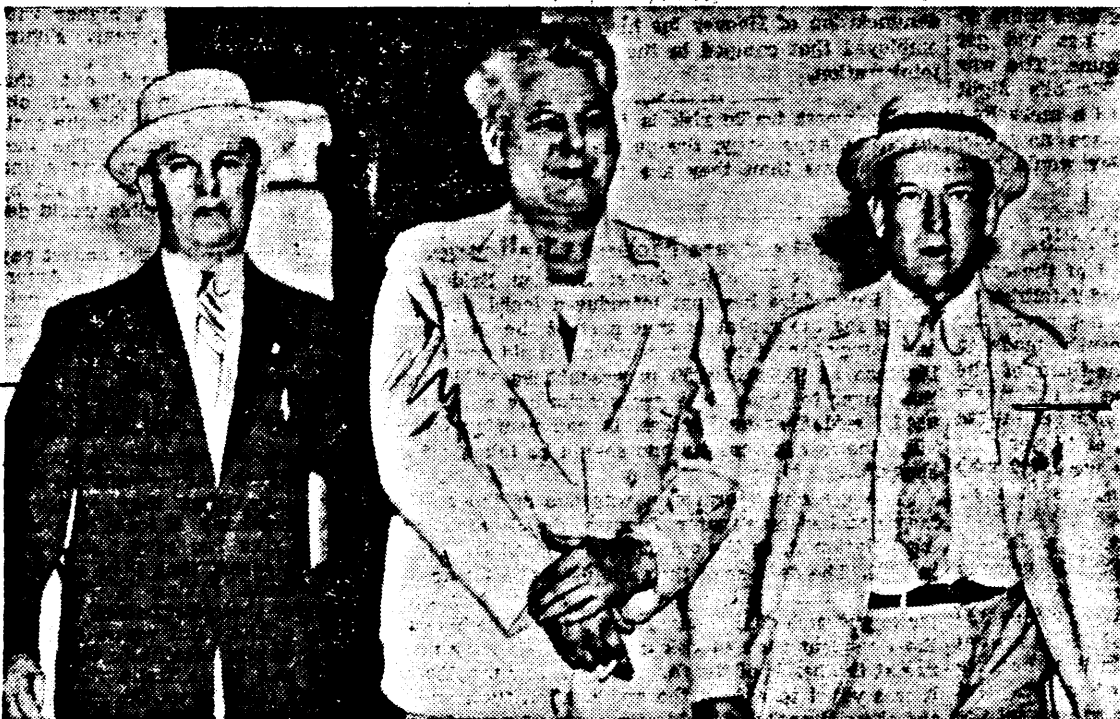
Amersbach is a fugitive from an indictment in Toledo (O.) Federal District Court. He will be taken there soon, Charles W. James, United States marshal, said last night.

Heavily built and possessed of a shock of iron-gray hair and a matinee idol's profile, Amersbach is a man of striking appearance.

Bremer Held 22 Days.

Mr. Bremer was kidnaped at St. Paul Jan. 17, 1934, and held captive in Illinois for 22 days until ransom of \$200,000 was paid. Amersbach, it is charged, harbored two of the kidnapers during the time they were fugitives.

Mr. Reinecke said that he had been informed that Amersbach is wanted in West Virginia on a robbery charge and that he engaged in a gang gun battle with Cleveland police in 1921. Amersbach, on the other hand, declared he had been "arrested only once before."

To date investigation of the Bremer kidnaping by Federal officers has resulted in the arrest and conviction of more than half a dozen men accused of having a part in the crime.

He was arrested in a tavern Monday night.

FACES PEN TERM IN WEST VIRGINIA

Clevelander Nabbed as Fugitive in Karpis Case

Anthony (Tony) Amersbach, arrested in Indianapolis as a fugitive on a charge of harboring Alvin Karpis and his gang at the Harvard Club, Newburg Heights gambling place of which he was part owner, also is wanted in West Virginia to begin serving a 21-year sentence for robbery, it was learned last night from United States District Attorney Emerich B. Freed.

Amersbach was being taken to West Virginia from Ohio Penitentiary, where he was confined as a parole violator, when he escaped, Freed said.

"Investigation of Amersbach's record discloses that he was arrested in Cuyahoga County a number of times before 1918, but that in almost every instance the charges were nolle," the district attorney said. "But this time he not only faces the federal charge of harboring Karpis and his men, but still has the 21-year sentence hanging over him in West Virginia."

Papers for the return of Amersbach were sent to Indianapolis yesterday by Freed. The fugitive was arrested in a beer parlor by Department of Justice agents as he was sipping a glass of cognac.

United States Commissioner Fee Patrick fixed Amersbach's bond at \$20,000.

Arthur Hebebrand, co-proprietor of the Harvard Club with Amersbach, and John (Sharkey) Gorman, club doorman and bouncer, recently pleaded guilty to harboring the Karpis gang at the club in January, 1936, and are serving prison terms.

When Amersbach disappeared in May it was reported he had \$40,000 of the club's money. Freed said he believed the reason Amersbach sought to escape was because of the West Virginia term.

Hears Karpis Gang Member Will Plead to Harboring Charge

Samuel Coker, who had an \$800-a-month legitimate income and became a member of the Alvin Karpis gang, indicated yesterday through his attorney to United States District Attorney Emerich B. Freed that he would like to plead to an indictment charging him with harboring the Karpis gang.

Coker was to have been the fifth man in the Garrettsville (O.) \$46,000 mail robbery Nov. 7, 1935, but illness forced him to go to a Toledo hospital and Benson (Soup) Groves was said to have been selected as the fifth man. Groves has never been apprehended.

Coker's legitimate income was from oil wells in which his family was interested, Freed said.

"At the moment he is in the Oklahoma State Penitentiary, where he is serving as a parole violator, having been placed on parole by William (Alfalfa Bill) Murray when governor," Freed said.

Coker was arrested in Toledo on a charge of violating the Dyer Act and returned as a parole violator to Oklahoma, where he was serving a sentence for robbery, Freed said.

It was a nurse-sweetheart of Coker's who gave the tip to federal agents which led to the arrest of Karpis, Harry Campbell and other members of the gang by J. Edgar Hoover, head of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, at New Orleans.

SEIZE ALLEGED KARPIS-BARKER AID IN INDIANA

Indianapolis, Ind., Aug. 24.—[Special.]—Tony Amersbach, 40 years old, Cleveland, said to have been an associate of the Karpis-Barker gang of kidnapers and robbers, was captured in a North Meridian street tavern today.

Agents of the federal bureau of investigation tapped Tony on the shoulder as he sat drinking alone in the crowded tavern, and his arrest was made so quietly that other patrons were unaware.

Amersbach will be sent to Cleveland to face charges of harboring the Karpis-Barker gang after the \$200,000 ransom kidnaping of Edward G. Bremer, wealthy St. Paul banker. He also will be charged as an accessory to the kidnaping.

Federal agents had been informed Amersbach was traveling between this city and Kentucky, usually carrying two or three revolvers. He was unarmed, however, when captured. Aside from admitting he was Tony Amersbach and that he formerly worked in a Cleveland gambling resort, he had nothing to say.

Quizzed After Husband's Arrest

He's Innocent, Wife of Kidnap Suspect Declares to G-Men

Stranded in a tourist camp while her husband faced charges of harboring members of the Barker-Karpis kidnap gang, Mrs. Eva Braun, 37, former night club hostess, today was questioned by Department of Justice agents here.

While Mrs. Braun tearfully asserted her innocence, G-Men announced they would take her husband, Joseph Amersbach, 40, to Toledo Saturday to face an indictment charging him with being an accessory after the fact in connection with the kidnaping of Edward Bremer, wealthy St. Paul banker, in 1934.

He was given a hearing before Judge Robert C. Baltzell in Federal Court yesterday.

Denies Guilt

"I'm the man that's wanted, but I deny any guilt," he said, waiving extradition proceedings.

As Amersbach remained in jail in default of \$20,000 bond, Federal agents received word that he had been spending week-ends this summer in a rented cottage at Lake Manitou and had represented himself as a disabled World War veteran and Indiana manager for a Louisville distillery.

Mrs. Braun, after telling of her 10 years of married life, said she did not know her husband was being held by Federal agents until she saw his picture in yesterday's local newspapers.

Amersbach was arrested by two agents in a North Side tavern early Tuesday. In addition to the harboring charges, he faces a 21-year sentence for robbery in West Virginia, according to Herold Reinecke, head of the local FBI Bureau.

Agents said they learned from Mrs. Braun that she and her husband had been living at the tourist camp nearly all summer and that he had operated a roadhouse near the city limits for several months.

Mrs. Braun told G-Men of her husband's connection with "gambling joints in Detroit, Louisville and Gary," but added that he had not told her much more.

"I never knew much about his business and I didn't ask," she said. "He would bawl me out if I went around to the places where he had business connections."

"He never said anything about all this trouble."

Story to Be Checked

Agents said they would communicate with Detroit, Louisville and Cleveland authorities to check Mrs. Braun's story. No charge has been placed against her, Mr. Reinecke said.

Mrs. Braun said she met her husband in Detroit and that she was the mother of an 8-year-old boy. She said she had operated dice games in Detroit night clubs and that her husband made her quit so she could be with him when he traveled.

"He couldn't help being associated with gamblers and racketeers. They were his best customers. But I don't think he is guilty of the charges against him," she said.

"All I want to do is to get out

and my clothes that are in it and get back to Louisville. Then I can get about \$500 down there and get back to Detroit."

Asked why they lived in tourist camps instead of in the city, Mrs. Braun said "Jimmy" preferred living in the country. She said they lived in a tourist cabin outside of Louisville for some time.

KARPIS GANGSTER CAPTURED HERE

G-Men Nab Tony Amersbach,
Cleveland, for Harboring
Kidnappers

Tony Amersbach was ordered removed to Toledo, O., this afternoon following a hearing before Fae W. Patrick, United States commissioner. Bond was set at \$20,000.

Gray-haired Tony Amersbach, age forty, Cleveland, who is said to have been an associate of the vanquished Karpis-Barker gang of kidnapers and robbers, was captured in a North Meridian street tavern Monday night while sipping cognac from a thimble glass.

Agents of the federal bureau of investigation working out of the Indianapolis office—G-men, if you please—tapped Tony on the shoulder as he sat alone in the crowded tavern, and his arrest was carried out so smoothly that fellow-drinkers were not aware that a long-sought purported criminal had been nabbed.

Harold H. Reinecke, head of the local office of the FBI, announced the arrest and said Amersbach will be sent back to Cleveland to face charges of harboring the Karpis-Barker mob after the \$200,000 ransom kidnapping of Edward George Bremer, wealthy St. Paul banker. He also will be charged as an accessory to the kidnapping, authorities asserting he "may have handled some of the ransom money."

G-men had learned Amersbach was in Indianapolis, but his address could not be learned. Information was received that he was traveling between this city and Kentucky, usually with two or three revolvers concealed in his clothing. But when he was caught he was unarmed, and in fact, merely seemed to be

intimated that he could not finish his drink.

Aside from admitting he was Tony Amersbach (Anthony Joseph Amersbach), and that he formerly worked in a Cleveland gambling resort, he had nothing to say about his alleged affiliation with the gang that was held responsible for the Bremer kidnapping and that of William Hamm, Jr., St. Paul brewer, to say nothing of a long list of holdups and shooting scrapes.

Karpis-Barker in Alcatraz.

Alvin Karpis, leader of the kidnap mob, and Arthur (Doc) Barker, his co-worker in crime, are serving life sentences in Alcatraz Federal Prison, and several other members of the gang also are behind bars.

Bremer was kidnapped at St. Paul January 17, 1934, and was held captive twenty-two days in an Illinois tavern until the \$200,000 was paid. Then, authorities assert, the gang went to Toledo, O., later migrating to Cleveland.

It was in the latter city that Amersbach is alleged to have provided refuge for the gang. Like other criminals, the kidnapers were said to have spent considerable time in gambling resorts, trying to build their ransom fortunes.

During his stay in Indianapolis, Amersbach bought two automobiles, paying cash for them from a wallet crammed with bills. He is a large man, weighing about 200 pounds. Agents said he was conservatively dressed in a brown suit and a blue shirt. He had no hat.

Although the Karpis-Barker gang was regarded as one of the most dangerous ever organized in this country, its two leaders and some of their henchmen, like Tony, were captured without gunplay. Karpis, who at one time was known as Public Enemy No. 1, was caught in New Orleans in May, 1936, by FBI men led by J. Edgar Hoover, head of the federal bureau.

Karpis Sent Death Message

Karpis, it is said, was the author of a death threat note sent to Hoover while a nation-wide search for the kidnapper was under way. He achieved unusual notoriety after federal agents killed Kate (Ma) Barker, original leader of the gang, and her son Fred, in a gun battle in a Florida hideaway. Karpis and a lieutenant escaped shortly before the shooting started.

The Karpis-Barker gang resorted to customary means in an attempt to escape capture, such as face-lifting and finger-print removing operations. And the members also had their "molls," pretty red-heads, blonds and brunettes, who posed as lawful wives.

A commentary on the gang's viciousness is seen in a remark made by Hoover when asked about the physician who performed the face-lifting operations.

"I think they dumped his body in Lake Erie," he said.

Of course, authorities are inclined to believe Amersbach was not a confidant of the gang; that he was used as an ally in time of emergency and that he accepted money for his services. But his name is listed as one of the last remnants of a terrorist gang.

Sam Coker, Karpis Gangster, Has \$800 a Month Income

Arrested Here With Harry Campbell Year Ago;
Now Serving Term in Oklahoma; Oil Well
Investments Bring Big Profits.

Sam Coker, whose career as an associate of the Karpis gang of kidnapers and mail robbers ended with his arrest in Toledo last year, was revealed today as the possessor of \$800 a month legitimate income from oil well profits.

The revelation was made in Cleveland by Emerich B. Freed, United States district attorney, who reported today that Coker, now in the Oklahoma state penitentiary completing a sentence for the theft of an automobile, wants to return to Toledo to plead guilty in federal court to an indictment charging him with harboring members of the Karpis-Barker-Campbell gang.

Coker was arrested in a dawn raid on an Arcadia avenue dwelling by FBI agents under the direction of J. Edgar Hoover, chief of the bureau of federal investigation in May, 1936. The same agents, the same day, arrested Harry Campbell, one of the chief lieutenants of the gang.

Coker, postal inspectors charge, was to have participated in the \$34,000 Garrettsville, O., mail robbery in October 1935 but was taken ill and confined in Mercy hospital here. Agents said he, Karpis and Campbell were together in Toledo.

Coker was taken to the Oklahoma prison as a parole violator. Joseph Amersbach, 40, Cleveland, arrested in Indianapolis, will be brought here within a few days to plead to an indictment also charging him with harboring the Karpis gang.

Mr. O'Reilly said he told his new acquaintance where he could get a Scotty.

Emerich Freed, U. S. district attorney, has a different version of the affair. He told Judge Paul Jones of federal court yesterday that Campbell was introduced to the Lucas county sheriff by Eddie McGraw as McGraw's cousin "who is in the money."

No one, so far, has disagreed that Mr. Campbell, alias Mr. Miller, was "in the money" only the federal government said he wasn't in it legally and forthwith dispatched Mr. Campbell to Alcatraz island for life so he can think over his departure from the straight and narrow path.

Five Sentenced

McGraw and his wife, Clara, who lived at 2011 1/2 Adams street, and Edith Barry, 524 Southard avenue, were sentenced to two years each in prison and fined \$500 each by Judge Jones yesterday afternoon after they pleaded guilty to harboring Campbell, Alvin Karpis and other members of the kidnap gang.

Earlier in the day, Ted and Bert Angus, former night club operators, were sentenced to two years and 10 months each and fined \$500 each.

The Angus brothers and McGraw will serve their sentences in Leavenworth prison while Mrs. Barry and Mrs. McGraw were sentenced to serve their imprisonment at the Alderson, W. Va., prison for women.

The McGraws went to Cleveland intending to plead guilty to the indictment but upon arrival changed their mind. After lunch they reconsidered, however, and entered guilty pleas.

The five were returned to the

county jail here last night and will be taken to prison later.

The group was indicted last May by the federal grand jury, climaxing an investigation of many months by FBI agents.

Mr. Freed charged that the \$24,000 Garrettsville mail robbery was planned by the Karpis-Campbell gang in the McGraw apartment and that Campbell was introduced there to the girl he later married under the name of Bob Miller in Bowling Green in the spring of 1934.

The gang fled to Toledo shortly after the kidnaping and subsequent ransoming of Edward Bremer, wealthy St. Paul brewer and banker.

Identify Gang Doctor's Body After 3 Years

Toledo, O., July 21.—[Special.]—The mutilated body of a middle aged man found strapped to a clump of bushes near a lonely road west of Toledo in September, 1934, has been identified as that of Dr. Joseph Moran of Chicago, fingerprint and face surgeon to the defunct Dillinger and Karpis-Barker gangs.

This information was obtained in Toledo today from federal authorities who indicated that an announcement of the identification would be made soon by J. Edgar Hoover, chief of the G-men from Washington, D. C.

Slain for Talking Too Much.

Moran, who turned his back upon a promising medical career to become nursemaid to gangsters, vanished from a Karpis gang hideout in Toledo in June, 1934. It frequently was reported that he had been slain by the gang to prevent him from talking. And it was widely believed at one time that he had been dropped into Lake Erie with his feet embedded in concrete.

In August, 1936, however, department of justice agents caused the body found on the outskirts of Toledo to be exhumed. The hands were sent to Washington for identification by fingerprints. This failed.

Ten Others Indicted.

Then came the indictment by a federal grand jury of Toledo on June 10 of seven Toledo and three Cleveland residents on charges of harboring members of the Karpis gang at about the time Moran disappeared.

Government agents, pursuing their investigation as the grand jury was in session, are understood to have persuaded several of the gang's companions to talk. Descriptions of Moran given by men who said they saw him shortly before his disappearance tallied with the slain man.

Flees from Chicago.

Moran, according to the story pieced together by government agents, fled with the Karpis gang from Chicago in the spring of 1934 after the \$200,000 kidnaping in the case of Edward Bremer, wealthy

brewer and banker. He previously had performed a \$500 operation on John Hamilton, Dillinger gangster. After arriving in Toledo, he performed face lifting and fingerprint operations on Alvin Karpis, Harry Campbell, Volney Davis and other members of the Karpis gang. Moran had boasted he held the fate of members of the gang in the palm of his hand.

Gang gratitude turned to gang fear and the death ride followed.

Native of Spring Valley.

Moran is the last of some 22 members of the Karpis gang to be accounted for, either by federal penitentiary sentences for the Bremer kidnaping or by the bullets of G-men. A native of Spring Valley, Ill., he served in France during the world war. He entered Tufts Medical college in Boston and was an honor student there.

Moran began practice in La Salle, Ill., but in 1928 was convicted of murder by abortion. He was released from Joliet on parole in 1930 and went back later for a parole violation. His final release came in 1931 after which he began his gangland practice.

**G-Man Hoover Denies Moran's

WASHINGTON, July 22.—Fate of Dr. James Moran, Chicago gang surgeon, remained a mystery today when J. Edgar Hoover denied that Moran was the man whose body was recovered three years ago near Toledo, O.

Toledo officials advanced the theory after the current grand jury inquiry indicated that the "doc" was murdered at Toledo in July, 1934, by members of Alvin Karpis' gang of kidnapers, for whom he had done odd jobs of face lifting and fingerprint disguise.

"There's nothing to it," said the chief of the G-men.

Hoover, however, is on record that Moran was slain by his gang pals when he proved too talkative under the stimulus of liquor.

Disposition of his body has never been discovered, but popular belief is that it was sealed up in a barrel of concrete and heaved overboard into Lake Erie from a boat.

Subsequently seven Toledo and three Cleveland residents were indicted by a federal grand jury on charges of harboring Karpis gang-

Government agents pieced together a story that Moran fled with Karpis gangsters from Chicago early in 1934, after the \$200,000 kidnaping of Edward Bremer, wealthy St. Paul banker. A little earlier, it was learned, Moran had performed an operation on John Hamilton, Dillinger gangster, for \$500.

AIDED KARPIS GANG

In Toledo, Moran performed face lifting and fingerprint operations on Alvin Karpis, Harry Campbell, Volney Davis and other Karpis gangsters. Incidentally, the doctor did some boasting he held the fate of the gang in the palm of his hand. This aroused fears and his death ride followed.

Identification of his body makes Moran the last of 22 members of the Karpis gang to be accounted for. Some were given penitentiary sentences for the Bremer kidnaping.

Others were killed by G-men bullets. Moran claimed to be the first American aviator shot down in the world war.

Body in Ohio Not Moran's, Hoover Says

J. Edgar Hoover, director of the federal bureau of investigation, today scotched all reports that the body of Dr. Joseph P. Moran of Chicago, former face and finger man to the defunct Dillinger and Karpis mobs, had been found and identified. In fact, Hoover declared: "We are not even spending any money looking for him. We have definite evidence that he is dead."

In a long distance telephone conversation with The Daily News Mr. Hoover said:

"Press reports that the body of Doc Moran had been found and identified in Toledo, O., are erroneous. There is nothing to them at all and the body in question is absolutely not that of Moran."

The F. B. I. director likewise denied that his bureau was still pressing its search for the criminal doctor, who harbored many cherished secrets of his outlaw patients.

"We are no longer actively conducting a search for him," Hoover said. "We have an open mind concerning him, however, and if we were given a worthwhile lead as to his whereabouts we certainly would pursue it. But we are convinced he is dead, in fact, have very definite evidence to that effect, and we see no point in spending money uselessly in looking for his body."

The director also remarked that members of the Karpis kidnaping and bank robbing band for whom the doctor performed the last of his face and fingerprint operations, are all imprisoned for their crimes and that Moran would now be of very little help alive, except for personal prosecution, and certainly of no aid to the government dead.

Killed by Barker

Marshal was killed August 20, 1927, according to police records, by Herman Barker following the hold-up of the Newton Ice Company at Newton, Kas., by three men.

Marshal and his companion, Patrolman Bush, were in north Wichita and chanced to see the fleeing car. They pursued and stopped the auto at Murdock and St. Francis. Bush went around the right side and Marshal took the left side of the car as they approached.

Barker, driver of the car, grabbed Marshal's head in his arm and started shooting. Marshal died instantly.

Bush shot Barker and Stalcup as they drove from the scene of the slaying.

Ends Own Life

Barker later took his own life to avoid capture at St. Francis and Pine. Stalcup was found lying in weeds between St. Francis and Santa Fe shot thru the hand, arm and both thighs.

Porter Meeks, third occupant of the car, was slain two days later in north Wichita by Merle Colver, acting on a tip given to police by a woman. With Colver was Harold Burkeholder, who had seen Meeks. Meeks was shot once and was instantly killed.

Colver Meets Death

Colver was later slain by Wilbur Underhill in a cheap rooming house on South Water.

Stalcup, whose record shows only two prison terms, is writing prominent Wichitans asking their aid, Captain Bowery said. The names of the prominent Wichitans were not made public.

Stalcup's record shows: In 1918, burglary, sentenced to three years in Oklahoma state prison; 1921, burglary and grand larceny arrests, vagrancy and dope fiend charged. He received a sentence of one to five years on the grand larceny charge was sent to Lansing. It was less than a year later that he was arrested as being an accomplice in the murder of the officer.

Police Chief O. W. Wilson had little comment on the application other than "we have placed all of our confidence in the governor and we believe that the application will be denied."

Barker was one of the four persons who were shot.

"I don't know why you fellows call me up all the time," Sticha said. "I don't know why I have to answer questions for the newspapers; I don't work for the newspapers."

"But what are you going to do about a gambling joint running wide open in your suburb?" the reporter asked.

"I'm not answering your questions," the mayor said as he hung up.

Hebebrand, a co-owner of the club, and Gorman, a doorman, pleaded guilty before Federal Judge Paul Jones to harboring Karpis, member of the Karpis-Barker-Campbell gang which kidnaped Edward Bremer in St. Paul in 1934.

Anthony Amersbach, also a part owner of the club, is being sought on a similar indictment. He is reported to have fled with \$40,000 of the club's money.

CLEVELAND, June 30 (AP).—John Sharkey Gorman and Arthur Heberbrand pleaded guilty in Federal court today to acting as accessories after the fact in the Bremer kidnaping at St. Paul in February, 1934.

Judge Paul Jones sentenced Gorman to three years in the penitentiary and Heberbrand to two years and fined each \$1,000. By their pleas of guilty they admitted they acted to obtain shelter and lodging for the Alvin Karpis gang, convicted of the kidnaping, prior to the \$46,000 Garrettsville, Ohio, bank robbery November 7, 1935.
