MEMORANDUM FOR INSPECTOR E. J. CONNELLEY

There are attached hereto the logs for January 8, 1937 covering the taps on telephones listed to the Chief of Police, City Jailor, and Mayor's Office, all located in the City Hall at Hot Springs, Arkansas.

The following are ~~xxx~~ the new members, ~~in~~ the Hot Springs Police Dept.:

Day Captain Jerry "Swede" Watkins  
Patrolman "Red" Terry  
Patrolman George Young  
Detective Monroe Young  
Chief of Police Weldon Raspberry

The call recorded at 11:30 A.M. indicates that Day Captain Jerry "Swede" Watkins is employed at the Belvedere at nights.

Note to Agent Damron: Review all calls made by one Doc Davis, as he appears to be very mysterious and guarded in his conversations. He usually calls from a pay station, and always asks to speak with "Dutch" Akers. It was believed at first that this individual might be Dr. Louis Davis, a local dentist, but additional conversations do not indicate this possibility.

Reference is made to the call at 5:45 P.M. between U. S. Marshall Julian and his office at Little Rock, Arkansas. The two men referred to in this conversation are Louis Ginsberg and Dan Moody. They were arrested by the U. S. Marshall's office for violation of the Harrison Narcotic Act.

Referring to that call on the Mayor's phone between Mrs. Leo McLaughlin and the Mayor at 10:51 A.M., we have no idea down here what Mrs. McLaughlin has in mind. As you will recall, she is ~~xxx~~ suing him for a divorce.

Note the attached clipping which appeared in Hot Springs Sentinel-Record on the morning of January 7, 1937. The following telephone conversation apparently refers to it:

11:21 A.M. (1/8/37) - Incoming over Mayor's phone J.L.M.

Grady Manning: Leo, you asked me the other day about this fellow, Nichols (Rev. Lee Nichols of Logan County, Arkansas) - and I said he was a reasonable fellow. Well, I'll ~~ret~~ act that statement. He's got a resolution drawn

up about six or seven pages long that he wants to introduce before the house next week. The Speaker let me read it this morning, and the things it recites are awful. I can't believe them. I wish that you and I and Jim Campbell can get together on this and discuss how we can handle this situation.

McLaughlin:

That thing was written here in Hot Springs. I got wind of it a couple of days ago. Joe Denby who lost the Circuit Court Judgeship in Montgomery County, this fellow Nichols, and Scott Wood collaborated on it.

Manning:

It would leave an awful bad taste, if this thing ever got out. It mentions a lot of names and cites many allegations of corruption that I don't believe are true. If the newspapers get a hold of it, they'll blast the hell out of us down there, even if damn thing doesn't reach the House.

McLaughlin:

Can't we discourage the thing in some way?

Manning :

That's what I want you down here for. We can talk to Bransford all right - he's our friend.

McLaughlin:

Can't we get the head man down here to drop it? (Probably referring to Attorney Scott Wood)

Manning :

Well, that's what I want to discuss with you - how to proceed on it. I would suggest that you, Jim Campbell and I get together and talk with John (Bransford) about this. Better come over this afternoon or tomorrow.

McLaughlin:

Will you be able to have Jim and John there?

Manning :

Yeah. John is here all the time, and Jim said he'll stay until tomorrow.

McLaughlin:

All right Grady, I'll try and be over there around three or four this afternoon.

Manning :

That's fine. I'll round up John and Campbell, and we'll be all set when you get here.

\* \* \* \*

Grady Manning is the President of the Southwest Hotel Corporation of which the Eastman or Kingsway Hotel and Majestic Hotel in Hot Springs are members. John Bransford is the designate-speaker of the Arkansas State of Representatives, and Jim Campbell is a local attorney here in town.

The following conversation was overheard by the writer:

11:40 A.M. (1/8/57) Outgoing on Mayor's phone

J.L.M.

Mayor: #446 (John Young, Constable)

Young: Hello -

Mayor: John, I meant to tell you this when you were in the office this morning, but I forgot. I got some information that Monroe (Young - a newly-appointed police officer) has been contacting some of these places in the nigger section, asking them to take care of him. We can't have that kind of thing, and I won't stand for it. I wish you would talk to him and tell him that I got that information this morning.,

Young: All right, Leo - I'll tell him this afternoon.

Apparently Monroe Young is either a son or brother to John Young, the local Constable. The calls at 2:35 P.M. and 4:18 P.M. over the police phones indicate that John Young endeavored to get a hold of Monroe Young to probably talk with him about this matter.

Little Rock, Jan. 6.—(AP)—The Arkansas Gazette will say tomorrow that a member of the Arkansas house who declined use of his name said he would introduce in the next legislature a resolution providing for a committee to investigate conditions in Hot Springs, Garland county and the eighteenth judicial circuit.

The representative said he would propose the committee consist of five representatives to be appointed by the speaker. The committee would be given an appropriation to enable it to secure the services of an attorney and a stenographer.

He reported the investigation would be to ascertain whether conditions justify the impeachment by the house of any city, county, or judicial circuit officials.

The Gazette reported the representative said the committee would pay particular attention to "the John Dickson case, the Luciano case and the recent democratic state primary in which Garland county gave top heavy favorites to state, district and county candidates who had the endorsement of the Hot Springs city administration."

Note that call between Grace Goldstein and "Dutch" Akers at 6:12 P.M. particularly this portion of the conversation:

Grace Goldstein: I've got that ready for you. I'll call a Postal boy and send it over to you right away. Don't say anything to anybody about it.

"Dutch" Akers: All right - I won't say anything.

The above conversation probably has reference to the division of that \$50.00 which Grace netted at the time she sold for \$65.00 that diamond ring which she purchased from Arthur Johnson for \$15.00 about one month ago.
