



MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON

The fingerprints of Fred Barker, with aliases, deceased, which were transmitted to the Division with the letter attached hereto, signed by Mr. E. J. Connelley, Special Agent in Charge, were examined in the Identification Unit and found to show very serious mutilation. The finger ridges were obliterated over large portions of the fingertips. Accurate classification of these fingerprints would be impossible. Enough characteristic detail showed, however, to permit identification.

When the fingerprints were received in the Technical Section of the Identification Unit, however, they were immediately compared with the fingerprints in the special mutilated fingerprint file and were identified with a photographic copy of fingerprints of Fred Barker which had been placed in the special file as indicated in my memorandum of September 26, 1934.

But before we take a look at what happened today at Oklawaha, Florida, let's answer a few questions about Fred Barker. He was born in Oklahoma; together with his brother he engaged in a series of mid-western crimes. Fred Barker was one of the prisoners who escaped from the Kansas State Penitentiary in 1931. Since then he has had a career of hold-ups and killings. The authorities identified him with the notorious Blackburn gang, the mob that for more than a year has been hunted in connection with the kidnaping of Edward G. Bremer, the St. Paul brewer. Federal men announced some time ago that the two Barker brothers had been identified by fingerprints as members of the Bremer kidnaping gang. So Fred Barker has been rated as one of the country's most dangerous outlaws.

And now let's see where Oklawaha is. The lake country of Florida runs down the center of that glorious state, honey-combed with lakes and towns - a region of farms, truck farms where the Florida winter vegetables are grown. Oklawaha is on Lake Weir, a small town drowsing in the mellow warmth of the South. And now what happened. Fred Barker and several others of the Blackburn gang took possession of a handsome summer cottage on the banks of the lake. With them was Barker's mother, sixty-five years old. They call her "Ma" Kate. The Federal agents got a tip, so fifteen government men of J. Edgar Hoover's staff helped by local police surrounded that cottage on Lake Weir - and

the battle was on. The outlaws and "Ma" Kate barricaded themselves in the house and fought it out with machine guns. The Federal men with machine guns and tear gas bombs fought like soldiers on the outside from places of shelter, from cover. The gun fire was incessant. People from the surrounding country reported that the continuous shooting sounded like a small battle, and the fight lasted for five hours. The government agents riddled the cottage with bullets - and how did it end?

Barker, shot and killed and his sixty-five year old mother, "Ma" Kate, shot dead - a machine gun at her side. The several others of the gang all accounted for, either killed or captured. It looks as if the Federal agents with one stroke down there in the lake country of Florida had wiped out the Blackburn gang. That's one gun fight story; here's another.





Replying to the above-quoted telegram, a long-distance telephone call was received by Mr. Keith February 5, 1935, from Mr. Berney, Sales Manager of the Winchester Company, who advised that in 1932 the Remington U. M. C. Co. and the Winchester Repeating Arms Company agreed to a consolidation and that during the general reorganization which followed, all records were destroyed of the .30 Caliber Browning Automatic Rifles, Model 1918. He further informed Mr. Keith that during the years 1933-34, several

.30 Caliber Browning Automatic Rifles, Model 1918, were sold to the firm of Sedgely of Philadelphia, dealers in firearms, munitions, etc.

On February 5, 1935, Special Agent Heffler of the Philadelphia Office was requested, by phone, to have an immediate sheck made by the firm of Sedgely at Philadelphia to ascertain if the above-described gun had been handled by that firm. Mr. Keith was subsequently advised, by phone, by the Philadelphia office, that Sedgely had no record of the instant gun.

Mr. N. N. Herndon, Sales Tax Division, Internal Revenue, Treasury Department, in charge of the registration of firearms, as provided in the National Firearms Act approved June 26, 1954, made a search of his records and advised that the firearm referred to above has not been registered in accordance with the provisions of Section 5 - (a) of the National Firearms Act.

In the event it should become necessary, subpoens should issue on the Commissioner of Internal Revenue, who will designate Mr. No No Herndon as one qualified to testify concerning the non-registration of this gun.



presently stored in some private garage. It was Mr. Block's opinion that Mrs. Hollinshead, whose husband Redfield Hollinshead is emgaged in the radio business, is the highest type of person, and bears a splendid reputation in the neighborhood. Mr. Block further advised we that Mrs. Hollinshead has stored ears in this garage for the past five or six years and that previous to her ownership of the Buish in question, she owned a Packard, which she had traded in for this in guick some time last year. Mr. Block continued, stating that to the best of his knowledge, the Buick ear was never away from the garage during the period of its storage for any extended length of time. Mr. Block has been employed at this garage as a floorman for the past two yearse

Miss Grace Koller, daughter of the superintendent of 911 MoLean Avenue, Yonkers, New York, the address of the apartment house wherein Mr. and Mrs. Hollinshead live, stated that to the best of her knowledge, Mr. and Mrs. Hollinshead are and always have been the best type of tenants, who have always paid their rest on time, and about whom no complaints of any nature have been received. Miss Koller further advised that to the best of her knowledge, Mr. and Mrs. Hollinshead have lived in this apartment house for the past five or six years.

On a suitable pretext, agent interviewed Mrs. Florence
Hollinshead in her apartment, 5 F, in the said spartment house, and
was informed by her that she is the owner of a Buick seden, black,
in color, bearing 1935 New York license plates 5V-4784, which ear
in 1934 bore New York license plates 2V-9337. She stated that her
car never did have on the back thereof any sort of trunk. She
further advised that she and her husband resided in this apartment
house for the past six years, during which time she has owned various
ears, none of which was ever taken by her to Chicago. In conclusion,
Mrs. Hollinshead stated that she has never been in Chicago, even
though she has always had the desire to go to the World's Fair.
Mrs. Hollinshead is a woman of about 45 years of age, and of a very
refined and cultured nature.

In reference to the car owned by Margaret Eager, bearing 1954 New York license plates 5U-3557, investigation at 2101 Cedar Avenue, Bronx, New York City, revealed that no one by the name of Margaret Eager presently resides at this house. This information was conveyed to Agent by Albert Perriotto, who has been the elevator operator at this house for the past two years. He stated that up until the spring of 1954, a party by the name of James Eager had

lived at this house. He described Mr. Eager as being married, the father of one shild, and a New York City patrolmen, who had lived at this house for a period approximating two years. Mr. Ferriotte further advised that Mr. Eager had a new Buick seden, black in solor, which did not have a trunk on the back thereof. Mr. Perriotte continuing, stated that to the best of his knowledge, the name of Mr. Eager's wife is Margaret. According to Mr. Perriotto, the Eager family has been a quiet one, of whom no complaints were sver received by the owners of the house, and they have an excellent reputation smong the tenants of the house.

At the 46th precinct police station, 181st Street and Ryer Avenue, Bronx, New York, it was ascertained from Lieutenant Charles Daly that James Eager is a plainclotheaman, presently stationed at the 10th Division, Brooklyn, New York, who was formerly stationed as a patrolman at the 46th precinct, and was transferred to his present post of duty about a year ago. Lieutenant Daly further advised that Eager has a new Buick sedan which was purchased, in his opinion, by Eager in the name of Margaret Eager, his wife. Lieutenant Daly does not know Eager's present address, which is, he stated, somewhere in Brooklyn, nearby his present post of dutys.

Special Agent J. R. Sharp made an examination of the motor vehicle registrations at Trenton, N.J., on the same date. It was ascertained that no license for 1934 or 1935 was issued to Harry Sawyer under his correct name or aliases. Although the records revealed several Harry Sawyers who appeared to be residents of New Jersey for the past several years, a check was made of these New Jersey drivers without any result. The descriptions of each of these Sawyers were checked against the description of Subject and none were found that might correspond or be identical.

The files of the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, having yearly registrations filed by license numbers and owners' names are arranged alphabetically. All these files were searched under Harry Sawyer's correct name and aliases without ascertaining any identifying data with reference to the Packard sedan. The thought occurred that the car might be registered under Louie or Dutch Brooks and the records were searched without result. In this connection, it was

A review of the Kansas City file in this case has been made to determine outstanding leads in this territory which have possibilities in sausing the location of any of the subjects sought. Regarding these perties it is found that there are basic leads here relating principally to Subject Volney Davis and this report is devoted antirely to treatment of investigation looking toward the apprehension of Davis. Later a resume of facts in connection with investigation in this territory to locate other Subjects sought, showing their various connections, will be rendered by the Kansas City Office. The purpose of this report is to recapitulate information regarding Davis in order that all outstanding leads in this territory with possibilities may be further covered as to him.

The file reflects that Davis has evidently separated from other Subjects of this case, and that for several months he has been in more or less constant contact with persons other than the main group of Subjects.

PRIENDS OF VOLNEY DAVIS, with whom he has been in contact during recent months are shown by the file as follows:

from Aurora, Illinois, where Bales has been a gembler and "fixer". They proceeded from Aurora, Illinois, to Glasgow, Montana in the Fall of 1954, where Bales operates a gembling house at present. It was thought for some time that Davis would join Bales at Glasgow, but apparently he has not.

but is believed to have lost his interest to Corey Bales.

Davis, together with Edna Murray, was in Aurora, Ellisbis, during March and April 1934, where they lived in close contact with Subjects MEAVER, ARTHUR R. BARKER and others. The file reflects that while Davis and Edna Murray lived at Auroya, during the period in question, there was an individual known as WILLIAN CONNELLY with his wife, who resided close to Mean and who apparently is a gangster. Connelly and his wife remained about a month after the departure of Davis and the others and the identity of Connelly has not been established. It will be noted, however, that through surveillance of the residence of HARRY C. STANLEY, at Pittsburg, Kansas, as later mentioned in this report, Stanley being a brother of Edna Murray, that an automobile registered to one E. A. CONNLEY appeared recently at the home of Harry Stanley. As shown in a letter from this office to the Oklahoma City Office dated. January 26, 1935, investigation has been requested at Mismi, Oklahoma, to determine the identity of E. A. CONNLEY.

The file indicates that Davis and Edna kurray have frequented aurora, Illinois considerably for the past year and that they are known at aurora as kr. and krs. Jy E. Hanson. In aurora, it appears that they make contacts with parties at IED'S TAVERN. The reports of Special Agent R. Brown dated at Chicago, Illinois, 10-6-34 and 10-27-34 show investigation at aurora which resulted in the establishing of valuable sources of information there.

It is also shown that Davis and Edna Murray probably spend considerable time at a tavern owned by TERRY DRUGGAN at Crystal Lake, Illinois. TERRY DRUGGAN is a well known gengster and it is the writer's impression that he is either serving at present in the United States Penitentiary at Leaveneworth, or that he may have been released during recent months. The file shows that Davis is in company with Edna Murray most of the time. She has numerous connections in the underworld which seem to be also those of Volney Davis. Concentrated effort to locate Edna Murray as a means to causing the apprehension of Davis, therefore, appears desirable.

The first definite data shown in the file indicating that the fine furray and Volney Davis were traveling together developed upon the arrest of Paula Harmon, Wynona Burdette and Gladys Sawyer, at Cleveland, Chio, during September 1934. Information was obtained from them that Davis was

traveling with a woman known as ENNA CRACE, an escape from the Missouri State Penitentiary. It was ascertained upon investigation that this individual is EDNA MURRAY, Register Number 28973, at the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri. Edna Murray has figured in previous investigations by this Division, as also has her sister Doris, and a review of other files in the Kensas City Office reflects the following, which may be helpful in locating the Murray woman and her sister, as a means to the apprehension of Voltay Davis

From investigation of the case entitled "RANL STUCHLICK alias Stewart; MRS. DORIS CONNELL alias Stewart; JACK MURRAY; MUNA MURRAY; JESSIE M. CRUTCHER; GUS NICHOLS; GEORGE BECKER; WHITE SLAVE TRAFFIC ACT - NATIONAL > MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT ACT, New Orleans office of origin, Kansas City file 31-106, it would seem that those named in that investigation, except Becker, sere arrested by New Orleans police in October 1924, having been recognized is remmants of the so-called "CONNELL GANG". Doris Connell, Edna Murray's sister, was the wife or woman of Emory Connell, now deceased. Doris and Earl Stuchlick were at that time found by New Orleans Police living as man and wife at the DeSota Hotel, in New Orleans, where the other Subjects of that dase were also congregated. Becker evaded arrest. Doris Connell denied immoral relations with Earl Stuchlick when questioned at that time. The parties had all arrived in New Orleans from Kansas City, Missouri, by way of Memphis, Tennessee, driving two large sutomobiles. They proved ownership of the cars with a and were all released after being fingerprinted and photographed by New Orleans Police. No Federal prosecution was undertaken.

It was at that time developed that Stuchlisk was a bootlegger in Kansas City, Missouri, and that Doris Connell had been running a joint to Kansas City.

Gus Nichols is now serving a long sentence in the Minnesota State
Penitentiary. He is a Greek and at the time of his arrest in 1924, as here
mentioned, he was the proprietor of a Cafe in Kansas City but was known as a
bandit locally. Gus Nichols now has a brother, Frank Hichols, operating a
cafe at 5906 Summit Street, Kansas City, Missouri, according to this file.

Jack Murray, who was arrested in New Orleans, is the same included shown as the husband of Edna Murray heretofore in this report.

Jessie M. Crutcher, when arrested in New Orleans, gave his address as 4219 Virginia Avenue, Kansas City, Missouri, and said he was a stock salesman. The present whereabouts of Crutcher is not shown in this file. The Can New Orleans Police have photograph and fingerprints of Crutcher and it will be requested that the New Orleans Office secure a complete criminal record of him in order that he may be now located through this means, if possible.

The identity of George Becker, who was with these parties in New Orleans in 1924, has not been established.

Through the review of another file found in the Kansas City
Office entitled "EARL STUCHLICK alias Stewart - NATIONAL MOTOR VEHICLE THESE
ACT" (investigated in 1933), it was found that Earl Stuchlick, Jack Murray
Edna Murray (the same parties heretofore mentioned) and Subject Volney Davis,
were arrested together by the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department at
January 22, 1925, on charges of suspicion and investigation. Davis was
returned at that time to the Oklahoma State Penitentiary from which he state
an escape under sentence of life for murder. Stuchlick was released by
the Kansas City Police without prosecutions. Edna and Jack Murray were convicted of robbery and sentenced to the Missouri State Penitentiary during
1925, presumably as a result of this arrest, although the file in the Kansas
City Office does not show that the fietails of that arrest were completely
secured and same will be further investigated.

The investigation of the case of "RARY STUCHLICK - NATIONAL MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT ACT here mentioned, was begun on January 5, 1935, due to m request from the office of the Attorney General of Kansas at Topeka. It was shown that the Farmers & Merchants Bank at Hill City, Kansas, had been robbed on the night of December 16, 1932 by five men, who forced the cashier to open the vault, bound him, and stole a large quantity of bonds and about \$5000.00 in cash, several expensive firearms and some personal jewelry of the cashier. A large Wash Sedan which had been stolen at the point of a pistol at Kansas City, Missouri on the night of Movember 26, 1932 by two men; was definitely identified as having been in possession of some strange men who accompanied Earl Stuchlick in the vicinity of Hill City, Kansas on the night of the bank robbery. The car was found abandoned at Kansas City, Missouri after the bank robbery on December 29, 1932. The Kansas City Police found it at 23rd and Summit Streets here. The investigation developed quite, definitely that Earl Stuchlick had participated to a large extent in the off possession of the stolen automobile and in the perpetration of the bank roppery.

In that case it was also found that GEORGE FATRIL alias Tony
Fattella, Kemsas City, Syriem racketeer, was found in possession of \$1000,000
worth of the bonds stolen from the Hill City Bank. Efforts to extradite
Fatell to Hill City, Kemsas failed, partially due to the support given him by
Chief of Detectives Thomas H. Higgins of the Kansas City, Missouri Police
Department.

Theft Act charge as there was a charge of counterfeiting pending against him at Topeka, Kensas, and the United States Attorney therefore declined further prosecution. He was given a six months sentence in the County Jail at Topeka on the counterfeiting charge during April 1933.

Recently am interview was had with George Fatell in an effort to elicit information regarding his contacts with the Subjects in this case, and this interview is shown on pages 5 to 8 in the report of Special Agent M.C. Spear, dated at Kansas City, Missouri, December 19, 1934. It will be noted

that Fatell operates a dice table at the Westport Recreation, a beer taveral operated by Harry Buchar, former Kensas City policemen, and located at 427 westport, here. The business telephone at the Westport Recreation is Valentine 9579. Fatell resides at 5320 Jefferson, his residence phone being Logan 6525. Fatell is a Syrian and stands well with the local political machine, being particularly protected by Tom Conway, Assistant County Prosecutor, according to information given by Fatell to the writer, Fatell is known as a friend of Jimmie LaCapra, who furnished valuable information in connection with the Kansas City Kassacre case. He was also a close friend of Jack Gregory and Ed Wilhite, who are mentioned in the report in the KANMO case by Special Agent W. F. Trainor, dated September 5, 1934, at Kansas City, Missouri. Agent Spear's report indicates that Fatell admitted intimate acquaintance with Earl Stuchlick, Doris Connell, Edna Murray, Volney Davis, Alvin Karpis and other Subjects in this case.

Jack Murray, the husband of Edna Kurray, has been interviewed by an Agent and disclaimed that he has received any communication from Edna since her escape in December 1932. However, he furnished information regarding her family and personal history which, through investigation, resulted in securing much of the data now available regarding her. It is believed that he might be a helpful source of further information.

The family of Edna Kurray, Kr. and Krs. N. D. Stanley, resided at Cardin, Oklahoma for over 25 years, originally having come from Kansas. The mother, Lula Stanley, is considered somewhat respectable but her two daughters, Doris and Edna, have led criminal careers from an early age. The father, N. D. Stanley, now deceased, made a living by renting shacks to coal miners at Cardin. There are a number of reliable residents in the vicinity of Cardin, Oklahoma, who furnished information regarding the Stanley family when approached by igents of the Oklahoma City Office.

The son of Edna Murray, Preston Paton, is about 17 years of age, although it is indicated by parties interviewed at Aurora, Illinois, that he looks somewhat older.

destinations unknown to informants there. He was absent for about two weeks up to October 8, 1934 on one of these trips, according to information received. It is felt by informants at Cardin that he is making contacts frequently with his mother and that she furnishes him with money. The file reflects that he was with his mother in Aurora, Illinois, during the month of April 1934.

Apparently he has contacts with this mob and would assist them on his contact in their criminal activities. The Kansas City file does not reflect an adequate description of Preston Paton. It is shown, however, that he is tall and slander. Further comment will be made later in this report indicating the possibility that Preston Paton is now traveling with Earl Stuchlink.

Doris Connell, sister of Edna Murray, is thought to be in touch with Edna, and there is a probability that since they have always operated with the same criminals it might be possible to locate Edna through Doris. Doris Connell for most of the time since 1924 has been the paramour or wife of Earl Stuchlick and they have lived together a considerable portion of that time at Hill City, Kansas, which is the home of Stuchlick. The present location of Doris Connell, however, is unknown. It is indicated by the report of Special agent Paul Hanson, dated at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma January 18, 1935, that Doris is believed residing somewhere near Kansas City, Missouri. The Kansas City file reflects no information to support this belief.

It is shown that Doris Connell has an eleven year old son named Mott Farrell, living with Mrs. Lula Stanley, her mother, at Cardin, Oklahoma, It was said by parties interviewed during November 1934, in the vicinity of Cardin, as shown by the report of Special Agent Paul Hanson, Oklahoma City, November 13, 1934, that Doris and her husband came to Cardin every month or two. Mr. H. D. Huddleston, Justice of the Peace, Cardin, Oklahoma, was to watch for the reappearance of Doris there and secure the license number of the car driven by here.

Inquiry at Hill City, Kansas, December 51, 1934, was made by Special Agent N. O. Scott of Sheriff Bill Jones, who is related to Earl Stuchlick, and of County Attorney J. S. Parker, but these officials advised that Doris "Stuchlick" had left her husband, Earl Stuchlick and returned to Oklahoma, place unknown to them. It appears from more recent developments later shown in this report that Earl Stuchlick called at the home of Doris Connell's brother, Harry C. Stanley, at Pittsburg, Kansas recently, and that Preston Paton, son of Edna Murray, may have been with him at that time. This might indicate that Doris and Earl Stuchlick are either together or in contact with each other now.

Doris Stanley Connell was reared at Cardin, Oklahoma, being the full sister of Edna Murray. She was the wife or paramour of Emory Connell, a notorious bendit, now deceased, who was a member of the Connell Geng that operated in Louisiana around 1920 to 1923. The file reflects that Emory Connell and Doris lived at Pearlington, Mississippi for five months in late 1922 and early 1923, being known there to Mrs. E. L. Dean and Mrs. Louisa Summers, of Pearlington, Mississippi, who have been recently interviewed. It is shown that during August of 1923 Doris again appeared at Pearlington, Mississippi in company with a man known as Tom Owens and two others known as Arthur Clay

and Melvin Stofer, remaining four days on that occasion. She then had with her her infant son, Kott, who is now residing at Cardin, Oklahome, as hereted fore mentioned. The New Orleans Office made investigation of the above individuals on a charge of National Motor Vehicle Theft Act, but the Kansas City file is obscure regarding that investigation. It is shown, however, that Emory Connell had a friend memed E. MCVAY, who is known to attorney E. Hover, of New Orleans, Mr. Hoover having been recently interviewed. McVay is thought to still be in New Orleans but has not been located to date. From interviews at Pearlington, Mississippi the opinion was expressed by parties, there that Doris Connell was very intelligent and the brains of the gang with which she traveled during 1934.

IMENE McCANN, Prison register number 38958, Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, escaped in December 1932 from that prison with Edna Murray. Irene McCann voluntarily surrendered herself in Chicage, Illinois, January 17, 1934 and is now at the Missouri State Penitentiary. She was interviewed recently and refused to give any information whatever but admitted that she could readily contact Edna Murray. Her communications received and sent from the penitentiary are being shown of record pursuant to a request from this office, although the recording of such communications is not customarily done at the penitentiary. These should be reviewed in the near future and a further interview should be had with Irene McCann for any additional information which she might furnish.

It might be interesting to note that Irene McCann surrendered in Chicago on the same day that Victim Bremer was kidnaped in St. Paul. Whether this has any significance with the kidnaping is unknown.

It is shown by the file that Mrs. Sadie Elliott, 925 Troost Avenue, Kansas City, Missouri, mother of Mrs. Jack (Jackie) Sutherland, might be in possession of valuable information regarding the location of Volney Davis since Jack Sutherland, who is now in the United States Penitentiary at Leavenworth, is a close friend of Volney Davis: Mrs. Elliott has been interviewed recently and no definite information from her was secured which would be helpful. Jack Sutherland, now serving in the United States Penitentiary at Leavenworth, should be interviewed and his correspondence record should be checked.

that upon the arrest of Edna and Jack Kurray at Joplin, Missouri, December 14, 1924, there was arrested with them one Edward G. Grahem, alias Bill Barnes, alias Edward Brothey, alias Edward Sully, Joplin, Missouri Police Department Number 2709, who had served three terms in Oklahoma, and that on May 28, 1925, that individual was received at the Kansas State Penitentiary, Lansing, Kansas to serve a term of four to eight years for second degree burglary. He was then 48 years old. A further check of this party should be made to determine

his identity and present location. This investigation should be made both at Lensing, Kansas and Moslester, Oklahoma

The Kansas City Office is requesting that his original recept be furnished to this and the Oklahoma City Office by the Bivisions

Harry Stanley and his wife visited the Boice family for a day or so after Movember 1, 1934 and then proceeded in their car to Glasgow, Montana, where, on Movember 7, 1934, Stanley and wife arrived at the gambling establishment of Coray Baless.

It is definitely shown that on November 8, 1934 Volney Davis was in Chicago

Harry C. Stanley and wife returned to Pittsburg, Kansas from Glasgow, Montana, and after remaining for a short time at the residence of W.H. Boice they secured rooms at 206 East Adams Street, which is the home of John C. Incas, at Pittsburg, Kansas.

Special Agents W. B. O'Kahoney and D. A. Bryce are now at Pittsburg, Kansas, keeping in close contact with all occurrences with reference to the Stanleys and this surveillance will be continued during the period when it appears that same is profitable, which at present seems desirable.

The report of Special Agent R. P. Shanahan, dated at Kansas City, January 4, 1935, sets out information regarding the appearance of a Pontiac 1934 model Sedan bearing 1934 Missouri license 585-264, which was observed at the Stanley residence in Pittsburg, Kansas. It is shown that upon checking

those license tags it was found that they were issued to CRACE R. Hawsay (aliases Grace and Hanson have been used at different times by Edna hurray). Grace R. Hamsen, when securing her license tag, gave her address as Ber 192. Belton, Missouri. The Pontiac car bears motor number 1058715 and was you chased October 11, 1934 from Noel V. Wood Company, Pontiac Dealers, Kansas City Missouri by the momen using the name "Grace R. Hamsen". She purchased the ear for each in the amount of \$886.90, Mr. Lohmeyer of the Moel V. Wood Company having been the salesman. When she bought the car she said she was purchasing it while her "boy friend was flush". She gave no residence address. Parties at Noel V. Wood Company, who saw this woman, have failed to make my identification of the photograph of Edna Murray. However, they furnish general detailed description of that woman which might fit Edna Murray.

A flash eard for the 1935 license registration on Pontiac Sedan, motor number 1058715, has been placed in the records of sutomobile registration division at the State Capitol, Jefferson City, Missourie

It is indicated by memorandum of Special Agent William B.
O'lahoney, dated January 12, 1935, that this Pontiac car, bearing the same 1934
license tags, appeared at the Stanley residence at Pittsburg two weeks before
that date, but the information was not reported by the Agent's informant
until the car had departed. The Agents are to secure a residence as close
to the Stanley abode as possible at such time as there is one facant, but
up to date there has been no such possibility.

It will be noted that Volney Davis and Edna Murray were driving a new Sedam, thought possibly to be a Pontiac, while at Muskogee, Oklahoma from October 13 to 24, 1934. It will be noted also that they did considerable traveling between Euskogee and Chicago, Illinois, shortly after October 24th.

It was found at Belton, Missouri that Grace R. Hamsen was unknown to anyone there. Post Office Box 102 was rented by a man. This man also purchased a city automobile license tag at Belton on November 11, 1934, according to investigation by Agents O'Nahoney and Shanahan. When he purchased the city tag he said his name was Grace R. Hansen, which is a peculiar circumstance. Parties at Belton, Missouri, where the city tag was issued, upon viewing the various photographs of Subjects in this case expressed an opinion that the photograph of Volney Davis might be a likeness of the man who said his name was Grace R. Hansen. The writer made inquiry at Belton, Missouri on February 1, 1935, to determine whether there has been any subsequent appearance of the Hansens at Belton, either in connection with the Post Office Box or the purchase of a new city tag since November 11, 1934, but no such appearance has been made. It was ascertained also that no specimen of signature

of Hansen could be secured at Belton since he made no written application either for the Post Office Box or the city license.

The file reflects that in previous instances Volkey Davis used a Post Office Box in small towns close to Chicago, Illinois and St. Faul Minnesota, which he rented and used only for a short period while receiving license registration papers for automobiles purchased and registered by him.

The Noel V. Wood Company's records at Kansas City, where the Pontiac car was purchased, reflect that it was serviced there on the following dates with the following mileage shown:

November 3, 1934 November 12, 1934 December 17, 1934 December 22, 1934

Mileage 6505/ Mileage 7011/ Mileage 12240 Mileage 13464

Arrangements are in effect at the Noel Y. Wood Company whereby this office will be immediately notified in the event the Pontiac Sedan is again brought in for service. It has not appeared there to date since December 22, 1934, as inquiry was made on February 1, 1935.

Whether this Pontiac car is in possession of Volney Davis and Edna Murray has not been definitely determined. However, the above circumstances would indicate a possibility that this is true and if within a short time the car is not registered in Missouri a circular letter will be issued in order to endeavor to locate it.

The New Orleans Office by letter of 1-8-35 advised the Chicago Office that M. J. Connell, brother of the deceased Emory Connell, had approached an attorney in New Orleans, Louisianak requesting that he be furnished a mortgage note on the farm of his father, Thomas Connell, at Chippewa Falls, Wisconsin. M. J. Connell furnished his address as 6515 Cottage Grove, Chicago, Illinois, It is evident that M. J. Connell is a brother-in-law of Doris Connell. Attention of the Chicago Office is directed to this angle with the suggestion that appropriate investigation be made in an effort to locate Doris Connell through the above addresses at Chippewa Falls, Wisconsin and Chicago, Illinois.

As shown in the report of Special Agent R. P. Shanahan, dated at Kansas City, Missouri, February 2, 1935, Chevrolet Coupe bearing Missouri license number 37-618, appeared recently at the abode of the Stanleys at Pittsburg, Kansas. This car was purchased at Kansas City, Missouri, and registered to P. L. Paden, 3830 Main Street, Kansas City, Missouri, same being a Chevrolet Coupe, 1933 Model, Motor number 14155. Agent Shanahan's report indicates inquiries at 3830 Main, at which time no identification was made from photographs of the various Subjects shown.

Mrs. Collier, who operates the Colonial Hotel, at 3830 Main Street,

Kansas City, Missouri, informed the Kansas City Office on January 50, 1935 that the same party, Paden, had appeared at the hotel the previous highter

The writer immediately proceeded to the Colonial Rotel where Mrs. Collier informed that on the previous night Paden, together with encolder man, appeared at the hotel. The older man registered under the name of "E. STEWART, TOPEKA, KANSAS". The registration card was produced by Mrs. Collier showing that the registration was on 1-29-55. The original registration card bearing the handwriting of E. Stewart is in the possession of this office and is being forwarded to the Division. She stated that Stewart remained all night, having left real early the morning of January 50th, and that the younger man went out about 2 o'clock in the morning and did not return. There is no telephone in the hotel and no conversation between the two men was overheard. She stated that when Stewart departed he informed her that he would be gone for two or three days but that he would be back. She promised that she would telephone this office immediately upon the return of this party.

In view of the use of the Bliss E. Stewart by Earl Stuchlick in the past it was believed that Earl Stuchlick might be identical with E. Stewart. The Kansas City file regarding Earl Stuchlick reflects that he was indicted for counterfeiting during April 1933 at Topeka, Kansas. Investigation at the office of the United States Secret Service, Kansas City, Vissouri reflected that on January 22, 1933, Stuchlick received a six months sentence in the County Jail at Topeka, Kansas upon conviction for counterfeiting. A photograph of Earl Stuchlick as taken by the Agents of the Secret Service was secured from Mr. William Davenport, in charge of that office in Kansas City, Missouri. This photograph was taken February 25, 1933. His description is there recorded as

It is evident that this is the same individual mentioned in the instant case since his fingerprint classification is the same.

A photograph of Earl Stuchlick was displayed to Mrs. Collier at the Colonial Hotel and she identified it as a photograph of E. Stewart.

From a description of the party known as Paden who stopped at the Colonial Hotel with Stuchlick, it is evident that he may be identical with

Preston Paton, the son of Edna Murray. The description which Mrs. Collier furnished was that he is real tall, wears enappy clothes and that he is around 21 years of age, although she was not sure as to his age, and did not observe him closely.

At the date of the dictation of this report, February 3, 1935. Ers. Collier has not notified this office that these parties have returned. Occasional inquiry has been made through her each day since January 30th to inquire if they have returned and she has stated they have not. It is believed she is sincere in her statement she will notify this office when they do return. It is intended they will be shadowed in their ear when they again appear at Kansas City since it is evident they may be in touch with Edna Murray.

Descriptions of Edna Murray, Doris Connell and Earl Stuchlick are being set forth for ready reference in case of future seed:

both of Tulsa, Oklahoma; that KATE BARKER'S name was KATE DONNIE REYNOLDS and her husband's name was GEORGE BARKER; that she does not know GEORGE BARKER'S address.

MES. VOSHERG stated she is forty-seven years of age, and that she did not know KATE BARKER'S correct age, but that she was approximately fifteen years elder than she; MES. VOSHERG stated that she had not seem KATE BARKER nor the BARKER boys for approximately ten years, until sither April or May, 1955, the exact date of which she cannot remember; that KATE BARKER and the two boys same to her place in Long Beach, driving a large car, and to the best of her judgment, it was a Buick ber. She stated they did not get out of the car, but parked in front of her place and remained in the ear; that she went out and got in the ear and sat there and talked to them for approximately twenty minutes; that they went away, and she did not see the boys again; that she did not know where they were staying, we they did not tell her, and they did not tell her what names they were using.

MES. VOSEERS stated that about a week later, KATE and a joung lady, approximately twenty-five years of age, small of stature and of blonds complexion, same to her place, she believes in the same Buick automobile - at least it was a large ear and resembled the ear which they were in when KATE and the boys were there; that the young lady was not in the ear at the time KATE and the boys were there; that on this occasion, KATE and the girl stayed for approximately one hour; that meither same in the house, but that she went out and sat in the ear and talked with KATE.

MRS. VOSERRG stated that she asked KATE about the boys, and that KATE said "Oh, they are getting along fine; they are very busy in Chisage, you know the World's Fair is on, and they are busy night and day", and this is all that she remembers that KATE said with respect to the boys. She stated that she did not press KATE for information about them, as she knew that the boys were both ex-convicts, and that she had no idea what they might be doing. She stated she did not know that KATE had included in any illegal practices of her own accord, but that she has known for many years that KATE was "craxy about the boys" and could not permit them to be out of her sight for a very great length of them.

MRS. VOSHERG stated she did not know where they stayed on that trip. Agent asked if they might have stayed with MRS. HENNEHERCH, another sister who lives in Ios Angeles, and she stated she did not know, but did not believe so. She further stated that she, Mrs. Vosberg, and her sister MRS. HENNEHERCH have been on the "outs" for many years, and that she has not seen nor talked with her sister for many years.

It was Agent's impression, from what MRS. VOSHERG said, that MRS. VOSHERG probably knew that Agent was informed of the fact that KATE and the two boys had been to her place in 1955, and she immediately volunteered that KATE was in California for approximately two weeks during the latter

part of August, 1934, and stated that, so far as she knew, KATE was alone on that trip; that KATE was at the Bosslyn Hotel, and had either Room No. 405 or 504, and called her on the long distance telephone and taked harito come to Los Angeles to that room in the Bosslyn Hotel to see her; that she went to Los Angeles, to the Rosslyn Hotel, priving showtly before luncheon time; that she and KATE had luncheon in the Rosslyn Hotel Cafe; that they walked around a few blocks, window shopping, and returned to the hotel and visited until about \$:00 o'clock, at which time she returned to her home in Long Beach. She stated that she saw no see with KATE at this time, and that KATE did not mention anyone, and see far as she knows, no one was with KATE on this trip. MRS. VOSEERS stated that she requested KATE to come down and visit her, and KATE promised to do so; that she promised to meet KATE at the Interurban Station near her home; that KATE came and she met her, and they spent the afternoom at her home; that at about 5:00 o'clock, KATE stated she would not stay all might, and stated she believed she would stay in long Beach during the might; that she called a cab and left; that she does not know the hotel at which KATE stopped in long Beach; that during the afternoom, KATE had told her that she desired to do her a little favor, and requested her to accompany her to San Francisco on the steamship YALE; that she agreed to do so, and arrangements were made.

MRS. VOSEERS stated that the next morning, KATE same to her place in a taxicab, and they went from her home to Wilmington, California, where they took the Steemship VALE for San Francisco; that she registered on board the ship in her correct name - MRS. VOSEERS; that she does not know the name which KATE used; that they occupied the same stateroom; that upon their arrival in San Francisco, they took a sab to the Whitcomb Hotel where she registered in her own name, but she does not know what name KATE registered under; that they had a large room and she believes it was on the top floor, but she does not remember the number of the room; that they stayed there four days, sight-seeing, window shopping, etc., and that they met no one of Kate's friends while there, and that Kate did not introduces her to enjone, and she did not see anyone in Kate's company.

and that KATE left the hotel to go to her train to Chicago before she took her train back to Long Beach; that KATE paid the entire expenses of this trip, and the return ticket for her to Long Beach.

It will be remembered, as is reflected from the various reports from the Los Angeles Division Office, that MEL VOSHERG, the sem
of MRS. VOSHERG, has been contacted relative to this matter on a number
of occasions, and at one time he furnished some information which, it is
believed, resulted in the location of the place where KATE and the BARKER
boys had lived in Chicago, but they had moved before the information
reached Chicago.

MRS. VOSHERG, on several occasions while Agent was interviewing her, stated that she has three boys ranging from twenty-three to seventeen years of age, and that mone of them knowsanything about the fast that KATE BARKER was their count, and that the BARKER boys were their counts; that she did everything in her power to keep this information from them.

MRS. VOSHERG also stated that this was perhaps the reason why
KATE did not visit her in her home, and perhaps the reason why KATE did
not stay overnight at her home, although she stated she was not well prepared to take sare of her if she had wanted to stay, for the reason that
they are in very moderate circumstances and have a very small bungalow
home.

MRS. VOSHERG had never been personally contacted by the Los Angeles Division Office, as it was deemed inadvisable to do so, and it was at all times believed and hoped that the VOSHERG boy would be able to obtain information of value.

Agent interviewed WILLIAM W. McKEIGHAM, assistant manager of the Rosslyn Hotel, Los Angeles, and a thorough search of the records of the hotel was made in an effort to find the name under which KATE BARKER had registered while there, and in that way, through telephone calls and otherwise, to ascertain who, if anyone, KATE BARKER contacted while here; however, no record was found of her registration under her name or aliases. A thorough check was also made of the rooms numbered 405 and 504, and it was ascertained that no one bearing her name, or her aliases, occupied either of those rooms during the month of August and first half of September, 1954.

Agent made a search of the passenger list on the Steamship Company, and found that on September 5, 1934, a "MRS. VOSHERG and MRS. F. HOWARD" were assigned to stateroom No. 5 on the trip from Wilmington to San Francisco; that MRS. VOSHERG had a one-way ticket, Form 25, No.22005, and "MRS. HOWARD" secured a ticket as a portion of a railway ticket, and that the steamship ticket issued thereon was Form 2505, No.6781, and the railway ticket M.R.12, No.1768, sold at Chicago, Illinois on August 1, 1934. The record did not show the address of the party purchasing the railway ticket either at Los Angeles or Chicago, but MR. LEMON stated that the

round-trip railway ticket which MRS. F. HOWARD (Kate Barker) had would, no doubt, bear the signature of the party purchasing it, and that same would be in Chicago at the general offices of the Chicago Morthwestern Railway Company.

It was ascertained that Ticket Agent C. M. RECTOR sold the tickets for the steamship trip from Wilmington to San Francisco. A picture of KATE BARKER was shown to him, but he was unable to recognize her or remember having sold a ticket to her.

After obtaining this information from the office of the Stemmanip Company, Agent returned to the Rosslyn Hotel and made a further search, in an effort to get the record of "MRS. F. HOWARD". A thorough search failed to reveal any information with respect to anyone registering in that name. The only party by the name of "HOWARD" found between August 15th and September 5th was MRS. C. A. HOWARD, Salem, Oregon, and a MRS. F. SHAW, Salem, Oregon, who had Room 401, and registered on August 15th.



Reference is made to letter of the Philadelphia office dated January 26, 1935, indicating that the father of ALVIN KARPIS had interested himself in obtaining custody of the expected kaby of DOLORES DELANEY, there being a letter enclosed from Geroge BiHolmes, Attorney, Chicago, Illinois, to the United States Attorney at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, who requested him to deliver a letter to the girl, indicating that they would take the baby and keep it permanently if the mother is not able or not allowed to keep it; that if Dolores Delaney is allowed her freedom they would also be glad to take her in and care for her and the child also.

In this connection it is believed that possibly it would facilitate the possible sentence of this woman in Court at Miami, Florida upon conviction, if the members of either her family or the Karpis family were allowed to take custody of the baby having since been born to Dolores Delaney at Philadelphia. However this is being left to the discretion of the Division as to whether or not they wish to advise the Philadelphia office in the premises, as to what further conferences, if any, they should have with the United States attorney at Philadelphia as to the attitude to be taken in connection with the efforts of the family of either Dolores Delaney or Alvin Karpis in obtaining custody of this child. Undoubtedly if this woman appears at Miami, Florida with the child it will create a symph thetic attitude toward her on the part of the court or jury, whichever may consider the facts in her case.



A cleak of the various residence and telephone directories for Denver and suburban towns failed to disclose the mome of R. I. Simpson, and the records of the local credit agencine did not reveal his name. Efforts to locate a matrimonial agency through these sources and through the City

License Bureau were elso unsuccessful, Through a shock of the newspapers, it was determined that R. E. Impson edvertised several years ago as "The Got-Acquainted Correspondence Club", and that this advertising is now being corried on by Herry T. B nor under the same trude name, the address of this person being 4300 713h76-Avenue Parkway, Denver.

DIVISION OF INVESTIGATION

In an interview had by the writer and Special Agent R. T. Mann with Barry T. Boner, it was determined that shortly prior to Jenuary 12, 1935, C. L. Herper, whose surners. DETARTMENT OF JUSTICE was then mistaken for "Sayser", wrote in ensuer to an advertisement of this concern appearing in the Kansas City Journal. Er. Bonor was unable to locate this letter. Under date of January 12, 1935, a form letter was sent by Boner to Harper as "Hayser", Box 12, Raytown, Missouri, and on January 14, 1935, the latter, giving his full name as Geo. Lawrence Harper, executed an application and description blank for membership, which he returned with a letter requesting that the names and addresses of the youngest girls listed slose to Kansas City be sent to him. As requested, the regular correspondence list of this concern was mailed to him at Box 12, Raytown, Missouri, this list containing the names and addresses of ammerous girls living in the middle west.

This is the first correspondence this concern has had from Harper, and a check of the correspondence records failed to disclose the names or known aliases of any of the Subjects in this case.

A comparison of the handwriting of Harper with that of Sabject Volney Davis appearing on Identification Order \$1237 direlated considerable similarity. Harper's description, as shown on the above mentioned membership application, is as follows:

Upon communicating the above information to your office today, the writer was informed by Sp cial Agent Miller that Harper, who had been identified as Volmey Davis, had just been apprehended as As of possible assistance to your effice, I am forwarding herewith in addition to the executed application blank and letter of Subject Davis as Herper, a copy of the correspondence list forwarded to him by The Oct-Acquainted Correspondence Club. It is requested that these papers be returned to the Denver Office when they have served their purpose.





Pursuant to your instructions I telephoned Mr. Hugh Fisher of the Criminal Division relative to the possible extradition of Nathan Heller from Cuba to this country on a harboring charge or a conspiracy charge. After consulting the existing extradition treaty between this country and Cuba, Mr. Fisher advised that the treaty did not cover harboring or conspiracy, but that it did cover kidnaping.

I explained to Mr. Fisher that Heller cannot be included in the kidnaping conspiracy indictment in that we do not at this time have sufficient evidence to implicate him. We discussed the continuing feature of the crime of kidnaping down to the exchanging of kidnap ransom money and in this connection Mr. Fisher advised that he had received information from the United States Attorney at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, that the Court of Appeals would probably hand down its decision on this question within the next three weeks.



Mr. Peloquin went on to state that on the night of January 29, 1935, just before midnight he placed Miss Mumaw, his subject, in a sleep influenced by his knowledge of hypnotism and while she was so sleeping he asked her questions about Karpis and Campbell, and the resulting answers comprised the information conveyed to this office by Detective O'Shea. Also on this particular night, Mr. Peloquin stated that he had inquired of Miss Mumaw while she was still under the influence of this sleep as to the whereabouts of the gangaters who had robbed United States Mail Truck at Fall River, Mass. The answers as given by Miss Mumaw were of such importance in Mr. Peloquin's opinion that he desired to telephone the Boston Police Department but the only thing that kept him from so doing was the fact that he lacked the necessary funds. Mr. Peloquin described himself as an automobile salesman, for the City Motors Sales Company, Inc., 1970 86th Street, Brooklyn, M.Y. and also as an amateur clairvoyance practitioner. He stated that he has been studying this "science" known as clairvoyance for the past year, and that he expects, with a little more experience, to make it his life's profession. He described the girl accompanying him as his subject without whom it would be impossible for him to obtain any information whatever. In conclusion Mr. Peloquin stated that he will always be available should the government desire to make use of the information that he might be able to obtain, and that he would not expect any pecuniary reward unless his information was proven to be an actuality.





The father, W. D. Donald, is a Presbyterian. The father and mother died about eight years ago. The Sheriff also ascertained that Phoenix Donald was never baptized into any church.

On Jamuary 28, 1935 Harold Tuck, who has provided information to the Chicago Division Office in connection with the Dillinger case, called at this Office and was interviewed by Special Agent V. W. Peterson.

Harold Tuck stated that a relative of one CHARLES COOK, alias HARRY FLETCHER, who resides at 45 North Oakley, Chicago, Illinois, informed him that Charles Cook is wanted by the United States Government.

A search was made of the files of the Chicago Division Office and no information could be located indicating that the Charles Cook referred to by Harold Tuck is wanted by the Division of Investigation, however, this information is being forwarded to the Division in order that a further search may be made of the files in the Division for the purpose of determining whether Charles Cook is actually wanted by the Division of Investigation.

It was stated by Harold Tuck that Charles Cook, alias,
Harry Fletcher, is wanted by the United States Government because of
defrauding the Government in connection with transactions relating to
a ranch which he operated approximately fifty miles from Los Angeles,
California. It was believed by Harold Tuck that the name of the ranch





I talked with Mr. Hanson at Miami in regard to the developments In the above, and he stated that as yet they have been unable to locate McDonald; that they have heard rumors, and otherwise received information to the effect that McDonald is in and around Miami. Mr. Hanson asked my reaction to the situation, in that he has to appear before the grand jury at Jacksonville tomorrow. I told him that it would be a good idea for him to leave two men down there to work on the leads which they now have; that he could go to Jacksonville, testify before the grand jury, and then return to Miami and press the investigation vigorously; that in the meantime the remainder of the men down there should return to their headquarters. Hr. Hanson stated that he would leave Agents Nichols and Metcalfe down there.

Mr. Hanson then mentioned the property of Karpis' which was recovered down there, which property consists of an automobile, a motor boat, a radio, etc. I told him that it was up to the Cuban authorities as to what disposition should be made of this property; that, however, it would be all right to confiscate the automobile; that in this connection the American Ambassador and the United States Attorney should be contacted to make the necessary arrangements; that we should not touch the remainder of this property.

Mr. Hanson stated that he has instructed Agent Brown to give the Cuban authorities all the information concerning Heller which they have collected so that the Cuban authorities might use the same in their deportation proceedings against Heller.

Mr. Hanson then mentioned the two automobiles down there, which automobiles formerly belonged to Karpis and Campbell. Mr. Hanson called and advised as to the following facts.

A complaint was filed here today against Nathaniel H. Heller. It charged him with a violation of Section 88 of Title 18 of the United States Code, in that he unlawfully, knowingly, and wilfully conspired, combined, confederated, and agreed with John Doe and Richard Roe, whose true names are at this time unknown. (2) In violation of Section 141 U.S. Criminal Code, harboring, concealed one Alvin (Karpovich, alias Alvin Karpis, the person for whom writs, search and bench warrants have then and there been issued by the District Court of the United States for the District of Linnesota, well knowing and having known it as a fact that bench warrants have been issued for the apprehension of Karpovich.

The persons refered to in the complaint as John Doe and Richard lliam/Harrison and hechocald. The United States Roe are William Harrison and Attorney did not think it fit at this time to mention the names of either of those two men in the complaint.

Mr. Hanson advised that he expects to leave in the morning at eight o'clock for Havana, where he will be at the Presidente Hotel. It is uncertain whether Lr. Hanson will be able to get out on that plane, as all the reservations are taken, but in the event of a last minute cancelation he will take that plane. Ir. Hanson will advise definitely by wire, when he leaves. Ar. Hanson expects to return tomorrow evening at three o'clock and will be back here at five. Special Agent R.D.Brown is also going back over there in the morning.

The U.S. Attorney here in Miami suggests that in this case it would be better for the Cuban Government to deport Heller rather than attempt to extradite him, because he does not believe this conspiracy violation comes within the treaty.

Yesterday noon, United States Attorney John W. Holland requested that I call at his office for a conference. Upon my arrival at Mr. Holland's office he introduced me to Claude B. Kenney, an attorney from Joplin, Missouri, and Frank Dixon, who is the employer of George Barker, father of the Barker brothers. Messrs. Kenney and Dixon appeared sincere, responsible, ethical, and gentlemen in every respect. They presented to Mr. Holland letters of introduction from the Clerk of the United States District Court at Joplin, Missouri. They also presented letters of administration showing that by the Probate Court of Jasper County, Missouri, on January 23, 1935, George Barker and Frank Dixon were appointed administrators of the estate of Fred Barker, deceased.

These gentlemen were here for the purpose of securing for George Barker any estate left by Fred Barker.

Mr. Holland advised Messrs. Kenney and Dixon that all money found in the house occupied by Kate and Fred Barker at Oklawaha, Florida, on January 16, 1935, was being held temporarily by the Government, that he wanted to be frank in his statements, and that he wanted these gentlemen to know that he would give them no information to make their work or search for assets easier, that the connection of Kate and Fred Barker with this nationally known mob was such that any property left by Kate and Fred Barker would be handled according to law, that he did not intend to aid or cooperate with attorneys or others to the end that any one not entitled to this property would attain same; that the Government in connection with this estate intended to be fair, that he did not intend to tell these men all he knew about the gang of which Kate and Fred Barker were the leading members, that he would not cooperate in working out their problems to secure any part of the estate.

Mr. Kenney stated that he believed that George Barker would be entitled under the law to the estate left by Fred Barker, that of source of the property found he could not determine which would belong to Kate and which would belong to Fred, that he did not know who had purchased the automobile that was found, but that George Barker had informed him that he had learned that Fred had purchased an automobile, that of course it might have been purchased under a fictitious name.

Barker for seven or more years, that during the last three and one half years he has employed him and has found him to be a congenial, respectable, honest man in every respect; that George Barker since his divorce from Kate Barker has lived in fear of his life, that he has been afraid of his wife and some and has stated that Kate Barker was responsible for the criminal lives and activities of her sone. Mr. Dixon stated that Mr. Barker would never talk of his family, that he never mentioned the boys, his sone, unless it would relate to the time when they were all children. Dixon stated that he really believes that up until a year ago George Barker was contacted at various times by his sone, that he knows that on occasions Mr. Barker would bar the doors and windows of his home at nights with 2x4 timbers, fearing that during the night his boys might some and kill him.

With reference to Fred Barker's estate, Mr. Holland called the attention of Kessrs. Kenney and Dixon to the fact that possibly Fred Barker might have had a wife or two who might show up at some future time and claim his estate, which would leave his father out entirely. Mr. Holland also called the attention of these gentlemen to the fact that possibly the Government might take action against this estate in an effort to collect income tax, since it was known that Fred Barker and others, after kidnaping Mr. Bremer, had received \$200,000.00, and that of course if income tax had not been paid on this amount the Government might take action to collect and if for the payment of income taxes it would seize all of the money left -which he did not believe would cover the tax -- nothing would be left for any one setting up claims showing a legal interest in Fred or Kate Barker's estate, after which Mr. Kenney stated that at the behest of Mr. Barker they were in Florida simply on a "fishing" expedition to determine whether these persons had left an estate to which George Barker was entitled. Both of these gentlemen intimated on leaving that because of the ramifications in connection with this case they hardly thought that it would be worthwhile pursuing their investigation.

I telephoned Mr. Manson at Miami and inquired whether a warrant has been issued for Nathaniel Heller. Mr. Hanson stated that there has been one issued charging him with conspiracy. I then inquired if this warrant has been certified so that it may be used in extradition proceedings. Mr. Hanson stated that he is informed by the United States Attorney that the offense of conspiracy is not an extraditable offense; that in this connection, the warrant has not been certified. I told Mr. Hanson to have the warrant certified in any event, so that if the occasion presents itself to use it, it will be ready; that if we are unable to serve it, we will at least have tried.

I inquired when the indictment is going to be returned. Mr. Hanson stated that the case is going to be presented to the grand jury tomorrow morning, and it is expected that the grand jury will make its return about. Thursday. In this connection, Mr. Hanson stated that he has appointments with the United States Attorney both this afternoon and this evening, and the case will then be presented tomorrow.

I then mentioned that I was somewhat concerned about the attitude of the American Ambassador in Cuba. I told him that a telegram received from Agent Brown this morning indicates that the Ambassador is not satisfied that Heller knew who Karpis was, and unless the Ambassador can be convinced, there will possibly be no deportation. Mr. Hanson stated that the Ambassador had asked him what his opinion on this matter was, and Mr. Hanson told him that he, Mr. Hanson, was sure that Heller knew with whom he was dealing; that he had pointed out the many things which Heller had done for Karpis which were so unusual and irregular for a hotel manager to do for his regular guests; that, however, it appears that the Ambassador is not satisfied that Heller knew who Karpis was.

I told Mr. Hanson to have the indictment certified when it is returned, and we will then take further steps along the above lines.

He stated that it would be reduced tonight, by at least three agents and possibly the entire squad could be withdrawn if contacts which are to be made today do not definitely disclose the present location of Harry Sawyer, Willie Harrison and Cash McDonald, in Miami. Please be advised that during the week ending February 2, 1935, Henry "Duke" Randall was arraigned before the United States Commissioner at Miami, Florida on January 25, 1935 on charges of harboring Alvin Karpis. He waived preliminary hearing and was committed to the County Jail in default of \$25,000 bond.

On January 29, 1935 Joseph H Adams was arraigned before the United States Commissioner at Miami, Florida on charges of harboring Alvin Karpis, also for viblation of Sections 4-4 of the Firearm Act and 3450 of the Revised Statutes - Concealing Goods with Intent to Evade Revenue Law. The latter two violations arose out of the handling of the Browning automatic rifle which Adams is alleged to have obtained from Willie Harrison. Adams was released on \$5,000 cash bond and hearing/was set for February 12, 1935.

Special Agents in Cuba have located one Nathan Heller, hotel proprietor who admits harboring Alvin Karpis and otherwise assisting him. Karpis presented a card on which a notation had been placed by Adams, referred to above, indicating to Heller that Karpis was "O. K." Investigation also discloses that Cassius McDonald, together with Willie Harrison and Harry Sawyer, exchanged a considerable portion of the Bremer ransom money in Havana, Cuba during September of 1934.

Extensive investigation in the vicinity of Toledo, Ohio has failed to develop any information regarding the whereabouts of Karpis and Campbell, although the latest tangible leads on these two individuals indicated their presence in that vicinity.

Mr. Brown called and stated they had received some very unfavorable publicity at Havana; that evidently the American Consul is not "backing us up"; that he is going to insist that Heller have a deportation hearing; that the publicity is being received through the American newspapers in Havana, the papers claiming that we are "railroading "Heller; that we caused him to be held incognito, etc. Mr. Brown stated he had talked with Ambassador Caffery this afternoon and he had suggested putting a proposition up to Heller - that he go voluntarily to the United States and face the charges there. Mr. Caffery thinks this a splendid idea; that it would satisfy the newspapers and accomplish our purpose also. He asked my opinion about the matter. I stated that to the best of my knowledge, in deportation proceedings, the Ambassador has no jurisdiction; that he can simply satisfy himself that the man is an American citizen; that the deportation is up to the Cuban authorities. I stated, however, that if Heller would agree to go to the United States voluntarily and face the charges, this would be satisfactory. I then stated that if he did not hear further from me within the next hour and a half he should follow the above procedure - the transportation costing \$35 - according to Mr. Brown. He further stated that in September of last year (September 10th), Cassius McDonald and a Cuban named Alivar negotiated at the Chase National Bank approximately \$72,000 in fives, tens and twenties, which was evidently part of the Bremer ransom money. Part of this money was sent to the National City Bank of New York. Mr. Brown stated that undoubtedly McDonald, the Cuban and Willie Harrison had brought the money to Cuba.

I telephoned Mr. Coulter at the St. Paul Office in regard to Bolton and told him that since we have confined the questioning of Bolton thus far to the Bremer case, and possibly have obtained from him all the information in his possession in regard to that case, we should now question him in regard to the Hamm kidnaping case; that in this connection, it would desirable to have him brought to the St. Paul Office for questioning. I told him further that Farmer or any other persons who are now in custody there should also be questioned about the Hamm case, or any other case in which the Division is interested.

For the information of the Division, Mr. Coulter stated that last week Mr. Nathan had permitted the County Attorney of Dakota County to bring some witnesses in and view Doc Barker in regard to the \$30,000 robbery in Dakota County in October of 1933. None of these witnesses was able to make a definite identification of Barker in this regard.
