[redacted] advised that he was not a member of the prison extremist inmate group known as the Black Guerrilla Family (BGF) and had never taken the BGF oath. He advised he was not in contact with any members of the BGF and had no desire or intention of committing any acts of violence or criminal activity for the inmate group.

[redacted] advised that he had associated with BGF members while in San Quentin Prison and had been warned by BGF members that his association would cause him to be labeled among other inmates and by prison authorities as a BGF member. [redacted] stated that among BGF members it is known that [redacted] is not a member.

The Crips, also known as The Cripps, The Cribs and The Crypt, a gang of youths in the Los Angeles, California, area whose activities consist of having confrontations with other youth gangs in the Los Angeles area, are reportedly joining the BGF upon their commitment to state prison. Partially due to this, as well as other reasons, the BGF may be slowly moving into a criminal "black mafia" type organization. It is estimated that 30 - 35 per cent of the BGF is more crime-oriented and the remainder are still dedicated revolutionaries.

A former Crips member [redacted] was killed recently in Los Angeles, California [redacted]

[redacted] had a large number of BGF members under his control [redacted] is supposedly mostly associated with the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA) and still has a great deal of affection for SLA member EMILY HARRIS.

Two female associates of the SLA are currently living in the West Los Angeles area. They are known as [redacted] and probably are prostitutes. They also use revolutionary names. Both girls carry weapons; one, a .38 caliber in a shoulder holster, the other, a .45 caliber in a holster on her back. Reportedly, the female with the .45 caliber automatic carries extra magazines in her purse. Both are described as female caucasians; mid 20s; [redacted]

On 1/14/76, a conference of the Monterey Task Force Intelligence Group was held at the Holiday Inn, San Jose, California. In attendance were police officers, California Department of Corrections personnel from throughout California, and representatives from various Federal investigative agencies.

The Monterey Task Force Intelligence Group holds monthly meetings for the purpose of disseminating, gathering, and exchanging information between law enforcement agencies concerning the four major prison gangs in the California Department of Corrections: The Black Guerrilla Family (BGF), the Aryan Brotherhood, the Nuestra Familia, and the Mexican Mafia. The Monterey Task Force Intelligence Group is a federally funded project.

Information obtained in the Sacramento interview of [redacted] 10/8/75, indicates that she is almost certainly the individual referred to in referenced Los Angeles nitel to the Director dated 7/18/75.

[redacted] again readily admitted her visits to [redacted] and again stated that their visits were of a personal nature and that she was not involved in any extremist activities or associated with the BGF. [redacted] indicated that she is not involved in any criminal activities and has no criminal intent. Referenced Sacramento letter reflects [redacted] has no criminal record.

In view of the nature of [redacted] contacts and [redacted] her lack of association with any other members of the BGF presently in prison, her lack of any criminal record, and her steady employment, no further investigation is being conducted regarding [redacted] by the Sacramento Division.

Information contained in referenced 2/4/76 letter had been previously received by Los Angeles from [redacted] who is original source of information furnished in referenced letter from [redacted]. This information has been disseminated to individual case files and appropriate investigation conducted.

Continuous contact with [redacted] has been maintained since this information was originally received in November 1975 in an effort to verify information and to obtain additional information of organized BGF activities. This source, as well as other sources knowledgeable of BGF activities including [redacted] have been unable to verify this information. At this time, veracity of information is under question by [redacted] as concerns [redacted] and BGF organizational attempts in Los Angeles.

All BGF members known to be on parole in the Los Angeles area are subjects of current or closed preliminary investigation by Los Angeles Division. No organized activities between these individuals has been determined, with the exception of the activity of a few members surrounding the visits of Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA) sympathizer [REDACTED] to Los Angeles in September and October 1975. *cal*

Since November 1975, the BGF in Los Angeles has been the target of intensified investigation to determine the extent of criminal and extremist activities by the BGF. This investigation has failed to indicate any organized criminal or extremist activities. Local law enforcement agencies and sources noted previously have all advanced opinion that lack of any organized activity is directly related to [REDACTED] *cal*

[REDACTED] and the serious setback this had on the BGF. The primary activity observed since November 1975 has been individual criminal acts resulting in the arrest of approximately 20 percent of the BGF members currently on parole to the Los Angeles area. These acts have not been connected or organized in any manner. *cal*

Los Angeles is continuing to investigate all BGF members as they are paroled to this area. However, due to a total lack of activities on an organizational level, the BGF case file is being placed in a pending inactive status to be utilized as a control file by Los Angeles. All information of interest to the Bureau, Office of Origin and other offices will be appropriately disseminated as it is received.

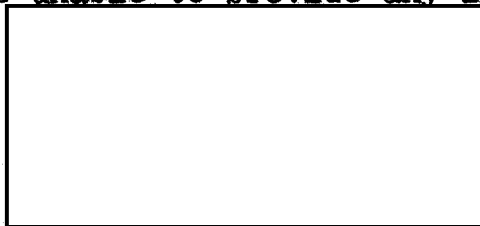

San Diego currently has cases opened on individuals released from the California State Penal System who reportedly had some membership affiliation or association with captioned Black Guerrilla Family while serving in California State Penal Institutions. A canvass of informants conversant with various phases of extremist activities in the San Diego area has not, to date, revealed any indication of an organized operative and existent Black Guerrilla Family in San Diego. However, inasmuch as cases are still open on the above referred to parolees from the California State Penal Institutions to the San Diego area, captioned case is not being made RUC at this time. Upon completion of investigation of above referred to parolees and recontact of informants, appropriate action will be taken in regard to the disposition of captioned matter.

Informants have been alerted to report any Black Guerrilla Family activity, and contact will be made with these informants to report any activity regarding captioned matter.

On 3/24/76, a meeting of the Monterey Task Force on Organized Prison Groups was held at San Diego, California. Besides the usual exchange of information on the four prison groups, Black Guerrilla Family (BGF), Nuestra Familia, Mexican Mafia and Aryan Brotherhood, this conference provided the first meeting of coordinating agents from each of the California field offices which has a pending investigation of the BGF. A meeting of these agents representing the Los Angeles and San Francisco BGF target teams, and Sacramento and San Diego BGF cases provided a better exchange of information on target organization and coordination. Progress was made towards an overall picture of BGF activities which will provide for a more unified investigative effort.

It was the consensus at the above meetings that the BGF has not been able to mount their pre-planned extra-prison organization due to the effectiveness of law enforcement in returning many of the BGF members and leadership to incarcerated status. These successes have been the direct result of increased liaison and cooperation between prison authorities and law enforcement groups (including the FBI Prisons Program), which have brought BGF membership and activities to the attention of enforcement agencies who then through more careful scrutiny have developed murder, robbery and narcotics cases on many BGF members.

Enclosed for information of the Bureau and receiving offices is one copy of the Black Guerrilla Family (BGF) oath found in the cell of an inmate at California Men's Colony, San Luis Obispo, California, on 3/19/76.

Continuing investigations of BGF members paroled to the Los Angeles area have indicated a high rate of recidivism for these individuals. Most frequently, these individuals are being arrested for robberies and drug related offenses. Continuous liaison with various local law enforcement agencies has failed to determine any organization to these criminal violations. [redacted]

[redacted] have all indicated that these criminal activities are apparently unrelated to the BGF as an extremist organization and represent only individual criminal efforts.

Initial investigation of captioned organization began in the latter part of 1973 when it was learned that the BGF was the cause of a great deal of violence within the California Prison System and followed an oath which was based on the philosophy of MAO TSE-TUNG.

In 1974, information was received from several sources that the BGF planned to expand its activities and organization outside the prison system. During this period, there was a large number of BGF members released to the San Francisco and Los Angeles areas and Bureau investigation of members and leaders of the BGF was increased to determine their organizational success.

In referenced Los Angeles letter to the Bureau, Los Angeles indicated that the BGF had failed to organize in their area and that many of the members had recently been returned to prison for criminal acts.

San Francisco letter to the Bureau, 4/19/76, further verifies that the BGF has been unable to organize as a group outside the prison, however, several members who were involved in the BGF inside the prison are relating to extremist activities with other radical groups active in the Bay area.

Sacramento concurs with San Francisco in that direct attention placed on members of the BGF has caused many of the leaders and members to be returned to prison. In addition, information developed from increased liaison with prison authorities has resulted in a great deal of intelligence on other radicals in contact with prison inmates and developed information on suspects in bank robbery matters.

Sacramento has had very limited BGF activity outside of the prison system but is in a good position to follow prison group activities through its liaison with the California Department of Corrections, Intelligence Division, located in Sacramento.

Based on the decline in activity of the BGF outside the prison system in the Los Angeles and Sacramento area, and the apparent centralization of same in the San Francisco area, it is recommended that OO in this matter be transferred to San Francisco.

Sacramento will continue to work with the California Department of Corrections and provide any information of value to the Bureau and other interested Offices.

San Francisco concurs with the overall assessment done by this group with the exception of the intensity and relationship described between the BGF and Black Liberation Army (BLA). It has been the observation within the San Francisco Division that BLA members inside the California Prison System qualitatively and quantitatively comprise a small portion of total BGF activity; however, there is much similarity in the rhetoric of BGF members regarding proposed activity external to the prison and BLA activities of the recent past.

The Black Guerrilla Family dates back to 1966, when it was formed at San Quentin by the late George Jackson. At that time the group was called the Black Family. While Jackson was at Soledad Prison, the name was changed to the Black Vanguard. Since the death of George Jackson (Aug. 1971), it has become the Black Guerrilla Family, also known as the B.G.F. The group at this time also called itself the "Chosen Family" of George Jackson. They are also known as the Prison Counterpart in the Black Liberation Army (BLA).

The B.G.F. follows the Marxist-Leninist teachings of George Jackson and former Black Panther leader Eldridge Cleaver. Overall, the B.G.F. classifies itself as a revolutionary guerrilla family which intends to control the destiny of black prison inmates. The B.G.F. is against a capitalist system and finds its ideology in communist philosophy. Their main three objectives are:

1. Erratication of racism.
2. Struggle to maintain dignity and pride in a prison environment.
3. Revolution to overthrow the government of the United States of America.

The B.G.F. has grown very rapidly. Many disenchanted members of other black groups have become members of the B.G.F. The group is so closely alligned with the B.L.A. that many authorities feel that the B.G.F. is nothing more than the prison branch of the B.L.A. We know of several ranking B.L.A. members who, since being incarcerated, hold high rank in the B.G.F. There also is a black youth group known as the "Crips" that originated in Los Angeles, California, and is very closely tied into the B.G.F. and B.L.A. As "Crips" members are convicted of various crimes and enter the prison system, they

immediately become members of the B.G.F.

The B.G.F. consist of a Central Executive Committee (CEC), Field Generals (ten in number), Captains of Security, Captains of Arms, Captains of Squads, Lieutenants and Soldiers. Their goals are set by the Generals. All members are responsible to the CEC, and all Generals are members of the CEC. Most members do not want to rise above being a soldier or to assume a higher position of leadership because responsibility increases. The leaders are responsible for the acts of the membership and must take or be able to cause retaliation and other acts of violence to revenge a wrong to a member. In addition to the aforementioned hierarchy, if a prison has no General in it, then there are "Regional Generals". A "Regional General" assumes the powers and responsibilities of a General and acts when there is no regular General available. A soldier is any black inmate who is willing to "fight for principle". To "fight for principle" means that if a member is the victim of an assault or gang attack, the nearest fellow soldier will immediately come to his aid.

The B.G.F. has a continuing recruitment program which extends its membership throughout the entire California prison system. In addition to the regular group discussions on Marxist political theory, recruitment programs include training in physical combat and the ideological dogma which is intended to convince the new member to commit himself by a death oath to the Family. All prospective members are given the oath in writing for three days to memorize, after which he must recite the oath from memory. If a prospective member has any questions or reservations about the oath,

he is not allowed to become a member. Death of or to a member is the only means of dismemberment.

The B.G.F. regards as its enemies the authorities of the California Department of Corrections, most guards, the California Judicial System, its judges and most law enforcement officers. B.G.F. members have been involved in many acts resulting in death of many inmates and prison officials.

The B.G.F. recognizes the Sword and Gun as its symbol - This is normally a tattoo of a sword and gun on the upper chest area of the member. Not everyone who has the tattoo is, in fact, a member of the B.G.F. However, if a black inmate has the tattoo, it indicates he considers himself a soldier. //

The principal objective of the B.G.F. in trying to organize former members on the streets is to conceive escape attempts. b7C b7D

Recently B.G.F. members have been paroled and have become involved in numerous robberies, narcotic traffic, and murders. There have also been rumors of their involvement in escape attempts.

HEADQUARTERS:

Approximately 200 blacks in and out of the prison system, although the exact number is unknown as this group is very popular to young blacks within the penal system. Most of the members are racially and criminally oriented.

Upon completion of investigation of above referred to parolees and recontact of informants, appropriate action will be taken in regard to the disposition of captioned matter.

Informants have been alerted to report any BGF activity.

Investigation of the BGF was initiated in 1974 as a black extremist organization active within the California penal system. In referenced letter Sacramento points out that its activities are not seriously impairing functions of the state government and therefore further investigation under the Attorney General's Guidelines is not warranted.

The BGF is basically an unstructured organization, elements of which have existed in prisons located within territories of all four of our offices in California. Sacramento was designated as Office of Origin. Since a number of individuals affiliated with the BGF have been active in Los Angeles and San Francisco these offices may desire to recommend continued investigation of the BGF. However, based on a review at FBIHQ, it is felt that no further investigation of the BGF is warranted in any of our California Offices.

Enclosed for the Bureau are 5 copies and for Sacramento 2 copies of a letterhead memorandum concerning recent activities of the BGF.

As the Bureau is aware, investigation into the BGF matter was discontinued in September, 1976 after it was determined that the activities of the group did not pose a sufficient threat to impair the function of government policies or decisions.

The State of California, Department of Corrections, has however, continued to monitor the activities of the BGF. With the announcement of "Black August" they believe that the BGF is preparing to launch an all out assault within the prison system with substantial outside support in the form of revolutionary expropriations, arms collection and the establishment of "safe houses" for the purpose of taking hostages to cause the release of BGF leaders in the four major California penal institutions. These are San Quentin, Soledad,

No attempt will be made to solicit live informant coverage in this matter due to the BGF's adherence to a "death oath" for members. It has been the standing practice of the BGF to execute any member who will not carry out a hit when ordered. [redacted] has developed informant coverage to an extent that BGF activities can be monitored.

On July 1, 1979 a female using the name Kishfu read a document entitled "Black August Solidarity Statement" on a prison reform radio program on Bay Area radio station KPFA FM, Berkeley, California, at 10 PM. The statement reads as follows:

"Those of us who are struggling in the minimum security section of this vast concentration camp called Amerika, wish to express our solidarity with those of you who are confined behind the walls of San Quentin and all other maximum security strongholds. Because we too understand the historical significance of the month of August, the lives of so many of our comrades lost, we wish to begin a surge forward, a striving upward to all things conducive to our total liberation as a nation of people. To further impress upon the minds of all those with whom we come in contact regularly, the seriousness of our total situation inside and out, we will have daily study groups alternating between the houses of everyone we struggle along side. To insure that our children aren't sorely neglected, we will begin weekend workshops that will hopefully continue after this commemorative month is over. We will build a communal food pantry and bank. Two first aid stations will be established on both sides of the Bay, hopefully equipped to handle most situations. In this month we will struggle to accomplish everything feasibly possible for ourselves and those inside. We will establish all necessary contacts wherever and with whomever possible. We will eat only one meal a day, after dark, for the entire month, to promote discipline. Media will be limited to bare necessities, news and education programs only. No drugs or alcoholic beverages will be consumed. On a personal level, everyone must attempt to mend any and all bad feelings that stand in the way of progressive struggle.

"It is with the remembrance of the lives of our fallen comrades that we will enter the month of August. It will be from this point on, a month of intense activity in regards to promoting the development of unity among black people. The fact that these soliders were murdered by the fascist cretins who hold so many of our brothers in chains must not be forgotten. We contend that it not be. POWER TO THE PEOPLE! STRENGTH TO THE DETERMINED!

Suspected BGF activity outside the prison still appears to center on the United Prisoners Union in San Francisco and MAX SCHWARTZ's radio program "State of Emergency" on Berkeley radio station KPFA. This mainly consists of rallies and picketing of CDC hearings in San Francisco and Sacramento and appeals for funds for prisoners' organizations and programs.

The Alameda County District Attorney's office has issued strict instructions to its investigators as well as police intelligence agencies within its jurisdiction not to divulge or discuss any aspects of the bank robberies or shootings so as not to prejudice the trials. As a consequence little or no information has been developed concerning any BGF outside activity.

This matter is being followed by San Francisco and it is anticipated that as the trials progress, more information will become available.

Continuing contact with foreign diplomatic institutions has failed to develop any further information on surveillance or contacts with them by BGF suspects.

For the information of the Bureau, the Sacramento, Los Angeles, and San Diego Divisions after canvassing their respective agencies and sources have reported no information identifiable with the BGF.

Investigation continuing.

On September 30, 1979, Roy "Chaka" Gant broadcast an appeal for support for the June 14, 1979, bank robbery suspects on the KPFA program "State of Emergency." In this broadcast Gant read a prepared statement denying any involvement by that group or any connection with the Faye Stender shooting and stated that any attempts to hold hostages was ridiculous and a "frame-up."

Gant further noted that the Bay Area leftist groups had totally abandoned them stating that no groups or attorneys had approached them offering assistance.

The program host, Max Schwartz, then delivered an impassioned plea for individuals to attend the court hearings which began on October 25, 1979, at Alameda County Courthouse, Oakland, California.

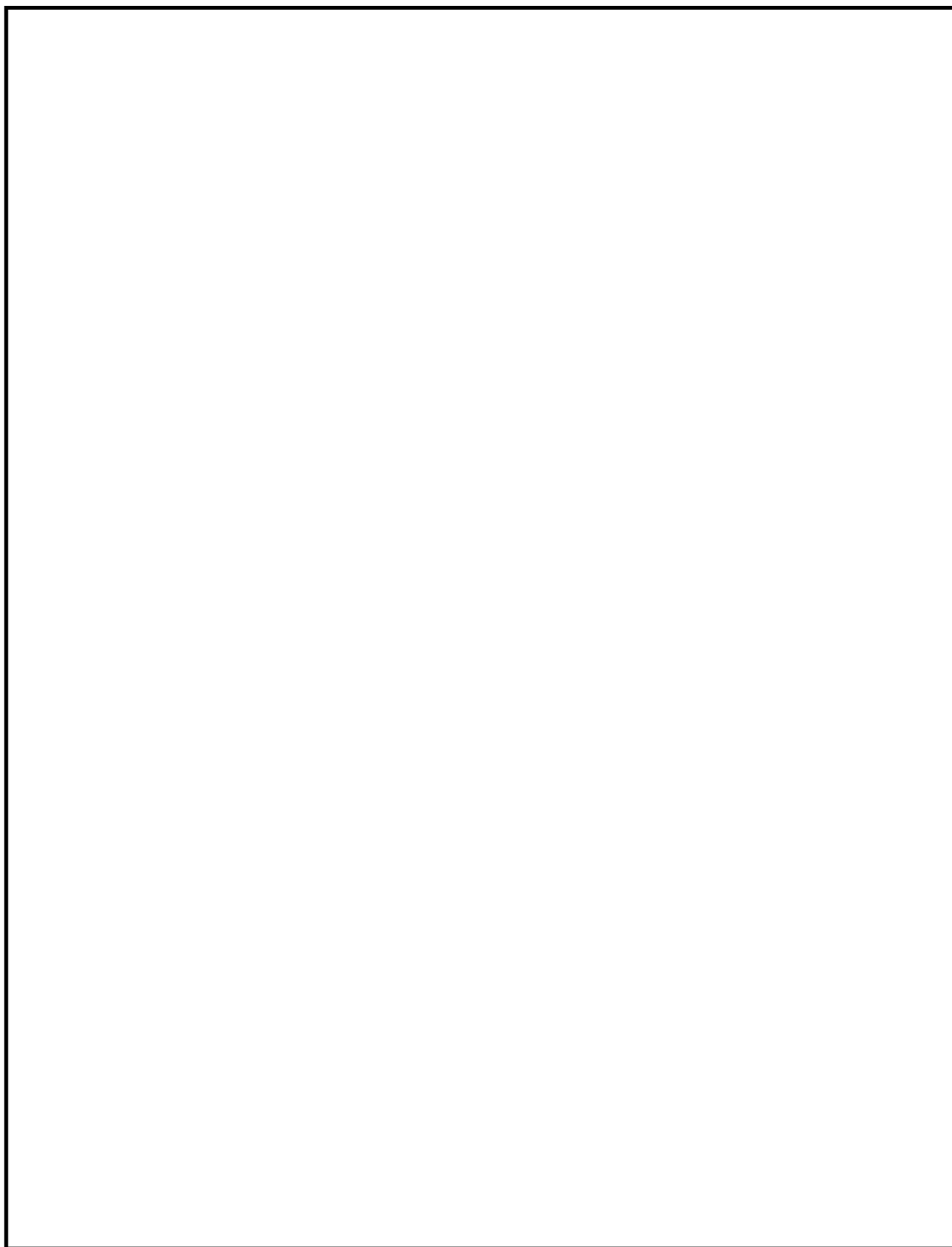
