Wednesday's robbery of a Bank One near East Towne Mall is similar to a string of 16 robberies throughout the Midwest, an FBI spokesman said.

FBI agents are investigating the 11:30 a.m. robbery at the bank, 4225 East Towne Blvd.

Two men wearing bandanas over their faces ordered employees and customers to the floor and set off a smoke bomb before fleeing with an undisclosed amount of money, according to FBI and Madison police spokesmen.

One man was seen with an automatic pistol, said Richard Eggleston, special agent with the FBI in Milwaukee.

The robbers also left purported bombs in the bank and in the getaway car, said Madison police Sgt. Steven Smithson. Smithson said it's been determined that at least one of the bombs was a fake, although he didn't know which one.

Eggleston said there are several similarities between Wednesday's robbery and 16 robberies in eight Midwestern states since January 1994.

In the previous cases "individuals left at the bank or in the get-

away vehicle a real or hoax explosive device," Eggleston said.

In addition, "The general description of the two individuals who entered the bank is similar" to those in the previous cases, he said.

And "they take control of the bank. They tell everyone to lie on the ground. They clean out the tellers' windows," Eggleston said.

Two other recent Wisconsin bank robberies are thought to be part of the string of Midwestern heists. They are the holdups on

June 22 at the Guaranty Bank in Glendale, and on March 11, 1994, at the Associated Bank at East Town Mall in Green Bay.

The Bank One at East Towne has been robbed at least one other time, on April 1, 1994. In that case,

a lone robber demanded money while holding a metal box that contained a fake bomb. However, that holdup wasn't among those listed by Eggleston as being part of the string of Midwestern robberies.

At approximately 11:30 a.m., August 30, 1995, three masked men entered captioned bank and announced a robbery. One man brandished a black, semi-automatic pistol and carried a blue plastic 2 1/2 gallon utility bucket which he sat on the floor.

After ordering bank employees and customers to the floor, two of the robbers vaulted the teller counter and removed cash from the teller stations. Throughout the robbery, the unknown subjects yelled at everyone to stay down.

After obtaining the loot the unsub with the pistol and bucket dropped a [REDACTED] into the bucket where it ignited. The unsubs then fled the bank in a blue 1981 Chevrolet citation which was recovered abandoned approximately 1/2 mile from the bank. When recovered, the vehicle was found to contain a hoax explosive device which was determined safe by the Dane County Sheriff's Department Explosive Ordinance Disposal (EOD) Team.

Due to the confusion in the robbery, more detailed descriptions are not available. Video photos taken by bank surveillance cameras are not clear.

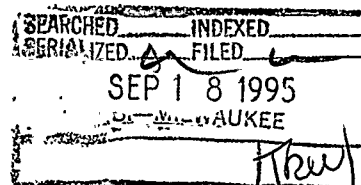
Located on the floor, in the front passenger area, was a device which appeared to consist of a [REDACTED]

Photographs were also taken of a possible improvised explosive device located at the above bank. This device was contained in a two and a half gallon plastic pail and consisted of a [REDACTED]

This device was photographed after Dane County Bomb Disposal personnel had disassembled it and rendered it safe.

The above photographs were processed at the Madison Police Department Photographic Laboratory and copies were turned over to Detective [REDACTED]. One set of photographs and the negatives were retained by Special Agent [REDACTED] for the exhibit section of this file.

[redacted] advised that an audit of all teller stations determined that the loss sustained during the robbery was [redacted]. She further advised that Bank One is insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

On August 31, 1995, Detective [redacted] Madison Police Department, advised that he had developed information that [redacted] white male, date of birth [redacted] was driving in the vicinity of 4130 Lien Road, Madison, shortly before the Bank One East Towne was robbed. [redacted] is employed by Virchow, Krause and Company which formerly occupied the building at the Lien Road address and he knew the building was now vacant. As [redacted] drove past the building, he observed a full-sized white van pull into the parking lot. He further noted that the van had license plates with white lettering on a blue background. He believed the van to be approximately five years old and had the impression that it was a cargo van as opposed to a passenger van.

On the same date, Detective [redacted] advised that he had determined that the Chevrolet Citation found abandoned at 4130 Lien Road was most recently owned by [redacted] white male, date of birth [redacted], residence address [redacted] Madison. [redacted] interviewed [redacted] and learned that [redacted] had sold the car sometime around August 11, 1995 to a white male with dark, close-cropped hair, a moustache and baseball hat, for \$300. The man had paid with three \$100 bills. [redacted] advised that he did not recall the name of the person who bought the car and no bill of sale was made. Prior to the sale, [redacted] had parked the car in the East Side Shopping Center parking lot on East Washington Avenue and had placed a For Sale sign in the window with [redacted] telephone number on it. The man who bought the car called [redacted] residence and arranged to meet him to consummate the sale. When [redacted] sold the car he warned the buyer that it might not be a good highway car and the buyer said he was going to use it to go to work locally. Further

On 8-30-95 at 11:29 am, I responded along with Officers [REDACTED] and other units to a report of a bank alarm at Bank One, 4225 East Towne Blvd.. En route to that location, we were advised by Dispatch that this was a confirmed armed robbery and that the employees of the bank were vacating the building after the suspects had detonated a smoke bomb inside.

Upon pulling into the parking lot, I observed the employees and the customers who had been in the bank milling about outside. I could see smoke coming from the front doors

to the bank which face the West. I made contact with one of the tellers, identified as [REDACTED] who told me that the suspects had fled in a light blue-colored veh, possibly a Chevrolet Citation, with a License Applied For, or LAF, sign in the back license plate area. She indicated that the veh was occupied by 3 or 4 males wearing bandanas and they were last seen traveling westbound on East Towne Blvd. at a high rate of speed.

Officer [REDACTED] Office [REDACTED] and I began taking statements from individuals present. The first person I contacted was a customer identified as [REDACTED] dob [REDACTED] [REDACTED] phone [REDACTED] work [REDACTED] is an employee of the Ponderosa restaurant and was at the bank to make a business deposit. He indicated that [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] when suspect #1 (above) entered the bank carrying a pail. The suspect quickly produced a handgun, holding it in his right hand, and began waving it in a semi-circular motion around the interior of the bank, telling everyone, "Everybody get down on the floor." Almost immediately, this suspect was followed by suspects #2 and #3, who entered the bank and immediately began heading towards the teller's counter. [REDACTED] indicated that suspect #2 hopped over the counter while suspect #3 went around the counter to the right. The suspect with the gun remained near the front door watching over everyone in the bank holding the gun at the ready. [REDACTED] indicated that he is familiar with guns and believes that the one used was a 9mm semi-automatic. [REDACTED] indicated that the 2 suspects who went behind the teller's counter began taking money while screaming at the employees. He indicated that suspect #2 was the most verbal, yelling, "Mother-fuckers, where are the keys? Where's the money at?"

[REDACTED] indicated that he did not get a real good look at suspect #3, but described him as being 5'10 with a stocky build. He indicated that he did not see suspect #3's face and believes that he also had a bandana of sorts, although he could not be certain.

After the robbers obtained the money, they left the store via the front door that they had come into. Suspect #1 was the last to leave and prior to leaving, pulled some kind of a [REDACTED] and set off a smoke bomb in the pail that he had been carrying. He then left the building. [REDACTED] did not see which way the suspects left, nor did he see them get into the veh. He estimated that from the time they entered the bank until the time they left, less than a minute elapsed. [REDACTED] indicated that after the suspects left the bank, he, the other customers and employees of the bank exited the bank via the back doors (facing to the east). One of the employees subsequently opened the front doors & propped them open to allow the smoke to get out of the bank.

She then observed 2 suspects coming in through the front door and heard one of them yell, "Get down on the floor." She indicated that she immediately got down on the floor back in [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] indicated that she heard the sound of a security door slamming open and crashing against the wall & shortly thereafter, observed a suspect standing in the [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] indicated she could not describe what was actually pointed at her. She indicated that the suspect was tall, based on where he came up to in the doorway of the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] She said that he had an American flag bandana with oval-shaped eye-holes cut in it covering his face. She indicated that the stars portion of the flag were covering the suspect's eyes and the stripes portion of the flag hung below. She also indicated that the bandana was draped across the top and back of the suspect's head so she could not tell what color hair he had. She estimated, based on the way the suspect talked, carried himself & his build, that he was a w/m between the ages of 22 to 25 years of age. She indicated that the suspect was wearing blue jeans and a standard-size men's black belt. She could not recall what he had on for a shirt. She indicated that he was carrying a cream-colored canvas bag, which he may have picked up before he entered the back area from behind the teller's station. She indicated that he went into the coin room and she could hear him picking up coins. She also watched as he opened up a lower safe in the drive-through teller area & as he tried to open 4 drawers there. While this was going on, she heard voices yelling in the bank's lobby, including one person yelling for people to keep looking down. At one point, she heard a suspect state, "We have a bomb." Shortly after she thought she heard the robbers leave, she heard another teller named [REDACTED] telling everyone to get out of the bank. At this point, [REDACTED] observed yellow smoke filling the bank.

[REDACTED] could not describe the second subject she saw walking into the bank when the robbers first entered. She indicated that she did not recall seeing any weapons, although she did say that something had been pointed at her, which she could not recall.

Detectives [REDACTED] and the FBI responded to the scene to assist in the investigation. The scene was processed by SI [REDACTED] While at the bank, we learned that the suspect veh was located abandoned in the parking lot of a building at 4130 Lien Rd.. When I arrived, Officers and were already on the scene interviewing witness/victims.

At this point I noted that the doors leading into the bank on the south side of the building were open and that the interior of the bank was filled with a cloud of yellow smoke. It was later determined that the smoke originated from a bucket located on the floor 9 feet into the building from the south entrance. The bucket did contain

At this point I asked for the assistance of the Madison Fire Department to vent the building and while that was being completed I did have a conversation with W/F of work

Ms. stated that she was inside of the bank at the time of the robbery, however, when the suspects entered, she was behind the teller line in a crouch, taking inventory of supplies. While doing that, she heard one male voice yell, "Everyone hit the floor, we've got guns". Since Ms. was already in a crouch, she crawled from the area of the cabinet under one of the teller counters and remained there during the commission of the armed robbery.

While on the floor behind the teller counter, Ms. indicated that she got glimpses of two males who she believed to be white.

Both of these individuals had climbed over the teller counter and began removing money from the teller drawers. She described suspect #1 as 5'9-5'10, wearing faded jeans and newer light colored work boots that were ankle high. She also noted at the top of the boot, near the ankle, was a dark brown rim. She also noted his entire face was covered with a colored bandana and there were eyeholes cut in that bandana. She also believed this individual had on him a very large canister of mace, which he had attached to his belt, left side. She also described him as being "wired" (meaning to be very excited).

In regards to suspect #2, she stated that he was also a W/M, however, smaller build and possibly shorter than suspect #1 and that he was wearing dark, baggie clothes (green or black in color). He also had a bandana covering his feet, which she thought was possibly blue. Again, this bandana had eyeholes cut in it. She remembered later that he was possibly wearing dark pants.

She stated that both individuals in her estimation were W/M's and seemed extremely young, that being 18-20.

She informed me that she did not see any one else in the bank that may have accompanied the two suspects that she saw behind the teller counter. She also stated that the suspects did enter via the south doors and exited the same way.

In regards to the teller stations, they will be counted from a north to south direction and manning teller [] earlier was an [] was open and was occupied by [] Ms [] indicated she was crouched under teller []

While talking with Ms [] I noted there was a newer looking squeegee that had an aluminum handle stuck near the bushes by the south entrance to the bank. I asked Ms [] if she noticed that item before and she stated she did not. That item was photographed by S/I [] retrieved and turned over to S/A [] FBI.

There were a number of officers at the scene that assisted in interviewing all the employees and did submit reports. Det [] responded and assisted the investigators in processing the scene.

Once the bldg was vented, I did enter and noted that approx 9' into the bldg from the south entrance was approx 2 ½ gallon blue plastic pail which had a handle. The pail in question did have a spout on both sides of the pail and the contents from merely a visual observation was as follows:

Also at this time, one of the FBI agents on the scene and I attempted to view the surveillance tape, however, Ms [REDACTED] had a difficult time isolating the specific time that the incident occurred. I retrieved the surveillance tape and later transported it to the DCSD where I viewed it with Dep [REDACTED] who is a media expert.

Dep [REDACTED] and myself both determined the quality of this surveillance tape was poor, however, using the technology at hand, we extracted the following information from the tape.

In regards to the surveillance tape at 11:26:38AM, the tape indicates a male wearing a dark baggie top and light colored pants, possibly jeans, also wearing dark shoes runs into the bank from the southside door, carrying the pail in his left hand. It appears from this frame that his hands were dark and I assumed that he was wearing gloves.

Frame 11:26:40AM, we see a suspect behind the counter and there is a bandana on his head. The suspect is a W/M, due to the fact you can see the flesh on the back of his neck and it appears the suspect has dark colored hair.

Frame 11:26:42AM, the first suspect is again seen on the southside of the lobby and everyone is lying on the floor.

Frame 11:26:51AM, the first suspect again is leaning over the bucket and he appears to be placing something into the bucket. It also shows that he is using his left hand.

Frame 11:26:59AM, again the first suspect is holding an object in both hands, which is directed towards the teller stations. It appears he is pointing a handgun in that direction. This suspect from this angle appears to be wearing a bandana on his head, as well as, his face.

Frame 11:27:14AM, the same suspect is shown again near the south doors with a handgun in his left hand and pointed towards the teller stations.

Frame 11:27:21AM, the same suspect is again seen and in this time he is seen in a crouch. Near his right chin, you can see the outline, which appears to be the bucket. During this frame, the suspect appears to have something protruding from his back, it is dark and similar to a fanny pack, however, could be the extension of body armor.

Frame 11:27:28AM, the first suspect who entered is still crouched at that location.

Frame 11:27:35AM, the same suspect now has both hands in the bucket.

Frame 11:27:50AM, is very brief and it appears to be a different suspect. However, there is no distinguishing features about that frame.

Frame 11:27:52AM, there appears to be a brief glimpse of a third suspect who was again a W/M with blonde hair, wearing a baseball cap. He also appeared to be wearing some type of dark t-shirt and he is behind the teller station.

The next frame is blurred, but appears to be 11:28:03AM, where we see the suspect wearing the baseball cap walking out the bank, towards the south and you see smoke in the background.

Frame 11:28:26AM, only shows a frame in which you see customers and smoke.

Dep [REDACTED] and I viewed this tape several times and we did extract a few photos from the tape and were placed on a floppy disc and later printed. I do have copies of those prints. It is my opinion from viewing this tape that three suspects did enter Bank One; the first one carrying the bucket in his left hand and the other two who rushed in and jumped over the teller counter. It also appears suspect #1 with the bucket stayed in the vicinity of the bucket and was ordering the customers and employees to lie down and threatening with a handgun, which by the shape I believe it to be a semi automatic.

It is apparent from the tape the suspects exited via the southside doors.

On 8-31-95, I received a message from Bank One employee, [REDACTED], who indicated [REDACTED] was stolen from the bank (THIS IS NOT FOR PUBLIC RELEASE). Also during the morning of 8-31-95, I did have phone contact with [REDACTED]

While there, Ms [redacted] stated that a strange occurrence occurred on 8-28-95 in the AM hours. On 8-30-95 at 11:29 am, I was dispatched to Bank One East Towne office at 4225 East Towne Blvd. ref. to a bank alarm. En route, we were advised by Data that this was a real alarm. Upon arrival, employees had evacuated the bank, as a smoke-type bomb was activated & had filled the interior of the building with yellow smoke.

I first spoke with bank teller [REDACTED] stated that she was working behind the counter in the [REDACTED] when 3 or 4 white males came into the bank real fast. Two of these suspects, one with a red, white & blue pullover on his head and the other with a black pullover on his head, jumped over the teller counter where she was working [REDACTED] The other 1 or 2 also jumped over the counter as they rushed in. All the suspects were yelling and saying, "Everybody down," "We have a gun," "We have a bomb," "Where's the money?" "Open the doors," "Do you have the key?" Above descriptions of 2 of the suspects and the veh were given by [REDACTED] stated that all 4 suspects were white males. 3 of the 4 were large and well-built, but not muscular. It should be noted that when Officer [REDACTED] was on the scene, [REDACTED] said that they were definitely taller and more built than he was, but she stated they weren't real muscular like they work out. She continues saying the suspects trashed the place & were looking through everything. She believes one suspect had black gloves on. Further description states suspects were in their mid-20's and well-built, except for the stocky shorter white male. She states the time in the bank when the suspects rushed in was 11:27 am. When all the suspects were ready to leave the bank, [REDACTED] states that was when the smoke canister was set off. The suspects then ran out, got into their car which is parked in the first stall to the left of the center line of the main entrance door to the bank and the veh proceeded westbound on East Towne Blvd..

Witness [REDACTED] stated that she was walking into the [REDACTED] and heard screaming, then heard, "Hit the floor," at which time she did. The only suspect information she had was seeing a guy with a dark scarf over face that may have had some white in it. On 8-30-95 there was a reported hold-up alarm coming from Bank One at 4225 East Towne Blvd. at 11:29 am. I went out to assist the units in the actual alarm and upon arrival, I contacted a witness of that incident. Witness was identified as [REDACTED] dot [REDACTED] address [REDACTED] telephone [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] stated he was in the bank with a friend and exiting about the time that the suspects entered the bank. [REDACTED] did observe one of the suspects and that was the one that was carrying the bucket that contained a supposed bomb. [REDACTED] stated that he observed the suspect enter the bank, walk basically to the middle of the floor and set the bucket down and stated in a loud voice, "This is a bomb." [REDACTED] stated that at that point, he observed them pull out a gun, thought to be out of his waist, waved it around & then just yelled, "Everybody get down, get down." [REDACTED] stated at this point, he lay down on the ground & did not observe much, except to say that he saw at least 2 other suspects & both of those suspects jumped up onto the counter and over the counter, away from his view.

[REDACTED] gives the description of the suspect with the bucket as a white male, approximately 5'8, medium build, wearing blue jeans and having construction-type boots with a yellow and almost new-looking color. The yellow he pointed to was almost the yellow-gold on my patch of my police shirt. [REDACTED] described the gun as very similar to one I have and that is a stainless steel semi-automatic. [REDACTED] stated that he did not get to see the handle of the gun, but described the main part of the gun as white, same as mine, which is stainless steel. [REDACTED] also stated that he did not see the face of the individual and only saw his head wrapped in what he described as an American flag, and that was covering almost everything except his eye slits.

As the suspects left the bank [REDACTED] did see them enter an older model blue veh that was parked right outside the door of the bank. When they left, the only thing else he

While patrolling the area of East Towne, I copied Office [redacted] as he indicated he had located what appeared to be the initial suspect veh parked in a deserted parking lot on Lien Rd.. I responded to that location & did observe an older model Chevrolet Citation 4-door, which was light blue in color & very significantly rusted. I observed that the veh had no plates, but rather was displaying the LAF (License Applied For) on the front and back of the veh. I approached the veh and copied the VIN numbers, which are as follows:

[redacted] This came back to a veh which should have been bearing WI plate [redacted] with a 4/95 expiration. The registered owner of this veh is a [redacted] St. in Mt. Horeb. In researching that address, I was advised by Dispatch that the legal occupant of said address is a [redacted] with a telephone # of [redacted]. Upon further investigation, I was advised that [redacted] had jail record & at the jail, he listed his address as [redacted] Rd. in Blue Mounds, WI. As I approached the area, I heard Dispatch attempt to contact units to make contact with a subject on East Towne Blvd., who stated that he had observed the suspect veh leave the scene of the bank robbery. I in turn responded to Verlo Mattress Co., which is almost adjacent to the parking lot of the bank. I then made contact with a w/m identified as [REDACTED] Rd. in Waunakee, home phone [REDACTED] and work phone at Verlo Mattress Co. is [REDACTED] where he is a [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated that he had been listening to his portable scanner, which he frequently does during the course of the day. When he heard the bank alarm sound for the bank adjacent to his place of business, he stepped out to see if anything was going on. Just after the alarm was sounded over the air, he estimates approximately 30 seconds went by to where he stepped out onto East Towne Blvd. road and observed a veh leaving at a high rate of speed. In addition to this veh leaving, he observed a female subject exit from the bank and also look at the veh as it left the area. [REDACTED] stated that the veh was accelerating past his location at a high rate of speed heading northbound. He stated that as the veh went by, he observed 2 w/m occupants in the front seat, both with bandanas around their forehead areas. He stated that the driver of the veh was a w/m with a bandana around his head & appeared a little on the heavy side or had a chunky type of face. He stated he did not notice any obvious facial hair as the veh sped by on the driver of the veh. His impression was that the driver also had medium length hair and it was dark in color. He stated that the subject's face was not concealed and that

he could see his full face, but did not get a very close look at it. He stated that the passenger of the veh was pretty nondescript and also a w/m with a bandana around his forehead area, approximately 18 to 25 years of age. He then stated that it appeared to him that the veh was fully occupied and that he had the impression that there were 2 other occupants in the back seat of the veh, although he was unsure. He stated several times that he felt or believed that the veh was fully occupied.

[REDACTED] initially described the veh to me as an early model '80 to '85 Chevy Citation hatchback, light cream or grayish in color with license plates LAF prominently displayed on the back. He stated that he was sure that the veh was a Citation hatchback model and that he had gotten a very close look at the veh as it sped by his location. [REDACTED] also stated that he had the aid of binoculars in observing the veh as it left the area and was able to get a good look at the veh.

While I was interviewing [REDACTED] Detective [REDACTED] requested that we respond to his location on N. Thompson Rd. to observe a veh that he was observing in a construction area. I escorted [REDACTED] to this location and had him take a look at the veh, to which he immediately stated that that was not the one he had seen leaving the bank area. Shortly after viewing this veh, I heard officers say that they had found the possible suspect veh abandoned in the 4100 block of Lien Rd. in a private parking lot. I then took [REDACTED] to this location and as we were entering into the parking lot, he observed the veh, stating immediately that that was the suspect veh that he had seen leaving the bank area 30 seconds after he had heard the bank alarm on his portable police scanner. [REDACTED] noted himself that the veh was blue in color and stated that he must have made a mistake in observing the color, as he believed it was a light cream or grayish tint. Even though there was a slight color variation [REDACTED] was convinced & assured that that was the same veh he had seen leaving the bank parking lot. On 8-30-95 I was working in my capacity as the Darbo/Worthington area neighborhood police officer. At 11:29 am, Dispatch advised of the bank robbery at the Bank One on East Towne Blvd.. A short time later, I began checking areas of the East side for the suspect vehicle.

Dispatch advised that the suspect veh was possibly an older model blue Chevy Citation with lots of rust and a License Applied For placard attached to the rear of the vehicle.

At 11:55 am, I was driving outbound on Lien Rd. and I observed a 4-door blue Chevy Citation parked & appearing to be unoccupied in the lot of Virchow, Krause & Co. at 4130 Lien Rd.. I pulled into the lot and behind the veh. I observed that it appeared to have a white placard attached to the rear license plate area. This placard had LAF written on it with what appeared to be a green marker. At this time, I called in the veh information to Dispatch. As I was doing this, Detective [REDACTED] arrived on the scene. He exited his veh and determined that the veh was unoccupied. He advised me that he had observed a bomb-like device on the front floor passenger side. Moments later, several other units arrived on the scene.

I should note that the left rear bumper of the veh had a bumper sticker which said, "Share the Road with Bicycles." Other officers were witnesses to the scene. They identified this veh as the suspect veh. The veh's VIN number is [REDACTED]. It lists to an '81 Chevy Citation to a Mt. Horeb address. This information was taken down by both Detective [REDACTED] and Officer [REDACTED]. I should note that when I initially observed the suspect veh, it was the only veh in the parking lot. It was parked relatively close to the building. The business located at that address has closed out and relocated; the building is apparently vacant.

I then assisted with securing the scene. At 12:48 pm, a Dane Co. canine unit checked

At 1:20 pm, the County EOD team began to work on removing the possible bomb from the veh. The only ones to come into close proximity of the veh were Madison police officers, Dane Co. deputies and FBI Special Agent [REDACTED]. On 8-30-95, while in the Det Bureau/MPD, I heard a police radio call that there had been a robbery at Bank One, E Towne Blvd. I proceeded to that location after hearing the description of the suspect vehicle as being a blue Chevy Citation, four door, with license applied for tags on the vehicle. [redacted] received from [redacted] and after hearing that description, Ms. [redacted] believed it to be [redacted] of [redacted] Dr. [redacted]

Ms. [redacted] looked up the rental records and stated that [redacted] lives with his wife [redacted] and that she works for Affiliated Engineers on Segoe Rd., phone [redacted]

Phone contact was made with [redacted] and she admitted that her husband [redacted] did purchase an old Chevy Citation approximately one month prior from an individual for \$100. Apparently the vehicle was going to be kept for parts, however, after [redacted] purchased the car, realized the car was not even worth the parts that were on it, therefore, decided to sell it. She stated that he parked the vehicle in the old Bowl-A-Vard property in the 2900 block E. Washington Avenue and within a day the vehicle was sold to an individual that she did not know.

I asked her where [redacted] could be reached and she informed me that he was currently out golfing, however, was going to be working at the Casino Lanes at 2 pm.

Shortly after 2 pm, while at the Casino Lanes, [redacted] M/W, [redacted] [redacted] walked into the establishment and introduced himself to me. I soon realized that he was the same individual I had spoken to at 9:30 am and asked if he knew who owned the blue vehicle and during that time period he denied it. I asked him why he

denied possessing that vehicle and he stated he did not like police officers very well and was currently on probation. He also stated he was attempting to sell his wife's car and did not want to be bothered. He stated after we left, he realized that he probably should have talked to us and that the vehicle we were referring to was indeed his.

[REDACTED] readily admitted that he did buy the Citation from an individual who lived on [REDACTED] St. for \$100 and that the individual did deliver it to his house, he believed on a weekend, possibly Sunday. He stated he only wanted the vehicle for parts and he parked it in the lot of his apartment complex for a week to 10 days.

After realizing that the car was not road safe, nor worthy of fixing, it decided to sell the vehicle, so did park it in the 2900 block E. Washington Avenue with a for sale sign on it, asking \$300 for the vehicle. He also listed his home phone number for contact.

He informed me that he believed that he placed the vehicle on the lot on a Thursday, which he believed was August 10th and on August 11th at around noon he did receive a phone call from an individual who wanted to buy the vehicle. He stated that he did respond to that location and made contact with one W/M. He stated he was 6-0, 24 to 25 years old, medium build with black straight hair that was cut above the ears and short in the back. He stated he had a long thin face and a mustache.

After [REDACTED] provided me with the description of the individual who purchased the vehicle, I did present to him a composite of an individual who was identified in a previous bank robbery and after viewing that composite he did state that he believed the individual depicted in the composite was the same individual who purchased that vehicle.

He stated that the individual said he was from town and that he needed the vehicle for work which he was going to do in the City of Madison. [REDACTED] warned him that the vehicle was not highway safe. He stated the individuals appeared to be in a hurry to purchase the vehicle and did not take it for a test drive. He stated they merely got in the vehicle and after starting it, put the vehicle in drive and then in reverse, put it in park, got out and told [REDACTED] he would purchase it. I asked him how he was paid and [REDACTED] stated that the individual presented him with three \$100 bills which he thought at the time was a little odd, however, they were deposited into his bank.

I asked him at the time of the sale of the vehicle if the license applied for sign was on the back and he stated that it was not.

At this point [REDACTED] stated he could offer no further information and stated on the date of the bank robbery he was golfing at Odana Golf Course.

After speaking with [REDACTED] I made phone contact with Agent [REDACTED] and asked him

to request a subpoena for phone records. He stated he would complete that by 9/1/95.

Mr. [] is a [] in the Green Bay Police Department and is currently in the City of Madison attending a conference for emergency government management.

[] stated that he checked into the Ramada Inn at 3841 E. Washington Avenue on 8/27/95 and is staying in room [] which overlooks the rear parking lot of the Ramada Inn.

Mr. [] stated that on 8/28/95, between 7 and 7:30 pm, he was looking out of his room window when he did notice a vehicle fitting the description as the one used during the commission of the bank robbery and later recovered approximately 2 blocks from the Ramada Inn.

He also stated at that particular time, driving parallel to the rear of the Ramada Inn was a smaller, older Ford Bronco, possibly green and brown, bearing truck plate [] (unk. if Wisconsin or not). He stated two males were in the vehicle and he witnessed this Bronco drive along the building and appeared to be slowing up as it went along and eventually did stop in front of the possible suspect vehicle. All he could see was that the passenger in the Ford Bronco was a W/M, approximately 25 years old, who was heavy set. He stated he could not see the driver of that vehicle. He then stated that the vehicle then drove in a southwesterly direction to the west side of the Ramada Inn where it stopped but eventually left the area. Lt. [] apparently had the plate number provided by Mr. [] prior to the interview and he did present me with a print out indicating that the Wisconsin DOT indicates that [] is registered on a 90 Ford truck to [] of [] Madison, WI. It indicates that the lien holder is the Cuna Credit Union and stated there were very few police contacts regarding the registered owner of this vehicle.

While at the Ramada Inn I did present the composite of the suspect in the previous bank robbery to the desk clerk and one of them stated that person fit the description of a couple of males who registered during the time of the bank robbery, however, at this time she could not locate the guest registry for those individuals, however, would be searching the files and would hold them for me.

I also asked the desk clerks if they would talk to the security officers who worked the Ramada Inn between 11 pm and 3 am to see if they documented any suspicious activity around the Ramada Inn or did notice the 81 Chevy Citation parked to the rear of that establishment. According to Ramada personnel, the motel is patrolled by JBM

Security.

While I was leaving the Ramada Inn I noted that one of the older vehicles parked outside of Mr. [REDACTED] room was currently parked at the front of the motel and I noted the individual who placed the vehicle there was a maintenance worker. This individual identified himself as [REDACTED] M/B, [REDACTED]

I asked [REDACTED] if the employees of the Ramada Inn routinely parked their vehicles to the rear of the motel. His response was yes and I then asked him if he ever noticed an older model Chevy Citation, blue in color, which was in very poor condition. His response was that it did ring a bell, however, at this point he could not be certain. I asked him if any of the other employees had a vehicle that fit that description and he stated that they did not.

I then told [REDACTED] that I was asking these questions because of the recent bank robbery and he asked me if the individuals responsible were prison escapees. I told [REDACTED] I did not know and his response was that he asked me that question because yesterday, meaning 8/30/95, he did locate inside door #5 of the Ramada Inn, some clothing and paper bags from K-mart store and the clothing inside appeared to be prison garb.

It should be noted that door #5 is near the location where Mr. [REDACTED] stated he saw the suspect vehicle.

I asked [REDACTED] where the clothing was currently at and he stated it was in the maintenance room of the Ramada Inn. He walked me to that area and produced a K-Mart bag containing one pair of men's green work trousers with the initials OSCI written on the outer waistband in black felt tip pen. Additionally, above the right pocket is the size of the pants, that being 32 x 32 and again above the left pocket are the same numbers, 32 x 32 in black felt tip pen.

On the inside of the left front pocket is the label and again on the label in felt tip marker is an X and the numbers 32. The label indicates that the pants are an Adolphe LaFont, size 32; the label indicates it was made in the USA.

Additionally, Mr. [REDACTED] turned over to me one pair of brown ankle high leather boots, having rawhide laces. The boots appear to be worn and again appear to be the type of boots issued to individuals in correctional institutions.

An inspection of the shoes reveal that they are unlabeled. There is not anything on the shoes which indicates size or manufacturer.

I retrieved these items from Mr. [REDACTED] and transported them to the Madison Police Department and I noted there were two plastic K-Mart bags, one of which had the blue

logo on it and contained several labels from what appeared to be recently purchased pieces of clothing. Additionally, another K-Mart bag with the red logo also contained a piece of paper, obviously from a label.

Out of the white and red K-mart bag was a partial label, blue in color and it will be preserved for further examination for latents. In the white bag with the blue logo was a tag for a pair of shoes, size 9 ½ which originally sold for \$19.99 now had a yellow tag indicating the reduced price was \$12.00.

The next tag retrieved out of the K-Mart bag indicated an item was purchased for \$17.99 out of Department 46 and has style number 0010 and item #3710 and key 11 would be used.

The next item is a label which reads Comfort Lites leather casuals; I believe they might be referring to footwear.

The next item is a large label for Saugatuck slacks.

The final tag in this particular bag is again from Saugatuck indicating that a pair of slacks, waist 30, length 30, Department 21 for \$17.99 was purchased.

All these items will be bagged separately for further examination.

Additionally, they will be photographed and stored in Madison Police property room under tag #P18877.

On 9-5-95, I had phone contact with WI State Prison officials and made inquiries regarding the recovered green pants that were stamped OSCI. I was informed that OSCI stands for Oshkosh Correctional Institute, Oshkosh, WI, 414-231-4010.

After learning this information, I made phone contact with Capt . He indicated they had no prison escapees and in regards to the clothing, he stated they are purchased thru central stores at the Waupun Correctional Institute. The pants from his institution are stamped OSCI.

I also gave him a description of the recovered ankle high level boots and based on that description, that being the green pads on the sole, the Captain indicated they also wear prison issued footwear.

I asked the Captain questions regarding possible transfers from one institution to the other, and he stated when a person is transferred, the clothing does stay with him. Also, the Captain indicated on occasion if an inmate is released and does not have any clothing, the inmate is given the opportunity to purchase the prison clothing.

I told Capt that I would be recontacting him at a later date to ascertain releases from the prison. He stated they could comply with any requests regarding released prisoners.

Also on this date, I contacted the Oakhill Correctional Institute and asked them *Questions* regarding inmate clothing. The security officer told me when an inmate is transferred from one institution to the next ~~when he arrives at Oakhill~~, he would be wearing the clothing from the prior institution, however, when he arrives, that clothing is taken away from that inmate and also any other clothing that may be in his possession is ~~also~~ confiscated and returned to the transporting officers so the clothing can be returned to

the prior institution. I also made contact with [] LNU, Waupun Correctional stores, phone [] indicated to me in regards to the labeling on the work pants located at the Ramada Inn, they were indeed the same brand that he purchased for the WI Prison System.

[] indicated to me that the green work pants purchased thru the WI Prison System are generally purchased by waist size only and the length size is generally done at the institution, based on the need of the inmate. That would explain why in felt tip pen the waist and length is also written on the inside and outside of the pants.

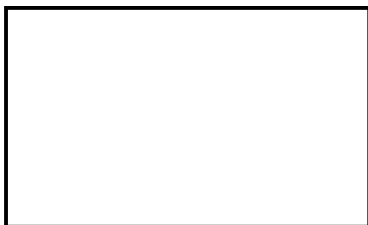

On 08/30/95, at approx. 2:40PM I met with SGT [redacted] and P.O. [redacted] in the parking lot of the VIRCHOW AND KRAUSE accounting firm at 4130 LIEN RD. SGT [redacted] briefed me on the robbery that had occurred earlier and the recovery of the getaway car by P.O. [redacted]. When I arrived at that location, I met city officers and Special Agent [REDACTED] from the FBI. They directed my attention to an older model blue Chevrolet Citation with a hand printed LAF tag on the rear and with all the windows rolled down. The officers directed my attention to the right front floor area where there was a device with what appeared to be some type of [REDACTED]

I was further advised that that a second device was still in the bank where the bank robbers had left it and the building had been evacuated. I contacted the 911 Center and advised them that we had two possible explosive devices and that I would need a full EOD team response with the truck.

The Madison police officers advised me that this vehicle was positively identified by witnesses as the vehicle the bank robbers drove away from the bank in and they further advised that there was a similar device with some type of radio in the bank at the present time.

Arrival of EOD Team:

A short time later, Lt. [REDACTED], Deputy [REDACTED], Deputy [REDACTED], Deputy [REDACTED] and Deputy [REDACTED] arrived on the scene with the EOD truck. I quickly briefed them on what had taken place and we immediately began procedures to remotely open the doors of the suspect vehicle and remotely remove the device on the floor. MEDIA RELEASE REGARDING**MIDWEST BANK ROBBERY SUSPECTS ARRESTED IN OHIO**

FBI investigation has indicated that since at least January 1994, approximately 18 bank robberies have been committed in seven Midwestern states by subjects using bomb devices and disguises, to include FBI and other Federal law enforcement apparel, and one Santa Claus suit. Recently, letters have been received by the news media, allegedly from these robbers, attempting to taunt the FBI. Investigation over the past year was intensified in late December when the FBI identified Richard Lee Guthrie, Jr. and Peter Kevin Langan as suspects in these robberies. A nationwide effort since that time further focused on Langan and Guthrie and resulted on January 4, 1996 in the filing by the FBI in Atlanta, Georgia of Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution charges against both of them stemming from an October, 1992 Pizza Hut robbery in Lavonia, Georgia. Late Monday, January 15, 1996, after a two-mile chase, Guthrie was arrested by FBI Agents in Cincinnati. He was armed with a semi-automatic pistol and additional weapons were located in his vehicle. No one was injured during this arrest.

On Wednesday night, January 17, 1996 and Thursday morning, January 18, 1996, a FBI surveillance was set up at a residence in Columbus, Ohio. Peter Kevin Langan exited that residence at approximately 9:45 a.m., Eastern Standard Time, and was ordered to surrender after he entered his van. Langan dove into the rear of the van and a gunfight ensued. Langan was shot and captured shortly thereafter. A subsequent search of the van yielded an M-16 semi-automatic rifle, two hand grenades and one additional handgun. A search of that residence, which is ongoing, has thus far yielded thirteen pipe bombs, several handguns, yellow smoke grenades, several semi-automatic assault weapons, voluminous ammunition, FBI hats, U.S. Marshal's Service identification, security firm uniforms, face masks, police uniforms, Aryan Nations literature, false identification from almost every state, false identification construction kits, wigs, ski masks and smokeless powder.

Last night and early this morning in Shawnee, Kansas, a storage locker was searched and the following evidence was located: pipe bombs, two semi-automatic shoulder weapons, circuit boards, a Santa Claus suit, FBI raid jackets, ATF and U.S. Marshal's Service apparel, lists of FBI office addresses, face masks depicting President Clinton and former President Nixon, numerous items of false identification and a book entitled The Gang They Couldn't Catch. This search is also continuing.

Based on investigation conducted by the Milwaukee Division of the FBI, a Federal complaint was filed today in Milwaukee charging Langan with the June 22, 1995 armed robbery of Guaranty Bank, 450 West Silver Spring Drive, Glendale, Wisconsin. In that robbery, an explosive device was left behind by the robbers which was subsequently rendered safe by Milwaukee County Sheriff's Department Bomb Squad.

A Federal complaint was also filed today in Omaha, Nebraska charging Langan and Guthrie with a bank robbery on August 3, 1994 in Omaha.

It is believed that additional subjects have been involved with Langan and Guthrie in their illegal activities and the investigation to identify and apprehend them continues throughout the United States.

Langan and Guthrie have allegedly used safe houses, storage lockers, mail drops and sophisticated communications procedures in order to carry out their illegal activities. The FBI, along with other Federal and local law enforcement agencies, is pursuing every avenue in order to uncover the identities of additional subjects and safe houses and/or storage lockers similar to the one located in Shawnee, Kansas yesterday evening. These safe houses and storage lockers must be considered as potentially booby trapped and containing bomb devices.

Both Guthrie and Langan have espoused hatred for the black and Jewish population, the FBI, and U.S. Government and are believed to have identified themselves with right wing extremist philosophies currently in existence in our country today.

Anyone with information regarding these crimes should contact the FBI immediately.
