Allegations have come to the attention of this office that in early 1972 Charles Colson, former Special Counsel to the President; Richard Howard, Colson's Administrative Assistant; and Llewellyn (Bud) Evans, Colson's assistant in charge of matters relating to the elderly, helped establish an organization called the Federation of Experienced Americans (F.E.A.). Although F.E.A.'s corporate charter indicated that the purpose of the organization was to aid elderly Americans, there is evidence that the major purpose of F.E.A. was to assist the President's reelection effort. This evidence establishes that F.E.A. was formed by the White House because of its belief that none of the then existing elderly organizations, particularly the National Council on Aging (NCOA) and the National Council of Senior Citizens (NCSC), could be counted on to support the President's reelection campaign.

At the initiation of Evans, and possibly as a result of efforts as well by Colson and Howard in the summer and fall of 1972, F.E.A. received Federal funds from the Department of Labor (DOL) and the Office of Economic Opportunity. At about the same time, F.E.A. applied for one other grant from the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, but this application was rejected. a White House and CRP official, also may have been involved in the attempts to fund F.E.A. Evans had at least one conversation with about F.E.A., and on August 31, 1972, Evans requested one of staff assistants, to talk to at H.E.W. to Maye F.E.A. funded.

In coordination with their efforts to fund F.E.A. Evans, Howard, and Colson allegedly attempted to have Federal grants to NCOA and NCSC cut back and organizations were considered to be anti-Administration or even "enemies" of the Administration. BRENNEMAN stated he also proposed a grant for FEA, which was to "inform the aging people" about the different programs that were administered by the various departments, such as Office of Equal Opportunity, Transportation, Labor Department and others. He stated there are approximately 50 programs designed to assist the aging in this country and there is no means to transfer this information to the aged. He stated he believed that the Social Security Offices were now furnishing some of this information to the aging people.

BRENNEMAN stated was head of the commission which turned his proposal down. BRENNEMAN stated that he had intended to use the radio and television and that this program was to be tried in 15 states.

BRENNEMAN stated after his above described program was turned down, that FEA officials requested him to prepare a little program as a "pilot program" which he did and this program was known as "quiet corner", where he contacted BURL IVES, meeting IVES in New York City. IVES was doing some spot talks for some other agency and one afternoon he, BRENNEMAN, contacted IVES and IVES taped some songs and did some 30 second tapes for him. He stated he had a script for IVES, however IVES did not follow the script and ad-libbed most of the time.

He stated he was told that this program was not to exceed \$5,000.00 and the \$5,000.00 from the Three M Company was to be used to finance this program. He stated the whole thing cost approximately \$5,000.00 and the tapes were sent out to various radio stations. He stated they were three minute programs that a station operator, radio announcer or what have you could plug in on his regular program. He stated IVES was to introduce someone from FEA and a person of FEA would then come on and discuss the FEA programs.

BRENNEMAN stated in relation to the above, he felt that the administration should be made aware of the professional people and their needs. He stated that there is a Department of Labor so the Union people have an oganization and there is a Department of Agriculture which is primarily for the farmers. He stated that there is no organization or department in government which is designed primarily for professional people, and that they sould have some organization so that these people would know where to go for benefits from the government.

BRENNEMAN further advised that he and his wife actually produce and direct shows which are shown on MAP. He stated in relation to MAP he has had over 600 television appearances and has had various people on this program including Former Director, Michigan State Police.

Mr. BRENNEMAN again reiterated that the above two programs were completely separate from FEA and were entirely financed by MAP. He stated he did not know of any action on the part of any officials of FEA or IOA with respect to the officials and the persons in the Department of Labor, OEO or HEW and acting upon FEA's application for grants or financial support.

BRENNEMAN also denied any knowledge of any political activity that was preformed by FEA, denied any knowledge of political activity on the part of any other persons involved in government agencies. He stated he did know there was a mess in California, however he has no knowledge concerning that except for a report which he observed written by the Spanish fellow that was working with the program on the West Coast which impressed him, BRENNEMAN.

BRENNEMAN stated he is aware that the local Model Cities Program in Lansing was having their difficulties, but he denied any contact with anyone in Model Cities or anyone that may have an indirect contact with Model Cities.

BRENNEMAN stated that he possibly has some various records, possibly minutes of the meetings and possibly transcripts of some of the programs which he had devised either in FEA or MAP, which he would be glad to collect and furnish to SA at a later date. He stated that this would take some time in getting together this information, however he would be glad to do it.

He stated one other piece of information which may be of interest was in the producing of the Quiet Corner. He stated that he hired an outfit locally in Lansing, Michigan, to produce this short spots with BURL IVES. He advised this company is known as Amonican. He stated he recalls the bill from this company was excessive and he had recontacted them and they had reduced the charges. He advised this company billed FEA direct.

Many literary and theatre personalities participated in the program among whom were: Paul Mumi, distinguished star of stage and screen; Paul Draper, leading American dancer; Benny Goodman and trio, Bert Lytell, President of Actors Equity Association; Mady Christians, now appearing in "Watch on the Rhine"; Margo; Fay Wray; J. P. McEvoy; Flora Robson, distinguished British actress; Martin Gabel, noted radio actor and theatrical producer; Selena Royle; Philip Bourneuf; dancers from the Monte Carlo Ballet; Vaughn Monroe; Burl Ives, American folk singer; the comedy act known as Andrew Mayo's "Pansy The Horse"; Myron McCormick; Bart Robinson; Martin Wolfson; Hester Sondergaard; Sam Bonnell and Tony Kraber.

A highlight of the evening's entertainment was the performance of a number of choral groups from the countries whose homelands are now under Nazi domination. These groups comprised The Norwegian Singing Society of Brooklyn; the Netherlands Zunkor Orpheus; Czechoslovakian Choral Group; and the French Lyric Society. The Russian Radischev Chorus also sang. Bearing their respective national flags, these groups sang their anthems and folk songs. During the evening, a new song by Ira Gershwin and Harold Arlen, written expressly for the Russian War Relief Benefit, was introduced for the first time.

Decor for the benefit at the Garden was designed and executed by Howard Bay; orchestra was under the direction of Joseph Littau, well known conductor; and the lighting was supervised by Moe Hack, who did a similar service for the Fight For Freedom rally. The script for Russian War Relief benefit was written by Jo Swerling, well known Hollywood scenarist; Kenneth White, Eric Barnow; and Bakart Newman.

Gentlemen:

Would you please answer some questions that have been bothering me for some months now? Many friends and acquaintances of mine have become quite concerned about the menace of Communism in America, primarily, I think, because of certain groups that have sponsored forums on Communism, published pamphlets accusing certain Americans of being Communists and Fellow Travelers, and other societies that claim to be champion Communist fighters. I, too, am concerned about the Communistic menace but I firmly believe that the job of investigation and accusation and the study of the Communist menace is a job of our government, specifically the FBI.

I particularly am interested in getting factual information to confirm or deny a tract published by Cinema Educational Guild, Inc., P. O. Box 46205, Hollywood 46, California. I am sure that you are familiar with this tract, which states that the Pro-Communist record of every person named in it is documented in the files of the House Un-American Activity Committee, in the California State Senate Fact Finding Committee, and other government investigating agencies. It seems that others have tried to get this information from you, from the House Un-American Activities Committee, and from their Congressmen - all to no avail. If you cannot furnish me the information that I am requesting, I would appreciate very much your telling me where I can get such information.

Would you please tell me whether or not the following named persons $w^{\mu\nu}$ were listed in the tract, "Red Stars - No. 3" and what this tract claims them to be: Lloyd Bridges, Bennett Serf, Chet Huntley, Burl Ives, George Jessel, Edward R. Murrow and Keenan Wynn?

Further, would you please define for me (a) "A rabid red", (b) fellow. traveler, and (c) "The Red Conspiracy in Hollywood and in Television"?

The above requested information would certainly be appreciated by me.

GEORGE GLASS

"Hollywood Reporter" for October 21, 1958, notes that film producer GEORGE GLASS, along with others, is considering the independent production of a film version of AP correspondent EDDY GILMORE's forthcoming novel based on his career as a newsman in Moscow, from where GILMORE is now barred.

On June 20, 1951, film writer LEO TOWNSEND and his wife, PAULINE, writers and both admitted former members of the CP in Hollywood from 1943 to 1947, advised that GEORGE GLASS, who at the time of the interview was Vice President of Kramer Productions, had been a member of the CP's organization in the film industry during the 1940's. The TOWNSENDs recalled, however, that GLASS had gotten out of the movement about 1946.

On October 4, 1958, T-5 recalled that GEORGE GLASS, motion picture producer-publicist, had voluntarily appeared under oath before the HCUA at Washington, D. C.; that he testified that although he had attended a number of discussion groups of the Communist Political Association (CPA) in 1945, he had had no intention of joining the CP or the CPA and that he never did. At the same HCUA hearing, however, CHARLES DAGGETT, former newspaperman and self-admitted former CP member, testified that GLASS not only had joined the CP in about 1945, but that he, DAGGETT, had attended several CP branch meetings at GLASS's home.

BURL IVES

"Daily Variety" for October 23, 1958, reported that IVES would co-star in a forthcoming film being produced for United Artists release.

According to information from T-10 on April 20, 1949, in 1944 BURL IVES was a personal acquaintance of ALFRED K. STERN, Soviet espionage agent. Informant learned from STERN that he considered IVES 100 per cent "left" in his thinking. T-10 advised that he had had many discussions with IVES, and T-10 characterized him as a typical propagandist and agitator.

On December 9, 1948, according to T-11, another Covernment agency which conducts security investigations, a confidential source of T-11 described BURN IVES as a member of the CP whom he, the source, had recruited.

LLOYD BRIDGES

"Daily Variety" for October 3, 1958, notes that actor LLOYD BRIDGES, star of the television series "Sea Hunt," would appear on NBC-TV's "Steve Allen Show" on October 12, 1958.

According to information furnished by T-12 on August 3, 1944, and November 19, 1945, LLOYD BRIDGES was a member of the Actors Branch of the Los Angeles CP's organization within the Hollywood film industry during 1943-1944.

In 1951 during an interview with him by SAs and MARCUS M. BRIGHT, JR., LLOYD BRIDGES admitted past membership in the CP, but he consistently refused to identify anyone else he knew in the party.

MENNETH MAC CLELLAND

During an interview with MAC CLELLAND by SA and SA WILLIAM J. MALONE on October 31, 1958,
MAC CLELLAND identified himself as the art director of the DINAH SHORE TV show which emanates from NBC studios in Beverly Hills. He had been connected with this TV production for some time. MAC CLELLAND admitted that he was a member of the CP from 1941 to 1946 or 1947. He claimed he got out of the party at that time when he felt he was being "pushed" by the party to accept an assignment he did not want.

On November 12, 1958, T-13, former member of a CP branch in the Hollywood Section, recalled KEN MAC CLELLAND and his wife, CHARLOTTE, as active members of the Victory Branch in the CP's Hollywood Section about 1943. At that time MAC CLELLAND was employed in the studio industry.

EDWARD DMYTRYK

"Daily Variety" for October 22, 1958, noted that Twentieth Century Fox had just recently signed EDWARD DMYTRYK

In an attempt to obtain speakers SCHVARTZ unspecsesfully contacted MARY BETHUNE of the National Board of Directors, but was successful in obtaining a negro speaker, CHARLES HOUSTON, a Washington, D. C. attorney, active in the Fair Employment Practice Committee.

In addition, after a goodly amount of communication with EVE BUDD of the National Office, she obtained BURL IVES to sing folk songs, although at the last minute he did not appear. Lt. SU HLE of the War Department, Mrs. J. BORDEN HARRIMAN, Ex-Minister to Norway, RAY LEV, Pianist. Locally she secured a representative from the Soviet Embassy and the British Consul as well as LUCIAN KOCH, National Director of the Industrial Union Shipbuilders of America, CIO. For music she secured the services of BOB IULA, who was supported by JOYCE EVANS, Vocalist for Radio Station ICAO.

It is interesting to note that in securing a haster of Geremonies SCHWARTZ solicited IAN ROSS McFARLAND. Commentator over Radio Station WITH, who related he was still interested in the movement but his sponsor, mGr., refused to condone his appearance. In view of this, SCHWARTZ obtained RALPH POWERS of Radio Station WCAO.

Informant further pointed out that the Artists Union, under the influence of MARTHA OSTRANDER, provided posters for the rally and Mr. and Mrs. EMMETT WHITE, wholesale art dealer, not only lent their services but appeared as sponsors for the rally.

On November 24th, during a conference with DR. H. C. LANCASTER, SCHWARTZ suggested that REV. MAROLD ARROWSMITH attempt to interest other members of the clergy in the rally, while DOROTHY SALMINI was preparing a list of merchants who would welcome doing business with the Soviet Union. During the conference SCHWARTZ suggested that DR. LANCASTER, his wife or daughter, contact the following in an effort to have them sponsor the rally:

A highly confidential source recently made available to this office a copy of a letter dated April 18, 1947, written by MARTHA DODD/STERN to Mrs. HERY WALLACE.

In the letter MARTHA DODD STERN enclosed some clippings concerning HEARY WALTACE and continued, "Maybe you remember my husband, Alfred Stern, who was at your home some time ago with Burly Ives and Boris Morros. And many years ago I had dinner at your apartment with my father who was then Ambassador to Germany."

The letter goes on to praise HELRY WALLACE and expresses the hope that the accuaintance of Mrs. WALLACE and the writer (MARTHA DODD STERM) would be renewed.

It is believed probable that the BURL IVES mentioned is probably the well known ballad singer.

It is noted that the date of the visit of STERN, MORROS and IVES to the VALLACE home is placed as "some time ago" and may have taken place during the time STERN and MORROS were associated in the record business.

The above is being reported for the information of the Bureau and interested offices and may be of value to the Los Angeles Office in the handling of

On September 9, 1948, Confidential Informant T-13 advised that HENRIETTA BARKER conferred with ALFRED STERN concerning a promoter by the name of VLADRIR DOMANSKY of 145 W. 55th Street, and his wife, CHEKAVA (ph), a professional singer. STERN inquired of SCHUMANN if she knew where "BORIS" was and she replied that she did not know and had not seen him for years. According to the informant it was believed probable that the BORIS referred to may be BORIS MORROS.

Confidential Informant T-14 also made available a copy of a letter dated April 18, 1947, written by MARTHA DODD STERN to LARS. HENRY WALLACE. Confidential Source A-16 has advised that when ALFRED K. STERN and JACK SOBLE were occupying a room together at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California, in February and March, 1945, it was ascertained that STERN had numerous documents contained in a brief case among which was a "Detailed Chronological Report Covering the Year 1944," relating to STERN'S business relations with BORIS MORROS in American Recording Artists; Inc. According to this source STERN stated in the report that he, STERN, was also friendly with BURL IVES to whom BORIS had previously spoken, having in mind his signing a contract with "our" company to publish and record his folk songs. STERN went on to state that BORIS also promised to get him (IVES) a radio contract including a place on the JACK BENNY program, as well as a spot in a picture, but after getting him interested he offered him a very low salary and BURL felt insulted and refused to accept it. STERN went on to state that since then BURL had met with success and "in this case, as well as others that I will mention, BORIS has toyed with people's interest in musical development or pictures without being realistic as to how he could carry out his plans or promises." STERN also related in the report that while MORROS was in New York in March he was very much involved with getting approval from Vice President WALLACE for "Of Thee I Sing" and getting clearance from the owners of the play to produce it. STERN stated that he went to Washington with MORROS, BURL IVES and ARTHUR LYONS, one of MORROS! movie associates.

This source also made available a document headed "Personal Relations Between Boris and Associates and Friends of his to Whom I have Been Introduced by Boris Either in Business or Personal Relations." In this document STERN states:

"I referred in detail in the attached report to BORIS! dealings with BURL IVES, a folk song and Americana singer. BURL is one of the most talented of the younger liberal folk singers in this country and has already made quite a reputation for himself. BORIS! handling of him as described in the other material was an insult to BURL and made him very disgusted with BORIS! methods."

Source 1-16 further made available at the same time a letter dated January 16, 1934 from 30 Rockefeller Plaza, New York City, to "Dear Boris." This letter stated in part:

An envelope in the file which appears to have the date July 18, 1943 is addressed to Mr. BORIS MORROS, 20th Century Fox Studios, Beverly Hills, California and has the return address of Cpl. BURL IVES, 32325070, 46 A.B. Sq., Hamilton Field, California.

A letter in the file addressed to "Dear Boris" and signed "Best wishes, BURL," states:

"Sorry to have cast any shedow of doubt on our plan. I just thought artists get very excited about things and sometimes cool off. That's their nature so I apologize.

"Work here is pretty interesting but I feel I should be singing. The field is very nice and the climate is great. By the way I go out on trips to the <u>Satalite</u> airdromes 2 and 3 days at a time so when you come let me know so I can be here. Must go to lunch. Hope to see you soon."

There is also a copy of a letter in the file dated July 21, 1943, addressed to "Dear Burl" and signed BORIS MORROS. This letter states:

"I am just the opposite of 'cooled off'. I was very glad to hear from you and I imagine in these days you may get a blue note once in a while so don't get sour on yourself and don't get any dreams to go overseas. I am making plans to be in Frisco as soon as possible so stick around and everything will be all right soon, I hope.

I am always glad to hear from you, be patient and you will be singing again and things will work out so everyone is happy."

It is noted, as set forth above, that the report by STERN reflected IVES as well as LYONS and STERN went along on the trip from New York to Washington at the time MORROS saw Vice-President WALLACE for clearance on the picture "Of Thee I Sing." It is further noted that on February 21, 1949 BORIS MORROS advised reporting agent that when he went to see Vice-President HENRY WALLACE about clearance for the picture "Of Thee I Sing," that ARTHUR LYONS and ALFRED K. STERN went with him and MORROS introduced both LYONS and STERN to WALLACE. MORROS at this time made no mention of IVES.

On April 20, 1949, while MORROS was being interviewed by SA's GOODENOW and DAVIS he was asked relative to his relationship with BURL IVES. MORROS was rather vague at first stating IVES was in Los Angeles making the picture "We're in the Army" for Warner Brothers, and that HENRY WALLACE wrote a letter to MORROS about IVES, or McKINLAY CANTOR could have introduced him. MORROS stated IVES complained to him that they wanted to take him out of "We're in the Army" and make a solo performer out of him. According to MORROS, IVES wanted him to build him up as a movie personality.

. MORRCS was asked if IVES had been along on the trip to see Vice-President HENRY WALLACE relative to "Of Thee I Sing" and he stated that IVES was ARTHUR LYONS! client and that IVES, IYONS, STERN and himself went to see HENRY WALLACE. In this connection MORROS stated that IVES and WALLACE are very friendly.

MORROS claimed that ALFRED K. STERN had negotiated with IVES for his services as a musician in connection with American Recording Artists, Inc. but that nothing had ever come of it. MORROS thought that IVES connection with IXONS was strictly business and he did not think IXONS handled IVES as a client for over four months. He also stated that STERN did not know IVES before. MORROS introduced them. He stated, however,

that STERN had immediately mentioned to IVES that he, STERN, was a very good friend of CARL SANDBURG'S and "that started them off;"

With regard to IVES! political inclinations; MORROS stated:

"IVES is one hundred percent as left as can be. It !
looked to me like ZUBILIN sent him to me like SOBLE sent him to me.
He looks like St. Louis or Iowa but he talks red, his talk is ultra
red. He looked to me like he was sent to check on me. I was very
uncomfortable and glad to get rid of him. He loves to talk; a typical
propagandist, more than that a typical agitator. If I would be you
I wouldn't trust him. I was scared to death."

MORROS could give no further specific information relative to why he thought IVES had been sent to him by ZUBILIN or SOBIE, but stated IVES was unpleasant and arrogant in his beliefs and appeared ready to back them up with physical action.

APPARENT COMMUNIST INTEREST

In addition to the information previously obtained by confidential informants of this office and stated in the foregoing paragraphs, it was learned by Confidential Informant CGO-5027 that was arranging with WILLIAM L. PATTERSON for a meeting with Communist Political Association officials in Chicago. Confidential Informant CAO-5029 had similar information to report on this meeting, but advised that it was rather vague. He said that PHII BART, of District Headquarters, was perfecting arrangements for this meeting, but the informant was unable to clarify this report.

Confidential Informant CGO-5027 reported that he was present when PHIL BART and WILLIAM PATTERSON discussed the subject organization. PATTERSON advised BART that would soon have to report back to the East.

BART stated that this was not true, as he had discussed the situation with MORRIS CHILDS and MORRIS had decided that she would stay here. BART stated that we have a definite understanding that she stays here for six months and if these plans are going to change overnight, then it's no use discussing them. PATTERSON told BART they would find out from her if if she was staying, as it was his understanding that they wanted something substantial created here. The remainder of the conversation was quoted as follows:

PHIL BART: "And this person should stay here to make that possible?"

PATTERSON: "But she wants also some talk to these people about getting together, consolidation of it. That's what she wants.

PHIL BART: "My understanding is that she is to stay here even if she did go away for a few days.

PATTERSON: "Well, on that point the question is getting together and talking over the consolidation; personnel questions, you know, are some of the things she wants to talk about. It's my opinion there should be a talk with her and with them, with some of these people so that she knows who is who and what's what.

BART: "I understand that MORRIS (CHILDS) spent half a day with them.



It is to be noted that the above names are being set out alphabetically below with a brief identification, where available, of each as to past or present connections with the radio-television industry, and a brief statement on any Communist Party membership or sympathics which are known.

LARRY ADLER

Confidential Informant T-11, of known reliability, advised on March 28, 1950 that he did not believe LARRY ADLER has ever appeared





announcer and actor in radio. According to the Informant, IRVING has a reputation of being pro-Communist and the Informant subsequently recalled that in 1947 his name appeared in an advertisement of the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions, supporting the May Day Parade, which is sponsored by the United May Day Committee, and which later organization has been designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order No. 9835.

Confidential Informant T-27, of known reliability, advised on September 25, 1946 that Communism as an issue had come into the open at the National Convention at the American Federation of Radio Artists held in 1946 in Hollywood, California, and that the New York local had unsucessfully tried to put through an anti-Communist resolution at that time. The Informant stated that the Party line at the convention was laid down by CHARLES IRVING.

Confidential Informant T-10 has advised that CHARLES IRVING is well known for being open in his admiration for things Communistic, and has supported the Communist Party line. The Informant also advised that IRVING was a sponsor of the May Day Parades of 1946, 1947, and 1948 and was the signer of an advertisement appearing on October 26, 1947 in the New York "Herald Tribune", which advertisement was in protest against the investigation of Communist infiltration in Hollywood by the House Committee on Un-American Activities.

BURL IVES

Confidential Informant T-14 advised on March 28, 1950 that BURL IVES has no regular program on radio or television at the present time, but that he appears as a guest star on a number of radio shows, for example, he was a guest star on the "Bing Crosby" show approximately three months previous. In addition, he has been a guest star on one of the "Arthur Godfrey" shows.

The Informant further stated that NORMAN CORWIN. The has been previously identified, more or less discovered BURL IVES. He further stated that IVES has been a sponsor of a number of Communist front organizations including the American Committee for Spanish Freedom, and the Citizens Committee of the Upper West Side, both of which have been

designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order No. 9835. BURL IVES was a member of the Advisory Council of "Stage for Action" which was cited as a Communist front by the California Committee on Un-American Activities in its 1948 report, page 392, and was a member of the Committee for the First Amendment, which was cited as a Communist front by the California Committee in its 1948 report, page 210.

Confidential Informant T-28, of known reliability, reported on May 22, 1948 that BURL IVES had been associated with many prominent Communists in New York City and had been active and a frequent entertainer at Communist Party functions.

Confidential Informant T-10 has advised that BURL IVES was an entertainer in 1941 at a function sponsored by the American Friends of the Chinese People, which was cited as a Communist front by the House Committee on Un-American Activities on March 20, 1944, pages 40 and 147.

In addition, Confidential Informant T-10 advised that BURL IVES was a sponsor in 1941 of the American Rescue Ship Mission, which was cited as a Communist front by the California Committee on Un-American Activities in its 1948 report, page 350. The Informant also advised that IVES was a sponsor in 1947 of People's Songs, which has been previously identified in this report as a Communist front.

Pages 70 and 157 of the "1950 Year Book - Radio and Television Directors Guild" reflected LEON JANNEY was a member of the casts of the "ETHEL MERMAN Show" (WNBC) and "Pepper Young's Family" (WNBC).

Confidential Informant T-14 advised on March 28, 1950 that LECN JANNEY was a free lance radio actor, and has been connected with a great many radio shows including "Mr. District Attorney" (WNBC). His uncle is RUSSELL JANNEY, who served as a juror in the trial of the Communist Party leaders in the United States District Court of the Southern District of New York, but according to the Informant, they are not on speaking terms.

Confidential Informant T-14 believes LECN JANNEY to be either a Communist or a Communist sympathizer, basing this on his connections

BACKGROUND:

A review of Budenz's article appeared in the November 28, 1950, issue of the Washington Times Herald. You requested to be advised as to whether we had obtained from Budenz the names and other details which probably were not reflected in his article appearing in "The American Legion Magazine.

DETAILS:

The article by Budenz in "The American Legion Magazine" names such Individuals as Alexander Trachtenberg, A. A. Heller, Joseph Brodsky, and V. J. Jerdme as leaders of the communist penetration in the radio field during 1943. J Howard Lawson is named as the person who went to Hollywood for the "Ameridan Polithuro" to get jobs for more obscure Communist writers. Earl Robinson and Norman Corwin are named as author and collaborator respectively of "The Quiet Man From Kansas" written in honor of Earl Browder . E. Y. (Yip Harburg is mentioned as a devoted sponsor of Communist fronts who is currently engaged in doing the music for MGH's forthcoming production "Huckleberry Finn."

William S. Gailmore, Sidney Rogers, and Arthur Gaeth are mentioned as pro-Communist radio commentators. Budenz stated that the leaders of the Communist penetration in the radio field felt that they had two friends in James C/Fly and Clifford Durr, both formerly with FCC.

Bureau files do not reflect that Budenz has furnished a list of concealed Communists in the radio industry as such. However, Joseph R. Brodsky, who died on July 28, 1947, and who was formerly carried as a key figure, was previously named by Budenz as a concealed Communist. In addition, John Howard Lawson, Earl Robinson, Norman Corwin, William S. Gailmore, Sidney Rogers, Arthur Gaeth, James Lawrence Fly (formerly of FCC) and Clifford Durr have all been named by Budenz as concealed Communists, and information concerning these individuals has been or is being furnished to the New York office by Budenz. It should be noted that Budenz has also named such individuals as Ray Lev and Burl Icle Tves, well-known musicians who have been in radio work, and who may be among those concealed Communists in the radio industry who were not identified by Budenz in his article in "The American Legion Magazine."

It should be noted that Budenz has furnished 462 names of concealed Communists and it is felt that those individuals to whom he refers in his article in "The American Legion Magazine" have already been furnished to the Bureau. However, in the light of the article by Budenz concerning concealed Communists in the radio industry, the New York office has been instructed to interview Budenz and to obtain the identities and complete details concerning the concealed Communists to whom he refers in his article in "The American Legion Magazine."

Mrs. DAVID OPPENHEIM, stage and screen actress, appeared before this Senate subcommittee on March 26, 1952. Mrs. OPPENHEIM's testimony revealed that she was born as JUDY TUVIM and that she is known professionally as JUDY HOLLIDAY.

Miss HOLLIDAY was queried by this committee concerning her sponsorship of various Communist dominated groups and concerning her appearance at a picket line in a Communist Party controlled strike. HOLLIDAY denied any knowledge of the subversive nature of these organizations and claimed to have supported them unwittingly and with only the desire to aid the underdog. She at no time admitted having belonged to the Communist Party or any Communist front organization to her personal knowledge.

PHILIP LOEB testified before this subcommittee on April 23, 1952. He was represented by Attorney R. LAVRENCE SIEGEL. Mr. LOEB: s testimony revealed that he was employed in the theater at New York since 1916 and had a lead part in The Goldberg" radio and television program. His testimony further revealed that he is currently teaching. Mr. LOEB has been a member of Actors Equity, American Federation of Radio Artists, Screen Actors Guild, Television Authority, and the Actors Fund. During the course of his testimony, Mr. MOEB admitted: (1) having been a member of the Board of Directors of Stage for Action; (2) having spoke at a Negro freedom rally in 1945 at the Madison Square Garden; (3) having sponsored the American Committee for Yugoslav Relief; (4) that he wrote a letter to the House Committee on Un-American Activities protesting their questioning persons concerning their Communist Party affiliations; (5) having been associated with the Arts, Sciences and Professions Section of the Progressive Citizens of America; (6) that in January, 1943, he signed a petition against the Dies Committee, distributed under the auspices of the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties; (7) sponsoring of the End JIM CROW In Baseball Committee; (8) wrote a letter commemorating BOB REED, a Communist in the theater.

LOEB claimed to have joined Communist Party Fund groups because he felt they had laudable objectives and that he did not investigate or inquire concerning their true objectives. It was brought out, however, that he considered the objectives of the House Committee on Un-American Activities laudable, but that his investigation told him that its actions were illegal.

BURL/IVES, a folk singer, appeared before this Senate subcommittee on May 20, 1952. BURL IVES is currently employed as a radio and screen performer.

IVES, in the course of his testimony, admitted participating in various Communist Party fronts. He denied Communist Party membership, but admitted that in the Spring of 1944 he did attend six or seven open meetings of the Communist Political Association, which meetings were held in Steinway Hall in New York City. IVES recalled that the following individuals were present at these meetings:

ELLEN MELTZER, Publicist RAY/LEY, Pianist HERB KEY, Conductor RICHARD DYER-BENNET

III. INVESTIGATION BY THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON UN-AMERICAN ACTIVITIES OF COMMUNIST INFILTRATION INTO THE RADIO-TELEVISION INDUSTRY

The House Committee on Un-American Activities, after repeated postponements during the past eight months, held public sessions at Los Angeles from September 29, 1952 until October 7, 1952.

According to 1-20, 121 witnesses were under subpoena to appear at the hearings; however, only 64 had been heard when the committee recessed the hearings until November 17, 1952. 1-20 advised; however, that it is extremely doubtful that the hearings will be resumed in Los Angeles prior to May or June, 1953.

Of the 64 witnesses before this committee, only three were cooperative in answering questions or otherwise furnishing information to the committee. All three of these are connected with the entertainment field and two were engaged within the radio and television industry.

The 61 witnesses who were "unfriendly" included ten individuals who have been employed in one capacity or another within the radio—television industry. These witnesses not only proved entirely uncooperative, but according to 17-20 attempted to utilize the hearings to charge the House Committee on Un-American Activities with engaging in a program of intimidation, black-listing, of attempting to impose political conformity and of continued violation of Constitutional guarantees.

During the first three days of the hearings, demonstrations in the form of picket lines were staged outside the Federal Building where the hearings were held; however, pro-HCUA picket lines developed in opposition to the anti-Communist demonstrators. Aside from one or two fist fights which were quickly stopped by local police officers, there was no violence arising during the entire hearings.

TRYGVE LIE HELPS THE COMMUNISTS AGAIN. You may have read in the newspapers that the Sec.-Gen. of U N intervened to prevent deportation of two so-called "foreign correspondents," Syed Sibtay Hasan of India and Nicolas Kyriazidis of Greece. What you haven't read is that Hasan has been making speeches at Communist meetings...right here in the U S...and that he has been writing in the Communist press of THIS country, not merely of India. For example, the Communist Party used most of the editorial page of its national paper, The Worker, on Oct 5, to print an article by Hasan.

Neither in Hasan's case nor in that of the Greek, Kyriazidis, was there any justification for Trygve Lie's loud demand on the U.S.

Trygve Lie's pro-Communist bias has been shown frequently in past 30 years. He visited Moscow in 1921 as a Communist official of Norwegian Labor Party, which was then affiliated with the Communist International.

He has discreetly assisted the Kremlin in many ways since then. Significant facts of his career were given in Oct issue of Plain Talk magazine (240 Madison Ave, NYCity...25¢ a copy). As chief official of U N, Trygve Lie has repeatedly helped Stalin and opposed the U S. It's time the U S Govt talked plainly to him and about him and made him behave.

O. JOHN ROGGE, COMMUNIST FELLOW-TRAVELER, and former Asst Atty General, is such a big hit with the Communist Party that it used more than a page in the Daily Worker Dec 26 to plug him in words & pictures.

PHILCO HAS COMMUNIST PARTY MEMBER ON ITS PROGAM. Last Friday night (Dec 26) the Philco Radio Corp program on Mutual network had its regular star, Burlives, and also a guest. his old pal, Peter Seeger. Now Burl Ives himself has supported many Communist fronts, including Natl Committee to Win the Peace (for Stalin, by weakening U S), Southern Conference for Human Welfare, People's Songs, Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, and testimonial dinner for Rockwell-Kent (artist and Communist Party member).

Pete Seeger, Communist Party member, and Burl Ives jested on the program about their chummy old days when they were on the bum together. This was a tender, sentimental topic, but it shouldn't divert anyone (even Philco Radio Corp) from the unsentimental fact that Pete Seeger is a complete Fifth Columnist. No matter what doubt there may be about Burl Ives, there's none about his old pal Pete Seeger. This man is director of People's Songs, an important Communist front (see Counterattack Dec 19 p 4). He entertains continually at party functions as well as at meetings of fronts and Communist-controlled unions. He was on the party line during the Stalin-Hitler alliance, singing songs denouncing Roosevelt as a warmonger... till Hitler attacked Russia. Then the party line changed and so did Seeger.

Why doesn't Philco know this? Why don't radio sponsors take care to avoid putting quislings on the air? When will they wake up?

THINGS YOU CAN DO TO BEAT THE COMMUNISTS: Individually and through your organizations, let Truman, the State Dept, Atty Gen Clark, and Congress know what you think of various matters reported in Counterattack today...and let newspapers know what you think of calling Communists "liberals"...and tell radio sponsors what you think about hiring Communist entertainers.

Concerning BURL IVES, on Tuesday, May 20, 1952, he appeared before the United States Senate Subcommittee of the Senate Judiciary Committee, to Investigate the Administration of the Internal Security Act, Senator PAT MC CARRAN presiding. During the hearing, Mr. IVES admitted he had bettared as an entertainer, or his name had been used, authorized and unauthorized, as a sponsor for organizations later cited as Communist controlled. He stated he did not participate in any of the organizations, and that, at the time, most of the organizations sounded like very positive and good things to do. He further stated he was not a Communist, and did not believe in the Communist policy.
