





DETAILS: AT ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI

A review on November 24, 1969, of the Marine Corps records on file at the National PersonnelRecords Center, Military Branch, St. Louis, Missouri, indicated CHARLES WENDELL COLSON, serivce number 061 287, was appointed a Second Lieutenant in the Marine Corps on June 1, 1953, and entered on active duty on the same date at Providence, Rhode Island. He was honorably discharged on June 19, 1955, as a First Lieutenant at Jacksonville, North Carolina, at his own request to accept appointment in the Marine Corps Reserve and inactive duty. On June 20, 1955, he was appointed a First Lieutenant in the Marine Corps Reserve and he remained on active duty at the Marine Corps Air Facility, New River, Jacksonville, NorthCCarolina, and transferred to the inactive Marine Corps Reserve. He served in the Marine Corps Reserve in an inactive status from June 24, 1955, to April 9, 1965, at which time he was honorably discharged as a Captain by reason of voluntary resignation.

He had foreign and/or sea service for approximately two months, exact dates and places were not shown and was awarded the National Defense Service Medal. His military occupation was shown as Supply Officer. His character and efficiency ratings ranged from average to excellent and there was no record of courts—martial or absence without official leave.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

He was granted a Secret security clearance on May 20, 1954, on the bases of a National Agency check. His records indicated under unfinished business that he was indebted to the U.S. Government in the amount of \$88.47, and that this amount was certified as being uncollectable in 1962. No other information was shown in the records concerning this matter.

His date and place of birth were shown as October 16, 570 1931, Boston, Massachusetts.

A review on November 19, 1969, by IC of the personnel records, National Personnel Records Center (Civilian), St. Louis, Missouri, indicated that CHARLES WENDELL COLSON was employed on July 5, 1955, as a Management Intern, with the Navy Department, Executive Office of the Secretary, Administrative Office, Administrative Operations Division, Personnel Branch, Office of the Head at Washington, D.C. On January 8, 1956, he was promoted to Administrative Intern. This employment was terminated on August 21, 1956, by reason of resignation to accept another position.

He was granted Interim Top Secret clearance on August 30, 1955, based on National Agency check completed April 20, 1954.

The record listed additional employment as Whiting, Weeks and Stubbs, June, 1948, to August, 1948, at Boston, Massachusetts; William Filenes, Belmont, Massachusetts, June, 1951, to July, 1951, and Zarehs, Belmont, Massachusetts, December, 1951, and December, 1952.

Additional addresses were listed as 251 Commonwealth Avenue, Boston, Massachusetts, September, 1937, to September, 1938; 47 Carlton Road, Belmont, Massachusetts, September, 1938, to October, 1939; 952 Franklin Street, Melrose, Massachusetts, October, 1943, to October, 1944; 15 Governors Road, Bronxville, New York, September, 1945, to April, 1946; Concord Road, Lincoln, Massachusetts, September, 1947, to June, 1948; and 29 Gothwaite, Apartments, Triangle, Virginia, August, 1953 to January, 1954.


