principally located at the National Autonomous University of  
Mexico (UNAM). Recently the Partido Comunista Bolchevique de  
Mexico (PCBM - Bolshevik Communist Party of Mexico) changed  
its name to the Liga Comunista Para la Construccion del Partido  
del Proletariado (LCPCPP - Communist League for the Construction  
of the Party of the Proletariat). This new organization is  
attempting to group together those who have been expelled from  
the Partido Comunista Mexicano (PCM - Communist Party of Mexico). (S)

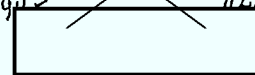

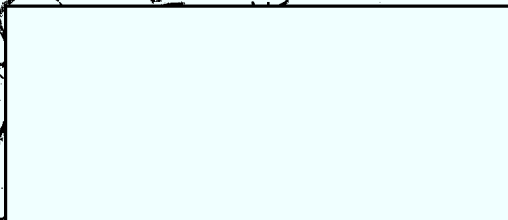

T-5, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on August 13, 1965, that the "Trotskyite" organization known as the PMT at that time was led by [redacted]

Some of the members of the PMT were also members of the LOM at the UNAM, which is also a "Trotskyite" organization. (U)

T-3 advised on January 6, 1966, that [redacted] a "Trotskyite" leader at the UNAM and a member of several "Trotskyite" organizations, is [redacted] DAVID AGUILAR MORA, a former member of the POR, who was arrested in Guatemala on December 8, 1965, and who allegedly was subsequently executed by Guatemalan authorities. T-2 advised on December 22, 1965, that he considered [redacted] as one of the top leaders of the POR in Mexico. (U)

T-2 advised in May, 1963, that the PCBM was a collectivity of militant communist elements in Mexico who planned to form a national organization in opposition to the PCM. T-2 stated that the nucleus of the PCBM was a group of former leaders of the Federal District Committee of the PCM who had been expelled from the latter organization in April, 1962, for factionalist activity and had since been able to persuade about 200 other former PCM members to desert the PCM and join the PCBM. According to T-2, the major difference between the PCM and the PCBM policies consisted in the preference of the PCBM for the militant Chinese communist line as compared to the pro-Soviet line of "peaceful coexistence" which remained the official PCM policy despite the recent struggle over this issue within the PCM national leadership itself. SUBJECT: VISIT OF MRS. LYNDON B. JOHNSON  
TO MEXICO CITY, APRIL 14, 1966

At 9:45 a.m., today, the Director telephonically advised Extra Duty Supervisor [redacted] Domestic Intelligence Division, that he wanted no dissemination made of any communication from Santo Domingo or Mexico City until he had a chance to review them. He advised that the reason for this was that Mrs. Johnson was planning a trip to Mexico City and President Johnson wanted the Director's analysis as to the security risk involved. The Director advised that he had planned to talk to the President later on today or early tomorrow morning. He advised that he wished to be advised immediately of any communications from Santo Domingo or Mexico City.

Legal Attache [ ] Mexico City, telephoned 4/5/66 concerning the proposed visit of the First Lady to Mexico City commencing 4/14/66. He pointed out that visits of a member of the President's family have, in the past, involved the Mexico City Office to a considerable extent. He noted that his Number One Man, Assistant Legat Robert F. Nischwitz, will leave 4/7/66 en route to San Juan as ASAC. In addition, Assistant Legat [ ] is currently attending In-Service. Mexico City is also short two Clerks as a result of the transfer of one to Santo Domingo and another to the Domestic Field, and their replacements will not arrive until after 4/14/66.

[ ] stated that he had received no contact or request, as yet, from the Secret Service but wondered whether he should ask ASAC Nischwitz to hold up on his departure for San Juan. He was instructed to let Nischwitz leave on schedule, as San Juan has been without an ASAC for several weeks due to SA [ ] illness and transfer. He was further instructed to inform the Bureau in the event Secret Service requests required the presence of SA [ ] who specializes in police contacts. It would be possible, if he was urgently needed, to return Clark to Mexico in a matter of hours.

The most significant conclusion of the attached  
estimate is that while there can be no absolute guarantee  
against incidents designed to disrupt U. S. - Mexican  
relations from occurring, USIB believes that the Mexican  
Government will take security precautions which will be  
adequate to protect Mrs. Johnson and Secretary Rusk. (U)

The USIB Secretariat advised on the afternoon  
of 4/12/66, that Admiral Raborn has asked that the attached  
estimate be reviewed and that a memorandum to holders of  
the estimate be written updating the estimate. The memorandum  
to holders, attached, states as follows: "We have reviewed  
SNIE 81-66 Security Conditions in Mexico, and we believe  
that its findings are still valid. Subsequent information  
indicates that the Mexican Government is taking security  
precautions to minimize the chances of an untoward incident  
during the visit of Mrs. Johnson, Secretary Rusk and their

The memorandum to holders has been reviewed by  
the Domestic Intelligence Division in light of information  
we have received from Legal Attache [redacted] in Mexico. As a

MEXICO CITY--THE U.S. EMBASSY SAID TODAY THE TOPICS TO BE DISCUSSED BY PRESIDENT JOHNSON AND MEXICAN PRESIDENT GUSTAVO DIAZ ORDAZ THIS WEEK PROBABLY WILL INCLUDE HEMISPHERIC RELATIONS AND ECONOMIC PROBLEMS. THE LAST MAJOR SPECIFIC ISSUES PENDING BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND MEXICO--DISPUTES OVER THE "CHAMIZAL" AREA OF EL PASO AND THE "SALINATION" OF THE COLORADO RIVER--HAVE BEEN SETTLED IN RECENT YEARS. A RELIABLE DIPLOMATIC SOURCE SAID THE JOHNSON VISIT, ORIGINALLY SCHEDULED FOR THIS SUMMER, WAS MOVED UP AT THE U.S. PRESIDENT'S REQUEST.

"THE VISIT HAS BEEN A FOREGONE CONCLUSION FOR SOME TIME," SAID THE SOURCE. "JULY WAS THE MOST FREQUENTLY-MENTIONED TIME FOR IT. THE PRESIDENT APPARENTLY DECIDED THIS WEEK WOULD BE MORE CONVENIENT. AFTER THE MEXICAN PRESIDENT DECIDED HE WOULD BE TAKING PART IN THE DEDICATION OF THE LINCOLN STATUE."

THE SUDDEN ANNOUNCEMENT CAUGHT USUALLY WELL-INFORMED DIPLOMATS HERE BY SURPRISE. A U.S. EMBASSY SPOKESMAN DENIED THE POSSIBILITY OF ANY SUCH VISIT ONLY FIVE MINUTES BEFORE THE OFFICIAL ANNOUNCEMENT WAS MADE IN JOHNSON CITY.

THE MEXICAN GOVERNMENT SAID JOHNSON "WILL BE GIVEN ALL HONORS THAT MEXICO PROVIDES FOR OFFICIAL VISITS BY CHIEFS OF STATE," EVEN THOUGH HIS TRIP HERE IS NOMINALLY "INFORMAL."

THE EMBASSY SAID IT IS UNLIKELY THAT THE PROBLEM OF MEXICAN CONTRACT FARMWORKERS RECENTLY BARRED FROM ENTERING THE U.S. WILL BE DISCUSSED BY THE TWO PRESIDENTS.

JOHNSON'S DECISION TO COME TO THE MEXICAN CAPITAL WAS A PARTICULAR SURPRISE. HIS DOCTORS ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE ADVISED HIM LAST YEAR TO AVOID MEXICO CITY, BECAUSE THE THIN AIR OF ITS MILE-AND-A-HALF HIGH ALTITUDE WOULD BE A STRAIN ON A MAN WITH A HISTORY OF HEART TROUBLE. IT HAD BEEN EXPECTED THAT HE WOULD MEET DIAZ THIS SUMMER IN THE SEA-LEVEL RESORT OF ACAPULCO.

"JOHNSON OBVIOUSLY GOT THE APPROVAL OF HIS DOCTORS TO COME HERE," DIPLOMATIC SOURCES SAID. "AFTER ALL--THERE ARE MANY MEN WHO HAVE HAD HEART ATTACKS WHO LIVE IN MEXICO CITY, AND IT DOESN'T APPEAR TO HURT THEM."

MEXICAN SECURITY OFFICIALS, REPORTEDLY AIDED BY U.S. SECRET SERVICE AGENTS, CONDUCTED A THOROUGH SEARCH OF THE MEXICO CITY AIRPORT WEDNESDAY AND POSTED GUARDS AT POINTS AROUND THE BUILDING.

THE AIRPORT WILL BE CLOSED TO ALL DOMESTIC TRAFFIC AT 3 P.M. (EST) THURSDAY, OFFICIALS SAID, AND TO INTERNATIONAL TRAFFIC 30 MINUTES BEFORE THE ARRIVAL OF THE PRESIDENTIAL PLANE AT 6:30 P.M. EST.

AT LEAST ONE NEWSPAPER (NOVEDADES) REPORTED THE PRESIDENT WOULD TRAVEL INTO MEXICO CITY IN AN OPEN CAR.

A MEXICAN OFFICIAL SAID THAT "ALL ELEMENTS THAT COULD POSSIBLY CAUSE TROUBLE HAVE BEEN 'INVITED' TO LEAVE TOWN FOR THE DURATION OF THE TWO-DAY VISIT. "THOSE WHO DID NOT ACCEPT THE INVITATION HAVE BEEN PUT UNDER SURVEILLANCE," HE SAID.

JOHNSON'S JETLINER WILL BE MET AT THE BORDER AND ESCORTED TO MEXICO CITY BY A SQUADRON OF MEXICAN FIGHTER PLANES, THE AIR FORCE ANNOUNCED.

TROOPS LABORED ALONG THE STREETS THROUGH WHICH THE MOTORCADE WILL PASS, STRINGING WIRE FOR BANNERS AND BUNTING. LESS THAN 24 HOURS AFTER THE VISIT HAD BEEN ANNOUNCED, COLORED POSTERS WITH PORTRAITS OF THE PRESIDENT AND HIS WIFE HAD BEEN PLASTERED ALONG THE PASEO DE LA REFORMA, MEXICO CITY'S MAIN STREET. THE WEATHER PROMISED TO BE UNSEASONABLY WARM AND SUNNY.

OFFICIALS OF THE RULING PARTY, THE PARTY OF REVOLUTIONARY INSTITUTIONS, HELD A CLOSED-DOOR MEETING WEDNESDAY TO HELP PREPARE THE WELCOME. THE PARTY WAS CHARGED WITH INSURING A LARGE CROWD TURNOUT AND SOURCES SAID IT HAD BEEN DECIDED TO TRY FOR A TURNOUT OF 500,000.

PRESIDENTIAL PRESS SECRETARY BILL MOYERS SAID HE THOUGHT SECURITY ARRANGEMENTS WERE GOOD. "BOTH PRESIDENTS ARE THE TYPE WHO PREFER NOT TO STUFF THE WARM RELATIONS BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES INTO A STRAIGHT-JACKET OF PROTOCOL," HE SAID, ADDING THAT THE UNITED STATES AND MEXICO HAVE TRADITIONALLY HAD "VERY CLOSE RELATIONS WHICH PERMIT THIS KIND OF SUDDEN AND INFORMAL VISIT."

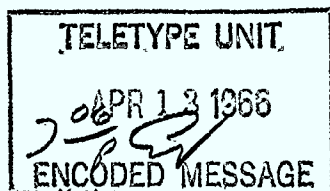

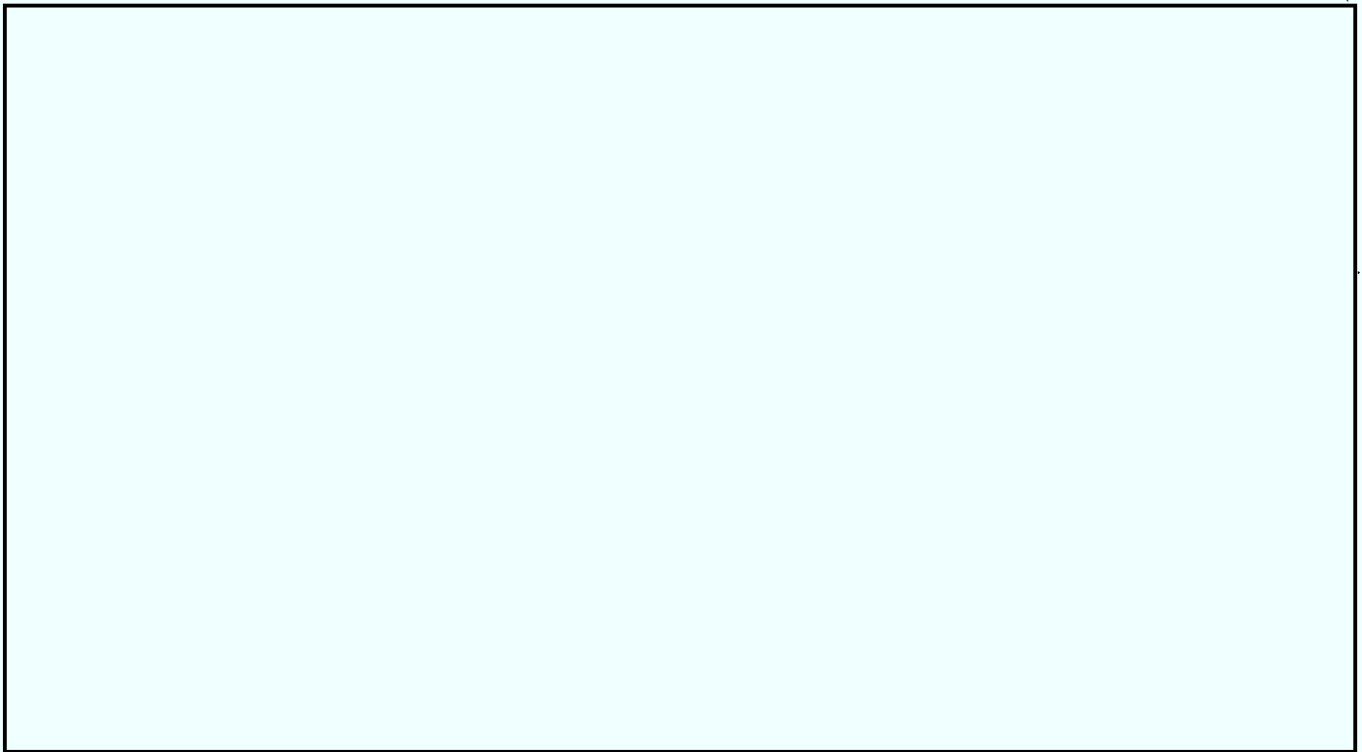

JALAPA, MEXICO (UPI)--AN ESTIMATED 500 LEFTIST STUDENTS SCREAMING "DEATH TO THE YANKEES" BURNED AN AMERICAN FLAG AND AN EFFIGY OF UNCLE SAM IN A DEMONSTRATION SUNDAY PROTESTING THE VISIT TO MEXICO BY PRESIDENT JOHNSON.

"DAMNED JOHNSON GET OUT," READ ONE BANNER. "WHAT ARE YOU LOOKING FOR IN MEXICO?"

SPEAKERS CONDEMNED THE U.S. PRESENCE IN VIET NAM AND CHARGED THAT JOHNSON, WHO WAS WILDLY ACCLAIMED DURING A 24-HOUR VISIT TO MEXICO THAT ENDED FRIDAY, HAD COME TO MEXICO TO PRESSURE THE MEXICAN GOVERNMENT INTO ACCEPTING THE U.S. VIEWPOINT IN THE ORGANIZATION OF AMERICAN STATES. MEXICO HAS OPPOSED THE IDEA OF A PERMANENT INTER-AMERICAN PEACE FORCE.

ONE SPEAKER SAID THE U.S. SHOULD BE FORCED TO RETURN THE TERRITORY THAT ONCE WAS MEXICAN--INCLUDING ALL OF CALIFORNIA, ARIZONA, NEW MEXICO AND TEXAS. JALAPA IS ABOUT 55 MILES NORTHEAST OF VERA CRUZ.

IT WAS THE ONLY DEMONSTRATION TO DATE AGAINST JOHNSON, WHOSE RECEPTION IN MEXICO CITY THURSDAY NIGHT WAS ONE OF THE WARMEST WELCOMES IN THE COUNTRY'S HISTORY.

CHAPINGO, MEXICO--LADY BIRD JOHNSON TODAY LED A 20-CAR MOTORCADE TO THE MEXICAN NATIONAL AGRICULTURE SHOWCASE ON BEHALF OF THE ALLIANCE FOR PROGRESS, AMID EXCEPTIONALLY HEAVY SECURITY PRECAUTIONS.

THE U.S. FIRST LADY TOURED THE NATIONAL CENTER FOR AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION IN THIS SMALL COMMUNITY ABOUT 35 MILES FROM MEXICO CITY.

TWO HELICOPTERS WHIRLED OVERHEAD, LEADING THE MANY ON A SCENIC TRIP FROM THE MEXICAN CAPITAL TO THE CENTER, WHERE MRS. JOHNSON WAS GIVEN A WARM WELCOME.

MEXICO CITY--ELATED BY "THE MOST WONDERFUL RECEPTION" HE EVER HAD, PRESIDENT JOHNSON TODAY IGNORED THE HARD-BREATHING ALTITUDE OF THE MEXICAN CAPITAL AND PLUNGED INTO TALKS AND CEREMONIES THAT LEFT THE CITY BREATHLESS.

THERE WAS A FORECAST OF HOT AND SUNNY WEATHER IN 7,300 FEET HIGH MEXICO CITY AND A PREDICTION THE WHITE HOUSE RELAYED FROM "MEXICAN SOURCES" OF A CROWD "AS MANY AS A MILLION PEOPLE" ALONG JOHNSON'S NINE AND A HALF MILE MOTORCADE ROUTE FROM THE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT TO THE LOS PINOS PRESIDENTIAL PALACE.

EVEN ANTI-AMERICAN LEFTISTS WERE REPORTED PLANNING TO JOIN IN A HEARTY WELCOME FOR JOHNSON, THOUGH TIGHT SECURITY PRECAUTIONS WERE BEING ARRANGED BY MEXICAN AND AMERICAN AUTHORITIES.

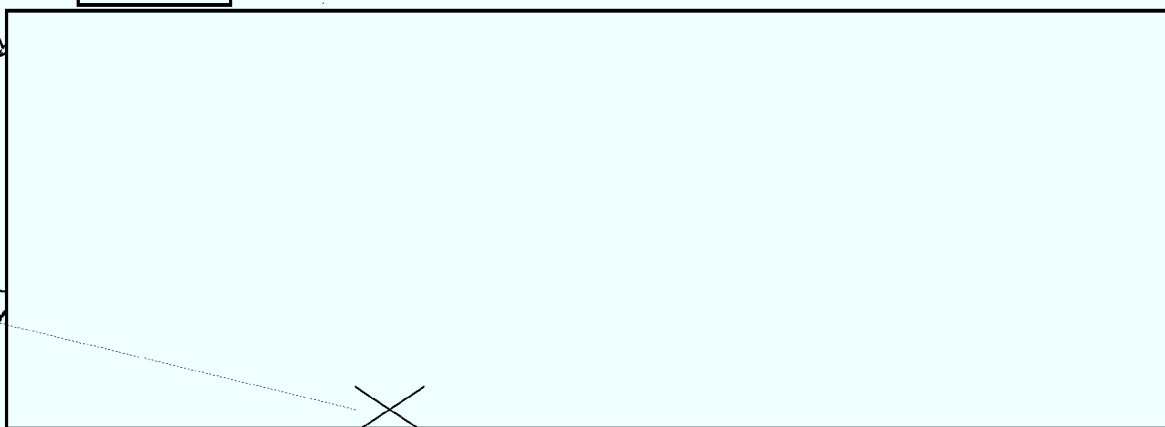

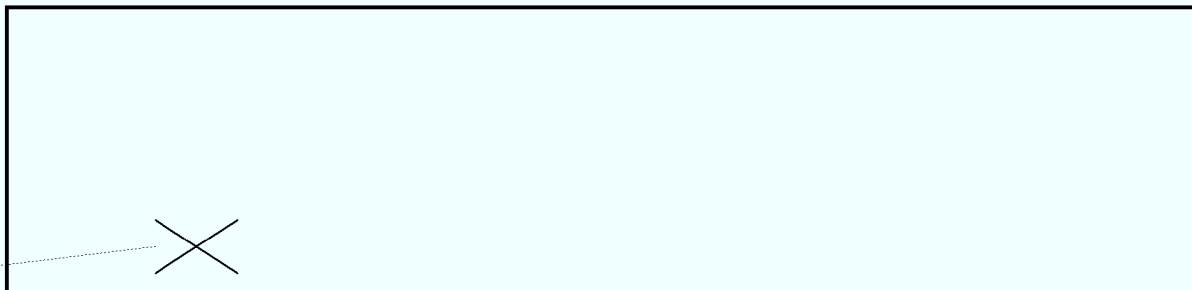

(U) Major leftist political parties in Mexico City continue to hold firm in their resolve to do nothing which would in any way embarrass President Johnson or Mexican Government. The leaders of these groups are known to be confining themselves to their homes in fear of police arrest and only element conducive to possible incident today is in Communist Party of Mexico plan to protest U. S. action in Vietnam at Lincoln statue dedication ceremony. Student group action has been planned by some factions and Trotskyist groups but no reports have been received of efforts to implement these plans. (S-1)(S)

As viewed by American observers on the scene the President's arrival and parade were highly successful events and performance of Mexican security forces was considered outstanding.

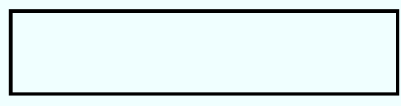

Accordingly, Special Agent in Charge Leonard Blaylock of the Albuquerque Office was instructed to immediately furnish a copy of the photograph of [redacted] which is in Albuquerque files to the Legal Attache, Mexico City, by airmail, Special Delivery so that it would reach Mexico City early 4/15/66, if possible. Blaylock said that he would get the photograph out 4/14/66. Legal Attache [redacted] was then advised that [redacted] photograph would be mailed to him directly from Albuquerque.

HE VOWED, IN MONTHS AHEAD, TO JOIN WITH OTHER HEMISPHERIC LEADERS IN SETTING UP A MEETING AT "THE VERY HIGHEST LEVEL" TO EXPLORE COMMON PROBLEMS AND GIVE THE ALLIANCE FOR PROGRESS "INCREASED MOMENTUM."

"ANY SUCH CONFERENCE SHOULD BE PREPARED WITH UTMOST CARE," JOHNSON DECLARED. "WE SHOULD EXAMINE EVERY IDEA WHICH MIGHT ADVANCE OUR COMMON INTEREST, BE IT OLD OR NEW. CAREFUL PREPARATION NEED NOT BE THE ENEMY OF IMAGINATIVE ACTION..."

JOHNSON MADE THIS PLEDGE IN THE WAKE OF A TUMULTUOUS WELCOME TO MEXICO CITY BY UPWARD OF TWO MILLION AMIGOS IN WHAT HE MODESTLY DESCRIBED AS A "NEIGHBORLY VISIT" SOUTH OF THE BORDER.

IN A SPEECH PREPARED FOR DELIVERY AT PRESENTATION OF A STATUE OF ABRAHAM LINCOLN FROM THE UNITED STATES TO MEXICO AS A SYMBOL OF FRIENDSHIP, JOHNSON SAID:

"WHAT ABRAHAM LINCOLN STOOD FOR IS WHAT BINDS OUR TWO NATIONS AND INDEED, THIS HEMISPHERE, TOGETHER."

THE TIES THAT BIND WERE EMPHASIZED BY JOHNSON IN STILL ANOTHER WAY WHEN HE FOCUSED ATTENTION ON THE "SEVERAL HUNDRED MILES OF THE DARIEN GAP" THAT REMAINED TO BE FILLED TO COMPLETE THE PAN-AMERICAN HIGHWAY SYSTEM IN LATIN AMERICA.

JOHNSON SAID THIS HEMISPHERE MUST "LOCK TO THE DAY WHEN THE OLD PRECOLONIAL LINKS ACROSS THE ISTHMUS ARE FULLY RESTORED, THE GOOD LANDS OPENED FOR AGRICULTURE, AND FAMILIES AND COMMERCE CAN MOVE BACK AND FORTH ANYWHERE BETWEEN LAREDO (TEXAS) TO TIERRA DEL FUEGO (ARGENTINA)."

# President Delighted by Mexico Trip

## Plans New Talks; Tuthill Is Named Envoy to Brazil

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., April 16—President Johnson, buoyed by his Mexican visit, announced plans today for two more meetings with President Gustavo Diaz Ordaz and a possible Central-American tour by Mrs. Johnson.

He also named John W. Tuthill as Ambassador to Brazil, a post vacant since January, when Lincoln Gordon became Assistant Secretary of State for Inter-American Affairs.

Reports from the LBJ ranch today portrayed the President as still ebullient over his Mexico City welcome.

### Greatly Pleased

"To say that he was pleased is an understatement," said his Press Secretary, Bill D. Moyers.

For three ecstatic hours on Thursday night the cares of the home front and of Vietnam were washed away in the roar of crowds estimated at 2 million.

The crowds' stimulant had him up at 7 a.m. Friday morning putting more "life" into a prepared speech, adding passages filled with reflections on what he had seen in the faces lining the motorcade route.

And it had him bubbling with plans for the United States and Mexico. In a long talk with Diaz Ordaz, these new projects were discussed:

• A verbal agreement to expand cultural relations, more exchanges of screen and stage stars and symphonies.

Arrangements for Secretary of Agriculture Orville Freeman to visit Mexico to discuss cotton production and marketing problems.

• An indefinite invitation to meet Diaz Ordaz on the Mexico-Texas border for a tour of Big Bend Park and discussion

of common development of the Rio Grande.

• A formal state visit to Mexico by Mr. Johnson.

• A poverty program for border communities.

Moyers said the prospect of a trip by Mrs. Johnson to "several Central and possibly South American countries" came up when Diaz Ordaz described his tour of Central America this year. No dates were discussed for either the President's or Mrs. Johnson's travel plans.

Meanwhile, in New York, Arthur J. Goldberg, U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations, announced that he will make an extensive trip in several Latin American countries this summer. Goldberg said the details of his tour were still being arranged.

Mr. Johnson apparently was deeply impressed with his host. "The more I see of Diaz Ordaz, the more I like him," Moyers quoted him as saying. Moyers said the President regarded the trip as a significant step forward in U.S. relations

with Mexico and the other nations of Latin America.

Specifically, Mr. Johnson believes his visit accelerated movement toward a summit meeting of the Alliance for Progress nations, Moyers said.

That conference, which Mr. Johnson endorsed in his speech Friday, appears to be at least a year away. The President is insistent on the need for careful preparation before the chiefs of state get together.

The preparations, Moyers said, would begin with study of the program agreed on by economic ministers at Buenos Aires last month. That program runs the gamut of economic problems — stimulating private savings, tax reform measures, expanding trade, pressing for economic integration of Alliance nations, agricultural development.

"The President feels that preparation for the meeting is a serious undertaking in itself," Moyers said.

The new Ambassador to Brazil, Tuthill, was chosen because he is both a diplomat and an economist. Moyers said, and was at the top of selection lists submitted by Secretary of State Dean Rusk and the chief White House talent scout, John W. Macy.

Tuthill, a career Foreign Service officer, has been U.S. representative to the European Economic Community in Brussels since 1962. An All-America football player at

William and Mary College in 1931-32, he holds a master's degree in economics from Harvard. He has been both economic counselor at the U.S. Embassy in Paris and director of the Office of European Regional Affairs in the State Department.

For a year before his present assignment in Brussels, Tuthill was U.S. representative to the Organization of Economic Cooperation and Development with the personal rank of Ambassador.

On 4/14/66, [redacted] Legal Attache,  
Mexico City, advised Night Supervisor [redacted]  
Domestic Intelligence Division, as follows:

President and Mrs. Lyndon B. Johnson arrived in  
Mexico City on schedule 4/14/66. There was a large crowd  
on hand at the airport and along the route to the Presidential  
Palace. The crowd was estimated at slightly over two million  
people.

The entire Diplomatic Corps, including the Soviet  
Ambassador, was on hand at the airport to greet the  
Presidential Party. There was a large number of union  
members and bus loads of students at the airport, although  
these groups were friendly. As a whole the crowd at the  
airport and the people along the procession route were very  
friendly and gave the President a warm reception. There were  
no significant incidents, although two groups of small boys  
who were shouting something unintelligible before the pro-  
cession arrived were dispersed by the police.

Speeches at the airport lasted longer than were  
scheduled and this fact, coupled with a slow moving pro-  
cession, caused by crowding around the Presidential vehicle,  
delayed the procession until after dark. This apparently  
made the Secret Service men somewhat apprehensive, particularly  
since the President was riding in an open car. At the Main  
Plaza, the Presidential car was stopped because of large  
crowds and there was some handshaking on the part of the  
President. The Party arrived at the Presidential Palace at  
about 9:10 pm (Mexico time), which was about 1½ hours behind  
schedule. Otherwise the arrival and procession went according  
to plan.

I talked with Legal Attache [ ] this morning in Mexico City. I advised him we had been in touch with Secret Service and that [ ] of that Service will be in charge of the Secret Service men and responsible for the direct protection of the President and Mrs. Johnson in Mexico City. I told him to be sure to set up immediate liaison with [ ] as well as [ ] who will also be in Mexico City. [ ] said he had been in liaison with Special Agent Johnson of Secret Service who had the responsibility for making advance planning.

[ ] said that the Agents on special assignment are starting to arrive in Mexico City and that he is working out assignments for them in line with the Director's instructions to be of maximum usefulness to the over-all protection of the President. As instructed by the Director, they will be available for emergency duty, to assist in the dissemination of information, and physical protection of Mr. and Mrs. Johnson if a request in this connection is received from the Agent in Charge of the Secret Service detail.

He was instructed to continue close liaison with the above-named persons. [ ]

[ ] and others having an interest in this over-all situation. He was told to fully brief the men on special assignment on conditions which will exist in Mexico in order to be sure that the Bureau Agents are of assistance and that nothing happens which would in any way be embarrassing to the Bureau.

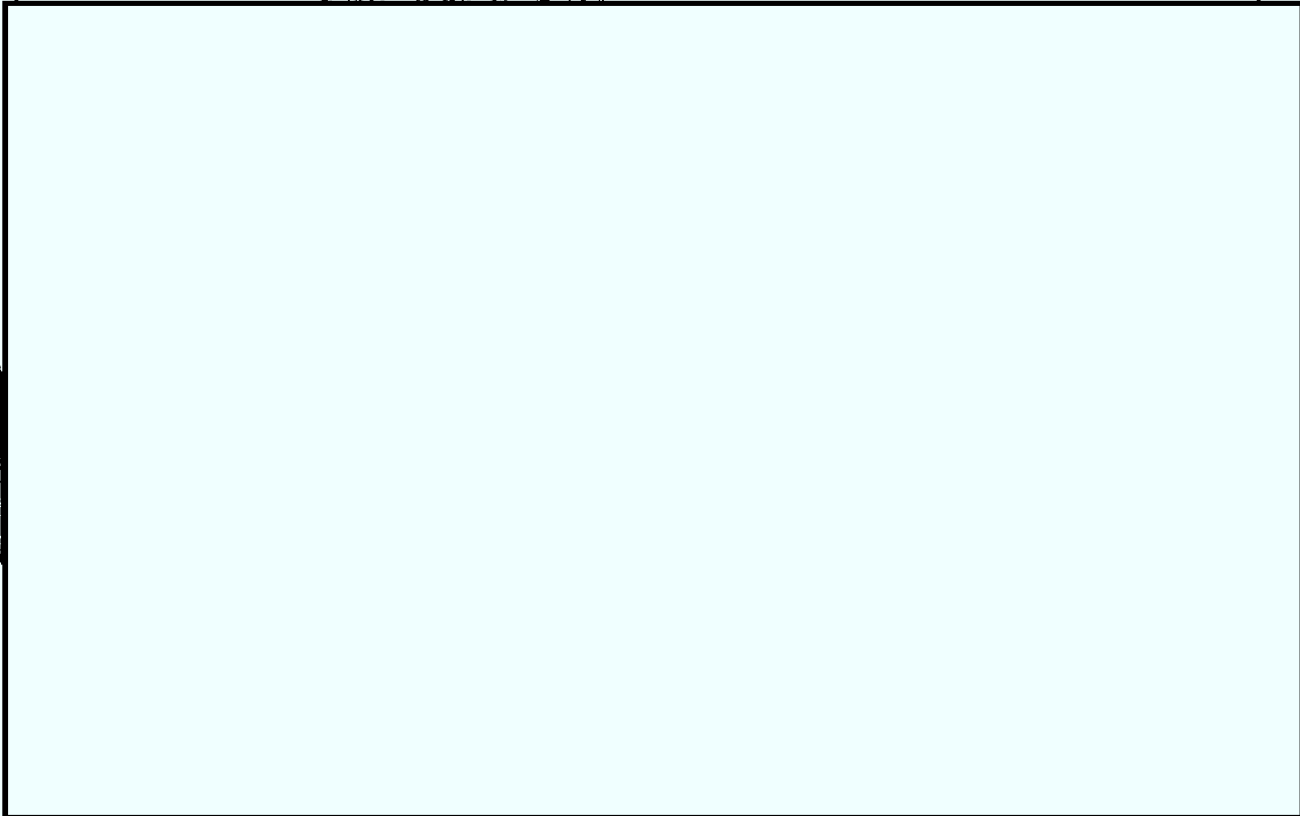

GOVERNMENT ORDERS PROHIBITED ANY ANTI-JOHNSON DEMONSTRATIONS, AND GROUPS SHOUTING AGAINST JOHNSON DURING HIS PARADE WERE CHASED AND ARRESTED BY POLICE, THE MAGAZINE ADDED.

IT ASSERTED THAT "A LARGE GROUP" OF STUDENTS SEIZED THE NATIONAL UNIVERSITY OF MEXICO RADIO STATION AND BROADCAST ATTACKS AGAINST THE U.S. ACTIVITY IN VIET NAM AND THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC.

(THE ONLY HOSTILE DEMONSTRATION PREVIOUSLY REPORTED OCCURRED IN JALAPA, CAPITAL OF THE STATE OF VERACRUZ, WHERE 500 STUDENTS BURNED A U.S. FLAG AND AN EFFIGY OF UNCLE SAM.)

POLITICA SAID THE POLICE DEPARTMENT "SPECIAL FORCE" HAD ORDERED HEADS OF LEFTIST PARTIES TO HIS OFFICE. THERE, IT ADDED, HE TOLD THEM THAT "BY PRESIDENTIAL ORDERS, ALL SOCIAL POLITICAL AND OPINION GUARANTEES WERE SUSPENDED" DURING THE VISIT OF PRESIDENT JOHNSON.

## VISIT OF PRESIDENT AND MRS. JOHNSON

(U) The "Trotskyites" probably refers to members of the Partido Obrero Revolucionario (POR - Revolutionary Workers Party) which is active at UNAM. (C)

T-2 and T-3, who have furnished reliable information in the past, on April 16, 1966, made the following resumé of incidents during the travel of President LYNDON B. JOHNSON from the Mexico City International Airport to Los Pinos, home of President GUSTAVO DIAZ ORDAZ of Mexico:

In front of the Benito Juarez hemicycle, Mexico, DF, about 200 students from UNAM shouted, "Johnson out of Mexico," "Johnson - Murderer," and "Yankees out of Vietnam." These students were dispersed by agents of the Judicial Police in Mexico, DF, and by agents of Special Services, Metropolitan Police Department.

When the Presidential retinue passed the corner of Insurgentes and Paseo de la Reforma, another group of students from the National Polytechnic Institute (IPN) shouted similar phrases. These students were quickly dispersed by grenadiers and by agents of Special Services of the Metropolitan Police Department.

*Mexico*  
Just before the Presidential retinue passed in front of the United States Embassy, a group of students from UNAM, headed by MANUEL AGUILAR MORA, leader of Trotskyite groups at UNAM, attempted to distribute propaganda protesting the visit of President JOHNSON to Mexico. MANUEL AGUILAR MORA was detained momentarily but released by agents of Special Services of the Metropolitan Police Department, and his followers were quickly dispersed, but not before a number of the agitators were struck by police officers.

(U) T-1 advised that the propaganda which MANUEL AGUILAR MORA attempted to distribute consisted of "flyers" containing the letterhead of POR. (C)

Many Cuban exiles lined the streets carrying signs and flags of their country. The signs protested the "communist meddling" in their country. These signs were confiscated by police officials.

## VISIT OF PRESIDENT AND MRS. JOHNSON

At about 3:30 p.m. on April 14, 1966, a group of students tried to stage a meeting in front of the Benjamin Franklin Library but were unsuccessful because of the great number of police who were present.

T-4, T-5, T-6, T-7, and T-8, who have furnished reliable information in the past, provided the following summary relative to the visit of President LYNDON B. JOHNSON to Mexico:

Students of UNAM and IPN, mentioned above, were identified by these sources as students who were organized by the Juventud Comunista de Mexico (JCM - Communist Youth of Mexico) and the Student Committee Pro-Vietnam at UNAM. These sources provided substantially the same data as T-2 and T-3 concerning the incidents which occurred along the route traveled by President JOHNSON and his party.

On April 15, 1966, a group of communist students attempted to approach the park where the statue of Lincoln was being unveiled but were intercepted and dispersed by police officials.

A group of JCM members met at about 5 p.m. on April 14, 1966, to form brigades of young women to distribute about 2,000 "flyers" prepared by the Federal District Committee of the Partido Comunista Mexicano (PCM - Communist Party of Mexico) and which contained pictures of "Lincoln" and "Juarez." They then joined other students of the Student Committee Pro-Vietnam to shout insults at President LYNDON B. JOHNSON and his party as described above. (S)

On the evening of April 14, 1966, a group of communist students from the School of Economics and the School of Political Science, UNAM, appeared at the UNAM radio station. They requested time to announce the end of a student strike and the resumption of classes at UNAM. Instead of following their announced plan, however, they launched attacks against President LYNDON B. JOHNSON concerning the invasion of the Dominican Republic and Vietnam. The office of the rector of UNAM has ordered an investigation of this incident.

The UNAM was unable to stage any activity as scheduled because of the close surveillance of police officials.

Offices of the PCM, Frente Electoral del Pueblo (FEP - People's Electoral Front), Central Campesina Independiente (CCI - Independent Peasants Central), Movimiento Revolucionario de Magisterio (MRM - Revolutionary Teachers Movement), Movimiento de Liberacion Nacional (MLN - National Liberation Movement), and other communist-oriented groups were under close surveillance during the visit of President JOHNSON in Mexico.

Wide newspaper coverage was afforded all activities during the visit of President LYNDON B. JOHNSON to Mexico. An enthusiastic crowd of between one million and two million people turned out along the streets to give President JOHNSON, his wife, and other members of the party a friendly welcome. The Mexican police afforded excellent security.

In September 1964, a split occurred in the CCI organization, and since then there have been two groups, one under the domination of the PCM and the other which professes to be opposed to PCM influence.

Movimiento Revolucionario de Magisterio  
(MRM - Revolutionary Teachers Movement)

T-1 has advised that the MRM is the PCM-dominated faction of the Sindicato Nacional de Trabajadores de Educacion (National Union of Education Workers).

Movimiento de Liberacion Nacional  
(MLN - National Liberation Movement)

According to T-3, the MLN, which was formally organized at Mexico, DF, in August 1961, is an anti-United States, procommunist organization under partial control by the PCM.

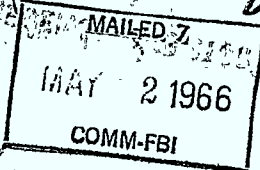

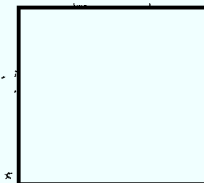

I thought you might be interested in the following aspects of the recent visit of President and Mrs. Johnson to Mexico.

The President's visit was very well-received by the Mexican public and he definitely succeeded in stimulating good will toward the United States. In a meeting with the entire Embassy staff yesterday to thank them for their assistance in the President's visit, Ambassador Fulton Freeman stated that according to one of the Mexican Cabinet officers the enthusiasm generated during the visit of President Kennedy was due to his magnetic personality while the enthusiasm generated during the visit of President Johnson was for the United States, thereby implying that it was more permanent.

The two principal public and semipublic functions during the visit of President and Mrs. Johnson were the unveiling of the Lincoln Statue and the reception given at the Ambassador's residence by Mrs. Johnson in honor of the wife of President Diaz Ordaz after President Johnson's departure.

The ceremony at the Lincoln Statue was very impressive and the comparisons made between President Lincoln and President Juarez of Mexico during most of the speeches were very favorably received.

The reception given by Mrs. Johnson for Mrs. Diaz Ordaz was attended by 500 to 600 persons, including the Congressional delegation from the United States and the other prominent American officials who had not returned to the United States aboard President Johnson's plane, as well as by most of the higher officials of the Mexican Government and many of the leaders of the American business colony in Mexico






The principal item of entertainment during the reception was an exhibition by four members of the United States Olympic swimming team and included ballet swimming and diving specialists. This exhibition had a very favorable impact upon the Mexican guests.

While Mrs. Johnson and Mrs. Diaz Ordaz spent most of the evening inside the residence except for the time when the diving and swimming exhibitions were put on at the outdoor swimming pool, Secretary of State Rusk spent the entire evening "holding court" in one side of the garden.

Former Senator Barry Goldwater, who was in Mexico for a vacation and who had made a well-publicized speech before the American Chamber of Commerce three days before, was also invited to the reception and attended there approximately one hour. His presence created somewhat of a surprise among many of the Mexican guests and he was very warmly greeted by most of the American guests.

Just prior to the departure of Mrs. Johnson and Secretary Rusk from Mexico on Saturday afternoon, April 16, the Secretary held an especially called press conference at the airport given for "foreign correspondents," which meant the American newspaper correspondents in Mexico.

On 4/12/66, the Mexico City daily newspaper "The News" carried an incoherent letter to the editor charging that the NAACP, Negroes, Arabs, and "white negroes" posing as white men, were infiltrating and obtaining power in governments throughout the world. This letter also declared that these people had great power in the C.I.A. and in every government agency of the world, even in Russia, and reported that they had killed the signator's first cousin, ALFRED VIGDERMAN, First Secretary of the Greek Embassy (location not stated). This letter was signed "Gen. MORTON SLOANE, US Army Military Intelligence 20325778."

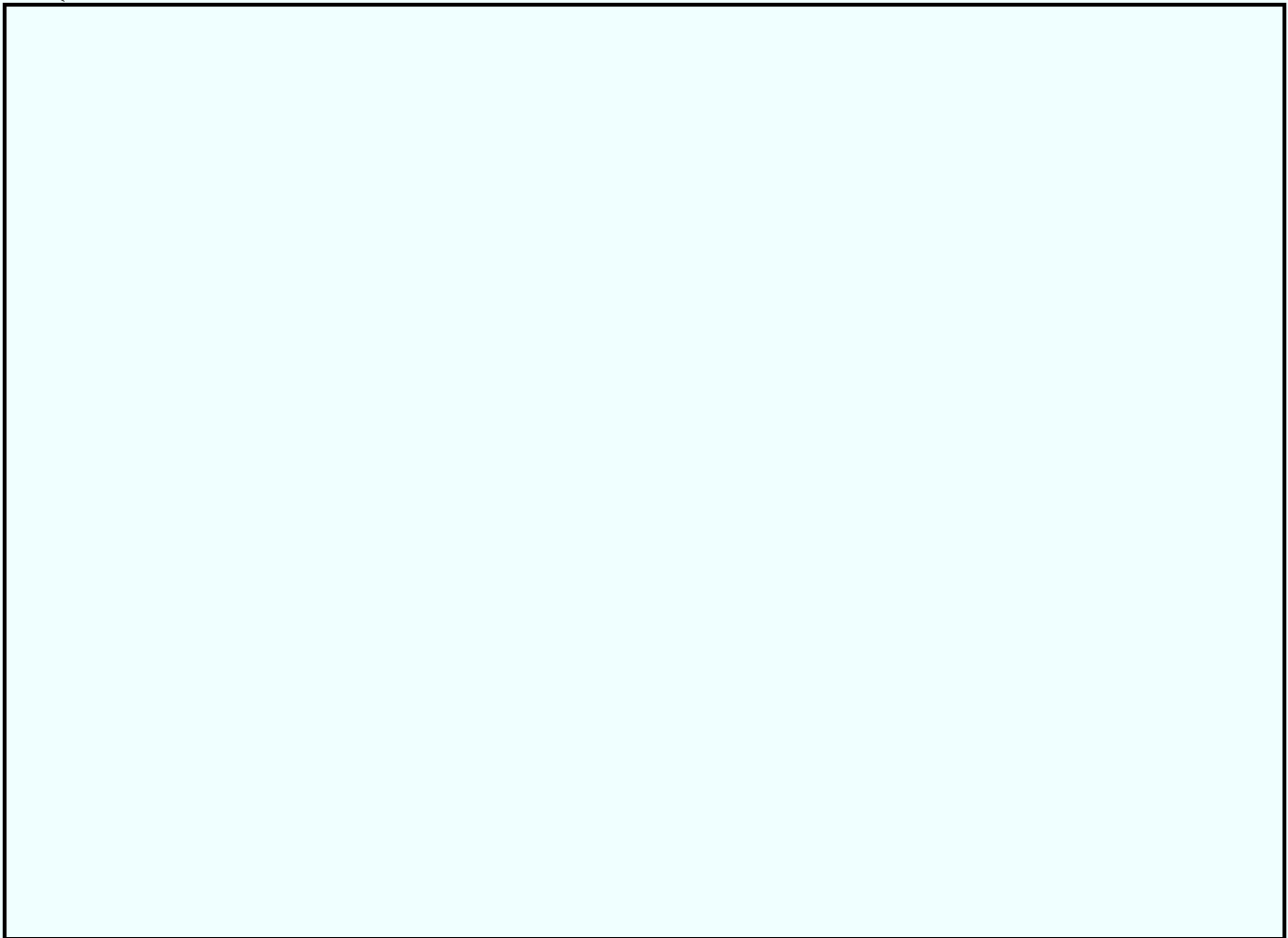

## Point 1

The Mexico City Office has continued to furnish the Bureau with monthly intelligence summaries containing pertinent information concerning the political scene in Mexico since the submission of referenced letter.

The Mexican Government continues to show a friendly but undemonstrative attitude toward the United States. During the visit to Mexico of President and Mrs. LYNDON B. JOHNSON in April 1966, an enthusiastic crowd of over one million people turned out to greet them.

President GUSTAVO DIAZ ORDAZ of Mexico, in his speech of welcome, eulogized ABRAHAM LINCOLN (Mrs. LYNDON B. JOHNSON unveiled a statue of ABRAHAM LINCOLN which was donated by the United States to Mexico in April 1966), coupling his name with his Mexican contemporary, BENITO JUAREZ, former President of Mexico, and stressed the excellent nature of the ties which bind the two nations.

President DIAZ ORDAZ recognized the existence of problems, great and small, past and present, between the United States and Mexico, but he called upon his people to look to the future and to forget the rancors of the past, pointing to the day when the relationships of all nations might be comparable to the fine relationship which exists between the United States and Mexico.

During the visit to Mexico of President and Mrs. LYNDON B. JOHNSON, police maintained close vigilance over

the activities of communist-oriented groups and thwarted all attempts by the Communist Party of Mexico (PCM) and other communist-oriented groups to foment anti-United States activities.

The PCM and the Popular Socialist Party (PPS) have agreed to cooperate in matters of mutual interest. The PPS has candidates for political office [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] The PCM has indicated that it will support PPS candidates in the coming elections and has instructed its members in the People's Electoral Front (FEP), the Independent Peasants Central (CCI), the Revolutionary Teachers Movement (MRM), and the National Confederation of Railroad Workers (CNF) to actively support PPS candidates throughout Mexico.

## Point 2

The PCM and the PPS, working in concert, called a meeting of communist-oriented groups on February 6, 1966, at Mexico, DF. The PCM and the PPS used this meeting to outline the resolutions and the programs formulated during the course

of the First Tri-Continental Conference, held at Havana, Cuba, January 3-15, 1966. Among those resolutions were resolutions to hold weeks of solidarity with Vietnam and the Dominican Republic.

The PCM-PPS-sponsored Week of Solidarity with Vietnam was held in Mexico March 12-20, 1966. About 4,000 to 5,000 individuals representing communist-oriented groups in Mexico participated in a demonstration on March 17, 1966, in support of the Week of Solidarity with Vietnam. They marched along a predesignated route shouting anti-United States statements and carrying signs critical of the United States policies in Vietnam. Demonstrators also burned two simulated flags of the United States. Police officers, however, maintained order, and the demonstrators were not permitted near the United States Embassy in Mexico City.

The Week of Solidarity with the Dominican Republic was scheduled for April 24-30, 1966. Because of a conflict between the PCM and the National Liberation Movement (MLN) over the Mexican delegates to the First Tri-Continental Conference, neither the PCM nor the PPS supported the Week of Solidarity with the Dominican Republic. Activities during that week were directed by the MLN, and little enthusiastic public response was elicited by the MLN.

The PCM leadership planned in November 1965 to reorganize the National Central of Democratic Students (CNED). A constituent congress of the CNED was held in April 1966, and leaders of the PCM youth organization, the Communist Youth of Mexico (JCM), were elected to offices of leadership in the CNED, including that of president. The CNED claims to have 75,000 student supporters throughout Mexico. It quickly tested its strength by calling an anti-United States, pro-Cuban demonstration on June 10, 1966, at Mexico, DF. About 2,000 students, including four busloads from UNAM and one busload from the National Polytechnic Institute, responded to the call. Police, however, dispersed all attempts to organize this demonstration.

Because of the recent reorganization of the CNED, it is too early to predict the degree of control the PCM will maintain over its activities. It is expected, however,

that the CNED will be used for anti-United States demonstrations and for support of international communist front activities.
