Robert Marvin Shelton, Imperial Wizard, United Klans of America, Incorporated, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA), is probably the most well-known Klansman in America. You are instructed to promptly review your files and make any necessary discreet inquiries to determine the background of Shelton, with emphasis upon any personal or organizational weaknesses he may possess that may be capitalized upon to discredit and disrupt organized Klan activities. Thereafter submit your recommendations for specific counterintelligence action.

Your inquiries should determine if Shelton is employed full time by the UKA and the nature of his duties. His sources of income should be developed and you should be alert for any information indicating he has misappropriated Klan funds or otherwise taken advantage of his Klan association. Set out appropriate leads to have Shelton's Air Force Service Record reviewed for data of possible counterintelligence value.

The "Birmingham News" edition of 4/30/60 carried an article entitled, "Shelton Ousted from Klan Post." This article quoted one E.L. Edwards, a Klansman at Atlanta, Georgia, as stating to reporters that Shelton was replaced as Grand Dragon and agent of the Klan in Alabama "for conduct unbecoming a Klansman and attempting to use the organization for selfish purposes." Advise the Bureau of full details concerning this episode.

The Ku Klux Klan has attempted to depict desegregation efforts as a communist inspired plot. Similarly, the Communist Party, USA, endeavors to propagandize the

activities of the Klan as symbolic of the alleged Fascist climate in the United States. In fact, the agitational activities of both the Klan and the Communist Party benefit from the activities of their opposite group. The Bureau is considering a long-range program with the objective of embarrassing both groups by implying through a variety of deceptive techniques the dependence upon and the possible sympathy of one group for the other. For example, we could enter subscriptions to communist publications in the name of Robert Marvin Shelton or we could circulate documents implying he is in sympathy with or actually working to benefit the communist cause. In a similar manner, it might be feasible to associate Northern communist leaders with the activities or interests of the Klan. Your comments and suggestions in this regard will be appreciated.

Afford this matter your prompt attention.

NOTE:

Shelton, [REDACTED], married, 2 children, resides at [REDACTED] Tuscaloosa, Alabama, and is reported to be employed by the UKA with offices at Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa. He served in the United States Air Force from 6/48 to 9/51 and received an honorable discharge. He was married [REDACTED]. As of 12/63 he drove a 1963 white Grand Prix Pontiac. His sources of income have not been fully explored. [REDACTED]

b7c [REDACTED] As he is symbolic of the Klan, and is self-appointed spokesman, we intend to afford him continuing counterintelligence attention.

[redacted] was a member of Eastview Klavern #13, United Klans of America, Incorporated, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA-KKKK) for 12 years and most recently was considered a leader of Eastview Klavern #13. However, in approximately August of this year, he was expelled from the UKA-KKKK for "conduct unbecoming a Klansman." His circle of acquaintances are all members of the Klan or United Americans for Conservative Government (UACG) and are ardent segregationists. [redacted] claims he desires to achieve segregation by peaceful means, but is known to carry a .28 caliber pistol and offered to shoot [redacted] when he was scheduled to visit Birmingham in 1962.

[redacted] has also been a member of the UKA-KKKK as well as a member of the UACG. However, he was expelled from the UKA-KKKK with [redacted] for "conduct unbecoming a Klansman."

You are requested to review your files and make any discreet inquiries to determine the backgrounds of [redacted] and [redacted] with emphasis upon the facts concerning their expulsion from the UKA-KKKK that may be capitalized upon to discredit and disrupt organized Klan activities. Thereafter, submit your recommendations for specific counterintelligence action.

The Klan-type and hate organizations operating in Birmingham territory and which are potential objects of a counterintelligence program are the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan and the National States Rights Party.

[REDACTED] Klan activity in Mississippi and felt the story could not have been prepared without FBI cooperation. He was impressed with this and has indicated a strong interest in similar material for the [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] He promised to protect the Bureau's interest in any such endeavor. He is a well known civic leader in Birmingham. A review of the files in the Birmingham Office is being made for suitable information in this connection.

Bureau instructed in referenced letter that specific mention be made of "Action Groups" in Klan organizations. At the present time the weekly meetings of Eastview Klavern No. 13, which has been the leading Klavern in United Klans of America, Inc., in this territory, have been poorly attended. b7c [REDACTED] Efforts are being made to secure information suitable for disruption purposes in connection with this group.

Investigation is being conducted concerning ROBERT MARVIN SHELTON. The Atlanta Office has been requested to ascertain why E. L. EDWARDS, now deceased, ousted SHELTON from his then position of Grand Dragon of the U. S. Klans. A copy of the article appearing in the "Birmingham News" for April 30, 1960, entitled "SHELTON ousted from Klan Post," has been obtained. The article did not disclose the exact nature of the charges against SHELTON. Records of the Alabama Secretary of State reflect that SHELTON was dropped as the Klan's authorized agent and was replaced by Rev. ALVIN HORN of Talladega, Alabama. E. L. EDWARDS, Imperial Wizard, U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, was quoted as saying "We had to have a grand dragon in Alabama and we didn't have one in ROBERT M. SHELTON." He told reporters that SHELTON was replaced as grand dragon and agent of the "Klan" in Alabama "for conduct unbecoming a Klansman and attempting to use the organization for selfish purposes." The article said EDWARDS did not elaborate on what is considered conduct unbecoming a Klansman.

Informants are being contacted for any information of a derogatory nature concerning SHELTON. Discreet inquiries are being made in Tuscaloosa concerning his financial status. In view of recent information from the Bureau no request is being made for a mail cover on Shelton or the United Klans.

As the Bureau is aware, some few months ago several individuals, who had been active officials and/or dedicated members of the National States Rights Party (NSRP), left the NSRP. They are trying to form and make a going party of the American States Rights Party (ASRP) with its headquarters in Birmingham.

Since the group pulled out of the NSRP, both the ASRP and NSRP leaders have been belittling, berating and making extremely derogatory remarks concerning each other. Both groups are using the same mailing list, (the NSRP's list), which the ASRP group obtained before pulling out of the NSRP, and they disseminate their derogatory remarks in the literature they distribute.

The Bureau has also been advised that GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL, American Nazi Party (ANP) leader has recently filed a \$550,000.00 libel suit in the U. S. District Court, Birmingham, Alabama, against Dr. EDWARD R. FIELDS, Information Director of the NSRP, and others connected with the NSRP.

Birmingham contemplates furnishing certain items, on a confidential basis to a few trusted, reliable newsmen (established SAC contacts), concerning the NSRP, the ASRP and the ANP for the purpose of possibly causing further disruption of any unified actions or working arrangements between these groups. Such newsmen may be used to contact the leaders of one group to inquire about or confirm something of a derogatory nature reportedly made by some leader of one of the other groups.

Birmingham also contemplates working closely with other law enforcement agencies to see that any activity of such groups are known, covered and where considered desirable, the group will be made cognizant that their activity is known.

Birmingham also is considering having some racial informants drop remarks to or for the benefit of the leaders of the NSRP, etc., that will tend to cause the leaders of one group to retaliate in like manner against the other groups.

If the Bureau has any material on disruptive tactics or results of efforts, which is not already in all field offices, Birmingham would be glad to receive it.

The Bureau desires you afford counterintelligence attention to capitalize upon the bickering between leaders of the National States Rights Party (NSRP) and the American States Rights Party (ASRP) which recently split from the former organization. Consider such disruptive techniques as anonymous telephone calls, circulation of anonymous letters and documents, furnishing information to cooperative news media sources, etc. Insure you obtain Bureau authority before initiating any counterintelligence action.

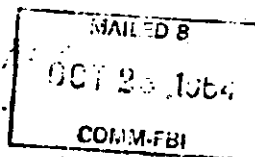

relating to the American Nazi Party (ANP), the NSRP and the ASRP, you must obtain Bureau authority. Requests for this type of action must contain assurances the individual to be furnished data will not reveal the Bureau's interest or betray the Bureau's confidence. Also it will be necessary for you to furnish to the Bureau a detailed summary of the information you desire to furnish to news media sources.

Keep the Bureau advised of all pertinent information relating to the \$550,000 libel suit filed in the United States District Court, Birmingham, by ANP leader George Lincoln Rockwell against Dr. Edward R. Fields, Information Director, NSRP, and others connected with the NSRP. It would appear this dispute between the leaders of two hate organizations will afford unique counterintelligence opportunities.

Racial informants have advised recently that [REDACTED] UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC. (UKA), was overheard to speak out against ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard of UKA at the Alabama State Fair. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] has never been known to criticize SHELTON and has always been quick to come to SHELTON's defense. In the past there has been some discontent about SHELTON's alleged inactivity and reluctance to do anything. [REDACTED] there is some jealousy toward SHELTON on the part of [REDACTED]

Bureau authority is requested to prepare an anonymous communication to SHELTON exploiting this situation.

A suggested letter is as follows:

"Birmingham, Alabama

"Dear Klansman Shelton:

"I am not in a position to become involved between Klansmen, but I hate to see anyone knifed in the back. You may think [REDACTED] is your friend, but he is far from it. He is out to get you if he can. He wants your job, that's what's eating on him.

and also the fact that Klan attendance in Alabama had fallen off almost 50 percent. Another factor in SHELTON's removal was that he had allegedly given [REDACTED] the run-around in a report on Klan conditions in Alabama. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated that ROBERT SHELTON had promised to get things straightened out in Alabama but that he had not kept his promise and had not kept the Imperial Wizard informed of events occurring within the Klan in Alabama. At that time [REDACTED] stated that if SHELTON did not get the Alabama Klan straightened out soon, he [REDACTED] was going to make a press release to the effect that all charters of U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, in Alabama would be cancelled and that SHELTON would be banished from the Klan and removed as Grand Dragon. Atlanta further advised that their files do not reflect any particular weakness or misconduct on the part of SHELTON which caused him to be released in addition to the information set out above.

[REDACTED] SHELTON is a man of good moral character who does not use intoxicating beverages in any way and engages in no criminal activity as far as [REDACTED] knows. [REDACTED] had never heard anything derogatory along this line concerning SHELTON.

The St. Louis Office was asked on 10-7-64 to review SHELTON's record in the United States Air Force with particular reference to any derogatory information which might appear therein. St. Louis has not furnished this information as yet. It is noted that a photostat of SHELTON's Army discharge on file in the Probate Office at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, reflects that he received an honorable discharge on July 19, 1951, and also that he received a medal for the Berlin Airlift Service and the good conduct medal.

[REDACTED] ROBERT M. SHELTON does not drink and he does not spend a great deal of time on recreation. [REDACTED] stated he spends most of his

time, in fact, practically all of his time in connection with his work with the UKA, INC., KKKK. [REDACTED] this is a full-time job for SHELTON and he travels a great deal in connection with his position as Imperial Wizard of this group.

[REDACTED] he has been known to "stretch the truth" [REDACTED] that is not completely truthful or reliable. [REDACTED] although the members are aware of this side of SHELTON's personality, he continues to maintain his position as the Imperial Wizard of this organization. [REDACTED] SHELTON, although he travels a great deal, generally returns to his home the same night.

Further discreet inquiries will be made concerning SHELTON's personal activities, etc. Particular emphasis will be placed upon attempting to secure information that SHELTON could be stealing money from the UKA and misappropriating it or that SHELTON's character is not good and that he is not a moral man.

Klavern #13 and has apparently been reinstated in the Klavern. [redacted] was expelled for "conduct unbecoming a Klansman" is trying to rejoin Klavern #13, but several of the Klavern members are opposing this. Further investigation is being conducted concerning [redacted] to secure information of counterintelligence value.

In contacts with ROBERT SHELTON in the past, he has mentioned that he receives copies of Communist publications. It is not specifically known that he is on the mailing list of these publications. It is also noted that the UKA publicly states it is fighting Communism. The Bureau is requested to give consideration to subscribing to "The Worker" in the name of ROBERT M. SHELTON and have it mailed to Headquarters of the UKA in the Alson Building at Tuscaloosa.

The Bureau does not believe the entering of a subscription to "The Worker" in the name of Robert Shelton, to be mailed to him at the offices of the United Klans of America, in itself would tend to compromise or embarrass Shelton. It is believed this action if combined with other counterintelligence techniques could implicate Shelton as being in sympathy with the communists. Before authorizing a subscription in the name of Shelton, the Bureau desires you develop a plan whereby Shelton may be progressively associated with or identified as in sympathy with the communists.

Continue to afford attention to possible counterintelligence action calculated to discredit or neutralize Shelton.

We have been considering a variety of approaches calculated to neutralize Shelton's activities. The Bureau is requested to consider securing copies of income tax returns for the UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC., KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN; ROBERT MARVIN SHELTON, 1708 - 15th Street, East, Tuscaloosa, Ala., or the ALABAMA RESCUE SERVICE, a name by which the UKA is sometimes known.

b7D [REDACTED] informants have advised that SHELTON is paid probably \$8,000 per year for his work as Imperial Wizard. This money is sent in monthly to UKA headquarters in Tuscaloosa by the individual Klaverns and presumably put in some bank.

An examination of pertinent income tax returns might furnish information concerning the financial standing of SHELTON and UKA which could be used in this program.

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Robert Marvin Shelton is a full-time paid employee of the United Klans of America, Incorporated (UKA), Knights of the Ku Klux Klan with the title Imperial Wizard. He is probably the most influential and well-known Klansman in the United States. We are endeavoring as a counterintelligence technique to develop information discrediting Shelton or embarrassing to the UKA.

Through analysis of the income tax returns we may be able to determine secret sources of Shelton's income or depository used by him for the Klan organization. There is a possibility that he is misappropriating funds. We also have information Shelton has been on the payroll of a Mobile, Alabama, engineering firm as a public relations man.

In the event we determine such information we will consider exposing Shelton within the Klan organization, publicly or by furnishing information to the Internal Revenue Service.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Liaison Section obtain from the Internal Revenue Service two uncertified copies each of the Federal tax returns filed by Shelton and the UKA for the past five years. Attached is a memorandum for the use of the Liaison Section.

Files are being reviewed for information to incorporate into an article which would tend to disrupt the UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC., KKKK, and which would be of such nature that a newspaper would be willing to publish it.

Investigation is being conducted in order to secure information concerning ROBERT M. SHELTON which could be used in a disruptive fashion.

Bureau has been requested to secure copies of income tax returns of ROBERT M. SHELTON or the UKA, KKKK, for use in this program.

Bureau approval is being sought to send out anonymously copies of a cartoon which indicates that the FBI has infiltrated the various Klan groups.

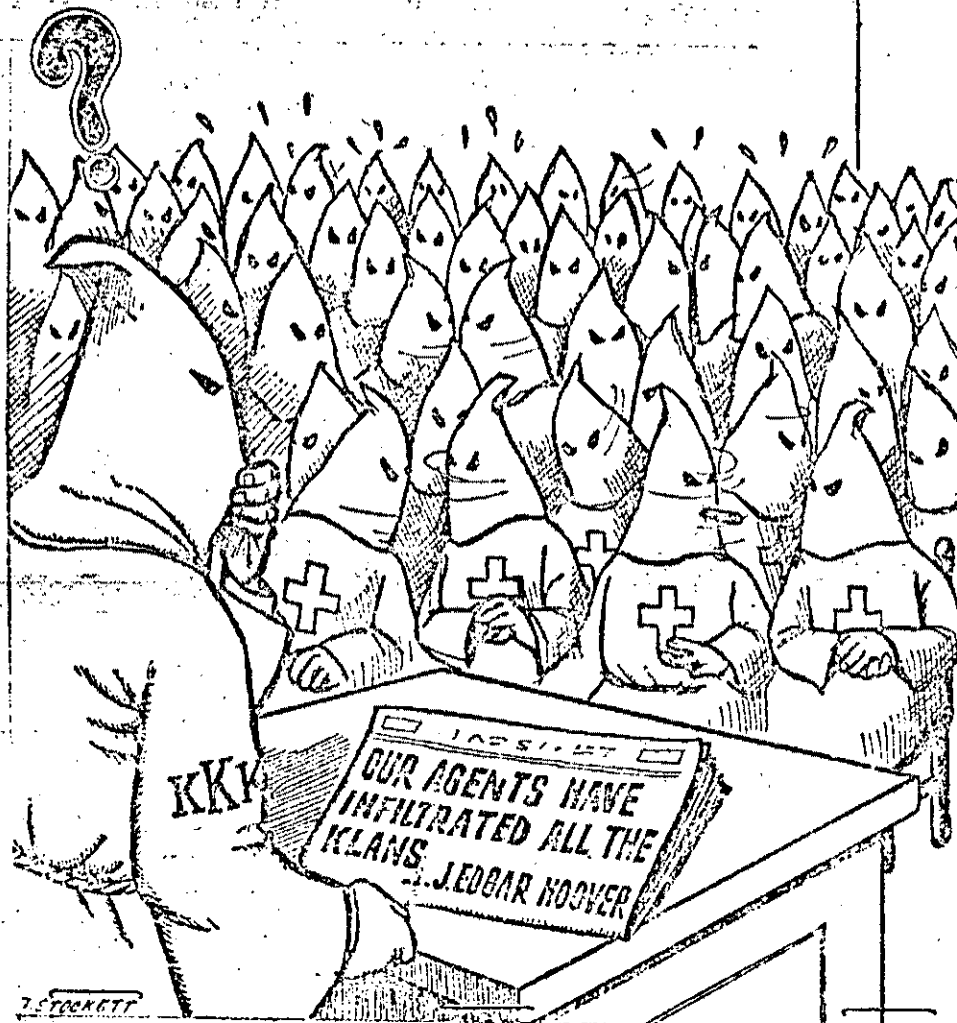

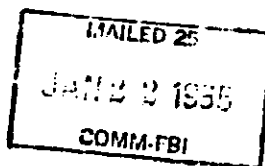

We cannot live with our guilt if we did not let the wonderful people who have supported the NSRP and Dr. Fields know the true story behind the April 28, split in the ranks of the NSRP. To date five top national party leaders have resigned from the NSRP as well as eight state leaders which comprise the only active units in the NSRP. Today the NSRP is steadily crumbling under the weight of the truth. The reason for this is the draining of party funds by Dr. Fields for his personal interests. These funds are sent in by the average White American, the dollars represent sacrifice and dedication from the persons who send them. Yet they are not all used for party activities. Recently Dr. Fields sent out a family portrait of himself, his beautiful and devoted wife Dolores, and their two sons, Allan and Keith. The purpose of the photograph was to build the family-man image of himself with the people of the NSRP. The picture he failed to send out was a picture of himself, his other wife, Mildred and their daughter Marty. DR. FIELDS HAS TWO FAMILIES. Mildred Fields is the mysterious woman who disappeared from Louisville, Kentucky when Dr. Fields and the NSRP was based in Louisville. She disappeared when rumor circulated that she was pregnant with Fields' child. Little is known of Mildred Fields except that she is a slender, dark-haired, mild mannered, rather attractive woman. While she

and Fields romped together in Louisville, Dolores Fields gave birth to Dr. Fields' first child, Allan. Later Fields fled the gossip of Louisville to the haven of Birmingham. As Ruth in the Bible, Mildred followed Dr. Fields to Birmingham where she obtained a job as a registered nurse in the West End Baptist Hospital in Birmingham. This is the same profession she maintained in Louisville, Ky. She rented a duplex apartment at 1334 Princeton Ave.; about a mile from Dr. Fields and Dolores' home on Mims St.

By this time Mildred had already had a child whom she called Marty. By Mildred Fields' own admission the child is that of Dr. Edward R. Fields. Dr. Fields, we know helped pay support of Marty. Later Dr. Fields' first family was expecting an addition. Dolores was pregnant again. While Dolores Fields was in the hospital bearing Dr. Fields his second son, Dr. Fields was out on the town with Mily, as he preferred to call her. For Christmas of 1963 Dr. Fields bought Mildred Fields a Television Set with a party check with party funds. The purchase was made at National Discount Sales Co. of Birmingham. The record of the purchase is filed with the Clerk of the U.S. House of Representatives in Washington, D.C. Dr. Fields paid \$25.00 for a doll for Marty. The T.V. was later taken to NSRP H.Q. on Bessemer Rd. when the FBI threatened to investigate the NSRP books. In exchange for the new Television, Dr. Fields gave Mildred a used

T.V. which belonged to James K. Warner, then associated editor of the Thunderbolt. Dr. Fields paid Mr. Warner \$40 for the used set he gave Mildred in exchange for the new one. In March of 1964, Mildred Fields left West End Baptist Hospital and Birmingham for Mobile, Alabama where she is employed as a registered nurse at the Mobile Infirmary. She left Birmingham in the white, 1959 Ford which once belonged to Dr. Edward R. Fields and is reproduced on this page. Also reproduced on this page is the telephone listing for Mildred Fields taken from the Birmingham Telephone Directory, page 139. Dolores Fields is a good, clean, midwestern woman and we mean her no harm by this expose of Dr. Fields. Dolores knows and disapproves of Mildred Fields, known to her as Mildred Hinson, but we are sure that she does not even suspect that Mildred followed her happy family from Louisville or that Mildred claims that Dr. Fields is also married to her. We deeply regret the hardships which the publication of this article will bring to the innocent victims of this sordid affair. But with a burdened heart and a concern for the good of the cause we deemed it our duty to print the truth.

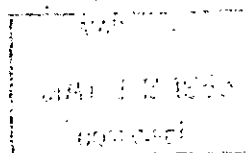

Imperial Wizard of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA), and the sources of all income of the UKA itself. Copies of the income tax returns of ROBERT M. SHELTON and returns filed by him as a corporate officer of the UKA are being used in the above mentioned investigation. These copies were furnished the Birmingham Office by the Bureau, under date of February 23, 1965.

By letter dated March 5, 1965, the Bureau authorized the mailing of anonymous letters by the Birmingham Office in an effort to expose the fact that CARL RIDEOUT

Birmingham, Alabama, was a member of the National Executive Committee of the National States Rights Party (NSRP).

On March 12, 1965, fifteen of these anonymous letters were mailed to fifteen Negro churches and/or anti-segregation groups in Birmingham.

By letter dated March 24, 1965, Bureau authority was requested for the Birmingham Office to be allowed to mail Xerox copies of an article published by the American States Rights Party (ASRP), in its March, 1965, issue of its monthly newspaper, "The White American," to various persons and organizations, in an effort to disrupt the NSRP. The article concerned Dr. EDWARD R. FIELDS, Director of the NSRP, and reportedly gave an account of certain extramarital activities of FIELDS, including the naming of a person described as the second wife of Dr. FIELDS.

By letter dated March 25, 1965, a Xerox copy of a cartoon satirizing the Klan and hate groups was furnished the Bureau for its consideration in regard to the preparing of an original cartoon satirizing the Klan and such other hate-type organizations.

3. Tangible Results

Bureau authority was granted, under date of January 21, 1965, for the Birmingham Office to send out anonymous letters concerning CARL RIDEOUT, and fifteen of such anonymous letters were mailed by the Birmingham Office on January 27, 1965.

Referenced letter enclosed five numbered Xerox copies of rough sketched cartoons.

Birmingham has reviewed the above-mentioned cartoons as directed. It is felt that one of the main purposes for the use of such cartoons would be to disrupt and/or harass the various Klan or hate groups. It is now felt that in view of the recent charges of President JOHNSON made on National television and also the many charges leveled against the Klan and other hate groups by local press, they are now or have been harassed almost to the breaking point. It is felt that any further steps, such as the mailing out of the above-mentioned cartoons, at the present time might force them into desperate acts of violence.

In view of the above, it is not felt by Birmingham that an anonymous mailing of any of these cartoons could be in the best interest of the Bureau at this time and that such a mailing would probably even have a very adverse effect upon the success of the Informant Development Program of the Birmingham Office.

Birmingham feels that there will probably be an appropriate time for an anonymous mailing of such cartoons and for that reason Birmingham would like for the Bureau to prepare and furnish the Birmingham Office with twenty-five copies of

SP-1et 4/29/65 advised the Bureau leads have been set out for Memphis and Mobile to conduct investigation relating to income received by Robert H. Shelton, Imperial Wizard, United Klans of America, Inc., as was indicated on his income tax returns that were confidentially furnished to the Bureau by the Internal Revenue Service.

Inasmuch as Shelton's income tax returns were received on an extremely confidential basis, the Bureau does not desire that any inquiries be made of individuals or firms who were indicated by Shelton as employers or sources of income. Such inquiries very likely could reveal that the Bureau has access to copies of Shelton's income tax returns especially if the sources of income were only listed on the returns by Shelton to conceal true income received by him from the Klan.

Birmingham, Memphis and Mobile should expeditiously furnish the Bureau names, addresses and any background information appearing in their respective files relating to the sources of income listed by Shelton on his income tax returns.

Birmingham should make no further attempt at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, to review the personal bank account of Shelton or the account in the name of the Alabama Revenue Service,

the title probably being used by the United Klans of America. The Bureau does not desire, at this time, to issue a subpoena duces tecum to the First National Bank of Tuscaloosa, Alabama, to produce for examination these records.

Upon receipt from Birmingham, Memphis and Mobile of the complete identities of individuals and firms reported by Shelton as sources of income, the Bureau will make further inquiries of the Internal Revenue Service at the Seat of Government to determine if tax records of these individuals and firms substantiate Shelton's claimed employments.

NOTE:

Shelton is reported by our informants to be employed full time by the United Klans of America, Inc. His income tax returns and the returns of the United Klans of America do not indicate he has received, or has been paid any funds by the Klan. It is probable he is using a number of firms and individuals listed on his returns as employers, to conceal his Klan salary. We are not making direct inquiries with his alleged employers because of the possibility they will alert Shelton and thereby reveal that we have access to his tax returns.

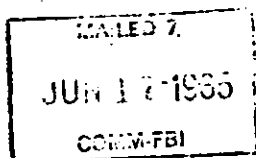

On 6/22/65 [REDACTED] who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that single copies of "The Fiery Cross" could be ordered. The orders for copies or subscriptions should be addressed to United Klans of America, Inc., 401 Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. The price for a one-year subscription to "The Fiery Cross" is \$3.00. [REDACTED] stated he did not know of any instance in which a subscription for a three-month or six-month period had been requested or obtained and did not know the specific price for a single issue of the Klan paper.

620 [REDACTED] stated he did not know of any particular language which should be used in requesting copies of the Klan paper so long as the terminology was that of "a patriot" who was interested in the cause of segregation. [REDACTED] also stated that on occasion copies of the Klan paper had been stapled at the time they were mailed and on other occasions the papers had been sent as third-class mail in a wrapper. [REDACTED] stated it was his understanding that the Klan had its own printing press in Tuscaloosa or in the Tuscaloosa, Alabama, area and that when the paper is published and mailed, it is mailed from Tuscaloosa and/or Holt, Alabama, which is adjacent to Tuscaloosa.

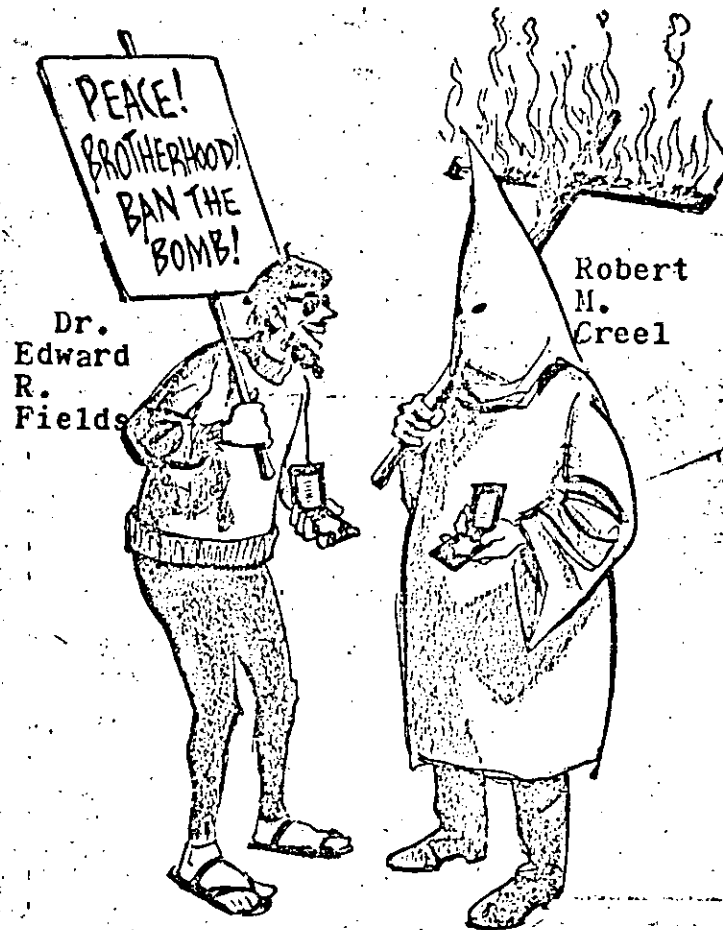

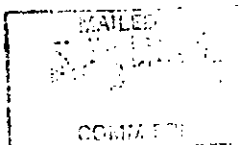
The cartoons should be prepared on inexpensive commercially purchased stationery. Take the usual precautions to insure that the mailings cannot be traced to the FBI. Advise the Bureau of any tangible results.

NOTE:

The original cartoon depicts two individuals, one dressed as a beatnik carrying a sign which reads "Peace! Botherhood! Ban the Bomb." the other dressed in Klan hood and robe carrying a fiery cross, unexpectedly meeting each other and one exclaiming to the other as they exhibit their credentials "Well, I'll Be Damned! I'm With the FBI Myself!" The Birmingham Office has suggested utilizing the cartoon as a disruptive counterintelligence technique by typing the names of the individuals (Fields and Creel) beside the respective figures. It is felt we can add to the impact by also showing their titles. This is a good technique as it shows that the FBI has infiltrated both organizations, each of which already has shown considerable animosity toward the other.

The following is a status letter covering the previous three months' period:

1. Potential Counterintelligence Action

This office is presently considering the distribution of Bureau-approved cartoons satirizing the Klan and hate groups. The anonymous mailing of copies of the newspaper of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA), to certain selected persons, is being considered. The sending of "change of address" cards regarding Klan and/or other hate type subscriptions is also being considered. The anonymous mailing of various documents, leaflets, as well as the making of anonymous telephone calls, etc., to these groups is being studied at this time.

2. Pending Counterintelligence Action

By letter dated May 25, 1965, a Xerox copy of a cartoon satirizing the Klan and hate-type groups was furnished the Bureau for its consideration in regard to the preparing of an original cartoon satirizing

the Klan and also other hate-type organizations.

By letter dated 4-15-65, the Bureau made available to the Birmingham Office five cartoons for consideration under this program. Birmingham selected two of these cartoons and requested 25 copies of each cartoon. Under date of 5-11-65, the Bureau furnished the Birmingham Office with 25 copies of each of the two cartoons which are now being held for possible future anonymous mailing at an appropriate time.

Birmingham is still attempting to obtain information regarding sources of income, actions of misconduct, immorality, etc., of ROBERT M. SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, UKA, and similar data regarding other officials of hate-type organizations, as well as the sources of income of these hate-type organizations.

In accordance with instruction set out in Bureau letter of 5-13-65, Birmingham mailed out Xerox copies of an article entitled "With Deep Regret", which concerns Dr. EDWARD R. FIELDS, Director of the National States Rights Party (NSRP) and which appeared in the March, 1965 edition of "The White American", the American States Rights Party (ASRP) publications. Copies of this article were mailed to 18 individuals whom it was believed would be most directly affected by or concerned with the information contained in the article.

In accordance with the instructions set out in Bureau letter of 6-24-65, Birmingham mailed a Xerox copy of a cartoon lampooning Dr. EDWARD R. FIELDS, above described, and ROBERT M. CREEL, Grand Dragon of Alabama, UKA. These copies of the cartoon were mailed to 19 individuals believed to be most interested in this situation and most likely to be in a position to take action which would disrupt any cooperation between NSRP and the UKA.

By letter dated 6-30-65, the Birmingham Office requested Bureau authority to send out Xerox copies of

an undated and unsigned three-paragraph letter. This letter stated that DR. EDWARD R. FIELDS was a Catholic and it also pointed out that the leaders of the UKA reportedly stated that all Catholics owe their allegiance to the "Pope", and for that reason a Catholic would not be taken into the UKA. Bureau authority was requested to send this anonymous letter to various UKA leaders as a disruptive tactic, in order to prevent any cooperation or joint activity between the UKA and the NSRP leaders.

3. Tangible Results

Referenced letter set forth information concerning apparent results of anonymous letters sent out regarding CARL RIDOUT, JR., National Treasurer, NSRP.

This is to advise that CARL RIDOUT, JR., reportedly remains at the NSRP National Headquarters in Birmingham, Alabama, during the regular daylight hours from Monday through Friday and apparently has no outside employment. It is believed that the disruptive tactics taken concerning RIDOUT, as above mentioned, resulted in his being transferred from one job to another and then being "fired" as previously pointed out to the Bureau. It is also believed that his employment at the NSRP Headquarters probably is due to the fact that he was unable to obtain other suitable employment and/or the NSRP had been unable to recruit or obtain office help necessary to carry on their regular office functions at NSRP headquarters in Birmingham.

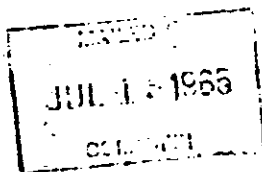

Birmingham Agent suggesting the possibility of such an anonymous letter is a practicing Catholic. The Agent to whom captioned case is assigned is a Methodist by profession. These two Agents are of the opinion that the mere fact that the Klansmen think there is a possibility that FIELDS is a Catholic would bring about the desired results. It is also to be noted that the Klan reportedly does not allow Klan membership of any person of the Catholic faith. It is also believed that the mere thought or rumor that FIELDS is a Catholic or comes from a Catholic family would serve in this situation as a disruptive force.

Referenced Bureau airtel also suggests that a more sophisticated technique would have greater potential value as a disruptive measure regarding FIELDS. It is further pointed out that almost no members of the NSRP or the UKA could be termed "sophisticated" and it is believed that such a blunt approach, as mentioned in the above situation and as expressed in referenced Birmingham airtel, might be on a sufficiently low level to bring about the desired results.

It is apparent from reBHairtel 7/22/65 that insofar as the use of the term "more sophisticated technique" in reBuairtel is concerned, you have completely missed the point. The Bureau is well aware that almost none of the members of the National States Rights Party or the United Klans of America could be considered "sophisticated."

What the Bureau had in mind when your original request was denied and the use of a more sophisticated technique was suggested, which would have greater potential value as a disruptive measure regarding Fields, was something which would give an added impact to the anonymous letter. In this regard, you are requested to advise whether you have considered the possibility of superimposing a photograph of Fields on a photograph of some local Catholic Church, in order to show him leaving such a church.

If such a composite photograph was prepared and added to an anonymous letter, the results would be much more disastrous and disruptive, as it would lend authenticity to the allegation in the anonymous letter.

It was suggested to Birmingham that they should give further consideration in an effort to develop a more sophisticated technique which would have greater potential value as a disruptive measure regarding Fields, such as producing specific information which would show that Fields is actually a practicing Catholic (attending church, etc.). Birmingham by airtel 7/22/65 requested the Bureau to reconsider its denial of their request. It stated in effect that the reason for this second request was that two Agents in the Birmingham Office, one a Catholic and the other a Methodist, felt that the letter as originally submitted would suffice.

Racial Informants have advised in April, 1965, that a meeting of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA), was held in Bessemer, Alabama, and this was a state meeting. One Birmingham informant advised that [REDACTED] one of the three defendants to be tried on the murder charge in Hayneville, Alabama, was present at this meeting. It was announced that [REDACTED] had received a letter addressed to him at Bessemer, Alabama (USA?), from Chicago, Illinois, and this letter was signed "Mafia." There was a black glove cut out of construction paper, with the words "Mafia," and "Vendetta," on it. Reportedly, this letter stated that all the Klan was marked for death, and if anything happened to the Negro boy who was riding with Mrs. LIUZZO when she was shot, then the Mafia would cut up [REDACTED] family, piece by piece, before killing them. Reportedly, the letter had been postmarked at Chicago, Illinois. It was also reported by Birmingham informants that the receipt of the above described letter by [REDACTED] not only placed him in a state of fear and great concern, concerning the situation, but caused quite a number of the other Klansmen to be similarly concerned and in somewhat of a fearful state of mind.

Bureau authority is requested to prepare an anonymous communication to [REDACTED] and other known Klansmen and/or officials of the UKA, in an attempt to exploit this situation. The Bureau is herewith requested to give consideration to preparing an original cartoon or drawing setting out a black glove with the wording "Mafia" and "Vendetta," appropriately arranged in or on the drawing of the black glove. Either above the drawing and lettering, as just mentioned, a letter could be set out to indicate that the letter had been prepared and sent from some city, such as Detroit, Michigan.

The following data is set forth for the information of the Bureau in answer to Bulets dated 9/3/65.

In accordance with instructions set out in Bulet of 5/13/65, Xerox copies of the article entitled "With Deep Regret" were mailed to 18 individuals in May, 1965. The exact results of the above mentioned mailing is not known; however, during July, 1965, Dr. EDWARD R. FIELDS, Director of the NATIONAL STATES RIGHTS PARTY (NSRP), moved his residence away from Birmingham, Ala. FIELDS moved to [REDACTED] and moved the NSRP Headquarters from Birmingham to the Marion Building, Augusta, Ga.

In regard to Buairtel of 7/28/65, Birmingham has considered the possibility of superimposing a photograph of FIELDS on a photograph of some local Catholic Church in order to show him leaving such a church.

Birmingham is continuing to give consideration to such a photograph of FIELDS, but a request is not being made for such authority since it is believed that such action could result in possible damage to the church involved.

Birmingham will continue to devote time to the above possibilities and other means of taking advantage of various disruptive tactics concerning all Hate Groups.

The following is a status letter covering the previous threemonths period:

(1) Potential Counterintelligence Action

At the present time the Birmingham office is giving consideration to the anonymous mailing of copies of the newspaper of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA) to certain selected Klan members. The papers, if sent, would be mailed in such a manner that any person handling the mail could recognize the paper as a Klan paper, and of course, could see to whom the paper was to be delivered. The sending of "Change of Address" cards regarding Klan and/or other hate-type subscriptions is also being considered at the present time. Birmingham is considering the making of anonymous telephone calls to certain selected Klan officials and/or members and also officials and members of other hate-type organizations. The anonymous mailing of various leaflets, cartoons, and documents is being considered. Birmingham is presently making preparations concerning the distribution of Bureau-approved cartoons satirizing the Klan

to twenty UKA leaders and/or members, hate group members and/or leaders and/or other individuals in a position to be concerned with same. This cartoon was the one furnished by the Bureau, and on the bottom of this cartoon was the wording "FBI Infiltrates Klan."

Birmingham is now making preparations to send out the copies of the other cartoon furnished by the Bureau at the same time the above-mentioned cartoon copies were furnished to the Birmingham office.

(3) Tangible Results

In accordance with instructions set out in Bulet of May 13, 1965, Birmingham mailed out Xerox copies of an article entitled, "With Deep Regret," which concerned Dr. EDWARD R. FIELDS, Director of the National States Rights Party (NSRP). In accordance with the instructions set out in Bulet of June 24, 1965, Birmingham mailed a Xerox copy of a cartoon lampooning Dr. EDWARD R. FIELDS, above-described, and ROBERT M. CREEL, Grand Dragon of Alabama, UKA. The exact results of the above-mentioned mailings, as described in the two preceding paragraphs, is not known, however, during July of 1965, Dr. EDWARD R. FIELDS, Director of the NSRP, moved his residence away from Birmingham, Alabama. FIELDS also moved the NSRP Headquarters from Birmingham, Alabama, to the Marion Building, Augusta, Georgia.

It is also to be noted that ROBERT M. CREEL, above-described, has also moved from Bessemer, Alabama, to Linden, Alabama.

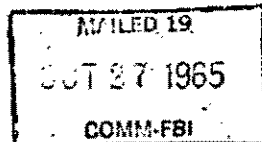

In regard to the third letter mentioned in Paragraph Three of Page Two of reBuairtel, Birmingham feels that such a letter should be sent. This letter should go to certain Klan officials and certain leaders of other "Hate Type" organizations. The letter from SHELTON could be worded to indicate that SHELTON was well aware of [REDACTED] connections with the Anti-Defamation League (ADL) as an informant, and that they (SHELTON and [REDACTED]) would have to be most careful to avoid having their scheme revealed. The letter could stress the fact that should [REDACTED] connections with the ADL be exposed, their goose that laid the golden egg would be killed and they would have to go back to working for a living.

Consideration is also being given to the anonymous mailing of various cartoons, leaflets, and documents which may have a disruptive effect upon the recipients of such mailings. The sending of "Change of Address" cards regarding Klan and/or other hate-type subscriptions to selected individuals is also being given consideration at the present time. Birmingham is still in possession of some copies of Bureau-approved cartoons satirizing the Klan, and is making preparations to anonymously mail these cartoons to certain selected officials of the Klan.

(2) Pending Counterintelligence Action

In accordance with Bureau instructions set forth in Bureau letter dated 7/26/65, during present reporting period, Birmingham mailed Xerox copies of the Bureau-approved cartoon mentioned in referenced Birmingham airtel, in Paragraph 2 of Page 2. This set of cartoons was the set which was furnished by the Bureau at the same time as the set of cartoons on which was set forth the wording, "FBI Infiltrates Klan."

In accordance with Bureau instructions and Bureau authority set out in Bureau letter of 11/15/65, Birmingham anonymously mailed cartoons as approved by the Bureau to certain Klan members and/or officials, and other hate group members. At present, Birmingham still has some copies of Bureau-approved cartoons which the Birmingham Office intends to mail out to certain selected individuals in the near future.

At the present time, Birmingham is in the process of collecting known handwriting samples of ROBERT M. SHELTON, Imperial Wizard of the UKA, in accordance with Bureau instructions.

(3) Tangible Results

Referenced Birmingham letter, in the last paragraph of Page 2, pointed out that ROBERT M. CREEL, Grand Dragon of Alabama, UKA, had moved from Bessemer, Alabama, to Linden, Alabama. It is to be noted that subsequent to the submission of referenced communication, ROBERT M. CREEL made known to the UKA that although he intended to remain a member of the UKA, he was not interested in seeking re-election as Grand Dragon of Alabama of the UKA. It is also to be noted that an election was held, and CREEL was so re-elected as Grand Dragon of the UKA in Alabama.

It is of further interest to note that during the present reporting period, Dr. EDWARD M. TIELES, Director of the National States Rights Party (NSRP), which presently

has its National Headquarters in Augusta, Georgia, called a closed meeting or rally of certain NSRP officials, selected members, and sympathizers. This rally was held at the Thomas Jefferson Hotel in Birmingham, Alabama; however, according to Birmingham informants, the NSRP rally was almost a complete flop, and there was a total of approximately 30 persons in attendance at this rally, although quite a number had been invited to attend.

The Bureau is contemplating increasing its counter-intelligence efforts against Robert Shelton, Imperial Wizard, United Klans of America, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. In order to have necessary information, the Birmingham Office is requested to review its files for specific background data on Robert Shelton. Conduct any additional investigation necessary to round-out available data.

While it is realized that reports have been submitted on Shelton, a special summary of all pertinent background data, especially names of relatives and ancestors, is needed.

In addition, the Bureau desires a summary of information concerning Shelton's close associates, likes and dislikes, drinking habits, and social habits. Not only should specific factual information be obtained, but in addition, Birmingham should report information concerning gossip about Shelton in Klan circles. For example, include any information concerning Shelton's relationship with his wife, any other females or males, any unusual behavior patterns and general Klan talk concerning his use or misuse of Klan funds, what motivates him, etc.

The reason for this information is to begin the planning of a "Rockwell Report," put out by George Lincoln Rockwell of the American Nazi Party, "exposing" some information about Shelton which would tend to discredit him.

While it is not necessary that the information on Shelton should be accurate, the facts surrounding this information should be as accurate as possible.

For example, if Rockwell printed a report that Shelton has some Negro ancestors, it would be necessary for us to know the names of certain ancestors who could, perhaps, have been an illegitimate child related to Shelton.

As another example, if we were to show that Shelton had some abnormal sexual tendencies, it would be necessary to give specific information as to whether he was associated with any persons who would have these tendencies.

Richmond should begin the format of a Rockwell Report upon receipt of this background data from Birmingham.

Birmingham and Richmond are requested to submit any recommendations they may desire concerning this project.

NOTE:

We are requesting background and recommendations from Birmingham and Richmond to begin planning a counterintelligence measure aimed at Robert Shelton, Imperial Wizard, United Klans of America. This effort is in the initial stages and upon receipt of the information requested of Birmingham and Richmond, appropriate recommendations will be made as to what steps will be taken with regard to Shelton. At this time, this is merely in the planning stages.

SHELTON and his wife and children now reside at #18 Lake Sherwood Drive, Northport, Alabama. For several years, they resided at 1708 East 15th Street, Tuscaloosa, Alabama, with his parents. He has been a resident of Tuscaloosa, Alabama, area all of his life.

SHELTON does not drink intoxicating beverages and dislikes anyone who does. He is a chain cigarette smoker and usually smokes Pall Malls. He dislikes grits.

While in Washington, D. C., attending the HCUA hearings, he remained in his room at the Congressional Hotel most of the time.

SHELTON is known to have bragged that in early 1965 he had 38 television interviews. It is known that he has flown to various cities and places over a great section of the United States to speak at public rallies or other UKA functions and/or to appear on radio or television programs. It is also

known that in early 1960, he was driving a 1957 or 1958 white Cadillac. In August, 1960, he was driving a dark blue Cadillac. In 1962, he was driving a 1958 green Cadillac. In 1963, he was driving a 1963 white Grand Prix Pontiac. In 1964, he was driving a 1961 black Cadillac.

He reportedly wears a .38 caliber pistol and on occasion has carried a carbine rifle in a gun case in his car, and on some occasions has been reported as carrying as many as two guns in the trunk of his car.

In October of 1965, ROBERT M. CREEL, who was then the Grand Dragon, State of Alabama, UKA, stated that the various members and officers of the UKA were very disappointed that SHELTON had taken the Fifth Amendment and had placed himself like communists in that regard.

It is believed that SHELTON and his activities are the most vulnerable from the standpoint of his handling or mishandling of UKA funds and possibly the use of rumors or figures alleging income tax evasion. It is known that SHELTON has been employed during a great part of his adult life as a tire builder. In early 1959, he was employed as a tire builder at the B. F. Goodrich Plant at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, and resigned from this position in order to take the job as sales manager over all the B. F. Goodrich Stores throughout the State of Alabama. It was rumored that he obtained this position by promising certain officials of the B. F. Goodrich Company that he was in a position to obtain

the entire tire business of the State of Alabama, which was then worth about one million dollars a year, for four years. He, according to a newspaper article appearing in the 10/11/59 issue of the Birmingham News, obtained a 1.6 million dollar tire contract for the B. F. Goodrich Company from the State of Alabama. It was alleged in this article that this tire contract was a "political debt is paid at last by PATTERSON," and the article goes on to indicate that Alabama Governor JOHN M. PATTERSON was indebted to SHELTON for services rendered by SHELTON and the UKA to him in his race for Governor of the State of Alabama.

In November, 1959, SHELTON reportedly had been called into the Birmingham office of B. F. Goodrich Company during that month and had been advised that he was being fired due to a reduction in the sales force of the company. SHELTON reportedly remarked that the company at Birmingham was being compelled by a few "Negroes" and "Jews" to fire him.

The Birmingham News for 4/30/60 carried an article entitled "SHELTON Ousted from Klan Post." The article quoted E. L. EDWARDS, a Klansman from Atlanta, Georgia, as stating that SHELTON was released as Grand Dragon, an agent of the Klan in Alabama, "for conduct unbecoming a Klansman," and "attempting to use the organization for selfish purposes." Records of the Alabama Office of the Secretary of State reflect that SHELTON had been replaced by Rev. ALVIN HORN of Talladega. The article went on to state that a check had been made with Mr. EDWARDS, who was then the Imperial Wizard of the UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN, at Atlanta, and he had stated "We had to have a Grand Dragon in Alabama, and we did not have one in ROBERT M. SHELTON." EDWARDS did not elaborate on what he considered conduct unbecoming a Klansman, as above mentioned. It is to be noted that on numerous contacts with SHELTON, on more than one occasion he has mentioned that he receives copies of communist publications. It is possible that this information may be used to show him up in a bad light.

In 1960, unverified information was received concerning an \$8,000 gambling debt won by "a" ROBERT SHELTON in 1960.

In 1963, it was reported that SHELTON was endeavoring to secure a percentage from truckers hauling whiskey of

their margin of profit under the division of commission set-up in the State of Alabama from Governor-elect WALLACE, as he supposedly had received money in this fashion under Governor JOHN PATTERSON's administration.

In early 1964, SHELTON and [REDACTED] and another individual had formed the [REDACTED] in Alabama and were prospering from that business. This insurance company was supposed to have been incorporated at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, and various UKA members were acting as agents and selling insurance. It was stated that [REDACTED] a Birmingham attorney, was handling the legal affairs for this insurance company. In July, 1964, it was stated that the [REDACTED] had folded up after the Klan members had determined that [REDACTED]

It was also stated that some of the members of the UKA were upset with ROBERT SHELTON as SHELTON was not explaining what he did with the money which had been donated by some citizens of Tuscaloosa, Alabama, during the recent activity concerning the insurance company in Tuscaloosa. It was also stated by one of the UKA members that since ROBERT SHELTON's wife worked in his office and was in charge of the wives of the members of Tuscaloosa Klavern #5 of the UKA, it was difficult to determine what was going on in SHELTON's office at that time.

The Tuscaloosa News on page one of its 9/11/64 edition carried a caption "Road Probe Labeled Political by WALLACE." The article indicated that an investigation was being conducted into alleged "wrongdoing" found in the handling of engineering contracts in Federal-aid highway projects in Alabama. The article went on to state that a lengthy report had been prepared in regard to the situation, and the report identified ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard of the Ku Klux Klan, as an employee of one of the engineering concerns involved, namely, Dixie Engineering, Inc., of Mobile.

The Tuscaloosa News on page three of its 10/3/64 edition contained an article reflecting that ROBERT SHELTON had been awarded the sum of \$4,200 as a plaintiff in the civil

damage suit against Dixie Air, Inc., in a settlement verdict entered in the Circuit Court at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, recently. It was stated that this suit grew out of an airplane crash in South Carolina in August of 1963 in which [REDACTED] of Tuscaloosa, had been killed and ROBERT SHELTON and one other companion had been injured.



It is known that about September, 1965, SHELTON moved into his new brick home next door to [REDACTED] in the Lake Sherwood Development near Tuscaloosa, as mentioned above. It is also known that about that same time, SHELTON was observed to be in possession of a large roll of \$20 bills. It was also reported that in May of 1965, SHELTON in a discussion with other Klansmen at a hotel in Natchez, Mississippi, had claimed that he had lived on \$2,700 from the Klan as his salary during the past year. He then stated that that was all he got from the Klan. At about the same time, SHELTON is also supposed to have stated that in a two-week period after the murder of the white woman in the Selma, Alabama, march, \$5,000 had been received by the UKA and was used as retainer fees for the forthcoming trial. He also stated that now deceased Attorney [REDACTED] of Birmingham, who had been the UKA lawyer, had spent \$6,000 or \$7,000 of his own personal money in connection with the three Klansmen being tried for the murder of the white woman in the Selma march. In October, 1965, [REDACTED] Grand Dragon of the UKA in Ohio, commented that ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, UKA, received 50 cents each month from each UKA member.


In October, 1965, [REDACTED] reportedly had charge of the UKA Defense Fund and paid out lots of money to [REDACTED] Attorney for the UKA at that time. It was stated that [REDACTED] in the UKA Defense Fund on one day in September, 1965. It is to be noted that they, SHELTON and [REDACTED] also were living as next-door neighbors in new homes at about that time.

In October, 1965, the Bureau instructed the Birmingham Office to discreetly attempt to ascertain whether about \$600 had been paid by SHELTON by check to Lorch's Jewelry Store at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, possibly for jewelry or radio equipment.

During 1965, at one time it was stated within the UKA that ROBERT M. CREEL, then Grand Dragon, State of Alabama, UKA, was short \$1,000, and it was also stated that funds were coming into the UKA at the rate of about \$2,000 per week. It was also stated that on 12/24/65 checks in the amount of \$1,373 and cash in the amount of \$189 were received

by SHELTON as Imperial Wizard. It was also stated that on

b7c [REDACTED] it was further stated that the UKA in North Carolina had collected \$14,000 in two days to support the expense of Klansmen in the HCUA hearings being conducted in Washington, D. C.

As above mentioned, it is believed by the Birmingham Office that SHELTON's vulnerability will probably exist in the manner in which he has failed to account for misused funds coming into the UKA and/or his failure to report funds obtained by him and used by him personally as income.

One important area of potential action in the Birmingham Division continues to be the anonymous mailing of untraceable cards, leaflets, cartoons, etc., to known Klansmen. Birmingham still contemplates sending "Change of Address" cards to selected individuals in regard to their hate-type subscriptions. The proper use of anonymous telephone calls to selected hate-group leaders, and/or members, is still under consideration.

(2) Pending Counterintelligence Action

LYNCH was then operating a 1958 Cadillac without a current valid driver's license. LYNCH is a rabid segregationist and leader of the National States Rights Party (NSRP), and has on occasion spent considerable time in the Anniston, Alabama area.

[redacted] indicated that he was aware of LYNCH's past activity in racial matters in the Anniston area, and that LYNCH had been driving a Cadillac automobile bearing California license plates [redacted]. [redacted] advised he would alert the patrolmen of the [redacted] area to be alert for LYNCH's return and should he do so, he would be arrested for driving without a valid license.

Under date of 2-22-66, Birmingham furnished the Bureau a 9-page compilation of information concerning ROBERT M. SHELTON, Imperial Wizard of the UKA, which information was obtained from Birmingham informants and a review of Birmingham files. This information was furnished on specific Bureau instructions and included pertinent background data concerning SHELTON as well as rumors and other data indicating possible use or misuse of UKA funds by SHELTON and other questionable activity on his part.

During March 1966, Birmingham mailed copies of a cartoon furnished by the Bureau to 15 UKA leaders and/or members who were thought to be the ones most likely to be influenced by its receipt. This cartoon was the one furnished by the Bureau, and on the top of this cartoon was the wording "KU-KLUXERS KOLORING KOMICS".

(3) Tangible Results

During the current reporting period, Birmingham is unable to state specific examples of tangible results of the counterintelligence action taken. However, it is to be noted and is considered significant by Birmingham that although there were numerous instances of racial demonstrations by pro-integration groups in the Birmingham Division, neither the UKA, the NSRP, the American States

Rights Party (ASRP) nor any other group caused any trouble or disturbances in these demonstrations.

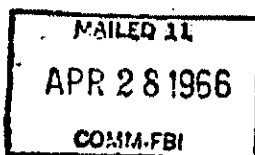

ReBulet, 4/8/66, and Atlanta airtel to Bureau dated 8/17/61, captioned "United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan; Racial Matters," Bufile 100-7801, Atlanta 157-193, Charlotte 100-8334.

ReATairtel enclosed a letterhead memorandum reflecting that "UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC., KNIGHTS OF THE KU-KLUX KLAN" was the new name of the organization formerly known as the UNITED KLANS, KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN OF AMERICA, INC. It was stated that the name was changed by a resolution adopted at the National Klonvocation held on July 8, 1961, at Indian Springs, Georgia, and that the new name was then being used on official documents issued by the Imperial Office of this group, which is located in Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Ala.

It is also to be noted that "THE ALABAMA KNIGHTS, KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN, INC.," also merged into the new organization at the same Klonvocation and its incorporation papers are recorded in Corporate Record Book 17, commencing on Page 391, of Probate Office of Tuscaloosa County, Ala.

In view of the above, it appears that the legality of the UKA corporation probably rests upon the legality of the Georgia corporation as originally formed and as amended.

Prior to Birmingham submitting a specific proposal to the Bureau concerning contacts with established sources, it is felt that Atlanta's evaluation of the corporate validity of the UKA should be furnished the Bureau and Birmingham. It is believed that much of the success of counterintelligence activity in Alabama in regard to the legality of the UKA will rest upon the results of Atlanta's findings.

There is also some indication that certain other UKA officials in Alabama resent BRASSELL's position of authority and make remarks against him and his actions.

Bureau authority is requested to prepare an anonymous letter to SHELTON exploiting this situation.

A suggested letter is as follows:

"Birmingham, Ala.

Dear Imperial Wizard.

I have been a klansman for a long, long time and I know you have to. But it concerns me that you would let WILLIAM BRASSELL hold the office of Ala. Grand Dragon.

I have heard him speak and I have heard him try to handle discussions at meetings. He just can't get anything done right and can't seem to make up his mind about nothing. He also has got a lot of good, faithful men upset at him and they don't want to work for him.

I hope you will look into this and do something about it for the klan is to good to fold up because of sorry leaders.

It is believed that such situations probably exist in regard to UKA Klaverns wherever the UKA is operating. It is also believed that such situations may be utilized in regard to instant program.

Birmingham suggests that the Bureau may desire to remind certain offices to take advantage of any such situations known to exist in their respective areas by the mailing of anonymous letters or the making of anonymous telephone calls.

Birmingham suggests that the cartoon depict a robed klanman on a road leading to a building marked "Klan Hall". On the road between the hall and the klanman should be drawn a black cat, marked "13", proceeding across in front of the klanman. The klanman could also be shown "behind an eight ball". The cartoon could also include a "subpoena server" waiting at the Klan Hall with a paper in his hand.

If such a cartoon is prepared by the Bureau, Birmingham will anonymously mail them as soon as authorized by and received from the Bureau.

Birmingham observations regarding immoral activity of Klan members is significant, and has been a prime consideration in counterintelligence since its inception.

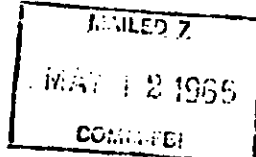

The following is a status letter, covering the previous three months period:

(1) POTENTIAL COUNTERINTELLIGENCE ACTION

As in the past, one important area of potential action in the Birmingham Division continues to be the anonymous mailing of untraceable cartoons, leaflets, cards, etc., to known Klansmen. The proper use of anonymous telephone calls to selected hate-group leaders and/or members is still under consideration. Birmingham also contemplates sending "Change of Address" cards to selected individuals, in regard to their hate-type subscriptions.

At present, the Birmingham Office, at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, is gathering information concerning the value of the residences of ROBERT M. SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and [REDACTED] both of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, along with suitable photographs of their residences. It is believed that information concerning their residences, and possibly the photographs of their residences, may be used by the Birmingham Office and/or other Bureau offices such as Charlotte, in regard to captioned program.

(2) PENDING COUNTERINTELLIGENCE ACTION

Copies of the letterhead or letter captioned "The National Committee for Domestic Tranquility," (NCDT), as furnished the Birmingham Office by the Bureau each month, is being anonymously mailed to certain selected UKA officials in the Birmingham Division.

In April, 1966, and also in May, 1966, Birmingham has anonymously mailed numerous copies of the postal cards made available to the Birmingham Office by the Bureau, under date of April 28, 1966. The first mailing dealt with postal cards indicating that the identity of the recipient of the card was known. The next mailing dealt with the postal card pointing out that some of the UKA officials were probably spending the recipient's money which he had turned in to the Klan.

In May, 1966, the Birmingham Office also anonymously mailed a letter to ROBERT M. SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, UKA, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. This letter indicated that it was being submitted by an unidentified Klansman who was dissatisfied with the manner in which WILLIAM BRASSELL, then the Alabama Grand Dragon of the UKA, was handling his position as the Alabama Grand Dragon.

By airtel dated May 20, 1966, with copies for Mobile and other offices, Birmingham submitted recommendations aimed at bringing about the possible revocation of the UKA charter.

During the latter part of May, 1966, Birmingham also mailed copies of the letter and membership cards enclosed with Bureau airtel, dated May 27, 1966. These copies were mailed to selected UKA members who had received the first issue of the letter.

On May 27, 1966, Birmingham also mailed copies of the cartoon furnished with Bureau letter dated May 19, 1966. Copies of the cartoon were mailed to certain selected UKA members believed the most susceptible to the receipt of same.

(3) TANGIBLE RESULTS

During the current reporting period, Birmingham is unable to state specific examples of tangible results of the counterintelligence action taken. However, it is to be noted and is considered quite significant by Birmingham that the inefficiency of WILLIAM BRASSELL, Alabama Grand Dragon, UKA, was anonymously made known to ROBERT SHELTON, above described, in late April, 1966, and that in late May, 1966, BRASSELL was ousted as Alabama Grand Dragon of the UKA. It is also considered significant by Birmingham that there has been almost no trouble or disturbance by the UKA or any hate group in Birmingham area during the past three months.

It has also been reported to the Birmingham Office, by several of its informants, that some of the UKA members and/or officials who have received or have knowledge of the fink post cards anonymously mailed think the Jewish Anti-defamation League is responsible for the mailing of these cards. Other UKA members think the White Citizens Council may be involved, and still other UKA members and/or officials have expressed themselves as believing that the FBI may be responsible. It is known that all who have received or had knowledge of the cards are concerned by the receipt of the cards.

Atlanta has advised that Ellis Arnall, former Governor, State of Georgia, is a front running candidate again in the Georgia gubernatorial race. You will recall that Arnall did, during the 1940s, order the Attorney General of Georgia to move on the Klan, which action resulted in the revocation of the then existing Klan charter.

Our counterintelligence study of ways and means to cause the revocation of the United Klans of America, Inc., (UKA, Inc.) charter on file in Georgia was instituted for the purpose of revoking that charter, and then highlighting the illegal corporate image of the UKA so that state and Federal revenue authorities would closely examine the financial structure of the UKA.

The legality of the Klan charter in North Carolina is presently a political issue in that state, and is being closely followed by the Charlotte Office.

The Internal Revenue Service is conducting an investigation concerning the conversion of UKA funds to private use by Robert Marvin Shelton and other Klan leaders.

We now feel that if Ellis Arnall is elected Governor of Georgia, a successful revocation of this Klan charter can be achieved. Therefore, at this time, interviews with various Alabama and Georgia officials previously suggested by Birmingham and Atlanta are not desired.

Referenced Bureau letter dated 5/12/66, requested Birmingham to submit counterintelligence proposals directed at the board of the UKA, and specifically requested comments, observations, and positive recommendations be made by Birmingham regarding the possible revocation of the UKA charter, as requested in Bureau letter of 4/3/66.

As mentioned in referenced Birmingham letter dated 4/22/66, it still appears to the Birmingham Office that the legality of the UAA corporation probably rests upon the legality of the Georgia corporation, as originally formed and as amended. Birmingham, in this same letter, pointed out that "The Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc.," actually was incorporated in the State of Alabama, and its incorporation papers are recorded in Corporate Record Book 17, commencing on Page 391 of the Probate Office of Tuscaloosa County, Alabama.

[REDACTED] a check of the corporate records of their office failed to reveal that any corporate papers had been filed by the UAA in Tuscaloosa County, Alabama, at any time.

In view of the above, and the information set forth in referenced communications, Birmingham proposes that Mobile contact Mr. RICHMOND FLOWERS, Attorney General of the State of Alabama, concerning instant matter. It is believed that FLOWERS would be the logical person to contact in order to determine whether the UAA has filed incorporation papers with the State of Alabama, in order to do business or operate within the State of Alabama. FLOWERS could also advise whether the UAA has received proper authorization to do business within the State of Alabama as a foreign corporation, if the UAA is not properly chartered in Alabama, and he could also advise as to whether or not there are any specific requirements which have or have not been met by the UAA in regard to its operating within the State of Alabama, including whether there are any penal provisions of the laws of the State of Alabama that might have been violated by officers of the UAA in Alabama.

The Mobile Office is requested to submit its observations and recommendations in regard to contact with RICHMOND FLOWERS concerning the matter involved, as mentioned above, and as suggested by Birmingham in the preceding paragraph.

Duncan authority is requested for the Mobile Office to contact FLOWERS, as suggested above, unless the Mobile Office recommends that such contact not be made with FLOWERS.

The Birmingham Office also believes that one of the most vulnerable points of the UAA operation and the operation of various UAA leaders throughout the United States is the manner in which they obtain funds, and probably misuse, fail

to properly record or account for such funds, either as corporate funds or as salaries of UKA officials. It is suggested by the Birmingham Office that the Bureau contact some high ranking official of the US Department of Internal Revenue Service in Washington, D. C., in order to get the Internal Revenue Service to concentrate its efforts on the operations of the UKA and its top leaders, as it is felt that if the IRS were to really dig into the operations and finances of the UKA and its officials, it would be a most successful disruptive tactic, from the standpoint of the U. S. Government and the FBI.

"Now let us examine what happens from the night the F.B.I. takes down license numbers and snaps their picture. Joe Smith who was in attendance at the Klan Speaking and who has not yet joined the organization or maybe he has no desire to join starts receiving letters, post card cartoons from non-existent organizations making claims against Klan leaders, post cards with a cartoon on the back side for everyone to see saying "KLANSMAN trying to hide your identity behind your sheet? You received this - someone KNOWS who you are!" Many times they will be sent to the place of employment instead of the mans home. Their purpose for this naturally is to bring about econcmic pressure. Bring about the fear to a man of his job being taken away from him and no money to buy food and clothing for the family and you can control his activities and his belief.

"A week later he receives through the mail a letter from a FAKE organization called The National Committee For Domestic Tranquility. The letter is signed by a non-existant person by the name of Harmon Blennerhasset.

"Since the F.B.I. is guilty of taking pictures and getting license numbers from cars that are in attendance at the Klan speakings and then days later these people start receiving the hate literature on the Klan, we ask this question. If it is not the F.B.I. who could in turn be receiving this information to harass the WHITE CHRISTIAN CITIZENS? ARE THEY ALLOWING OTHER ORGANIZATIONS TO USE THIS INFORMATION? These things do not just happen, they are planned.

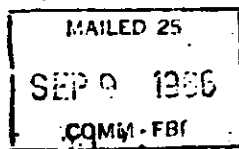

As is known to the Bureau, ROBERT M. SHELTON, Imperial Wizard of the UKA, INC., has held this top position for several years. He is the controlling officer in the UKA and has almost completely controlled the plans, finances, and operations of the UKA, especially on the national level.

There are indications that SHELTON's manner of operating the UKA, its finances, and his stand concerning non-violence has antagonized many UKA members.

Birmingham proposes that the Bureau give consideration to authorizing informants in various offices to raise questions as to why SHELTON fails to call a National Klonvocation of the UKA. It might be hinted in the conversations that SHELTON may fear he will be ousted. It is felt that any such hints, conversations and/or rumors should be handled in private conversations rather than in open UKA meetings. The statements should not be made so openly as to put the informant on the spot and may be handled in various manners by different offices and different informants.

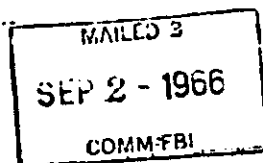

No counterintelligence action should be initiated without prior Bureau authority. Your interest in submitting this suggestion is very much appreciated by the Bureau.

Mobile submits the following proposal for consideration of the Birmingham Office and the Bureau for its possible use in connection with captioned program.

Information recently developed by a Birmingham informant indicates that ROBERT M. SHELTON, UKA Imperial Wizard, intends to convene an Imperial Klonvocation of the UKA in Tuscaloosa, Ala., sometime following his trial in USDC, Washington, D. C. This trial is now scheduled to begin 9/12/66 and if such Klonvocation is seriously contemplated by SHELTON it might be scheduled for some time within the next few months.

Once a definite weekend is scheduled, and the word passed to all Klaverns, no doubt a substantial number of Klan officers and members would plan to attend from various parts of the United States. As a disruptive tactic, a telegram was sent to the Grand Dragons of each State one day prior to their scheduled arrival in Tuscaloosa, Ala., informing them that the Klonvocation was being postponed one week (for some fictitious reason) this might effectively ruin the entire Klonvocation and further dis-credit in the eyes of all Klan officers and leaders.

For example if the Klonvocation was scheduled for the weekend of October 21, 22 and 23 at Tuscaloosa, Ala., a dozen or so telegrams sent to the various Grand Dragons might read as follows: "Meeting postponed until 10/28/66. Wire seriously ill. /s/ ROBERT".

The telegrams could be sent via Western Union in Tuscaloosa, Ala., either by calling them in to the Western Union.

It is noted of course that as of the present date, no such klonvocation has been scheduled by SHELTON and there is a possibility that the klonvocation might never come off.

The Bureau is requested to consider this proposal as outlined in general terms above and advise Birmingham and Mobile whether or not it warrants further consideration, and if so, the Bureau's recommendations and instructions for its implementation.

Birmingham is requested to promptly make known its opinion as to the feasibility of the above tactic, its possible effects, favorable and otherwise, so that the Bureau may have the benefit of your thoughts prior to making any decision.

Noting the completely indefinite status as of now insofar as any date being set for an Imperial Klonvocation, Mobile and Birmingham will both maintain close contact with Klan informants on this point and will promptly advise the Bureau if and when any such date is set together with the place, time, etc., of any such klonvocation.

Your attention is directed to the article which appeared in the Birmingham "Post-Herald," issue of 9/2/66, entitled "Mothers To March Against Communism."

The article indicates that a Mother's Crusade for Victory was to be held on 9/10/66 at Birmingham, Alabama, in order to attract attention to communist treason within and out of America and to urge citizens to dedicate their support to our fighting forces in Vietnam.

As you are aware, the National Committee for Domestic Tranquility (NCDT) is a Bureau controlled anti-Klan organization whose objectives are similar to those of the Mother's Crusade for Victory mentioned above.

Advise the Bureau without conducting any active investigation if the Mother's Crusade for Victory is associated with the Ku Klux Klan. Also advise if your indices contain any information regarding [REDACTED]

In the event that the Mother's Crusade for Victory has no strong affiliation with the Klan, consideration will be given to the issuance of an NCDT bulletin demonstrating that the spirit of the NCDT has inspired the Mother's Crusade for Victory in Birmingham, Alabama, and may provoke similar crusades by American mothers throughout the United States. This type of action will give further authenticity to the NCDT which is now provoking significant counterintelligence activity in Louisiana and other Southern States.

The main policy of the Bureau-controlled NCDT is to preserve domestic tranquility and "Quit the Klan and back our boys in Vietnam." Our objectives seem to be similar to those of the Mother's Crusade for Victory, recently held in Alabama, and if we can indicate that we were responsible for the crusade, then we can logically convince the Klan that the NCDT is growing in power in the South.

As the Bureau is well aware, ridicule and "open disclosure of Klan membership" can be devastating weapons in numerous instances.

Enclosed herewith is a sticker which was taken from a recent issue of "MAD" magazine. This sticker has a dark blue background and bright yellow letters reading "SUPPORT MENTAL ILLNESS." Then, immediately below that appears in smaller letters, "Join The Ku Klux Klan!"

In view of above, Birmingham recommends that the Bureau prepare postcards to be mailed to Klansmen. This anonymous mailing can be participated in by all FBI Offices which may desire to take such action, regardless of the actual klan group involved.

By the same token, cards can be prepared directing the recipient to "Join The National White Americans Party" and/or any other hate group in a similar manner to that mentioned above.

Birmingham believes that the mailing of open postcards to hate group members will serve a useful purpose. Birmingham also suggests the Bureau might give consideration to anonymously

Your suggestion that we utilize a sticker with the wording thereon "SUPPORT MENTAL ILLNESS - JOIN THE KU KLUX KLAN!" as a counterintelligence measure has been previously submitted by other offices. We are giving consideration to this proposal in our overall counterintelligence program; however, do not desire to utilize this measure at this time.

You have also suggested that the above-mentioned sticker be utilized in connection with a mass mailing of postcards to known hate group members. In the counterintelligence program we recognize the value of such mailings, however, we are utilizing this technique on a highly selective basis so as not to saturate our targets with anonymous communications and thereby detract from the impact of same when utilized.

The interest being displayed by the Birmingham Office in the counterintelligence program is most helpful, and you are encouraged to continue the submission of counterintelligence proposals, especially those which are on a long-range sophisticated matter which can logically produce factionalism and disorder within organized Klan activities.

The suggestion furnished by BH appeared in a recent issue of "Mad Magazine." We feel that the anonymous distribution of postcards to Klansmen bearing the suggested sticker might well be construed by the ignorant Klan sympathizers and members to mean that the Klan is actually supporting a charitable need, mental illness. For this reason, and the fact that mass mailings are to be utilized only on a highly selective basis, BH's proposal not to be utilized is recommended.

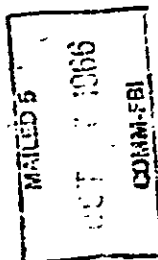

The following is a status letter, covering the previous three-month period:

(1) POTENTIAL COUNTERINTELLIGENCE ACTION

Birmingham, as in the past, continues to consider the anonymous mailing of untraceable cards, cartoons, leaflets, etc. to known Klansmen and/or other hate-group members, as a very important area of potential action. Proper use of anonymous phone calls to certain selected Klan leaders and/or members has been made by the Birmingham Office, and further use of such calls in appropriate situations is still under consideration. Birmingham continues to contemplate the sending of "Change of Address" cards to certain individuals in regard to their hate-type subscriptions.

As previously mentioned in referenced communication, the Birmingham Office is continuing to gather information concerning the residences of ROBERT M. SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and [REDACTED] both of the UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC., KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (UKA). It is believed that such information concerning their residences and/or financial transactions at the appropriate time may possibly be used in captioned matter by the Birmingham Office and/or other Bureau offices.

(2) PENDING COUNTERINTELLIGENCE ACTION

During July, 1966, the Birmingham Office anonymously mailed postcards captioned "Invisible Government," which cards were furnished to Birmingham by the Bureau. The postcards were mailed to quite a number of UKA members and were mailed in accordance with the specific instructions given by the Bureau concerning their mailing.

During August, 1966, the Birmingham Office, in accordance with Bureau instructions, anonymously mailed postcards to quite a number of UKA members in the Birmingham Division. These postcards dealt with the theme and contained the wording "Trying to Hide," and the postcards were mailed to some of the UKA members at their residences and/or places of employment. These postcards were also made available to the Birmingham Office by the Bureau.

On 8/17/66, as instructed by the Bureau in its letter dated 8/10/66, Birmingham mailed three picture postcards and two regular postcards to the National Office of "The Fiery Cross," P. O. Box 2369, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. These postcards were mailed in connection with the National Committee for Democratic Tranquility (NCDT).

By airtel dated 8/25/66, Birmingham requested Bureau authority to make anonymous telephone calls to a few logical members or officers of UKA Confederate Klavern #14, insinuating that [REDACTED] was a fink. By letter dated 9/2/66, Bureau authority was granted for the making of such anonymous telephone calls, and these calls were made to certain UKA members and/or officials in Birmingham on 9/16/66.

b7c In August, 1966, Bureau authority was requested for Birmingham to prepare an anonymous letter to be mailed to [REDACTED] above-mentioned Confederate Klavern #14, with a copy for ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, UKA. By letter dated 9/9/66, the Bureau granted authority

for the sending of such a letter accusing [redacted] of carrying on an affair with a woman other than his wife and of doing a lot of drinking and not properly caring for his family. b7c

On 9/13/66 the above-mentioned anonymous letter was sent by the Birmingham Office to [redacted] with a copy to ROBERT SPELTON, Imperial Wizard, UKA.

By letter dated 8/29/66, Birmingham proposed to the Bureau that certain informants in various offices should be authorized to raise questions as to why ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard of the UKA, failed to call a National Klonvocation of the UKA. It was pointed out that it might be hinted in the conversation that SHELTON might fear he would be ousted. By airtel dated 9/2/66 the Bureau acknowledged receipt of this suggestion, but pointed out that ROBERT SHELTON was scheduled to stand trial for Contempt of Court during September, 1966. The Bureau requested that upon completion of this trial, Birmingham should resubmit its recommendation to the Bureau. By airtel dated 9/20/66, Birmingham resubmitted the suggestion concerning ROBERT SHELTON's failure to call a National Klonvocation of the UKA.

During September, 1966, Birmingham enclosed to the Bureau a sticker which had been taken from a recent issue of "MAD" Magazine. This sticker contained in large letters "Support Mental Illness" and below that in smaller letters was "Join the Ku Klux Klan!" Birmingham requested the Bureau to give consideration to preparing postcards to be anonymously mailed to Klansmen. By so doing, the mailing of such postcards would ridicule the Klansmen and would also serve to openly disclose Klan membership on the part of the recipients of these postcards. Birmingham also pointed out that such postcards could be used by any FBI Office having any Klan-type organization operating in its territory and/or any other hate-type group merely by changing the name of the organization reportedly sending the postcards and requesting the recipient to join its organization.

(3) TANGIBLE RESULTS

During the current reporting period, Birmingham has received information from various informants in different Klaverns of the UKA operating in the Birmingham Division concerning the receipt of the above-mentioned pink postcards, such as the one dealing with "Invisible Government," and one dealing with "Trying to Hide." Several Birmingham UKA informants have made known that several of the UKA members receiving these postcards have become exceedingly disturbed by the receipt of the anonymous postcard, and some of the UKA members have expressed great concern and have been exceedingly disturbed by the receipt of these cards. One Birmingham UKA informant stated that ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, UKA, had stated that the Anti-Defamation League (ADL) had received membership lists of the UKA from the House Un-American Activities Committee, and that the ADL was the one responsible for the sending of these cards to harass UKA members. It was stated that SHELTON remarked that he was going to instigate a personal law suit against the ADL, thereby forcing it to reveal publicly its source of information.

By airtel dated 8/6/66, the Birmingham Office enclosed to the Bureau two copies of an issue of "The Fiery Cross," the official publication of the UKA. These two copies were made available during early August, 1966, by a Birmingham informant, and most of the entire publication was taken up with the UKA concern over the receipt of copies of the publication put out by the NCDT and the receipt of the above-mentioned postcards by numerous UKA members. The articles written in this issue of "The Fiery Cross" showed that the UKA leaders and members were greatly concerned over the sending of such letters and postcards and were making every effort to determine who or what organization or organizations were sending such literature.

As has been pointed out previously by the Birmingham Office, Birmingham feels that it is very significant that there has been almost no trouble or disturbance by the UKA or any other hate groups in the Birmingham Division during the past three months. It is felt that such inactivity, to a great extent, may be the result of and attributable to the counterintelligence activity of the Bureau and the various FBI offices.

Referenced letter suggests the Bureau and Birmingham consider that should a National Klonvocation be held, some informants on the Imperial Board might be replaced.

The above-mentioned possibility has been under consideration by Birmingham for several weeks. For Atlanta's information, it is known that ROBERT SHELTON, for several months, has contemplated calling a National Klonvocation but has not done so. He gives various reasons for not doing so.

Birmingham feels certain SHELTON will not be pressured into calling a National Klonvocation. He will do so if and when he gets ready. Although Birmingham has no such information, SHELTON may already have definite plans for a National Klonvocation at a specific time.

Birmingham feels that the proposed disruptive activity under consideration is well worth pursuing as previously outlined in Bulet to Birmingham dated 9/27/66.

In accordance with instructions set forth in referenced Bureau letter, Birmingham makes the following recommendations in regard to the above-named objective under consideration.

(1) It is recommended that Birmingham, and possibly other field offices, be authorized to make anonymous telephone calls to a few selected leaders and/or members of the UKA. In these calls, statements should be made that ROBERT SHELTON has not called a National Klonvocation of the UKA since September, 1964, and this may be due to SHELTON's fear that he would be defeated. It will also be hinted that he, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] are living high off of nothing but UKA funds and contributions. It will be mentioned that the SHELTONS and the [REDACTED] and have lovely houses which are fairly new, each drive new cars, SHELTON a CHRYSLER Imperial and [REDACTED]

(2) It is recommended that anonymous mailings of "smear sheets" be made by Birmingham and/or other field offices to (a) selected high ranking officials in the various states; (b) numerous radio stations and/or television stations; (c) numerous newspapers in Birmingham, Alabama, and/or other cities in the several states.

The smear sheet should be on plain commercial paper and mailed in an envelope that cannot be traced to the FBI.

The smear sheet could be worded as follows:

"Why should Robert Shelton, Imperial Wizard of the UKA call a National Klonvocation?"

ROBERT SHELTON in all his life has never had it so good. He is the Imperial Wizard (top officer) of the United Klans of America, Inc., KKKK, and has held this position for over five years.

SHELTON drives a new Chrysler Imperial automobile, owns a new home and he [REDACTED]

b7c [REDACTED] are living off of the UKA funds and contributions. SHELTON moved the UKA National Headquarters from a public office building in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, into a room he made out of his carport. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] SHELTON [REDACTED] have a gold mine in operation.

Why should SHELTON risk calling a National Klonvocation of the UKA at which rational officers would be chosen? SHELTON is no fool! He has the top position, the purse and purse strings of the UKA, and there is no reason in the world why he would want to call a National Klonvocation and risk being kicked out of office.

It is a fact that there has not been a National Klonvocation of the UKA held since September, 1964, in Birmingham, Alabama, even though one should be held each year."

If authorized, the letter would be addressed to a column in "The Birmingham News," a daily newspaper of Birmingham, Alabama, which column is headed "Letter to The Editor."

(4) Another copy of the same letter, if authorized by the Bureau, could be prepared as though coming from [REDACTED] and could be sent to the Editor of "The Birmingham Post Herald," a daily newspaper of Birmingham, Alabama, and/or the editors of newspapers in other cities in the Birmingham Division.

"WHO RUNS THE UKA?"

Do you realize a National Klonvocation of the United Klans of America, Inc.(UKA) has not been held since September, 1964.

Who holds the top position in the UKA? Who is bound to profit as long as a National Klonvocation is not called.

Of course it is ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard of the UKA, who has held this top position for at least five years. He is the controlling officer of the UKA and has almost completely controlled the plans, finances and operations of the UKA.

It should interest you to know that SHELTON [REDACTED]

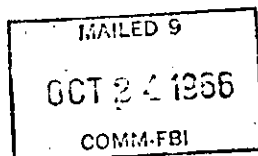

The Charlotte Office is of the opinion that some measure of pressure may be exerted on BOB SHELTON through informants in an effort to force him to hold a national convention of UKA. It is presumed that the Birmingham Office, in submitting its proposal, has in mind the removal of SHELTON as Imperial Wizard.

Prior to instituting such a program, this office feels that there are several possible results which the Bureau should consider:

1. To initiate a program in several offices through informants, anonymous communications, cartoons, etc., will undoubtedly alert SHELTON to the fact that the proposed holding of a national convention is being inspired by an outside organization.

2. If SHELTON or other Klan leaders become suspicious of this being fomented by an outside force, it could result in the compromise of informants who are being employed in attempts to bring about the convention.

3. If SHELTON is to be replaced or attempts made to do so, who is the logical choice to succeed him and what will the far-reaching results be, if successful?

Insofar as this office is aware, North Carolina has more klaverns and more Klan members than any other state and possibly a combination of several states. Voting delegates to the Klan convention from North Carolina could possibly vote into power a new Imperial Wizard. The logical choice of the North Carolina delegates would be [REDACTED] of North Carolina. The only other possibilities would be [REDACTED] from Greensboro, who is currently in disfavor with not only [REDACTED] but also rank and file members, and [REDACTED] from Cary, N. C.

It is believed it would be difficult, if not impossible, to persuade voting delegates from North Carolina to overthrow SHELTON for [REDACTED]. However, it is believed that the North Carolina delegates would refuse to vote into power a new Imperial Wizard from any other state.

The situation boiled down would be that SHELTON might be deposed in favor of [REDACTED]. This does not appear to be a situation which would be favorable to the Bureau even if it resulted in a split in UKA with part of the membership remaining loyal to SHELTON and part to [REDACTED]. The fruits of a division within UKA may be disputed in that this would divide presently existing klaverns and further reduce current informant coverage.

The Charlotte Office does not desire to throw cold water on any proposal aimed at disrupting the top Klan leadership and the Klan as an organization; however, the above considerations are being brought to the attention of the Bureau and Birmingham prior to the institution of any program.

Information available to this office indicates many Klansmen feel SHELTON is in the Klan for the money he receives, and they feel that he has not been as diligent as he could have been in the distribution of Klan materials and literature. Also, members in North Carolina were very much disturbed upon learning that the UKA in North Carolina is paying for issues of the "Fiery Cross" while other states receive issues of this paper free.

If, after consideration, the Bureau and Birmingham feel that action should be initiated to bring about a national convention, the following proposals are submitted:

1. It is felt this "campaign" should be initiated by having a nationally-known syndicated columnist, whose column is widely carried throughout states in which the Klan is active, write an article pointing out the fact that no national convention of the Klan has been held recently. This article could be directed toward pointing out the shortcomings of SHELTON as an organizer and leader and his reluctance to place himself in a position where he may be voted out of office.

Through this means, the Klan, which claims to be a strong supporter of democratic practices, would be placed in a position of being declared an undemocratic group.

2. Following the publication of such an article which could be brought to the attention of informants, these sources would then have a basis for discussing a national

As mentioned in referenced communication, the proposal involved was submitted by Birmingham with the thought in mind that such action would probably serve as a disruptive tactic and might result in the removal of ROBERT SHELTON as Imperial Wizard.

Birmingham feels that referenced Charlotte airtel reveals that considerable thought has been given to the situation now under consideration. Birmingham feels that, as previously intimated by the Bureau, any such action would probably commence with rumors and/or anonymous leaflets. By so doing, the possibility of compromising informants would be minimized.

Birmingham does not believe that there is any great probability that SHELTON can be deposed as Imperial Wizard at the present time. Birmingham agrees with Charlotte that should SHELTON be deposed, his successor probably would logically be selected by or come from the North Carolina area. Birmingham is of the opinion that a major split within the UKA is not likely to result in a part of the UKA going with SHELTON and a part going with [REDACTED]

It is also noted with interest by Birmingham that many Klansmen feel SHELTON is in the Klan for the money he receives, and that it is not felt that he has been as diligent as he could have been in distributing Klan materials. Such situations may be used and emphasized in the "rumor" and "anonymous leaflet" phase of this project. The fact that North Carolina Klansmen are having to buy issues of the "Fiery Cross" while other states receive the UKA paper free should be given serious consideration.

Charlotte's suggestion regarding an article by a nationally known syndicated columnist, as set out on page 3 of reairtel seems logical and worth serious consideration by the Bureau.

Due to the above, Birmingham plans to use extreme caution in regard to any additional contacts with [REDACTED]. Bureau authority is therefore requested, as follows, for Birmingham, in future contacts with [REDACTED] which statements will have a sufficient element of truth in them to possibly plant seeds of doubt and/or distrust.

Sources of Tuscaloosa Klavern #5 have been contacted on a regular basis concerning captioned matters and the UKA, and have been unable to furnish positive information in this regard, and it is felt that this is primarily and mainly due to the extensive traveling of the two top UKA functionaries, [REDACTED] SHELTON.

Birmingham and other designated offices are in receipt of prior communications relative to the United Klans of America, Inc. (UKA), National Klonvocation. In the interest of brevity, this and all subsequent communications should carry in the title the abbreviation UKANK in place of UKA National Klonvocation.

The survey conducted among major offices handling Klan counterintelligence was prompted by Birmingham's proposal that steps be taken to cause criticism of Shelton's failure to order a National Klonvocation, suggesting Shelton feels such action might lead to his ouster as UKA Imperial Wizard.

This proposal has been studied in depth by the Bureau with emphasis on the UKA Imperial Board, recommendations of interested offices and practicality.

Based on the above factors, it is indicated a National Klonvocation cannot be successfully forced at this time and to mount a Nation-wide counterintelligence effort to attempt same is not now wise nor practical. To initiate a specific program designed to criticize Shelton for his

reluctance to order a National Klonvocation is redundant, in that, Shelton has been and will continue to be a direct and indirect counterintelligence target.

This survey, however, has developed some interesting concepts and areas of potential counterintelligence activity. The following action should be taken by recipient offices indicated:

1. All recipient offices keep the Bureau informed of any information coming to your attention indicating a UKA National Klonvocation may be called by Shelton, or indicating any significant pending shift in UKA national leadership. Such information should be accompanied by your observations and firm recommendations for counterintelligence, if feasible. This action will give the Bureau the capacity to move at the earliest date possible in a manner designed to insure we are in a position to exert maximum control over a UKA National Klonvocation.

2. Birmingham advise the Bureau if your suggested letter purporting to be from [redacted] a former UKA member, to Birmingham newspapers has been formed in language known to have been used by [redacted]. If not, resubmit same to the Bureau in a [redacted]. Further consideration will be given to this local proposal upon receipt of your advice.

3. Charlotte follow this matter closely to insure any move by the UKA Grand Dragon, North Carolina, to broaden his base of power is furnished the Bureau at the earliest date with recommendations designed to benefit our investigative and counterintelligence needs.

4. Jackson, since Shelton dissolved the Mississippi UKA state office and is attempting to control same himself, submit your recommendations, if feasible, relating to possible specialized counterintelligence activity designed to withhold Mississippi UKA units from Shelton's control.

5. Mobile develop further your recommendation concerning the ability of [REDACTED]

Your final recommendations should include comments relative to [REDACTED] present capacity to disrupt the UKA, as well as his follow up capacity to misdirect the National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (NKKKK) in order to increase animosity between that organization and the UKA.

Other offices who have expressed an interest in this survey and who have contributed to the disruption of the UKA through counterintelligence activity are encouraged to continue their vital interests.

Recipient offices take no additional action in this matter, other than specifically requested, without prior Bureau authority.

NOTE:

A survey has been conducted in order to consider a Nation-wide counterintelligence activity to smear the Imperial Wizard, UKA, and to force him to call a National Klonvocation. If we could have accomplished this, our objective would have been the establishment of an informant, or a subject controlled by a Bureau informant, as UKA Imperial Wizard. However, in deference to the present informant coverage on the UKA Imperial Board, we are not instituting this effort. Upon receipt of advice from recipient offices, further consideration will be given to recommendations submitted.

(1) POTENTIAL COUNTERINTELLIGENCE ACTION

As the Bureau is aware, the Birmingham Office is in the process of gathering information concerning [REDACTED] ROBERT M. SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, [REDACTED] both of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA). This information, along with information concerning the possibility that SHELTON [REDACTED] is being gathered for possible use in regard to instant program. As the Bureau has previously pointed out, should definite information be developed showing that SHELTON [REDACTED] an interest in this above-mentioned housing development, the information can be passed on to the Internal Revenue Service of the U. S., which is conducting a "sensitive investigation" concerning the possible use of UKA funds by SHELTON [REDACTED]

As has been previously stated, Birmingham feels that the sending of anonymous untraceable cards, leaflets, cartoons,

and so forth, to known Klansmen and/or other hate-group members, is a very important disruptive action in the counterintelligence field. It is believed that the proper use of anonymous phone calls to certain selected UKA leaders and/or members has, in the past, been used successfully by the Birmingham Office, and further use of such calls in appropriate situations is still under consideration, and Bureau approval will be requested in all specific cases.

(2) PENDING COUNTERINTELLIGENCE ACTION

At the suggestion of the Birmingham Office, the Bureau is presently giving consideration to a "smear campaign" against ROBERT M. SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, UKA, centering around the suggestion that SHELTON may be opposed to calling a National Klonvocation of the UKA, due to the fact that he fears he would not be retained in his position of power if such position was put to a vote. This situation, at present, is being coordinated by the Bureau on the basis of information furnished by different offices and proposals made by such offices in regard to appropriate action to be taken concerning the manner in which this "smear campaign" should be undertaken.

Birmingham, at present, is giving consideration as to the best manner in which counterintelligence action can be taken against [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Careful consideration is being given to steps taken in regard to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] In addition to considering action to be taken against him from the overall standpoint of the counterintelligence program.

As above-mentioned, in October, 1966, Birmingham recommended to the Bureau that Birmingham, and possibly other field offices, should be authorized to make anonymous telephone calls to a few selected leaders and/or members of the UKA concerning ROBERT SHELTON having failed to call a National Klonvocation of the UKA since September of 1964. It was also suggested in this communication that it be hinted that SHELTON

In November, 1966, Birmingham, by airtel, recommended to the Bureau that a special edition of "National Committee For Domestic Tranquility" be prepared to spotlight numerous instances in which various hate-group leaders have been involved recently throughout the United States. This airtel set out numerous instances known to the Birmingham Office where certain hate-group leaders in various states of the United States had received publicity in the various newspapers or other means of communication in regard to violations of laws or misconduct on their part which had been made known to the public.

In December, 1966, the Birmingham Office furnished the Bureau with the results of investigation conducted by the Birmingham Office, including a review of files of the Birmingham Office concerning the UKA activities of ROBERT M. SHELTON [REDACTED] and persons who might be considered close friends of the SHELTONS [REDACTED]. The results of these file reviews and investigation concerning the SHELTONS [REDACTED] he [REDACTED] the Bureau in detail, and as previously mentioned in this communication, Birmingham continues to attempt to develop information concerning the financial status of the SHELTONS [REDACTED] including their personal and real estate holdings.

In December, 1966, the Birmingham Office also furnished information to the Bureau to the effect that [REDACTED] probably was buying his home through the Prudential Insurance Company in Birmingham, Alabama. In the same communication, it was pointed out that the Bureau might have sources in a position to make discreet inquiries of high-ranking Prudential Insurance Company officials in order to determine [REDACTED]

might hold insurance policies on his life or other property.

(3) TANGIBLE RESULTS

As the Birmingham Office has previously stated to the Bureau, it is felt, by Birmingham, that it is very significant that there has been almost no trouble or disturbance by the UKA or any other hate group in the Birmingham Division during the past three months. It is also felt that such inactivity, to a great extent, may be the result of, and directly attributable to, the counterintelligence activity of the Bureau and the various FBI Offices, and that this may be considered definitely as "tangible results".

During the current reporting period, Birmingham has also received information from various informants in the UKA that several officials and/or members of the various Klaverns of the UKA in the Birmingham Division have, on numerous occasions, openly expressed great concern in regard to how the FBI could know so much about their members, their activities, and their plans. It is also felt by Birmingham that such fear, questions, and doubts in the minds of the UKA officials and/or members have, to a great extent, curtailed any plans and/or activity on the part of the UKA for fear that such activity might result in the arrest of such participants.

It is also believed that the sending of the anonymous communications, previously authorized by the Bureau, to certain selected UKA officials and/or members, and the making of anonymous telephone calls to certain UKA officials, as authorized by the Bureau, have produced tangible results. It is known that several of the members who have received such communications have expressed great concern due to the fact they have received the communications and have made known their concern at various UKA meetings.

As the Bureau is aware, the Birmingham Office was authorized to make anonymous telephone calls to certain highly placed UKA officials in the Birmingham Division indicating that [redacted] an active member of the Confederate Klavern #14 of the UKA in Birmingham was a "fink". The Birmingham Office has subsequently received

By separate communication you have been informed by the Bureau as to what counterintelligence activities may be considered in connection with a United Klans of America, Inc., (UKA) National Klonvocation.

In connection with counterintelligence consideration being given to [redacted] Alabama, the following is set forth for your consideration:

The Bureau is in receipt of information indicating that Robert Shelton, UKA Imperial Wizard, utilizes an electronic recording device in connection with the telephone service installed at his residence. This recording device apparently allows any caller 18 seconds to leave a message in the event no one is at the Shelton residence.

Advise the Bureau of any information in your possession which establishes Shelton does, in fact, have such a device on his telephone. If this information is not in your possession, advise the Bureau whether or not you are in a position to verify same without FBI interest becoming known.

If it is resolved that Shelton does utilize a recording device, you may wish to consider the use of a telephonic pretext which might be handled by a Birmingham Special Agent well qualified to do so. A pretext telephone call might be made to Shelton's residence at a time his electronic recorder is in service. If this can be achieved, the following message could be left in an 18 second period:

"John Harrison calling--stockbroker for [REDACTED]. I want to verify his official position with your office. He has a large common stock transaction in connection with the purchase of a home pending. If I don't call back, you'll know I verified this at Tuscaloosa."

If Shelton should listen to such a recording, it might give rise to the impression that [REDACTED] is skimming off UKA funds, or he has a substantial income from another source, possibly from a police or Federal investigative agency, which permits him to purchase stock.

Insure no action is taken which might jeopardize our pending counterintelligence activity against the Shelton wide-area telephone service.

Birmingham is also authorized to insure [redacted] continues his survey of Shelton's wide-area telephone service and to obtain the results of [redacted] on a continuing monthly basis. Birmingham remains absolutely certain [redacted] understands that FBI interest cannot be divulged and that any information furnished by [redacted] to the Birmingham Office is done so directly and not through an intermediary employee.

Birmingham should take the action authorized, only after the following request has been handled by the Jackson Office.

[redacted] and for [redacted] no information to the contrary, Birmingham may proceed as authorized.

Miami continue to remain alert for any information relative to telephone company action against Shelton which you may receive through your established source at Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company, Miami, Florida.

NOTE: Miami has received information that Robert M. Shelton, known Imperial Wizard, Tuscaloosa, Alabama, utilizes a wide-area telephone service to contact Klan subordinates throughout the U. S. Miami uncovered information indicating that Shelton has conspired to defraud the telephone company by utilizing his wide-area telephone service in a manner designed to keep Klan expenses down. Through telephone company source, Miami, an investigation is being conducted in Birmingham. [redacted]
