Re Bureau letter to Chicago dated 4/20/60 instructing Chicago to develop counterintelligence measures to neutralize GREGORY noting he has traveled all over the country preaching black nationalist extremism, hatred and violence.

Concerning GREGORY it may be noted that an article appeared in the Tuesday, 5/21/68 edition of the "Chicago Sun-Time newspaper of general circulation in Chicago, in "Erp's Column" (IRV KUPCINET, Chicago newspaper columnist and TV rersonality), which states "Dick Gregory calls a temporary halt to his write-in campaign for President next week when he reports to the state of Washington to serve that 90-day sentence for civil disobedience".

It is also noted that the 5/14/68 edition of the 'Chicago Daily News", also a daily newspaper of general circulation, reported the Illinois Appellate Court upheld a 1997 conviction of comedian GREGORY on charges of battery and reminding a police officer during a 1965 civil rights demonstration. GREGORY in his appeal charged he was denied fair trial because of a "systematic exclusion of Negroes from the jury". The Appellate Court in ruling on his appeal, sgid GREGORY failed to prove the charges.

GREGORY had been fined \$200 for each of 2 counts of battery and \$500 on each of 2 counts of resisting arrest and was ofdered to serve 5 months in the County Jail.

The following information sets forth the summary of the Counterintelligence Program for the Albany Division as requested in reBuairtel.

1. Operations Under Consideration

Pending Bureau approval, the Albany Division is considering a counterintelligence operation wherein black nationalists designated as targets will be exposed to the local police departments so that they may designate these individuals as targets also. The police departments can then issue a series of traffic tickets to the individual targets, of which the target's copy will be destroyed, until a backlog of "unpaid" tickets is accumulated and the issuance of an arrest warrant is necessary. It is planned that the warrant would be held in abeyance until such time as racial violence may appear imminent and information indicates that the target may be engaged in fomenting this violence. The warrant can then be served and the target arrested and incarcerated, thereby preventing his presence in the streets to incite the racial strife.

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2. Operations Being Effected

Inasmuch as no proposed counterintalligence operations have been approved by the Bureau for the Albany Division, there are no operations presently in effect at Albany.

3. Tangible Results

Not applicable at this time.

4. Developments of Counterintelligence Interest.

Presently there is only one black nationalist organization in the Albany Division. Investigation to date has revealed that the organization has not femaled racial trouble in the past nor are there plans within the organization to creat any racial violence in the future. As previously reported to the Bureau, the Nation of Islam has unsuccessfully attempted to establish mosques at Albany, N.Y., and Syracuse, N.Y., however, no colfsustaining mosques have been established to date. In view of the absence of black nationalist activities by organization or individual, the counterintelligence program regarding these matters is limited. If black mationalists in this Division become active to the point the public indicates concern, it is felt that then would be the most appropriate time to more fully exploit the measures made available through this program.

For the information of the Bureau, the Brothers, mentioned in referenced Albany letter to the Bureau, are highly supported by the "Times Union", the local Albany, N.Y., daily newspaper.

are closely associated with the Prothers and support them on a continuing basis through the use of the "Times Union". Contact with the Albany Police Department and the New York State Police has confirmed through their past experience that any attempts to expose the Brothers or any individual members of the Prothers through the newspaper media would undoubtedly result in continuassment to the FBI.

I. OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

By letter forwarded to the Bureau by Jackson on May 11, 1968, the Jackson Division requested approval for a counterintelligence measure against the three main Student Non-violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) functionaries in Mississippi - ROBERT EARL FLETCHER, JR., BOWARD HERSCHEL SPENCER, and MARVIN LOUIS WILSON, all Negro males.

This measure was designed to discredit these three individuals by implying that each of the three are informants of some Mississippi Law Enforcement Agency.

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the measure was to be initiated by submitting separate anonymous letters to SNCC Headquarters in Atlanta, Georgia, addressed to each of the three individual

Each letter would thank the addressee for providing certain specified bits of intelligence information regarding SNCC Classication retained by Said

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

II. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

Regarding B. above, was personally instrumental in screening out many militant Negro youths from participating in any manner in the Southern Caravan portion of the Poor People's Campaign. He was especially watchful for anyone in any manner asso-PJD ciated with SNCC and any allegations he received in this regard were grounds for automatic elimination of individual as Southern Caravan participant.

DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

The Jackson Division has disseminated pertinent information regarding known Mississippi Black Nationalist militants to all appropriate local and State law enforcement officials. They, in turn, carefully scrutinize activities of these individuals for any indications that they may be breaking State or local laws. Any violations result in rapid arrest. In this regard,

Black Nationalist Militants from Jackson, Missimippi, have each been arrested once by local authorities on minor infractions over the past four months.

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Additionally, any information received of out-of-state Black Nationalists traveling to Mississippi, is immediately furnished local and State authorities; these authorities likewise scrutinize activities of these out-of-staters while in Mississippi, for any indications of law-breaking. Recently, two SNCC members from Tennesses following FBI alert to local authorities, were stopped on traffic violation; their automobile was searched and concealed weapons and drugs were found, resulting in more serious charges; charges are still pending and individuals involved were released on bond and immediately returned to Tennessee.

As pointed out in referenced Minneapolic lotter of 4/3/68, there is only one Black Nationalist group in the Minneapolis divison, the Nation of Islam. Member in has not changed since referenced Minneapolis letter. They have not been influencial nor active in the Minneapoltonit. Paul area. As pointed out, their membership varies from 27 to 34 adults. Penetration of this group has been the much approved informant techniques and coverage is offentive. In regard to the overall Black Nationalist moverand, there bave been no significant changes since referenced Minranpolic letter.

OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

In a continuing effort to establish Figgs of communication into the Negro communities in the " marpolis Division, we are considering utilization of resemble liaison racial matters sources as tools for county intelligence activity. For example, when information public's communed alleging cortain rights or wrongs on the part of the more vociferous Negro leaders where it is known such in armetion is incorrect and espoused primarily to incite and a solidify following of such leaders, wherever possible a training source might, through challenging the statement of atatements

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ith fact confidentially furnished by this office, destroy he effectiveness of such erroneous proclamations.

(2) OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

Close periodic all-night liaison during times of suspected stress (such as the ten days immediately following the death of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING) places us in a position to secure immediate information on various activities, including minor arsons, burglaries, resultly racially connected, etc. Also, stress on development of ghetto informants is producing great coverage of entirities of the Negro hoodlum element that is primarily in alread in racial unrest.

(3) TANGIBLE RESULTS

As an example of tangible results effected under one and two above, it is to be pointed out that on the night of Dr. KING's murder, a Negro male in the North Minneapolis ghetto area got drunk in his apartment, told his till he was going to kill the first white man he saw, promoded to leave his apartment, and did just that. Shere's thereafter, a meeting was being held in a South Minusepolis church of many Negroes and whites as a quasi-momental service for Dr. KING. During this meeting, three of the more active Regroes striving for leadership in the Minneapolis North Side community entered the church and one became emotionally upset during his oulogization of Dr. KING and stated, "Where are your young teen-ager tonight? One Negro has just beenkilled in North Minnespolic by a white man." A liaison source present in the church contacted a special agent and asked about thin, rowing that the congregation was very uneasy and almost to the boiling point, as a result of this alleged murice of a Negro youth. The agent who was with inspector in charge of the Minneapolis police was aware in fact that the reverge was true in that a Negro had killed a white man. information was furnished to the lisison source with instructions that he make it known to the assembled group immediately that the charge was a lie and that no Vogro boy had been shot but rather a Negro man had killed a white The source did this, and as a result, the group quiet@d 157-438

down and later orderly dispersed after the ceremon. This is one instance of the value of good liaison now.

(4) DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGETET INTEREST

During this period, there have been no developments of interest in the counterintelligence field other than that set forth above.

MUHAMMAD, Chicago, Ill., bearing the anonymous rignature, "Sister X", accusing of stealing some of the collections made in MM #47. Bureau authority has not yet been received under this project.

2. Operations Being Effected.

There are no purely counterintelligence operations being effected in this program at the present time. However, as mentioned in reTPlet dated 4/4/68, attempts by the MM #47 (NOI - Tampa) to expand into Lake Wales, Fla., have been thwarted through the efforts to and actual investigation conducted by Buagents. MM #47 has been uncuccessful to date in expanding its:coverage into St. Petersburg, Fla. The situation in Lake Wales and St. Petersburg is being watched closely and should an opportunity for counterintelligence operation emerge, appropriate recommendations will be made to the Bureau.

3. Tangible Results.

No tangible results of counterintelligence activity have been achieved to date.

4. Development of Counterintelligence Interest.



I. SUMMARY OF CHANGES SINCE REFERENCED LETTER

There has been no significant change in the over all Black Nationalist Movement within the Columbia Division, however, a new group of the Black Awareness Coordinating Committee, (BACC), has been formed at Voorhees College, Denmark, S. C. This proup is closely associated with the BACC group at South Carolina State College, Orangeburg, S. C., the details of which were set forth in referenced letter.

A subsidiary group of the Association of Afro-American Students, (AAAS), University of S. C., (USC) Columbia, S. C., has recently been formed. 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

It was also learned that used her personally owned automobile on this trip and used the USC gasoline credit card to fill her autovalite with gas. An anonymous telephone call was made to "Live Wire" which is a column in the Columbia Record, a dilly newspaper in Columbia, S. C., which gets the answers to mestions submitted to "Live Wire" dealing primarily with problems of interest to the Columbia community. This anonymous call requested that an explanation be given by USC as to why a militant black power group was attored to use a USC automobile at state expense. This postion and the answer by the USC officials was publicled in "Live Wire". Thereafter individual grown contacted USC demanding an explanation and on 5/23/6 , ~ 0 article appeared in the Columbia Record which meated that USC had restricted their rules on student groups using USC automobiles for trips. It is felt that this operation has stopped the use of college automobiles in S. C. for black power groups to attend profings in other states.

V. DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTERIOR

In South Carolina, one of the concint questions among the citizens is the school situation. It a result of federal laws, many students, both black and white, are being transported out of their own neighborhood and away from schools close to their homes to other actuals in order to insure that all schools are being integrated. This situation is causing hish feelings on the part of both Negro and white people. It is felt then the high school situation for the coming school year till be explosive as many of the young Negro militants are expected to cause trouble in the high schools.

It is believed that high schools will have to form some type of organization such as the open formed by to cope with the problems that are expected to arise during the coming school year. There are enough leaders among the young Negro students to control the few militant leaders. This control can only be accepted when a majority of the students let the militant know that they will not tolerate any actions that will being discredit among them.


The BPP is currently under considerable count attack in Alameda County. Two leaders, ELDRIDGE CLEAVER and UNEX NEWTON, are in jail, and several others who engaged in a story-out with the Oakland Police Department are also in jail, held under high bail. BOBBY SEALE, current BPP Chairman, is free on boil, while he appeals a "gun" conviction. Thus, the BPP has the ived considerable publicity describing their penchant for inlance.

At the same time the various leaders of model at SFSC have been suspended from school and face combination for demonstrations and acts of violence at SFSC. This linewise received publicity to the extent of drawing unfavorable comments from the Governor of California and influential legislators. The President of SFSC resigned under fire.

One would think that after the above the militants would have suffered some loss of stature among the liberal pressend the "respectable" Negro community. Such does not appear to have been the case. The leading Negro newspaper in the area, it "Sun Reporter," has given prominent space to the doings of the RPP and its office was used as the site of a press conference held by the militant leader, HARRY EDWARDS, when he announced his numbership in the BPP. 

The Poor People's Campaign is on the mode in Washington, D.C., but not on foot. The campaign is now buying cars and buses, twelve cars and three inness so far. The mule train got great publicity for the poor people, but when it comes to the hard work of "turning the Mation's Capital upside down," in the words of Reverend Abernathy, the poor people innert in several thousand dollars worth of automotive equivalent.

The three buses are being used to shithly the demonstrators around Washington on their appointed rounds and the dozen cars do the job of transporting campaign leaders to Resurrection City from their quartern at the Pitts Motor Motel. Of course, the angry demonstrators who went to the Pitts Motor Cotol to get Reverend Abernathy for a stay in the mudder camp didn't get to use these cars.

The Poor People's Campaign bought two more cars over the Memorial Day weekend, making the fleet as large as some of the car rental agencies in Washington. If the campaign leaders used commercial bus lines for their trips back and forth from their hotel, the thousands spent on cars would feed a lot of children in Resurrection City.

Relet is the required 90-day summary of counterintelligence operations and should not to med, to request Bureau authority for specific counterintelligence operations. Relet and your letter 4/2/68 set out a possible general suggestion for counterintelligence.

This involved local police targeting specific militants, issuing them parking tickets and destroying the target's copy until a backlog of "unpaid" tickets is built up. Then when racial violence threatens those extremists could be arrested for the unpaid tickets so as to remove them from the scene of potential violence.

Your office, of course, has the responsibility of disseminating information about local black recipient extremists to local authorities. Local police should be kept advised of the identities and activities of these militants when matters of local interest are involved. Any action taken by local police thereafter to prevent violence is the responsibility of local authorities.



It is the area surrounding 4231 Blagdon Ave., in one of Washington's better class areas, where fiery Stokely Carmichael and his new bride, African folk singer Miriam Makeba have just purchased, reportedly for cash, a home in the \$70,000 class.

Now there will be some who will jump to the conclusion that Stokeley, who advocates the realization of black power goals by "any means necessary," has made his radical movement into a very profitable thing. Not necessarily so. His new bride is a very talented, and extremely well paid concert artist, and such a home as the newlyweds may soon occupy is well within her means.

But, no matter, Stokely is free from the ghetto, regardless of the means that made his accomplishment possible. It remains to be seen if his heart will remain stelidfastly with his impoversihed brothers, or its solicitude reserved for special occasions.

This source state 1 that CARMICHAEL's action in this regard appears to have created considerable discussion among Negroes and has created doubt in the minds of these persons as to the true motives of CARRICE AND.

Provided WFO has not already done so, Detroit recommends that the above information be used in an effort to discredit CARMICHAEL as a black nationalist leader. example, through cooperative news media (particularly those directed toward the Negro community) articles could be prepared containing photographs of CARMICHAEL's new residence and his immediate neighborhood and interviews of his white neighbors, all tending to show his high social status among the whites and his financial gains as a result of his participation in \$100 and; the racial movement. A series of articles along this line should be extremely effective.



Detroit recommended articles be prepared in the news media discrediting Carmichael.

Carmichael did not go through with the suschase of the \$70,000 house, but the wide-spread publicity about the matter has already had its effect on his reprintion among black militants. The Bureau has also noted the facetious comment in the press that Carmichael much be an FBI agent or informant.

The Bureau would be interested in sprending the rumor among black nationalists that Carmichael is, indeed, a paid agent of a government intelligence on police agency. Due to Carmichael's extensive travel oversome, and black militants' distrust of the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), it might be appropriate to tag Carmichael with a "CIA label."



Operations under consideration: The San Diego Office plans to conduct interviews of all of the members of the US Group. In these interviews, questions will be asked in such a manner as to weaken the influence of leaders of this group. The growing internal dissension in the group will be encouraged. Bureau authority will be requested in each case before interview unless an opportunity for interview should, present itself in any particular case. Through contact with the San Diego Police Department, this office is encouraging their making it difficult for the group to hold meetings. Various groups who have control of public meeting places will be contacted in an effort to discourage cooperation with the US Group. . Informants will be used to plant seeds of dissensi whenever possible.

Since the US Group is composed of individuals who use druss of various kinds and become involved in robberies and arson, the San Diego Police Lepartment has arrested a number of the members of the group. Close liaison contact is maintained with the police department and whenever the opportunity presents itself, they are encouraged to continue to enforce the law where this group is concerned. On numerous occasions police officers have indicated that they are discouraged because known Black Nationalists have been released by the courts, sometimes without bail. These officers are praised for their part in enforcing the law and are encouraged to continue to do their duty in this respect. The San Diego Office intends to recommend that letters from the Director of the FBI be written to deserving officers who have done outstanding work in law enforcement in the recial field.

The San Diego Office intends to encourage news coverage of anti-violent *tatements by Negroes who are prominent in San Diego, such as ARCHIE MOORE, former heavy weight champion of the world. Sources in the news field will also be encouraged to publicize job opportunities and outstanding accomplishments by Negroes in San Diego.

The San Diego Office will be slert to counterintelligence ection which can be taken against individuals and will request Eureau authority before taking such action. UACB the operations described above will be conducted.

2. Operations being effected:

of the US Group in San Diego has been interviewed by agents of the FBI. He was not cooperative and is completely Black Nationalistic in his thinking. Officers of the San Diego Police Department have advised that a grand jury indictment is being returned against members of the US Group who have been involved in arson attempts against schools in San Diego. They intend to get a grand jury indictment against for conspiracy on the same charge. The grand presently completed a personnel questionairre at his place of employment. The San Diego office made available to the Security Department where he is employed, public source material which refrected that was not only a member of organizations which he did not list, but was in fact an officer in the organizations.

Five members of the US Group were recently arrested by the San Diego County Sheriff's Office on a traffic charge. At the time they had in their possession a quantity of arms and ammunition.

They also had in their possession a number of names of prominent business men in San iego. A number of these business men who are personally known to agents working in the racial field have been contacted to determine whether US Group members have contacted them in an effort to obtain financing or contributions. These individuals have not been contacted to date and there is no indication why the names of these individuals were in the possession of those arrested. These individuals have been advised of the nature of the US Group on a confidential basis and will advise the FBI should they be contacted to furnish financial essistance to this group.

Through lisison with the police department and the San Diego County Sheriff's Office, it has been possible to make it more difficult for this group to find a public meeting place. Teen Post Kumber 1 and a house owned by a woman's club at 2972 Clay Street are now not available as meeting places for this group. They have had to meet at homes of various members and this has cut the attendance at meetings to the hard core members of the group. This a making it more difficult for this group to apread their brand of hatred of the white to the Negro community.

The San Diego Office is making an effort to obtain the license number, make, model and color of cars determined to be available to US Group members. It is believed that should trouble in the Negro area occur, it would be possible to spot and follow activities of this group through information concerning cars available to them.

3. Tengible results:

The US Group is having increasing difficulty in finding places to hold their meetings where they can attact a crowd of Negroes.

Informants report that the US Group is having a problem with dissension among it's members. Some of the members are becoming dissetisfied with the leadership because they want to do all the talking and individual members have little or nothing to say. The leadership has advised members of the group to rob stores to get guns and has told them to take what they want from the white man. As a result of following this policy, several members of the US Group have been arrested. Members of the group are becoming increasingly suspicious of the intentions of RON. KARENGA, the leader of the US, Inc. Group in Los Angeles.

The mis-directed mail technique would only serve as a signal for the "Inner Circle" to tighten security.

It is not believed at this time that an anonymous letter would serve any purpose as such a technique would appear too obvious.

For a mis-directed communication to be effective, it is believed one of the "Inner Circle" should be the target. Further the context of the allegation must not be general in nature, but must be based on some specific event, item, or future plan whereby the other members of the "Inner Circle" would have a bona fide reason for looking with suspicion on the target of the counter-intelligence operation.

The above are observations directed by conditions reportedly existing in the National Headquarters of SNCC and, of course, may not be applicable to branches of SNCC located in other cities.

For the mis-directed mail technique to be successful, it is felt it should be confined to a particular location, dealing with local personalities, events, programs, and projects and based on information furnished by sources in that area regarding SNCC and its operations.

This problem would be further complicated by the fact that many large cities such as New York, Doston, Ni wi, Chicago, Philadelphia, Deattle, San Francisco, Los Ingeles, and New Orleans have regional passport offices which process applications and issue passports. In many instances, these applications do not reach the Passport Office, USDS, for approximately a month after the issuance of a passport.

however, subsequent investigation, as in Legat, London letter May 28, 1968, did not substantiate, or lend credence to GREGORY's use, or receipt of funds from abroad, primarily to have been utilized against the Democratic Convention, August, 1968, in Chicago.

Chicago is continuing to give the matter of discrediting GREGORY top priority, and Bureau authority will be promptly requested at the earliest opportunity in the event a specific counterintelligence device is formulated. It might also be noted, however, as in Chicago airtel of May 21, 1968, that GREGORY also faces a five month sentence, Cook County Jail, Chicago, as a result of the upholding of criminal charges against him, by the Illinois Appellate Court, of 1965 charges in connection with a local demonstration.

Chicago also has under consideration the review of federal income tax returns of HERBERT C. MOHAMMED, since he was pin-pointed as a counterintelligence target in Chicago airtel April 22, 1968, under the above caption, and that of the Nation of Islam (NOI).

These returns, referred to in Bureau letter May 15, 1968, have not as yet been received by Chicago, however, upon receipt, and subsequent review, a specific recommendation regarding counterintelligence action will be submitted.

In previous Chicago communications under above caption, Chicago has identified local Student local Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) official, as a possible target of counterintelligence action, with reference to his possible removal from an active role as a result of his refusal to cooperate with Selective Service officials over his imminent induction into the Armed Forces.

Although not a counterintelligence measure as such, Chicago has vigorously followed and pursued this situation, both with Selective Service and the Office of the United States Attorney. Recently refused to be inducted, his file is in the process of being forwarded by Selective Service to the United States Attorney (USA), who has advised case will be brought before the Federal Grand Jury at the earliest possible moment. The USA has advised that a warrant for the arrest of the contact of the contac

shortly forthcoming. Unquestionably this would serve to further inhibit local SNCC activities, and hopefully, would in some measure serve to neutralize thimself.

Chicago also feels that the Chicago Firearms
Registration Ordinance, which went into effect May 15, 1968,
has definite potential as a counterintelligence device, to be
directed against local militants, as for example

Chicago ordinance, a state law which requires registration of all persons possessing firearms will go into effect September 1, 1968. The penalty for violation of the local ordinance is a \$500 fine, for violation of the state law, a \$1,000 fine and a year incarceration.

Contact with the local office of gun registration has reflected that it will be approximately another 45-60 days before records are organized and alphabetized. The is identified as a possible target in this regard, however, there would appear to be a number of militants who may well be vulnerable.

As the Bureau has cautioned, Chicago assures that each specific future counterintelligence operation will be submitted for Bureau approval prior to taking any action.

2. Operations Being Effected

Chicago at present has no counterintelligence operation in progress, however, as noted will develop such, directed toward HERBERT MOHAMMED, upon receipt of his tax returns from the Bureau.

The impetus being provided to the efforts to expedite the handling of Selective Service case is not a counterintelligence operation in the normal sense of the term, arising as it does from a substantive violation of federal law. However, the end result, that of reducing the effectiveness and hampering the activities of the ist tantamount to that which might be achieved through any such operation with as 1ts target.

3. Tangible Results

With the possible exception of the imminent incarceration of the imminent above, no tangible results have as yet been forthcoming since the inception of this program in the black nationalist field.

4. Developments of Counterintelligence Interest

There have been no significant developments in this field since my airtels of April 22, 1968, which would materially alter programs and approach previously suggested. Chicago appreciates, however, that changing times and developments in the general RM field can have an influence on any counterintelligence operation. Chicago will remain alert to any such development, and when any situation arises, relative to an individual or organization, which offers promise and potential as a counterintelligence operation, an appropriate communication will be promptly submitted.

It might also be noted that in general, the assessment of the local black nationalist movement, as set out in our airtel of April 22, 1968, under the above caption, remains as noted. It was pointed out that GREGORY had threatened to disrupt the Democratic National Convention, in August, 1968, however, as the Burau is aware, he has cancelled his demonstration plans for before and during this convention, and is currently incarcerated.

Chicago assures the Bureau that full and continuing attention is devoted to this aspect of our operation, its potential value is well appreciated and this office will remain alert and receptive to any opportunity to accomplish and establish a productive counterintelligence operation.

There have been no counterintelligence operations placed into effect in the Buffalo Office during the past month. The racial situation and the organizational development in the militant Black Nationalist Field in the Buffalo Division do not suggest any effective counterintelligence device at the present time.

Set forth below is a summary of the situation in the Buffalo Division in which a counterintelligence operation might be considered:

NATION OF ISLAM (NOI)

Racial informants have reported during the past month that Muhammad's Mosque No. 23 (MM No. 23), Buffalo, New York, is in the midst of a membership recruiting drive as announced by Minister JOHN B. X-STRICKLAND. Where 80-90 persons were observed in attendance at public meetings on regular Sunday afternoon affairs at MM No. 23, this number has now increased to approximately 120. Minister STRICKLAND has offered a number of prizes to NOI members to bring in new members. He has proposed the doubling of the present NOI membership. It was mentioned at one recent meeting that Minister STRICKLAND was complimented by NOI leaders in Chicago, Illinois, as being the "second best" Minister in the organization. He has dutifully transmitted between 2 \$4,000.00 and \$5,000.00 per month to the NOI Headquarters 1 Chicago which undoubtedly prompted the above mentioned comoliment.



a friendly newspaper source, with Bureau approval, have thus far met with no success due to the fact that no antablished source within the Negro news media field could in convinced that this type publicity would have the desired effect, but rather would stimulate sympathy among the Negro repulous. Cleveland is continuing liaison with sources in the position to publicize such information, with Bureau approval.

By airtel dated June 20, 1968, Cleveland furnished the Bureau with ten (10) Xerox copies of an editorial from the "Call and Post," a Cleveland, Ohio, Negro workly newspaper of general circulation, June 15, 1968, james, Page 4B, captioned, "STOKELEY, How Could You?" for possible use in captioned program.

cleveland continues to be on the alone for any such articles eminating from communications redea in an effort to furnish them on a timely basis to the furnament for consideration in this program.

2. Operations Being Effected

The Counterintelligence program in the Cleveland Office is being more smoothly administered by the routing of informant dissemination memos through the considerator of the Counterintelligence program on a day-to-day basis. This program of dissemination enables the coordinator to remain constantly abreast of any and all developments in the overall racial field.

Previous operations which have been recreated to the Bureau are under consideration including relicizing the editorial mentioned above which appeared in the "Call and Post," and the script from the movie "Up Timet."

3. Tangible Results

Cleveland has not utilized any counterintelligence measures which have been under the ideal situation of being devised, approved by the Bureau and implemented by the Cleveland field office; however, in the case of as mentioned above, although efforts to produce this fact met with negative results, contacts with for the "Call and Post" appear to have

The following information is submitted aggrading racial intelligence matters in the St. Louis Data ion:

1) Operations Under Consideration

was arrested in St. Louis on 4/18/68 after burglarizing a store for the purpose of obtaining guns for use in riots and racial disturbances which he hoped to foment. Upon arrest claimed he was a representative of CORE and that CORE would "take tare of things" relative to his arrest. I felt the was highly influential and would nelp him. I to date is in jail awaiting trial but is unable to raise bond and apparently ignored by

Since had influenced two youths to accompany him on the burglary and appeared to be quite impressed with CORE, some kind of anonymous publicity regarding abandonment by CORE has been considered. It is falt that an anonymous mailing to CORE membership reporting his abandonment would tend to amplify plight and whole confidence in CORE leadership.

2) Operations Being Effected

There are no racial counterintelligeness programs presently being effected in the St. Louis Division.

3) Tangible Results

Since no operations are presently being effected no tangible results can be reported.

4) Development of Counterintelligence Interest

Recently a group of four to six or ciall Negro militants, two from East St. Louis, Illinois, have been making demands of local Negro radio stations which would require these stations to participate in black antionalist propaganda. These persons, or those connected with them, have intimidated merchants on a local level. Informants have reported that these individuals have no backing by legitimate organizations or groups, but have used Hid-City Community Congress, a church financed civic organization. In doing so these persons have raised the ire of some prominent Negro leaders. One is

holding several important positions such as

been concerned that these persons were using the headquarters of the Mid-City Community Congress, an ostensible non-militant organization, for the planning of some of their activity of which he disapproves. It is a lirison source of the St. Louis Division and has cooperated with the FBI for several years. Consideration is being given to enlistment of the regarding some type of publicity which would tend to discourage or discredit these racial militants.

Black nationalist organizations and help groups remain as previously described in referenced St. Louis letter. No definable new organizations have developed and leadership in existing organizations remains as it was last outlined. The potential for violence of the Nation of Island (NOI) does not seem to have been effected by the passage of time since 4/5/68.
