RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the following anonymous letter be mailed to the Manager of WSTV-TV from Steubenville, The letter reads as follows:

"Dear Sir:

"As long time residents of the upper Ohio Valley, we have been very interested in WSTV-TV as it has such a pervasive influence in our area. Your station has in large part been a positive factor in the progress of the area and your programming has always consisted of a responsibility balance between the national and local events. WSTV has always, we feel, fairly reflected the public interest.

"Frankly, the compelling reason for this We feel that by supporting and giving him a forum for his views, WSTV is encouraging civil disorder, violence, and is directly leading to the undermining of the citizens' confidence in government, both local and international.

"To support our charge, you need only review some of his programs and note the importance of many of his seemingly innoculous statements and reflect upon them.

"We think that it behooves you, as a public broadcasting facility, to take cognizance of activities and pronouncements. To help you in this matter, the following information is being brought to your attention:

"On February 17, 1969, the "Black Panther,"
the official newspaper of the Black Panther
Party (BPP), carried an article by
which was a cleverly disguised piece of propaganda
concerning Huey Newton, who is, as you know, a
founder of the BPP. Newton was convicted by a
California court of killing a police officer. We
do not feel that a man who eulogizes Newton
should have a forum on television for the further
dissension of his views.

"The BPP calls for its members to arm themselves, use their guns and start a revolution. They openly claim that they will use guerrilla tactics and overthrow the American Government. To check on this, you need only to subscribe to or read one issue of their newspaper.

that belongs to locally, is not really a chapter of the BPP? He has openly criticized the Community Action Council, COMBAT and the NAACP. By criticizing these groups and causing people to question their actions and integrity, he poses as the only individual who truly has the black man's interests at heart. This, you know, is false. Will he not some day turn on you also? Is he not now calling upon his followers to arm themselves and create a disturbance in our schools and at our athletic contests?

"We think it would be most illuminating for you to determine why the trustees, all black, of the Phyllis Wheatley Association, no longer allow to use their premises for his meetings with high school students. We feel you should determine who the black militant hate mongers are whom he introduces into the community. Why has Taylor so antagonized many of his colleagues in the civil rights field?

"Thank you for your consideration in this matter."

The Cincinnati Division, at Steubenville, Ohio, recognizes that it will be more effective if this information could be given to a personal contact at the television station. This is not being considered as the risk of exposure is too great for the following reason:

There is a great deal of prostitution and gambling in the Steubenville area and two announcers, who work for the television station, are involved in these matters. It is felt that the anonymous letter technique is the more prudent approach at this time, and therefore it is recommended.

OBJECTIVE

It is felt that by bringing this information to the attention of the television station, they will have to consider its implications.

They have numerous alternatives, but it is hoped that they will consider terminating subject's contract at a suitable time after a preliminary inquiry reveals the facts in the letter to be true. If they do not make an inquiry and do not consider terminating services, it is felt that they at least will show the letter to and it is felt that this will cause him to tone down many of his statements.

FOLLOW UP

Depending upon any tangible results obtained from this letter, the Cincinnati Division could send the same letter to various advertisers with a different forward, and requesting them to withdraw their advertising from WSTV-TV. In connection with this follow up, the Cincinnati Division would utilize as enclosures anti-sematic statements made by Black Nationalists.

It is recommended that the Bureau approve the above measure to be instituted by the Cincinnati Division at the earliest possible date.

The program "wild Grapes" was presented on WFLA TV, Tampa, Florida. It has interviews of black extremists associated with the Junta of Militant Organization, St. Petersburg, Florida, as well as interviews of New Left leaders. Editorial comment during the program brings out the extremist nature of this organization. The program was prepared with the assistance on a confidential basis of the Tampa Division as a counterintelligence measure. Tampa recommends obtaining a copy of the program for showing at In-Service classes and for possible use of other offices considering similar counterintelligence operations. We concur, in addition, the film should be useful for briefing purposes. Cost of reproduction, which will be handled by our established source at WFLA TV through a commercial firm, will be between \$180 and \$300. It is necessary to obtain a l6mm print of this film for our purposes as equipment for viewing the program on video tape is not readily available.

I. Operations Under Consideration

By letter dated 2/26/69, Houston Division proposed a counterintelligence measure directed against the Black Penther Party (BPP) nation-wide which proposal dealt with a communication directed to the various BPP chapters throughout the country requesting a minimum of \$500 be sent to a Post Office Box in Oakland, California which box would be rented in the name of one of the officials of the BPP. It is felt this proposal if put into effect would cause considerable distrust among the BPP and in particular the leadership of the BPP which reportedly is undergoing considerable financial difficulties. No action is being taken on this proposal pending specific Bureau instructions.

II. Operations Being Effected

No specific counterintelligence operation is currently being effected against the Black Nationalist-Hate Groups in Houston other than to continue to capitalize on well placed informants within the NOI and within the group attempting to establish a BPP chapter in Houston. In this regard informants have reported that as a result of the recent trip to Chicago for the National NOI Convention, the male members of the contingent were put in a hotel room, four persons to each room and were charged \$10 a piece per night for their lodging. This money was given to of the Houston contingent and it was determined by the membership that the room rent was only \$18.00. Members have inquired and continue to be unhappy with the fact that

It is pointed out also that through the control of well placed informants within the group attempting to form a BPP chapter in Houston, no chapter has been formed to date and it appears that the persons who formerly desired a BPP chapter in Houston are losing interest in this endeavor.

III. Tangible Results

Results of counterintelligence action in the Houston Division have been considerable friction developing among the NOI members and leaders because of money matters and also a significant result as regards the BPP is the fact that no BPP chapter has been formed in Houston to date.

IV Development of Counterintelligence Interest

No outstanding development of a counterintelligence interest has developed in the Houston Division; however, well placed informants within the black nationalist groups have been instructed to remain alert for a possibility of counterintelligence action against the black nationalist groups and in the event additional counterintelligence actions appear feasible, the Bureau will be advised.

COUNTERINTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

The Memphis Office is on a continuing basis attempting to develop informants within the ranks of the known black militant organizations within this Division and has made repeated efforts during the past 90 days in sending logical and willing potential informants into meetings of these organizations in an effort to have these potential informants recruited into these black militant organizations. These efforts are continuing and it is contemplated that within the near future one or more of these individuals will be accepted into the black militant organizations known as the Invaders and the Black Knights.

Due to the success of the counterintelligence program whereby the Memphis Office has been furnishing to a reliable newspaper source of the Memphis Office information regarding the black militant organization known as the Invaders, as set out hereinafter, the Memphis Office is giving consideration to increasing this type of counterintelligence activity and a preliminary contact has been made with a representative of the Memphis "Commercial Appeal" who has always been cooperative with this Bureau in an effort to determine his interest in writing articles. exposing the Invaders organization and the Black Knights organization



II. COUNTERINTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

Interview Program

The Memphis Office is continuing its policy of interviewing any Negro who is known to associate with any black militant group at Memphis, Tennessee, immediately upon ascertaining his identity and provided no Burcau restrictions are in effect which would preclude interviewing It is hoped that such an interview program this individual. will serve two purposes, one, the development of potential informants, and, two, will keep this individual from perhaps becoming a confirmed and active member of any black militant group at Memphis, Tennessee. There is evidence that these initial interviews which are general in nature and merely point out to the individual being interviewed the dangerousness and the anti-Negro position of these black militant organizations and on several occasions, it is known that these interviews have resulted in the potential member of the Invaders and/or the Black Knights having nothing further to do with these organizations.

The exchange of information on a daily basis with the Intelligence Unit of the Memphis, Tennessee, Police Department, which has resulted in numerous arrests, not only of black militants at Memphis, Tennessee, but also members of the newly formed chapter of the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) at Memphis State University, is continuing and has proved beneficial to both the Memphis, Tennessee, Police Department and to the local FBI Office. Due to the informant cowrage of the Memphis Office in a photographic sense, the Memphis Office has been in a position to obtain photographs of most, if not all, of the current members of the Invaders and as a result has been able to furnish the Memphis, Tennessee, Police Department copies of these photographs which have been of great assistance to the Police Department in policing this Invaders group.

III. TANGIBLE RESULTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS

The "leaking" of derogatory information regarding the Invaders and their plans to a trusted newspaper source has resulted in almost daily articles exposing the activities of the militant group at Memphis known as the Invaders. This expose of Invaders activities has resulted in numerous results, not the least of which has been the willingness of merchants at Memphis, Tennessee, who have been subject to what amounts to extortion by members of these Invaders being willing to come forward now and testify against these individuals in court. These newspaper articles have exposed the Invaders as being young thugs preying on their own race and have shattered the illusion among the Negro populace of Memphis that the Invaders are interested in helping their own people. This series of articles was culminated by a full-page article by in which set forth an outline of activities of the Invaders, those that have been arrested with their crimes, and the identities of the victims of these crimes, Summarizing paragraph at the end of this article pointed out that the majority of crimes committed by these Invaders had been against people of the Negro race. This article has resulted in numerous calls by responsible Negroes at Memphis, Tennessee, to both the FBI at Memphis and to the Memphis Police Department indicating that they no longer have any sympathy for this Invaders There have been several instances where Negroes have offered their services to the Memphis Police Department in an effort to combat this Invaders group.

Care is being exercised to insure that information furnished to is information that could be obtained at various public meetings or through public sources if an interested person was at these meetings or knew where to look for the information.

Information being received recently from RI(PRCB) (Ghetto) sources of the Memphis Office indicates that these articles written by have resulted in wide-spread disillusionment with the Invaders on the part of the Negro populace at Memphis, Tennessee.



IV. DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

During the past 90 days, through cooperation with authorities of the Intelligence Unit of the Memphis, Tennessee, Police Department and the administrators of Memphis State University (MSU), the newly formed SDS Chapter at MSU has been unable to secure a charter and some 11 of their members have been arrested charged with possession or use of marijuana. Nine of these members were arrested as a result of information obtained from Bureau informants and furnished to the Vice Squad of the Memphis Police Department. This tactic has resulted in the inability of this SDS Chapter to secure a charter at Memphis State University, has caused a great many of their former members to drop out of this organization, and has rendered this organization at the present time inept.

While this is not directly connected with the black militant hate groups, it should be pointed out that every effort is being made on the SDS Chapter at Memphis to recruit Negro members and they are working hand in hand with the Black Student Association (BSA) at MSU which is a cell or a branch of the over-all Black Power organization at Memphis known as the Black OrganizingProject (BCP).

Two informants have been developed in this SDS Chapter and are active members of this SDS chapter and counterintelligence activities directed against the SDS members, particularly with regard to their use of marijuana, is being continued by the Memphis Office.

The Memphis Office is making every effort to be alert to any counterintelligence operation that might disrupt or embarrass local black militant activities at Memphis, Tennessee.

The Bureau will be kept advised of all developments.

While the newspaper has relatively little circulation and interest in the Black community, it can be expected to improve its stature. Pitt Hires Black Leader

Hovize To Recruit Negro Students

The University of Pittsburgh has enlisted a black militant to co-ordinate a retruiting drive for "qualifiable" black students backed by an \$53,060-a-year scholarship program.

The financial aid plan — launched last summer along with a stepped-up search for prospective Negro scholars — has been renamed the Malcolm Martin Marcus scholarships.

Men Honored

That name honors black leavers Malcolin X, Dr. Martin Luther King and Marcus Garvey.

The University - Community Education Program announced at the same time its selection of Sam Howze of the Hill District to co-ordinate its searchand-scholarship efforts.

Howze, 25, also known as Sala U Din Sail Salaam, is chairman of the Afro-American Institute, which promotes black history and culture study.

50 Grants Available

Fifty Malcolin Martin Marcus scholarships—each worth up to \$1700 a year—will be awarded to needy and potentially-able students this summer.

Thirty of the grants will go to black students from Allegheny County, 10 to black students from outside the County and 10 to members of other minority groups such as Puerto Ricans or Mexicans.

These students, identified as seeding academic help to enter college, will be brought to the Pitt campus for a special preparatory program in the summer.

A Pitt spokesman pointed out that the search for black students extends beyond the Malcolm Martin Marcus scholarship project, which is backed by foundation grants.

He said Pitt hopes to have 200 blacks among the entering frashman class this fall. This figure would nearly double the number of blacks among last fall's freshmen.



3. WFO has noted and reported on instances in the recent past in which black extremists have lectured to students at Cardoza and Eastern High Schools under the guise of black studies programs. II. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

 Pittsburgh advised on 11/14/68, that an Agitator Index subject of that office. in a -exhibited a current membership card in the National Rifle Association (NRA) during investigation of a complaint that he was providing firearms training for members of the Black Nationalist movement in Pittsburgh. With Bureau permission, this information was provided on a confidential basis to an established contact in the membership section of the NRA for membership. The contact possible action to revoke advised that the information concerning was sufficient to merit revocation of membership but that such action must be the result of the membership committee. The contact advised that he would present the information relating to to the membership committee for action. In addition, he stated that any similar information concerning members of the NRA would be welcome inasmuch as the NRA is desirous of removing from its rolls any individual who uses guns or his NRA membership in a wrongful manner.

2. With reference to the incipient Black Panther Party (BPP) organization in Washington, D.C., being formed by FO is following a general policy of establishing contact with BPP members or prospective members within a reasonably short time after they have been identified as such. The purpose of these interviews has been to determine the attitudes of the individuals, to attempt to further the coverage of this group through source development and to serve notice on the leaders of these BPP members of the active investigative interest of the Federal Government through the FBI.

III. TANGIBLE RESULTS

These contacts were terminated on 2/20/69, when expressed anger and resentment to the contacting agent, indicating that interviews of his members and prospective members were seriously impeding his efforts to establish a viable BPP in Washington, D. C.

IV. DEVELOPMENTS OF A COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

The Bureau was previously advised that the New School for Afro-American Thought (NSAT) was involved in an internal power struggle for control of the school. Sources of WFO familiar with NSAT have advised that a more moderate group intent on stressing the educational function of the school has taken control and that the more militant clique no longer frequents the NSAT.

WFO is prepared to infiltrate any incipient BPP organization with informants who will thereby be in a position to grow with the organization and place themselves in a position of leadership.

Thereafter, WFO intends to identify and interview all members and prospective members with the threefold purpose of 1) further identifying members of the organization and determining the extent of their black extremist attitude and involvement, 2) possible informant development, and 3) making the individuals and the chapter aware of the interest of the FBI in the BPP.



It contains several accusations which should cause great concern. The letter is to be mailed in a cheap, unmarked envelope with no return address and sent from St. Louis to residence in Cairo. Since her letters to are usually sent via the Black Liberator Headquarters, any member would have access to getting her address from one of her envelopes. This address is available to the St. Louis Division.

Her response, upon receipt of this letter, is difficult to predict and the counter-intelligence effect will be nullified if she does not discuss it with him. Therefore, to insure that the Black Liberators are made aware that the letter was sent, the below follow-up action is necessary:

St. Louis will furnish Springfield with a machine copy of the actual letter that is sent. Attached to this copy will be a neat typed note saying:



"A mutual friend made this available without knowledge. I understand she recently recieved this letter from St. Louis. I suggest you look into this matter.

God Bless You! "

This note would give the impression that somehow one of close friends, probably a minister, obtained a copy of the letter and made it available to the The above material is to be mailed by the Springfield Division at Cairo, Ill., anonymously in a suitable envelope with no return address to:



Although is now living in E. St. Louis, Ill., he did use the above address when arrested in St. Louis in Jan., 1969, and it was printed in local newspapers. Mail will reach him at the above address since it is the residence of a close associate of his.

ANTICIPATED RESULTS:

The following results are anticipated following the execution of the above-counter-intelligence activity:

- 1. Ill feeling and possibly a lasting distrust will be brought about between the state of the concern over what to do about it may detract from his time spent in the plots and plans of the SNCC. He may even decide to spend more time with his wife and children and less time in Black Nationalist activity.
- The Black Liberators will waste a great deal of time trying to discover the writer of the letter. It is possible that their not-too subtle investigation will lose present members and alienate potential ones.
- 3. Inasmuch as Black Liberator strength is ebbing at its lowest level, this action may well be the "death-blow."

RECOMMENDATION:

Bureau authority is requested to initiate the above-described activity.

Succinct summary of Black Nationalist Movement in Indianapolis Division:

Nation of Islam (NOI)

Since the last letter the NOI of the Indianapolis Office has remained fairly stable in membership neither gaining nor losing an appreciable amount of members. The NOI has approximately 140 persons attending meetings, at a total of seven temples or mosques. There are two mosques which are located in South Bend and Gary, Indiana, mosques number 31 and 33 respectively. South Bend remains the largest with about 50 members, Gary having about 45 members. There are temples located at Evansville, Fort Wayne, Muncie, Indianapolis, and East Chicago, Indiana, which continue to struggle for existence.

In the last two weeks the BPP has been concentrating on two high schools in Indianapolis with predominantly or almost total Negro students in attempts to get them to strike. They have been unsuccessful in their attempts but they have on several occasions possibly had a part in getting the students and faculty stirred up by passing out literature, and asking to speak to the students.

All activities of the BPP are followed in a bi-weekly letter.

D. Afro-American Student Association (AAASA)

The Afro-American Student Association continues to exist at Indiana University, Bloomington, Indiana, and at Notre Dame University, South Bend, Indiana. However the organization has not engaged in any activities at either university since last letter. They have made no demands of the universities or issued any statements as an organization since last letter. These groups are being followed closely in the event they do become active.

1. Operations Under Consideration

Plans to interview all members of black extremist organizations even though they are not active are being considered, which it is felt may produce information of value and possibly help in the development of informants. Prior to this only active members have been considered for interview. It is felt that this also may particularly effect the BPP in driving some of the more inactive members away and causing the BPP leaders some fear.

2. Operations Being Effected

Attempts to interview active members of the BPP have been made in addition to active members of the other black extremist organizations. Through these interviews with other groups valuable information has been gained even though the person being interviewed did not know he was furnishing information of value. In addition in the BPP one of the officers was interviewed and developed as an informant and he furnished information concerning his trip to the National BPP Retreat held in Oakland, California in November, 1968. All possibilities to use informants to gain information leading to arrest of members is being utilized as well as in any other areas of counterintelligence.

3. Tangible Results

The black extremist groups in the Indianapolis Division to date have not been united or have not become sufficiently strong to cause any major incidents or disturbances. Although the possibility is ever present no violence has been encountered from these groups.



Number One shows with a list containing the which have been crossed off. The names of SEALE and WALLACE remain on his list.

Number Two indicates that BOBBY SEALE is simply and is in complete control of all factions of the BPP. This is a sensitive area since it is reported that many local BPP leaders feel that they are more qualified to control their own groups than is SEALE.

Number Three suggests that possibly SEALE is himself a "police agent" and, in addition to demanding substantial amounts of money from the local BPP membership, is also passing information on to local police authorities. This caricature is aimed at BOBBY SEALE's announced program of purging the BPP of informants.

Number Four attacks a very sensitive point among BPP members in that there is a prevalent feeling that the individual member chapters are being exploited by SEALE. The drawing depicts SEALE extracting his 50% from the local BPP chapters and in effect returning them to a subserviant role within the BPP framework.

Number Five who is as being a "paper tiger." It is felt that the paper tiger terminology is in keeping with the BPP's espousement of MAO TSE TUNG's teachings.

The cartoons will be mailed anonymously one at a time, one week apart. Five copies of each cartoon will be sent to BPP offices on a weekly basis.

The Bureau indicated in referenced airtel that the resident addresses of local BPP leaders should be obtained from the BPP newspaper. A complete review of BPP newspapers available to the San Diego Division has failed to reveal any resident addresses of any BPP member. Therefore, the following information is being requested of each receiving office:

Since Minneapolis letter of 12/2/68 there has been no racially-oriented violence in the Twin Cities, Minnesota, area, where practically all Negroes in this Division reside, with the following exception: In January, 1969, there was a one-day take-over of the Administration Building at the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, by the Afro-American Action Committee, a University of Minnesota-approved campus organization. This take-over was to present demands on the University generally for the purposes of setting up Afro-American courses and obtaining more scholarships for minority races. This demonstration ended with the intervention by the police and the University agreed to meet most of the demands. Sources to this point have indicated no program on the part of this group to incite racial violence.

As of this writing, there are no active Black Nationalist hate groups operating in the Minneapolis Division except the Nation of Islam, whose membership remains constant and which group has not been involved in any local racial disturbances. As mentioned in MPlet 2/18/69, there has been an effort on the part of two individuals who attended the Black Panther Party retreat in California in November, 1968, to establish a chapter of the Black Panther Party in Minneapolis. As of this date, there has been no information developed that such a chapter does exist. Minneapolis has close informant coverage in the Negro community and will continue to follow closely the activity of the few militants in the Division who might possibly be involved in organizing a Black Panther Party.



The majority of the Negro students are members of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), which operates a Chapter at Ferris State College (FSC) and is a recognized campus organization.

On the evening of 3/3/69 263 Negro students were arrested when they refused to leave a school auditorium. The Negroes had stated that they had refused to leave the auditorium because they feared for their safety.



"I write this letter as a concerned parent and I am sure there are hundreds more who feel like I do. So let's have our Government leaders, politicians, and responsible Civic leaders get behind President Spathelf and let him know that we support him in what he is doing for the good of all the students in the school.





It is believed that this counterintelligence technique could render great harm to the subject's reputation and standing in the black nationalist community. IV. DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

Internal dissension in the BPP in San Diego appears to be increasing on almost a daily basis. This appears to be attributable to a major degree to the authorized counterintelligence activities being utilized by the San Diego Office. The BPP members are currently in a state of confusion and feel that no one within the party, including the leadership, is any longer trustworthy.

V. ADMINISTRATIVE

For the information of the Bureau, the television -interview of the enclosed tape cassette along with the first portion of side two.

It is requested that the enclosed tape be brought to the personal attention of the first who has expressed a specific interest in this particular tape.

The Burcau is also requested to review the tape in the light of possible utilization in the counterintelligence and racial briefing programs of other divisions. It is felt that the interview of a BPP leader who describes the BPP as being armed, having an army, being anti-capitalist, being pro-Chinese communist, and advocating a bloody revolution, would be of particular value to the west coast offices. No information has been received since submission of re letter that the two chapters of the BPP located in the Omaha Division at Omaha, Nebraska, and Des Moines, Iowa, have held regular meetings or been involved in any activity as a group. As indicated in re letter, a former lieutenant in the Omaha chapter of the BPP considered this chapter to be almost out of existence.

No counterintelligence accomplishments under captioned program have been obtained during the past twoweek period and because of the inactivity of the two chapters in the division, it is not felt that intelligent recommendations can presently be made concerning counterintelligence measures aimed at crippling this organization.

This matter will continue to receive close attention and any suggestions for counterintelligence activity at a future date against the BPP or its leadership will be submitted by separate letter.

In view of the recent developments, Milwaukee will submit a biweekly letter under captioned program, beginning 4/7/69, UACB.



In April, 1968 through June, 1968 several individuals formed a group in Indianapolis, Indiana, and called themselves the Black Panthers, although they were not affiliated in any wry with the nationally known Black Panther Party. In June. 1968 they were arrested when attempting to burglarize the U. S. Marine Corps Reserve Training Center, in Indianapolis in an attempt to obtain weapons. Since that arrest however. the Black Panther Party Chapter in Indianapolis affiliated with national organization was formed. It has supported the individuals arrested and had several fund raising projects to obtain funds for their defense. Last week, in March, 1969, FBI agents testified in local case against individuals who were arrested last June, and in addition a former informant of the Indianapolis Office testified. persons have been in jail since June, 1968, and two were found guilty of burglary, and sentenced two to forteen years, as - a result of informant's and agents testifying. In addition to the burglary charge the subjects were acquitted on a conspiracy to commit murder charge in which they had discussed possible plans to murder the chief of police in Indianapolis. and another officer of the Indianapolis Police Department.

Further possibilities to disrupt BPP activities and plans through informants and possible arrest by local authorities will be watched for, and utilized whenever possible.

3. Investigation at Syracuse, N. Y., has disclosed that there are presently 8 members of the United Black Brothers organization who are recipients of monthly welfare payments. These monthly checks average about \$100 each, and a seceiving approximately \$90 of each check. It is felt that nonondaga County Welfare Department, could be confidentially apprised of the true nature of the United Black Brothers Organization in an attempt to terminate this source of funding.

Albany is of the opinion that implementation of the above recommendations would be a method of hampering the activities of the United Black Brothers organization and insuring that the organization fails to achieve its desired ends.

Pursuant to instructions in referenced letter, Buffalo has given consideration to various counterintelligence measures which might possibly be applied to the Black Panther-Party (BPP) chapter recently established in Rochester, N.Y. It is desired to point out that this chapter is presently highly disorganized, is made up of very few members, and has no funds with which to operate. It lacks any kind of leader-ship against whom a planned counterintelligence project could be operated.

The Buffalo Office has conducted a series of interviews of known members of the Rochester chapter of BPP, and extremely close liaison is maintained with the Rochester PD, Special Intelligence Unit, in connection with the BPP. The latter unit has kept a close watch on the activities of this chapter, and the interviews are believed to have effectively kept this chapter off balance during its formative stages.

The above chapter has surrendered its headquarters at 400 Joseph Avenue, Rochester, having rented this space in October, 1968, and failed to pay any rent since November 1, 1968. They are presently seeking a new headquarters but have not thus far been successful. Consideration has been given to calling attention to members of this chapter the various acts of financial mismanagement on the part of some of the top leaders of the BPP, including KATHERINE CLEAVER, wife of LEROY ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, who appeared with the latter at the time he gave a

It is felt, at this time, that the present disorganized and bankrupt state of the Rochester BPP chapter is such as to mitigate any real effect of spreading a rumor about the conduct of national officers because this chapter appears to be very remotely connected and/or interested in the actions of the more highly placed BPP leaders. This suggested counterintelligence move will be kept under consideration for future use if this chapter becomes more formally organized.

The inactive status of the Rochester BPP chapter at this time does not seem to present any effective counterintelligence operation. Buffalo will continue to follow this matter very closely and will keep the Bureau advised of its recommendations.

As in referenced letter, developments within the local Black Panther Party (BPP) have been reviewed from the standpoint of the formulation of an effective counterintelligence device.

Based on information which has been obtained since referenced letter, a productive counter-intelligence opportunity has not presented itself.

No tangible results have been reported by Chicago sources relative to previous Chicago counter-intelligence suggestions regarding the BPP.

The Bureau has been previously advised under this caption of the! mob action warrant from Maywood, Illinois, the arrest having been effected as a result of the alertness of and information provided trial, in Maywood, has since been held and he has been found innocent of these charges.

Since referenced letter Chicago has also advised local police authorities, specifically the Gang Intelligence Unit, Chicago Police Department, of the violation of the terms of his local probation by a local Black Panther officer, in that he was arrested in Springfield, Illinois, in February, 1968. The information was also provided to probation authorities, however, in neither instance was there any interest expressed in pursuing this matter by local authorities.



Information concerning the background and militant activities of the background and militant has been recently furnished to which

Washington Field Office has recently furnished public source information concerning the activities of the National Rifle Association (NRA) of which as a member, and the information is to be presented to the membership committee of the NRA for possible action to revoke the membership of the office therefrom. This action is considered highly desirable inasmuch as the constantly involved with firearms and membership in the NRA may possibly lend an air of legitimacy to these activities.

(3) Tangible Results

As a result of information made available to an established contact at the "Pittsburgh Press," concerning mentioned above, an article appeared in that newspaper on in an unfavorable light.

(4) Developments of Counterintelligence Interests

As is being experienced on a nationwide basis, racial agitational activities in the Pittsburgh area are presently being conducted for the most part in schools, both high schools and colleges. Two high schools in the Pittsburgh area have recently experienced racial outbreaks and there have been short takeovers of property at two colleges in Pittsburgh by black students, during the current academic year.

As a result of these activities, the Pennsylvania State Legislature is presently considering a bill to increase the penalties for such takeovers of schools by students.

The present indication is that the Legislature will probably pass the law, however, there is strong indication that it will be vetoed by the Pennsylvania Governor. It also noted that the bill is generally opposed by academic leaders as an infringement of academic freedom.

There are presently two black student organizations on college campuses in the Pittsburgh area: The Black Action Society at the University of Pittsburgh and the Black League of Afro-American Culture at the Allegheny Community College, Pittsburgh. The activities of both of these organizations are being considered from a counterintelligence standpoint and any recommendations for specific action against either organization will be submitted to the Bureau by separate letter.

The Boston Office contemplates the setting up of a "paper" organization, under a suitable name, which will keep the responsible Negro ghetto community ostensibly informed of activities of the Black Panther Party, Boston (BPF-B), whose activities are undermining and damaging the legro community as a whole. This "paper" organization will operate through a blind post office box with suitable recurity measures taken, through which anonymous mailings will be made to selective Megro businessmen and responsible legro citizens in the ghetto area. These mailings will nelude posters, which can be pasted up, and which will contain selective information concerning the activities of the BPP-B which will be designed to arouse animosity of the responsible Negro community against the BPP-B.

In this connection it is noted that recently a

reported that many of his Negro customers have been complaining of housebreaks at residences in Roxbury, as well as purse snatchings. According to the source, the homes of these Negroes are being looted of television sets and other expensive appliances; most of these victims are regularly employed Regroes who resent these raids by other Regroes.







II. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

The first of the five Bureau authorized cartoons has been mailed and the second is currently being prepared for mailing. III. TANGIBLE RESULTS



The following information sets forth the summary of the Counterintelligence Program for the Albany Division as requested in referenced Bureau airtel:

1. Operations Under Consideration

The United Black Brothers of Syracuse has been established as a militant black nationalist organization in the Syracuse area posing under the public front of being a self-help organization for needy Negro men. A large portion of financial support from this organization is derived from the Syracuse Council of Churches. The Albany Division is considering approaching an established contact within the Syracuse Council of Churches and exposing the United Black Brothers as a black hate group in an effort to end the financial support being received from the Council of Churches.

The Albany Division is further contemplating the possibility of publicly exposing the United Black Brothers through the use of the "Herald Journal", a Syracuse, N. Y., daily newspaper in which there is an established source of the Albany Office. It is felt that discrediting articles regarding the United Black Brothers would bring this organization into public view to expose it as the hate group it actually is.

Investigation has revealed that various members of the United Black Brothers are on State Welfare and that a portion of these welfare checks are given to It is being

Set forth hereinafter is the periodic progress letter concerning captioned matter, as directed in Bureau airtel March 4, 1968, under the captions as instructed:

1. Operations Under Consideration

Since the above referenced letter, Chicago has continued to closely follow local developments in the Black Nationalist field, with the development of effective counterintelligence techniques constantly in mind. Although all facets of Black Nationalist activities and groups are so considered, the local Black Panther Party (BPP) chapter and its activities continue to receive particular attention. This is due to the admittedly violent and militant nature of the BPP, as well as the volatile nature of the individuals who compose both its leadership and membership.

Chicago is under Bureau instructions to submit on a two-week basis a counterintelligence proposal regarding the BPP, and since referenced letter a number of specific proposals have been submitted and approved. Chicago has prepared and mailed four separate anonymous communications, concerning December 10, 1968), approved Bureau letter January 30, 1969, and (approved Bureau letter January 30, 1969, and (approved Bureau letter Epbruary 20, 1969.

Since referenced letter Chicago also has requested and received Bureau authority to utilize a countilling intelligence activity directed against the Nation of Islam (NOI).

has since advised that the NOI attacks on MALCOLM have generally produced unfavorable results within the Negro community on the south side, particularly since the NOI in many quarters is still regarded responsible for the death of MALCOLM.

Accordingly, Chirago will shortly submit, by separate communication, Bureau authority to recontact relative to possibilities of further exploiting the NOI attacks on MALCOLM, directed at further reflecting unfavorable reaction toward the NOI.

At present Chicago has no further specific counterintelligence proposals under consideration. Another letter regarding the BPP, however, is due for submission March 24, 1969.

2. Operations Being Effected and Tangible Results Obtained

Reference has previously been made to the specific counterintelligence actions initiated by Chicago. As yet no information has been received by Chicago reflecting tangible results of these actions.

A detailed analysis of the use of was set forth in Chicago airtel of February 17, 1969. In short, it was noted that the NOI was shown publicly as more of a business than a religious group, and articles authored by him may have had the effect of rendering NOI officials vulnerable to robbery efforts, as in the case of February 4, 1969. The lis being considered.

Chicago has also continued to advise local authorities of instances where local Black Nationalists, particularly BPP members, appear vulnerable to arrest on local charges. Along these lines Chicago letter of February 10, 1969, set forth specific information whereby was arrested just prior to a television appearance, through efforts of a Chicago BPP source and Chicago Special Agents. The arrest was an effective source of embarrassment to the BPP; however, was subsequently found innocent, in jury trial, of the mob action charges for which he had been arrested.

Additionally, information has regularly been disseminated by Chicago to other Bureau offices for local dissemination in instances where Chicago BPP subjects have travelled elsewhere. Specifically local BPP subjects have on several occasions journeyed to the University of Illinois, Champaign, Illinois, and their activities there have resulted in numerous arrests. Prior knowledge of the presence of these subjects, their purposes and identities, have been of great value in alerting local authorities to the potential for violence represented.

One of those local BPP members arrested in Springfield was determined to be on probation on local Chicago charges. Inasmuch as the arrest represented a violation of this probation, the information regarding the arrest was made available to the appropriate Chicago Police authorities, and probation authorities. Unfortunately, both expressed a lack of interest in taking any action in this matter.

4. Developments of Counterintelligence Interest

As in the recent past, the most significant area of development continues to center around the activities of the local BPP. It has suffered from organizational and factional problems, as well as financial difficulties, and has yet to prove its ability to serve as a cohesive or unifying influence in the local Black Nationalist community.

As concerns the remainder of local Black Nationalist, individuals and groups, the situation continues to be fragmented, with none appearing of sufficient stature or influence that the divergent groups are willing to sacrifice their own limited objectives, or independance, for the sake of a united front.

Memorandum W. C. Sullivan to C. D. DeLoach 2-13 69 indicated the National Episcopal Church (NEC), New York City, intends to furnish the Afro-American Society of Greater Atlanta (AASGA) funds totaling \$34,000, ostensibly for the purpose of improving race relations in Atlanta. However, AASGA is actually a front name for SNCC. It has been ascertained that who is in at Atlanta, did receive \$34,000 in the name of AASGA. The NEC subsequently questioned whether AASGA was a bona fide organization and retrieved the \$34,000 to further consider this matter. Jenkins has expressed the opinion NEC will re-issue the funds in a few weeks with the knowledge AASGA is actually a SNCC organization. SNCC is one of the most notorious black extremist organizations in the country. Under the leadership of Stokely Carmichael and

H. Rap Brown it has advocated a black revolution through violence and guerrilla warfare. The fact the Episcopal church is even considering furnishing funds to SNCC is outrageous and it is believed publicity about this matter would cause the church to cut off the grant. At the request of the San Diego Office, the names and addresses of five important members of the Los Angeles Black Panther Party were furnished by the Los Angeles Office in order that certain caricatures concerning the Black Panther Party could be mailed to these individuals in the hope that this will create further dissension within the Black Nationalist movement.

Interviews with members of the BPP are being continued in the hope that a state of distrust might remain among the members and add to the turmoil presently going on within the BPP.

Counterintelligence Operations Under Consideration

All arrests of members of the BPP continue to be followed, looking for violations of anti-riot and gun control laws in order to determine if any of these individuals might be prosecuted under Federal and State laws.

Accomplishments Obtained

During the past week, a BPP member was critically wounded, reportedly by "US" members, at a rally near the Carver Junior High School, which had been involved in student strikes. In retaliation, it is believed that BPP members fired into the home of a member of "US" without doing any injury to this individual.

During the early morning of 3/17/69, an individual was shot near the residence of the state of an "US" official, and six individuals believed to be "US" members were arrested.

There is no indication that the above incidents were the result of any of the counterintelligence programs aimed at the BPP; however, they do indicate a definite disruption within the overall black nationalist movement and causing a great deal of consternation within the black community.



And several members of the BPP appeared at the Woodlawn Senior High School, Woodlawn, Maryland, where they were met by a member of the Baltimore County Police who escorted them to the Vice Principal's office.

And members of the party were questioned regarding who had invited them to appear at Woodlawn High School.

And members of the party refused to identify the person inviting them to the school, whereupon they were advised that they were trespassing on Baltimore County School property and were subject to arrest.

And the BPP members then left the area. According to Information received, when the Panthers arrived at Woodlawn High School there were no students assembled for the proposed meeting.



For your information, reports concerning the cartoons mailed in the San Diego are currently being received through San Diego sources. They indicate that the cartoons of the caused a great deal of confusion and apprehension, particularly concerning who could be responsible for the cartoons. Several individual BPP members who have defected to the US organization or who have ties with the white community have been discussed by active BPP members as suspects. The local police department was also mentioned as suspect but this theory was almost immediately abandoned. The general, and final consensus of opinion at this time, is that the US organization is "now ready to move" against the BPP.

In addition to the mailing of the cartoons to individual BPP members, two envelopes, each containing three cartoons, are being mailed to the various BPP headquarters.

Copies are also being mailed to local underground newspapers in the San Diego and Los Angeles areas.

In the event recipient offices feel additional members should be on the "mailing list" or if it is felt inclusion of local underground newspapers would be of benefit, it is requested that the appropriate names and addresses be furnished to San Diego.

Caution should be exercised that the furnishing of names and addresses of individuals will in no way jeopardize confidential sources.

"Of special interest to you as one of our black business brothers trying to survive in our black ghettos from both a safe operating standpoint free from interference and at the same time realizing a fair profit, we would like to offer you the following information on our newly formed business security program:

"1. The Black Panther Party has recently organized a staff to adequately furnish protection of our black business brothers operating in our black communities. This staff would insure your business is not hampered by black men's stickups or arson (this should be handled by the anti-black Detroit Police Commissioner Spreen and his white oriented cops who over protect white businessmen and over-react against our black brothers.

The above letter will be sent to numerous black people operating businesses in the Detroit black ghetto area. The names and addresses of these people will be obtained from personal observation, and through ads in the "Michigan Chronicle", a weekly Detroit publication which caters to a minority group. Names and addresses will also be obtained from Bresser's Directory.

This letter will be prepared with a Black Panther Party letterhead.

Pending receipt of Bureau approval for the dissemination of the above-mentioned counterintelligence letter, Detroit proposes as a counterintelligence follow-up activity relating to this matter a letter to the Editor of both "The Detroit News" and the "Detroit Free Press", Detroit daily newspapers. This letter would be signed by one of the recipients of the BPP letter and would be of a bitter nature complaining about paying "protection money" to the Detroit BPP. This letter would read as follows:

"As a respected and fearless black businessman operating a business in the black community in Detroit I deeply resent receiving a letter from the Black Panther Party which to me smacks of a 'shakedown'. I pay taxes and operate my business above board. I treat my customers fair and don't gouge them when they buy from me. So why should I be singled out by the Panthers who have as much as said pay and join up with us so your store doesn't get broken into or burned down.

"I am sending along with this letter a copy of a letter I received from the Panthers which is too long to include in my letter to the Editor.

"I sincerely hope your newspaper will expose the Black Panther Party for what they are trying to do to me. I am sure other Negro business people have received the Panther's letter but are probably scared to expose these dangerous thugs for fear they will be hurt."

This letter would be written in longhand and signed by one of the recipients of the BPP letter with his name and address.

As another proposed counterintelligence activity relating to this matter, Detroit recommends the following after the aforementioned letter is published in the letters to the Editor. This letter would be a reply from the BPP in Detroit. This proposed letter would be also directed to "The Detroit News" and "Detroit Free Press" and would read as follows:

"Let me go on record as flatly denying that the Black Panther Party of Detroit as an organization or that any of us leaders or members of the Black Panther Party in Detroit, have ever disseminated any literature to organize black businessmen in Detroit to safeguard their businesses and prevent them from suffering physical harm. We of the Black Panther Party, and I as their chief spokesman, vehemently deny any participation in the action referred to in the letter to the Editor as published in your issue of _____, allegedly received from a Detroit black businessman.

"Further allow me to state that the Black Panther Party does not advocate violence but rather that we are interested only in the

survival of the black people and securing our rights and being treated as dignified, responsible citizens. As for myself, I do not advocate the overthrow of the U. S. Government by violence or through any other means. I would not participate in any activity which would be inimical to the best interest of the United States Government.

"This obvious smear against the Detroit Black Panther Party which I, as their representative, believe is unwarranted and in extremely bad taste, is only another way in which people are trying to do away with the Panthers.

"It is my fervent hope that this letter will alleviate any fear people have of the Black Panther Party and will encourage people to understand us in the proper perspective.





(SEALE TAKES HIS 50%)



In accordance with instructions set out in referenced Bureau letter, Buffalo has given consideration to Counterintelligence matters which could possibly be applied to the Black Panther Party (BPP) Chapter established in Rochester, New York.

The Rochester Chapter has recently completed its probationary period, required by the National Headquarters of the BFP in Oakland, a period of six months and is awaiting its charter as a regular BPP Chapter. As of this date, the Chapter does not have a headquarters in the Rochester area. It has been contemplating two locations for a new headquarters and is presently attempting to raise funds to make the initial rental payment.

Based on information available, the Chapter is in a highly disorganized state and is made up of some one-half dozen individuals, who are active in the organization. It lacks any organized leadership against whom a planed counterintelligence project could be operated at this time.

As pointed out in referenced Buffalo letter, consideration has been given to calling attention to members of this Chapter, the various acts of financial mismanagement on the part of some BPP leaders including KATHERINE_CLEAVER. At this time it is felt that the disorganized and deakrupt state of the Rochester BPP Chapter is such as to mitigate any real affect of spreading a rumor about the conduct of national officers because the Chapter appears to be only remotely connected and/or interested in the actions of the leaders,







Regarding the counterintelligence proposal set forth in referenced Houston letter, Chicago feels this suggestion could result in the creation of internal friction in Black Panther Party (PPP) leadership, and sees no reason why it should not be utilized. In connection with the local BPP, there are no funds available to provide BPP headquarters, and in all likelihood, the immediate reaction would be a telephone inquiry regarding such a request. The fact that little, if any, funds would result is immaterial, and in fact, the size of the sum in question would serve to alert BPP officials of this matter more expeditiously. Chicago does not have intimate knowledge of the inter-relationships of the BPP upper echelons, and consequently, is not in a position to have any real basis for estimate of possible reactions. Even if it were suspected that such was the result of "enemy" action, as long as this is not provable in any way, Chicago feels the effort is worthwhile.





As indicated in referenced communications and the above, these are two instances in which black extremists have recently sowed their seeds of hate before young impressionable high school students. These lectures are presented under the guise of black studies. ' programs and it would appear that there is no effective way to counteract these extremist activities except through wide spread publicity in the local news media. From information obtained by WFO, it appears that the teachers are permitted to invite anyone of their choosing into the classrooms without prior concurrence of the school principal or others in authority. It is obvious that this situation presents a very grave risk to an already (tense racial situation in that it virtually negates informant coverage because of the tender age of the students involved and the nonexistence of an organization subject to penetration by racial informants. In short, any teacher sympathetic to the aims of black extremism can invite guest speakers into his classroom where the activities would only be known to the teacher, the speaker and the students involved.

It would appear that an effective way to counteract this situation would be through a series of indepth articles by a friendly local newsman. Ideally, the articles would include interviews of the three at Eastern High School, and also the three at Eastern High School, and also be conducted with a representative number of high school principals, the District of Columbia school superintendent, as well as members of the school school to determine the extent of their knowledge of these





BACKGROUND - PROBLEM

There are a number of civil rights and racial groups in the Steubenville, Ohio, area, and the sentiments of numerous individuals who belong to these groups remain questionable. Inasmuch as one aspect of our job is to identify extremists in these organizations, the following plan is broached. This plan is suggested because of the difficulty and obvious pitfalls in accepting an informant's determination as to who is an extremist, when there have been no overt acts.

The secondary problem which exists for the field is the testing of the aggressiveness, range, and scope of the informant net in a certain area. It is the belief of the Agent who handles racial matters in Steubenville, Ohio, that it would be wise to test this apparatus before an actual outbreak of civil disorder, so that it can be evaluated A similar problem or doubt and changed if necessary. always exists and that is: "Could a conspiratorial type meeting take place within an area covered by an RA or Headquarters city without the office being aware of it?"

It is recommended, therefore, that the following letter be prepared on Black Panther Stationery, which could be supplied by the Bureau Laboratory, by Cincinnati, in respect to addresses and mailed by the San Francisco Office. The letter would be sent to approximately 75 people in the Steubenville, Ohio, area. This letter will be mailed from San Francisco, California, so that it reaches the Steubenville, Ohio, area one or two days before the scheduled -meeting.

We are presently preparing to enlarge the mass base of our party and we will be sending a representative to the Steubenville, Ohio, area on April 26, 1969, to meet with you and other individuals whom we feel have the necessary revolutionary spirit to form a chapter of the Panthers.

We feel that black men everywhere should buy arms and learn to use them, because we do not intend to simply change the society, we're going to overthrow it. We will have Black Power and we will have it now. BLACK MEN SHOULD BE BLACK PANTHERS.

Our man will be in Steubenville, Ohio, on April 26, 1969, at 3:00 P.M. He will hold a meeting across the street from the Baptist Temple on Fernwood Road in Wintersville, Ohio. This is an empty lot and public land. If the pigs should question you as to the reason for your gathering you are to say it is only a religious revival meeting. We will settle with the pigs later.

As you can see, we have done our homework well, our advance men have been in the area, heard about you, and we know you are on our side.

It is felt that this letter is sufficiently inflammatory and subversive in both tone and content that it would only attract those individuals who are subversive and/or have a propensity for violence. The area where the meeting is proposed to take place is in the a very reliable friend of the Bureau, and it could be arranged so that no embanassing incidents took place. The area is ideal for photographic surveillance, and all cars going into the area can easily be identified. The meeting, of course, will be covered by selected sources. There will, however, be no real meeting, unless someone seizes leadership on an impromptu basis. The land is public land where many groups have meetings, and there is no problem of trespassing.


FOLLOW-UP

Upon identifying those individuals who might attend, Cincinnati will open a case, develop background, and interview each. This procedure would have two objectives: (1) It would let these people know that they have been identified, and that the Bureau is aware of their attitudes and actions, thus hopefully causing them to cease some of their activities. (2) Cincinnati at Steubenville, Ohio, would be afforded an excellent opportunity for developing better informant coverage.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the Bureau approve the above measure to be instituted by the Cincinnati Division as soon as possible, noting that it would be most effective if used before the summer months, which have traditionally been disturbance prone.

Cincinnati suggested sending a spurious letter from the Black Panther Party to about 75 possible agitators in the Steubenville, Ohio area, inviting them to a meeting. The letter was worded in such a way that only those with a propensity for violence would attend the meeting. Thus, through a surveillance, Cincinnati would be able to identify those with a propensity for violence. This suggestion has merit, however, as stated above the Bureau would be vulnerable if violence erupted from this meeting.
