The BPP is a notorious black extremist organization with headquarters in Oakland, California, which advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end "oppression of the black man." The group advocates the killing of policemen and follows the doctrines of the Chinese communists.

We have conducted a continuing counterintelligence program against this notorious group and have recently come into possession of copies of BPP letterhead, printed at nations headquarters in Oakland, California. In addition, one page of this letterhead contains the signatures of the "Central Committee" of this group. At this time, several CIP proposals are being considered which necessitiate the use of BPP letterhead. Prior to making recommendations concerning these proposals, it will be necessary to produce a supply of blank letterhead, including some copies with the signatures of these leaders. This has been coordinated with the Document Section of the Laboratory and the reproduction of the letterhead is feasible

I. Operations Under Consideration

By communication dated 2/26/69 the Houston Division proposed counterintelligence measure directed against the Black Panther Party (BPP) which proposal dealt with directing a communication to the various BPP chapters requesting \$500 be sent to a rented P.O. Box in Oakland, California. This proposal which required the obtaining and duplication of BPP letterhead stationery as well as other details is currently under consideration by the Bureau.

II. Operations Being Effected

No specific counterintelligence operation is currently being directed against the black nationalists-hate groups in the Houston Division. It is noted, however, that with the handling of well placed informants in the Houston Division, efforts to get any black nationalist organization of any substance in the Houston Division has been controlled. In this regard, it is noted that the only black nationalist group currently operating in the Houston Division is the Nation of Islam and because of the number of informants currently utilized against this group they continue to have difficulties as regards finances and membership.

III. Tangible Results

Results of counterintelligence action in the Houston Division as pointed out above has resulted in considerable friction developing among Nation of Islam members and leaders and also a significant result is the fact that the BPP, SNCC and other black nationalist groups have not been able to organize or function to this point in the Houston Division.

Attached is a memorandum for dissemination under the Mass Media Program entitled Propaganda for Breakfast" which sets forth information concerning the Black Panther

The BPP is a notorious black extremist group which advocates and practices violence. This group has initiated a program to feed breakfast to ghetto children. The announced purpose is "humanitarian." The real purpose is, among other things, to gain control of the ghetto community, poison the minds of ghetto children with antiwhite propaganda and to cloak the illegal activities of the BPP with some segment of respectability.

Party and its attempts to conduct a Breakfast for Children

Attached points out that this group used threats to obtain food from businessmen and that the children are the innocent victims of this notorious scheme. It quotes the Black Panther newspaper as calling on the people to "kill" businessmen who refuse to contribute to the program. It contains information from the newspaper about the BPP conducting a wedding in one of the churches used for the breakfast ceremony, where the children serenaded the married couple by calling for the killing of policemen. It urges sympathetic priests and ministers to think twice before supporting this program.

Churches and schools are the sites of the breakfasts and free labor is obtained from Black Panther Party workers as well as misguided ghetto mothers. This program is existing in several cities today. Several hundred children are being fed daily by the Black Panther Party. In order to better understand the reasons behind this program, we need only look to statements made by the Panthers themselves in their newspaper "The Black Panther."

The Black Panther issue of May 11, 1969, contained an article captioned "Breakfast for School Children." This article concerns the methods used by the Black Panther Party in obtaining food from white and black businessmen for use in the breakfast program. The following was set forth in the article, "the BPP has also hounded the avaricious businessmen infesting the black community who rob and steal" from the black community. The article also points out that some of these businessmen have contributed and some have "refused to cooperate." Concerning those businessmen who refused to cooperate, the article states "Therefore, we call on the masses of oppressed peoples to kill this worm of economic exploitation." The article ends up with the statement "all power to the people." The above points out the method used by this group in obtaining the food for their "humanitarian" efforts.

17. DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

Things currently remain in a state of complete chaos within the ranks of the BPP. This situation has been compounded by the recent murder of BPP member JOHN SAVAGE on 5/23/69. The murder is believed to have been committed by a member of the US organization.

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

PREDATORY PARTMENTS

Those the live in neighborhoods infested with Black Panther Party members are finding out that this pro-Chinese Communist revolutionary group is actually a collection of thugs and hoodlums.

The Black Panther Party claims it was formed to protect Negroes from police brutality, but now the question has become, who is to protect the Negro from the Black Panthers? For the members of this group, most of whom have long criminal records, continue their criminal behavior while using Party membership as a mask for their deprivations. And their victims are not white; their activities are in the ghetto, and as is the case with ordinary criminals, the ghetto dweller suffers the most.

The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) recently made a point of criminality in the ghetto. An NAACP committee on crime reported, "The reign of criminal terror in Harlem must be stopped now. The lives and property of the people are in constant danger by

After a short chase police successfully stopped the car and a gun battle broke out. One subject was critically wounded. The other subjects admitted they had just committed an armed robbery of a drive-in restaurant in their stolen car and were then on their way to mug Regro security officers in order to get guns. This group was led by a Los Augales Black Panther.

In Scattle, Washington, Curtis Earris, Ceptain of
the Black Panther Party, was arrested 11/25/63 after an armed
robbery in which four shots were fired. The robbers escaped
from this robbery in a red Mustang which was traced to Harris
through the license number and found in front of his residence
with the engine still warm. However, Earris was released when
witnesses failed to identify him. Other members of the Fanthers
in Scattle have been arrested for armed robbery, cerrying
concealed wenpons, theft, burglarly, arean and escape free
custody.

New York City Black Panthers were arrested 11/21/68 in Stamford, Connecticut, in possession of a stolen car. Guns, ammunition, handcuffs and a map showing bank locations in Stamford were found in the car. In nearby New Haven, Connecticut, two Panthers have been indicted by a Federal Grand Jury for transporting firearms across the state line.

Panthers were arrested and charged with fire bombing a grocery store in Baltimore, Karyland, in August, 1968. Two Panthers were sentenced to five years in April, 1969, for this crime. Panthers were arrested at their headquarters Des Hoines, Iowa, for arson which destroyed an A & P store and a lumber yard in October, 1968. Seattle Black Panthers were responsible for an armed robbery in Eugene, Oregon, and a Panther drove the getaway car during a Brinks robbery and murder of a guard in Derkeley, California, in January, 1969.

The Licutenant of Education of the Panthers in Seattle was arrested March 14, 1969, for robbery of the Fidelity Mutual Savings Bank in Seattle on March 7, 1969. A Panther arrested in Daltimore on February 25, 1969, was found to be carrying a .38 caliber pistol. The Captain of the Black Panther Party in Eugene, Oregon, Howard Douglas Anderson, Jr., was indicted March 24, 1969, for assault with a dangerous weapon, as was his brother, Towny Lee Anderson.

Between November, 1968, and February, 1969, some curteen members of the Panthers in Ker York City were arrested

for serious crimes. Among these were Vac Manuel Perex, arrested for the Movember 29, 1968, machine gunning of the Pifth Precinct police station in Jersey City, New Jersey.

Joudon Ford, Deputy Minister of Defense of the Black
Panther Party in New York, was arrested by the FBI for carrying
a concealed weapon on board an aircraft. Donald Gregory Weems
was arrested in Newark, New Jersey, on February 17, 1969, for
bank robbery. Weems was wounded in a chase following the
robbery.

Ann Stewart, who used the name Ife Balagoon, was arrested December 31, 1963, attempting the robbery of a subway station booth. She was also charged with firing a pistol during this robbery attempt. Another Panther was arrested as a deserter.

In the apartment of one arrested Panther police found a rifle, 71 sticks of dynamite, 100 instantaneous dynamite caps and 50 feet of explosive primer cord.

Six Panthers were arrested in Newark, New Jerssy, on March 2, 1969, for possession of a stolen car and four party members were charged in Chicago, Illinois, on April 11, 1969, by Federal authorities for buying machine guns.

Attacks on Police

The Black Panther Party was organized ostensibly for the purpose of protecting the black community from its 'occupying army," which is what the Panthers call local pelice. This "protection," in practice, has worked out to be continuous, unprovoked, and deadly attacks on police by armed Panther members. An early instance of this was an attack on Berkeley, California, police by Panther leaders Bobby Scale and Ruey Newton. Police were attempting to arrest Scale and Newton for shouting obscene statements in a restaurant; the two Panthers bit and kicked the two arresting officers, a crowd collected and screamed "Cut him! Stab him!" whereupon Bobby Scale pulled out a knife and made several passes at one of the officers.

The Black Panther Party has long advocated that Negroes arm themselves. The group first got national publicity when 12 Panthers carrying rifles, shotguns, and handguns visited the California State Capitol on May 2, 1967, and forced their way onto the floor of the Assembly Chamber. Since then, especially in California, Panthers have flaunted their carrying of weapons openly in public. Oakland, California, police on May 22, 1967, were investigating a complaint against juveniles observed carrying a saved-off shotgun. The officers were accosted by three Black Panther Party members, including Huey Revton who was armed with a dagger with a 91 long blade. Revton held the knife in the face of one of the officers and threatened to cut his throat. During the arraignment of these three Pauthers following their arrest, Panther leaders Bobby Seale and Bobby Hutton were arrested in the courthouse f shotgung with barrols of illegal length.

On October 26, 1967, an officer of the Oakland

Police Department stopped a car driven by Hucy Newton for a

traffic violation. While the officer was awaiting the results

of a radio inquiry as to whether the car was stolen, Newton

shot and killed him. Newton critically wounded the second police

officer and was wounded himself. He was convicted of voluntary

manslaughter and given a prison sentence of 2 to 14 years.

Police in Oakland on April 6, 1963, attempted to question the occupants of two parked cars. Among these individuals were 15 Black Panther Party members, including leaders Eldridge Cleaver and David Hilliard. The Panthers opened fire as officers approached the parked cars and a 90-minute gun bettle left one Panther dead, another injured and two police officers wounded. Cleaver and six other members of the Black Panther Party were charged with attempted murder as police learned that the Panthers had been driving around in an attempt to ambush police.

On July 28, 1968, two members of the Black Panther Party in New York City threw a Nolotov cocktail into an empty police car and completely destroyed it. The Panthers had telephoned police with a phony complaint and when officers arrived in response to the complaint the car was set on fire. Across the country at Scattle, Vashington, on the next day, officers arrested two Panther leaders on their charges. Following the arrest, suppers fired at police ars, injuring one officer. Another policemen was injured.

A gun battle erupted in Los Angeles on August 6,

1968, when police officers approached a car at a service
station. Three members of the Black Parther Party were
shot and killed and two police officers were wounded. Three
days later in the same city, police were fired upon by a group
of Negroes, several of whom were recognized as Black Panther
Party members. Police returned the fire and eight Hegroes were
arrested.

In New York City on August 21, 1968, firemen responding to a rubbish fire were the targets of thrown missiles. Police were summoned and as a result, three Black Panther Party members were arrested for assault. They pled guilty to assault charges on December 16, 1968.

attempt to ambush police officers. Shots were fired in one

area in an attempt to lure police to the site but the attempted

direction.

On September 24, 1968, a Panther in Jersey City,
New Jersey, stood in the middle of the street blocking a
police car. When police attempted to arrest this individual
a large number of Panther members burst out of a nearby
building and attacked police with night sticks and sawed-off
pool cues. Four police officers were injured and three

A Berkeloy, California, police officer stopped a car on Rovember 18, 1968, for a traffic violation. As the officer approached the automobile one of the occupants opened fire, sending a bullet through the clothing of the policeman. The officer returned the fire, wounding the driver of the car.

All three occupants of the automobile were found to be members of the Black Panther Party.

In San Francisco, on November 19, 1968, three police officers were wounded when they stopped a truck suspected of being involved in a robbery. Seven of the eight individuals in the truck were identified as members of the Black Panther Party and the truck itself was a delivery wehicle for the Black Panther Party newspaper.

During the evening of November 29, 1968, the 5th Precinct police station in Jersey City, New Jersey, was hit by 36 shots from an automatic weapon. Three Black Pauther Party members were arrested for this attack.

Garner Farl Drooks was arrested in connection with his
shooting at a Scattle police car on January 11, 1969.

On January 17, 1969, in New York City two patrolmon investigated a car parked at the side of an expressary. Two Regro men standing by the car told police they were having motor trouble; then one suddenly opened fire with a pistol. One oliceman was hit and both the Regroes fled. A 19-year-old

on this ambush "to prove herself." A .38 caliber revolvor was found at the scene, two Pauther members were identified as the assailants, and a loaded, high-powered rifle was found in the rental car used by the group. Two other Panthers had rented the car.

Criminal Backgrounds

One reason for criminal activity by the Black Panther Party is the criminal backgrounds of many Party members. The ranks of the Panthers are filled by a large number of hoodlums with long criminal records. For example, Jorge Aponte, Jr., a Brooklyn New York Panther Lieutenant was convicted of attempted robbery with a sawed-off shotgum in 1961.

Jerome Chambers, a Panther in Newark, New Jersey, has over twenty arrests, including arrests for larceny, assault, robbery, and narcotics violations. Isaiah Rowley, also of the Ecwark Panthers, has been arrested for armed robbery, breaking and entering, looting, narcotics violations and assault on a police officer.

Anthony Coston of the New York City Black Panther
Party was arrested in 1960 for assault and robbery. Fred Alan
Bampton, Field Director, of the Chicago Black Panther Party,
has a long arrest record, including several arrests for mob
action, aggravated assault, and robbery. Tommy Lee Horne, of

In addition it does not appear to criticize the specific groups mentioned in referenced communication. The idea of formulating a cartoon which will lampoon various black student groups now forming coalitions on the San Diego City College campus is good. San Diego should review the local situation and if appropriate forward ideas for a specific cartoon which pits the BPP against the Black Student Council, Black Student Unions, US and the Black Student Alliances in the San Diego area. It may be that for San Diego's purposes the cartoon may show the BPP as the dominant group with the other campus organizations completely subordinate. If this type of cartoon is feasible, San Diego should forward to the Bureau for production and return for dissemination.

No new counterintelligence operations have been placed in effect against the BPP since date of referenced letter.

Exhaustive interviews of BPP members are being continually conducted, causing a considerable degree of consternation on the part of the leaders as to whom should be trusted within the organization.

In addition to following the arrest of BPP members, looking for possible violations of the Antiriot and gun control laws, their every-day activities are being closely scrutinized for violations of local laws, in which case this information can then be furnished to local law enforcement officers for action.

Accomplishments Obtained



The Black Panther Party in Omaha and its affiliate at Technical High School the Black Association for Nationalism Through Unity (BANTU), have since April, 1969, concentrated their efforts against the Omaha school administration. As pointed out in referenced letter, the latter organization recently furnished a list of 23 demands to the Technical High School administration and also sponsored a boycott of this school by its students on 5/19/69, which boycott resulted in a high percentage of absenteeism on the part of the Negro student body at that school.

Now that school is out for the summer, the area of concentration of these organizations is at present unknown and remains to be seen.

Omaha is continuing to remain alert to various activities of the Black Panther Party and BANTU that might lend themselves to counterintelligence activity and it's anticipated that such situations will present themselves in the near future.

No counterintelligence accomplishments have been obtained under captioned program since submission of the last bi-weekly letter.

This matter will continue to receive close attention and suggestions for counterintelligence activity against the Black Panther Party, BANTU and the leadership of these organizations at a future date will be submitted by separate letter.

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by Bobby George Seale, BPP Chairman, and Huey P. Newton, BPP Minister of Defense. Newton is presently serving a sentence of 2 to 15 years on a conviction of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther," which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service," states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, George Mason Murray, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement, ... we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it.

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

He was approached by agents while standing apart from other BPP members who were present in the hall. was greeted and approached with comments indicating that he had been cooperative in the past with agents. did not act unfriendly and the other BPP members nearby were watching with great interest. Inasmuch as the BPP leaders here do not want members to talk to agents and cooperate in any way, and since they have been suspicious of all members, it is felt that this act may have had merit as a counterintelligence measure. It was noted immediately after this that the other members did not want to have much to do with the other immediately indicated distrust toward him.

In the event any other such situations present themselves, and appear to have any counterintelligence merit, they will be utilized for the appropriate purpose. Attempts to interview any members who might talk and even those who have been unwilling to talk will be continued.

The two articles contained on Page 1 of "The Voice of the Black Community" entitled "Porter and Brown Doing Their Thing" have previously been set forth under a separate LHM (Springfield File: 157-1094, entitled "For Souls Only", dated April 11, 1969).

An article written on Page 3 of the VOBC entitled, "How About This" states that the most questionable appointment made by the NIXON Administration was the one made by the Department of Justice Community Relations Service. The article reflects that BEN HOLMAN was selected to succeed ROGER WILKINS to head this agency and HOLMAN is black. A second article on Page 3 entitled, "The Chatterbox' advises that the Black Central Coordinating Committee (BCCC) is still accepting applications for the job of Community Organizer. The article reflects that if you qualify, don't hesitate to apply. Under the same article another paragraph contains a statement that black students are getting uneasy. On Page 6 of the VOBC, an article entitled "The Voice Intent" states "The VOICE has and will continue to bring to you news and events about local black people that bring to you news and events about local black community. We feel is in the best interest of the black community. Using this media as a source of information enhances your chances of getting a true picture of situations that might chances of getting a true picture of situations that might chances concerning black people. The article further reflects arise concerning black people. The article further that any items of newsworthy interest should be submitted to the VOBC for consideration.

Articles appearing in the 31st Edition of "The Voice of the Black Community" (VOBC) of Intelligence interest are as follows:

An article written on Page 1 of the VOBC entitled "Blacks Seek Assassins of King" indicates that a deal was made between Defense Attorney PERCY POREMAN and the Prosecuting Attorney PHIL M. CANALE to swiftly place RAY in solitude to avoid scrutiny by an extended court trial. The article to avoid scrutiny by an extended court trial. The article reflects that this was done in order to smother the truth reflects that this was done in order to smother the truth about KING's assassination. The article goes on to state that RAY was involved in a conspiracy and probably served that RAY was involved in a conspiracy and probably served as the "PALL GUY". The article states that by making a set the "PALL GUY". The article states that by making a deal to avoid a full court investigation, the racist Nemphis deal to avoid a full court investigation, the racist Nemphis deal to avoid a full court investigation to avoid any threat court and federal government are seeking to avoid any threat of black outrage if the trial reveals political collusion.

On Page 2 of the VOBC, an article entitled "Decatur Or Cairo" advises that with each coming day black people become more aware of the efforts to delete them out of all forms of Americanism. The article reflects that by becoming more aware of the hypocracy that exists, the blacks are dissenting more vigorously. The article questions whether this dissent is the purpose of the concentration of military vehicles in the area bounded by Broadway Street and the IC tracks just south of Marietta in Decatur. The article also reflects that the training of personnel in this area is being watched with great concern by the predominately blacks who live in this area and questions whether this constitutes a move to contain people who are in search of a true democracy. The article goes on to state that a similar situation is existing in Cairo, Illinois where almost half its population is black but the town is completely controlled by whites. The article states that black brothers are going against the whites and the police and that the white society calls law and order containing black people by any means. The article further reflects that the Local Association for Black Action (LABA) has sent Governor Ogilvie a telegram denouncing the treatment of black people in Cairo and asking that he take whatever steps necessary to guarantee the rights of the black people and that community.

An article on Page 3 of the YOBC entitled "Chatter Box" states that the percentages were not encouraging at the memorial for Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. The article reflects that half white and half black attended the church when there should have been only black people. The article reflects that the black community was honoring a man who passively that the black community was honoring a man who passively that the black people denied him this hour. It further reflects sought equality and justice for all of humanity, and yet the black people denied him this hour. It further reflects that blacks have also denied young militants who have attempted that blacks have also denied young methods. The article is to achieve the same goals by other methods.

Articles appearing in the 33rd Edition of "The Voice of the Black Community" (VOBC) of Intelligence interest are as follows:

An article on Page 1 of the VOBC entitled "Cairo, Land of the Free?" states that the federal government in recont years has applied so much pressure on the Ku Klux Klan that they went underground. The article advises that the Ku Klux Klan is now using guerilla tactics to harass and humiliate black people of the South because they are afraid of the federal intervention. The article goes on to state that in the state of Illinois we have vigilantes patroling the streets of Cairo making no attempt to hide from the law because their actions have received the blessings of the law enforcement body. The article reflects that Father MONTROY led a delegation that came from all over the state consisting of 20 black citizens from Cairo, over 100 white clergymen, one black clergyman and other interested citizens from mid Illinois. It states that they sought and received an audience with black legislators from Illinois, asking that they do something to bring the matter to the Governor's attention. The article reflects that in the past two years there has not been one black person sit on the jury in Judge SPOONER's court in Cairo. The article further reflects that black people are threatened at the polls by loss of jobs and that the median income of the blacks in Cairo is \$1600 per year. The article goes on to reflect that the young black leader of the community has stated that they young plack leader of the community has been community are attempting to establish an interrelated black community through black co-ops and at present they have in operation a black supermarket. The article states they have also imposed a boycott on all downtown businesses and that the 17th Street Church in Cairo is the only church that will open its doors so that they might have community meetings.

The editor of "The Voice of the Black Community",
HORACE G. LIVINGSTON, JR., advises that DAVE LIVINGSTON, a
member of the group who went to Springfield from Decatur,

A second article on the same page entitled "BCCC Selects Grayned" states that GEORGE S. GRAYNED has been selected by the Elack Central Coordinating Committee (ECCC) for the job of community organizer in Decatur, Illinois. The article reflects that the BCCC, a committee composed of most black organizations in Decatur was formed as an aftermath of the school boycott several months ago, and since its organization it has been the general consensus of all representatives that a coordinator was needed. The coordinator was suppose to establish rapport between organizations, combine the efforts and endcavors of all black groups and direct them toward a common goal. The article further reflects that last but not least he would work in the community to develop the potential of aspirants who in the past have been denied. The article goes on to state that GRAYNED is a past employee of the Illinois Youth Commission, U. S. Department of Labor, and past president of the Local Association for Black Action. The article reflects that GRAYNED's duties begin in his new position on April 15, 1969 and his office is temporarily located in the OEO quarters on the corner of West Main and Church Streets. article reflects that GEORGE GRAYNED is well qualified to man this position as he has played a leading role in this city in the quest for human decency and human rights. The article states he is a graduate of Eisenhover High School and has three years college education. The article further reflects that black Decatur is beginning to move toward a better life for all its citizens and establishing a community organizer is just one of the many things the BCCC has planned in hopes of creating a better atmosphere within the city.

On Page 2 of the VOBC an article entitled "As I See It" by HORACE G. LIVINGSTON, JR., states that complacency once again has taken its toll in the black community. The cover of "The Voice of the Black Community" is filled with large letters stating "Black Unity Must Be If Black People Are To Be, Together There Is Salvation - To Be Black Is To Be Proud, To Be Proud Is To Be Truly Beautiful".

on Page 2 of "The Voice of the Black Community" under a title "As I See It" by HORACE G. LIVINGSTON, JR., the editor of the VOEC reflects that as a people the blacks that failed miserably in Decatur in grasping how urgent the need is for unity in the black community. The article reflects that the editor will continue to write about black reflects that the editor will continue to write about black reflects that the editor will they have an interunity until it catches on and until they have an interunity until it catches on and until they have an interunity until dedicated to help all black people.

On Page 3 under an article entitled "Letters to the Editor", a letter signed "Burned-up" states that top level organizations in Christendom all recognize the imperative to provide funds for communities to free someone within the black community from the white man's pursestrings to organize groups within the city to bring about social changes in living conditions for the black and the poor. The article further reflects that the BCCC 21 delegates from the seven such groups have chosen a person to do this very job in their community, however, the money verbally promised by the various churches in the community has not been provided. The letter states that the funds would be given with no strings attached and that this was suppose to mean the money would be given to the blacks to do their own thing" in their own way. The article further reflects that all the black pride and black dignity they could muster they proudly announced that their leader is to be GEORGE GRAYNED, and as soon as the news reached the ears of the "Decatur Review" and they decided to write a story in the usual white fashion, all possible rumors, scandals, and controversies were included in the article. The article reflects that as a result various members of the BCCC began getting phone calls from various white clergymen, pleading "Anybody but George". The letter states that anyone whitey doesn't want is sure to be the right man for the job.

The letter reflects that their man, GEORGE GRAYNED, is a hometown man and they are expecting him to work with groups to do the things necessary to make Decatur a better place in which to live. The letter closes with the statement, which to live. The letter closes with the statement, which is build, Baby, Build, or Burn, Baby, Burn?"

On Page 5 of "The Voice of the Black Community" an article entitled "in the wilderness: Dick Gregory" contains portions of a speech given by DICK GREGORY. This article contains a statement which has quoted DICK GREGORY as saying "The Jevish reaction to black antisemitism shows the structure of the racist system. Every Jow in America over 20 years old knows another Jew that don't like niggers. So when you run across a nigger that don't like Jews, the only upsetting thing about it is that the nigger is the lowest thing on the totem pole and it's an insult." The article goes on to reflect that GREGORY states "America is an antisemitic nation. Black folks have always wanted to be like white folks, so we picked up the bad habits with the good.

Personally, I tell the kids I'm glad black anti-semitism came out because now for the first time you know it's there. Every black man in America in a large urban city done heard his momma make an anti-semitic statement. Only the white folks didn't know it, the Jews didn't know it and it was OK. But it's BEEN there and the only way to get it out is to get it in the open. That's the only thing that's going to stop it."

The article goes on to reflect that the high school kids in the country are demanding changes in their education and they will take these changes into the colleges and create problems for the future.



It is noted that BPP leader Bobby Seale speaks in schools and universities and receives fees of up to \$1,000. This raises counterintelligence opportunities, among which are anonymous disseminations of derogatory information to universities and misuse of funds received.

As it concerns the BPP, you point out that results achieved by utilizing counterintelligence ideas such as publicizing the evils of violence, the lack of morals, the widespread use of narcotics and anonymous mailings, have not been outstanding. This is because a typical black supporter of the BPP is not disturbed by allegations which would upset a white community. You must recognize that one of our primary aims in counterintelligence as it concerns the BPP is to keep this group isolated from the moderate black and white community which may support it. This is most emphatically pointed out in their Breakfast for Children Program, where they are actively soliciting and receiving support from uninformed whites and moderate blacks. In addition, we have received information from San Francisco and other offices indicating that BPP officials are extremely suspicious of each other as to monies received. This also is a fertile ground for CIP and should be explored.

ReSFairtel states that nation-wide mailings to BPP chapter offices would automatically indicate that the FBI was the source. Mailings originating from Oakland, California, would logically be attributed to someone either at national headquarters of the BPP or a dissident who has recently resigned and had access to the records.

You state that the Bureau under the CIP should not attack programs of community interest such as the BPP "Breakfast for Children." You state that this is because many prominent "humanitarians," both white and black, are interested in the program as well as churches which are actively supporting it.

Violence comes naturally to them. The "Black Panther" newspaper features articles on violence, carries pictures of guns in prominent places, and prints revolutionary slogans. Behind this facade of militancy is a never-ending cry for justice for the Negro, job opportunities, and the familiar allusions to 400 years of slavery, etc. The Party in its daily work, maintains it is attempting to improve the lot of the Negro people. Many Negroes, of course, do not believe that the methods used by the BPP in the past are the proper ones to achieve the desired objectives. However, while the Negro community does not agree in the main with the expressed views of violence, it, along with much of the white community, does support such programs as the break-fasts for children, legal aid to arrested Negroes, etc. Their success in reaching the communities, both black and white, can be measured by the following:

- A. The weekly newspaper circulation has increased to over 45,000.
- B. The local and national news media continue to attend press conferences called by the BPP and to publish and publicize what was said there. For instance, "Time" magazine is sending out teams of prominent newscasters, such as ERIC SEVAREID and JOHN CHANCELLOR to interview black leaders for a TV special. They want to interview BOBBY SEALE and DAVID HILLIARD. They must certainly know of the revolutionary position of the BPP, yet they are willing to give it additional publicity. The BPP espouses the cause of Communist China and attacks the "revisionist" clique" of the U.S.S.R. BOBBY SEALE and others of the BPP share platforms with leaders of the New Left. SEALE is in demand as a speaker in schools and universities, both domestic and foreign, where he asks for and receives a fee of \$1000 for remarks which by now seem repititious.

The above is mentioned to emphasize the wide-spread, international publicity given this group at a time when the membership nationally is probably less than 1000 and even more likely to be perhaps only 500. The Panthers right now are not many people and perhaps also do not represent many people, as many people and perhaps also do not represent many people, as many people and perhaps also do not represent many people, as many people and perhaps also do not represent many people, as represent an idea, or a voice in the ghetto, and are often called upon by Negro residents, to come quell a disturbance in a playground or talk to someone alleging police brutality, even if the caller is not a BPP member.

The above is set forth to show the following summary:

- A. The program and the complaints of the BPP are clearly defined in their literature and in the well-publicized appearances of the leaders.
- B. In spite of or possibly because of its violencepreaching, it has struck the notice of the United States and world press.
- C. Some sort of militant organization, if not named the BPP, will continue to attract these same people.
- (2) The Role of the FBI to Counter This Particular Group.

The FBI has actually few laws to use in its investigative efforts concerning the BPP. Host of the violations of law incurred by members or sympathizers are of a local nature. However, as a result of intensive investigative efforts, a considerable amount of knowledge has been accumulated by the FBI concerning the BPP. Therefore, it is believed that based on this knowledge, effective counter-intelligence methods to disorganize and disrupt the BPP can be devised. To date, utilizing ideas drawn from the past, such as publicizing the ewils of violence, the lack of morals, the widespread use of narcotics and alcoholic beverages, anonymous mailings, etc., results have not been outstanding. The typical black supporter of the BPP is not disturbed by allegations which would upset a white community. The various field offices have used imagination and have strenuously tried to bring forth worthwhile ideas to assist in the project. However, most of the plans have been along the lines of harassment, which, while perhaps causing temporary distress or extra work for a BPP worker, have not had any lasting effects. SEALE and HILLIARD remain

firmly in control of the BPP structure. There have been serious defections and expulsions, many caused by personality clashes. Others arose from disciplinary action during the purges of January, 1969, when many criminal types were expelled. It is believed the personality issue will be always present and occurs regularly without outside inspiration.

The various offices have been interviewing former or present members of the BPP. Agents attempt to show a picture of FBI integrity and fairness, of success against the Klan in the South, etc. It is believed that to have even a change of success, the FBI must not be completely equated with the "pigs" (local police). At times a Negro will agree that the FBI is (local police). This leads to the recommendation that counterintelligence work should be of such a nature that it does not convey the impression that:

- 1. It originated with or can be attributed to the FBI or
- 2. The FBI is working against the aspirations of the Negro people.

This would mean that nationwide mailings to addresses where only a nationwide organization like the FBI could have knowledge, should be avoided.

Expensive mailings such as the San Diego caricatures are a borderline case, as at first the BPP blamed the us organization but later on blamed the CIA or the FBI. The caricatures caused anger but had no permanent, known effect.

Secondly, attacking programs of community interest such as the breakfasts for children should be avoided, since many prominent "humanitarians", whites as well as blacks, have become interested in this program and churches are actively supporting it.

Examples of successful counterintelligence were the publicity given the withdrawal from the bank of \$30,000 by KATHLEEN CLEAVER, the publicity that the BPP had used funds from the Huey Newton Defense Fund to travel to Mexico, the expulsion of Deacon Alexander from the Los Angeles BPP because he was & member of the CPUSA, and the publicity given the "recruiting" of BPP members as "extras" for a filming of a Berkeley demonstration.

Emphasis should be directed to the "wrong" side of the BPP, violence, taking money from the "brothers", using the Party for personal gain, etc.

Needless to say, the Bureau should in no way be responsible, and thus be blamed, for any counterintelligence tactic which results in death or serious injury to a member of the black community.

As to the specific projects of the Bureau at this time, there are three which are under consideration and will be treated herein.

1. Breakfast For Children. This program is being promoted nationwide by the BPP (see Bureau letter, 5/1/69). not believed that this program to date lends itself to "disruption" at this time. The Party is very careful to maintain the "voluntary" aspect of the donations. Complaints of pressure of unauthorized demands so far have been dealt with quickly by headquarters. The members of the BPP get up very early in the morning to prepare the breakfasts, they work hard at getting supplies, and there is no indication of misapplication of the proceeds. In the absence of any information to date that the program is more harmful then beneficial, counter measures should be very carefully considered before being applied. It would not benefit the Bureau to sabotage such a program. San Francisco has interviewed a

pathy for the program. Further, efforts of this nature at Sacred Heart Church or any other church are not recommended.

2. A second project was proposed by Houston. and then ednding a letter in the name of the paper demanding \$500 from

the various chapters. This idea would arouse speculation by the recipients, but it is believed that they would only pick up the telephone and inquire as to what was going on. The Party uses the telephone to transact its business and the newspaper office regularly telephones all over the country asking for money. Therefore, it is believed that this plan would have no deleterious effect on the operation of the BPP would have no deleterious effect on its newspaper, and its adoption is not recommended.

A letter limited in circulation would not be attributed to the FBI "pigs," and CARMICHAEL would not be attributed to the FBI "pigs," and CARMICHAEL might accept it as a true document, even if the Party head-quarters were to deny sending it.

The Bureau should note that CARMICHAEL for unknown reasons is still carried on the "Black Panther" masthead as Foreign Minister, notwithstanding the attacks on him in the paper.

The type of typewriter used at BPP headquarters varies.

advise that sometimes they use personally owned machines, sometimes they go over to the Berkeley "Barb" to write on their machines. Some machines are in the homes of leaders or are generally scattered around. Therefore, there is no definite information of value to this project available.

It is not believed that we should ask our newspaper contacts to print a fictitious, forged letter in the guise of a bona-fide document. Such tactics compromise both the Bureau and the newspaper.

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In furtherance of this plan, Atlanta, Boston, New York, and WFO are requested to give their opinion as to the best place to address a letter to the above three and if, in their opinion, to address a letter to the above three and if, in their opinion, the letter should be to all three collectively or separately. 






As set forth above, the Memphis Office is continuing its interview program whereby routine interviews are being conducted with rank and file members of the Invaders. At the present time, it appears that one possible informant has been developed through this program.

In addition, information is continually being leaked to and she is continually urged to write articles pointing out the criminal activity of the Invader organization in an effort to discredit this organization.

The Memphis Office is in constant communication and exchanges information on a daily basis re black power activities at Memphis along with SDS activities and New Left activities. This exchange of information has resulted in numerous arrests on the part of the Invaders and members of SDS at Memphis. This counterintelligence program will be continued.

III. TANGIBLE RESULTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS

Information has been received from various leaders of the Invader organization indicating that their operations are being seriously hampered by the distrust and lack of confidence in the Invader organization by the rank and file Negro resident of Memphis. Information has been received indicating that the counterintelligence activities directed against the Invaders has resulted in many of their leaders who are out on bond to be most circumspect in their criminal activities and their black power activities through fear of being arrested by the Memphis PD. Information has been received indicating that most of the leaders are convinced that based on interview program of the Memphis Office that not only are all of the leaders of the Invaders under constant surveillance by the FBI but that their telephones are tapped, their mail is opened, and that within their ranks are several informants. This has tended to curtail

activities with regard to black militancy on the part of the Invader organization.

the Invaders as a criminal group of thugs has been most beneficial to the Memphis PD inasmuch as many Negro citizens have called in to the PD and furnished information re Invaders almost without exception stating that after reading the articles by are now convinced that the invaders are only interested in criminal activity and are not interested in elevating the Negro race.

Every care is being exercised to insure that information furnished to is of a nature which could be obtained at public meetings or through public sources. She is continually cautioned to insure that the source of her information is not attributable as the FBI.

IV. DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

One of the most effective deterents yet developed at Memphis directed toward disruption of the Invader activities was

that it has been brought to the attention of the rank and file member of the Invader that these calls are now known by the Invader group to have originated from and there is a considerable amount of distrust on the part of the Invader group toward the three designated persons who have been called by

The referenced letter of May 1, 1969, was directed toward inhibiting the embryonic alliance formed locally recently between the Black Panther Party (BPP) and the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS). It was suggested that efforts be made to exploit the coalition by depicting the working relationship as an effort on the part of SDS to utilize the BPP as a mercenary group fighting a black war for white liberation.

A careful review and analysis of BPP activities locally since relet of April 30, 1969, reflects that the tenous working relationship between these two groups continues .. to exist and the activities and programs as recommended in Chicago letter of May 1, 1969, continue to be valid. Chicago will await the Bureau's response to this recommendation prior to initiating any efforts in this direction.

In recent weeks also the local BPP group has effected a similar coalition with the Young Lords, a mear north side Puerto Rican youth gang and the Young Patriots, the latter an off-shoot Jobs or Income Now (JOIN), an SDS affiliated group of young whites. Chicago will follow this and related developments closely and as the opportunity presents itself will submit appropriate counterintelligence suggestions.

Item (2), to date, presents less vulnerability for counterintelligence action due to small chapter membership, inaccessibility to the chapter's bank account data, and some publicized pending local and Federal prosecutions against the chapter's tight-knit leadership; prosecutions involve past possession of guns, rather than threats or armed violence.

It appears that numerous Black Panther chapters are participating in the national Black Panther Party Breakfast Program, with more or less favorable publicity, as a recent April issue of The Black Panther newspaper, official publication of the National Black Panther Party, devoted several pages to photographs and articles on numerous cities where BPP chapters are participating in their local areas in the "breakfast program".

Counterintelligence proposals as to the Kansas City, Missouri, BPP chapter's "breakfast program" were made in paragraphs four and five, page two, of Kansas City Air Mail letter, 4/22/69, to the Bureau, dual captioned as instant letter. The Bureau's views on those proposals will be appreciated.

However, such releases by high authorities for local dissemination could not be ignored (e.g., statements by the President, the Attorney General, testimony of the Director), such as the quotes of Mr. JUSTICE THURGOOD MARSHALL in the Kansas City Star, 5/5/69, though MARSHALL in his position could hardly name the Black Panthers (copy attached for Bureau).

In order to facilitate action on counterintelligence proposals, New Haven should not include these proposals in the biweekly letter. In addition, the name of the organization, which is the subject of the proposal, should be added to the title.

Authority is not being granted to mail the communication suggested by you in referenced letter. Obscenity should not be considered in the mailing of anonymous communications under the CIP. In addition, the communication appears too strong to be mailed to moderate black businessmen. Your attention is directed to the 5/11/69 issue of "The Black Panther" newspaper, page 8, which contains an article entitled "Breakfast for School Children." You should review this article and consider a mass media dissemination. The article may accomplish the same purpose as your suggested letter. Take no action without specific suthority of the Bureau.

MAY 1 4 1969 (2022-178) A review of referenced letter disclosed that members of the BPP caused a newspaper article to be printed which pitted the local hoodlum element against the BPP. You should review files in an effort to identify various drug pushers and narcotics dealers in the New Haven area. You should thereafter consider and forward specific proposals aimed toward the furtherance of agitation by the hoodlums and the BPP.
