Enclosed is a copy of the Black Panther Party (BPP) letterhead stationery in possession of the Bureau. It does not appear that this stationery would be currently in use by the BPP as some of the officials listed as members of the Central Committee no longer are members.

You should obtain several blank pieces of the letterhead stationery presently in use by the BPP National Headquarters. On one type your proposed expulsion letter exactly as you desire it to appear. The signature will be added by the laboratory. Date the letter sufficiently far in advance to allow for time consumed in mailing to Bureau, preparation in the laboratory and mailing back to your office. A date two weeks in advance would probably be about right. Furnish several blank pieces of stationery for possible laboratory use.

The letter you prepare will be reproduced by the laboratory after addition of the signature and sufficient copies will be run off for the mailing. You should advise as to the method that would ordinarily be utilized by BPP headquarters in reproducing the letter, i.e. Xeroxing or some other method. It is assumed that BPP headquarters would not type each letter separately in a mailing of this nature.

Furnish FBI number of individual who will be shown as signer of the letter to facilitate locating fingerprint card of that person for signature comparison.

Advise as to whether you desire each letter signed individually or whether only the "master letter" need be signed and the signature reproduced along with the text of the letter.

Upon completion of the letters at the Bureau they will be returned to you for addressing and mailing.

NOTE:

San Francisco has submitted a counterintelligence proposal which involves the mailing of expulsion letters to approximately sixty members of the BPP in various parts of the United States as a disruptive measure. The letters are to be prepared on BPP stationery with the simulated signature of a BPP national official. The laboratory has prepared similar reproductions of BPP stationery and officials signatures in the past. As pointed out in this letter, we need additional information before going ahead with preparation of the letters. For information, copy of letterhead stationery is attached to this yellow.

This list was not to include prominent members of the chapters who are in close contact with the National Office.

It was felt that a mailing of the expulsion letter to a large number of BPP members who are not in close contact with the National Office, accusing them of black nationalism may produce some disruption and defecting among the decreasing membership.

It is, therefore, suggested that the following letter, addressed to individuals hereinafter set forth, be prepared at the Laboratory on BPP letterhead paper available there and signed by [REDACTED]

It is believed that the signing of the letter by only [REDACTED] will be more logical at the present time than attempting to prepare a communication for signatures of the [REDACTED]

Re Omaha letter to Bureau, 12/1/69; and Bureau letter to Omaha, 12/10/69.

As noted in referenced Omaha letter, the BPP in Des Moines, Iowa, is non-existent; and the BPP's successor in Omaha, United Front Against Fascism (UFAF), has only 8 to 12 members whose only activity to date has been the selling of "The Black Panther" BPP newspaper and the publication of a UFAF newsletter. In addition to this information, indications are that the UFAF is planning to start a liberation school at its headquarters in Omaha in the near future.

In response to referenced Bureau letter, the identities of the leadership of the UFAF are known to the Omaha office. Omaha is presently giving consideration to some type of counter-intelligence activity aimed at disruption of the UFAF newsletter or its distribution and counter-intelligence measures directed against the leaders of this organization.

Close attention will be afforded this matter in order to produce effective results. Proposals for counter-intelligence activity will be submitted to the Bureau by separate communications in the very near future.

I. OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

Activities of the former members of the now ~~defunct~~ BPP in San Diego are being closely followed to determine the current status of these individuals. All possibilities for counterintelligence action will be explored and appropriate requests submitted to the Bureau.

One proposal is presently awaiting Bureau evaluation.

Attempts are being made to determine if the BPP has actively made efforts or has been successful in establishing an office of the BPP on the University of California at San Diego (UCSD) campus under the direction of [REDACTED]. If it is determined that they have established such a unit, appropriate requests will be submitted.

Efforts are also being made to determine if the US group is attempting to infiltrate the various Black Student Council and/or Black Student Union organizations on the various campuses. If it is determined that they are, appropriate requests will be submitted to the Bureau.

II.

OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

The Bureau-approved anonymous letter to [REDACTED] head of the US organization in Los Angeles, along with the newspaper clipping has been mailed. No results have thus far been observed. Internal Revenue Service is continuing their investigation through the efforts of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] is continuing his efforts to determine if the US organization is in violation of income tax laws.

Investigation is being conducted by both the San Diego Police Department Intelligence Unit and San Diego Police Department Forgery Detail concerning the purchase of [REDACTED]. For tangible results see following section of this letter.

III.

TANGIBLE RESULTS

On 12/12/69, information concerning purchases of [REDACTED] were disseminated to the Intelligence Unit of the San Diego Police Department on a UACB basis.

As a result, the [REDACTED] has established a surveillance of [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] These surveillances are in effect as of the present time. It was also subsequently determined by the San Diego Office that the check which was submitted for payment of [REDACTED] was paid for with a forged check in the name of [REDACTED]. In view of the fact that this activity encompasses a local crime, the information was disseminated to the Forgery Detail of the San Diego Police Department. That detail is currently conducting a joint investigation with the Intelligence Unit of the Police Department in an effort to identify the female who was with [REDACTED] who submitted the check for payment, and thereby obtain forgery warrants charging both the girl and [REDACTED]

It is also felt that the racial briefing sessions being given by the San Diego Division are affording tangible results for the Counterintelligence Program. Through these briefings, the command levels of virtually all of the police departments in the San Diego Division are being apprised of the identities of the leaders in the various militant groups.

It is felt that, although specific instances cannot be attributed directly to the racial briefing program, police officers are much more alert for these black militant individuals and as such are contributing to the over all Counterintelligence Program directed against these groups.

Just prior to the raid on the headquarters of the BPP in San Diego on 11/20/69, the San Diego Police Department was advised of the extensive fortifications and sand-bagging effected at BPP headquarters. As a result the San Diego Police Department tactics concerning the raid were changed whereby two plainclothesmen initially gained entry into the headquarters after which they immediately brought in reinforcements. This tactic was used rather than storming the front of the building. As a result, no officers were injured and no exchange of gun fire resulted as may have been the case if the police department had not been aware of the fortifications incorporated in the headquarters building.

IV. DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

The situation in southeast San Diego remains quiet at the present time. Unconfirmed reports have been received that the US organization, particularly, is attempting to infiltrate and obtain members in the various black student council and black student union organizations on various campuses. Efforts are being made to determine the reliability of these unconfirmed reports.

Delay in submission of this letter is occasioned by the fact that the Agent to whom this case is assigned has been involved on a full time basis with the investigation of the extensive Civil Rights investigation concerning [REDACTED] along with numerous racial briefing sessions throughout the San Diego and Imperial County areas.

As per Bureau instructions, this letter does not contain counterintelligence action directed at the BPP.

I. OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

US, Incorporated, and the individual leaders of that organization, are considered the prime target for this phase of the Counterintelligence Program.

Attempts are currently being made to determine the source of income for [REDACTED] to determine if any counterintelligence action is appropriate. Along these lines, consideration is being given toward requesting the Bureau to obtain copies of the individual income tax returns submitted in an effort to determine if declarations being made for revenue from speaking engagements are being reported by them.

II. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

During the previous 90 day period, the following Bureau approved activities have been effected:

Bureau approved information was furnished to [REDACTED] regarding use of the Black Student Council (BSC) office at San Diego State College (SDSC) by the US organization in obtaining supplies and utilization of the mimeograph machine.

The Bureau approved letter to [REDACTED] was prepared on commercially purchased stationery, incorporating the changes pointed out in referenced Bureau letter to San Diego 9/17/69.

Bureau approved information regarding the incorporation of US, Incorporated, has been furnished to [REDACTED]

A Bureau-approved anonymous letter mailed to [REDACTED] concerning the white men who attended an US meeting.

A Bureau-approved anonymous letter to [REDACTED] leader of the US organization, along with a newspaper clipping out of the BPP newspaper, has been prepared and mailed.

III. TANGIBLE RESULTS

On 11/4/69, local news media carried a story reflecting that State Senators and Representatives in California have launched a statewide investigation into the misappropriation of funds designated for the various state colleges. This investigation follows, within one week, information received from [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] It is felt that the Bureau approved information furnished to [REDACTED] contributed greatly or was solely responsible for the above mentioned investigation presently being conducted by the state.

As a result of the Bureau approved information being disseminated to the Internal Revenue Service, that department is conducting investigation of the US Organization to determine if they are in compliance with existing income tax laws.

Information concerning the possibility of US headquarters being bombed on the weekend of 8/30/69, was furnished to the San Diego Police Department prior to the actual bombing. It is felt that the furnishing of this information might have been a major factor in precluding any injury of innocent persons at the time the actual bombing took place.

IV. DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

The situation in southeast San Diego remains quiet at the present time. Unconfirmed reports have been received that the US organization, particularly, is attempting to infiltrate and obtain members in the various black student council and black student union organizations on various campuses. San Diego has apparently misunderstood the Bureau's objection to the mailing of this letter as set forth in Bulet of 11/28/69. The reason it was not previously approved and is not now being approved is that the letter itself makes no reference to the fact that [redacted] are members of the BPP, consequently, as a counterintelligence measure directed at the BPP it has no value since it does nothing to put the BPP in a bad light with the reading public. If you were in possession of public source information showing that [redacted] are members of the BPP, then this could be included in the letter to the newspaper to show the tie-in between [redacted]

It is suggested you hold this matter in abeyance until such time as [redacted] are publicly identified as members of the BPP at which time you should resubmit your proposal including a specific reference in the letter to their association with the BPP.

Re Los Angeles airtel dated 9/15/69, and Los Angeles letter dated 10/27/69, advised the Bureau of the [REDACTED] and of her indication that [REDACTED]

In referenced letter of 10/10/69, Los Angeles advised that the counterintelligence value of this situation was considered minimal but, if the opportunity arose, its usefulness would be maximized.

Los Angeles will be alert to maximize the counterintelligence potential of dissension and animosity between members of the BPP and proposals in this respect are under consideration.

The speech by FRED HAMPTON, Chairman of the Illinois Black Panther Party (BPP) at which attendees were required to submit to comprehensive searches of their person, received unfavorable press coverage in the "Vidette," Illinois State University student newspaper and the "Daily Pantagraph" daily newspaper of Bloomington, Illinois.

On 11-14-69 HAMPTON again spoke, this time at Southern Illinois University, Carbondale, Illinois. Attendees were not subjected to any type of search.

Agents of this Division working with the BPP have made the following suggestion concerning possible counter-intelligence measures:

When a BPP leader is scheduled to speak at a college or university that the college administration be shown the text of the last address as well as looking to the press that everyone was or is searched that attends these speeches.

The San Francisco Division may also be able to have the National Headquarters of the BPP asked if their Illinois Chapter is so weak that they need to fear white college students who attend their speeches, otherwise why search them.

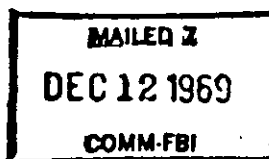

Your suggested letter, to be mailed over the name of BPP [REDACTED] has been reviewed and, while it contains good counterintelligence possibilities, Bureau approval is not being granted at this time for the suggested mailing.

The following general observations are made for your future guidance:

You are correct in directing your counterintelligence efforts against [REDACTED] if you can neutralize his activities in the early steps of his recruiting efforts, you may prevent establishment of a BPP chapter [REDACTED] with the resultant saving in future investigative time.

You are also correct in directing your efforts towards choking off any support the BPP may possibly receive from Negro businessmen or clergy in the area. In this connection, you should be aware that other offices have anonymously mailed copies of the Black Panther Coloring Book and clippings from the "Black Panther" newspaper, which are particularly obscene or violent in nature, to responsible Negro businessmen and clergy. The Coloring Book is particularly vicious and a note can be included stating in effect that this is the type literature and teaching the Negro children are being exposed to when they attend the BPP Breakfast for Children program.

It is assumed there has been an attempt to distribute the "Black Panther" newspaper in the Augusta area. You should give consideration to counterintelligence measures which would disrupt the distribution of this paper.

If there is a known source of funds to the BPP in Augusta, consider counterintelligence measures directed at drying up this source.

Any information developed concerning violations of the law by BPP members should be promptly furnished to appropriate authorities. The resulting arrests and bail or fines will divert BPP funds which would otherwise go into expanding their activities.

Concerning the content of your proposed letter, the following specific observations are made:

The letter is not prepared in the usual jargon of the BPP. A review of the "Black Panther" will familiarize personnel with many of the terms used by and the manner of writing of BPP members. For example, a very common closing in many of their letters is the phrase, "All power to the people!"

The letter is too well typed. It gives the appearance of being prepared by a stenographer. It appears more misspellings would be appropriate; however, if the writer is known to be a well-educated or otherwise literate person, then the misspellings would not be in order.

The derogatory references to [REDACTED] while effectively written, should be deleted. It is very possible that a letter such as this could be circulated in the Negro community or possibly even published in a newspaper. It would not be proper for the Bureau to create suspicion or mistrust of the activities or personnel of another governmental agency.

Finally, the question arises as to the advisability of typing [REDACTED] name at the end of the letter as opposed to his hand-written signature. If any of the recipients of the letter challenge [REDACTED] he will obviously deny authorship of the letter. If the letter bears a good facsimile of his signature, his denial will be less believable. Review the above suggestions and observations and if after further consideration you desire to go forward with the mailing of such a letter, resubmit your proposal in line with the above comments.

In future communications utilize the caption of instant letter. Also, when making a specific counterintelligence proposal, designate a copy of your communication for the San Francisco Office so that they may be aware of the activity involved and be in a position to evaluate the proposal as well as the results which may come to their attention through their coverage of the national headquarters of the BPP.

Secure Bureau approval before instituting any counterintelligence measures.

NOTE: Savannah Office has proposed an anonymous letter over the name of a BPP [REDACTED]. The letter is directed to whom it may concern and attacks several of the Negro clergy and businessmen in the Augusta area for failing to cooperate with the writer in his BPP efforts. BPP activity is just getting underway in the Savannah Office and this is their first counterintelligence proposal. The above suggestions and observations, both general and specific, are being furnished Savannah to assist them in establishing an effective counterintelligence program.

Augusta, Ga.

While being in the Richmond County Jail I have had time to think--time to think about who is my friend and who are the Uncle Toms here in Augusta.

I came to Augusta and have been [redacted] and have got to know many of the so called black leaders. First I talked with [redacted]. It was obvious from the beginning that [redacted] has betrayed the black man in Augusta and is interested only in his church and getting wealth to the hurt of the poor black in Augusta. He drives a big car, gets fatter and fatter, cooperates with the establishment, turns his back on the needs of the poor and is interested only in [redacted]

I started a breakfast program with [redacted] his church. At first this program looked like it would get going and give a real service to the needy, hungry, poor children in the community of [redacted]. [redacted] showed his true colors before the program got going. He wanted to feed not the poor children who were going to school hungry, but to feed his own vanity and desire for glory. So he gets in touch with the news media and promotes [redacted] and his church, not the breakfast program. All at the same time [redacted] draws a big salary with the center, dresses like the establishment, and lives in all the comfort of the capitalist while the children still go hungry to school.

When it becomes obvious who [redacted] is working for, I start working with [redacted] on a breakfast program out of his church. This program did not last as long as the first one, and [redacted] starts talking out of both sides of his mouth. Before a week is over, he gives some lame excuse why he cannot do the breakfast program [redacted]. He shows which side of the fence he is on and everyone soon knows he is on the side of the pigs, the establishment, and the capitalist, while the poor children still go to school hungry.

[redacted] are two of the biggest double crossers of the whole black community. They try to use me to do their dirty work, while they sit back and talk bit but take no action. They also draw big salaries and live like the slumlords and the pigs. Take

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away there big salaries and see where they stand. Also they take in [redacted] who says he is a Panther one day and deny it the next day. [redacted] has shown where he stands after getting a taste of the big money. He is a two faced pig and should go on down and join the pig force. [redacted] should know I have a few friends who keep me informed of his true colors, and where his first love is.

Then there is [redacted] He is the slumlord of the slumlords. How many of the poor black people in the community has this pig lover cheated and swindled. He wants to be a big time politician, not for the black community but to help [redacted] only. He is no better than slumlord [redacted]. He is worse because with his black skin he is a sheep in wolf clothes. [redacted] owns all this property [redacted] but what is he doing to seek better housing, better food, better clothes for the poor? Nothing, but he is out to take away what the poor folks have by charging high prices in all his business establishments. He is no better than Olds and all the other pigs.

These are only a few of the pigs here in Augusta. You see one of them and you see a true Uncle Tom. So, I call on all the Folks here to help me expose them for what they are. They can't be counted on for help in the black community. They can be counted on to line their pockets with the money of this capitalist society, That's all.

I. Operations Under Consideration

Houston currently has no specific counterintelligence operations under consideration other than the continued utilization of well placed Houston informants. As the Bureau is aware, because of the successful operation of these Houston informants, Houston SNCC and Houston BPP activities have ceased and the only black nationalist organization currently operating in the Houston area is the NOI.

II. Operations Being Effected

No specific counterintelligence operations are currently being effected at this time other than the continued efforts with informants to preclude any black nationalist organization obtaining a foothold in the Houston area.

III. Tangible Results

Results of past counterintelligence action in the Houston Division as pointed out above has brought about a highly desirable situation in the Houston area, in that there is currently no black nationalist organization operating in Houston other than a small NOI group, and at the present time it appears that with the handling of the informants and the current climate in Houston, no black nationalist activity of significance is likely to develop.

Your interest in submitting the counterintelligence proposal contained in relet is appreciated; however, authority is not granted to implement your suggested plan. There are several objections. The "Reader's Digest" article is lengthy and probably would not be read in its entirety by recipients. Also the article points out that the BPP has taken violent retaliatory measures against businessmen who have not "contributed" to the Panthers. This could have an undesired effect on businessmen reading the article by causing them to succumb to Panther solicitations to avoid any possible violence directed at them. Further, to utilize [REDACTED] in the distribution of the reprints would be exposing a Bureau counterintelligence technique to an outside source which, of course, should not be done.

As an alternative it is suggested you give consideration to determining through your sources the identity of the businessmen who are contributing to the BPP Breakfast for Children Program and, thereafter, anonymously mail to them copies of the Black Panther Party Coloring Book which shows the vicious nature of this organization. A note can be included with the mailing stating that this is the type of teaching the children are receiving at the Breakfast for Children Program.

Enclosed for the Bureau are pages 121 through 126 containing an article captioned "Intelligence Report on Today's 'New Revolutionaries' " from the October, 1969, "Reader's Digest".

As indicated in referenced letter, the BPP has recently opened an office in Albany and has attempted to solicit funds from merchants in this city. It is felt that if their efforts to obtain financial support are unsuccessful, the possibility of success in their future endeavors will be greatly minimized. In view of the above, the following information is set forth:

[REDACTED]

On 11/19/69, he voluntarily appeared at the Albany Office of the FBI and furnished information concerning the attempts of the BPP to solicit funds from the merchants of that area. During subsequent contacts he has referred to the enclosed article which affords accurate portrayal of BPP efforts to raise money through their breakfast program and other related activities. He has also personally brought the solicitation attempts of the BPP to the attention of the local Chamber of Commerce.

It is recommended this source be approached to determine if he would be agreeable to having reprints of this article disseminated by the local Chamber of Commerce to all on their mailing list. It would be pointed out to him this would be upon his own initiative and that the FBI could not be involved under any conditions although reprints of this article would be supplied to him by the Bureau.

Intelligence Report on Today's "New Revolutionaries"

By WILLIAM SCHULZ

AT NEW YORK UNIVERSITY, members of the Students for a Democratic Society slip into an auditorium where the Ambassador from South Vietnam is scheduled to speak. At a given signal, they storm the stage, manhandle the Ambassador and flee the hall. The young activists then proceed to another room, batter down the doors and forcibly prevent New York Times columnist James Reston from delivering his speech.

During a period of agitation by student radicals in Claremont, Calif., a secretary at Pomona College removes a bulky package from a col-

lege mailbox. As she does, the box explodes, blinding the woman in one eye, causing loss of two fingers and badly disfiguring her face.

At Tougaloo College in Mississippi, students from Negro colleges in the South and East attend a closed-door "defense workshop," discuss the elimination of mayors and police chiefs, the kidnaping of college authorities, the instruction of ghetto residents in the manufacture of Molotov cocktails and use of firearms.

These recent incidents, by no means isolated, are graphic illustrations of a new breed of revo-

lutionary violence that is gravely threatening America. Its iron-fisted methods, often masked behind a shield of legitimate concerns, are doing severe disservice to honest protest in our society. "This has gone beyond the issues," says Prof. Harvey Mansfield of strife-torn Columbia University. "It is naked force against the democratic process."

The FBI supplies grim statistics: in 12 months more than 225 campuses were rocked by organized terror and violence; campus radicals accounted for more than \$3 million in damages as research labs, ROTC buildings, even auditoriums were bombed; police in more than 40 cities were the target of guerrilla attacks.

Not surprisingly, apprehensive citizens in all parts of the country are asking: Who are the New Radicals? How do they operate? Who is financing them? How extensively are they assisted from abroad?

Here, then, is an intelligence report based upon months of nationwide research and the accumulation of documented findings by Congressional probers, U.S. law-enforcement agencies, and state and local authorities. In the words of Sen. John McClellan (D., Ark.), whose U.S. Senate Permanent Investigations Subcommittee has conducted extensive hearings: "The public now deserves to be acquainted with the cold, irrefutable facts."

Alliance of Terror. The revolutionary menace consists of a highly dangerous minority of perhaps

20,000 activists embedded within an overall movement of 200,000 radical dissidents. At the core of the movement, security officials agree, are two groups, one white and one black, both with grandiose plans for the overthrow of a "decadent" American society. They are:

- The Students for a Democratic Society, activated in 1962 by a handful of students from less than a dozen campuses. Today, SDS claims 70,000 followers on 350 campuses, and its national leaders—virtually all non-students—proudly rattle off a string of revolutionary victories scored last year at schools from Harvard to San Francisco State.*

- The Black Panther Party, a virulent, self-styled "armed revolutionary vanguard." In less than two years, the Panthers have mushroomed from a 125-man contingent based solely in Oakland, Calif., to a nationwide operation with 60,000 sympathizers and chapters in two dozen cities. "Schooled in the Marxist-Leninist ideology and the teachings of Mao Tse-tung," reports the FBI, "Panther members have perpetrated numerous assaults on police officers and engaged in violent confrontations with police throughout the country."

Throughout the early part of 1969, national leaders of SDS and the Black Panther Party held top-secret strategy sessions to discuss plans and coordinate strategy. The meetings were hardly surprising, for the

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extremist blacks and the revolutionary whites have much in common: a hatred for present-day America, an idolization of Fidel Castro and Mao Tse-tung, an abiding faith in violence as the means of destroying American society.

Bombs and Bombast. Thus, last fall, activists attending the SDS national council meeting at Boulder, Colo., were supplied copies of a pamphlet that set forth detailed instructions on the manufacture of fire bombs, train mines, even hand grenades. This and other manuals were circulated widely among SDS and other activists from coast to coast—with predictable results.

At Washington University in St. Louis, a 22-year-old SDS member, Michael S. Siskind, was arrested and convicted of the attempted fire bombing of an ROTC installation. At Ann Arbor, Mich., a bomb ripped through the local offices of the CIA, causing extensive property damage, and SDS claimed credit. Finally, a 26-year-old Army deserter, SDSer Cameron D. Bishop, became the first campus radical to make the FBI's Ten Most Wanted List—charged with the dynamite sabotage last January of defense-plant transmission-line towers near Denver. "It's not reform we're after," one SDSer told reporters at last summer's national convention in Chicago. "It's the destruction of your stinking, rotten society—and you better learn that fast."

The pronouncements of Black Panther leaders are strikingly simi-

lar. "Let us make it clear that the Panthers do not seek the objective of civil or legal rights," announced the party's minister of education, George Mason Murray, while visiting Cuba in August 1968. "We are organized like guerrillas," he said. Their purpose: to assassinate police, blow up bridges, burn factories.

This is not mere rhetoric. Panther members receive detailed instruction in the revolutionary use of "anti-property and anti-personnel grenades and bombs." Senate testimony reveals that last year, in Mobile, Ala., Panther Field Marshal Donald Lee Cox held classes for young Negroes in the manufacture and use of acid bombs. Result: a wave of terrorist bombings, mostly of Mobile business establishments. At least 58 of the bombings were attributed to such explosives.

From Havana With Hate. Substantial quantities of revolutionary propaganda are imported from China and Cuba by the Panthers and various New Left groups. One widely circulated tract, originally published in Cuba, advocates extensive sabotage, the derailing of trains, the use of fire bombs, homemade flame-throwers and explosive booby traps. Finally, "advanced instruction" in the revolutionary arts is available outside the United States.

Twenty-year-old Christopher Z. Milton told the SDS national convention this year that he spent three years behind the Bamboo Curtain, where he was a member of the revolutionary Red Guard. New Yorker

Robert Steele Collier, 32, visited Cuba in 1964 as part of a tour organized by the pro-Peking Progressive Labor Party and paid for by the Castro government. While in Cuba, Collier is reported to have received training in explosives from a major in the North Vietnamese army. He returned home, established contact with Cuban U.N. diplomats, and was a leader of a Black Liberation Front set up to carry out terrorist acts.

Collier mapped ambitious plans to blow up the Statue of Liberty, the Washington Monument and the Liberty Bell—but was “betrayed” by an undercover policeman who had infiltrated his group. Convicted of conspiracy in June 1965, he was sent off to federal prison—only to be released with time off for good behavior in March 1967. The “rehabilitated” Collier went on the New York City payroll as a recreation supervisor and moved into the Black Panthers. In April 1969 he was behind bars again—one of 21 Panthers charged with conspiracy to bomb department stores and to murder police. Collier is only one of hundreds of young Americans who have traveled to Cuba in recent years. In August 1968, for instance, 34 SDS members made their way to Cuba via Mexico. Part of the group of SDSers met with Huynh Van Ba, of the National Liberation Front of South Vietnam, who urged them to marshal U.S. anti-war sentiment, organize draft resisters, and solicit funds for the Vietcong.

Fat Cats and Foundations. The dollars that fuel the New Left and Black Power movements come from a variety of sources—foreign and domestic, legal and illegal. Many New Leftists come from affluent homes with indulgent parents whose generous allowances cover travel and minimum living expenses. Operating costs of the movement are high, however. Just to maintain the SDS national office, for instance, costs more than \$80,000 a year.

Some of this is covered by membership dues and the sale of literature. But nearly 60 percent of the SDS budget comes in the form of contributions—including substantial amounts, curiously, from wealthy benefactors. As FBI director J. Edgar Hoover told Congress, four individuals—a Cleveland industrialist, the wife of a millionaire Chicago attorney, a New England heiress, and a wealthy New York lecturer and writer—have contributed a total of more than \$100,000 to New Left activities.

Several tax-exempt foundations have helped finance the New Left. Hoover disclosed that one such group, located in New York, has supplied more than \$250,000 during the past seven years to individuals and groups, most of which have had close ties to the New Left or Communist Party-U.S.A.

Piece of the Action. All too frequently, report experts, campus unrest is also financed by unsuspecting students and taxpayers. For example, at San Francisco State College

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(enrollment 18,000), several hundred student radicals took advantage of campus apathy and captured the student government in a little-noticed election.

Once in control of the \$400,000-a-year associated students fund, derived from required student fees and some bookstore profits, the radicals ousted the business manager and his staff, slashed allocations for traditional activities—athletics, service clubs, various extracurricular groups—and embarked on a wild orgy of revolutionary spending. From then until State Attorney General Thomas Lynch impounded the fund last February, they approved pay and allowances for each other, purchased guns, commissioned "Hate Whitey" movies for ghetto showings, hired Panthers as lecturers.

The militants discovered other sources of money, including funds available from government agencies to Bay Area colleges, which were to enable them to conduct Community Action programs in the slums. College radicals promptly maneuvered themselves and their allies into many of the 300 to 500 work-study student jobs, each paying up to \$3.50 an hour. These work-study students, operating in pairs throughout the ghetto, organized protest marches and school boycotts, picketed defense plants, fomented rent strikes and promoted "lie-ins" to halt troop trains.

The use of anti-poverty funds for disruption and violence is not confined to the Bay Area. Indeed, from

coast to coast, black and white extremists of all descriptions have managed to grab a piece of the action:

Item: Black Panther leaders Bobby Seale, Huey Newton and George Murray all spent time on the anti-poverty payroll. In Jersey City, that city's chief Panther kept his anti-poverty job even after he was arrested for assaulting a policeman.

Item: In New York City, officials put up \$30,000 for a "Free Store," designed to aid hippies and other "alienated youth." Free Store facilities were used to distribute leaflets on the manufacture of fire bombs and to recruit demonstrators for the 1968 Democratic national convention in Chicago.

Item: Little more than a year ago, Cleveland police walked into an ambush in the steaming Glenville ghetto—and were cut down one by one by trained marksmen. In 30 minutes, two patrolmen and a lieutenant were dead, 14 more were wounded. The leader of the uprising, black militant Fred (Ahmed) Evans, had received nearly \$7000 in local anti-poverty funds—and boasted he had used part of the money for purchasing the murder weapons.

Capacity for Chaos. The largest source of Panther funds is not the poverty program, however, but the armed robberies and the shake-downs committed in the name of revolution. The Panthers' so-called "Breakfast Program" is a perfect example.

Tough young recruits swagger

through the ghetto informing merchants that the Panthers are running pre-school chow lines for underprivileged black kids. Contributions—in the form of foodstuffs or money—are demanded. "You wouldn't want someone to burn down your store," smiled one Los Angeles Panther.

The merchants get the message. In the San Francisco area, an auto dealer who refused to give the Panthers money arrived at work the next day to find his plate-glass windows shattered. A Chinese grocer in Oakland who refused to continue donations saw his place badly damaged by fire. In Harrisburg, Pa., "uncooperative" merchants were fire-bombed. "Most merchants are petrified," explains an East Coast police official. "So they kick in—\$25, \$50, \$100 a week."

Such "voluntary contributions" finance an insidious program of revolutionary indoctrination. Impressionable school-age children—second, third and fourth graders—are fed not only bacon and eggs (usually in church basements) but massive doses of racist propaganda. A coloring book that shows blacks mutilating policemen with guns, knives and hatchets has been distributed in at least five different programs.

Other Panther projects are financed by armed robberies, as ex-Panther Larry C. Powell told the McClellan Subcommittee. As a member of the elite black guard, Powell related, he had been assigned to one of the "rip-out" squads that carried out the daily robberies ordered by the Black Panther Party Central Committee. Stores were carefully targeted—"A place wasn't worth robbing unless it had \$500 or more"—with one third of the take going to the Panther treasury and the other two thirds split among the robbers.

The Panthers are no more representative of American blacks than the Students for a Democratic Society are of the country's seven million collegians. But both groups have a capacity for disruption that far exceeds their numbers. By carefully selecting issues—from the Vietnam war to "police brutality"—and by exploiting them fully, they have stirred to action thousands who would not normally become involved. And the havoc they have wreaked has had far-reaching consequences. It has jeopardized the struggle for civil rights, severely disrupted the normal processes of our academic system and posed a major threat to the continued existence of our democratic system.

Fall Fancy. Autumn is the peacock of the calendar: strutting, preening, wheeling and dipping its way through September and October and even into November, clearly mindful of all the attention that is turned its way.

Investigation by the Oklahoma City Division has developed no information indicating the existence of a Black Panther Party branch in this division at the present time.

In August, 1969, a group of young Negroes under the [REDACTED] attempted to form a branch of the BPP in Oklahoma City. This group was never authorized as a BPP branch by the National Office of the BPP and their only known method of contact with the BPP headquarters during the time the group was in existence was by telephone. This BPP group in Oklahoma City participated openly for a few days in the demonstrations in connection with a strike of sanitation workers in Oklahoma City. During the first week of the strike the Oklahoma City Police commenced a physical surveillance of [REDACTED] and resulted in his leaving the State of Oklahoma.

Following the departure of [REDACTED] from Oklahoma City, there has been no further activity of the Black Panther group in Oklahoma City.

Investigation of the activity of this Black Panther group by the Oklahoma City Division and by the Oklahoma City Police Department has developed no information indicating that the group ever utilized tapes to send reports to national headquarters.

I. OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

Malcolm X Liberation University (MXLU), [REDACTED] was dedicated in 10/69. A portion of its funds were publicly announced as coming from the Episcopal Church. It is noted that the Columbia Division submitted a proposal concerning the making available information concerning MXLU to [REDACTED]

It is noted that the Bureau did not grant authority to carry out this plan due to the possibility of embarrassment. After a review of appropriate files, Charlotte will make a recommendation as to the furnishing of public source type data concerning MXLU to [REDACTED]

Concerning [REDACTED] formerly Black Panther Party (BPP) [REDACTED] now residing at [REDACTED], no positive information could be located by New Haven and New York as to an actual marriage [REDACTED] however, he continues to reside with [REDACTED] without benefit of a known marriage. [REDACTED] has been inactive in the Black Nationalist situation in Greensboro, and due to the fact positive proof of a previous marriage could not be located, no further action will be taken at this time. In the event [REDACTED] again becomes active, an appropriate counterintelligence plan will be submitted to the Bureau.

It is noted that the Bureau suggested that, in view of the fact that [REDACTED], had advised the BPP Headquarters that he had had difficulty in distributing the BPP Paper in Charlotte, and was quoted as saying that some of the "niggers" in Charlotte say that [REDACTED] is a Communist, that the paper is a Communist paper, this line of thinking should be further engendered in the responsible Negro population. However, due to lack of BPP activity at Charlotte, Charlotte has suggested that no efforts be made to publicize the BPP at this time. It is noted that the only active group actually seeking affiliation with the BPP is now located at Winston-Salem, N. C. On the development of the appropriate means, efforts will be made at Winston-Salem, N. C., to publicize the connections of the BPP with foreign Communist Nations and the BPP support of racial violence in the United States.

II. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

Bureau permission has been received to furnish public source type data concerning [REDACTED] and black extremist activities to [REDACTED] of the [REDACTED]

Preliminary discussions have been held with [REDACTED] however, to date he has not completed his article concerning [REDACTED] and is withholding further preparation pending developments in MXLU.

1. Operations Under Consideration

Information has been recently received that [REDACTED], a Pittsburgh black militant leader who has in the past been involved in a gun battle with Pittsburgh police officers, is presently employed as a [REDACTED] at the University of Pittsburgh. Appropriate counter-intelligence action to publicize this employment and thus get him removed from this position is being considered.

The Republic of New Africa (RNA) has recently established a consulate in Pittsburgh and is presently experiencing difficulty in getting well established. The recent factional dispute between [REDACTED] which resulted in the cancellation of the RNA Legislative Conference scheduled for Pittsburgh on Thanksgiving weekend, has had an effect on the Pittsburgh RNA and this office is considering operations to capitalize on this situation and to prevent the RNA from becoming firmly established.

2. Operations Being Effectuated

Public source material concerning [REDACTED] has been previously furnished to [REDACTED] and reliable source at the [REDACTED] and information concerning his possible employment at the University of Pittsburgh has also been furnished to [REDACTED]. Relets requested information concerning the mailing of tapes from various BPP branches to BPP Headquarters at San Francisco, California.

[redacted] advised that to their knowledge, no tapes were ever made of Political Education classes at the Milwaukee BPP Chapter. Both indicated, however, [redacted]

[redacted] instructing Milwaukee to make recordings of speeches given by the Milwaukee BPP members. Nevertheless, sources were not aware of any instances wherein recordings were actually made for the purpose of sending them to National Headquarters.

Both sources indicate that since the Milwaukee BPP Chapter was dissolved, on approximately 11/4/69, no contact with National Headquarters has been made. The Milwaukee BPP Chapter remains disillusioned with National Headquarters, as they feel they were unjustly treated by the national leaders. Since the chapter has split up into 3 splinter groups, no organized Political Education classes or speeches have been given by any of the remaining members. Sources remain alert for tapes being sent to National Headquarters and are aware of the Bureau's interest in these tapes.

No information has been developed by the Omaha Division to indicate that the United Front Against Facism, the successor organization to the BPP branch in Omaha, Nebraska, has been forwarding taped reports to National BPP Headquarters in San Francisco.

As has been previously pointed out to the Bureau, the BPP Chapter in Des Moines, Iowa, continues to be inactive and for all intents and purposes does not presently exist.

II. and III. Operations Being Effected and Tangible Results Obtained

Reference has previously been made to the specific counterintelligence actions initiated by Chicago. No information has been received reflecting tangible results of these actions.

Chicago has also continued to advise local authorities of instances where BPP members appear vulnerable to arrest on local charges. In this regard, Chicago letter to the Bureau dated November 21, 1969, captioned "Black Panther Party (BPP), RM" is concerned with the location in Chicago of weapons reportedly purchased legally by local BPP members. This information has been furnished to local law enforcement officials. Officials of the Chicago Police Department have advised that the department is currently planning a positive course of action relative to this information.

Information has regularly been disseminated by Chicago to other Bureau offices for local dissemination in instances where Chicago BPP have travelled elsewhere. Local BPP members have made a number of trips to Illinois State University at Normal, Illinois. Prior knowledge of the presence of these subjects, their identities and purpose of trip has been of value in alerting local authorities to the potential for violence represented.

IV. Developments of Counterintelligence Interest

Recently FRED HAMPTON, Deputy Chairman, Illinois BPP and [REDACTED] called a general meeting of the Chicago Branch of the BPP at which time HAMPTON announced that everyone, but himself and [REDACTED] were purged from the BPP.

A counterintelligence recommendation was submitted by letter dated November 25, 1969, relative to this action.

This situation is being followed closely and where any further counterintelligence avenue appears likely a suitable recommendation will be made.

No counterintelligence action will be taken by Chicago without Bureau approval.

Regarding the remainder of local Black Nationalist groups and individuals, their activities are fragmented and limited. Chicago continues to follow such activities in the event information is developed which would indicate a counterintelligence effort would appear to have reasonable potential.

Continuing coverage by Minneapolis through racial informants, confidential sources, and police liaison fail to develop any information that there are any organized black nationalist-type hate groups operating in the Minneapolis Division with the exception of the Nation of Islam group whose membership has remained constant. This group has not been involved in any racially oriented disturbances in the Minneapolis Division.

Minneapolis is continuing to emphasize quality informant coverage and will continue to enlarge coverage of Negro community. A few Negro militants in this Division have been unable to get any type of organization started inasmuch as the vast majority of the Negro people in the Minneapolis - St. Paul area are hard-working, independent, straight-thinking individuals who have been the first to decry any type of racial violence in the Twin Cities area.

By letter dated 11/6/69, the St. Louis Division requested authorization to distribute copies of an editorial which appeared in a local newspaper, which editorial was critical of ACTION, a local black activist group, and ACTION's opposition to the Veiled Prophet Ball. By letter dated 11/17/69, the Bureau declined to authorize the mailing of the above-described material.

3. Tangible Results

In response to a St. Louis request, the Bureau on 6/3/69 authorized the New York Division to send an anonymous mailing of [REDACTED] letter which criticized the Black Panther Party. These letters were apparently not mailed until the last week of September, 1969, and apparently the time lapse between the date of [REDACTED] letter and its anonymous dissemination in the St. Louis area was sufficient to blunt the effectiveness of this particular article. While no specific information has been received from informants and sources as to the actual comments from the local New Left figures, it is apparent that there is no strong support in the St. Louis area among the New Left extremists for the Black Panther Party. This is further evidenced by the fact that there has been no serious attempt of any kind to formulate a Black Panther Chapter in this Division despite the fact that the St. Louis metropolitan area has a high Negro population and presumably has sufficient black militants who might be interested in such an organization.

4. Developments of Counterintelligence Interest

ACTION, described above, continues to be the only black group of any significance other than the Nation of Islam in the St. Louis Division. This Division is continuing to research various counterintelligence activities which would be effective against this organization, and when another specific plan is developed, Bureau authority will be requested to initiate same by separate communication.

The 12/3/69 issue of the New Haven Journal Courier, daily morning newspaper New Haven, Conn., contained an article entitled, "Panther: Police Seeking to Drive Us From City", which reported a press conference held by BPP Captain DOUGLAS MIRANDA at BPP Headquarters, 35 Sylvan Avenue, New Haven.

Black Panther Party Member

MIRANDA said that the step-up in the alleged harassment of the New Haven BPP is due to the party's active effort toward "community rehabilitation" and is an effort to drive the party from the New Haven area.

MIRANDA said that he had received information from what he termed a reliable source that police, Federal marshals and FBI agents would raid the headquarters before the end of the week.

The New Haven Office is not aware of any anticipated arrests of BPP members in the near future by Federal or local authorities.

The motive or reason for the ordering of "Mandate Three" and the press conference, supra, is unknown. There is a possibility that the BPP is initiating a counterintelligence program of its own in order to obtain public sympathy.

San Francisco should, of course, promptly submit their own counterintelligence proposal to Bureau when information is received concerning activity scheduled in San Francisco territory.

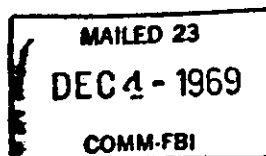

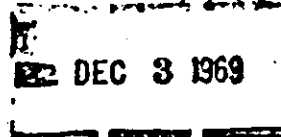

These black radicals are now peddling their own revolutionary season's greeting cards at \$1.00 a box. The greeting cards, of poor quality prepared in black and white by their "Minister of Culture," are advertised for sale in the latest issue of "The Black Panther" newspaper.

In one hate card a child is shown telling his father what he wants for Christmas - machine gun, hand grenades and dynamite! Another depicts a young boy, gun in hand pointed at Santa Claus's head saying "We want an end to the robbery by the capitalists of our Black Community." Police are represented as pigs being chopped by bullets and dynamite!

It is ironical indeed that in the season which resounds to "Peace on earth" and "good will to men" some will open their greeting cards to see a drawing of a black baby clutching a gun while someone proclaims "We will fight from one generation to the next."

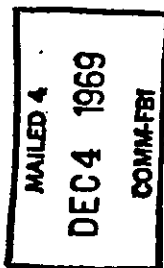

Tampa letter to the Bureau, 10/16/69, captioned [REDACTED] indicates that Local Board #4, Freeport, N.Y., had received a letter dated 9/22/69 from [REDACTED], advising that [REDACTED] in his fourth year and resides on campus. Inquiry at New College indicates that [REDACTED] is in fact not attending school and not residing at the college. The New York Office has been requested to contact [REDACTED] for the full circumstances surrounding the letter supposedly from [REDACTED] attendance and residence at the school. The possibility exists that [REDACTED] is in violation of the Selective Service Act for furnishing false information or certificates to the Local Board regarding his attendance at New College.

2. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

At the present time Tampa has mosques of the NOI located in Tampa, Melbourne, Ft. Myers and St. Petersburg, Fla. The Tampa Mosque has a membership of 15-20 members whereas the other mosques have memberships of 4 to 6 members each. These mosques have had no effect or support within the community.

The Junta of Militant Organization (JOMO) in St. Petersburg, Fla. has 8 to 10 members and the [REDACTED], is out of jail on appeal.

The Los Angeles Division continues to follow arrests of members of the LABPP for violations of Anti-Riot and Gun Control laws, to determine if any of these individuals might be prosecuted under Federal or State laws. Liaison with logical sporting goods stores and firearms outlets continues in an effort to identify members of the LABPP purchasing firearms.

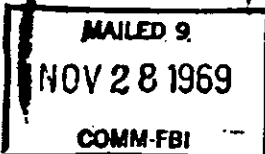

The item relates that the Black United Front (BUF) has demanded a "tax" of a dollar per demonstrator (or a lump sum of \$25,000) be paid by the New Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam (NMC) in order to hold an antiwar demonstration 11/15/69 in Washington, D. C., and in spite of this, Julius Hobson, a prominent BUF member, has agreed to speak at this NMC demonstration.

In addition, the NMC has procured the appearance of Mrs. Coretta King at the rally and the group now believes that the BUF will be reluctant to cause any trouble if the "tax" is not paid.

Publicity about this situation in Washington, D. C., would further the rift between the antiwar group and the black community and would help neutralize the demonstration.

ANALYSIS OF PUBLICATIONS

Articles appearing in Volume 1, Issue No. 59, of "The Voice of the Black Community" (VOBC), dated October 9, 1969, of intelligence interest are as follows:

An editorial appearing on Page 2 of VOBC entitled "As I See It", alleges that Mr. NIXON is attempting to force the appointment of Judge HAYNESWORTH to the Supreme Court Bench. It further states that "even though HAYNESWORTH is a known racist, a union buster and a user of his position for personal gain, NIXON is still telling the country to accept him."

An article appearing on Page 4 of VOBC contains alleged statements of Mayor RICHARD GORDON HATCHER, Gary, Indiana, to the effect that the election of several "law and order candidates" in primaries in New York, Los Angeles, and Minneapolis showed an alarming trend toward conservatism that may well include a federal plan to put dissenters in concentration camps. The article goes on to state that in his regular address to the Gary City Council, HATCHER said that he was disturbed by frequent rumors among black leaders that the federal government has approved \$50 million to renovate Job Corps camps around the country despite President NIXON's assertion that he was planning to phase out the Job Corps. The article carries a direct quote as follows: "That can lead to one of several conclusions, the most frightening of which is that those camps are being prepared for dissidents, perhaps Black and white."

In Volume 1, Issue No. 58, VOBC, Thursday, October 16, 1969, no articles of intelligence interest are apparent.

Articles appearing in Volume 1, Issue No. 58, Thursday, October 24, 1969, of VOBC, are as follows:

An article appearing on Page 1, entitled, "Janitor Accused of Pushing and Kicking Black Girl", alleges a discrepancy in a story printed in the "Decatur Herald-Review".

with a story obtained by the editor from one of the participant's mother and grandmother. The story alleges that a white student was let into a restricted area at Thomas Jefferson High School to get pop. Black students attempting to do the same thing were blocked at the door by a white janitor. Through a joke, cold cream on the hands of one of the girls got on the janitor and he shoved her against the wall and kicked her. After shoving another of the girls her sister allegedly jumped in and scratched him. The editor states that a recent article in the "Decatur Herald-Review" reported that three girls had attacked the janitor at Thomas Jefferson School. The article states that "in the past years incidents like this have been publicized degrading black people and we had no means of rebuttal. This isn't true today for the VOICE is on the scene telling it just like it is."

Volume 2, Issue No. 8, Thursday, October 30, 1969, of VOBC, contains no articles of intelligence interest.

Articles appearing in Volume 2, Issue No. 9, Thursday, November 6, 1969, of VOBC, of intelligence interest are as follows:

An article appearing on Page 3, entitled "Seale Depicts Image of Blacks in America", contains an artists conception of Black Panther BOBBY SEALE gagged and shackled to a chair. Underneath the picture is a statement as follows: "This picture of Bobby Seale portrays the predicament of Blacks in America today. Those Blacks speaking out for the rights of black people are being gagged. Those blacks doing something physical about the problem are being shackled."

Articles of intelligence interest appearing in Volume 2, Issue No. 10, November 13, 1969, are as follows:

An article appearing on Page 1, entitled "Many Discrepancies Unfold in Sangster Trial" alleges as its purpose, giving the public an opportunity to know the many contradictions in the trial of WILLIE T. SANGSTER, and also

the caliber of the witnesses testifying on both sides. The article, apparently written by the editor, HORACE G. LIVINGSTON, states that he witnessed the events in the courtroom and he is reporting what he saw and heard. The editor refers to the testimony of GEORGE GRAYNED, who he says testified that he drove SANGSTER to the hospital at 4:30 on the day of the robbery, December 16, 1969, and went with him to visit his wife. The editor states that GRAYNED later left and did not return until 8:00 PM to pick up SANGSTER.

The editor also states that a Northtown parking lot attendant gave a statement after the robbery indicating that the man was between 18 and 24 years old, wore a dark coat, and weighed approximately 130 pounds. The article then said that he could not identify pictures of SANGSTER at Headquarters, or pick him out of a line-up. The article then said that yet in open court he made positive identification. The article also contains the alleged testimony of Dr. LEWIS KIRK of Adolph Meyer Zone Center who recalled meetings with SANGSTER on the day of the robbery, which lasted from 1:30 to 4:10 PM. Then there is alleged testimony of Mrs. ALMA TATE, Zone Center employee, who stated that she left work and went directly to Decatur Memorial Hospital to visit Mrs. SANGSTER at 4:30 PM and arrived 10 or 15 minutes later and saw SANGSTER in his wife's room at that time.

The article does not contain any indication as to testimony concerning the time of the robbery.

The only significant change in the Black Nationalist Movement in this division is the fact that the three Black Panther Party (BPP) branches have given up their headquarters and stopped participating in the Breakfast for Children Program and the Liberation School Program.

1) OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

No specific operation is now under consideration. The almost complete lack of activity by the BPP and the very limited activity of the Nation of Islam (NOI) have made development of a meaningful counterintelligence program particularly difficult. Consideration is given to any information received concerning these organizations having potential counterintelligence action but thus far, no worthwhile program has been developed.

1. Operations Under Consideration

The NYO is presently considering an attempt to disrupt the distribution of "The Black Panther", the BPP national newspaper, in the New York City area.

In order to accomplish the above proposal, it is necessary that the NYO thoroughly analyze the means and methods of distribution of "The Black Panther" in order that a logical and practical plan may be submitted to the Bureau.

Upon completion of the aforementioned study, a plan will be submitted to the Bureau by separate cover letter for the Bureau's consideration and approval.

The NYO is now considering the fact that since several current issues of "The Black Panther" seem to be more concerned with combating Fascism than with bettering the plight of the Black man and that handbills be prepared to that effect which would be distributed in known areas of BPP activity.

2. Operations Being Submitted

On 11/20/69, an anonymous letter was sent to [REDACTED] after Bureau approval to do so was granted on 9/23/69.

The delay in mailing the anonymous letter was because of the recent Mayoral campaign in New York City. It was felt that an

earlier mailing of this letter might make it appear to be politically motivated and, therefore, cause it to lose its hoped for effectiveness.

On 10/28/69, information was received that the BPP had contacted an official of St. Anthony of Padua, a Roman Catholic Church in NYC, with the hope of instituting a "BPP Free Breakfast Program".

On 10/29/69, SAS of the NYO contacted a priest at the above mentioned church and discussed with him the background and ideals of the BPP.

During the months of September and October, 1969, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] could furnish no information which would identify any members of the BPP as being the recipients of welfare benefits. It is planned to utilize any positive information obtained from this source as a counter-intelligence proposal which would discredit the BPP in the New York area.

Also during the period of September through November, 1969, several confidential sources, who have furnished reliable information in the past, and who are familiar with some aspects of racial activities in the New York City area advised that generally [REDACTED] among the Black community and exerted no influence on their activities. Therefore, it is felt that there is no pertinent counterintelligence aspect that could be capitalized on in regard to [REDACTED]

On 11/7/69, the NYO submitted a list to San Francisco (re their file SF 157-601) of individuals known to be active in or at least closely associated with the workings of the BPP in the NYC area. This is to be utilized in a counterintelligence technique emanating from San Francisco.

3. Tangible Results

On 11/3/69, SAS of the NYO again contacted the priest previously mentioned at [REDACTED] Church and learned that the "BPP Free Breakfast Program" was not instituted at that church and there were no plans to permit it to operate in the future.

It is felt that the above situation is indicative of the proper utilization of counterintelligence measures by the NYO.

4. Developments of Counterintelligence Interests

The activities of the Jewish Defense League as reported in the local news media are being closely monitored so that an appropriate "second anonymous communication" may be submitted to the Bureau for their suggestions and approval.

Activities of the Republic of New Africa in the NYC area continue to be in a state of flux. When their activities achieve some semblance of stability, consideration will be given to the submission of logical counterintelligence proposals dealing with this organization.

The NYO is aware of the necessity for the Bureau to consider and recommend any specific counterintelligence proposal and will, therefore, remain alert for indications of situations where counterintelligence techniques may be utilized and will immediately inform the Bureau of such happenings.

You stated in relet that the United Front Against Fascism (UFAF), the successor to the Black Panther Party (BPP) in Omaha, is composed of approximately eight to twelve members, and their only activities have been to sell "The Black Panther," BPP newspaper, and publication of a UFAF news letter.

While the activities appear to be limited in the Omaha area, it does not necessarily follow that effective counterintelligence measures cannot be taken. As long as there are BPP activities, you should be giving consideration to that type of counterintelligence measure which would best disrupt existing activities. It would appear that some type of counterintelligence aimed at the disruption of the publication and distribution of their literature is in order. It is also assumed that of the eight to twelve members, one or two must certainly be in a position of leadership. You should give consideration to counterintelligence measures directed against these leaders in an effort to weaken or destroy their positions. Bureau has noted that you have not submitted any concrete counterintelligence proposals in recent months. Evaluate your approach to this program and insure that it is given the imaginative attention necessary to produce effective results. Handle promptly and submit your proposals to the Bureau for approval.

During October, 1969, copies of a cartoon which had appeared in the BPP newspaper and which had been altered and reproduced by Newark were mailed, following receipt of Bureau approval, to selected BPP members and sympathizers connected with the Jersey City, N.J., BPP Chapter.

III. TANGIBLE RESULTS

Tangible results cannot be directly attributed to any specific counterintelligence operations effected by Newark based on information presently available.

IV. DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

BPP Chapter, has been attempting to form a new organization called the BLACK NATIONALIST PARTY built around the remnants of the former Newark BPP Chapter. These efforts have met with little success to date.

No suggestions have been submitted to the Bureau as of this time since it appears the BPP is encountering resistance in this area. This matter will be closely followed, however, and if this organization becomes active in the area, specific suggestions will be submitted to the Bureau.

The following is a ninety day summary of activities within the New Haven Division relating to captioned program:

1. OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

The New Haven Division has and will continue to recommend anonymous mailings regarding prominent sympathizers to the Connecticut Black Panther Party. It is felt that operations of this nature will cause embarrassment, not only to those individuals concerned, but to the Black Panther Party as well.

The New Haven and Hartford Branches of the Black Panther Party are engaged in a breakfast for children program and these programs are being closely watched for possible counterintelligence exploitation.

2. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

As authorized by the Bureau, the New Haven Division will continue to furnish public source data to approved press representatives.

On August 29, 1969, an anonymous letter was mailed to [REDACTED] and mailed from New Haven. This letter pointed out activity of the Black Panther Party on the Yale campus and the apparent condonement by the Yale authorities.

The New Haven Division remains alert for Federal, state and local violations committed by members of the Black Panther Party and is aggressively conducting such investigation to uncover criminal violations.

4. DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

The New Haven Division continues to note the rebuilding of the Black Panther Party within the State of Connecticut. The Black Panther Party, [REDACTED] has held numerous demonstrations and have been in frequent contact with the Students for a Democratic Society, the Communist Party and other left-wing organizations.

Recently, five New York Panthers, who were transferred to New Haven for an indefinite period, returned to New York and are reportedly going to be replaced by West Coast Panthers.

The New Haven Division expects a continued increase in Black Panther Party activity as the trial of the "Connecticut 14" approaches. This activity will undoubtedly include a large influx of out-of-state Panthers.

The Black Panther Party (BPP) in the Chicago, Illinois area in general encourages the technique of "comprehensive searches of their person without prior notice" at functions in which they participate, however, this is not done on all occasions.

Review of material furnished by Chicago area BPP sources tends to indicate that BPP members accompanying BPP speaker act as security guards for that speaker. If the speaking engagement is local, generally if search conducted, it is done by BPP members. If engagement is outside Chicago area, no search is conducted by BPP members as speaker is generally appearing for a fee.

Chicago of the opinion an anonymous letter to a campus, local newspaper or the BPP headquarters protesting "fascist and police state tactics" would have no effect on whether or not BPP members conducted a search at the function where a Panther was speaking. It is further noted that the use of white hippies as security for the appearance of a Black Panther leader would not matter to the BPP inasmuch as those members accompanying the Panther speaker act as speaker's security and would consider white hippie searchers as searching persons for their own protection and not BPP speaker protection.

Review of this material also indicates that where searches have been conducted by the person sponsoring BPP speaker, the accompanying BPP members have at times requested those individuals carrying cameras and evidently known to searchers, to place these cameras under their chairs, not to use them or chance being forcibly removed from the room.

90-DAY PROGRESS LETTER:

I. COUNTERINTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

Due to the inactivity of the Black Student Association (BSA) at Memphis State University (MSU), and the black militant organizations at Memphis known as the Black Knights and the Invaders, no counterintelligence operations are presently under consideration by the Memphis Office directed against these three organizations.

It should be noted that the Invader organization at the present time is practically non-existent. It presently consists of [REDACTED] and some five followers, exerts no influence in the community, and for its very existence has affiliated itself with Local 1733 of the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees (AFSCME) union, which has been conducting a strike at a private hospital at Memphis, Tennessee, in an effort to unionize employees at this hospital.

Informants have advised that BSA organization at MSU, which took part in and led the take-over of MSU President's Office in the spring semester of 1969, has no militant plans and is presently operating as a social group only.

Informants and interviews with members of the Black Knights indicate that this organization is non-violent at the present time and has taken part in no

militant activities during the past several months.

Other than the interview program directed against both leaders and rank-and-file members of the Black Knights and Invaders, no counterintelligence operations are under consideration directed against these organizations.

B. Furnishing of information to [REDACTED] a trusted newspaper source, where the furnishing of such information can be used to disrupt and discredit existing black militant organizations and leaders.

Sources have reported that since this program, Miami's NOI Mosque had to discontinue its "mission type" meetings held weekly in the Coconut Grove area of Miami because of a lack of attendance. Prior to the expose, these meetings averaged from 30 to 40 visitors; since the program they average only 8 to 10 visitors. Sources have also reported there has been a definite decrease in attendance at regular NOI meetings in Miami. This decrease includes both visitors and members. OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

At the time of submission of referenced letter and up until a few weeks ago, a situation was prevailing on a local level wherein [redacted] was becoming disenchanted with the BWA. [redacted] had allied himself with [redacted] a local extremist movement established [redacted] to take action against local government regarding the activities surrounding the July 23, 1968 confrontation between an extremist group and local police which resulted in what has been commonly known as the Glenville shoot out.

It is apparent the monetary return from sympathizers and backers of the July 23 Defence Committee did not materialize and this caused the zeal of [redacted] to cool.

It was felt the disenchantment with the July 23 movement by [redacted] after some funds had been raised could be exploited by a friendly newspaper source.

The lack of interest in this group by extremist elements and those on the fringes, even when many become aware that money already funnelled to this group had been misappropriated, blunted any effect this proposed counterintelligence activity might have had if implemented.

Re Chicago letter dated 11/17/69.

On November 22, 1969, FRED HAMPTON, Deputy Chairman, Illinois BPP and [REDACTED] called a general meeting at the South Side Office of the Chicago Branch, Illinois Chapter, BPP, telling everyone that if they were late for the 10:00 am starting time they would be purged from the Party. When everyone arrived the meeting began with an announcement by HAMPTON that everyone but himself and [REDACTED] were hereby purged from the BPP. They would all be known as "Friends of the BPP" until HAMPTON and [REDACTED] decided they had "earned" the right to be called a Panther.

Chicago recommends that the following letter be mailed from Chicago to [REDACTED] California, National Headquarters, BPP:

"Brother:

"Myself and other brothers are getting tired of the screwing Hampton [REDACTED] are giving the brothers and sisters here in Chicago and the brothers in Berkeley.

"Last week [REDACTED] and Hampton called us all in for a meeting and the M..... F..... told us we are purged from the Party. All the time they are bitching about you no good nigger. They say you only think of Chicago when you need bread. You don't give a damn about all our brothers in jail here who have gone down at these M..... F..... orders.

"We know the national [REDACTED] has need for more bread so we are fed up with Hampton [REDACTED] always bitching behind your back.

Henry brothers' rift causes split in RNA

A dispute over tactics and control of the Detroit-based Republic of New Africa (RNA) has split the black separatist group and left Richard and Milton R. Henry, the brothers who founded it, on opposite sides of the fence.

The conflict has been variously described as anything from a "power struggle" to a "misunderstanding."

It came to a head this week when Milton Henry, a Pontiac attorney and first vice-president of the RNA, suspended his brother, Richard, from positions as RNA minister of the interior and Midwest regional vice-president.

Richard, known in the RNA as Brother Imari, claimed that "subversive" members of the organization deliberately fed misinfor-

mation to Milton, creating a "misunderstanding" which led to the suspension.

OTHER SOURCES, however, indicated Milton Henry is trying to purge his brother from the organization because of personal and political differences.

These sources say Richard, as speaker of the RNA's legislative body, was trying to take control of the organization's military arm, the Black Legion.

Although admitting that his suggestions for recruitment and use of a 100,000-man "defensive force" were not accepted by Milton Henry and other RNA leaders, Richard Henry denied any intention of trying to usurp power from his brother.

"I love and support my brother," Richard said, "and I will continue to do so."

Richard added, however, that he felt his brother was being duped by a small minority of RNA members who have opposed him (Richard) since the "nation" was founded 21 months ago with the avowed aim of establishing a separate black nation in the southern United States.

"Milton is a victim of their subversion—not a part of it," he said.

Asked to explain his reasons for the suspension, Milton Henry told The Detroit News:

"I absolutely cannot comment on this. Much as I would like to answer these charges, I cannot discuss the internal affairs of the republic in public."

Richard said he did not know why he had been suspended from the RNA cabinet.

"BUT I HAVE BEEN pursuing certain policies that have upset some people in the republic, and this may be the reason," he said.

One of those policies, he said, involved the establishment of the 100,000-man force which would serve as a "deterrent" to prevent hostile acts against the RNA by the U.S. government or other segments of white society.

Richard expressed confidence that the "citizens" of the RNA would support him against those who engineered his suspension. He predicted that he would be vindicated before the next legislative convention, which he said would be held in the next two months.

He added, however, that he did not plan to press for the creation of the 100,000-man army.

"SPEED AND SECRECY

were essential for its success," he said, "and it cannot work now that the plan is out in the open."

Asked how the plan had gotten "out in the open," he said:

"I just told you about it."

Although Richard Henry denies it, other RNA sources claim the dispute over the size and deployment of the Black Legion is simply the last straw in a long-simmering feud between him and Milton.

Nothing better illustrates the apparent differences in the philosophies of the Henry brothers than their occupations outside the RNA.

Milton is an attorney. He hews to a legalistic approach for the establishment and operation of the RNA.

Richard has been employed for most of his career as a civilian employee of the armed forces, first for the Air Force and then the U.S. Army Tank - Automotive Command (ATAC) in Warren.

WHILE MILTON was in England using legal means to free RNA President Robert Williams from a London jail, Richard was confronting Edward I. R. MacGregor, the

British consul general in Detroit, and threatening military action if Williams was not freed.

Richard says he took the action only after the Detroit consulate of the RNA voted to do so. He admits that the local commander of the Black Legion was angered by his action. Significantly, he made no mention of any approval by his brother for the move.

Richard states flatly that the course of the RNA from its founding days to the present followed the blueprint he laid out in his pamphlet, "War in America, the Malcolm X Doctrine."

Military might plays a major role in the pamphlet.

IF RNA LEADERS decide to change direction and shelve the man responsible for the original plan, Richard said, it would be nothing new in the history of governments.

He admits the minister of defense, Mwcusi Chui, of Dayton, Ohio, as well as the commander of the Black Legion in Detroit, were "disturbed" by his threat of military action against the British.

Since then, the organizations' three regional vice-presidents have been removed from the chain of command over the RNA military, Richard Henry revealed.

Control of the Black Legion may have been one of the key items slated for discussion at a legislative conven-

tion scheduled for the next weekend in November in Pittsburgh.

RICHARD AS SPEAKER of the RNA's national council of representatives, was in New York earlier this month to work out details of the convention with other legislative leaders.

Milton, however, issued an executive order this week canceling the convention.

"All citizens must abide by this order for the preservation of the republic," he said in a letter mailed to all RNA members.

Richard countered by saying it was "constitutionally impossible" for a member of the RNA executive branch to cancel a meeting of the legislative branch. He said a legislative convention would be held.

THE PROPOSED convention could decide who will win control of the RNA.

Members have been given a choice: Obey Milton's order or follow Richard and attend the convention.

Their decision could determine whether the RNA will follow its present policies or become more militant and more militaristic.

Formed by the Henry brothers in Detroit almost two years ago. The RNA proclaims its members to be citizens of an independent nation.

THEY HAVE petitioned the U.S. government and the United Nations, demanding that the states of Georgia, Mississippi, Louisiana, Alabama and South Carolina be turned over to the RNA, along with \$400 billion in reparations.

Members of the republic refuse to discuss membership figures, but outside observers set the national "hard-core" membership at about 200, plus perhaps 10 times that many who have attended RNA meetings and express sympathy with its cause.

In addition to Detroit, with an estimated 50 hard-core members, chapters (called consulates in the RNA) are active in New York (with about 10 members), Brooklyn (15 members), Boston (10), Washington (12), Dayton (20), Cincinnati (eight), Chicago (eight), New Orleans (20) and Phoenix (15).

DESPITE ITS MILITANT posture, the RNA has had only one brush with violence in its 21 months of existence.

On Saturday night, March 29, one police officer was shot to death and a second wounded when they stopped to question a group of RNA "legionnaires" carrying rifles outside Detroit's New Bethel Baptist Church, 8450 Linwood, where the RNA was holding a national conference.

Police reinforcements entered the church and arrested everyone in the building. Two RNA members are now awaiting trial on charges growing out of the shooting of the two officers.

To date the activities of the Arlington BUF have consisted of a monetary request for reparation at Resurrection Lutheran Church in Arlington and the submission of a list of grievances to the principal of Washington-Lee High School and the Arlington School Board. At the Resurrection Lutheran Church approximately 50 individuals appeared claiming to be members of the Arlington BUF; however, it was noted that [REDACTED] and a number of other Washington, D. C., BUF members were present in the group. Local spokesmen for the Arlington BUF have been identified as [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] To date the Arlington BUF has not engaged in or indicated a propensity toward violence. It consists of a small group led by Rev. MOORE, is relatively inactive since MOORE spends most of his time in Washington, D. C., and consists mostly of teenagers.

An incident involving Alexandria Police Department [REDACTED] led to a series of demonstrations in Alexandria led by [REDACTED] then an official of the Alexandria Urban League, calling for [REDACTED] dismissal by the police department. Although no violence occurred at the demonstrations, a series of fire bombings occurred in the evening hours in Alexandria. Four Negro juveniles were arrested by the police department, none of which were identified as being connected with the Urban League, and the bombings ceased thereafter. However, the [REDACTED] for not clearing his activities with them and not acting in the best interests of the Negro community. [REDACTED] has since announced organization of a new group called the Black Association for Cultural Advancement (BACA). To date the group has proposed a demonstration calling for [REDACTED] job. There is no indication that it has a propensity toward violence. According to [REDACTED] new group suffers from a lack of funds and is likely to fold in the near future.

In view of the lack of activities of black nationalist hate groups in the Northern Virginia area, no counterintelligence operations have been effected or under consideration at the present time. However, Alexandria has pending cases on BUF and BACA as well as its leaders, and their future activities will be closely followed. In the event future activities of these groups fall into a category covered by the above case, appropriate counterintelligence operations will be proposed for Bureau approval.

A good example is how the traditional anti-Semitism of organizations like the American Nazi Party is parroted by organizations such as the Black Panther Party (BPP) and the Nation of Islam (NOI), two black extremist organizations. It is curious that publications such as the "Fiery Cross," a Klan newspaper, and "The Thunderbolt," official newspaper of the National States Rights Party, a Nazi-type organization, call for the destruction of the State of Israel in the same demagogic manner as articles appearing in "The Black Panther" and "Muhammad Speaks," official organs of the BPP and the NOI respectively.

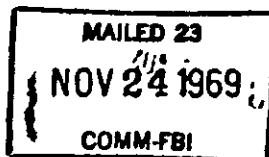

San Diego has suggested an anonymous letter to [redacted] in Los Angeles complaining of these tactics. San Diego has advised that [redacted] is the individual to whom the majority of the grievances of the San Diego branch are normally taken. The letter proposed should be an effective disruptive technique.

In ReSFairtel of 11/7/69, San Francisco Office requested permission to advise the San Francisco Police Department (SFPD) Intelligence Unit of BPP proposed request for authority to use a building owned by the City of San Francisco on a rent-free basis for their Breakfast Program. It is believed that such a contact with the SFPD could forestall the use of the building by the BPP since their request for the rent-free use of it is based upon their claim that their Breakfast Program is a non-profit activity operated for charitable purposes.

San Francisco has also previously suggested investigation by the Los Angeles Office to determine if [REDACTED] is responsible for smuggling tape recordings prepared by HUEY P. NEWTON out of the California Mens Colony where NEWTON is imprisoned. Results of these inquiries have not been provided the San Francisco Office to date.

COUNTERINTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS IN EFFECT AGAINST THE LOS ANGELES BLACK PANTHER PARTY (LABPP)

The Counterintelligence Operation proposed in Los Angeles letter to the Bureau dated 10/20/69, is being held in abeyance pending Bureau approval.

Exhaustive interviews of suspected members of the LABPP continue and are serving to create distrust among activists and the defection of peripheral members.

COUNTERINTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

A survey of toll calls of selected LABPP leaders continues, with the result of these reviews being considered for counterintelligence proposals.

The Los Angeles Division continues to follow arrests of members of the LABPP for violations of Anti-Riot and Gun Control laws, to determine if any of these individuals might be prosecuted under Federal or State laws. Liaison with logical sporting goods stores and firearms outlets continues in an effort to identify members of the LABPP purchasing firearms.
