Re: BAlet, 8/20/70 and Buairtel, 9/9/70, captioned, "Counterintelligence Program, Black Nationalist Hate Groups, Racial Intelligence - BPP; Counterintelligence Program New Left, Security Natter".

In accordance with instructions entained in referenced Buairtel, copies of the article prepared in pamphlet format concerning the fear of Jews to anti-Zionism of New Left and BPP, which appeared in the 8/14/70 issue of "The New York Times" and which was enclosed with referenced Buairtel, was anonymously mailed out by the Baltimore Office to 21 selected Jewish Synagogues and schools. This matter will be followed and the Bureau will be advised of any positive results obtained from this mailing.

In view of the low level of activities on the part of New Left groups during the summer months, no other opportunities were noted during the past months wherein it was felt counterintelligence could be used effectively against New Left groups.

Baltimore will continue to follow closely New Left activities in the Baltimore Division and any opportunities to utilize counterintelligence activity against the New Left coming to the attention of the Baltimore Office will be immediately submitted to Bureau with appropriate requests.

Baltimore has been following closely the current split which now exists between the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) and the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and also the SDS and the Black Panther Party (BPP) with the view in mind of taking advantage of any opportunities to widen these differences.

problem of the Bureau is aware through information furnished by Problem of the Bultimore Problem of the Bultimore Office of the FBI, the Bultimore City PD has been able to obtain signed statements from several leading BPP members concerning their participation in the torture and murder of EUGENE LEROY ANDERSON,

BPP headquarters in BPP headquarters in Bultimore and at present is preparing this case for prosecution. This case will involve as defendants several leaders and former leaders of the Bultimore BPP as well as at least one BPP leader at the National level, and is certain to have an adverse effect on all activities of the BPP as it will show to the nation what kind of animals are running the BPP.

In view of the above, Baltimore is not recommending any additional counter-intelligence measures at this time.

Consistent with their security, you should continue to use your sources in an effort to widen the split existing between the Black Panther Party (BPP) and the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS).

Referenced airtel suggested further that established sources within news media could be used to interview leaders of SDS and BPP in the Baltimore area regarding the dispute between their organizations. Prior to authorizing this, it is desired that you identify the established source that you propose to use for this purpose. At that time you should also advise as to their reliability and as to whether they have been previously used by your office.

By referenced communication, Baltimore suggested that established sources in the news media in the Baltimore area be used to interview leaders of SDS and BPP in order to bring out their views on the split which now apparently exists between the SDS and the BPP. In recent weeks these organizations have been in dispute concerning community control of police. We are attempting to further this split.

It could be suggested to these established sources of the news media that interview of leaders of SDS and BPP in the Baltimore area could be made regarding their views on this subject asking their opinion of the line followed by the opposition. Questions could also be asked of the SDS leaders regarding their views of the remarks made by BPP Chairman BOBBY SEALE and BPP Chief of Staff DAVID HILLIARD, that the SDS is a facist organization as set forth in the "Guardian" dated 8/16/69.

The Baltimore Office feels that the use of anonymous letters to various members and leaders of each group in the Baltimore area would not serve any purpose at this time since a gap has already been established between the two groups and since the BPP leadership is in a state of confusion at this time.

Baltimore will continue to exploit the original suggestion approved by the Bureau. The additional suggestion set forth will not be undertaken until Bureau approval is given.

Relative to captioned program, Bureau authority is requested to take the following action:

Obtain a suitable number of blank five cent post cards from the U.S. Post Office and affix to these the appropriate names and residential addresses of a selected number of SDS members of the Baltimore Division. Upon the message side of these post cards the following message would be written:

> "The national officers of the SDS wish to congratulate you and your SDS chapter at (appropriate college or university) for your successful participation in anti-establishment and anti-military industrial complex activities of the SDS during the 1968-1969 school year.

"As an active SDS supporter, keep up the good work during the coming semester.

"Signed, Comradely, Your National SDS Director."

These post cards would then be mailed as enclosures to a letter to Chicago for subsequent posting by the Chicago Office to reflect a Chicago postmark.

The Baltimore Office, through established sources, has obtained student directories reflecting the home residence addresses for numerous students including known SDS members. As the SDS is generally composed of many postjuvenile immature students who are still tied to the financial

apron strings of their parents, it is believed that mailing such a post card to their parental residences could well have an adverse effect upon their future nefarious activities.

Your sources must be most circumspect in following this course in order to prevent charges of obstructionism being brought against them. Any such activity should also be instituted on an individual basis with each informant with his security being a paramount consideration in each instance.

By relet BA pointed out that it might possibly be effective to instruct its sources in the BPP, to start a program designed to undercut SDS by suggesting/BPP members that SDS was a core of elite white chauvinistic students which was exploiting the militant strength of the BPP. In this way, a wedge could be driven between BPP and the SDS. Consistent with the security of the informants such a program could be effective in alienating SDS and the BPP.

COUNTER INTELLIGENCE PROGRAM - BLACK NATIONALIST HATE GROUPS RACIAL INTELLIGENCE



Investigation within the Baltimore Division has indicated that members of the SDS and members of the Black Panther Party (BPP) have been making efforts to cooperate with each other, presenting the problem of a possible coalition between these two extremist groups.

As a counter intelligence move aimed directly at both of these groups the following move is suggested and Bureau authority is requested to implement this action:

BPP sources of the Baltimore Office should be directed to suggest or imply to BPP members that the SDS consists of a corps of elite white chauvinistic students of upper middle class who would like to exploit the militant potential and strength of the BPP and other extremist groups; that is, they should suggest to the Panthers that the SDS will talk of violent actions and may provide lip service, funds, and materials (such as weapons) but the SDS is basically a cowardly, honky group, which is striving to get the BPP to do the dirty work thus exposing Panthers to needless danger.

It is believed that if the above program is instituted that a wedge can be successfully driven between the SDS and the BPP and will put an end to their recently commenced honeymoon.

By relet Baltimore furnished a copy of an article appearing in "Newark Weekly," a Newark, Delaware, newspaper, captioned "Creatures of the Dark," This article draws the close parallel between the New Left and Adolf Hitler's "New Order" by pointing out the unsympathetic attitudes of both, as well as their lack of tolerance for opposition. suggested that copies of this article be furnished anonymously to the administrators at the University of Maryland, Johns Hopkins University, Towson State College, as well as to administrators at the Talmudical Academy, a Jewish theological school in Baltimore, and to the Baltimore Chapter of B'nai B'rith, in the hope that it will influence their attitudes toward the New Left. Baltimore also suggested this parallelism be used in discussions with informants, sources, and police contacts.

The New Left in the Baltimore Division consists of SDS chapters at Johns Hopkins University (JHU), Baltimore, Maryland; Towson State College (TSC), Towson, Maryland; the University of Maryland (U/M), College Park, Maryland; the University of Delaware (U/D), Newark, Delaware and the Baltimore Defense Committee (BDC), 2525 Maryland Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland.

Informants and PSIs of the Baltimore Division have been advised to take no action which might tend to assuage any developing strife or internal disorders within the SDS or BDC.

The Baltimore Office also has continued to review editorials and letters to the editor to obtain articles which might prove to be useful in this program. In this regard the "Newark Weekly," Newark, Delaware, in its city edition of 9/18/68, Page 4A, carried an article captioned "Creatures of the Dark." (A copy of the article follows at the end of this letter).

The above mentioned article compares the catchy phrase "New Left" to the catchy phrase "New Order" used by ADOLPH HITLER and draws a parallel between the two.

As the above article was circulated only in Delaware, Bureau authority is requested to furnish copies of the article anonymously to various school administrators at the U/M, JHU and TSC. The anonymous distribution should indicate that the article originally appeared in the "Newark Weekly." It is also suggested that the article be

It is further suggested that this parallelism between "New Order" and "New Left" in terminology should be pointed out in contacts with informants, sources and police security units in an effort to show "New Left" and "New Order" as closely linked.

# Creatures Of The Dark

The "New Left" is changing.

Gone are the days of "peaceful" pickets, clever signboards, and other symbols of youthful dissatisfaction with the "establishment." Even the protest songs have become passe, and about the only one that has survived the Summer is "We Shall Overcome." But even "We Shall Overcome" has changed.

Now it is sung in a different spirit, in a new context, like a chorus or two of a battle hymn, or in somewhat the same way as the mobs of Hitler sang the "Horst Wessei Song," in the light of roasting books and accompanied by the anguished cries of Jewish doctors, scholars, bankers, merchants, and scientists being led away to extinction.

The Jews of Germany represented a large part of the "establishment" of another era, an "establishment" not unlike our own. It was made up of people who were successful, who worked, who invented, who paid the taxes, who created the wealth of a nation through the use of the reasoning mind and through the development of knowledge, knowledge that is the very foundation of civilized society, the one pre-requisite for decency everywhere.

So, the gutter-rats of Germany assaulted knowledge. They burned the books and libraries that stored the knowledge. They extinguished the brains that developed the knowledge, and they destroyed the schools that taught and sustained, and carried, the knowledge over from one generation to the next.

Thus together they perished, knowledge, and the "establishment."

And with their passing there emerged "The New Order," and a time of darkness. For with knowledge crased, the light that shines to show man the way ahead flickered and died. The light that protects went out, and a nation was seized by the creatures of the night.

Then came the dawn of a new day, a war to set back the dark, and a great turning-on of the lights.

But, the creatures of the night are still with us.

They lurk in the twilight, an area of gray between the darkness and the course of With public learning they seek to aquelch the source of the beginning high that dankers and billiabs them, and wear is them independent And with unimal rage, they had out at the ii, he should not show their teeth.

And so it is that foday we have the "New Left," which like the "New Order," seeks to put out the light.

BOTH CANDIDATES HAVE COMMENTED ON THE DRAFT, HUMPHREY HAS SAID HE IS IN FAVOR OF A LOTTERY. WHILE NIXON CLAIMS HE WANTS AN ALL VOLUMTEER ARMY IN PEACETIME AND SAYS IT HON'T COST MORE THAN \$3 BILLION A YEAR.

Conscription is justified by the government and the candidates under the assumption that every male must be ready to fight and die for the country that protects him. Supposedly, a completely volunteer army also costs too much. Enlistment propaganda appeals to love of country, a sense of adventure and offers enlistees a choice which induction destroys. We don't want to disparage patriotism and adventure, but we feel this invocation of rights and obligations and costs disguises what the draft does to people, how it operates and whose interests it serves. These are subjects which the candidates generally ignore and which still shape the lives of young Americans.

Since the draft is very closely tied to the war and our foreign policy, let us make our position clear. SDS believes that America's vast military power is not for her security. (Does it make you feel any more secure to know the US could destroy the whole world in a half an hour?) It is used to chain financial and political domination over underdeveloped countries and to carry out a reactionary program, contrary to the welfare of our own spoor and the poor in those countries we control, such as Latin America.

THE SELECTIVE SERVICE SYSTEM IS A MEANS AND SOURCE OF PERSONAL AND ECONOMIC COERCION. IT FORCES EVERY YOUNG MAN, WHO IS MORALLY, MENTALLY, AND PHYSICALLY QUALIFIED TO SERVE HIS COUNTRY: AS A SOLDIER FOR TWO YEARS, OR IN SOME OCCUPATION WHICH CONTRIBUTES TO THE 'NATIONAL HEALTH, SAFETY OR INTEREST' FOR AS LONG AS HE IS DRAFT ELIGIBLE.

As Concral Hershey himself put it in his Channeling Memorander, "The psychology of granting wide choice under pressure to take action is the American or indirect way of achieving what is done by direction in foreign countries where choice is not permitted." If you are too poor to go to college, or if you can't take the crap once you're in it, then channeling means you must serve your country as an enlisted man, if qualified. College graduates have a wider choice: they can become officiers or else get the right kind of job. According to the National Security Council, undergraduate deferments produce a substantial number of military officers.

One nice feature about the draft is that it shifts a good portion of the cost of the war onto the shoulders of those who are fighting it. The difference between what soldiers get paid and what their sevices would bring in civilian life is about \$11 billion dollars. And what price should you put on loosing your freedom for two years or more?

General Hershey has also provided for malcontents, discontents, disruptors and realous draft counsellers; if they are under 35, according to Local Board Nem. # 83, they are declared delinquent, classified 1-A and expeditously inducted into the Armed Services. General Hershey, and his bassed, seem to feel serving your country can be a punishment as well as an honor.

foreign justion, it still is repressive and undemocrate c, and must be abolished.

THE SELECTIVE SERVICE SYSTEM IS RUN UNDER A VERY COMPLICATED SET OF RULES WHICH FORBID THE REGISTRANT FROM HAVING LEGAL COUNSEL. STANDARDS VARY TREMENDOUSLY FROM LOCAL BOARD TO LOCAL BOARD AND AMONG THE STATES. IF SOME BUREAUCRAT FOULS UP, YOU HAVE TO RISK A FELONY RAP, BY REFUSING INDUCTION, TO GET YOUR CASE INTO COURT.

And don't ever expect that the advice you get from your local board about available options is accurate or pertinent. They are often unaware or ignorant of the regs and the law and careless in saying what they do know. Of course, if every one took advantage of all the rights he has under the present system, or it was forced to operate under judicial review, it would break down almost immediately and be unable to meet its manpower quotas and the war effort would suffer.

THERE ARE OTHERS --- OILMEN, WHO MAKE 2/3 OF THEIR PROFITS OVERSEAS AND NEED THE FAVORABLE MARKETING SITUATION THAT A PREPONDERANCE OF MILITARY POMER CREATLS AND BANKERS, WHO LIKE A FAVORABLE INVESTMENT CLIMATE.

The draft doesn't benefit the people who are forced to die in a cruel, victous war, or their relatives and friends; the women who have to weit for their men; the exipples; the scientists and engineers who are forced to study the most efficient way to kill the enemy and protect our friends and our "boys", no matter what their beliefs are, under the duress of chanceling. The draft doesn't benefit the poor and the blacks in the ghettoes, who suffer from lacks that the resources we waste on our military effort could supply.





The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and to "redically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. Gus Hall, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1955, described the SDS as a part of the "Responsible left" which the Party has "going" for us. " At the dune, 1965, SDS Hatlonal Convention, an · anti-communist provise was removed from the SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1956, issue of "New Laft Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The anational headquarters of this organization as of April 13, 1957, was located in Room 205, 1508 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

Across the country first SDS meetings have seen 2,3 and 4 times as many people as ever attended before. Many have been brought to a large extent seeing the farce of the '60 elections. All want to learn, and act. They must be brought into the on-going SDS projects. But that isn't enough.

To all of these people, as well as millions mistakenly choosing one of the imperialists to vote for (we can't write these people off), we must offer a clear, votal political vehicle. Between now and the elections we should carry out an intensive agit campage on-compus and reaching out to workers. This needs a national focal point. A massive, militart national demonstration of opposition to the hear of the elections, to imperialist wars, to raciom. A clear loud NOI to be heard throughout the country and around the world. In the history of the U.S. there has not been such a vocal strack upon the farce of the presidential elections.

We propose that SDS organize a national march on the White House, Election Day, November 5.

### BUILD SES

The first SDS march on Washington had a tremendous effect of building SDS and advancing the student movement. This was done especially through the intense work done on campus before and after the march. New chapters were formed. Old chapters grow. Thousands joined SDS.

Organizing for this march should have the same effect... except more intensive. The objective situation is sharper, the demonstration should be also. This march would offer every chapter a real opportunity to organize 500...1, 000...2, 600 students. It would be a real boost. It would activate, in the organizing for and actual going to the White House, the many new people at that first meeting. Instead of dropping out or joining a phony McCarthyite "new" party these people should be brought into SDS and radical activity.

It is important that the march be led by SDS. At the time of the first march a liberal coalition wanted to take control of it. This move was narrowly defeated within SDS. Such a coalition would have meant areal defeat for the radical movement.

( It is important that this march not be in coalition with the Mobilization, which has

watered down the politics and/or led people into police traps every time they have led an action: from N. Y. is Stop the Druft Week to Chicago (where the people fought yaliantly inspite of the Mobilization mis-leadership).

### WORKER-STUDENT ALLIANCE

During the weeks proceeding the morch, SDS, SLAP committees, should carry out intensive leafletting and talking with workers at factory grees, subway entrances, etc. GI's can be reached near and on bases, at transportation points, etc. We should explain our analysis of the elections, imperialism, racism, how they serow both students and workers, and why we're going to the White House. We should follow up these contacts after the elections.

### WEST COAST

On the Coast demonstrations should be held to coincide and tie-up with the White House Action.

### NOTOMINICAW AL

We should begin with a rally, putting forth the three themes, leading to a march on the White House and a demonstration in front of it. If violence occurs, it will be initiated by the government. Chicago has taught us that that is likely. A lot of tactical considerations must be discussed at length. We don't want any traps. We can expect a lot of force to meet us, very possibly the Guard and Federal croops. SDS should organize to keep tratical control of the situation. We don't want crazies, provocateurs, "terrorists", or plainclothes cops to lead the demonstration. These are problems that now some up at any large demonstration. The N.C. and the SDS March Organizing Committee will have to discuss these at longth. Its ns will have to relate also to changing events. We can't go into all of these in this proposal.

The basis of the prosent is: a national Worch, the lite Boase (not the Penhagar) which is the center of the dial class government, as to eger; the three political themes; and the organic closes before and after the center to reach students and workers.

### IMPLEMENTATION:

- 1. A mailteant call be put on by \$198 immediated.

The New Left in the Baltimore Division consists of chapters of the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) at Johns Hopkins University (JHU), Baltimore, Maryland, Towson State College (TSC), Towson, Maryland, University of Maryland (U/M) College Park, Maryland, and University of Delaware (U/D) Newark, Delaware.

Activity by the various SDS chapters during the summer of 1968 was extremely limited because of the summer vacations.

During the brief lull in SDS activity the Baltimore Office further cultivated existing informants and PSIs with a view to initial and complete coverage of SDS chapter activity with the opening of schools in the Fall. In this regard also all informants and PSIs have been advised to be alert for possible weak spots or "sore spots" within the variousSDS chapters with the purpose in mind of further magnification of these spots in order to shatter SDS unity.

Subsequent contact with has reflected that he had not yet reached a decision regarding the status of the SDS. He indicated that he would advise when his decision was reached.

In accordance with instructions set out in referenced Bureau letter of 7/29/68, copies of the reproduction of an article captioned "Campus or Battleground? Columbia Warning to all American Universities," have been furnished to educators and administrators within this division who are established sources. In order to ascertain complete security, these copies were all mailed anonymously. date no positive results have been developed from the mailing of these articles but it is believed that the article was well received. It is further requested that since the Baltimore Office has additional valuable established sources, in various institutions of higher learning that if available. another 15 copies of the above mentioned article which appeared in "Barron's" should be furnished to Baltimore for a similar dissemination. It is believed that the mailing of these copies would be particularly effective at this time with the recent openings of institutions of higher learning. It is also anticipated that positive results will be obtained from the judicious dissemination of the article and the Bureau will be appropriately advised.

The matter of the importance of the Counter Intelligence Program relative to the New Left has been brought to the attention of the appropriate personnel within this division and is being stressed as one of the more vital current programs. As new ideas and suggestions are received, the Bureau will be advised. No direct counter intellige.ce move will be made by the Baltimore Office without first obtaining prior Bureau permission.

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

The Baltimore Office in the Delaware area is continuing to exert extensive efforts for the expansion and improvement of existing sources, as well as to utilize existing sources to the maximum and to develop new sources. Specific attention is being paid to the possible development of recently discharged military intelligence personnel residing in the Newark, Delaware area.

Violence on the campus of the University of Delaware during the forthcoming year is certainly possible due to the radical attitudes and opinions expressed and actions urged by some SDS members; however, an issue that will garner sufficient support from the rank and file members of the student body must be first found and developed. Membership of SDS is not large enough, nor is the membership apparently foolhardy enough to engage in violent disruptive activity without substantial student During the 1967-68 school year, the SDS failed to increase their numbers and failed on several occasions to gain substantial student support to oppose the University administration. There is no reason, at this time, to believe that they will meet with any more success during the 1968-69 school year.





The New Left in the Baltimore Division is synonymous with the SDS as no other New Left groups exist within this division. The Baltimore Office is currently pressing a vigorous program toward the development of new sources and informants within the SDS and at the same time is working for improvement in the coverage afforded by present informants.

A survey of the present security informant program in the Baltimore Division has been made and it has been determined that the following informants and PSI's, who have previously, and are currently furnishing, information primarily concerning the Communist Party, can also be directed or re-directed into the area of the New Left:



The Baltimore Office has also engaged in a program through liaison with local military intelligence

to determine the identities of military intelligence personnel who are being given honorable discharges in the immediate future and who intend to further their education in institutions of higher learning. This is being done with a view to future contact of these individuals for informant development purposes.

With regard to an evaluation as to the potential for violence on the campuses in this territory, for the forthcoming school year, there has been no indication that plans for such violence have been, or are being made at this time. However, bearing in mind the revolutionary tendencies of numerous SDS leaders, the potential for violence exists where any SDS chapters are allowed to exist.







of Delaware, the Governor of Delaware and the Delaware Legislature and all duly constituted authorities and most facets of society have also come under attack.

On October 12, 1967, a score of students disrupted an ROTC drill at the University by marching on to the drill field shouting "Sieg Heil." This demonstration was also alleged to be in opposition to compulsory ROTC at the University of Delsware. Six of the students identified were subsequently suspended from the University. SDS proceeded to take up the cause of the suspended students and to oppose compulsory ROTC. A campaign was instituted by SDS to get a large number of students to make voluntary confessions that they, too, had participated in the disruption. When 35 students "confessed" 28 were suspended and seven were put on probation by the University. The SDS was instrumental in planning and holding a rally protesting University action. The rally was held on the University campus on November 22, 1967, and had as many as 400 students participating. It was noisy, but peaceful.

All but several of the suspended students were eventually readmitted to the University and a decision was reached by the University authorities to discontinue compulsory ROTC later in the 1967-68 school year.

Several faculty members participated in this activity and later received warnings from the University administration to disassociate themselves from this type of student activity.

Speakers of national prominence in the "New Left" have been sponscred at the University by the SDS. They have spoken against the draft and the Vietnam War.

The SDS organized and participated with a group of approximately 50 students from the University in the October 21, 1967, Pentagon March in Washington, D. C. They have also participated in several anti-war and draft demonstrations in Wilmington, Delaware during 1967-1968.

Members of the SDS joined the "Black Power" advocates on Harch 28, 1968, at a demonstration in Legislative Hall, Dover, Delaware, to agitate for more equitable welfare conditions. Numerous copies of the "Heterodoxical Voice" were distributed.

The number of the students who have participated in SDS demonstrations has varied from 10 to 75 persons.

The SDS organized and participated in a day-long student strike and rally on April 26, 1968, at the University, which was to culminate a week of concentrated anti-war and draft activities. The largest number of students in attendance at any one time was approximately 200. Most of those present were students carrying books, who apparently stopped to observe between classes.

At the rally, SDS members spoke out against the Vietnam War, the draft and the University administration. They tried to gain student support for four SDS members who had been arrested on April 22, 1968, for distributing obscene literature advertising an SDS teach-in. They had no apparent success.

Many present at the rally were openly hostile to the SDS. The activities of the University were not noticeably disrupted. Several University faculty members were in attendance. Two SDS members were later arrested

for using obscene, vulgar, lewd, and obtrusive language over an open microphone at the rally.

Members of the SDS, joined by other white and Negro students, refused to leave one small portion of the Student Center when the building closed at 11:00 p.m. on May 16, 1968, and were left in the building overnight under supervision of campus police. They presented a list of demands to the University officials that demanded more black professors, black trustees, black students and courses on Negro history. They also demanded that the Delaware National Guard by withdrawn from Wilmington, Delaware, and that the demands of the students at Delaware State College at Dover, Delaware be met and that the Student Government President at Delaware State be rein-The students participating in the sit-in voluntarily left the Student Center by 8:15 a.m. on May 17, 1968, after the building was routinely opened for the day. rifty students participated. The University has taken no known action on the list of demands presented.

The SDS at the University of Delaware is composed exclusively of students or ex-students. The number of faculty who openly support SDS represent a very small proportion of the faculty of the University of Delaware.



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

The November 19, 1967, edition of "The Sun" a local Baltimore newspaper, reflects on page 22 that an SDS leader at JHU stated that the recent demonstrations in Washington, D.C. had been a turning point in SDS activity and the SDE was moving from non-violence to active resistance.

On November 29, 1967, a member of the JHU Chapter of the SDS stated that the SDS would attempt to prevent a Dow Chemical Company recruiter from entering the interview building at JHU.

The January - February issue of "The Baltimore Peace and Freedom News" on page 7 reflects that the SDS had been active for the October, 1967 anti-war demonstration in Mashington, D.C. and that a recent SDS activity at JNU was a protest against the Dow Chemical Company (makers of napalm) on December 4, 1967.

"The Peace and Freedom News" is published by the Peace Action Center, 2525 Maryland Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland. The Peace Action Center is a control for various groups agitating for peace and against the draft.



He had formerly been, but is no longer an officer of the SDS at JNU. The SDS at JNU as far as he knew is defunct. The demise of the SD3 Chapter at JHU came through a lack of support for all SDS activities and because many of the SDS members had described in order to go over to the MC CARTAY campaign. The last successful venture of the SDS in his opinion at J.H. was a protect against the Dow Chemical Company Manufacturers of nagalm, which cocurred during the winter of 1968. The SDO group with which he had been affiliated was a group of politically non-monelithic individuals who for the most part word more liberal than liberals. ### YOUNG SCCIALIST ALLIANCE

(YS), page 1, column 3, disclosed that during April 15-17, 1950, a mitional organization entitled "The Young Socialist Allience" (YSA) was established at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.

The above issue, page 6, set forth the Founding Declaration of the YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workers Party (SUP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles, and that the supportors of the YS have come into basic political solidarity with the SUP on the principles of revolutionary socialism.

On Moreh 10, 1957, a source advised that the YSA was formed during 1957, by youth of verious left socialist tendencies, particularly newbers and followers of the SWP. The source further advised that the YSA has recently become nore open about admitting that it is the youth group of the SWP and that an SWP representative has publicly stated that the YSA is the SWP's youth group.

The headquarters of the YSA are located in Rooms 532-535, 41 Union Square West, New York City.

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



In addition to the analysis set out in referenced Baltimore letter, the following is noted in accordance with referenced Bureau letter:

## False Allegations of Police Brutality

There have been no direct charges or allegations of police brutality within the Baltimore Division by factions of the New Left; but the following is noted:

"The Heterodoxical Voice", a Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) publication at the University of Delaware, in its June issue on page one under a caption "The Great Obscenity. Bust" reflects, among other things, insinuations that police were overzealous in the handling of SDS agitators. A Xerox copy of the mentioned article is attached to this letter.

In addition, the Interfaith Peace Mission (IPM) of Baltimore, a so-called pacifist group which is composed of numerous young persons, has demonstrated in conjunction with the SDS, and SDS members and advisors often attend IPM meetings. As of December 7, 1967, a member of the IPM who was formerly associated with the W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America (DCA) and who was also formerly associated with the SDS, acted in a belligerent manner toward uniformed police officers during demonstrations in the Baltimore area according to the Baltimore Police Department.

Previously who had found it "convenient" to live with the wind who bore him two children and this was also reportedly without benefit of marriage. After the children were born, he applied a principle of the New Left in that he promptly left them to further champion the cause of the New Left.

The above type of moral decadence appears to permeate many areas and persons of the New Left.

The 1968, edition of the "Evening Journal" a Wilmington, Delaware, newspaper, on Page 3 under a caption Three face smut counts in case at U of D, reflected the following information:

Three men had been arrested at the U of D by Newark Police the preceding day on charges of distributing obscene literature. The arrested individuals were

These individuals had been arrested in connection with the distribution of a leaflet advertising a teach-in the previous night at the Rodney Room of the Student Center. The teach-in was a part of a ten-day anti-Vietnam War program organized by the SDS.

"The Review", a U of D newspaper in its 1968, edition on Page 1, reflected that the SDS had held an anti-Vietnam War rally the preceding Friday and that both U of D students, had been arrested by the Newark, Delaware, Police, charged with using vulgar, obscene, abusive language over open microphones at the rally.

## 3. Action by College Administrators

A review of files of this Division indicates that school administrators, with few exceptions, have not generally taken a strong stand against the disruptive and anarchist elements of the New Left.

It is also noted, however, to date elements of the New Left have failed to take the strong actions which would result in arrests on a massive scale in connection with most demonstrations or activities.

A strong stand was, however, taken by school administrators at Delaware State College, Dover, Delaware on May 16, 1968. At that time dissident elements of the SDS and certain racial groups saw fit to seize state owned buildings and facilities at that instituation of higher learning. This illegal action was immediately met with forceful and clear-cut decision by the school administrators and Governor of the State of Delaware to close this school and send in necessary State Police and National Guardsmen to restore a state of law and order as is legally called for. This uprising was quelled with dispatch and further incidents have not occurred.

The New Leftists at Delaware State College were agitating for the following:

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1. Immediate reinstatement of LEROY TATE, a leader among protesting students.

- 2. Amnesty for participation in TATE's interruption of a previous dedication ceremony.
- 3. Student representation on the Board of Trustees with a number equalling the present Trustees.
- 4. Immediate resignation of college president.
- 5. Student examination and evaluation of college teachers.

These demands were met by a refusal by the Board of Trustees. The number of demonstrating students at Delaware State was undetermined. Their activities were not successful, and the damage they did was considered minor.

During February, 1968, a group called Dissent at Morgan State College appeared to be threatening open discretes, protesting recruitment by Dow Chemical Company officials at Morgan State College. It was announced that a demonstration would be held. Prior to the demonstration and in anticipation of possible trouble, the president of Morgan State College clearly and courageously announced to faculty and students alike that disorders or improper behavior by students or faculty would result in his immediately closing Morgan State College and dismissing both faculty members and students summarily. The resultant demonstration was quiet, orderly and legal in all respects.

Each SDS chapter within the Baltimore Division is known to be advised by certain faculty members; but general intelligence has indicated that the various faculties are not composed primarily of individuals fostering the New Left. The great number of faculty members appear to be in opposition to "leftist" groups.

At the University of Delaware, it has been noted that approximately [five] faculty members have been involved in SDS activities.

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In considering the large number of faculty members at the University of Maryland, University of Delaware, and Johns Hopkins University, it is noted that those individuals connected with the faculty who are also associated with the New Left are an extremely small minority group. However, this small group appears dedicated, vocal and extremist in nature.

The university does, strangely enough, protect itself from the law -- the same law it uses to quash dissent. The library and the bookstore carry books with livid descriptions of every sexual perversion known to man, and in the language of the layman, including the infamous title of the SDS leaflet in a book

It is obvious here that "university" does not refer to the students, but to the administration, just as U.S. government means -- drew your own conclusions -- just what everybody knows it means.

There is enclosed a blind memorandum concerning Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) which you may furnish

University of Delaware.) This memorandum was compiled from public source information and sets out the background and militant activities of SDS. The Bureau is not to be named as the source of this memorandum. It is not felt that the Bureau should advise Mr. whether or not the University of Delaware should wrendraw recognition from . SDS. This is a matter which should be decided, by University authorities. However, the enclosed blind memorandum will give him background on which to base a decision,

Relet also suggests that in those instances where New Left activists from an area covered by another field office move to the area covered by your office that public source information concerning such individuals be furnished by the office which has been covering their activities. should be done in any case in order to round out the investigation of these individuals. In all instances where this situation exists, you should request such information from the office previously handling the investigation.

In regard to your other suggestions that anonymous letters be written to newspapers and that informants attempt to create splits in New Left groups, you should submit concrete suggestions. Proposed letters should be submitted for Bureau approval. In no instance is counterintelligence action to be taken without Bureau approval.

#### NOTE:

Bulet 5/10/68 requested that all offices furnish suggestions for counterintelligence action against the New Left. BA has pointed out that an established/Borrey of concerned about the SDS Chapter at the University of Delaware and that University officials are considering whether the University should withdraw official recognition of it. BA recommends that a representative of that office contact and present a strong case for the withdrawal of University recognition. It is not felt that the Bureau should be placed in this situation. However, the enclosed blind memorandum will give background information on the militant and subversive activities of SDS and should enable him to make a decision.

BA's other suggestions were merely ideas which it is being instructed to put in more concrete terms and submit to the Bureau.

BA pointed out in its letter that in those instances where a New Left activist moves to BA from another area, public source information should be obtained from the area in which the activist formerly lived for use in counterintelligence action. Obviously, this should be dome in any instance where a person under investigation moves to a new area.

In accordance with instructions of Bureau letter, an active control file has been opened on captioned matter and this case has been assigned accordingly.

Groups involved in the New Left are being followed by this office on a continuous basis and strong emphasis is now placed on taking the opportunity to impose effective counterintelligence measures against the New Left.

This matter has been taken up through conference with appropriate headquarters and resident agency personnel and all have been made fully aware of the vital necessity to disrupt the New Left.

University of Delaware (UD), Newark, Delaware, advised that the trustees and administrative officials of the University are extremely concerned about activities of the New Left represented primarily at the UD by the local chapter of the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS). He explained that while the SDS chapter of the University is very small in number in relation to the student body, it has been a source of agitation and disruption which detracts from the prime educational functions of the University.

The officials of the University are now considering the best means of dealing with this organization. They are trying to decide if it would be better to take away University recognition, thus depriving the SDS of legitimacy and thereby

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forcing them off campus or to allow them to continue as a recognized group. As a recognized campus organization they have certain privileges such as the use of University facilities which are used by the SDS to definite advantage.

of SDS and believes they represent a threat to the security of the United States. He solicited advice on a strictly confidential basis as to which of the above two policies would be the best course to follow in dealing with the SDS and causing its demise at the UD.

realizes that any decision regarding SDS recognition on the UD campus will have to be made by appropriate UD authorities who in the end will bear the responsibility.

At the University of Maryland, SDS chapter investigation has reflected that SDS members are strong personal dislikes for one another and are jearous of each other. This situation represents a weak link in the SDS chapter at the University of Maryland chapter and is a potential spot in which a divisive wedge can be driven. The university of Maryland student newspaper regarding her SDS leadership role and is known to have taken exception to this. It is believed that this strong difference between these two active SDS people can be exploited without risk by the submission of fictitious letters to the "Diamondback," a University of Maryland, publication, either praising or criticizing and vice versa.

It is believed that judiciously-employed pretext telephone calls might possibly add fuel to this fire, throwing further suspicion on

This tactic of creating a suspicion of SDS members and leaders for one another is believed to be an extremely valuable tool for disruption.

The New Left in Baltimore consists primarily of the SDS and various pacifist type groups or groups which profess to be pacifist in nature. It has been noted that within the SDS and practically all of these "pacifist" type organizations within the Baltimore City area are composed almost 100 per cent of Caucasians. It is believed that this aspect of the New Left should be publicized through fictitious "Letters to the Editor" or through anonymous calls to various racially-centered groups. This, it is believed, would be very effective against the New Left in Baltimore because the New Left talks of itself as being a type of champion for the Negro, whereas in reality Negroes are almost totally excluded from its ranks.

Another disruptive technique, which it is believed can be utilized effectively, is to cover the "Letters to the Editor" type columns in the various newspapers, both large and small, within the territory of this division in order to determine the identities of law abiding citizens who can write effective letters against the New Left. It is believed that these individuals who write good letters and have strong arguments in their own right against the New Left could be contacted with the purpose in mind of encouraging them to continue to write such letters and to write more of them.

It is recommended that authorization be granted to immediately institute counterintelligence measures as follows:

Instruct appropriate informants to attempt to incite arguments within meetings of members of the New Left;

Direct appropriate communications, anonymously or fictitiously, to news media in the "Letters to the Editor" column, exposing various weaknesses within the SDS.

It is recommended that anonymous letters be directed to the "Afro-American," a primarily Negro publication in Baltimore, accusing the SDS and other exponents of the New Left to be totally segregated groups. It is also recommended that appropriate pretext telephone calls be allowed to various SDS members at College Park, Maryland which might spread distrust for

It is also recommended that where it has been determined that an SDS activist or other New Left activist is from another field office territory, though now currently living in Baltimore Division, that newspaper libraries or "morgues" from the previous cities be examined for public source information which might expose these New Leftists. If such information is obtained, this should be furnished to college administration or alumni associations.

Bureau authority is requested to recontact at the UD on a strictly confidential basis regarding this matter and present a strong case for the withdrawal of University recognition from the SDS. It is believed that the withdrawal of recognition would disrupt and severly limit the effectiveness of their activities. The loss of use of University facilities would deny them ready access

to meeting places and audiences of University students and make them more vulnerable to arrest and harassment when engaging in activities on University property. It is recognized that there is a danger of the SDS gaining student sympathy if a move is made against them by the University; however, it is believed that the disruption that SDS would suffer because of its expulsion would in the long run be beneficial to the University of Delaware and our national interests.

This matter is being given continuous and penetrative attention by the Baltimore Division.
