At the present time, there is no known SDS activity in the Kansas City area since the arrest of leader of the Weatherman faction of the SDS in Kansas City.

There is a group of individuals who were formerly known as the Lawrence Liberation Front made up of individuals in Lawrence, Kansas, who were formerly members of the SDS or White Panther Party. There is also a Students Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam group in Lawrence, Kansas, and there has been some conflict between these two groups in Lawrence, Kansas. The Kansas City Office is presently endeavoring to determine the full extent of this conflict so as to be in a position to recommend some potential counterintelligence action in this regard.


PENDING COUNTERINTELLIGENCE ACTION

Because of intensive investigation by Agents of the Kansas City Office and the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department against the SDS Weatherman commune in Kansas City, Missouri, the leader of this group was arrested on 6/30/70 in the possession of a pipe bomb and is presently in custody of the U.S. Marshal awaiting trial on the Federal charge of illegal possession of a bomb. Other leading members of the SDS Weatherman commune have departed from the Kansas City area.

Members of the YSA were planning to go to Chicago, Illinois, to attend a schooling, however, due to liaison with the parents of the leader of the YSA in the Kansas City area, these plans were disrupted and the YSA leader remains in the Kansas City area at this time.

At the present time the SDS chapters at varbus colleges and universities in the Kansas City Division appear to be disorganized and inactive.

Several SDS members have been suspended or expelled from such universities as the University of Missouri at Columbia, Missouri, the University of Missouri at Kansas City, and Kansas University in Lawrence. Kansas.

The authorities in Kansas City, Missouri, decided against taking legal action against the SDS members at the University of Missouri at Mansas City who disrupted classes in view of their expulsion from school.

A member of the SDS in Kansas City, Missouri, was dismissed from his job as a teacher from the Kansas City, Missouri, School District which resulted in considerable publicity in the Kansas City area. Efforts are presently being made to have this individual reinstated. It is believed by the Kansas City Office that in view of the present interest in this matter and the fact that the local school board and local police department are involved in this matter that the Kansas City Office should avoid any involvement in this matter at this time.

POTENTIAL COUNTERINTELLIGENCE ACTION

At the present time the SDS chapters at the various colleges and universities in the Kansas City Division appear to be disorganized and inactive.

The Young Socialist Alliance is currently attempting to recruit former SDS members at the University of Missouri at Kansas City and at Kansas University, Lawrence, Kansas.

It is believed that the past potential counterintelligence action would lie in causing suspicion and distrust among Young Socialist Alliance members and SDS members.

There is presently Grand Jury action pending against members of the SDS at UMKC for disrupting classes at that school on 10/15/69, and one graduate of UNKC and active member of SDS who participated in this class disruption in 10/69, has been discharged from his position in the Kansas City public schools which has resulted in considerable newspaper publicity. It is felt that any recommended counterintelligence action should await the outcome of the Grand Jury proceedings now scheduled for 1/9/70.

PENDING COUNTERINTELLIGENCE ACTION

There is currently no pending counterintelligence action in the Kansas City Division since leaders of the SDS have been expelled from UMKC and another SDS member has been REC-1 100.449698-23discharged from his job and Grand Jury action is pending against these individuals.

This is being done by threatening to withhold funds for further expansion and shifting the funds to other state campuses where there is no New Left agitation. For this reason, the administration of the University of Missouri system has been endeavoring to curtail the activities of the New Left.

This reflects a very negative approach to this program by your Division. It is to be noted that the best time to attempt to neutralise the New Left is when it is weak and disorganized. Counterintelligence action takes can be decisive and may even result in complete withdrawal of the New Left from these educational institutions.

You should assure that this program is assigned an Agent who grasps the full significance of the dangers projected by the New Left and to one who can approach the problems involved with enthusiasm and ingenuity.

There were approximately 1,500 demonstrators in this park, and stated he observed no force or violence on the part of either the demonstrators or the Chicago police that night. The demonstrators were removed from the park several times and then infiltrated back through the police lines into the park. This continued until approximately 3:00 AM on the morning of August 26, 1968.

noted that several of the demonstrators had hats and arm pands which proclaimed them to be newsmen and most of them also had cameras. Stated he noted members of the regular press present, who were first well dressed, and then he observed them later in the week and noted that they had changed their clothing and attire to conform with the demonstrators.

of demonstrators in the Grant Park and Lincoln Park areas of Chicago on August 26, 1968, and August 27, 1968; however, he did not observe any arrests by the Chicago police or any force or violence on the part of the demonstrators. The demonstrators were seen to set trash fires and shout obscenities at the police during this time. Newsmen and television cameramen were very active amongst the demonstrators, interviewing them and working throughout the crowds of demonstrators.

Numerous items of inflammatory literature was being distributed by these various demonstrators, however, stated he could not identify any of the demonstrators distributing literature or making inflammatory statements.

bodies of demonstrators were observed marching from Lincoln Park to Grant Park. They appeared to be well disciplined and moved in groups of one hundred to two hundred at a time and were following leaders who were distinguished by the black arm bands that they wore.

Stated that he could not identify any of the individuals wearing black arm bands.

stated that he was not near the Hilton Hotel on the evening of August 28, 1968, when the Chicago Police Department fired tear gas at the demonstrators, nor was he present when they removed the demonstrators from the lobby of the Hilton stated that when they arrived, the police had just finished clearing the demonstrators from the hotel lobby and there was still a strong odor of tear gas in the area. Most of the demonstrators had been driven across Michigan Boulevard estimated their number at approximately into Grant Park. There were also about 1,500 persons standing along the side streets on either side of the Hilton Hotel, on the west side of Michigan Boulevard, watching the demonstrators. From time to time groups of individuals among the spectators were permitted by the Chicago police to cross Michigan Boulevard and go into Grant Park to join the demonstrators.

hats and arm bands which indicated that they were with the press and most of these individuals also had cameras and they were taking pictures of the Chicago police in an attempt to harass them. The press hoted that several members of the regular press were present, and he noted that several of these individuals were observed later in the week to have changed their wearing apparel to conform with the wearing apparel of the demonstrators. In noted that nearly half of the male demonstrators and nearly half of the members of the press were bearded and after a few days, it became virtually impossible to distinguish members of the press from the demonstrators.

of demonstrators in Lincoln Park and Grant Park in the Chicago area from August 25, 1968, through August 27, 1968, during which time they continually shouted obscenities at the Chicago police and were seen to pass out various items of literature. stated that he could not identify any of the individuals seen passing out literature or making inflammatory or obscene statements.







Stated that he observed groups of demonstrators who appeared to be well disciplined and following leadership of individuals wearing black arm bands march from the Lincoln Park area to the Grant Park area on August 28, 1968.

stated that he was not present near the Hilton Hotel, Chicago, Illinois, when the Chicago Police Department fired tear gas at the demonstrators or removed the demonstrators from the lobby of the Hilton Hotel. He stated he arrived at the scene shortly after the police had cleared the demonstrators from the hotel lobby and there was still a strong odor of tear gas in the area.

During that evening, stated he observed approximately twelve persons being arrested by the Chicago Police; however, none of the demonstrators offered any resistance and no undue force or violence was used by the Chicago police. Stated he did observe one demonstrator pouring catsup on a bandage and then tieing the bandage around his head, giving the impression that he had suffered from a head wound.



1. STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. Gus Hall, General Secretary, Community Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us". At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anticommunist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes", the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of April 18, 1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

An article which appeared in the Sunflower Newspaper, Wichita State University, March 11, 1968, indicates that on that date a peaceful demonstration in protest of the presence on the campus of recruiters from the Naval Weapons Center, Corona, California, was held by the local chapter of SDS. The demonstrators carried an American flag and a flag of the Vietnamese National Liberation Front. A student, ripped the flag from the flagpole carried by a demonstrator for SDS. ReBulet to all offices dated 5/23/68, and Kansas City letter to Director dated 5/29/68.

ReBulet requested detailed information concerning false allegations of police brutality following student-police encounters and immorality by New Left adherents and subsequent action by college administrators.

As previously stated, in referenced Kansas City letter, the only New Left activity in the Kansas City Division is the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) which has not been active to any extent at the universities and colleges within the Kansas City Division during the past school year. In addition, there have been no student-police encounters within the Kansas City Division, nor has any information come to the attention of this office concerning immorality on the part of New Left adherents.

The importance of this program is realized and no opportunity to implement the program will be overlooked.
