





1. Potential Counterintelligence Action//

There appears to be good potential for counterintelligence action against the Peace and Freedom Center. -- (PFC), 618 South Millvale Avenue, Pittsburgh, Pa., and the Revolutionary Socialist Union (RSU), University of Pittsburgh (UP), Pittsburgh. //



The RSU is a campus-approved student organization at the UP. The RSU allows both students and non-students as members, contrary to UP policy. It is proposed that an established source at the UP be furnished this information on a confidential basis so that UP officials can challenge RSU leaders in this regard, and, possibly, cause the RSU to restrict its membership to UP students.

At present, Pittsburgh does not have any pending counterintelligence action.

3. Tangible Results

on 4/1/70. an established and reliable source at pittsburgh, was furnished information relative to 3-day conference scheduled at Carnegie-Mellon University (C-MU), Pittsburgh, Pa., 4/3-5/70, as outlined in retel dated 3/31/70. This office anticipated that armed with this information, could prevent this conference from being held at C-MU.

On 4/3/70, advised that he had furnished information relative to proposed conference and that the C-MU Administration had then taken steps takel permission for the conference. When the originators of the conference were informed that C-MU had cancelled permission for the conference, they protested C-MU's decision, claiming, among other things, that C-MU had renged on its promise that the conference could be held on its campus. The C-MU Administration relented by allowing the conference to be held as scheduled provided the conference did not include the planning of strategy for the Gulf Action Project, a project intended to disrupt the 4/28/0, stockholders meeting of the Gulf Oil Corporation, scheduled to be held at Pittsburgh.

In regard to proposed counterintelligence action against the last mentioned in relet dated 3/31/70, it is to be noted that the communist Party of Western Pennsylvania (CPWP), and is now considered a CPWP member in good standing. CPWP leaders reportedly expressed the opinion that was trustworthy in every respect and, in effect, agreed to let indiscretions go by the Board. Pittsburgh has





continues to be extremely active in the Peace and Freedom Center (PFC), Pittsburgh, Pa., and is closely associated with the leadership of the PFC, which is one of the most active peace organizations in Pittsburgh.

2. Pending Counterintelligence Action

Pittsburgh was considering counterintelligence action against the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) in the Pittsburgh area. However, there is no longer a chapter of the SDS at Pittsburgh. During September, 1969, the University of Pittsburgh Chapter, SDS, ceased to exist as an organization.

At present Pittsburgh does not have any pending counterintelligence action.

3. Tangible Results

In compliance with Bureau authority as set forth in Bulet to Pittsburgh dated 6/19/69, Pittsburgh made fictitious mailing to Pittsburgh newspapers on 6/23/69. However, these newspapers did not publish these anonymous letters.

Relet 5/29/68, advised that detailed plans for counterintelligence action against the Peace and Freedom Center (PFC), Pittsburgh, would be submitted by the Pittsburgh Office. During this two-month period, SDS must obtain a charter from the National SDS; submit a progress report concerning its recruiting efforts on the UP campus; and submit the identity of the major SDS officer who is responsible for SDS activities on the campus.

The UP is a private educational institution and receives substantial funds from the State of Pennsylvania to insure its continued operation. Campus-approved student organizations at the UP are usually allocated \$500 each year for the support of their campus activities. It is







Ca September 21, 1983, a source advised that at the first meeting of SFP during the 1983-07 school year on September 13, 1983, Dill Meber, SFP president, stated that SFP is not a pacificat group and anyons who empected it to be so could leave the meeting. Weber said the past president was a pacifist, but he would lead the organization as a militant group. He stated that it was not the purpose of the SFP to do only what the University allows, but since SFP was the only radical group on campus, they intended to do whatever they felt necessary to empress the radical viewpoint.

The information requested in relet is set forth below under the appropriate headings:

FALSE ALLEGATIONS OF POLICE BRUTALITY

Pittsburgh files relative to the New Left contain no information relative to alleged police brutality in this division.

IMMORALITY

The Pittsburgh Office has not received any specific data relative to immorality on part of New Left adherents. From time to time, Pittsburgh sources have furnished general information indicating that several couples associated with the New Left movement were living together without benefit of marriage. These sources have been alerted to furnish specific data in this regard so that captioned program may be intelligently pursued.

ACTION BY COLLEGE ADMINISTRATORS

On 10/5/67, three students at the University of Pittsburgh (UP), Pittsburgh, Pa., namely, laid down in front of marching Roll troops performing their drills on the UP drill field to demonstrate their opposition to ROTC. The students

were described as the "beatnik-type" with beards and no shoes. The students were removed from the drill field by the UP Security Police and taken at their request to the Dean of Men, HERBERT G. MC GIBBENY. After their arrival at the office of the Dean, the students had nothing to say. Dean MC GIBBENY requested the students to appear before him again on 10/9/67.

On 10/9/67, Dean MC GIBBENY conferred with above students, however, no decision was reached as to what action the UP would take against them.

On 10/11/67, Dean MC GIBBENY reportedly discussed this matter with the Chancellor's Committee on University Policies. The Dean was in favor of suspending the students but the members of the Committee felt that since this was the first offense for each student, suspension would be too drastic. The Committee recommended that the students be placed on probation and warned that future violations would result in their suspension.

On 10/13/67, it was reported that Dean MC GIBBENY was carrying out the recommendations of the Committee by sending letters to the three above-mentioned students and one other student, who attended a similar demonstration on 10/10/67, and their parents. The letter advised that the students were then on probation at the UP and any future involvement in activities opposed to the best interest of the UP could result in their dismissal from the UP.

On 11/2/67, it was reported that no student activity expressing opposition to the action taken by the UP concerning the above four students involved in ROTC protest demonstrations on 10/5 and 10/67, was taken. It was also reported that copies of above-mentioned letter had been mailed to these students and their parents by Dean MC GIBBENY.

On 11/15/67, it was reported that no problems had resulted from the UP's disciplinary action concerning above students. In fact, it was reported that one of the students, dissociated himself from the other demonstrators and no longer has a "beatnik" appearance as he wasthen clean-shaven and well-dressed. Since 10/5/67, former companions, and were reported to have participated in peaceful demonstrations opposing ROTC sponsored by the Students for Peace (SFP), a campus-approved student organization at the UP, which is characterized an an attachment hereto.

On 11/14 and 15/67, the SFP sponsored picketing demonstrations in front of the Student Union Building, UP, protesting recruiting of potential employees by representatives of the Dow Chemical Company. demonstrators denounced Dow Chemical Company for production of napalm bombs and use of those bombs in Vietnam. Demonstrators, which numbered approximately 125 at the height of picketing, carried placards, distributed literature and held speeches. These demonstrations were peaceful and without incident. No efforts were made by demonstrators to enter the building or in any way interfere with interviews being conducted by Dow Chemical Company representatives or block entrance to the Student Union Building, where the interviews were being conducted in the Placement Services Office located on the second floor.

On 11/13/67, it was reported that the SFP planned no acts of violence or civil disobedience in connection with aforementioned demonstrations. The probability of such acts was minimized as the UP had announced that such acts by students would be in violation of the UP's rules and regulations and that violators afaced arrest and possible expulsion from the UP.

The 11/16/67, issue of "The Pittsburgh Point", a weekly newspaper at Pittsburgh, contained an article entitled, "Napalm and Free Speech at Pitt," by RICHARD RIEKER, set forth that the 11/13/67, issue of "The Pitt News," a student newspaper at the UP, carried a letter written by JACK B.CRITCHFIELD, Dean of Students, UP, relative to the issue of representatives of the Dow Chemical Company appearing at the campus to recruit potential employees. The letter, described as a policy statement, was a reply to letter from six members of SFP protesting appearance of Dow Chemical Company recruiters on the UP campus. CRITCHFIELD was reported to have stated in his letter, "While those who are opposed to the activities of a particular employer have a right to make their views known to their fellow students by peaceful means, disorderly conduct or physical obstruction which interferes with any student's right to participate in an interview cannot be tolerated."

The article continued in part:

"The implications of the phrase 'cannot be tolerated' were spelled out by CRITCHFIELD in a meeting with some of the students about a week before the demonstration. CRITCHFIELD said, in an interview, that he had read to the students his own revision of a passage from the students' handbook. One part of the statement reaffirmed the right to protest. The last sentence read as follows: 'Any student involved in an on-campus protest whose nature is physical force or physical obstruction will be subject to dismissal from the University."

Among the principal speakers at above demonstration on 11/14/67, were ARTHUR TUDEN, Associate Professor of Anthropology, UP, who criticized the indiscriminate use of napalm against villages in Vietnam, causing death

On September 21, 1966, a source advised that at the first meeting of SFP during the 1966-67 school year on September 13, 1966, Bill Weber, SFP president, stated that SFP is not a pacifist group and anyone who expected it to be so could leave the meeting. Weber said the past president was a pacifist, but he would lead the organization as a militant group. He stated that it was not the purpose of the SFP to do only what the University allows, but since SFP was the only radical group on campus, they intended to do whatever they felt necessary to express the radical viewpoint.

On February 23, 1968, source advised that efforts by the Communist Party of Western Pennsylvania (CPWP) to infiltrate, dominate, control or influence policies of SFP have, for the most party, been unsuccessful to date. Source advised, however, the CPWP has been interested in SFP since its beginning and has made efforts to recruit members of SFP into the Communist Party Youth Club (CPYC) and succeeded in recruiting one, Daniel Smullyan, who became a member of the Executive Board of the CPYC as the Club treasurer. He transferred to New York City after withdrawing from the UP in early 1966. One other SFP member, Richard Sayre, is currently a member of the Pittsburgh Chapter of the W.E.B. DuBois Clubs of America (PDC).

PEACE AND FREEDOM CENTER (PFC)

On May 1 and 10, 1968, a source advised that the PFC was located at 5899 Ellsworth Avenue, Pittsburgh, Pa. 15232. Prior to November, 1967, the PFC was known as the Pittsburgh Committee to End the War in Vietnam which had been activated in the Summer, 1965.

The PFC functions as a service organization and its aim is to coordinate Pittsburgh peace activities directed toward ending the war in Vietnam or other disturbances elsewhere. Activities also include those having racial overtures, the PFC advocating racial equality.

One member of the District Committee, Communist Party of Western Pennsylvania (CPWP) was on the Steering Committee of the PFC as of May 10, 1968. In addition, the CPWP exerts influence upon the activities of the PFC through the association of four other members of the CPWP, with Walter Tillow, Field Secretary, who is responsible for the physical operation of the PFC. Tillow, who was a speaker at a CPWP meeting in Pittsburgh on May 3, 1968, stated that a Marxist daily newspaper was vital to the needs of the public and agreed with communist policies on peace activities.

A review of Pittsburgh files discloses the following organizations that may have potential for counterintelligence action:

Pittsburgh Peace and Freedom Center (PPFC) 5899 Ellsworth Avenue Pittsburgh, Pa.

This organization is operated by with the assistance of his wife, to coordinate peace activities and movements having racial overtures. The are closely associated with members of the communist Party (CP) and sympathize with the aims of the CP in Western Pennsylvania (CPWP).

Students For Peace (SFP) University of Pittsburgh Pittsburgh, Pa.

This is a campus-approved organization of the University of Pittsburgh. It refused to become affiliated with Students For a Democratic Society (SDS) but goes along with policies of SDS and peace demonstrations in Pittsburgh. There is one member of the W.E.B. DuBois Clubs of America in the organization.

Pittsburgh Veterans For Peace (PVP)

This organization is commanded by a graduate of the United States Naval Academy and a graduate student at Carnegie-Mellon Institution. Pittsburgh. The Treasurer of PVP is a member of the CPWP. There are about 90 members who so far have peacefully advocated the end of the war in Vietnam. The has been able to induce to subscribe to "The Worker" and consider the CP line in his activities.

High School Students for Peace in Vietnam

This organization was organized by adults interested in the termination of the war in Vietnam. The students hold approximately weekly demonstrations and some have elected to take part in other peace demonstrations.

SDS, University of West Virginia, Morgantown, W. Va.

In 1967, a chapter of SDS was organized at the University of West Virginia but to date it is not known to have been recognized by the National Headquarters, SDS. Activities have been negligible and normal activities have presently ceased at the University except for summer-school classes.

This organization operates out of the office of PPFC. Its purpose is to counsel and assist young men to resist the draft. Adult

Peace and Freedom Ticket (PPFT)

This political party was organized for the purpose of placing a third party on the November, 1968, Pennsylvania ballot. The CP was active in promoting this organization which resulted in DICK GREGORY and Dr. BENJAMIN SPOCK being nominated for President and Vice President of the United States. The organization has ceased to function temporarily pending the election.

The PPFC appears to be the center of new left activity in the Pittsburgh area. Works full time to promote activity of this nature and has a printing press in the PPFC office to assist in advertising demonstrations. It is believed that to curtail or eliminate the use of this equipment could be brought about by several methods.

Campus-approved organizations sometimes are allocated funds by the University. It is believed that if it could be shown that funds are utilized for producing un-American literature or activities, the funds may be denied. It is also believed that should the University demand that the student organization pay for guards when they wish to promote a demonstration on the campus, this would deter the organization from making the demonstration.

Plans utilizing the above suggestion will be formulated and the Bureau will be provided with details of counterintelligence proposals.
