Recent information shows that several Puerto Rican Socialist League (LSP) members traveled to New York to discuss with individuals there the proposal that Secretary General of the LSP, be deposed and that be substituted as the new leader of the LSP. information indicates that on 10/2/69 and a number of LSP members were arrested by the police of Puerto Rico (POPR) on charges of Illegal Possession of Firearms.

In view of the above, San Juan should give prompt consideration to counterintelligence moves at this time directed against Since certain LSP members are apparently disenchanted with him, it appears now would be an appropriate time to discreetly let it be known (for example, by anonymous letter) that the reason for the recent arrests of LSP members is indiscretions. Anonymous letter could be so written that it would clearly point to as police source who led to the arrests.

You should consider the above in light of the situation as seen by your office. Submit your comments and recommendations for Bureau consideration. No anonymous letter should be mailed without prior Bureau consideration.





The letter may be worded as follows:



"Comrades of the Liga Socialista Puertorriquena:

"A few facts for your consideration:

"In 1954 our organization was formed with the idea of having a close-knit group of militant young men to advance the teachings of Marxism-Leninism and to lead in the fight for the independence of our beloved country.

"Since that time much has been written but nothing has been accomplished by us. The sad truth is that while our "leader" sits in his ivory tower writing "poetry," Mari Bras gains hundreds of followers by acting and leads in our struggle for independence. While we talk, others act. While our old men discuss theories, our young men are carrying the struggle into the streets and onto the campuses. While our young men travel to other countries to establish ties with other peoples who think as we do, our "leader" indiscriminately tells the police of our plans and actions.

"While our young men gain publicity by bombing stores and destroying the ROTC building, the only thing the newspapers can publish about us is the fact that we managed to get ourselves arrested for carrying weapons, while all other independentistas carry guns unmolested.

"Thanks to the indiscretion of our "leader" the police have been in our very midst reporting our every move. Who knows how many other informants attend our meetings!

"The time to press for our independence is now. The people to do it are our young men.

"What do you think? Is it time for a change???







During the latter part of 1969, positive indications were developed that there existed some major disagreements among leaders and members of the Liga Socialista Puertorriquena (Puerto Rican Socialist League) (LSP). A number of prominent LSP members were questioning the leadership of and indicated that he should be replaced.

An analysis of the overall situation at that time resulted in the conclusion that the situation presented an opportunity to disrupt the organization by taking advantage of the existing situation utilizing a counterintelligence measure. An anonymous letter was composed for distribution among selected members of the ISP, including some of those who were directly involved in the disagreement described above. The letter was worded to take advantage of the disagreement and to increase the bitterness that was already developing. The letter was approved by the Bureau and subsequently mailed, on 12/19/69. Although no first hand direct report of the effect of the letter is available for lack of any sources within the organization, subsequent developments establish a significant measure of success for this counterintelligence device.



It was felt a successful counterintelligence move against and the LSP could remove from prominence this militant dangerous separatist and could weaken and/or neutralize the LSP.

San Juan prepared anonymous letter which pointed out shortcomings of leadership and his indiscretions in leaking information to police source which led to arrests of a number of LSP members. Letter was so written that it was felt additional dissension would be created within the LSP. With approval of the Director, San Juan's letter was sent on 12/19/69 to selected LSP members in San Juan.

A current analysis of situation in San Juan shows a number of dissident LSP members (all of whom were recipients of our letter) have broken off from LSP and have formed a splinter group. The LSP at the moment, in view of this, is disorganized and is reported attempting to recruit new members in order to restore life into the LSP. It appears reasonable to conclude this counterintelligence effort has succeeded in taking advantage of noted dissension in LSP and has created an irreparable split between and a number of his most devoted lieutena []

% Cuban, Researcher Says

Dade Latin Population Put At 307,000 and Still Growing

By FRANK SOLER Of Our Latin America Staff

An economic research anayst Tuesday estimated that the Latin population of Dade County was more than 107,000 — and growing.

Richard Tobin of First Reearch Corp. said his compaiv estimated there were 307,i24 Spanish-speaking perions living in Dade County is of January 1970. Tobin said that about 90 per cent of hese are of Cuban extraction.

The over-all figure, he said, means about 22 per cent of the area's 1.4-million population is Latin.

TOBIN said the figure represented an increase of 90,000 — up from 221,000 — over the last 3½ years.

The figures coincide with recent estimates by the Standard Rate and Data Company, a national media market research firm, which reported 303,000 Latins living in Dade County as of January, he said:

The estimates were revealed at a Latin market seminar at the Dupont Plaza Hotel.

A PREVIOUS report by First Research, prepared for advertisers interested in the Latin market's potential, had estimated that there would be 306,000 Latins in the area by June 1, 1971.

Tobin attributed the growth to the number of refugees who return to the Miami area after they have been resettled elsewhere in the United States.

About 4,000 Cuban refugees arrive in the United States each month aboard the twice-daily airlift flights from Cuba to Miamia

Memorandum recommends approval of San Juan Office's proposed counterintelligence ploy directed against Juan Mari Eras, Secretary General of the Movimiento Pro Independencia de Puerto Rico (Puerto Rican Independence Movement) (MPIPR). The MPIPR is the largest and most dangerous of the militant Puerto Rican proindependence groups. Letter is attached for transmittal to San Juan.

The 3/15/70 issue of "Claridad" contained an article bearing the byline of Mari Bras entitled "Political Comment, Act of War." "Claridad" is the official newspaper of the LPIPR. This article condoned the assassination of United States military personnel stationed in Puerto Rico and declared that the time was approaching for Puerto Rican "patriotic forces" to engage in warfare against the Government of Puerto Rico and the United States military.

This article apparently caused consternation within MPIPR ranks. Many MPIPR members feel they have neither the strength nor resources to engage in violent activities at this time, nor do they feel that the "moment of crisis" has arrived. Mari Bras has been openly criticized by some MPIPR leaders who feel he has crossed the line between respectable independentist activity and illegal acts of violence.

San Juan proposed an anonymous lotter designed to exploit dissension among MPIPR members as a result of public support of terrorist activity by Mari Bras be sent to selected MPIPR members in San Juan and New York City. San Juan also proposed to send copies of this letter to and and who are editorial writers for spanish-language newspapers published daily in San Juan. Both individuals have previously published articles critical of Mari Bras and the MPIPR. Sending of the proposed letter could create additional dissension and distrust within the MPIPR.



On 10/9/70, records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York were caused to be checked by SC for information on the subject. No record was found identifiable with him.

On 10/12/70, records of the Bureau of Criminal Identification and the Special Services Division of the New York City Police Department were caused to be checked by SA for a record on the subject. No record was record identificable with him.

During October and November, 1970, the following sources, familiar with Puerto Rican independentist activities in the NYC area, were contacted for information on the subject and/or a Puerto Rican answering service who is running guns into the US. Results were negative.



In view of the fact that no positive information has been obtained in the investigation of this matter, it is apparent that the anonymous caller who reported this answering service may be the subject's wife's former husband who is attempting to cause problems for the subject. The case will, therefore, be closed and in the event further information is received on this answering service, additional investigation will be conducted.





He was interviewed by the aforementioned news media representatives for approximately 15 minutes, as he walked though the airport. 

The aforementioned publicity was a counter intelligence plan of the San Juan Office in an effort to disrupt the visit of to Puerto Rico, which plan was designed to thwart or prevent an alliance or points of agreement between communist elements in the United States and those elements seeking Puerto Rican independence by forceful means.

It is felt by the San Juan Office that this counter intelligence plan was extremely successful in that, due to the publicity afforded that arrival and stay in Puerto Rico, numerous scheduled meetings with Puerto Rican independence leaders were cancelled and was unable to clandestinely meet and cement alliances with Puerto Rican independence clements.





APPENDIX

MOVINIENTO PRO-INDEPENDENCIA DE PUENTO RICO (PUENTO RICAN INDEPENDENCE MOVEMENT) (MPIPR)

The MPIPR was organized in November, 1959, at Ponce, Puerto Rico. It has a current membership of about 700-800 person, with several thousand sympathizers. The MPIPR 1s organized in missions which are located in various towns throughout Puerto Rico. There are also members and sympathizers in the continental United States. The MPIPR National Headquarters is located at 1122 Ponce de Leon Avenue, Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico.

At the time the MPIPR was organized, it indicated that it did not advocate violence but would accept members who cid. JUAN MARI BRAS, the founder and dominant leader of the organization, in a speech in 1964, threatened violence comparable to that in Algeria, 1964, if Puerto Rico became a state within the United States.

MARI BRAS, in an editorial appearing in the March 15, 1970, issue of "Charidad," the MPIPR newspaper, stated that "in Puerto Rico there is an incipient armed struggen the part of pro-independence individuals who consider it their patriotic duty to conduct warfare against the empire which dominates us. We believe that every Puerto Rican has the right to make war against the invaders of our country. And war is mainly killing and dying."

The press of Puerto Rico has reported that the MPIPR has held numerous public meetings and demonstrations at which they protested compulsory military service for Puerto Ricans and United States policy in Vietnam. The MPIPR has further urged the boycott of elections in Puorto Rico.

The PIP was founded in 1948, but has declined in votes drastically since 1952. The party first lost legal standing when it failed to poll the required five percent of the total vote cast in the elections of 1960. The PIP was placed on the ballot by legislative edict for the 1964 elections, but again failed to poll the required number of votes. After being placed on the 1968 ballot by fulfilling all legal requirements for recognition as a political party by petition, the PIP received less that three percent of the total vote cast, again losing its status as a registered party.

On March 10, 1970, Mrs. ROSITA M. CORDOVA, Secretary to the Superintendent, Commonwealth of Puerto Rico Elections Board, advised that at the January 23, 1970, meeting of the Elections Board, one PIP was certified as a legally constituted political party in Puerto Rico by reason of petition.

Ine January 26, 1970, edition of "The San Juan Star," an English language daily newspaper published at San Juan, Puerto Rico, reported that during his speech, accepting the presidency of the PIP, ROWN BERRIOS MARTINEZ pledged himself to a more radical political posture, with "Christian socialism" and "pacific militance" as principal tactics. In an interview, BERRIOS placed special significance on the inclusion of other means of gaining independence in addition to going to the polls, such as more active participation in protests, marches, pickets and boycotts.

The February 21, 1970, edition of "The San Juan Star," reports that BERRIOS stated that "The only way to solve. . . the problem of military occupation in Puerto Rico is to achieve our independence as a nation."

The April 17, 1970, edition of "El Mundo," a Spanish language daily newspaper published at San Juan, Puerto Rico, contains parts of a speech given by specific wherein he says that the members of the organization are to intensify the struggle against the regime, but that violence was ruled out for his party. He added that it was more profitable for their cause to let the invaders break the heads of these opposing their oppression than to fight them face to race."
"Some day," he stated, "the lackeys of Yankee imperialism willings too far and there will be innocent victims and blood will run."



MOVIMIENTO PROTINDEPENDENCIA DE PUERTO RICO (PUERTO RICAN INDEPENDENCE MOVEMENT) (MPIPR)

The MPIPR was organized in November, 1959, at Ponce Puerto Rico. It has a current membership of about 700-000 persons with several thousand sympathizers. The MPIPR is creatized in missions which are located in various towns throughout Puerto Rico. There are also members and sympathizers in the continental United States. The MPIPR National Headquarters is located at 1122 Ponce de Leon Avenue, Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico.

At the time the MPIPR was organized, it indicated that it did not advocate violence, but would accept members who did. JUAN MARI ERAS, the founder and dominant leader of the organization, in a speech in 1964, threatened violence comparable to that in Algeria, 1964, if Fuerto Rico became a state within the United States.

MARI BRAC, in an editorial appearing in the March 15, 1970, issue of "Claridad," the MITR newspaper, stated that "in Puerto Rico there is an incluient armed struggle on the part of pro-independence individuals who consider it their patriotic duty to conduct warfare against the empire which dominates us. We believe that every Puerto Rican has the right to make war against the invaders of our country. And war is mainly killing and dying."

The press of Fuerto Rico has reported that the MPIPR has held numerous public meeting and demonst tions at which they protested cumpulsory military service for Pherto Ricans, and United States policy in Vietnam. The MFIPR has further urged the boyco; of elections in Puerto Rico.

The MPIPR is the largest and most dangerous of the militant proindependence groups. Letter is attached for transmittal to San Juan. Secretary General of the CPUSA, traveled to Puerto Rico during January, 1971, where he planned meeting. with leaders of the PCP and with leaders of the MPIPR. planned, through these meetings, to institute cooperative action among the CPUSA and these groups. Neither the PCP nor the MPIPR has seen fit to publish either the photo or the article. The conference in San Juan, January 22, between the top leaders of the MPI (El Movimiento Pro-Independencia de Puerto Rico), headed by its general secretary, Juan Mail Eras, the top leaders of the Communist Purty of Puerto Rico headed by its general secretary Felix Ojedo, and the IJ.S. Communist delegation, headed by Gus Hall, issued the following statement:

In the spirit of internationalist anti-imperialism and in an atmosphere of friendship and cordinlity a meeting took place. In the office of the National Mission of the MPI.

Present were Juan Mari Bras, general secretary of the MPI; Gus Hall, general secretary of the Communist Party, U.S.A.; Felix Ojeda, general secretary, Communist Party of Puerto Rico. Others present were Julio Vives Vazquez, Fedro Briges Chapel, Jenaro Rentas, Manuel de J. Gonzalez and Angel Agosto, members of the Political Committee of the MPI; Gertrudis Melendez de Perez, and other members of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of Puerto Rico, and Pat Toohey, member of the national committee of the Communist Party, U.S.A.

The talks focused on the struggle for Puerto Rican independence, and for the climination of U.S. military, economic, and political domination and influence over Puerto Rican life. All parties agreed that Puerto Rica is subjected to a direct, classic form of colonialism by the U.S. imperialists.

The talks included a discussion about the developments in the struggle for national liberation throughout the world. The meeting took note of the new and omit has steps of escalation in Southeast Asia by the Nixon Administration. Recause of this, all parties present agreed to intensify and heighten the struggle to end the U.S. aggression in Indochina.

The discussion dealt with the movements and struggles for independence in Puerto Rico, and in the U.S., with the various struggles against imperialism and war; with the struggle for black liberation, and against the special oppression of 1,600,000 Puerto Rican people now in the U.S. The talks took note of the serious nature of the present economic crisis and its severe and damaging effects upon the working people of our two nations.

The meeting developed a number of concrete forms and actions, especially around the following issues:

A. To eliminate the U.S. naval presence and its criminal bombardment of the Island of Culebra We see this struggle as the initial stage in eliminating the presence of U.S. imperialism's military force in Puerto Rico.

B. To heighten the struggle for the freedom of Angela Davis. We see this as a struggle to save the life of a beautiful human being and symbolic of the struggle against racism and all other forms of the perialist ideology. We see it symbolic of the need for unity of all victims of imperialist oppression.

C. To expose the hypocrisy of U.S. imperialism in now proclaiming that Puerto Rico is not inclining the Tialteluleo Treaty for Nuclear Free Zene Latin America. This only shows that the criminal intentions of U.S. imperialism are to recommic, military, and political oppression fuer Rico; to continue it as a regional military staging area and to have, in Puerto Rico, nuclear weapont bases from which it can threaten the independence of all nations in our hemisphere.

D. The talks canvassed the meaning of the un precedented mass militancy of the youth of our two nations. The meeting agreed on special steps that are needed to render assistance and mass support to the hundreds who have been arrested or indicted because of their courageous stand against the U.S. military draft.

E. The meeting took special note of the centrality of the need to promote unity and a fighting, militant fraternal relationship between the workingclass and trade union organizations of our two nations. We will seek ways to put an end to the ability of U.S. coporations to use the working class of one maticagainst their class brothers of the other.

The conference concluded, strength radeship between us in spite of the difference view that each party may have about a number of things as symbolic of the future ties and friendship that will grow and deepen between our two peoples: based of an end to U.S. imperialist oppression of Puerto Ricc as neighbors in independence, equality and mutus respect.
