PRESSMAN has known DAN ROSTENKOWSKI for approximately twenty-five years. Their relationship is a personal one that began when they both owned vacation homes in a small community in Wisconsin. Their wives were also friends and PRESSMAN's daughter babysat for ROSTENKOWSKI'S children on occasion.

Through the years PRESSMAN has received a variety of gifts from ROSTENKOWSKI. Most of these gifts have been commemorative items signifying an event or occasion in ROSTENKOWSKI'S career. These include a commemorative book on ROSTENKOWSKI'S life that was issued when he became Chairman of the House of Representatives Ways and Means Committee. PRESSMAN also received a book on the U.S. Congress. PRESSMAN remembers receiving a pair of cufflinks that commemorated some occasion, but he believes he lost these. PRESSMAN may have also received a commemorative plate, but he does not recall for what occasion or if he still has it. PRESSMAN never received a chair from ROSTENKOWSKI.

All of the items that PRESSMAN received from ROSTENKOWSKI were given to him as gifts and he never reimbursed ROSTENKOWSKI for the items nor was he asked to pay for them. He believes that all of the items were mailed to him and each was probably accompanied by a card or letter.

The film was processed by the photo lab at FBIHQ, and some of the photos were found to be underexposed (i.e., the notes attached to the backs of the Capitol chairs were not readable). After reviewing the negatives to determine if the notes could be exposed, it was determined that FBIHQ could re-develop the film to expose the necessary data. Three of the five sets of negatives were returned to FBIHQ for re-possessing, and as soon as the photos are received from FBIHQ, they will be sent (along with the negatives) to WMFO.

[redacted] stated that he received a Capitol chair from ROSTENKOWSKI a couple of years ago, and to the best of his knowledge it was delivered to the mail room at [redacted] stated that the mail room is located on the 19th floor, and [redacted] has no idea if the chair was mailed to his office or dropped off by someone. [redacted] stated that he never discussed reimbursing ROSTENKOWSKI for the chair because he assumed it was a gift from ROSTENKOWSKI. [redacted] could not recall receiving any correspondence from ROSTENKOWSKI regarding the chair, but questioned that he might have had a conversation with ROSTENKOWSKI during which he thanked ROSTENKOWSKI for the chair.

He stated that he nor his companies have asked for or received any type of political favors or gifts from ROSTENKOWSKI.

He initially met Representative DAN ROSTENKOWSKI, United States House of Representatives, in 1984 in Washington, D.C. He recalls this meeting took place in ROSTENKOWSKI's Capital office and was for the purpose of "getting to know each other" as the Representative was a powerful member of Congress and a good man to know. He stated during the succeeding years, he doubts he had more than a dozen conversations with ROSTENKOWSKI with the last actual contact having taken place in 1990.

[redacted] did state in June, 1988, he gave Representative ROSTENKOWSKI "a ride" to the West Coast. He explained that ROSTENKOWSKI, [redacted] from Chicago and a ROSTENKOWSKI aide were coming to the West Coast for a fund raiser so he volunteered to fly them to Los Angeles in his personal jet. He recalls that upon arriving in Los Angeles, he drove this party to the Universal Hilton where they were staying and then joined them for a Democratic fundraiser hosted by [redacted] that night. He indicated this is the only West Coast contact he had with ROSTENKOWSKI.
