[redacted] was [redacted] husband for 55 years but he passed away on December 11, 1991. [redacted] was told that the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) wanted to interview her husband because of gifts that her husband may have received from Representative DAN ROSTENKOWSKI. [redacted] knew that her husband was a lobbyist in Washington, D.C., for the Delaware River Port Authority and that at one time he worked for a construction firm in Pleasantville, N.Y., but she knew very little about what he did as a lobbyist. [redacted] knows that her husband knew Representative ROSTENKOWSKI but she did not know anything about the dealings that he had with Representative ROSTENKOWSKI. [redacted] would occasionally ask questions of her husband about his work and he would tell her that she was prying and he would not talk about his work. [redacted] knows of no gifts that Representative ROSTENKOWSKI gave to her husband. [redacted] was asked if her husband had an office and she stated that although it may sound strange she does not know if her husband had an office. [redacted] has never seen any items in her house with Representative ROSTENKOWSKI'S name on them or which appear to have come from Representative ROSTENKOWSKI.
