I am an FBI agent that recently retired after 23 years. My last assignment was as an Assistant Section Chief in the Espionage Section under [redacted] I have also worked with SSA [redacted] when he was at FBIHQ doing Economic Espionage back in 1996. I know some of the terrorism task force folks in the Kansas City office.

The purpose of this note is to give you the attached tape in case it is of any value to you. I contacted [redacted] to get your name.

1. I was recently contacted by an old friend from California who has worked as a practicing psychic for the past ten years. She is pretty much in demand in New York and in California. I have not spoken with her for about five years because she married and moved to England. She called to give me information on a murder case that someone in your territory is probably working. She said that there was a special on the DATELINE television program during the month of July, 2004. She said she got the following intuitive information from the television program and wanted to share it with whoever needed it.

2. This information is regarding the "BTK Killer" in Wichita, Kansas. The woman who gave me the information is [redacted] and she may be reached at [redacted] [redacted] said that the killer/subject is a person that is jealous of the attention that other serial killers may be receiving and wants some NOTORIETY. She said that there are PEARLS associated with the serial killer. Either the victims were wearing pearls or the subject has pearls from something. [redacted] gets the sensation that the subject is PERCHED up in a high place, either living up on a hill or in an apartment where they can look down. [redacted] said that the BTK Killer has other B-type words associated with them. A name such as BOBBY came to her mind. She also said that there is someone or someplace associated with the subject that has SC in the name. She mentioned Scranton, Pennsylvania or the name SCOTT. [redacted] said that the subject lives in a dark place where they could be very DEPRESSED. The subject has very STRANGE EATING HABITS and may take their victims underground; hopefully they do not have anyone underground right now. [redacted] said that the subject liked to keep the person UNDERGROUND and that there were FERNS and PINES in the area where they were located. [redacted] also said SPARPEN THE EYE had something to do with the murders. Either EYE SURGERY or remembering things from the past, looking at the subjects etc. [redacted] said that there is something about track of homes or a housing development that has some importance to the case. [redacted] said that the B person is either taking college courses, or is associated with a Halfway House or with an institute. [redacted] says that the subject DOES NOT LIKE TO INTERACT WITH PEOPLE [redacted] then mentioned that there is a Jim or James as well as a Chuck or Charles that are associated with the subject. She said the subject wants to get caught and keeps hearing the saying "FOLLOW THE BOUNCING BALL" The ball will lead to the subject. There is also a Mike, Mark, or Margaret associated with the subject. [redacted] said that she could see someone driving to the out skirts of town and trying to decide where to go. [redacted] finally added that there is someone involved with the

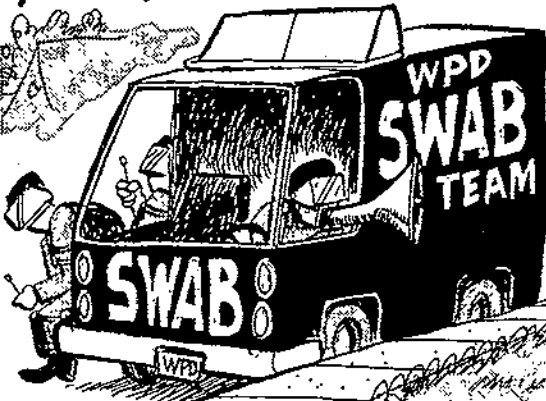

Another poem by BTK is released

"I was perfect plan of deviant pleasure so bold on that Spring nite. . ."

So opens a poem the serial killer BTK penned to a woman he meant to kill 25 years ago. But it wasn't a perfect plan, because she didn't come home when he thought she would.

Frustrated and impatient, BTK left her home at 615 S. Pinecrest that April night. Six weeks later, he sent her the poem and items from her home to let her know he had been there.

Wichita police on Thursday released the poem, titled "Oh, Anna Why Didn't You Appear," in the hope that someone recognizes the poem — and its author — and calls the police.

"This poem appears to be an original writing, as an extensive search has not found this to be a known, published work," Lt. Ken Landwehr, head of the homicide division, said Thursday in a prepared statement.

Because the poem was photocopied, police want to talk to anyone who might have seen the original poem or has any knowledge of it.

Anna Williams, a 63-year-old widow at

WHO IS BTK?

The killer known as BTK is Wichita's most notorious serial killer, now connected with eight unsolved homicides from 1974 to 1986. BTK stands for "bind, torture and kill," a style of killing he used. The serial killer used the initials in letters he sent to local media.

BTK POEM

BTK sent this error-riddled poem in June 1979; it was released by Wichita police Thursday.

Oh, Anna Why Didn't You Appear

I was perfect plan of deviant pleasure so bold on that Spring nite
My inner felling hot with propension of the new awakening season

Warm, wet with inner fear and rapture, my pleasure of entanglement,
like new vines at night

Oh, Anna, Why Didn't You Appear
Drop of fear fresh Spring rain would roll down from your nakedness

the time, received the 19-line, typewritten poem in an 8½-by-11-inch envelope on June 14, 1979.

The envelope was addressed in neatly printed block letters and also contained a sketch, an article of the woman's clothing and a piece of jewelry. The next day, KAKE-TV received a matching envelope with similar contents.

Police said late Thursday that they had talked to Williams as recently as 1984, but that she has since died of natural causes.

Laden with sexual overtones, the poem indicates that Williams was meant to be BTK's eighth victim. He had already killed seven people between 1974 and 1979 and would eventually claim an eighth; Vicki Wegerle, who was found dead in her home at 2404 W. 13th St. on Sept. 16, 1986.

His way of taking credit for that murder — in a letter containing photos of Wegerle and her driver's license sent to The Eagle in March — was the first time BTK had been heard from since sending the letters to Williams and KAKE 25 years earlier.

Thursday's announcement was the second time in less than a week that Wichita police have appealed to the public for more information about a poem written by BTK. Last Friday, police released "Oh! Death to Nancy," which adapted lines from the folk song "Oh, Death."

That poem, signed by BTK, had been included in a letter sent to KAKE on Feb. 10, 1978, claiming responsibility for the murders of Shirley Vian, Nancy Fox and another victim, later determined to be Kathryn Bright.

POLICE STATEMENT*This is the statement issued by police Thursday morning:*

On April 28, 1979, a burglary occurred at 615 S. Pinecrest. In June 1979, a local television station received a mailing that included a poem authored by BTK, titled "Oh, Anna Why Didn't You Appear."

Based on the Wichita Police Department's investigation, this poem appears to be an original writing, as an extensive search has not found this to be a known, published work.

The copy of the poem "Oh, Anna, Why Didn't You Appear" that was sent to the television station back in 1979 was a photocopy. We want to talk to anyone who may have seen the original poem, or has any other knowledge of the poem.

Since BTK resurfaced last March, the Wichita Police Department has received more than 4,000 tips from the public.

We appreciate all the tips we have received thus far, and we are now asking anyone who has information on the poem "Oh, Anna Why Didn't You Appear" to please contact us.

Last week, we released BTK's poem "Oh! Death to Nancy" and received more than 100 tips from the public.

the killer sent a letter to KAKE with the heading "The BTK Story" and a chapter titled "P.J.'s." Investigators found that the song "Oh, Death" had been used in an American folklore class at WSU in the 1970s, taught by Phyllis Wyatt — better known by the nickname P.J. She died in 1991.

Police have collected hundreds of DNA swabs since BTK resurfaced in March. People familiar with the case say the release of the poems could signal a shift in the investigation's focus.

"I'm glad to see they are asking the public for help," said Bernie Drowatzky, former lieutenant in charge of the homicide division for the Wichita Police Department during the BTK investigation and now an investigator with the Kay County Sheriff's Department in Oklahoma. "I think they've been

too tight-lipped about this.

"There are some things in investigating you don't release, but there may be some things Joe Citizen might pick up on."

He added that news conferences should be open to media questions and not just center on reading a prepared statement, as BTK updates have been delivered this year by Landwehr.

"They ought to accept questions, and if they can't answer them, then say you can't answer them," Drowatzky said. "But there might be a question that they can answer."

Wichita psychologist Howard Brodsky called releasing information about BTK "very risky business," but likely vital if police are to nab him.

Police have received more than 4,000 tips since March, including more than 100 tips related to the "Oh! Death to Nancy" poem.

Profilers contacted by The Eagle on Thursday declined to analyze the "Anna" poem, saying they did not want to offer analysis that would let BTK know his identity was about to become clear — and thus go deeper into hiding.

Brodsky, a forensic psychologist who has counseled sex offenders for 25 years, said "Oh, Anna Why Didn't You Appear" says a lot about the man who wrote it.

"It's boldly sexual," Brodsky said. "It's definitely creepy."

The poem's lines blaming the intended victim for screwing up his "perfect" plan are fitting for something written by BTK, he said: "Sex offenders have this issue about blaming others, and it runs through here."

BTK is "quite a wordy fellow," Brodsky said. "He uses more words than are probably necessary to express things. This has got to be something people would notice about him."

A grandiose theme runs throughout the poem, Brodsky said, but the poor writing skills reflected in the poem suggest he is not well-educated.

It's quite possible BTK took some college-level courses — including Wyatt's folklore class — but never earned a degree, Brodsky said.

The framing of the poem, as if it's written to a lover who has rejected him, leaves Brodsky wondering if BTK's killing spree was ignited by a love which wasn't returned.

Returning to poems a quarter-century old after spending months collecting DNA samples leaves people familiar with the case suspecting authorities are at a dead end.

"It's extremely frustrating," Drowatzky said. "We put so many hours and so much time, and here it is again, and we're right back to square one basically."

THE ANNA WILLIAMS CASE

■ On April 28, 1979, Wichita police are dispatched to what appears to be a routine burglary at 615 S. Pinecrest. Anna Williams, 63, had arrived home at 11 p.m. to find some clothing, jewelry and \$35 missing — and the phone line cut, one of BTK's signature moves.

■ On June 15, 1979, an 8½-by-11-inch manila envelope arrives in the mail at Williams' home. The envelope, neatly addressed in printed block letters, contains the poem "Oh, Anna Why Didn't You Appear," a sketch, and clothing and jewelry that had been taken in the break-in. The next day, an identical envelope containing similar items arrives at KAKE-TV and is turned over to police unopened.

■ Shortly after receiving the packet, Williams moves out of the state.

■ Police on Thursday ask for help from anyone who recognizes the poem.

Joseph and Julie Otero are strangled in their home at 803 N. Edgemoor along with two of their children, Josephine, 11, and Joseph II, 9. The family car is found later at the Dilons store a Central and Oliver.

April 4, 1974

Kathryn Bright, 21, is found stabbed to death in her home at 3217 E. 13th St. Police later conclude she was a BTK victim.

October 1974

The Wichita Eagle-Beacon receives a letter from a person claiming to have killed the Oteros. The letter included details of the crime scene that only the killer could have known.

March 17, 1977

Shirley Vian, 24, is found tied up and strangled in her house at 1311 S. Hydraulic.

Dec. 8, 1977

Nancy Fox, 25, is found tied up and strangled in her home at 843 S. Pershing. BTK's voice is captured on tape when he calls a dispatcher to report the homicide.

Jan. 31, 1978

A poem written with a child's printing set on an index card arrives at The Wichita Eagle-Beacon. The poem, which is patterned after a "Curley Locks" nursery rhyme, refers to the Vian homicide.

Feb. 10, 1978

A letter from BTK arrives at KAKE claiming responsibility for the deaths of Vian and Fox, as well as another unnamed victim. At a hastily arranged news conference, Police Chief Richard LaMunyon announces that a serial killer is at large and has threatened to strike again.

April 28, 1979

The killer waits inside a home in the 600 block of South Pinecrest but leaves before the 63-year-old woman homeowner returns. He later sends the woman a letter letting her know he was there. Police think the killer was targeting the woman's daughter.

Aug. 15, 1979

Wichitans listen to repeated radio and television broadcasts of voice of the BTK strangler from the 1977 phone call. Police receive 110 tips during the first day the broadcasts air.

Mid-1980s

A new BTK investigation is opened by a group known as "The Ghostbusters," who spend three years employing new techniques including DNA testing, computer database searches and psychological profiles.

Sept. 16, 1986

Vicki Wegerle, 28, is strangled in her home at 2404 W. 13th St. The family car is found two blocks away in the 1300 block of North Edwards.

January 1988

The wife of murder victim Phillip Fager receives a letter from a man claiming to be BTK. The letter talked about the killing of Fager and his two daughters, but BTK experts disagree whether actually was from BTK.

March 19, 2004

A letter arrives at The Wichita Eagle containing a photocopy of Wegerle's driver's license and three pictures that apparently were taken by the killer. Relatives say the license was the only thing missing from Wegerle's home.

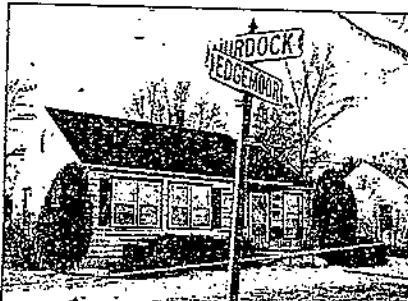

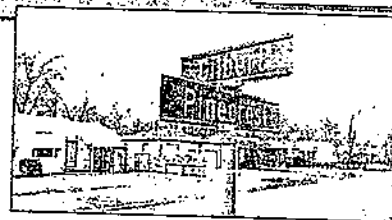

Eight victims have been connected to BTK. They are:

■ Joseph Otero Jr., 38, a retired Air Force mechanic; his wife, Julie Otero, 34, a Coleman Co. employee; and two of their children, Josephine, 11, and Joseph II, 8. They were found murdered in their home at 808 N. Edgemoor on Jan. 15, 1974. Three other family members — Charles, 15; Darryl, 15, and Carmen, 13 — were not at the home during the murders. Joseph Otero was a native of Puerto Rico. He had been a mechanic and flight instructor at Cook Air Field in Rose Hill. The family had moved to Wichita the fall before the murders.

■ Kathryn Bright, 21, was found stabbed to death in her home at 3217 E. 13th St. on April 4, 1974. Her brother, Kevin, was shot by the intruder during the slaying but survived. She was a member of the Valley Center Class of 1971, went to the University of Kansas for a semester, then returned to Wichita, where she got a job at Coleman. She had lived at the house on 13th Street for less than a year.

■ Shirley Vian, 24, was found dead in her home at 1311 S. Hydraulic on March 17, 1977. Vian had three children who were in the home at the time of the murder.

Details: Between January 15, 1974 and September 16, 1986, a serial killer, who dubbed himself BTK (Bind, Torture, Kill), committed eight murders in the City of Wichita, Kansas. The investigation into these murders was conducted by the Wichita Police Department (WPD), Wichita, Kansas.

Letters on BTK put WSU on alert

■ Wichita State University receives four letters about BTK, prompting speculation but offering no apparent help in the case.

Four envelopes relating to the BTK case and postmarked from California were discovered by Wichita State University postal workers early Wednesday, touching off a buzz of speculation at the university and a flurry of police activity.

But police said the envelopes are not a significant development in the case.

Each one contained a photocopy of an Associated Press story about the BTK case that appeared in the Aug. 21 edition of the Los Angeles Times.

The mailer included a name and telephone number on the backs of the photocopies, and asked recipients to call the number.

But, when contacted by phone, the person whose name and number were written on the photocopies said he did not send them and had never heard of the case.

Police spokesman Janet Johnson wouldn't comment on the investigation into the envelopes, but said, "This is not a big deal."

the lead BTK investigator; Amy Geiszler-Jones, communications coordinator at WSU; the "BTK Strangler Editor" at The Eagle, and the "BTK Strangler Reporter" at KAKE-TV.

Landwehr and Geiszler-Jones were mentioned in the Associated Press story that appeared in the Times, which concerned a possible link between the killer and a folklore class once taught by a WSU professor.

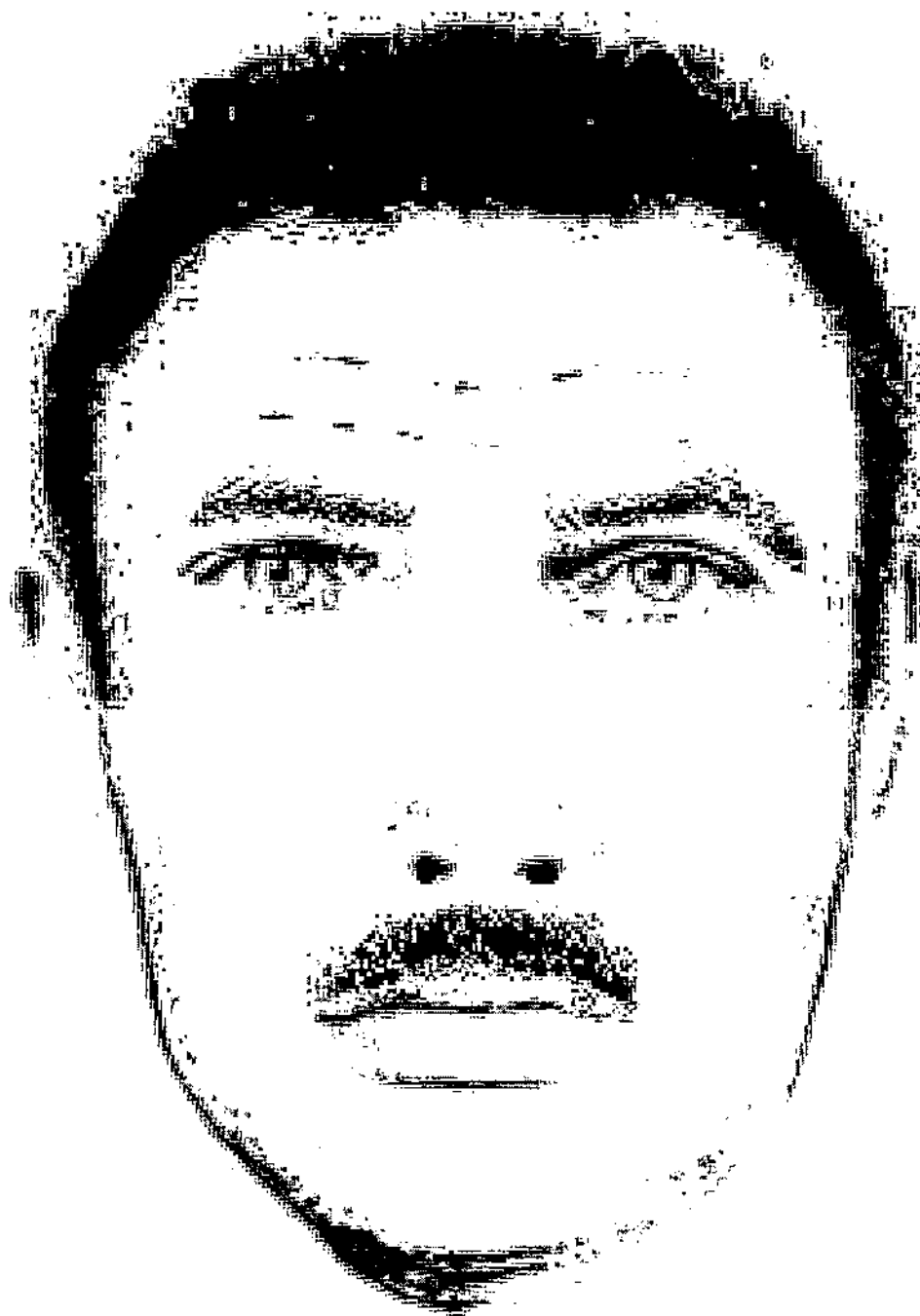

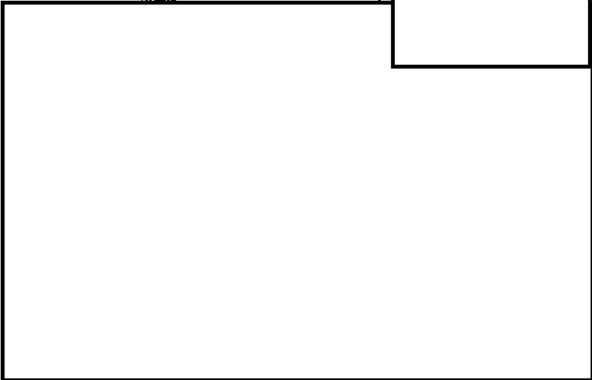

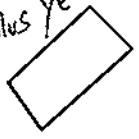

He answers his cell phone, "Homicide."
 A lecture hall filled with 100 students looks on.
 Wichita police Lt. Ken Landwehr pauses just a few seconds to talk quietly, then puts the phone away.

He resumes restlessly pacing the front of dimly lighted Room 211 in Hubbard Hall at Wichita State University.
 He delivers his lecture dressed in a crisp white shirt, tie and slacks. A gun and badge hang at his waist.
 By day, Landwehr directs perhaps the nation's best-known serial killer investigation — the hunt for BTK.

Each Tuesday night, he teaches a three-hour class titled Serial Killers. Landwehr tells his students he will not comment on BTK. He refers to it simply as "that case I can't talk about."
 He delivers his lecture in an even voice. He cracks several grim jokes, shaped by a career of investigating homicides.

"Wichita is a much easier hunting ground," he tells his students. "It's much easier to be anonymous. Whereas in Newton you go to a bar and everyone knows you. You don't want to be Norm. If you go into Cheers and you're gonna kill somebody, you don't want everybody

screaming your name."
 The class releases a few nervous laughs.
 He thinks it is the sexual deviance of many killers that catches the attention of the media.
 "Serial killers like Al Capone are just gangsters," he said. "They don't pique as much interest in the long run."
 He outlines, with the aid of PowerPoint, some of the challenges facing investigations, such as managing large amounts of information, media pressure and lack of experience.
 Investigators in the Midwest were not always prepared to handle such cases, he says.
 "In the early 1970s and even the 1980s it was difficult," he tells

his students. "We were not very aware of serial killers, especially in the Midwest. We didn't have a lot of that. A lot of places had a lack of experience with how to deal with it."
 Police may use strategies such as forming task forces, releasing information to the media and profiling, which he says was more prevalent in the 1980s and 1990s. But he dislikes when the media use profilers.
 "The experts talk about what the press knows," he says. "And they know very little of the information."
 He dismisses the class for a break.
 The class is filled with the curious and those aspiring to criminal justice careers. At the break, a long-haired woman rushes up to him, speaking about her passion to work in homicide.
 He has taught this course for five years, he says during the break. The re-emergence of BTK

this year didn't discourage him from doing so again.
 He also teaches classes on profiling and sex crimes at the university.
 Most nights, he teaches the course in Room 218, where the late professor P.J. Wyatt taught her American Folklore course in the spring of 1977. Landwehr announced a possible link between BTK and "Oh, Death," a poem used in Wyatt's course, in a news conference Aug. 20.
 Landwehr was a WSU student when the Otero murders took place in 1974. He was assigned to work full time on the case in 1984 and has investigated it ever since.
 He used to focus a lecture on the BTK case, but stopped doing so two years ago.
 "I stopped because it's unsolved," he says. "I decided to take it out. I did one lecture on it and showed a little of the crime scene."

After the break, he returns to his lecture.

There are five manners of death, he tells the students: natural, accidental, suicide, homicide and undetermined.

Seeing so much death can make you paranoid. He shares how he was worried at first after he and his wife adopted their son, James, because of sudden infant death syndrome, although it is rare.

"I was terrified that would happen to him," he says.

Then he returns to his lecture, and the content is grim. He spares his students nothing, including several graphic photos of decomposing bodies.

"If you're there, it's going to be disgusting," he says. "Trust me, I've been there."

Next he reviews the crime scene from the 1998 murder and sexual assault of Regina Gray, 28, in her home after she attended a catechism class. A very nice lady,

he says.

The first shots he flashes across the screen are of Gray's front and back doors.

What do you notice? he asks.

The front door is open, she let him in, they answer.

Then come the disturbing crime scene photos.

He lists several men who were suspects and details how her neighbor, Stanley Elms, was connected to the case.

DNA samples linked him. He

told his mother-in-law details only the killer would know, and chose a victim too close to his home, Landwehr says. He was one stupid guy.

Elms was convicted of Gray's murder.

"Remember Stanley. Remember Regina," Landwehr closes the class. "I'll see you next week."

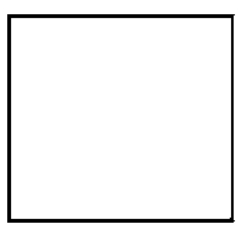

"Recently, the Wichita Police Department obtained another letter that could be connected to the BTK investigation. That letter was submitted to the Federal Bureau of Investigation on Monday, October 25, for authentication.

BTK has taken credit for eight unsolved homicides in Wichita from 1974 to 1986.

"Based on the information provided to us by the FBI, and the fake IDs and fake badge that were sent to KAKE by BTK, we think it is important to citizens to continue to practice personal and home crime prevention techniques."

In late June, police announced that FBI officials had confirmed that the KAKE and police letters were authentic BTK letters.

A third letter, left at the Wichita Public Library on July 17, has also been turned over to

FBI officials for investigation, police announced on July 22.

At that July 22 news conference, police Lt. Ken Landwehr also urged area residents to be vigilant in their efforts to prevent crime.

"Based on the information pro-

vided to us by the FBI, and the fake IDs and fake badge that were sent to KAKE by BTK, we think it is important to citizens to continue to practice personal and home crime prevention techniques. We want parents to teach these skills to their children also," Landwehr said.

Authorities think BTK would be in his 50s or 60s today.

KAKE and KWCH, Channel 12, reported Tuesday that the most recent letter was found at the Omni Center, a building at 250 N. Kansas, near Second and I-135, basing their reports on comments from employees at that center.

Staff: BTK likely used UPS drop

Workers at an office building just east of downtown say a suspicious package that may be from the Wichita serial killer BTK has given them an eerie feeling this week.

They say the package was found in a UPS drop box Friday night outside their office complex, the Omni Center, at 250 N. Kansas.

Police announced Tuesday that they "recently" obtained a letter possibly connected to the BTK investigation, and that it had been sent Monday to the FBI for verification.

Through a series of letters, poems and other mailed material dating back to the 1970s, BTK has claimed responsibility for killing at least eight Wichitans from 1974 to 1986.

Although police have not said where or when the latest letter was found, Omni Center workers

said Wednesday that Wichita police Detective Kelly Otis, a BTK investigator, met with them Saturday.

Chris Wood, who works at the Omni Center, said Otis did not say the visit was linked to the BTK investigation, but did ask about a package found in a drop box there.

He also urged them to look out for a suspect in his 50s or 60s with gray hair and a medium build, Wood said.

Police have used similar wording to describe BTK, who resurfaced in March after a 25-year silence by mailing a letter to The Wichita Eagle. Since then, police have investigated possible BTK letters sent to KAKE, Channel 10, and the Wichita police and another

er found at the Wichita Public Library's downtown location.

The Omni Center has drop-off boxes outside for the U.S. Postal Service, FedEx and UPS.

A FedEx spokesman at its corporate headquarters in Memphis said he could confirm his company's drop box was not involved in the incident.

Bob Godlewski, spokesman for UPS at its Atlanta headquarters, declined to elaborate, but said, "We are cooperating with author-

ities in the investigation."

Wood speculated that the drop-box location was chosen because it is in a secluded area, with I-135 just a block away.

"On one hand, it's cool that it's BTK because I'm interested in the investigation," he said, "but then it's also creepy because I only live three minutes away."

An office receptionist, requesting anonymity, said she has taken numerous calls from local media and employees there about the matter. She said she understood the package was a plain manila envelope with pictures and names inside.

Past communication from BTK has included photographs, poetry, essays, photocopies of identification cards and other items.

Courtney Troyer, an employee who lives nearby, was working Friday evening when the suspi-

cious package was reportedly discovered.

She, like many others inside, were unaware of its possible connection to the BTK investigation until the police announcement Tuesday.

Because most of BTK's victims were female, Troyer said the reported incident has made her extra cautious.

"When I go home, I look behind the door, under the bed and turn on every light," she said. "I won't be going out on late nights by myself."

BTK sent a poem to the local newspaper indicating he killed Vian and a poem for Fox would be sent later. The poem was not recognized as anything but a potential classified advertisement for Valentine's Day and the police were not notified.

Subsequently, BTK sent another typewritten copy of a letter, a copy of a poem for Fox, and a copy of a sketch of the Fox homicide scene to a local television station.

The police obtained the poem for Vian from the newspaper. The new letter described, in detail, the deaths of the Oteros, Vian, and Fox. It noted another victim killed and challenged the police to identify the other killing. The letter also described how the next victim would be found.

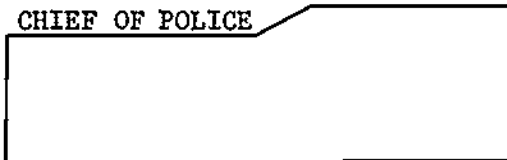




The submitted evidence was searched through the appropriate sections of the Anonymous Letter File without effecting an identification. Copies have been added thereto.

The typewriting on specimens Qc21 and Qc24 resembles IBM, Underwood; Remington and Smith Corona styles of type. Because of the poor quality photocopies as well as changes in size due to the photocopy process, a determination as to the exact size of the typewriting on specimens Qc21 and Qc24 was not made. The typewriting on specimens Qc21 and Qc24 is of a different style than the typewriting on a letter captioned "OTERO CASE" submitted previously and designated Specimen Q5. Because of the indistinct nature of the photocopies, a determination was not reached whether specimens Qc21, Qc24 and specimens Qc18 and Qc19 were or were not prepared using the same typewriter. Specimens Qc21 and Qc24 contain a watermark: "Hammermill Bond Made in USA." This is a product of Hammermill Paper Company 1540 E. Lake Road ^{hand printed} PO. Box 1440 Erie, Pennsylvania 16533 (Telephone 814-456-8811).

The block-styled notation "POST" on specimen Q5, submitted previously, was compared with the hand printed block-styled letter formations on specimens Qc20 and Qc23. Because of the limited nature of the hand printing on Q5, a determination was not reached whether these entries were or were not prepared by the same person.

Specimens Qc21, Qc22, Qc24 and Qc25 were prepared using a photocopier utilizing plain bond paper (uncoated). Photocopiers manufactured by IBM and Xerox use this process. Characteristics observed indicate that specimens Qc24 and Qc25 (615 S. Pinecrest) were prepared before specimens Qc21 and Qc22. (KAKE TV). Because of the absence of specific markings as well as a determination was not reached as to the particular make of photocopier used to prepare specimens Qc21, Qc22, Qc24 and Qc25.

The stamps affixed to the envelopes designated Q20 and Q23 were removed from a roll or "coil" of stamps.

The postmarks on specimens Q20 and Q23 contain the date "June 14, 1979." However, a determination was not made whether the same postal machine was used to prepare these impressions.

No indented writings of value were noted on the submitted items.

Specimens Q20 through Q25 have been photographed. You will be advised separately of the results of the requested fingerprint examination and the disposition of the evidence.

Document The submitted items could not be associated with any materials maintained in the FBI's Letter File. The Q26 envelope was manufactured by Congress Paper Corporation, 110 East 149th Street, Bronx, New York, 10451, telephone 212-665-5000. The Q26 material is carbonized.

The Q27 and Q28 photocopies were produced utilizing a plain paper, dry toner, sheet fed process, but the specific manufacturer or model machine was not determined. A listing of photocopiers falling within search parameters for the Q27 and Q28 copies is included for your investigative interest.

Typewriting appearing on the Q29 envelope and depicted on the Q27 document corresponds most closely to Laboratory standards for an IBM, CSA, or DSG style having a horizontal spacing of 10 characters per inch. This style of type may have appeared on a brand of machine other than the three aforementioned, and may have originated on a single element or typebar machine. No differences were noted in the Q27 and Q29 type style, but they differ in style from typewriting submitted previously in this matter.

The evidence contained no indented writing of value in identifying its source or origin.

Serology

Specimens Q26 and Q29 were examined for the presence of blood; however, none was found.

A chemical test for a substance characteristically present in saliva was positive when performed on Q29. Grouping tests conducted on these stains failed to disclose the presence of any "ABH" blood group substances. The chemical test for saliva was negative when performed on Q26.

Microscopic Analysis

Textile fibers including black wool, brown cotton, and a red synthetic fiber have been removed from the tape on the Q26 envelope and preserved on a glass microscope slide for possible future comparison purposes.

Result of examination:

The submitted evidence was searched through the appropriate sections of the Anonymous Letter File without effecting an identification. Copies have been added thereto.

The typewriting on specimens Qc21 and Qc24 resembles IBM, Underwood, Remington and Smith Corona styles of type. Because of the poor quality photocopies as well as changes in size due to the photocopy process, a determination as to the exact size of the typewriting on specimens Qc21 and Qc24 was not made. The typewriting on specimens Qc21 and Qc24 is of a different style than the typewriting on a letter captioned "OTERO CASE," submitted previously and designated specimen Q5. Because of the indistinct nature of the photocopies, a determination was not reached whether specimens Qc21, Qc24 and specimens Qc18 and Qc19 were or were not prepared using the same typewriter.

Specimens Qc21 and Qc24 contain a watermark "Hammermill Bond Made in USA." This is a product of Hammermill Paper Company 1540 E. Lake Road, Post Office Box 1440, Erie, Pennsylvania 16533 (Telephone 814-456-8811).

The hand printed block-style notation "POST" on specimen Q5, submitted previously, was compared with the hand printed block-style letter formations on specimens Q20 and Q23. Because of the limited nature of the hand printing on Q5, a determination was not reached whether these entries were or were not prepared by the same person.

Specimens Qc21, Qc22, Qc24 and Qc25 were prepared using a photocopier utilizing plain bond paper (uncoated). Photocopies manufactured by IBM and Xerox use this process. Characteristics observed indicate that specimens Qc24 and Qc25 (615 S. Pinecrest) were prepared before specimens Qc21 and Qc22 (KAKE TV). Because of the absence of specific markings as well as cut edges, a determination was not reached as to the particular make photocopier used to prepare specimens Qc21, Qc22, Qc24 and Qc25.

The stamps affixed to the envelopes designated Q20 and Q23 were removed from a roll or "coil" of stamps.

The postmarks on specimens Q20 and Q23 contain the dates "June 14, 1979." However, a determination was not made whether the same postal machine was used to prepare these impressions.

No indented writings of value were noted on the submitted items.

Specimens Q20 through Qc25 have been photographed. You will be advised separately of the results of the requested fingerprint examination and the disposition of the evidence.
