With respect to the above, the Bureau, in Section 23E of the Manual of Instructions, sets forth the following instructions, in part, with respect to the aforementioned individuals:

"Each office is to maintain on a permanent basis an up-to-date list of potential suspects. When a new suspect is added, he should be assigned to a designated Agent who will be responsible for developing background information as quickly as possible. Such background information should include suspect's residence, place of employment, hours of employment, description of automobile and license number, photograph, handwriting specimens, identification record, and whereabouts as of the dates of pertinent bombings in the past. A reliable neighborhood source should be developed and an alternate Agent should be designated to assume responsibility for the suspect in the absence of the assigned Agent. If it is indicated that the suspect may personally handle explosives, the Latent Fingerprint Section should be requested to include him in the single fingerprint explosives file. The effectiveness of this file will depend upon the field offices' furnishing complete information from their files. This should include the names and aliases, as well as descriptions and arrest or FBI numbers of suspects."



As a result of the recent inspection within the Milwaukee Office, it was indicated individuals maintained on the Bombing Suspect List within the Milwaukee Division were not being handled in accordance with existing Bureau instructions. As set forth in Volume II, Section 23, Manual of Instructions, cases on individual subjects maintained on the Bombing Suspect List should be reopened at six-month periods, and current background information obtained. Photographs of these individuals are also to be maintained in the individual Bombing Suspect File. Review of instant file reflects this has been neglected in the past.

It is recommended instant matter be reopened although subject is in a fugitive status. Information regarding subject's status should be set forth on FD-398, and photograph obtained from the WISBOM File 98-879 of captioned subject and placed in instant file. Upon completion of the above, instant matter should be placed in a closed status subject to reopening at the end of a six-month period.

1) Criteria necessary to include an individual on the list of Potential Bombing Suspects must consist of:

- a. A known propensity for violence
- b. A potential for using explosives, as demonstrated by past activity or training

Each individual already on the list must be re-evaluated using the above criteria at the time of the six month verification of residence, employment, and auto description. Deletions of those not meeting the criteria are to be made at the time they are re-evaluated.

Additions to the Bombing Suspects list may be made only if a sound basis exists for the inclusion.

The Bureau advised that the list must be carefully tailored to the needs of each office.

2) When a Potential Bombing Suspect's background investigation is initiated, the first communication or memo in the file should clearly set forth the basis for the investigation.

3) On or before May 15, and November 15, of each year, beginning with this May, a communication must be submitted to FBIHQ advising of the number of Potential Bombing Suspects on the Milwaukee Division list, and the number of suspects currently under investigation.

4) The Potential Bombing Suspects list is for investigative use of the FBI only, and individuals included on this list are not to be identified outside this agency.



FBI Eyes Report on Armstrong

The FBI said Monday it would look into a report by an underground newspaper that one of three men still sought in the 1970 bombing of Sterling Hall at the University of Wisconsin—Madison has returned to the United States.

The Berkeley (Calif.) Barb recently published a story said to be based on an interview with Dwight Armstrong, 24, formerly of Madison.

The story, reprinted in Take Over, a Madison newspaper, said Armstrong had returned after hiding in Canada for nearly five years.

Armstrong's older brother, Karleton, is serving a 23 year sentence in the State Prison at Waupun on charges of second degree murder, arson and conspiracy in connection with the bombing, which killed a university researcher.



4 Charged in School Blast

Editor at Wisconsin Included

WASHINGTON (AP) — FBI agents today charged four young men, including an editor of a student newspaper, with sabotage, destruction of government property and conspiracy in connection with the Aug. 24 explosion at the University of Wisconsin math center.

Fugitive warrants against the four were issued after what FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover described as "a very extensive investigation."

A 33-YEAR-OLD physicist, Robert E. Fassnacht, was killed when the blast tore through the university's Sterling Hall at 3:42 a.m. Aug. 24.

Three other persons were injured.

Those charged included Karleton Lewis Armstrong, 22, and Dwight Alan Armstrong, 19, brothers. The Milwaukee Journal, in a copyrighted story published today described them as admirers of Cuban Prime Minister Fidel Castro.

Also charged were David Sylvan Fine, 18, student night editor of the Daily Cardinal, and Leo Frederick Burt, 22, a summer student at the university.

The FBI said the elder Armstrong brother had formerly attended the university and described his younger brother as a high school dropout.

Fine was identified by the FBI as a former staff member of the "Heterodoxical Voice," a publication of the Students for a Democratic Society at the University of Delaware. Fine was the only one of the four linked by the FBI to the SDS.

THE FBI announcement said that Sterling Hall "for several years has been the target for demonstration activity by radical groups led by the Students for a Democratic Society which protested it as a link of the University of Wisconsin with the federal government."

"The Students for a Democratic Society vowed to use all means at their disposal to force the Army Mathematics Research Center off the campus," the FBI said.

Hoover said he has ordered a nationwide hunt for the four. He said they should be considered armed and dangerous.

The FBI announcement made no mention of the group calling itself the "New Years Gang," which claimed responsibility for the bombing in a letter to the student newspaper.

4 indicted in college bombing

WASHINGTON — Four young men, one identified as a student editor, were charged by the FBI yesterday in connection with the Aug. 24 bombing of the Army Mathematics Research Center at the University of Wisconsin.

The four, object of a nationwide manhunt, were identified as Karleton (Karl) Lewis Armstrong, 22, a former student at the Madison, Wis., university; his brother, Dwight Alan Armstrong, 19, a high school dropout; Leo Frederick Burt, 22, a summer student at the university; and David Sylvan Fine, 18. All are white.

The FBI said Fine was employed as the student night editor of the Daily Cardinal, the university newspaper. It also identified him as a former staff member of "Heterodoxical Voice," a publication of the radical Students for a Democratic Society at the University of Delaware.

In Madison, Burt was said to have been a reporter on the Cardinal, the campus paper.

THE FOUR were charged

with sabotage, destruction of government property, and conspiracy in connection with the early morning blast in which a graduate student, Robert E. Fassnacht, 33, was killed and three persons were injured.

The Federal charges carry a maximum penalty of 10 years in prison and a \$10,000 fine. Any murder charges growing out of the explosion must be brought by state authorities, since murder is not a Federal crime.

The FBI announcement came late yesterday. Earlier in the day, the Milwaukee, Wis., Journal had reported that authorities were seeking two Madison brothers whom the newspaper described as admirers of Fidel Castro.

A UNIVERSITY building housing the mathematics research center was ripped apart at 3:42 a.m. Aug. 24 by an explosive that had been placed in a stolen Ford Econoline van parked at a basement loading dock.

The FBI noted that the building had been the target of demonstrations by radical groups for some time. It also

said that the SDS had "vowed to use all means at their disposal to force the Army Mathematics Research Center off the campus."

IN THIS connection, Defense Secretary Melvin R. Laird told a news conference yesterday that the government should look into the possibility of moving all Federal research—health and environmental, as well as defense—off campus.

If Federal research facilities are causing college administrators trouble, he said, "there are other locations where they can be built." Laird said independent research institutes such as the one at Stanford may be the answer.

Police let 4 bombing suspects go

MADISON, Wis. (UPI) — Four fugitives who are wanted for the Aug. 24 bombing at the University of Wisconsin were held by authorities for more than an hour short-

ly after the blast but were let go, it was learned yesterday. Reynold R. Abrahams, chief Dane County sheriff's deputy, said recent decisions by the U.S. Supreme Court led police to release the four men. They have since gone underground.


Named in Federal warrants charging sabotage, conspiracy and destruction of government property were two Madison brothers and two former staff members of the university student newspaper, the Daily Cardinal.

THE FBI identified the four as Karleton Lewis Armstrong, 22, a former UW student; his brother, Dwight Allen Armstrong, 19, a high school dropout; David Sylvan Fine, 18, a UW student from Wilmington, Del., and former night editor of the Cardinal; and Leo Frederick Burt, 22, a UW student and former writer for the newspaper.


Dane County authorities were expected to file murder charges. The blast, which destroyed the U.S. Army Mathematics Research Center and caused up to \$6 million damage, killed physicist Robert E. Fassacht, 33, father of three, and injured four other persons.

IN WASHINGTON, there were reports that at least two of the suspects, Fine and Burt, had made their way into Canada by means of "underground" aid. One Justice Department source said Washington was encouraging Wisconsin officials to press murder charges against the four in order to alleviate any extradition problems.

An FBI spokesman denied the report but did say mur-

der charges are generally grounds for extradition from all countries.

IN A NEW development, Sauk County Sheriff Ralph Hearn announced a warrant was being sought charging Karleton Armstrong with an abortive bombing attempt on an electric substation near Prairie Du Sac, Wis.

Hearn said he has "received positive identification of a fingerprint found on evidence recovered at the scene of the attempted bombing of a Wisconsin Power & Light Co. substation about midnight of Feb. 22 of this year as that of Karl L. Armstrong."

Employees of the company reported discovery of dynamite, wire, a battery and other items and said they saw an unknown person at

the substation.


THE MAT research center explosion came at 3:42 a.m. on Aug. 24. The FBI said two Dane County officers saw a "light-colored, late model Chevrolet Corvair" speeding from the explosion area and a bulletin was aired on police radio.

James Bray of the sheriff's department in adjacent Sauk County said two officers immediately set up an "observation post" on U.S. 12, a main highway between Madison and Baraboo.

At 6:06 a.m., Bray said, a car similar to that described in the bulletin was seen on U.S. 12. The Sauk County officers ran a license check, found the car was registered in Madison and stopped it.

Character checks were requested from Dane County at 6:19 a.m. on the occupants the Armstrongs, Fine and Burt. Bray said a report from Madison at 6:48 a.m. said only one had a prior record.

"The two officers continued to interview the men until about 7:30 a.m. and since there was no hold or wanted on these men at that time, they were released," Bray said.

Bombing Fugitives

Go Unrecognized

LITTLE FALLS, N.Y. (UPI) — Two fugitives sought in a fatal bombing at the University of Wisconsin fell into the hands of police for the second time yesterday and for the second time were released by authorities who failed to link their names with the case.

Police said two men carrying drivers licenses identifying them as Dwight Armstrong, 19, and David S. Fine, 18, were stopped here because their car had a faulty muffler.

They were questioned for about an hour and then let go by authorities who did not recognize their names.

IT WAS REPORTED earlier this week that police at a roadblock near Madison, Wis., stopped a car carrying Armstrong, his brother Karleton, 22, and two other men shortly after the Aug. 24 explosion but did not detain them when the brothers said they were on their way to a vacation area in upstate Wisconsin.

Little Falls Police said Dwight Armstrong and Fine told them they were on their way to visit "Leo Burt in Utica." Burt, 22, was the fourth suspect named by the FBI Wednesday.

It was not until four hours after Armstrong and Fine were released that Little Falls Police discovered they were wanted.

FEDERAL AUTHORITIES have said the fugitives may be headed for Canada. It is a drive of about two hours from the Little Falls — Utica area to the Thousand Islands Bridge leading to Canada above Watertown in northern New York.

A FBI spokesman in Utica said the FBI was "doing everything logically possible to try and locate these individuals in this area. It's a big search of a big area."

Although the four suspects were subjects of a nationwide hunt by the FBI, a spokesman at State Police headquarters in Albany said they had received no special alert.

THE SPOKESMAN said the usual procedure is for the FBI to mail flyers with names, photographs and details of a crime rather than to teletype information to local authorities.



For information of all offices, captioned six-story building housed the University of Wisconsin (UW) physics department as well as the Army Mathematics Research Center (AMRC), an unclassified Atomic Energy Commission facility. The building was bombed at 3:42 a.m. 8/24/70. The explosion was preceded by an anonymous telephone call by a male individual to the Madison Police Department at 3:37 a.m. advising a bomb was in the building. The blast and subsequent fire resulted in one death, several injuries and an estimated six million dollars damage to the building and contents. The explosive(s) utilized have not yet been positively identified, but were determined to have been a high-order type explosive such as dynamite, military or homemade-type explosive. The explosives were placed in a Ford Econoline van which was stolen three blocks from the building on 8/20/70. The blast and subsequent fire have virtually destroyed the entire building.

Sterling Hall for several years has been the target of demonstration activity by radical groups led by Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) which protested it as link of UW with Federal imperialist government. SDS vowed to use all means at their disposal to force AMRC off campus. The structure

previously suffered damage including several arson attempts. On 8/28/70 UW Board of Regents announced a \$100,000 reward for information leading to identity, arrest, and conviction of unknown subjects; requesting information be furnished to nearest FBI office. In view of seriousness of this case, and possibility this bombing could trigger similar tragic consequences elsewhere, it is imperative that early solution be made in this case. New Left extremists have previously announced their targets include Federal buildings, FBI offices, and other law enforcement facilities.

Each office will immediately contact all logical informants and sources for information which will assist in identifying unknown subjects. Within five days of the receipt of this communication, each office will advise Bureau and Milwaukee without fail as to the results of its check of informants. It is imperative that each office not merely poll its informants, but that each informant, when contacted, should also be furnished specific instructions to make necessary inquiries for the purpose of developing information of value. Information so developed should be immediately furnished the Bureau and Milwaukee.

You should insure that all personnel contacting informants realize most radical extremists of the New Left have a great deal of mobility and are known in radical circles and in many cases have been active in various sections of the U.S. For this reason, it is quite possible the unknown subjects may not have come from Wisconsin and may not have remained there after the bombing. For the same reason, it can be expected that the explosives utilized may have been purchased or stolen in another section of the country by the unknown subjects or on their behalf by others. Since the explosives used had to have been of tremendous quantity, each office through its informants and other sources should be alert for information as to the purchase or theft of a large quantity of explosives which may have been used in this case.

This is a major case investigation and you should insure the necessary manpower is assigned to develop the information requested and furnish a reply within period instructed.

4 suspects in bombing on FBI list

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The FBI placed four young men wanted in connection with a fatal bombing at the University of Wisconsin on its 10 most wanted list of fugitives yesterday.

FBI headquarters acted after two of them bluffed their way through police questioning at Little Falls, N.Y. The pair now may be in Canada.

It was the second time officers failed to recognize the wanted men. Police stopped a car carrying all four at a roadblock Aug. 24, two hours after the explosion that wrecked the Wisconsin Army Mathematics Research Center, but let them go when they said they were on their way to a summer resort.

THE TWO STOPPED in Little Falls Thursday night were Karleton Armstrong, 22, and his brother Dwight, 19, both of Madison, Wis. The two other wanted men, David S. Fine, 18, Wilmington, Del., and Leo F. Burt, 22, Haverford, Pa., also were reported to have possibly fled to Canada.

The FBI put the men on the most-wanted list on the basis of Federal warrants issued in Madison Sept. 2 charging them with sabotage, destruction of government property and conspiracy.

All should be considered armed and dangerous, the FBI said.

Two Bombing Suspects Are in Canada

OTTAWA (UPI) — Two of the four suspects in the fatal bombing of a research laboratory at the University of Wisconsin reached Canada early this week. The other two were last seen heading for Canada, but their whereabouts were unknown to officials today.

A Canada-wide police alert has been issued for the four youths, who it now appears have slipped through the fingers of the police three times, together or in pairs, since the laboratory was bombed Aug. 4.

MOUNTED POLICE Inspector George Potts said that the Mounties have verified information that David S. Fine, 18, of Wilmington, Del., and Leo F. Burt, 22, of Darby, Pa., were in Peterborough, Ont., as recently as Wednesday.

The have disappeared since, and their present whereabouts are not known, he said.

The other two suspects, the brother's Karleton and Dwight Armstrong, 22, and 19, respectively, both of Madison, Wis., were stopped Thursday night by police in Little Falls, N.Y., but due to a combination of errors were not held.

They left Little Falls on a westbound highway that could have taken them to Canada in about two hours.

LITTLE FALLS police stopped the Armstrongs because the stolen car they were driving had a dragging muffler.

Dwight Armstrong identified himself by name and produced his driver's license as proof of identity. His companion gave Fine's name but was later identified from photographs as Karleton Armstrong. The two said they were going to Utica, N.Y., to visit Burt.

They were allowed to proceed because Little Falls police had not received federal fliers on them — they are now on the FBI's "most wanted" list — and the car was not recognized as stolen because of a computer operator's error.



Federal warrants issued at Madison, Wisconsin, on September 2, 1970, charge the four men with sabotage, destruction of Government property and conspiracy.

The four fugitives allegedly participated in the bombing of Sterling Hall, a six story building on the University of Wisconsin campus, on the early morning of August 24, 1970, with the blast and subsequent fire resulting in the death of a 33-year-old researcher,

Robert Fassnacht, plus several injuries and an estimated \$6 million damage to the building and its contents. The destroyed building housed the University's Physics Department as well as the Army Mathematics Research Center and equipment belonging to the Atomic Energy Commission. Explosives had been placed in a panel truck stolen three blocks from the building four days before the blast.

Sterling Hall for several years has been the target for demonstration activity by radical groups led by the Students for a Democratic Society which protested it as a link of the University of Wisconsin with the Federal government. The Students for a Democratic Society vowed to use all means at their disposal to force the Army Mathematics Research Center off the campus. The structure had previously suffered damage as a result of attacks on the building by demonstrators.

Karleton Lewis Armstrong, who was born on October 15, 1946, at Madison, Wisconsin, is a white American who formerly attended the University of Wisconsin, and has been employed in the past as a machinist--lathe operator, security guard, railroad switchman, and assembly line worker. He is 6'2" tall, weighs 185 pounds, has brown hair, brown eyes, a medium build and a medium complexion. He reportedly speaks Spanish, is a strict vegetarian and reportedly uses drugs. He has been known to have a beard and mustache, but may now be clean shaven.

Dwight Alan Armstrong is a white American who was reportedly born at Madison, Wisconsin, on August 29, 1951. A high school dropout, he has been employed as a chef, dishwasher, mechanic and railroad switchman. A Very Serious Business

MADISON, Wis.—I am sitting on the lawn in back of the University of Wisconsin's Student Union as I write this.

It's early afternoon and the sun is hot. But there is a cool breeze under the trees and it is very pleasant.

I have been sitting here, staring out at Lake Mendota for some time, trying to figure something out.

Despite the fact that the university is between semesters, there are hundreds of students all around the lakefront area.

Right now, several are swimming off the end of the dock. Two young guys are having a great time paddling their kayaks. Girls are sunbathing on the dock.

Half a dozen ducks are sitting calmly on the water near shore. A dog has just leaped into the water to retrieve a stick. Off in the distance, a motor boat speeds along, towing a water skier.

EVERYTHING is so calm, so placid, here.

But in other parts of town, the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the police are still tracking down leads in the bombing of the Army Mathematics Research Center.

Way out on the east end of town, on Mifflin St., the family of Robert E. Fassnacht, the 33-year-old physicist who was killed in the blast, is making preparation to bury him.

And somewhere, the people who stole the truck and loaded it with explosives are contemplating the reactions to the thing they have done.

They are in it for good now. The man who made the phone call to police and said, "Hey Pig, there's a bomb in the Math Research Center," is in it. So is the man who drove the truck and set the clock running for the explosives to go off. And so are the others who helped collect the explosives.

This isn't marching in the streets and shouting anti-war slogans. This

isn't rock throwing or thrashing. If they are caught, the charge will be conspiracy to commit murder. The fun and games are over.

That brings me back to the reason I have been sitting here at a picnic bench under a tree when I am being paid to work.

About an hour ago, the most remarkable thing happened. I had gone into Brown's Book Store on State St., just a few blocks off campus to buy a notebook.

While there, I studied the paperback book racks for some time, finally buying a copy of Richard Harris' "Justice," a contrasting study of the uses made of the Justice Department by Ramsey Clark and John N. Mitchell.

It is subtitled, "The Crisis on Law and Order in America."

AS I WALKED out of the store, I noticed a large crowd of students as well as older people gathered at the side of the building and reading a hand bill that had just been posted.

No doubt if had been taped to the wall during the time I was in the bookstore because there had been no crowd there at all before.

At the top of the handbill in large black letters it read: "WHY THE BOMBING?"

Under this was a large, high-quality photograph of the heavily damaged Army Math Center.

The accompanying text read: "We who understand and support the demolition of the Army Math Research Center must speak for ourselves because the official media have distorted the event beyond recognition.

"They do not tell you that this was not any mathematics research center solving any theoretical problems, but the Nation's only Army Math Research Center whose role is to solve military problems, to design triggers for others to pull.

"THEIR RESEARCH has killed literally thousands of innocent people and has developed instruments for the delivery of nuclear and chemical-biological bombs.

"These researchers shield their eyes from the fact that their work is used to keep the privileged ruling minorities in power around the world, and the press terms this self-imposed blindness 'neutrality.'

"The media does not tell you that the bombers defended human life, not only attacking an institution of organized murder but also by choosing the time of day and time of year when the building was least likely to be occupied—and then by phoning their warning to police 12 minutes before the actual explosion.

"The police made no attempt to call the walkie-talkie equipped guards in the Army Math Building.

"They do not tell you the history that led reasonable people to commit acts of force. For a full year an increasing number of students attempted to expose the real function of Army Math and to shut it down.

"At first they tried persuasion, distributing thousands of pamphlets describing the different ways that the research service the needs of the military. This led to a student demand for negotiations, but the university administration refused to negotiate.

"Then followed seven months of futile protest, ranging from non-violent marches last November to rock-throwing attacks this May. By ignoring reasoned argument and negotiation, the university's managers provoked rebellion.

"BY RESPONDING to rebellion with naked force they left those who disagreed with only one option—force in return. This is the background for the bombing of the Army Math Research Center, the story the news media never covered.

"They do not tell you the facts that would explain the bombing and then they claim that there isn't an explanation, that it was the act of a 'twisted mind.'

"But we are not lunatics and our actions are not wanton. We want to live and we want to be free and if the military suppresses life and freedom then we must suppress the military."

It was signed, "Life Above the Trees."

As I stood there writing down the words on the handbill, I could hear one young man who had a full beard say:

"A remarkable statement. They never once mention the fact that they killed a man who had never done anything to hurt them."

ANOTHER YOUNG man answered: "What about all the Viet Cong we've been murdering for years?"

Those were the only two people who spoke during the time I stood there.

I am left with several questions in my mind. First of all, who put the handbill on the wall knowing that he or she was risking instant arrest?

Second, can it be that the people who planted the bomb are actually proud of what they did?

I have been sitting here now for perhaps another 10 minutes searching for a way to conclude this piece, but it's hard to concentrate.

The thing that keeps going through my mind is the title to the first section in the Richard Harris book that I have just bought. It reads, "Something has gone terribly wrong with America."

Federal warrants issued at Madison, Wisconsin, on September 2, 1970, charge the four men with sabotage, destruction of Government property and conspiracy.

The four fugitives allegedly participated in the bombing of Sterling Hall, a six story building on the University of Wisconsin campus, on the early morning of August 24, 1970, with the blast and subsequent fire resulting in the death of a 33-year-old researcher, Robert Fassnacht, plus several injuries and an estimated \$6 million damage to the building and its contents. The destroyed building housed the University's Physics Department as well as the Army Mathematics Research Center and equipment belonging to the Atomic Energy Commission. Explosives had been placed in a panel truck stolen three blocks from the building four days before the blast.

Sterling Hall for several years has been the target for demonstration activity by radical groups led by the Students for a Democratic Society which protested it as a link of the University of Wisconsin with the Federal government. 

Pursuant to Bureau instructions set out in Manual of Rules and Regulations, Part II, 3E, Page 17, Paragraph (7), that the Ten Most Wanted Fugitives cases must be kept pending in all field offices, except Honolulu and San Juan until fugitive is located, Honolulu does not keep all Top Ten cases pending.

Pursuant to instructions of the SAC, all Top Ten Fugitive Program cases have been reviewed by the writer. It is recognized, with the exception of Honolulu and San Juan, Top Ten Fugitive cases must be kept pending in the other field offices.

Of the 15 individuals currently included in the Most Wanted Fugitives Program, 9 are b. way of background considered to be New Left affiliated or oriented. Each of the four major Islands in the State of Hawaii have areas, particularly hippie type communes, in which fugitives of the New Left type can possibly be absorbed without detection. Although Honolulu has no information indicating any of the Most Wanted Fugitives are in Hawaii, it is felt such a possibility cannot be ignored in view of the relatively large concentration and influx of transient types.

In an effort to get these cases underway, each SA to whom case is assigned should insure sufficient copies of the Identification Order (IO) are being maintained in the Honolulu Office. If not, IOs should be ordered through the Chief Clerk. The Chief Clerk will coordinate the submission of necessary orders for additional copies of IOs.

Through the cooperation of road trip Agents, a determination should be made as to how many IOs would be needed to disseminate to officers covering hippie commune areas to insure each officer having a personal copy, if desired. The senior road trip Agent on each Island will coordinate this aspect.

The files should be thoroughly reviewed to determine if there is any information or background which would give basis for independent, self-initiated investigation here in Hawaii. If so, such investigation should be initiated without delay.

All incoming serials should be reviewed to insure the information contained therein does not alter or change the direction your investigation is taking. If so, appropriate adjustments should be made.

At the outset all SAs should insure local credit, criminal, DMV and Drivers License records are checked on subject's true name and all known aliases. During review of the case file SAs should insure all pertinent names and items have been indexed.

While the SAC is permitting above leads to be exempted from the usual fugitive deadline rules due to our geographical dispersal, nevertheless, pertinent developments should be brought to the SAC's attention without delay and developments requiring close attention or additional investigation should be so handled.

The above instructions are by no means all-inclusive but merely the minimal steps which should be taken. Only your imagination and initiative can limit the extent to which these cases can be exploited.



On August 24, 1970, Sterling Hall on University of Wisconsin (UW) campus, Madison, Wisconsin, was destroyed by bomb explosion, killing one occupant, injuring others and severely damaging surrounding buildings. Bombing target was Army Mathematics Research Center housed in Sterling Hall.

[redacted], Dwight Alan Armstrong, [redacted], were identified as being responsible for bombing in federal complaint filed September 2, 1970. On September 30, 1970, Grand Jury indictment returned at Madison, and warrants issued, charging men with Destruction of Government Property, violation of Civil Rights, and Illegal Possession and Use of Destructive Device. Wisconsin State murder warrants issued against the four subjects, August 31, 1971. UW Board of Regents raised \$100,000 in reward money for apprehension and conviction of fugitives, at request of FBI.

Armstrong brothers were Madison residents and UW hangers-on. [redacted] was [redacted] from [redacted], a [redacted] enthusiast and [redacted] for UW newspaper. [redacted] was [redacted] from [redacted] and also worked as [redacted]. [redacted] and [redacted] had orientation toward New Left extremism, and Armstrong brothers knowledgeable re explosives and in contact with criminal element through [redacted], in [redacted].

After bombing, all four fugitives fled to New York City, where contact made to family or friends for money. [redacted] observed [redacted] and [redacted], Peterborough, Ontario, August 30--September 3, 1970, when they disappeared, leaving behind false identification of Eugene Fieldston and Matthew James. Armstrongs stopped by upstate New York Police Department vehicle check, September 2, 1970, but mistake in inquiry resulted in failure to identify car they occupied as stolen earlier same day.



Dwight Alan Armstrong is a white American, born at Madison, Wisconsin, on August 29, 1951. A high school dropout who reportedly uses drugs, he is 6'3" tall, weighs 160 pounds, has a slender build, medium complexion, brown eyes and light brown hair which may be dyed.

The four accused men allegedly participated in the bombing of Sterling Hall, a six story building on the University of Wisconsin campus, on the early morning of August 24, 1970, with the blast and subsequent fire resulting in the death of a 33-year-old researcher plus several injuries and an estimated \$3 million damage to the building and its contents. The damaged building housed the University's Physics Department as well as the Army Mathematics Research Center and equipment belonging to the Atomic Energy Commission. Explosives had been placed in a panel truck stolen three blocks from the building four days before the blast.

Sterling Hall was the target for several years of demonstration activity by radical groups led by the Students for a Democratic Society which protested it as a link of the University of Wisconsin with the Federal government. The Students for a Democratic Society vowed to use all means at their disposal to force the Army Mathematics Research Center off the campus and the structure had previously suffered damage as a result of attacks on the building by demonstrators.

Dwight Alan Armstrong is a white American who was born at Madison, Wisconsin, on August 29, 1951. A high school dropout, he has been employed as a chef, dishwasher, auto and airplane mechanic, and railroad switchman. He is 6'3" tall, weighs 160 pounds, has a slender build, medium complexion, brown eyes, and light brown hair which may be dyed and worn at medium length. He has bushy eyebrows, a scar on the web of his right

thumb, a space between his front teeth, and two distinct birthmarks or moles on his face. He has reportedly used drugs. Armstrong is said to walk with a slouch and has used Social Security Numbers 389-54-0343 and 389-54-3043.

Acquaintances describe Armstrong as an antagonistic individual who has difficulty getting along with others. He is reportedly a camping enthusiast and has had a student pilot's license.

Armstrong should be considered armed and dangerous. Anyone with information concerning him is requested to immediately notify the nearest office of the FBI, the telephone number of which may be found on the first page of local telephone directories.

TEN MOST WANTED FUGITIVES PROGRAM

Reference is made to SAC letter 71-7 (G) dated 2/16/71 and Bureau airtels to Albany, copies to all other offices, dated 1/21/72 and 5/10/72, respectively, each captioned as above.

One of the most important responsibilities in a complicated and intensive fugitive investigation is a complete follow-through in the location and probative interview of all logical relatives and associates of a fugitive. Though tedious, it is recognized that the fulfillment of this responsibility has accounted for or formed the basis for the apprehension of a great majority of the Bureau's fugitives and, therefore, is the foundation of any fugitive investigation.

Referenced Bureau airtel dated 5/10/72 notes the importance of each office carefully scrutinizing each fugitive's life for possible leads. In your continuing review of these important fugitive cases, close attention must be given to the complete identification of each subject's relatives and prior associates. It is usually from this great reservoir of individuals that information is developed leading to the development of informants and/or the fugitive's apprehension. These individuals must continue to be subject of penetrative interviews and imaginative investigation.

While the identities and locations of most relatives of a fugitive are usually readily available through interviews of close family members, the identification of prior associates is a much harder and broader task. In this regard, you should insure that all available records, such as high school, church, organization, arrest, parole, pre-sentence reports, et al., where applicable, have been exhaustively reviewed to develop additional associates and other

important information regarding each of these fugitives. These individuals should be located and thoroughly interviewed for additional information, the identities of other associates, and their informant potential assessed. In many instances, a prior associate or relative may not know of the subject's whereabouts; however, such an individual may have informant potential and may be targeted against someone who is either uncooperative or suspected of withholding valuable information. No interview of a prior associate or relative should be concluded on the basis that the fugitive's whereabouts is unknown. To the contrary, each interview should be probative and cover all logical areas which may assist in locating each fugitive.

During the interviews of these and other individuals, be ever alert in recognizing latent motives for their cooperation. In this regard, financial inducement should be considered where appropriate.

The respective office of origin of these cases should insure all logical relatives and prior associates are interviewed in line with the observations set forth above. Leads received by each field office must continue to be promptly and meticulously covered. Emphasis must be placed on the interviews of these persons and each field office should initiate action, including a review of its files, in order to effect a complete follow-through in this regard.

It is imperative that instructions set forth above and in referenced communications receive your constant attention and are fully implemented. The content of these communications should be understood by supervisory and investigative personnel so that there is full recognition that investigation conducted by each office is expected to precipitate positive results. These fugitives are the most wanted fugitives in the FBI and must be given the highest priority and receive your personal attention.





But, the bombs failed to detonate." A security officer at Baraboo Ordnance Depot, Baraboo, Wisconsin, advised a single-engine aircraft was observed without lights, made two passes at the depot at approximately 500 feet on the early morning of 1/1/70. The commander of the above depot has advised no bombs have been found, and they are continuing the search today.

Our Milwaukee Division is investigating this matter, and the bombings on the University Of Wisconsin campus, at the Reserve Officers Training building, and the vandalism at the Army Reserve Center and the Selective Service Board. This matter is being closely followed.

ReMITel 1/5/70 concerning captioned matter.

The information contained in referenced teletype would indicate that the stolen Cessna aircraft was the same aircraft sighted over the Baraboo Ordinance Depot 1/1/70.

Milwaukee should promptly determine whether any latent fingerprints were developed on this aircraft after its recovery on 1/1/70. If so, such should be expeditiously submitted to the Identification Division for comparison with the fingerprints of any New Left or antiwar activists from the Madison, Wisconsin, area who could possibly be considered suspects in this matter.

In connection with the above, if bombs are in fact located by the search being conducted at the Baraboo Ordinance Depot, such should be carefully examined for any latent fingerprints for submission to the Identification Division.

Milwaukee should contact the Federal Aviation Administration for its assistance in an effort to identify any "activists" from the Madison, Wisconsin, area who may hold a private pilot's license and be responsible for the theft of the Cessna aircraft mentioned above.

Sufficient investigation should be conducted by Milwaukee in order that complete details may be promptly made available to the Department to determine if a violation of the sabotage statute exists. You should be guided by those instructions contained in Section 86, Manual of Instructions, relating to sabotage and furnish the Bureau a communication suitable for dissemination in accordance with the above Bureau deadline.

In view of the other acts of violence which have occurred in the Madison, Wisconsin, area between 12/28/69 and 1/4/70, you should continue to be alert for evidence of a conspiracy directed against the military and Selective Service. The fact that the underground newspaper "Kaleidoscope" has reported this matter and has also expressed a knowledge of the other acts of violence in the Madison area would indicate such conspiracy and you should continue to locate and interview members of this staff as soon as possible.

NOTE:

Underground publication at Madison, Wisconsin, alleges bombs were dropped from a stolen airplane on Army ordinance plant, Baraboo, Wisconsin. Investigation indicates aircraft without lights was sighted over ammunition depot 1/1/70, but no bombs have been found. Investigation was initiated by Milwaukee and that office has been instructed to conduct sufficient investigation to determine whether sabotage violation has occurred and whether act is part of conspiracy against Selective Service and military.

The Badger Army Ammunition Plant (BAAP) is located approximately 10 miles southwest of Baraboo, Wisconsin on U.S. Highway 12. This plant manufactures gun powder and is operated under contract by the Olin Mathison Chemical Company for the U.S. Army. Security of the plant is handled by the Department of the Army.

At about 5:09 PM on January 2, 1970 a person identifying himself as [redacted] for the "Daily Cardinal", the student newspaper at the University of Wisconsin (UW), Madison, Wisconsin, telephonically contacted BAAP and advised Lt. [redacted] Military Security Division, that he had heard a rumor that two days ago a bomb had been "thrown" at the plant. [redacted] requested background information concerning the bomb blast. [redacted] advised that there was no such information concerning such a bomb. [redacted] then stated that possibly the bomb had not yet gone off. [redacted] refused to discuss the matter further with [redacted]. The security force was alerted to look for possible bomb devices but none were located until January 7, 1970.

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Inquiry at the "Daily Cardinal" and Madison Newspapers, Inc., publishers of the "Wisconsin State Journal" and "The Capitol Times", on January 2, 1970 failed to identify [redacted] as either a reporter or employee of either organization.

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This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

[redacted] was arrested by officers of the Protection and Security Division, UW, on [redacted] and charged with disorderly conduct. [redacted]

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[redacted]
A search of the building failed to locate any explosive device.

A National Crime Information Center check identified [redacted] as an FBI fugitive. [redacted] is charged with violation of Section 462, Title 50 Appendix, U.S. Code, in that he failed to appear for induction. A warrant was issued at Rockford, Illinois on [redacted]. [redacted] was released on \$1,000 bond, pending preliminary hearing on Federal charge. He was also released on \$207 bond on the disorderly conduct charge. [redacted] admits to FBI Agents making the telephone call to the BAAP on January 2, 1970. He declines to furnish any additional information upon advice of counsel.

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The January 4, 1970 issue of the Madison edition of the "Kaleidoscope", an underground newspaper, which went on sale on January 5, 1970, carried a front page article reporting the bombing incidents at facilities housing the Army ROTC Offices and classrooms on the UW Campus on December 28, 1969 and January 3, 1970. The article also described in some detail the entry into and the vandalism committed at the U.S. Army Reserve Center on January 1, 1970. Also the article reported the theft of a Cessna 150 airplane from Morey's Air Field, Middleton, Wisconsin, on New Year's Eve. The article reported that the plane was used to fly over BAAP and dropped bombs which failed to detonate.

On January 5, 1970 the Dane County Sheriff's Department advised that they were investigating the theft of a Cessna 150 Aircraft from Morey's, which was recovered at the Sauk-Prairie Airport in Sauk City, Wisconsin on January 1, 1970. The plane was processed by the Sauk County Sheriff's Department and two latent prints were developed on the control wheel. The lifts were turned over to FBI Agents.

RE: BOMBING OF BAAP

A crime scene search at the point of recovery of the plane on January 1, 1970 noted that two sets of footprints led from the abandoned aircraft and crossed a field and went through a line of trees to a barn area housing horses. This barn is located approximately 300 to 400 yards west of the rural single air strip of the Sauk-Prairie Airport. This air strip is not equipped with runway lights. No photographs or casts were taken of the prints as they were 90 percent covered by newly fallen snow. Neighborhood investigation at the point of recovery was negative.

A security officer at BAAP stated that he observed a single engine plane flying low over the plant at about 2:13 AM on January 1, 1970. He stated that this plane did not have on its running lights.

Theft of instant aircraft was discovered by an employee of Morey's at 8:30 AM on January 1, 1970. Recovery and location of the plane was telephonically received by Field P. Morey at 9:30 AM on January 1, 1970. The aircraft was stolen from a storage hangar. Entry into the hangar was made by prying the outside hinges from a small entry door in the hangar doors on the east side of the building. The aircraft was parked near the west doors with the keys in the ignition.

Interview conducted by FBI Agents determined that the aircraft was stored with a full tank of gas at approximately 5:30 PM on December 31, 1969. Field Morey was the last person to leave the air field after making a security check at 6:30 PM. When the plane was returned, it was filled with gas and it was determined through the consumption of 11 gallons of gas that the unknown subjects possibly had the plane for one and one-half hours. Instant plane belongs to Morey Aircraft Company and is used for flight instructions.

Lists of licensed pilots have been obtained from the Morey Aircraft Company, UW Flying Club, Frickelton School of Aeronautics and the Four Lakes Aviation Corporation, all in the Madison area.

RE: BOMBING OF BAAP

On January 6, 1970 a search of the BAAP grounds located pieces of glass and metal tops in two separate areas. The glass fragments and metal tops appeared to be from gallon sized, wide-mouth jars, similar to the type used by restaurants in storing mayonaise and pickles. It also appears to be similar in type to the jars recovered at the bombing site of the T-16 building on the UW Campus on December 28, 1969. The one such device was found between buildings in the acid area in the north part of the plant and the second one near a laundry building in the south area of the plant.

There was no damage to any plant facilities. Soil and liquid specimens have been submitted to the FBI Laboratory in Washington, D.C. in attempt to identify the possible explosive substance. Upon receipt of the results of such examination, the remaining physical evidence will be submitted for examination.

Interviews are continuing to possibly identify unknown subjects in the theft of instant Cessna aircraft.

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

In the matter of the fire bombs of the ROTC facilities on the University of Wisconsin (UW) campus, Madison, Wisconsin, glass fragments were recovered by the Wisconsin Fire Marshal's office. These fragments, along with fragments recovered from the bombing of the Primate Laboratory, UW, on 1/4/70, which is located across the street from the Wisconsin State Selective Service Headquarters, 1220 Capitol Court, Madison, were examined at the Wisconsin State Crime Laboratory, Madison. This laboratory was unable to identify the type of substances used to ignite such fires, although they advised that they could not locate any traces of any petroleum based products. No latent prints were developed on these fragments. It is believed that similar type material was used in the devices dropped at the BAAP on 1/1/70. Results of FBI Laboratory examination may result in the solution of all cases mentioned.

He described [redacted] as an individual who had become very frustrated over the years and who now was "an extremely young man." He has no direct information connecting [redacted] with any destructive acts. [redacted] has requested that his identity not be divulged due to the nature of his relationship with [redacted].

[redacted] of the [redacted] Wisconsin, volunteered on 1/6/70 that on 1/5/70 he had the occasion to talk with [redacted] a SDS activist now residing in the [redacted] area. [redacted] overheard a conversation between [redacted] (LNU) from [redacted] with [redacted], wherein [redacted] said that [redacted] from [redacted] was involved in the anti-military - anti-draft activities on the UW campus and in the Madison area perpetrated during the last part of December, 1969, and the first part of January, 1970.

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[redacted] said on 1/7/70 that she talked with an individual whose name she believes is [redacted]. [redacted] is known around the UW, Madison, as [redacted] since he [redacted] [redacted] to UW fraternity and sorority houses. [redacted] said that he was formerly connected with SDS, and he recently [redacted]. [redacted] further stated that his friends were probably responsible for the recent wave of terrorism in Madison directed against ROTC and the Selective Service System. He also said [redacted]

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[redacted] said she has received no further information concerning this case as all of the SDS members she has contacted are all "up tight" and not talking.

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[redacted] said she doubted the reliability of [redacted] statements to her, and she thought he was trying to impress her.

[redacted] former [redacted] currently a [redacted] advised on 1/9/70 that on 1/8/70 the UW SDS Chapter met on the UW campus. About 170 attended. SDS leaders, who spoke, indicated that SDS has no knowledge or control of the Madison terrorist activities. The chapter then voted to support the ROTC fire bombings as they felt that this represents an "increased level of struggle." [redacted] said that he believes in his talks with staff members of "Kaleidoscope," supra, that the staff has guilty knowledge of this case.

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A [redacted] using [redacted] [redacted] volunteered on 1/14/70 that he met a [redacted] on one or two occasions at the UW. [redacted] is the boyfriend of an individual known as [redacted] a UW SDS activist [redacted]. [redacted] said he could not pin down any specific statements made by [redacted] and further at no time did he recall [redacted] admitting taking part in the activities. b6 b7C

Latent prints were developed on one of the control wheels. Numerous persons with flying licenses were interviewed with negative results. 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A. PREDICATION

Investigation is predicated upon information furnished by [redacted] Security Officer, Badger Army Ammunition Plant (BAAP), Baraboo, Wisconsin, to Special Agent [redacted] Madison, Wisconsin, on January 2, 1970, as follows:

Lieutenant [redacted] Military Security Division, BAAP, received a phone call on January 2, 1970, from a person identifying himself as [redacted] for "The Daily Cardinal," a University of Wisconsin (UW), Madison, Wisconsin, student newspaper. [redacted] stated he had heard rumors that two days ago a bomb had been thrown at the plant. [redacted] requested background on the bomb blast. [redacted] advised that he had no information concerning such a bomb. [redacted] responded that possibly the bomb had not yet gone off. [redacted] refused to discuss the matter further with [redacted] and reported the call to [redacted].

[redacted] further advised that no bomb throwing incident(s) have been reported by any security guard and no explosion(s) had taken place at the plant. In view of the call, guard patrols have been alerted to such a possibility of a throwing incident or the firing of any undetonated device.

[redacted] residence [redacted] "The Daily Cardinal," Wisconsin, advised Special Agent [redacted] on January 3, 1970, that the Cardinal does not have now or formerly had a reporter on the staff named [redacted] [redacted] advised that the name was unfamiliar to him as a person involved in journalism in the Madison area.

[redacted] residence [redacted] Wisconsin, [redacted] of the "Wisconsin State Journal" and [redacted] of the Madison Newspapers, Inc., publishers of Madison's two daily newspapers, the Journal and the "Capital Times," advised that [redacted] is not now or formerly was a reporter for either paper. The name [redacted] was not familiar to [redacted] as an individual involved in the publication of any newspapers in and around the Madison area.

The Madison edition of "Kaleidoscope," described as an underground newspaper, in its January 4, 1970, issue which went on sale on January 5, 1970, in an article entitled "Radical Saboteurs Talk With Madison's Kaleidoscope - Move Against Targets On and Off Campus: Army, SS Are Hit - ROTC Bombed." The article stated that [redacted] of Madison "Kaleidoscope" staff was contacted on January 1, 1970, by a spokesman of the activist group who claims they had stolen an airplane from a local airfield and flown it up to Baraboo, Wisconsin, and dropped three bombs on the Badger Ordnance Plant. The article continued that the bombs had failed to detonate. The spokesman said that the plane had not yet been reported missing and that they had hidden it at a secluded airfield. - b6 b7C

The newspaper article stated that the above facts were checked out over the last 24 hours and the following facts verified: that sometime after dark on New Years Eve a hanger had been broken into and a Cessna 150 stolen; the airplane was found the next morning standing undamaged on the Sauk City airstrip not far from Baraboo; theft was reported in a one-paragraph article tucked away in the back of the late evening edition of the "Capitol Times."

The article in the paper advised that the guard office in the munitions plant and local Baraboo newspaper denied any trouble of bombs. The newspaper speculated that if the bombs had been dropped they were found and the discovery was kept secret. It also speculated that the possibility existed that there were three small bombs which were dropped and they simply had not been found to date possibly due to the recent new snow fall and the large open spaces between buildings at the plant.

B. THEFT OF AIRCRAFT

Captain [redacted] Detective Bureau, Dane County Sheriff's Office, Madison, Wisconsin, on January 5, 1970, furnished a report of Detective [redacted] on case number 35530. The following was noted from a review of this report: b6 b7C

At approximately 9:30 AM on January 1, 1970, [redacted] of the Morey Aircraft Company, Airport Road, [redacted] b6 b7C

Middleton, Wisconsin, had advised that a Cessna 150, registration number 66203, was stolen from their storage hangar sometime after 12 PM, New Years Eve. The report shows that the hangar was entered on the east side by forcing a small service door open by grabbing the padlocked door on the exposed hinge side and forcing the wooden screws and nails out of their places. Exit was obtained by unhooking the two large tracked hangar doors on the west side and removing the stolen aircraft. A Cessna 172, owned by [redacted] was parked in front of the stolen aircraft and left out on the apron area of the hangar. The hangar doors were then closed and left unhooked.

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The airplane was reported recovered by [redacted] [redacted] Sauk-Prairie Airport, Prairie du Sac, Wisconsin. [redacted] reported that the aircraft was left abandoned parked in the middle of the north-south single airstrip. The plane was pointed to the south.

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Detective [redacted], Sauk County Sheriff's Office, Baraboo, Wisconsin, processed the plane and lifted two latent fingerprints from the left control wheel. From the point of where the plane was parked two sets of footprints were noted in the snow. These prints led easterly from the airplane to a horse barn 400 or 500 feet east of the airstrip. From the horse barn the tracks led to a service road that entered onto Sauk County Highway PF. Neighborhood investigation failed to develop any information concerning possible suspects.

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At the time that the aircraft was flown back to Morey Air Field, Middleton, a flight of approximately 15 minutes, Pilot [redacted], employee of Morey Aircraft, observed that the stolen aircraft's transmitter and receiver, which is normally set on channel 123.5, a flight training channel, was now turned to channel 121.5, which is the emergency transmitting channel. The report stated that [redacted] upon return to Morey Airfield, contacted the Lone Rock, Wisconsin, airport to determine if there was any recorded transmissions on the emergency channel from the stolen aircraft. No transmissions were recorded for this plane during the period of December 31, 1969, to January 1, 1970. Upon return to its home base, the plane was immediately serviced and found to have used approximately 9½ gallons (upon reinterview [redacted] advised that the plane took a total of 11½ gallons of gasoline). Based on consumption return of this aircraft, it is estimated that persons taking this plane flew approximately one and one half hours to one and three quarter hours.

The report pointed out that all planes stored in the Morey hangar are left there with the keys in the ignition.

An additional report of Detective [redacted] in instant matter dated January 2, 1970, concerned the development of a [redacted] age [redacted] as a possible suspect.

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[redacted] was interviewed at his place of employment by [redacted]

[redacted] Wisconsin. [redacted] stated that he is presently residing at [redacted]

[redacted] Wisconsin. He had spent New Years Eve and early New Years day in the company of his girl friend, [redacted]

[redacted] Wisconsin. [redacted] denied the theft of instant aircraft and pointed out that he has knowledge of flying, but does not have a private pilot's license.

Also developed as a possible suspect was a [redacted] [redacted] Wisconsin, who was a former [redacted] at the UW.

Date January 16, 1970

[redacted] Morey Airplane Company, furnished the following information:

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He worked all day at the airfield on December 31, 1969. He was the last one to leave that evening which was around 6:30 PM. Before leaving he checked all building doors and found them to be secure. At about 8:30 AM on January 1, 1970, he received a phone call from one of the pilots [redacted] advising that he had made a check of the airfield and had found the small port entry door located on the east hangar doors of the storage hangar broken from its hinges. [redacted] at that time had not determined if anything was missing but was requested to do so. [redacted] called back within five minutes and advised [redacted] that a company plane, a Cessna 150, Serial No. 15067420, Registration No. N6620S, blue and white in color, a 1968 model, was missing. [redacted] went to the airport after this report and had the theft and the breaking and entry reported to the Dane County Sheriff's Department. At about 9:30 PM, [redacted] received a telephone call from a [redacted] [redacted] of the Sauk Prairie Airport, Prairie Du Sac, Wisconsin, advising that [redacted] 1968 Cessna 150 was abandoned on [redacted] airstrip and was in good condition. After a detective from the Sheriff's Department arrived and made an initial investigation, [redacted] along with [redacted] and the officer flew to Prairie du Sac and recovered the airplane.

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When arriving at the Sauk Prairie Airport, the airplane had been pulled off from the runway and was taken to one of the nearby hangars. When examining the plane he noted that all switches were off and the plane had full flaps which were all normal for operation. [redacted] did observe that the UHF Radio was turned to the emergency frequency channel. This would allow for the receipt of all calls from the Madison, Wisconsin tower and the towers at Lone Rock and Baraboo, Wisconsin. The opposite would be true if any transmission had been made by the persons flying the airplane the previous evening. [redacted] also observed that

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the window in the left door, which is the pilot side, was loose as well as screws for the window latch being loosened. He also noticed that the pull strap on the door had been broken as if someone had pulled the door shut extra hard.

[redacted] evaluated the situation as to possible suspects in stealing the plane as an individual who probably had the minimum skill of a pilot's license to fly the 150, which is one of the smaller and lighter aircrafts. b6 b7C

Based on the information received to date as to the developments of the fire bombings on the campus of the University of Wisconsin, Madison, he believes that the person or persons stealing the airplane had to have been flying currently within the last three to six months, including some night flying. He also believes that based on the physical set up at the Sauk Prairie Airport, which is a rural airport with a landing strip approximately 2,900 feet long, running north to south, with no nighttime navigational or landing aids, that the person must have been at or flown into the airport at least once or twice. Based on the information received from [redacted] as to the location of the plane on the airstrip, which was approximately 2,000 feet from the north end, it was determined that the plane was landed in a north to southerly direction. [redacted] advised that he was getting together a list of all persons flying out of his airport who would meet the qualifications of flying at least a Cessna 150 and having sufficient hours to make such a flight from here to Sauk Prairie and have landed at least on one occasion at the Sauk Prairie Airport. b6 b7C

One of these pilots would be [redacted] and who [redacted] who is also a [redacted] on December 31, 1969. This individual is a [redacted] at [redacted] who [redacted] at the airport on [redacted]. [redacted] considers this individual as a very straight individual and a good [redacted]. He does not wear his clothes or hair in the appearance of any individual who is active politically with any of the radical movements on the university campus. [redacted] is not known to drink or smoke while at the airport. Another immediate suspect would be a [redacted] who took flying lessons at the airport beginning on [redacted]. A check of the records showed b6 b7C

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that [redacted] last flew out of Morey's on [redacted]. At that time [redacted] had a private pilot's license for a single engine plane and had accumulated approximately 50 hours of flying time. His true name is [redacted]

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[redacted] last known address [redacted] Wisconsin. [redacted] further recalls that this individual when he was flying out of the airport was kind of an odd character. [redacted] advised he would hitchhike out to go to the airport to fly which would be for about 45 minutes and he would pay cash and leave immediately. He believes at that time [redacted] was employed at [redacted] or at [redacted] located on [redacted].

[redacted] also checked his records for the name of [redacted] which shows that he has approximately 70 hours flying time with a private pilot's license. Records show that he last flew at Morey's in [redacted]. His records show that he started flying on [redacted], receiving his license on [redacted]. This individual has been employed by [redacted]

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Records show that his present address is [redacted]; date of birth [redacted] Social Security No. [redacted]. [redacted] believes that [redacted] does have the capability to fly the 150 and land it at the Prairie du Sac Airport.

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He has been [redacted] at Morey Airplane Company

On December 31, 1969, [redacted] worked all day at the
 airfield. Sometime close to around 4:00 PM, he and part-
 time employee [redacted] started putting away and storing
 the airplanes. This included servicing the planes, that is
 filling them with gas. When completing this job, both of
 them left the airfield the same time, which was around
 6:00 PM. He believes that the only person left was [redacted]
 [redacted] of the airport.

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As is the custom, in the operation of storing
 planes, all planes left out on the apron are locked and
 the keys placed on a panel in the stock room. All planes
 put in the hangar are maintained with the keys in the
 ignition. He recalls specifically that he tested the hangar
 doors and the port entry door into the hangar before
 leaving New Years Eve.

On the morning of January 1, 1970, at about 8:00 AM,
 [redacted] left his residence and drove pass the airport to
 the east end where [redacted] a small stable for [redacted]
 [redacted] horse. He fed the horse and stonned at the airport
 because he had observed that the [redacted] Airplane,
 a Cessna 177, was parked outside the hangar. He felt this
 was kind of unusual and he recalls that this plane was the
 last one put away because [redacted] had indicated that they
 would be flying on January 1, 1970. When checking the hangar
 doors at about 8:30 AM, he noticed that the small port entry
 door on the east hangar doors was off its hinges. Without
 making any further inspection inside the hangar, [redacted]
 called [redacted]. He was instructed to check for missing items

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and at that time discovered that the company's Cessna 170 blue and white airplane was missing. [] then recontacted [] and advised him of the missing airplane. [] came to the airport and shortly after looking around and reporting the incident to the Dane County Sheriff's Office, he received a phone call from [] of the Sauk Prairie Airport advising that [] plane was found abandoned in the middle of [] airstrip at that time. Upon the arrival of a officer from the Dane County Sheriff's Office, [] along with the officer and [] flew to Sauk Prairie and recovered the airplane. [] flew the Cessna 150 back to Morey's and immediately filled it with gas. He noted that at that time it took eleven gallons of gas. Based upon the consumption rate and eliminating his 13 minutes flight back from Sauk Prairie, he would estimate that the persons who stole instant airplane had flown it approximately an hour and three-quarters.

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[] could not furnish any information as to a possible suspect in the theft of the plane based primarily on his lack of time being at the airport. He believed that the employees who have private pilot licenses at Morey's were not responsible for the theft.

[redacted] furnished the following information:

He is a [redacted] at [redacted]. At the present he is a [redacted] at Morey's Airplane Company, Middleton, Wisconsin. He has taken flying lessons at the airport and has obtained his private pilot's license. He did work on December 31, 1969, at the airport and assisted [redacted] in servicing and storing planes in the storage hangar. He does recall that the 1968 Cessna 150 belonging to the company was one of the last planes stored away with a full tank of gas. He believes that the plane in front of that was a Cessna 177, which was owned by the people at [redacted].

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[redacted] does not recall any particular incidents shortly before closing time at 6:00 PM, but does recall an individual, a [redacted] [redacted] build, [redacted] years, [redacted] pounds, [redacted], who appeared at the airport sometime between 12:30 PM and 1:00 PM that date. This individual seemed to take a particular interest in the airplanes sitting in and around the storage hangar. Because [redacted] was busy with other assignments, he did not observe what type of car this individual might have had with him. [redacted] has not seen this individual at the airport since that date.

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[redacted] advised that he has no particular suspects in mind but advised that there is [redacted] at [redacted] who has been involved in the various student protests at the school and seems to espouse the various radicals' point of view on the high school campus obtained from the University of Wisconsin campus. He identified this individual as a [redacted] who resides at [redacted] [redacted] is known to fly at least a Piper Cherokee. He does have a private pilot's license and does all of his flying from the [redacted]

[redacted] furnished the following information.

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[redacted] and several other persons in the Prairie du Sac area are members of a small, private air club which operates the Sauk Prairie Airport. This airstrip is on [redacted] farm land and the airstrip is approximately one-quarter of a mile from [redacted] which is located on US Highway 12, approximately [redacted] of the Badger Army Ammunition Plant, Baraboo, Wisconsin.

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On January 1, 1970, at about 8 AM, or shortly thereafter [redacted] went to breakfast in Sauk City, Wisconsin. They returned some time between 9 AM and 9:30 AM. At this time [redacted] observed a light aircraft parked on the airstrip. His position indicated to him at first that possibly the pilot had gotten into a snow pile and could not extricate the plane. [redacted] let off [redacted] and drove out onto the airstrip. There he observed what was later to be identified as a Cessna 150, blue and white, single-engine aircraft registered to the Morey Aircraft Company, Middleton, Wisconsin. This plane was approximately half-way between the north and south end of the airstrip pointing south. When looking inside the aircraft all power switches were off and the carburetor heater pulled along with full flaps. This indicated to [redacted] that whoever landed the plane was an experienced pilot. He believed that after reading the registration papers that [redacted] had delivered the aircraft that he had requested to rent but he was concerned why the plane was left in the middle of the airstrip. At that point [redacted] made a telephone call to Morey Aircraft and learned that the instant plane which bore a registration number of N6620S, had been stolen some time during the previous night. After receiving this theft report [redacted] telephoned the Sauk County Sheriff's Department and two officers appeared and processed the plane. After it was processed [redacted] taxied the plane to a nearby hangar.

[redacted] recalled that when he first looked at the instant aircraft he observed two sets of footprints that led from the plane in an easterly direction and appeared to lead to a horse barn approximately 500 feet east of the runway. This horse barn is located on [redacted] property who stables several horses. The Sauk County officers along with the Dane County officer that arrived with [redacted], made a search of the area and were unable to develop any information concerning the possible suspects in this theft.

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[redacted] during the previous evening went to bed around 12:30 AM shortly after [redacted] had gone to work at the Badger Plant. He was not awakened during the night by any sound of aircraft or cars driving onto the airstrip. He pointed out that he resides on a busy highway and that he does not pay any attention to vehicle noise.

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[redacted] evaluated that the individual who flew the Morey aircraft must have been an experienced pilot and who had night-time experience in flying. He also believed that the pilot must have been familiar with the Sauk Prairie Airstrip as he had to be oriented as to the airstrip's location and due to the fact that the airstrip is not equipped with runway lights. [redacted] pointed out that he does have red and yellow reflectors positioned along the length of the runway on both sides. [redacted] could not furnish the identity of any persons he has observed at the airport who might possibly be involved in this theft. He pointed out that many persons use this airstrip to practice their short landings and takeoffs. Most of these persons usually fly out of airports in and around the Madison and Baraboo areas.

Lieutenant [redacted], Security Force, Badger Army Ammunition Plant, residence [redacted] Wisconsin, furnished the following information.

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He was working the shift 11 PM to 7 AM on December 31, 1969 - January 1, 1970. At approximately 1:45 AM, January 1, 1970, he was in the guard headquarters and heard the sound of a low-flying aircraft in the area of the plant. As it seemed that the aircraft stayed around in the plant area, he went outside the headquarters and heard the plane to the west of the plant. It seemed to be making a circular movement and then after a while he observed the plane coming from the north flying south across the lighted area of the plant. As it came south, but north of the power plant, the pilot put the plane in a slight stall close to the acid area. The plane then continued south and for a second time the pilot put the plane in a stall. The plane continued south. This action occurred at about 2:13 AM and he would estimate the plane flying at a height of 400 to 500 feet. From the reflection of the lights from the plant he would describe the aircraft as a single-engine with white coloring and dark color on the wing tips. The pilot did not have any navigational lights on. Based on the activities that occurred subsequent to this sighting in regards to the bombings of facilities on the University of Wisconsin Campus, Madison, Wisconsin, and the finding of glass fragments in the acid and maintenance shop areas, he would deduce that this plane was used in dropping the device on the plant in the early morning of January 1, 1970.

[redacted] has questioned all patrolmen on that shift and learned on this date that one officer has reported that when the above-described aircraft flew over the plant a [redacted] white in color, drove up the road toward the main gate. About one-half way the vehicle made a "U" turn and went back out onto US Highway 12. The officer did not observe in which direction the car proceeded after leaving the plant area. The officer stated that he could only observe one occupant in the vehicle.

[redacted] Protective Service, Olin Mathison Corporation, Civilian Operator of Badger Army Ammunition Plant at Baraboo, Wisconsin, stated that on the morning of January 6, 1970, an organized search of the Ammunition Plant was conducted by employees of the Plant, and such employees were all instructed that they were to look for any foreign objects or anything unusual within their respective designated search areas that might be a bomb or an unidentified material dropped from an aircraft on the Ammunition Plant premises. They were instructed that if they saw a foreign object or anything unusual within their areas, they were absolutely not to approach the item to ascertain its exact nature but were to immediately contact the Protective Service so that a member of the Explosive Ordnance Disposal Detachment might come to the area to make a determination as to whether the object sound might be a bomb.

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[redacted] stated that at 9:47 a.m. on January 6, 1970, his office was advised that employee, [redacted] had discovered an unidentified object in the snow somewhere between the acid area and laundry building number 4562. [redacted] caused [redacted] (EOD), to be dispatched to the area.

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[redacted] stated that at 9:59 a.m. on that same date, his office was notified that Ammunition Plant employee; [redacted] had discovered an unidentified foreign object in the snow south of building number 510 on the premises of the Badger Army Ammunition Plant. [redacted] caused [redacted] to be dispatched to the area to make a determination as to whether that item found was a bomb.

[redacted] Commanding Officer, 259th Detachment, Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD), stationed at [redacted], stated that he came to the Badger Army Ammunition Plant, Baraboo, Wisconsin, together with Master Sergeant [redacted], Staff Sergeant, [redacted] and Staff Sergeant [redacted], all of the EOD, [redacted] to participate in the search and lend technical assistance in the handling of evidence in connection with a reported bombing of the Badger Army Ammunition Plant.

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The search for items that may be bombs began in the morning of January 6, 1970, and the procedure was that searchers were to systematically comb their designated areas, and if any foreign objects were discovered or if there was any indication on the ground or in the snow that something unusual was lying in the area, then the searcher was not to approach the object for the purpose of determining the nature of the item discovered. The searcher was instead instructed to immediately contact the EOD detachment, and a member of that detachment would be dispatched to the area and make a determination of whether the item found was a bomb.

[redacted] stated that that same morning, he was called to the acid area of the plant to make a determination of whether an item, which was found by an employee of the plant, was a bomb. When [redacted] arrived at the site, he noted that the employee who had found the area had come upon a patch of snow that was disturbed, and the employee's footprints in the snow came to approximately ten to fifteen feet from the disturbed area. For this reason, [redacted] determined that he, himself, was the first person on the scene to make the initial investigation of the item found.

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[redacted] stated that the area of snow disturbed was between the acid area and Laundry Building No. 4562 and was approximately 900 feet inside the perimeter fence. The object that had apparently freshly fallen in the snow had landed in a snow drift that was approximately 9 inches deep. The object then hit the frozen ground and made a hole approximately five

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inches deep and one foot long and one foot wide. [] closely examined this area and obtained for evidentiary purposes a metal lid for what might have been a one gallon bottle, and he also gathered numerous small pieces of broken glass. He also gathered samples of the ground that had been hit by the object, and he gathered samples of snow from the area. [] advised that glass from the object was scattered for approximately twelve feet in the immediate area of the impact, and the path appeared to be layed from a northerly to a southerly direction. He stated that this path was approximately four feet wide. [] stated that he would be unable to say whether this object had been a bomb without a laboratory examination.

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[] stated that later that same morning he was called to the area of Building Number 510 to make a determination of whether another item, which was found by an employee of the plant was a bomb. When [] arrived at the site, he noted that again the employee who had found the area had come upon a patch of snow and ground that was disturbed, and the employee's foot-prints in the snow came to approximately ten to fifteen feet from the disturbed area. For this reason, [] again determined that he, himself, was the first person on the scene to make the initial investigation of the item found.

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[] stated that the area of snow disturbed was approximately fifty feet south of Building Number 510 and was approximately 1500 feet inside the perimeter fence. The object had apparently freshly fallen on the snow-covered ground and made a splatter area of approximately four feet in diameter, but the impact had not penetrated the frozen ground to any extent. A metal lid similar to the first lid was found approximately twenty five feet south of the impact area. [] obtained for evidentiary purposes the metal lid and numerous small pieces of broken glass and snow from the impact area, and from the area that the lid had been found. He stated that the impact area appeared to be layed from a northerly to a southerly direction, and that he was unable to say whether this object had been a bomb without a laboratory examination.

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[] delivered all the items that he took for evidence and examination into the custody of Colonel RUSSELL ENOCH.





The spokesman said that this ROTC attack was only the beginning. He furnished the following statement to [redacted]

"The policy of our group is to increase the level of violence against both on-campus and off-campus institutions of repression. On the campus, our activity will escalate until the University Administration accedes to the demands of SDS and other student power oriented groups. The levels of violence will be raised until either these demands are met or the University faculty plant is destroyed and the institution shut down."

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The article went on to describe an anonymous telephone conversation between [redacted] and the spokesman for the terrorist group. [redacted] declined to release the full text of the statement, according to [redacted] article, but said it would be included in next week's issue of Kaleidoscope, described by [redacted] as "an underground newspaper which was founded in Milwaukee and now publishes a Madison edition."

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The terrorists had made the call on Monday evening, according to [redacted].

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Upon interview, [redacted] said that the article he had written was not entirely accurate in that he had not spoken directly with [redacted]. The voice sounded as though it belonged to a young man, possibly in his late adolescence. The voice was very calm.

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[redacted] pointed out that his receipt of the telephone call about ROTC was purely by chance as he happened to be the closest to the telephone when it rang. [redacted] has no idea as to the identity of the caller, and he has not received any subsequent calls or notifications of any type.

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Concerning the Madison Kaleidoscope newspaper, commonly known in the Madison area as an underground publication, [redacted] is aware of the identities of four people who are reportedly on its staff. They are:

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[redacted] Kaleidoscope, like the Capital Times, also reportedly received a telephone call from an unidentified individual who announced that there had been a fire bombing at the University of Wisconsin (UW) buildings. He feels that Kaleidoscope, like the Capital Times, subsequently reported the telephone call, and the person at Kaleidoscope who received it does not know who made the call or who was responsible for any of the Madison terrorist incidents.

Kaleidoscope, which claims to be a bi-weekly publication, has been having financial difficulties,

Background information on persons alleged to have possible knowledge concerning captioned matter determined to be negative to date.

DETAILS:

At Minneapolis, Minnesota.

[REDACTED] Air Traffic Branch, Federal Aviation Agency, on January 21, 1970, advised that no information has been furnished his office concerning an aircraft having been observed and disappearing from the radar screen at approximately 2:18 AM, on December 23, 1969, operating in the vicinity of Baraboo, Wisconsin, or any other town in Wisconsin. [REDACTED] pointed out that any aircraft that flies below 3000 feet would disappear from the radar screen and that this appearance of aircraft on the radar screen and subsequent disappearance off the screen occurs regularly and is not a matter to be reported unless

had radioed that it was in some type of difficulty.

[redacted] advised that individual private aircraft flying from local fields in Wisconsin would file flight plans with Milwaukee Federal Aviation Agency, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, if the field is located East of Madison, Wisconsin, and would file with the Lone Rock Federal Aviation Agency, Lone Rock, Wisconsin, if these aircraft were taking off from fields west of Madison. He stated these flight plans are not forwarded to Minneapolis and that to determine the origin of flight on December 23, 1969, to January 1, 1970, from airfields in Wisconsin would be necessary to check either of the two above mentioned facilities.

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At Madison, Wisconsin

SA [redacted] on January 13, 1970, received an anonymous telephone call from an unidentified male stating that during the early part of September or late part of August, 1969, an airplane had been operating in the Pardeeville, Wisconsin, area by a person who was a "hippie" type and who was a student at the University of Wisconsin. The caller stated he believed this individual had relatives living in the Pardeeville area. The caller continued that the hippie type person had rented a late model Cessna 150 airplane and was taking his friends for a ride in the Pardeeville area. The caller continued that this individual, while operating the airplane, did so pass the plane's certified structural limitations in that he was doing rolls, spins, and power dives within 500 feet of the ground. The caller was not aware of the identity of this individual, but believed the airplane being used was rented from the Hartford Flying Service, Hartford, Wisconsin. The caller also observed that on one other trip made by this individual, the rear window of the aircraft had been broken during his power dive. The caller felt this type of person was probably responsible for the bombing of the BAAP.

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At Hartford, Wisconsin

[redacted] ZIEKO Aviation, on February 11, 1970, advised SA [redacted] the individual possibly related to the information received from the

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

Ammonium nitrate was also recovered from specimens Q4 through Q6. A flammable petroleum hydrocarbon mixture corresponding to the heavier fractions of kerosene or light fuel oil was recovered from a portion of the bulk soil sample, Q6.

The glass fragments in Q3, Q5 and Q6 appear to have originated from a large jar manufactured by Brockway Glass Company, Incorporated, Brockway, Pennsylvania. Such jars are common and nothing of apparent significance was found from the examination of the broken fragments of glass.



[redacted] and [redacted] both of Minneapolis, have furnished information involving Armstrong brothers as members of the "New Years Gang," responsible for the attempted bombing of Badger Army Ammunition Depot, Baraboo, Wisconsin, 1/1/70, and captioned matter. [redacted] identified as purchasing 1,700 pounds nitrate fertilizer 8/19/70 (used as booster for homemade bombs). Traces of such component found in debris of truck in which bomb in captioned matter detonated. [redacted]

[redacted] own yellow Corvair automobile, regularly driven by Armstrong brothers. Police officer responding to instant bombing observed light color Corvair leaving scene of blast at high speed. At 6 a.m., 2 hours, 18 minutes after blast, all [redacted] of above suspects were identified in [redacted] Corvair about 40 miles from Madison as vehicle was suspected stolen. They were released. OBSERVATIONS:

Milwaukee was instructed to obtain Corvair for FBI Laboratory analysis for nitrate traces. This has been done; examination not completed yet. Other leads furnished Milwaukee on a timely basis and close supervision maintained daily by telephone.

This matter appears to be drawing to conclusive point and aggressive prosecutive steps appear warranted. As you are aware, our investigative entree to this matter was sabotage, based on existing Army contracts. Also, as you are aware, Assistant Attorney General Yeagley, Internal Security Division, has been gun shy as to aggressively pursuing prosecution in similar matters. This matter was orally discussed with Yeagley this morning and it was very strongly put to him the desirability of moving quickly and the obvious advantage of having the local U. S. Attorney (USA), on the spot, authorized to proceed with warrants under sabotage violation as soon as warranted; normally a prerogative retained by Internal Security Division. Yeagley agreed and stated USA should be advised to use his on-the-scene judgement and to authorize warrants under sabotage statutes when he felt sufficient probable cause existed. He also telephonically authorized search warrants for Madison residences of all four suspects. SAC Sullivan at Madison was advised of Yeagley's authorization for search warrants and instructed to advise USA of Yeagley relinquishing authority to proceed under sabotage statutes to USA.

SAC Sullivan has been instructed of the necessity to press this matter vigorously and to insure warrants are obtained as soon as sufficient probable cause exists to do so, consistent with good judgement, bearing in mind the deterrent aspects of a speedy solution to this matter and need to apprehend guilty parties before they flee the country.

Synopsis:

On 6/10/77, DWIGHT ALAN ARMSTRONG appeared in U.S. District Court, EDW, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, for violation of Title 18, Section 371 (Conspiracy), U.S. Code, and he was sentenced to 5 years incarceration and remanded to the custody of the Attorney General of the United States, for violation of Title 18, U.S. Code, Section 4 (Misprision of a Felony). He was sentenced to two years incarceration and remanded to the custody of the Attorney General. The sentences are to run consecutively and it was recommended, but not ordered, that the sentence be served at FCI, Oxford, Oxford, Wisconsin. On 6/8/77, ARMSTRONG sentenced to 7 years by Circuit Court, Dane County, for his participation in the bombing of Sterling Hall. ARMED AND DANGEROUS.

DETAILS:

On June 10, 1977, DWIGHT ALAN ARMSTRONG appeared before U.S. District Judge MYRON GORDON, Eastern District of Wisconsin (EDW), Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Judge GORDON sentenced ARMSTRONG to 5 years confinement in the custody of the United States Attorney General for violation of Title 18, U.S. Code, Section 371, Conspiracy. This sentence resulted from ARMSTRONG's participation in the bombing of Sterling Hall at the University of Wisconsin, on August 24, 1970.

Judge GORDON also sentenced ARMSTRONG to 2 years incarceration, in the custody of the United States Attorney General, for violation of Title 18, U.S. Code, Section 4, Misprision of a Felony. This sentence resulted from ARMSTRONG's guilty plea concerning his involvement in the bombing of the Badger Army Ammunition Plant.

The sentences are to run consecutively and the court recommended, but did not order, the sentences to be served at the Federal Correctional Institution, Oxford, Wisconsin.

On June 8, 1977, ARMSTRONG appeared in Circuit Court, Dane County, Wisconsin, Madison, Wisconsin, and received a 7 year sentence for 2nd degree murder, resulting from his participation in the bombing of the Sterling Hall at the University of Wisconsin. Execution of this sentence was stayed until such time as ARMSTRONG was sentenced in U.S. District Court. It is expected the Judge of the Circuit Court will order the State sentence to run concurrently with the Federal sentence.
