Reference is made to my memorandum of June 23, 1964, wherein the Director approved that we provide transportation for General Eisenhower from the helicopter landing at the Pentagon to the unveiling of the statue at 23rd and P Streets, Northwest, and then back to the Pentagon.

(b)(7)(C) A copy of the General's schedule is attached. I have instructed [redacted] to handle this matter and to meet the General. The General will be accompanied by his aide General Robert Schulz. There will only be two in the party.

In that there will be 32,000 people in the area (according to the press), we have notified the Metropolitan Police Department, the Park Police and Secret Service. Metropolitan police are going to provide one motorcycle escort in case of traffic problems.

We will also have one extra Bureau car following at all times in case of breakdown. This car will be driven by a Special Agent from the Crime Records Division.

(b)(7)(C) We are using the Director's 1963 Cadillac and the driver will be [redacted]. These arrangements have been approved by General Schulz, General Eisenhower's aide.

Former Attorney General William P. Rogers called. He stated he was troubling me because he had received a call from former Attorney General Herbert Brownell, who had a call from former President Dwight D. Eisenhower. President Eisenhower told Messrs. Brownell and Rogers to issue a statement apropos of President Johnson's statement yesterday that President Eisenhower had the same kind of a problem as the [redacted]. Rogers stated he wanted to check with me; that he remembered the [redacted] matter but as he recalled, Vandenberg was not employed.

By letter of 11-19-64, to the Director with a copy to General Eisenhower and [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] pointed out it was his intention to go to the root of this issue and expected Mr. Hoover and Eisenhower to allow him to use the correspondence between them to be published in the [REDACTED] as a contribution to the efforts to show the American people the true nature of ultra-isms, both left and right. He admits the issues involved are complex and assumes the position that the slogans of the John Birch Society including "liberty, freedom and conservatism" parallel the communist front's shield in the words such as "opportunity, justice and democracy." It is his contention that the use of a picture is well worth "a thousand words" and the Society by printing the Director's photograph -- even with the disclaimer that the FBI does not endorse any organization -- still has a carrying effect to impress the reader. Indirectly, he implies he will bring this matter to the attention of the Attorney General, if necessary.

(b)(7)(C) [REDACTED] in his letter to Eisenhower, a copy of which he enclosed to Mr. Hoover, set forth his "credentials" naming apparently substantial people in his area and noted the formation of the National Council for Civic Responsibility, known in Bureau files as having been formed recently by Arthur Larsen, (former aide to General Eisenhower at the White House,) which Council has as its purpose to look into the propaganda disseminated by extremist groups, both right and left. [REDACTED] states that he is not motivated by any group, but is merely acting on his own, his position appears to be that following all of the tenets set forth by the principles of the National Council for Civic Responsibility.

Enclosed with his communication are copies of editorials appearing in the "Idaho Statesman" (which newspaper the Bureau has enjoyed cordial relations and its editors have been on the Special Correspondents' List.) These editorials describe at length the rising problem facing the American people in connection with extremist groups. Much of the literature figuring in the recent Presidential campaign was mentioned.

Also enclosed was a copy of the advertisement sponsored by the John Birch Society as it appeared in this paper on 11-2-64. This advertisement has photographs of General Eisenhower, former Secretary of Agriculture Benson and W. Cleon Skousen, former Bureau Agent. This advertisement is apparently a cut-down version of the color supplemental section originally brought to the Bureau's attention as published by the "Los Angeles Times" in the fall of this year. It is to be noted that the original Birch ad, quoted the Director from his appearance before the HCUA in March, 1947; however, the current ad has the additional disclaimer that this should not be interpreted as an endorsement of the John Birch Society, as the FBI endorses no organization.

By telephone call of 11-25-64, General Robert ~~Schultz~~^V, aide to General Eisenhower, told Inspector Robert E. Wick that Eisenhower intended to reply to his letter by pointing out he has never responded to such incredulous charges throughout his life and did not intend to start now.

(c) The Birch Society has used the Director's photograph and statement previously in several ads appearing in various newspapers throughout the country. In answer to specific inquiries concerning this ad, our reply has been to note that the Director's speeches and articles are a matter of public record and are quoted from time to time; however, their use does not necessarily mean that this Bureau has or has not "cleared" the manner in which these were employed. A specific statement was included to the effect that no permission was sought or granted in connection with the use of Mr. Hoover's photograph and statement. The confidential nature of Bureau files and our policy of not evaluating organizations are usually set out and the general reminder that the Director is not in a position to comment along these lines is stated. [redacted] assumes a strong position; however, it would appear to the Bureau's better interest to continue to rely upon our policies in these matters. [redacted] is permission to publish the Director's reply, it is believed it should be an "in absence" for this reason.

General Eisenhower will be flying to Boston from Cleveland in former Secretary of the Treasury Humphrey's plane. In Boston General Eisenhower will be staying at the Summerset Club and then will be going to the Tavern Club for the birthday party tomorrow in honor of General Robert Cutler. Apparently the problem of getting General Eisenhower from the Summerset Club to the Tavern Club is of some concern.

General Schulz asked if our Agent in Charge of the Boston Office could please contact General Cutler at his home and discuss the matter with him. It was felt that if uniformed police guards were assigned to transfer Eisenhower from the Summerset Club to the Tavern Club this would attract large crowds and General Eisenhower would like to avoid this.

I talked with SAC Handley, told him to get in touch with General Cutler and work out arrangements for transferring General Eisenhower between the Summerset Club and the Tavern Club while he is in Boston. Arrangements for transportation for General Eisenhower from the airport to downtown Boston have already been taken care of. A

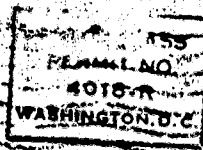

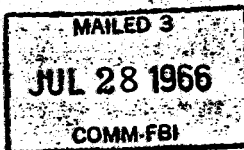

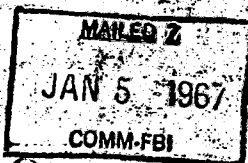

General of the Army Dwight D. Eisenhower called from Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. He said he wanted to ask me one question; that he has seen three or four performances by the groups "Sing Out" and "Up With People," which are very patriotic and very inspiring performances. He said it turns out they are sponsored by an organization called Moral Rearmament. He continued that everybody who has seen performances by these groups has been inspired and is keen on them, but a number have questions about Moral Rearmament. The General stated he knew nothing about this and a friend had called him and advised that a couple thousand of these young people were coming to his state and he wanted to know about Moral Rearmament. General Eisenhower said he is so puzzled about this as, for example, this month there are going to be performances by about 300 of these young people in Constitution Hall for about 2 week and he even wrote and suggested the President ought to have them over to the White House. I commented that it sounded like a good idea. General Eisenhower said they are tops and what he wanted to know is, is there anything against them.

I told the General that off hand, I would say that I know nothing against them but I would like to check our files. The General asked if I would do that and drop him a note. I told him I would write him today.

Mr. DeLoach has been instructed to have a memorandum prepared today regarding Moral Rearmament together with a letter to General Eisenhower.

General of the Army Dwight D. Eisenhower called from Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. He stated he has developed with Reader's Digest an article on crime and delinquency to be published soon. He stated one man he talked with was a member of the National Council on Crime and Delinquency and, as a matter of fact, he thought this man had some good ideas so he wanted to put in his article that here is one group trained to do something in this field. He said that now one of the staff heard indirectly where this outfit at one time had a lot of leftists and communists in it. General Eisenhower said [redacted] is the man he talked to, [redacted] certainly is a dedicated American and for law and order. The General wondered if I knew anything about the organization.

I told him it used to have a different name as it had the name of something about parole and probation before the name was changed. I said at that time there were in the organization and may still be a number of these so-called "bleeding hearts," as I call them, in regard to penology and law enforcement who believed parole should be extended to everyone. I stated I had several arguments with them as to that because I believe in parole and probation but I do not like to see the abuses. I said I had never heard them or know now of any subversives or communists in that group and there are some very good people in it and I thought you are bound to find a difference of opinion on the subject. The General asked [redacted] and I told him I did not know. He said he knew [redacted] I told him I knew nothing that would support the contention that there are communist or subversive elements in it and it could possibly be an extreme statement made by someone who has different views. The General said he would tell the editors that and expressed his appreciation.

President Lyndon B. Johnson called and said he had an interview in front of him of former President Eisenhower on the UPI ticker and asked if I had read it. He stated Eisenhower says they ought to empower the FBI to investigate this. I told the President I saw it, but General Eisenhower is completely misinformed. The President said he thought I ought to call his briefing officer and say to him to see UPI #35. The President proceeded to read the ticker as follows: "Former President Eisenhower suggested today there is a pattern to current city riots. He suggested that Congress empower the FBI to move into the situation. The General, meeting with reporters in his office on the Gettysburg College Campus, said he had been told while in Washington several days ago that there is no law in the books by which the FBI can use its investigative forces in the present situation. When there is good reason on the part of the Government to believe that there is some national organization that is bringing about this trouble, the FBI should be allowed and directed to make an investigation and report," et cetera. I told the President that the General later said he was told that by Senator Dirksen.

The President told me to call General Andrew Goodpaster and tell him the President said he was the man designated to keep General Eisenhower fully informed and briefed and would appreciate his help and he, the President had asked me over night before last and been in touch with me and that I have all the resources needed and that the President had given me full authority to spend anything to get the facts and to tell Eisenhower we don't want to put it on full page headlines the FBI is going "to eat you up" and scare everybody and put them on notice what we are doing, but I have the authority and the President is on top of it and called me weeks ago when in Newark and insisted I get anybody, including their wife if she contributed. The President then stated he noticed this Rap (Brown) outfit said he was going to get a gun and shoot Lady Bird (Johnson.) I stated Brown has issued a statement that no Negro is bound to obey any law he does not believe in. I stated Brown will be arraigned at two o'clock.

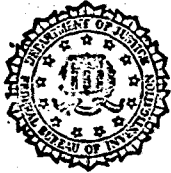

The telephone operator stated that an address was also given but could not be understood, however, she believes that North East or North West was mentioned. Immediately after the message, there was a click and the receiver was hung up.

Investigation at White House determined that instant call was not recorded or monitored, nor was a trace initiated. All persons at the White House involved with the call have been interviewed.

Based upon information developed by investigation, WFO and Bureau files and public source material fail to reveal any information which would assist in this matter.

[redacted] understood this individual to say the time of death was approximately 10:12 p.m. [redacted] rang [redacted]

[redacted] and informed [redacted] that a [redacted] was on the line and desired to talk to the President. She informed this individual she was connecting him with [redacted] of the President's Office."

He stated that it was the White House telephone operator informing him that she had a [REDACTED] on the phone who desired to get in touch with the President concerning the

SCHULZ, Retired, Lieutenant General LEONARD D. NEATON, or Admiral GEORGE G. BURKLEY would contact either [redacted] with this information.

and he spoke with a very authentic tone. She did not detect any accent.

[REDACTED] he spoke with the above caller on
the President's private telephone. He was suspicious of the call because
it was not made in accordance with previous arrangements with Walter
Reed Hospital. A call was made to Walter Reed Hospital to verify the
information and it was determined that the call was a hoax. [REDACTED]
described the caller as appearing to be in his late twenties, intelligent,
articulate, cool and deliberate. He did not discern any degree of
emotionalism in the caller's voice. He was of the opinion that the
person could be from either the Washington, D. C., area or the
Midwest but not from New England or the South. The caller was
able to describe the physical layout of the Presidential suite at the
hospital.

Tom Johnson, a staff member at the White House, called me at 1 o'clock this morning, and indicated he was calling at the instructions of the President. Tom Johnson stated that at approximately 11:30 p.m., last night, 8/19/68, an individual giving the name of *[REDACTED]* had called the White House switchboard, indicating he was calling from *[REDACTED]* and wanted to immediately advise the President of former President Eisenhower's death. The caller went through three operators, and was eventually connected with the President. The President talked with him for a matter of of a few minutes and eventually realized that either the man was a mental case or else someone was deliberately trying to pull a trick. DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER

Tom Johnson stated the President was infuriated and ordered him to cause an immediate investigation.

I called SAC Purvis at 8:10 this morning and told him to have the Washington Field Office check with the White House switchboard operators to get the facts concerning this matter. I requested also that the Washington Field Office check at Walter Reed Hospital to discreetly find out if there is a *[REDACTED]* assigned there. Indices of the Washington Field and at the Bureau are also being checked, following which a brief report will be sent to the White House. A call of this nature is almost impossible to trace, unless it is anticipated in advance.

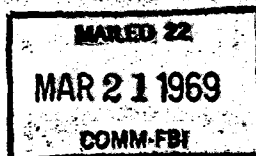

Robert Gresham, Minority Clerk of the House Appropriations Committee, telephonically advised the writer at 3:30 P.M. today he had just learned from the White House that there will be a private service for former President Dwight D. Eisenhower in the Bethel Chapel of the National Cathedral where his body will be taken tomorrow morning at 11:00 A.M.

He stated that on Sunday it will be removed to the Rotunda of the Capitol arriving there at 4:30 P.M.; that President Nixon will be present and a eulogy service will be conducted from 4:30 P.M. to 5:30 P.M.

He also advised that the public funeral service will be held at 3:00 P.M. on Monday afternoon at the National Cathedral when the body will be returned to that location and the President is declaring Monday a national day of mourning and a holiday for Federal employees.

We have been checking with Departmental officials as to what instructions will be forthcoming from the Department with regard to Monday as a workday and to date they have not been able to furnish us any advice.

Gresham also advised that Congressman Bow is going to recommend to Chairman Mahon of the Appropriations Committee that all scheduled hearings be cancelled until President Eisenhower's body is interred in Abilene, Kansas. This is to take place it is understood on Wednesday afternoon April 2nd.

I have checked with Ken Sprankle, Clerk of the House Appropriations Committee and he advised he had no information at this time as to what the plans of the committee would be in regard to hearings that have been scheduled but will keep the writer informed as soon as he gets any definite indication.
