MEMORANDUM FOR MR. LADD

Re: Lt. Gen. Hoyt S. Vandenberg
Director, CIG

Special Agent Doherty of the Liaison Section contacted Colonel Wright, Executive Officer of General Vandenberg, and indicated to him that he had received a rumor to the effect that General Vandenberg was to resign and was to be replaced by an Admiral of the United States Navy.

Colonel Wright stated that ever since last August there have been rumors to the effect that General Vandenberg is to resign and take over some top position in the Government. Colonel Wright stated that he has talked these rumors over with General Vandenberg frequently and at the present time feels assured that as far as he or the General knows the General has no intention of leaving CIG.

Colonel Wright stated, however, that when top Army officers are being considered for various assignments General Vandenberg is usually mentioned in connection with this type of rumor because he believes the General is an individual that must be considered in shifting Army top flight personnel. Colonel Wright stated that he is aware of the rumors to the effect that General Eisenhower is going to become Ambassador to a foreign country and also another rumor that General Eisenhower is to resign as Chief of Staff and run for the Presidency. He stated that to follow through with these rumors top flight Army officers also must be shifted and since General Vandenberg is considered a top flight Army officer it is only natural that he is mentioned in some capacity in filling the gaps created by the removal of Eisenhower.

Colonel Wright further related that in the event Vandenberg resigned as Director of CIG, and as Colonel Wright stated the General has no intention of doing so at the present time, he believed that his position will be filled by an Admiral due to the fact that it is believed CIG is not ready as yet for a civilian director.

Colonel Wright assured Agent Doherty that these rumors are strictly rumors at the present time and in the event anything definite occurs, he would be very happy to bring it to the Bureau's attention.

Dwight

Whoever told you that General Eisenhower is seeking the Democratic nomination for President is, I feel sure, mistaken. The General was here in Texas a week or two ago, was wined and dined mightily, and made speeches in San Antonio, Houston, and so on. Wherever he went, his cronies (fellow-guests at luncheons and dinners) were members of the old-line Republican organization in Texas. These same Republicans, two years ago, were hot for Bob Taft and wouldn't touch Eisenhower with the proverbial ten-foot pole.

and local Republicans merely snorted at it. - though not all- were Democrats who voted in the end, as I did, for Truman. When the General was down here this time he let the Republican regulars corral him, and his original supporters never even saw him. We're not miffed about it, but it strikes me that nobody who really wanted to be President would commit the tactical error of ignoring any organized group of supporters, especially a nonpartisan one such as ours was.

Another thing. Though Eisenhower spoke mighty softly on the recent Navy-Air Force hearings, he did speak against the Navy side. There are enough ex-Navy men in this country to defeat any candidate who is against a strong Navy - even though there may not be enough of us to elect a Navy supporter. I doubt if a man who seriously wanted to be President would alienate the Navy veterans.

Eisenhower has turned out to be something of an enigma to me, and I suspect the reason is that he himself is confused about what he wants. He would like to be President, but he won't do anything to get the nomination because he likes the role of elder statesman. You can't be Bernie Baruch and FDR too - you have to choose. And I think that Eisenhower has let his chance slip by. He won't get the Democratic nomination because Truman controls it, and if he runs as a Republican I think he'll be beaten. I don't believe that any Republican except Stassen has a chance of being elected in 1952.

Hearty congratulations on your fine work in behalf of the Navy and the Marines.

Dear General Eisenhower:

It is my very great pleasure to extend to you an invitation to deliver the graduation address to the Forty-fourth Session of the FBI National Academy on Friday, June 30, 1950. The exercises will be held in Washington, D. C., in the Departmental Auditorium located on Constitution Avenue between Twelfth and Fourteenth Streets, Northwest, and will begin promptly at 10:30 A. M. There is always a capacity audience of approximately 1,500 in attendance at these exercises, consisting in part of state, county and municipal officials and officials of the Federal Government.

The FBI National Academy for law enforcement officers was established by the FBI in 1935. The purpose of the Academy is to afford training in the advanced methods and techniques of law enforcement to representatives of state, county and municipal police organizations. The course of training is twelve weeks in length and is designed to develop police executives and police instructors. The Academy, since its inception, has been most enthusiastically received by law enforcement organizations and officials throughout the United States and its territories and there is always a waiting list of officers for attendance. With the graduation of the Forty-fourth Session, consisting of fifty-eight members, there will be 2,196 graduates.

While I realize there are very heavy demands upon your valuable time, I want to assure you that not only would the law enforcement officers attending the academy be greatly honored by your acceptance of this invitation, but that the entire personnel of the FBI would likewise feel it a distinct honor if you could be with us. We shall be glad to arrange for a representative of this Bureau to confer with you about the program, and matters of transportation and hotel reservations at any convenient time, if you desire. I do hope that you can accept this invitation and if there is any additional information or assistance which you desire, I would appreciate hearing from you.

ASAC Whelan called from New York on the afternoon of 1/12/51, to advise that a G-2 representative in New York had come over to see him to relate a story which had been brought to them concerning a possible plot to kill General Eisenhower and his aide. G-2 received its information from

G-2 requested the FBI to run down this rumor in view of the fact that civilians were involved.

I advised ASAC Whelan that there had been some publicity here recently in the newspapers concerning possible threats against the General and as a result, several Communists in France were arrested and that this might be the basis for the statement. However, in view of the fact that this statement had been made and until it was run down, we had no way of knowing whether there was any subversive angle involved. The New York Office should therefore attempt to locate *who made* the statement and get to the bottom of it. ASAC Whelan said he would do this.

While talking to SAC Carson on other matters today, he referred to the wire the Director received from [redacted]

[redacted] who wanted to have an Agent come see him. They had difficulty contacting him on the phone and locating him, but an Agent did see him at [redacted] told Agent that he and a group of people are interested in backing General Eisenhower, however, he had received a rumon to the effect that Eisenhower was either a German Jew or a Dutch Jew.

[redacted] wanted to get the straight dope on this from the Director. The Agent told [redacted] did not know and that the Bureau did not make inquiries pertaining to race, color or creed.

[redacted] he was a friend of the Director's and asked the Agent to advise the Director of his inquiry.

(b)(7)(D) I told Carson to have the Agent call [redacted] back and stated that they had been in touch with the Washington headquarters of the Bureau and that it would not be possible for the Director to make any inquiries on this matter, and that the Director did not have any firsthand information.

In this connection, [redacted] called me from Los Angeles last week to say hello. In the course of the conversation, he asked if I had ever heard that Eisenhower was a "German Jew"; that he had heard that in Eisenhower's application for admittance to West Point he had described his race as "Semitic."

[redacted] he is fearful someboiy is getting ready to start a rumor campaign and he wanted to find out himself. I told him that we, of course, could not make any inquiries. He then stated that he would check with either [redacted] He then asked if I would call one or them and ask them if they knew and if they did not know, to find out and get in touch with him.

I did talk to [redacted] and advised him of [redacted] inquiry. [redacted] they had a photostat in the office of the year book at West Point which characterizes Eisenhower as a "Swedish Jew."

Dwight D. Eisenhower said that he and President Truman received honorary degrees at Princeton at the same time (this was in 1947), and on that occasion President Truman told him that the people at Princeton were interested in seeing Eisenhower and not "just another politician," and that he wanted Eisenhower to take all the bows and to consider himself the "main event."

Dear Mr. Ladd

I thought you would be interested in the attached morning editions of London newspapers regarding the death of the King.

I was informed by a Parliamentary Member last night that the King, as I told you before, had cancer of the lung, one of which was removed some time ago. The cancer apparently, according to the Parliamentary Member, spread into his chest and all over his body and it was known in Royal Circles that he would not live over six months. Practically all of the members of the Royal Family knew this, excepting Princess Elizabeth as it was felt that it would interfere with her plans in visiting the Colonies and Dominions.

My Parliamentary contact also informed that other Members of Parliament believe World War III will start in 1953. He has just returned from a trip to [redacted] and he says that high-ranking officials there also hold the same views. He also had talks with Dwight D. Eisenhower and claims that Ido told him that he would run for President, if drafted.

Mr. Hoover:

An acquaintance of has advised not long ago privately explained the General's attitude about future political plans as follows:

The General definitely will not campaign for the presidency and will continue his present activities without definitely committing himself. However, if a stalemate arises insofar as the Republican nomination is concerned and General MacArthur feels that it will be his patriotic duty to accept the nomination, he will then agree to be nominated.

DWIGHT D.

 stated that, General MacArthur and General Eisenhower had a conference some time in the past. During the course of the conference, General Eisenhower allegedly discussed the possibility of his being nominated by both the Democratic and Republican Parties for the Presidency and indicated he would like to run with this dual nomination. General MacArthur literally "blew his top" and asked Eisenhower if he realized what he was saying.

General MacArthur pointed out that this would be destroying the two-party system, by which the citizen is guaranteed a choice of candidates and that Eisenhower's actions would be contrary to the whole political philosophy of this country.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this memorandum is to summarize information concerning Kevin C. McCann, the man behind the Dwight D. Eisenhower campaign.

BACKGROUND:

There is no information in our files concerning McCann.

The New York Times on April 8, 1951, reported that McCann was named President of Defiance College, Defiance, Ohio, on April 7, 1951, to succeed Dr. Harold Dana Hopkins, who was retiring on June 30, 1951.

The Times stated that McCann was a graduate of the University of St. Mary's, San Antonio, Texas, holding Bachelor and Master of Science degrees. The paper stated McCann is a former industrial engineer and newspaper publisher who enlisted in the Army in 1942. He received a Washington assignment with the Army in 1945, and was transferred to General Eisenhower's Headquarters in 1946. He was discharged from the Army in 1948 as a Lieutenant Colonel. The Times stated McCann was associated with Eisenhower, from 1946 until he accepted the presidency of Defiance College, as the General's assistant at both Columbia University and Supreme Headquarters of the Allied Powers in Europe. (New York Times, April 8, 1951, page 70)

The New York Times reported on September 11, 1951, that during an address to the Toledo, Ohio, Rotary Club on September 10, 1951, McCann spoke highly of Eisenhower, praising him for his "armored liberation" of Europe during World War II and his "spirit of liberation" of Europe in 1951. (New York Times, September 11, 1951, page 27)

Defiance College is a co-educational school established in 1885 offering degree courses in liberal arts subjects. (Patterson's American Education Directory, page 49)

On Sunday evening, May 25, 1952, the writer was present at a small informal get-together at the [redacted] attended by

[redacted] and four or five other friends of [redacted] The get-together was held prior to the time that the NBC-TV Program "AMERICAN FORUM OF THE AIR" was televised.

In conversation with the writer, [redacted] made the following observations:

(1) The GOP Convention will be a real hot battle between TAIT and EISENHOWER. Neither will win on the first ballot. [redacted] real concern is that the battle won't disrupt the Republican Party.

(2) EISENHOWER and his backers will do everything possible to prohibit the naming of General MacARTHUR as a compromise candidate. EISENHOWER, if an unbreakable deadlock results, will throw his strength to TAIT rather than to MacARTHUR. EISENHOWER would not accept MacARTHUR as a running mate, but TAIT might run with MacARTHUR.

(3) EISENHOWER will attempt to divorce himself from public forums and debates prior to the GOP Convention in July. He will explain his position on the major issues through one or two speeches and by answering inquiries from newspaper, radio and television correspondents.

(4) [redacted] doesn't know what EISENHOWER's campaign will encompass if he receives the GOP nomination.

[redacted] will do everything possible to incite EISENHOWER to make a vigorous and aggressive campaign so that the GOP fate of 1948 won't be repeated.

(5) [redacted] doesn't think that Governor DEWEY would be acceptable to the GOP Convention if a deadlock develops. He doesn't think that DEWEY is trying to maneuver himself into such a position.

(6) [redacted] Doesn't think that MacARTHUR would accept a bid from the Democratic Party to be the V.P. nominee if EISENHOWER receives the GOP Presidential nomination.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

At 12:45 PM on July 13, 1952, Mr. Arthur Vandenberg, Jr., who identified himself as Executive Assistant to General Eisenhower, telephonically communicated with the Bureau and expressed a desire to speak to you. In your absence, Mr. Vandenberg agreed to talk to me. It is noted that Mr. Nichols was not immediately available at the time of this call.

Mr. Vandenberg inquired of me as to whether the Bureau could provide personal protection to General Eisenhower during the course of his campaign for the Presidency. Mr. Vandenberg was informed that the Secret Service had been given the jurisdiction and the responsibility to provide personal protection to the President and his family. At this point, Mr. Vandenberg interrupted and stated that he should have known this and that this answered his question completely. He stated that apparently the Secret Service did not have jurisdiction to extend personal protection to General Eisenhower, as a candidate for the Presidency, as General Eisenhower had not heard anything from the Secret Service along these lines.

Mr. Vandenberg stated that he regretted bothering us regarding this matter and that he should have known our jurisdictional limitations. He asked that his very best wishes and personal regards be extended to you.



Monday night I met the Quartermaster General, Major General George A. Horkan. He was talking to several people and described himself as a very close friend and military associate of General Eisenhower. His son and Eisenhower's son served as Best Man at each others wedding and also each served as godfather for the others children first born.

He described Eisenhower as a square shooter and a diplomat. For example, Horkan wanted to be Quartermaster General when Eisenhower was Chief of Staff. Eisenhower told him that he would prefer personally for Horkan to be Quartermaster General but that he could find no fault with the present Quartermaster General and he would not recommend Horkan. By so doing, he won Horkan's additional respect for his straightforwardness, although he was disappointed at the time.

He stated that Eisenhower is demanding and expects things to be done properly. He also stated that Eisenhower is a very sensitive person which should not at any time be overlooked. He said that General Eisenhower is trusting and is in for many rude jolts if he is elected. For example, he would be unable to understand how a Congressman would be able to tell him one thing at ten o'clock and then the Congressman do another thing an hour later.

On the contrary, one reference was located on Page 67 of the Sixth Report of the Senate Fact-Finding Committee on Un-American Activities, California Legislature, 1951, which includes the following statements in connection with loyalty oaths.

"There seems to be little controversy concerning the idea that actual members of the Communist Party should not be permitted to teach in our schools. The following information has been obtained by Liaison Agent from Mr. Alan LaPlante, Chief, Washington Area Security Operations, Atomic Energy Commission (AEC). On November 19, 1952, the AEC Commissioners (Gordon Dean, Thomas Murray, Eugene Zuckert, and Henry Smyth) went to New York City to brief President-elect Eisenhower on the entire AEC operations and the contemplated program for the next 4 years. According to LaPlante, they were well received by the General who expressed extreme interest. Eisenhower again expressed his concern and displeasure with the disclosures of AEC operations and activities in the public press. You will recall that he mentioned this to the public press. You will recall that he mentioned this to LaPlante when LaPlante briefed him in Georgia concerning the hydrogen bomb explosion. He stated he felt something should be done about this.

LaPlante commented that while he was waiting in the outer office for the Commissioners to finish their meeting, the General's Secretary came out and made the comment to the Appointment Secretary that he could see no reason for "these CIA men" to have to come in to see the General every day. He felt that one briefing a week by the CIA representatives would be enough and that it appeared that these daily meetings were merely taking up time.

It is not normally the practice of this Bureau to investigate employees of the White House. Ordinarily the Civil Service Commission conducts investigations of persons entering on duty in the classified Government positions. We also know, from past experience, that the United States Secret Service conducts investigations of at least some of the individuals employed at the White House.

It is assumed, therefore, that individuals on duty at the White House or in the Executive Offices of the President have been checked against files of this Bureau and, of course, if such a check had developed information reflecting upon their loyalty, a full field investigation under the Loyalty Program would have been conducted concerning them; otherwise, as above-stated, any investigation of such persons would have been made either by the Civil Service Commission or the United States Secret Service.

General Eisenhower has appointed a small committee of which Nelson Rockefeller is the Chairman, with the purpose of assisting him in making recommendations for changes in the Executive Departments.

It will be very much appreciated if you will give Mr. Rockefeller a report on such personnel as he may request. He will communicate directly with you listing the names of these people.
