



### SMITH ACT CASE - DENVER

### BACKGROUND

Complaints were filed and warrants issued on July 30, 1954 at Denver, Colorado, after preparation by Departmental Attorneys on the following:

- 1. ARTHUR BARY, Director of the Rocky Mountain
  Region of the Communist Party, and Western
  United States Communist Party Underground
  Leader.
- 2. ANNA BARY, member, Colorado State Board, Communist Party, who was in an underground reserve
  status.
- 3. HAROLD ZEPELIN, District Organizer, Communist Party of Colorado.
- 4. LEWIS MARTIN JOHNSON, District Organizer of the Communist Party for the State of Utah.
- 5. PATRICIA JULIA BLAU, formerly in the Communist
  Party Underground in California, and former
  member of Colorado State Board of the Communist
  Party.
- 6. MAIA SCHERRER, Section Organizer of the Communist
  \*Party at Pueblo, Colorado.
- 7. JOSEPH WILLIAM SCHERRER, Branch Leader of the Commentst Party at Pueblo, Colorado.

Of the above seven subjects, four were in the Communist Party Underground at the time the warrants were issued; namely, ARTHUR and ANNA BARY, LEWIS MARTIN JOHNSON, and HAROLD ZEPELIN.

### **APPREHENSIONS**

ARTHUR and ANNA BARY, HAROID ZEPELIN, and LEWIS MARTIN
JOHNSON were apprehended by FBI Agents on Sunday afternoon,
August 1, 1954, in front of the Olin Hotel, 1420 Logan Street,
Denver, Colorado, where these four individuals met on the
street. JOSEPH WILLIAM SCHERRER was apprehended by FBI Agents
at his residence, Pueblo, Colorado, on August 2, 1954, and
MAIA SCHERRER was taken into custody by the FBE at the Municipal
Airport, Denver, Colorado, on the same day. PATRICIA JULIA
BLAU was apprehended by Agents of the Los Angeles Office at
her residence in Los Angeles on the evening of August 1, 1954.

### CURRENT STATUS OF PROSECUTION

All seven subjects were indicted by a Federal Grand
Jury, for violation of Smith Act, at Denver, Colorado, on
August 9, 1954. These defendants have been brought into
Federal Court on several occasions for arraignment on \*
indictment before Federal Judge JEAN BREITENSTEIN, and arraignments have been postponed because the defendants claimed they
have not as yet been able to obtain counsel. Arraignment is

now scheduled for September 15, 1954. No date has been set for trial.

### STATUS OF DEFENDANTS

All seven of the above defendants are currently detained in Denver County Jail in default of bond with the exception of MAIA and JOSEPH SCHERRER, who have been released on bonds set at \$5,000 each. The bonds for the remaining defendants, who are still in jail, are as follows:

PATRICIA JULIA BLAU	10,000

The total bonds set in this case, therefore, amount to \$105,000.

Of the above, Judge BREITENSTEIN, U. S. Attorney KELLEY, and U. S. Marshal KIMBALL were recommended for appointment by Senator EUGENE MILLIKEN (Republican), Junior U. S. Senator for Colorado.

The Denver FBI Office has excellent relations with all of the above.

### CURRENT POLITICAL SITUATION IN COLORADO

The following is submitted in view of the fact that there has been considerable newspaper publicity in Denver concerning the coming elections:

### U. S. SENATOR

Senator EDWIN C. JOHNSON (Democrat) is not a candidate. The Republican candidate is GORDON ALLOTT, presently Lieutenant Governor. The Democratic candidate for U. S. Senator has not been selected. A Primary Election will be held September 14, 1954, between JOHN A. CARROLL, Denver, former Congressman, and QUIGG NEWTON, present Mayor of Denver. This has been a very spirited and heated campaign, receiving considerable newspaper publicity.

### GOVERNOR

Governor DAN THORNTON is not a candidate for any public office. The Republican candidate for Governor is State Senator DONALD G. BROTZMAN, while the Democratic candidate is U. S. Senator EDWIN C. JOHNSON.

GOVERNOR THORNTON, a personal friend of President EISENHOWER, has been very friendly with the Denver Office, and spoke very highly of you in connection with his recent visit with you while in Washington, D. C.

### BOETTCHER KIDNAPING CASE

You will recall that in 1933 the BOETTCHER kidnaping case broke in Denver. Briefly, the following facts are brought to your attention:

About midnight on February 12, 1933, upon returning to his residence with his wife, CHARLES BOETTCHER II, then age 31, son of a wealthy and prominent Denver family, was kidnaped by REO VERNE SANKEY, was., and GORDON FRANCIS ALCORN, was., who left a rensom note with Mrs. BOETTCHER demanding \$60,000 for his release. BOETTCHER was immediately driven to SANKEY's ranch near Kimball, South Dakota, where he was held pending payment of the ransom, with ARTHUR HENRY YOUNGBERG acting as a guard. CARL W. PEARCE typed a number of notes sent to BOETTCHER's father. On March 1, 1933, the ransom money was thrown over a culvert north of Denver, Colorado, and BOETTCHER was released in Denver the same night.

On March 7, 1933, YOUNGBERG was arrested at Kimball, South Dakota, by Denver Police. On May 27, 1933, in the U. S. District Court at Denver, he was sentenced to sixteen years and fined \$1,000 for his participation. CARL W. PEARCE was arrested by Denver Police on March 5, 1933 at Denver. On May 27, 1933, in the Federal Court at Denver, he was sentenced to twenty-six years.

SANKEY and ALCORN were arrested on January 31, 1934 and February 1, 1934 in Chicago, Illinois, by the FBI and were

immediately taken to Sioux Falls, South Dakota, where an indictment was outstanding against them for the kidnaping. On February 8, 1934, SANKEY committed suicide by hanging himself in the jail. On February 9, 1934, ALCORN was sentenced to serve the rest of his life in a Federal penitentiary.

The above is being brought to your attention at this time since CLAUDE BOETTCHER, the father of the above victim, presently resides in Denver, and is a personal friend of President EISENHOWER. Mr. BOETTCHER recently advised me that President EISENHOWER was a guest in his home.

### BERT KEATING - DISTRICT ATTORNEY AT DENVER

Of possible interest to you, BERT KEATING (Democrat), who is District Attorney in Denver, was seriously injured in an automobile accident on Thursday evening, September 9, 1954. He was crushed under his car when it plunged over an embankment in Turkey Creek Canon, which is located in the mountains near Denver. As of September 10, 1954, he was in Mercy Hospital, where his condition is reported as satisfactory but serious. He suffered numerous bone fractures.

You will recall that KEATING is outgoing President of the National Association of County and Prosecuting Attorneys, having been so elected at the National Convention in Denver last year. Mr. CLEGG attended this convention.

EUGENE SMALDONE, WAS., ET AL OBSTRUCTION OF JUSTICE, BRIBERY, CONSPIRACY, CONTEMPT OF COURT

You will recall that the captioned case involving the SMALDONE Gang in Denver, Colorado, received considerable publicity on a local and national basis during the fall of 1953. I am briefly setting forth for your ready reference certain facts surrounding that case in view of the fact that there is currently appearing in the Denver papers newspaper publicity since the matter is now being argued on appeal in Denver.

gamblers, mobsters, and hoodlums, who controlled the criminal element in the Denver area for many years. In connection with a federal income tax case, EUGENE SMALDONE was tried in June, 1953, in the United States District Court, Denver, on charges of income tax evasion. The jury was unable to reach a verdict and retrial of the case was scheduled for September 21, 1953.

As a result, the Denver

FBI Office was requested to conduct an immediate investigation of possible jury tampering by then United States Attorney CHARLES VIGIL and Federal Judge WILLIS W. RITTER. The Denver FBI Office conducted an immediate investigation and as a result, an indict-

ment was returned on September 21, 1953, by the Federal Grand Jury, charging EUGENE SMALDONE, WILLIAM CALVARESI, and JERRY BENALLO, JR. with violations of the Obstruction of Justice, Bribery, and Conspiracy Statutes. These three subjects were arrested by FBI Agents at Denver on September 21, 1953. A similar indictment was returned against CLYDE SMALDONE on September 22, 1953, and he was arrested by FBI Agents on September 24, 1953.

Late on the afternoon of September 21, 1953, United States Attorney VIGIL requested the Denver FBI Office to interrogate the currently sitting jury panel and to investigate the jury panel. You will recall that he was advised that a jury panel investigation required approval of the Department, and the Department refused the request of United States Attorney VIGIL.

The Internal Revenue Service then interrogated the remaining members of the jury panel and as a result, additional indictments were returned on similar charges against FIORE SMALDONE, LOUIS F. SMALDONE, MICHAEL J. BENALLO, and JOSEPH F. CEFALU. After a trial by jury, five of the above defendants were found guilty on October 29, 1953, and were sentenced as follows:

EUGENE SMALDONE, 60 years plus \$24,000 fine; CLYDE SMALDONE, 60 years, plus \$24,000 fine; WILLIAM CALVARESI, 15 years plus \$5,000 fine; JERRY BENALLO, JR., 15 years plus \$5,000 fine; MICHAEL J. BENALLO, 10 years plus \$5,000 fine.

The remaining three defendants were not tried at that time.

You will recall that Judge RITTER at the time of the sentencing of the five principal subjects made some caustic remarks concerning the failure of the Justice Department to permit the FBI to continue the investigation in this matter. This subsequently became a political controversy and was culminated by a hearing by the Senate Judiciary Committee in Denver under the chairmanship of Senator WILLIAM LANGER of North Dakota, on December 12, 1953. You will further recall that WARREN OLNEY, Assistant Attorney General in charge of the Criminal Division of the Department, appeared at this hearing and after an all-day session, the hearing adjourned with charges and countercharges being made by the various members of the Committee against each other.

This particular phase of the SMALDONE Case has received no additional publicity in the Denver area during recent months, but the convictions of the five principal defendants were appealed and were argued before the 10th United States Circuit Court of Appeals in Denver on September 9, 1954, and the case is currently under advisement.





### I. MATIONAL CRIME PICTURE

### A. TREEDS

### From and Aural Crime Frends, 1952-53

There was a general increase in crime across the country during 1953 as compared with 1958, with the totals up 4.5% in the cities and 9.6% in the rural areas. A comparison of the more serious primes reflects the following:

### Crime in 1953 (Urban and Rural)

Major crimes went over the 2 million mark again in 1953 - 6% above 1952 - for a new high of 2,159,080 estimated major orines and the rise cannot be charged to the increase in population alone. The population of the U.S. rose 5% between 1950 and 1953, but orine totals rose more than 20% in that same period. Murders and negligent manelaughters took 12,810 lives in 1958 as compared to 12,860 victims the year before. Respectes numbered 63,100 with an average of \$222 lost per robbery. Ropes increased from 17,840 in 1952 to 17,900 in 1953 and aggrowated assaults increased from 1952's 87,930 to 92,800 in 1953. There were 479,180 burglaries reported in 1953 causing a less of more than 78 million dellers in money and property. There was 8.5% rise in crime during the first siz months of 1954 as compared with a similar period last year. Buring this same period, the Nation's population rose loss than 8%. There were an estimated 1,186,140 erimes from January to June of 1954, 88,850 more than for the same period in 1953. Urban crime rates rose 7.2% and rural rates increased 11.9% during the latest reporting period over the January-June rates of 1953.

### B. JUTENILE CRIME TREADS - 1953

Of the 1,791,160 arrests recorded by the 1,174 reporting cities over 3,500 in population, 8.4% were persons 17 years of age at less, and 14.7% were under 21. In the category of auto thefts, 53.6% of all persons arrested were fuveniles, and in fact 29% were not even old enough to get a regular driver's license in most states.

Hearly half of the persons arrested for burglary were not yet 18, and two-thirds of these were under 16 years of age. Persons under 21 represented 50.6% of the arrests for crimes against property-robbery, burglary, larceny, auto thefts, embezzlement and fraud, buying and receiving stelen property, and forgery and counterfeiting.

### C. PLASORNIL FIGUEES

Total FBI employees, including Special Agents, as of September 2, 1954, was 14,737. Total Special Agents was 6104.

### III. COOPERATIVE TURCTIONS

### A. IDENTIFICATION DIVISION

As of August 31, 1954, there were 133,173,037 sets of prints on file, of which 26,164,943 were orinical prints. The settented number of persons represented in the orinical prints was 20,312,439 and 60,151,555 in the menorizinal prints. Buring August, 1954, there were 473,404 sets of prints received, of which 135,272 were crimical prints. There were 942 fugitives identified during the month of August, 1954. Buring the 1954 fiscal year there were 12,636 contributors, of which 76 contributors were from the State of Colorado.

#### B. FRI LABORATORY

A CONTRACTOR

During the 1954 fiscal year the FBI laboratory made ever 126,000 examinations in FBI cases and for local, state and Federal law enforcement agencies.

### C. PRI KATIONAL ACADEMY

Braduates through the SSrd Session, which was completed on June 11, 1954, total 2026. The 54th Session began August 39, 1954, with 78 members, including Captain Jack E. Stiffler, Pueblo, Colorado, Police Department. The State of Colorado has had 32 areduates.

### IV. CONSUMIST PARTY LINE

The March 7, 1954, issue of the "Daily Worker" set forth the new governing principles of the Communist Farty, USA. This Party "line" is known as the Communist Party Draft Program and returns the Party's thinking to the World War II days when the Party represented itself as the proponent of free government and the defender of all things imerican.

The Draft Program denies that the BSSR threatens the U.S. and declares it seeks "no conflict with any church or any incrioun religious belief." The Farty further declares that the country is on the brink of a depression and that incrioun foreign policy has led us up a blind alley.

The Communists call for Government expenditure for "human welfare and not warfare." Coexistence with the USAR and its estellites is the core of Communist thought. The election of "progressive" candidates and the defeat of the present Administration are also called for by the Draft Frogram.

In connection with this program, the Communist Party is printing and distributing a million copies of a booklet estitled "The American Ray-To Jobs, Proce and Denocracy." This 23-page booklet is being sent to libraries, political efficials, Congressmen, and asyons who has any standing in the community.

### V. SHITE ACT TRIALS

HEV TORK: Riepen Sational Board Members. Found guilty October 14, 1949; conviction confirmed by Supreme Court June 4, 1951. Two jugitives being rought.

HET TORK: Twenty-one leaders indicted June 20, 1951. Seventeen arrested. Four went underground, one later apprehended. Two nevers due to 111 health. Result of trial - two moquitted, thirteen convicted. Appeal pending.

BALTINORE: Six functionaries errested December 7 and 8, 1951. Tric began March 10, 1952. All found guilty April 1, 1982. Sentenced April 4, 1952. All fined \$1,000 and given terms ranging from two to five years. Convictions affirmed by U. S. Circuit Court of Appeals July 31, 1952. All subjects presently incarcorated.

PITTSBURGH: Six arrested August 17, 1951. Trial started Bovember 1952, and ended August 20, 1953. One subject severed due to ill health. Five convicted to five years each. Appeal pending.

MONOLULU: Meven leaders arrested August 28, 1951. Trial began formber 5, 1952. Guilty perdict returned June 19, 1953, on all subjects. Appeal pending. 69019

CALIFORNIA: Toelve Fest Goast functionaries arrested Les Angeles, July 25, 1951. Three ethers en August 31, 1951. One severed due to ill health. (Tetal fourteen). Trial began February 1, 1952. Found guilty August 5, 1952. Bentenced August 7, 1952. Appeal pending.

PETROIT: Six leaders arrested September 17, 1952. Trial began Rovember 2, 1953, and on February 16, 1954, all were found guilty and sextenced to terms ranging from 4 to 5 years. Appeal pending.

BT. 10015: Five leaders arrested September 17, 1952. Trial began on February 1, 1954, and on June 4, 1954, all were sentenced to terms ranging from 8 to 5 years.

STATTLE: Seven leaders arrested September 17, 1952. On October 10, 1953, five were convicted to 5 years such. There was one suicide during the course of the trial and one sequittal.

PHILADELPHIA: In July and August, 1953, a total of mine leaders were arrested. Trial began on March 22, 1954, and the presecution and defense rested on August 2, 1954. All defendants found guilty on August 13, 1954, No date set for sentencing.

CLEVELY BD: On October 6, 1953, eight leaders were arrested and on Boumber 4, 1953, an additional three were apprehended. Trial is tentatively scheduled for October, 1954.

HIN HAVEE: Seven leaders arrested on May 29, 1954. All out on bond. So trial date set.

CHICAGO: Claude Mack Lightfoot arrested on June 26, 1954. Indictment was based on membership clause of Smith Act rather than conspiracy clause which was the case in all previous arrests. Maximum penalty project membership clause is 10 years or \$10,000, or both, which is double the conspiracy clause's maximum. Trial is tentatively set for September 21, 1954.

PETYER: Seven leaders were arrested in Denver and Pueblo, Colorado and Les Angeles, California, on August 1 and 2, 1954. Bond was set at \$10,000 for six and \$30,000 for the seventh. On August 4, 1954, Maia and Joseph Beherrer were released on \$5,000 bond. Other five subjects still in jail.

As by September 9, 1954, 117 Communist leaders have been arrested and 81 convicted. Prison terms total 311 years and fines total \$421,000.

### DERVER

### CHIME CONDITIONS:

Denver, it will be recalled, was for years the home of the widely publicated Smaldone gang headed by two brothers, Clyde and Eugene. In October, 1953, Clyde and Eugene Smaldone were each sentenced to eastly years en charges of obstruction of justice, bribery and conspiracy. On February 17, 1954, the brothers started serving their sentences at Leavenworth. The case has been appealed and arguments will probably be heard by the Appellate Court in the 1954 Fall Term. Several additional members of this gang have also been indicted and face trials during the Fall of 1954.

As of August, 1954, reliable sources have developed no information indicating that any person or group was seeking to perpetuate the racketeering and gambling sativities formerly controlled by the Smaldones.

The Denver Office has received no data during this year to indicate there is any political tie-ups with criminal activities in the Greater Denver area.

The Denver Police Department's Annual Report for 1953, released in Narch of 1954, reflects no major over-all increase in serious effenses between 1952 and 1953.

### LAW ENFORCEMENT RELATIONS:

We have had friendly and cordial relations with the Denver Police Department which until April 3, 1954, was under the leadership of Chief of Police Herbert E. Forsyth. Forsyth resigned effective April 3, 1954, because of \$11 health, and Walter F. Johnson was appointed now Chief of Police. He was formerly Division Chief in Charge of the uniformed ranks. Johnson is a graduate of Northwestern University course in police administration and traffic and has been connected with the Denver Police Department since November 1, 1934, He wrote him a letter of congratulations upon his appointment as Chief.

The Denver Police Department has four men on active duty at the present time who are graduates of the FBI National Academy. For a short time in 1950, the Bureau discontinued eccepting students for the Matienal Academy from the Denver Police Department and else refused to provide any instruction for the officers of the Benver Police Department. This was not eccasioned by any trouble with the police department itself but because of trouble we had with Mayor Quigg Newton of Denver. In December, 1949, the American Municipal Association edopted a resolution unfriendly to the Bureau with reference particularly to police training policies and indicated the Bureau s policies were handloapping their state programs. Information received indicated that the antagonian was openheaded by Mayor Devin of Sectile. The sene convention elected Mayor Quigo Newton of Denver as President. Repeated efforts erally and by letter to get the American Municipal Association to furnish specifications documenting their allegation were fruitless.

### CRI'S FIGURES:

In comparing crime figures for the first six months is 1954 with a similar period for 1953, the following is noted: marker decreased 23.1%; robbery increased 27.6%; aggravated assault increased 22.1%; burglary increased 22.9%; largery increased 3.8% and auto theft increased 6.7%. These figures concerning Denver are based on a comparison with urban crime figures in the United Statesy

on August 20, 1933, the Pest corried a critical editorial entitled "Dehind In His Readin". The editorial stated that apparently Mr. Hoover had never read the report of the Subcommittee of the Senate Committee on Elections and Privileges nor had he read a pemphlet by the Visconsin Citizens' Conmittee on McCarthy's record. The editorial pointed out that Mr. Hoover had said Senator McCarthy is both "cornest and honest" and inferred that McCarthy's enemies comprise the "opposition inevitable to one who estacks subversives of any kind." It is pointed out that if Mr. Hoover had read the documents mentioned he would have heavily qualified his endorsement of McCarthy's integrity.

The elitorial continues by stating that the endorsement of McCarthy is a poor way "for Er. Hoover to cultivate the trust of the free people who heretafere had entermined no fears that the FBI would depart from the sterm injunctions of constitution and statute in presecution of its Suties."

At the Oridiran Club dinner on 12/12/53 Mr. Michels jumped on Palmer Hoyt about this editorial. Next was apalegetic saying the Post was anti-McCarthy and was taking a crack at him although they had nothing against the FBI or Mr. Hower. Hoyt eaid they didn't agree with Mr. Hoover's views on McCarthy but they were not being anti-FBI. The Post is a crusading type of paper and with this one exception has been basically friendly to our Denver Office and the Bureau.

By sir-tel dated March 30, 1953, SAC Denver transmitted a copy of a column by Rescoe Fleming of The Denver Post" which was dated March 27, 1953. Fleming stated in this column that columnist Housian Maring inquired of the Director as to the identity of two men who used a recorder in interviewing a Denver University dean and that the Director enswered they were not FBI men and that the FBI never carried recorders. The two investigators were actually

from the Atomic Energy Countesion, and we wrote to Palmer Hoyt, Editor and Publisher of the Denver Post, on April 3, 1953, and advised him of the true fauts in this matter.

It should further be noted that on May 13, 1934, we sent a note to Hoyt concerning favorable articles by Charles Hoss of the Denver Post staff. These articles were very favorable to the Bureau.

on May 25, 1954, the Director wrote Royt regarding a Kry favorable editorial on the Director's 30th Anniversary.

On August 11, 1954, Director wrote Hoyt on an editorial entitled "The FBI Strikes" which dealt with our work in the internal security field.





I told Walsh that as yet there has been no move to get the federal to get action in the sit-down sthorities to move emonstrations. I commented that I have been amazed at the restraint shown by the local citizenry and I thought the police have been doing a very worthwhile job in maintaining order, and as long as it does not get out of hand the federal government should stay out. I told Walsh that I thought it was bad for the NAACP to start such demonstrations as they tend to invite riots; that the NAACP states riots should be provented but the Negroes go into these restaurants with brickbats and of course the whites to the same. Walsh was informed that the NAACP is appealing some of the arrests of Negroes for trespassing or for disturbing the peace and I commented that this is the only way I can see where the federal government might get into it. I further commented that many communities have laws that no one is required to serve food if he does not want to do so. I commented such a situation was different from one involving the Greybound Bus where the court might construe it to be a public utility, for instance where a bus stops at a certain place for food and food is deated to the colored people and there is no other place for them to go. I stated so far I did not see where this could be applied to private restaurants not utilized in interstate business. I commented that the press will probably question the President concerning these matters and he certainly should be prepared with answers.

The Deputy Attorney General stated he has requested that something be gotten up for the President for his use. He then mentioned that there are some states which require segregation which might involve the 14th Amendment, and I told him that this was an area which I did want to touch on but I wanted to do some legal research on it first so as to be sure of our ground. Walsh stated he would get this up for us.






