Bufiles do not indicate that the Tampa Office has initiated an investigation of the July 26 Movement there. The scope and seriousness of the organizational activity, heavily infiltrated by communists, as described in the attached document give rise to the questions not only of whether there is some validity to the data but also of whether the prior coverage of the Cuban situation by the Tampa Office will enable an accurate appraisal. This is particularly true in the absence of any past intensive investigative attack upon the July 26 Movement activity in Tampa. It is recognized that data provided by [redacted] may be colored to some extent by his anti-Castro position. However, this information cannot be discounted and must be resolved investigatively.

By 12-1-60 the Bureau desires that the Miami Office submit a complete and detailed report on the organized activities of the July 26 Movement, Tampa, Florida, from inception to the point that the Tampa Office was created. This should include all pertinent data available during that period. The report should also include all pertinent data from the attached document regarding the applicable period together with all pertinent data available or which can be acquired investigatively which would serve to show the authenticity of the data or the lack thereof on the basis of facts. This report deadline of 12-1-60 must be met. The report should be carefully organized with headings and subheadings where appropriate and a table of comments. Miami should include any comments or conclusions as to the validity of the [redacted] data in an airtel accompanying the report.

The Tampa Office, as office of origin, must submit its first report no later than 12-12-60. It should cover the period from the creation of the Tampa Office to date and include all pertinent data developed regarding the subject organization during that period, pertinent data from the attached document applicable to that period and to the present time and data which would establish by facts the validity, or lack thereof, of the [redacted] supplied by [redacted]. The Tampa Office should include any comments or conclusions as to the validity of the [redacted] data in

an airtel accompanying its report. Included in that airtel should be a specific listing of all separate investigative cases now pending or which have been initiated on individuals named in the b7D [redacted] document. This listing should include the full title, character, Tampa, file number and Bureau file number, where available. Under no circumstances should this organizational file be utilized as a framework within which to initiate and report separate investigations regarding individuals. Data pertinent to the over-all organizational picture should, of course, be extracted from individual case files and included in reports in this case.

The later deadline of 12-12-60 has been set for the Tampa Office to prevent duplicate reporting and to allow a sensible chronology in the presentation of data. This matter must receive continuous and preferred attention in both offices and sufficient personnel must be assigned to meet the deadlines set and to do an effective job.

In order that the Bureau may better evaluate the above-mentioned report the following information is submitted:

The last four pages of the [redacted] report" consists of a list of names of individuals with comments beside each name. It was at once apparent to the Tampa SAs investigating Cuban matters that this list bore great similarity to a list of names received 10/13/60 by SA [redacted] from [redacted] now a PSI of Tampa office. A comparison of the two lists shows they contain the same names and addresses except that [redacted] list contains one name, [redacted] which was not included on the [redacted] list, and the latter contains six names not on [redacted] list. These six are the last five names on [redacted] list and that of [redacted]. Even the order in which the names are listed is similar although there are some variations in the order. The nicknames [redacted] and [redacted] appear on both lists, as do the incomplete names [redacted]. Whereas the [redacted] list contains the incomplete name [redacted] did not name this person but merely listed him as [redacted].

It is noted the only name omitted from the [redacted] list, [redacted] is also the only name on [redacted] list concerning whom there was no identifying data.

Principal differences noted in the two lists are as follows: Whereas the [redacted] list is captioned "List of Members of the Communist Cell Inside the 26th of July Movement Club of Tampa, Florida", [redacted] identified his list as merely the names of people affiliated with one of the pro-FIDEL CASTRO organizations in Tampa, the Patriotic Movement of Tampa for Aid to Cuban Farmers or the 26th of July Movement. Moreover, the comments in [redacted] list are for the most part identifying data only such as residence, employment, affiliation, whereas the [redacted] list contains in almost every instance additional comments such as "Agent of the D.I.E.R.", "Active member of the Communist Party", etc.

From the foregoing comparison it was apparent that:

- (1) [redacted] had obtained the list from [redacted] or (2) [redacted] had obtained his list from [redacted] or (3) [redacted] and [redacted] had each obtained the list from a common source.

On 11/23/60 PSI [redacted] advised SAs [redacted] and [redacted] that the list he had furnished was personally prepared by him from his own knowledge of the individuals thereon or from information he has received concerning them from his associates in Tampa. He said the only copies of the list other than the one furnished the FBI were given by him to [redacted]

[redacted] and to [redacted] Miami. On further questioning he admitted he did not personally deliver the list to [redacted] but gave it to "an intermediary" [redacted]. Although obviously reluctant to identify this "intermediary" he eventually did so, saying [redacted]. He requested this information be kept confidential. [redacted] was asked whether he had information any of the persons on the list was an agent of the D.I.E.R. or whether he had ever told anyone these people were D.I.E.R. agents. He said he never did so for the reason he has no way of knowing who might or might not be an agent of D.I.E.R.

Reference is now made to Bulet to Miami 11/29/60 captioned "CUBAN INTELLIGENCE ACTIVITIES IN THE UNITED STATES; IS-CUBA."

It is believed that this office has pretty well established that the list furnished by [redacted] emanated from [redacted] and that, as pointed out in TP refairtel, someone along the line added a few names plus uncorroborated statements indicating certain individuals as DIER agents.

It is suggested that if the Bureau has not already done so, they request the [redacted] list to have [redacted] questioned along the lines set out in Bulet 11/29/60 concerning Cuban intelligence activities.

MM T-1 advised on 11/7/60 that Tampa organization of "July 26th Movement" second in stature in planned infiltration of U.S. by Cuban "Red agents". July 26 Movement, Tampa, Fla., founded in 11/55 on occasion of visit to Tampa by FIDEL CASTRO, leader of July 26 Movement. CASTRO stated purpose of Movement to remove BATISTA Government and restore liberty and democratic government to Cuban people. VICTORIANO MANTEIGA named to head Tampa Club in 11/55. Total of \$191.02 collected at meeting 11/27/55. MANTEIGA advised in 4/56 no July 26 Club then in existence in Tampa, but that he and 3 others met weekly at office of his newspaper, Spanish weekly "La Gaceta", and contributed \$1. per week each for support of CASTRO in Mexico. Stated RAUL VILLAMIA then acting as Secretary-Treasurer. MM T-1 said no "real and positive action" inside this organization until 1957. Said "real revolutionary activities began" 10/15/57 with Comite de Ayuda a la Liberacion Cubana (Committee to Aid Cuban Liberation) (CALC) which included leaders from July 26 Movement and other groups. MM T-3 advised first activity in 1957 on behalf of FIDEL CASTRO took place in Tampa on 6/30/57. July 26 Club members reported to have picketed Cuban Consulate on 7/25/57 per "Tampa Tribune", 7/26/57. "Diario Las Americas", Miami Spanish daily newspaper, published letter from VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, 9/25/57, in which he stated he was then President

of July 26 Movement of Tampa. Dr. GARCIA MENENDEZ advised 12/57 that Central Committee for Revolutionary Unity formed 10/57 to unite Cubans opposed to BATISTA, and included members of 26 of July Movement. VICTORIANO MANTEIGA advised 11/57 that July 26 Movement, Tampa, had been split and that other groups headed by Dr. GARCIA MEMENDEZ, ANIBAL VELAZ and RAUL VIANA joined Committee for Revolutionary Unity. MANTEIGA advised on 2/13/58 he believed Committee for Revolutionary Unity had died and that he had resigned as President of July 26 Movement of Tampa. "La Gaceta", 1/17/58, listed Dr. EDUARDO V. MIJARES PUJALS as President. MM T-3 advised 3/58 that July 26 Movement activity had come to standstill. July 26 Club demonstration by 8 persons held 12/31/58, downtown Tampa. MM T-1 advised CALC dissolved by CASTRO after fall of BATISTA 1/1/59, and July 26 Club reinstated with FELIPE JIMENEZ as President. Said VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, although appearing retired, is President. "La Gaceta" reported meetings of July 26 Club, Tampa, in August and October, 1959, with CARLOS CARBONELL listed as Secretary. The 2/26/60 issue of "La Gaceta" lists VICTORIANO MANTEIGA as President. MM T-1 alleged all officers and members of July 26 Club of Tampa "are active Communist Party members or agents of CASTRO's G-2 Organization", and furnished "list of members of Communist cell inside the '26th of July Movement Club' of Tampa, Florida." Available information re names listed by MM T-1 set forth. MM T-13 advised that as of 2/3/58 there were 7 CP members in Tampa. Status under Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended, set forth.

Information was received from MM T-1 on November 7, 1960.

According to MM T-1, the "July 26th Movement" organization in Tampa, Florida, is second in stature in the United States, and first in Florida, in the planned Communist infiltration of the United States by Cuban "Red agents". This is attributed to the large Cuban and inter-related Spanish-Latin colony in Tampa consisting primarily of elements of the "lower social classes or the working class, the ones that give most of their members to the Communist movement throughout the world...", and to the pressure exerted by the "powerful Spanish Commies of Tampa - the oldtimers of the Spanish Civil War - who have remained in obscurity throughout the years, but, who, now, when ordered by the leaders of International Communism rallied around the Cuban Communist Revolutionary Group."

I. ORIGIN OF THE JULY 26TH MOVEMENT OF TAMPA, FLORIDA, November, 1955, to Mid-1957

MM T-1 advised that in 1955, FIDEL CASTRO was in exile in Mexico, and was ordered by General ALBERTO BAYO to visit cities in the United States having a large Latin population, such as New York, Tampa and Miami, to establish 26 of July Movement clubs, which would eventually become an "organized Communist nucleus inside the United States". In connection with the organization of the Tampa club, General BAYO furnished CASTRO with the names of two men, VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, publisher of Spanish newspaper "La Gaceta", and Dr. JORGE A. XTRELLES, owner of Dr. Trelles Clinic, Inc. These individuals were contacted

by emissaries of CASTRO one week prior to his arrival in Tampa. When he reached Tampa, CASTRO was to personally choose one of these individuals to become organizer and head of the July 26 Movement in Tampa. CASTRO subsequently visited Dr. TRELLES, but TRELLES refused the post, not due to any disagreement, but because he was already head of another political organization, Organizacion Autentica, the militant division of the Authentic Party whose head was CARLOS PRIO SOCARRAS, former President of Cuba, overthrown by BATISTA in March, 1952. CASTRO then approached VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, who accepted the position.

MM T-1 advised that on November 25, 1955, a Patriotic Club of the 26 of July Movement was formed at the Union Club, 19th Street and 12th Avenue, Tampa, Fla with officers as follows:

1. VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, President
2. RAUL VILLAMIA, Secretary
3. FLORENTINO SANTOS, Treasurer
4. CARLOS CARBONELL, Chief of Publications.

Regarding General ALBERTO BAYO, mentioned above, it is noted that on July 8, 1957, EDUARDO HERNANDEZ, then Cuban Consul General in Miami, Florida, advised that General BAYO was born March 28, 1892, at Camaguay, Cuba, but later went to Spain, where he served with the Spanish Republican (Loyalists) Army, and following the defeat of that army by forces of FRANCISCO FRANCO, BAYO went to Mexico under the sponsorship of LOMBARDO TOLEDANO, described by HERNANDEZ as a Mexican Communist labor leader.

On November 15, 1955, MM T-2, who was at that time a [redacted] Cuba Fla

[redacted] advised that FIDEL CASTRO RUZ arrived in Miami during the preceding week from Mexico City, where he had been attempting to collect funds for the purpose of overthrowing the BATISTA Government in Cuba. MM T-2 said

that CASTRO claimed to lead an organization known as the Patriotic Clubs of July 26, with a large following in Cuba, and that he planned to organize chapters of this club in Miami and Tampa.

On November 23, 1955, [redacted] Investigator, Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), Miami, advised that FIDEL CASTRO had come to the INS office in Miami, at which time he had been interrogated regarding his status as an alien in the United States. CASTRO, according to [redacted] last entered the United States on October 20, 1955, at San Antonio, Texas. During this interview, CASTRO advised that he entered the United States for the purpose of visiting his son, and at the same time to comply with invitations which Cubans in New York, Miami, Tampa and Key West had made to him for the purpose of explaining to Cubans in the United States the situation in Cuba, as well as his ideas and plans as the leader of the Movement of the 26th of July, 1953. CASTRO said the Movement was so named to commemorate the assassination of 80 young Cubans, who on July 26, 1953, made an unsuccessful attempt to overthrow BATISTA. CASTRO stated that the purpose of the Movement was to remove the BATISTA Government and restore liberty and a democratic system of government to the people of Cuba. He denied that he planned to use force at that time to bring about the downfall of BATISTA, but hoped rather to use the force of public opinion. ✓

CASTRO said that the money collected in the United States was to be used for publicity purposes, and the general fight. He claimed that he had remained within the laws of the United States, and that he planned to give talks in Tampa and Key West, Florida. He stated that while in Tampa he could be reached at the home of VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, [redacted], Director of the "Tampa Gazette", a Spanish language newspaper. ✓

CASTRO stated ~~at this time~~ that he had never been a member of any organization affiliated with the Communist Party (CP).

The Communist Party, USA, has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On November 23, 1955, MM T-2 advised that CASTRO was leaving Miami for Tampa, Florida, on the following day.

The November 26, 1955, issue of the "Tampa Tribune", a Tampa daily newspaper, carried an article entitled "Anti Batista Cuban Comes Here to Seek Revolt Funds", by TOM O'CONNOR, Staff Writer, who stated that CASTRO had come to Tampa under the auspices of a recently formed society in Tampa known as the 26 July Club, provisionally headed by VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, publisher of a Spanish language newspaper. CASTRO was quoted as stating, "We will try every legal means to oust the tyrant Batista from Cuba, but failing in that we will take to arms." ✓

SAs [redacted] and [redacted] attended a meeting of the July 26 Club of Tampa, which was held at 3:00 P.M., Sunday, November 27, 1955, at the CIO Hall, 1226 7th Avenue, Tampa. Among the speakers at this meeting was VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, who was introduced as the secretary of the Patriotic Club of July 26 of Tampa. The final speech at this meeting was made by FIDEL CASTRO, who solicited the support of all Cubans who love liberty.

It is noted that on November 29, 1957, the newspaper, "La Gaceta", published a report on the collection which had been taken up at the meeting, which was held two years ago on November 27, 1955, by the July 26 Club of Tampa, at which FIDEL CASTRO spoke. This

report showed that a total contribution of \$191.02 was received, and that expenses of \$81.00 had been incurred. This report was signed by VICTORIANO MANTEIGA and FIDEL CASTRO.

The masthead of the December 20, 1957, issue of "La Gaceta" reflects that it is a Spanish newspaper published every Friday at 2015 15th Street, Tampa, Florida. The editor and publisher was listed as VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, and the Business Manager as ROLAND MANTEIGA. Rolando Manteiga Fla

On January 18, 1956, JUAN ORTA CORDOVA was interviewed by Investigator [redacted] at the office of INS, Miami. ORTA identified himself as the President of the Patriotic Club of July 26 of Miami, Fla and stated that this group was affiliated with the July 26 Movement in Cuba, which he said was headed by FIDEL CASTRO. He said that there were other such clubs in the United States, including a club located in Tampa, Florida, but that the Miami club had no connection with any other club in the United States. b6 b7c

MM T-3, a long time resident of Tampa, Florida, with a wide acquaintance among the Spanish speaking people in that city, advised on February 14, 1956, that he had recently [redacted] He said that MANTEIGA had been named provisional head of the Patriotic Club of July 26 of Tampa, in November, 1955. He said that [redacted] MANTEIGA said that the July 26 Club had had little activity in Tampa, but that there were several people who contributed \$1.00 per week each to the club, which money was going for the support of FIDEL CASTRO and his group in Mexico. b7D

T-3 advised on April 27, 1956, that he had made inquiries among many of his acquaintances of Cuban origin in Tampa, and that nobody seemed to know anything about the Tampa July 26 Club. He stated that in his opinion the club at that time was either non-existent or inactive.

VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, 2015 15th Street, Tampa, Florida, editor of "La Gaceta", advised on April 26, 1956, that at that time there was actually no July 26 Club in existence in Tampa. He said that he first met FIDEL CASTRO when CASTRO came to Tampa in November, 1955, and that he was sympathetic with what CASTRO was trying to do just as he was sympathetic to all opposition to the dictatorship of BATISTA in Cuba. MANTEIGA said that CASTRO made the announcement in Tampa that a club was being founded, and that he had wanted to make it appear that he had substantial backing in Tampa, as well as elsewhere in the United States. MANTEIGA stated, however, that the people of Tampa had not responded to CASTRO's appeal sufficiently to establish a club.

MANTEIGA said that he and three other persons met each Sunday at 11:00 A.M. in the office of "La Gaceta", and each contributed \$1.00 per week. He said that the other three persons who had been attending these Sunday meetings were [redacted]

[redacted] He stated that they had no officers with the exception of [redacted]

[redacted] He recalled at the last meeting [redacted] had reported a total collection of \$42.00 which money remained in the treasury. He said that this money was contributed for the support of CASTRO in Mexico.

MANTEIGA advised that the Tampa group had no contact with any other Patriotic Club of July 26 in the United States, nor with any organized group in Cuba. He said he was aware that there was a large club in Miami, where there was a large colony of Cubans. MANTEIGA said that the president of the Miami club was JUAN CHEDA,

The May 2, 1957, issue of "Diario Las Americas", a Spanish language daily newspaper published in Miami, Florida, contained an article announcing that a meeting of the July 26 Club of Miami was to be held on May 4, 1957,

and that the speakers would include VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, Director of "La Gaceta" of Tampa and president of the July 26 Movement in that city.

MM T-4, a person who was well informed concerning certain Cuban agents, and concerning some counter-revolutionary activities in the Miami area, advised on May 7, 1957, that a meeting of the July 26 Club of Miami was held on May 4, 1957, at 215 N.W. 4th Street, Miami. He said that about 60 persons were present at this meeting, and that among the speakers was VICTORIANO MANTEIGA of Tampa, who commented on the atrocities of the BATISTA regime, and stated that in Cuba there would be no peace until BATISTA disappeared from the scene.

MM T-4 advised on July 15, 1957, that he had attended a meeting of the July 26 Movement of Miami on July 13, 1957. The final speaker of the evening was VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, who stated that two weeks previously a successful meeting had been held in Tampa of the July 26 organization in that city, and that they were uniting because "in union there is strength".

II. STATUS OF JULY 26TH MOVEMENT OF TAMPA, Mid-1957 to December 31, 1958

MM T-1 advised that following the creation of the July 26 Club of Tampa in 1955, and until 1957, there was no "real and positive action inside this organization" because FIDEL CASTRO was still unknown and had not yet received the support of "International Communism". MM T-1 said that on October 15, 1957, in Tampa, the "real revolutionary activities began". "All revolutionary leaders of the different organizations" met, including the July 26 Movement, Authentic Organization (OA), and Revolutionary Directory, and numerous other little groups, at the Clinic of Dr. TRELLES, and formed the Comite de Ayuda a la Liberación Cubana (Committee to Aid Cuban Liberation) (CALC).

MM T-1 said that CALC "did a remarkable job -- from selling bonds to the sending of medicines, armaments, distribution of propaganda for FIDEL CASTRO, and the aid of Cuban Communists persecuted by the BATIS regime. Dr. TRELLES' Clinic was the center of operation of this organization."

The newspaper, "La Gaceta", issue of June 28, 1957, reported that a meeting of Revolutionary Unity had been held the past Sunday at the Flagler Theater in Miami, Florida. This article related that the Tampa delegation to this meeting was composed of VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, FLORENTINO SANTOS, RAUL VILLAMIA, CARLOS CARBONELL, and his son, and ENRIQUE SOMEILLAN.

The "Tampa Tribune" issue of July 1, 1957, contained an article captioned "BATISTA FOES Rally Here, Aid Rebels".

It was stated that "some 200 Tampans of Latin extraction and a scattering of Cuban exiles-heard speakers whip up support here yesterday for Cuban Revolutionary Leader FIDEL CASTRO, who is opposing the regime of President BATISTA." The article stated that JACINTO VASQUEZ, President of the July 26 Club of Miami, and VICTORIANO MANEIGA, who was described as the Tampa leader for CASTRO, addressed the meeting. The article stated that MANEIGA had said that the Cuban people were asking citizens of the United States "only for fair play and not intervention." It was stated that the audience contributed an estimated \$250.00 to help CASTRO. *(u) b6*

On July 16, 1957, MM T-3 advised that he had not attended the meeting of June 30, 1957 in Tampa, but that he had learned from [redacted] that the main purpose of the meeting was to stimulate interest in behalf of CASTRO and to collect funds. *b6 b7C*

MM T-3 said that this meeting was the first activity conducted on behalf of CASTRO in Tampa in 1957, and that he knew of no activity on the part of the July 26 Movement Club in Tampa.

It is noted that on June 24, 1957, VICTORIANO MANEIGA advised SA [redacted] that a meeting was to be held by supporters of FIDEL CASTRO in Tampa on June 30, 1957, and that this activity would be the first such activity in Tampa since CASTRO, himself, had spoken there. MANEIGA stated that in reality there was no July 26 Movement Club in existence in Tampa due to public apathy.

MM T-3 advised on July 18, 1957, that the July 26 Club of Tampa had been active in distributing leaflets on that date at the cigar factory of Perfecto Garcia and

Brothers Company. He said that these leaflets appealed to those workers who had "helped the Spanish Republic when it was attacked by International Fascism" to assist the youth of Cuba and FIDEL CASTRO in returning Cuba to "its liberty". The leaflet was signed "For the 26th of July Club of Tampa, VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, President, RAUL VILLAMIA, Secretary," and was dated July, 1957.

The "Tampa Tribune" issue of July 26, 1957, contained an article captioned "Cubans Place Pickets at Consulate". This article stated that "members of the July 26 Club, sympathizers with the Cuban revolutionists, yesterday set up picket lines in front of the Cuban Consulate Office in downtown Tampa".

The article related that VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, President of the July 26 Club, had stated that members were also collecting donations throughout Tampa to assist some 50 or 60 Cuban youths exiled in Tampa and unable to get work. The article stated that the picketers carried placards attacking BATISTA, and identifying themselves as July 26 Club members.

The September 25, 1957, issue of "Diario Las Americas", in its column entitled "Reloj", published a letter from VICTORIANO MANTEIGA in which MANTEIGA stated that he was then the president of the July 26 Movement of Tampa, and that he had been appointed by FIDEL CASTRO personally.

On October 7, 1957, [redacted] previously mentioned, made available to SA [redacted] a leaflet which stated as follows: "Join the 'July 26th Movement' by becoming a member of the 'July 26th Patriotic Club of Tampa'." This leaflet stated that in order to join this club people could apply at the newspaper "La Gaceta" at 10th Avenue and 15th Street in Ybor City, and that anyone who wished to contribute financial assistance could do so by mailing their contribution to that address.

[redacted] stated that the above-mentioned leaflet was one of a number which had been distributed in Miami by persons unknown to him.

On December 17, 1957, [redacted]

[redacted] advised SA [redacted] that the Central Committee for Revolutionary Unity had been formed in October, 1957, in Tampa by from 10 to 15 persons, members of several different organizations opposed to the administration of BATISTA in Cuba. He said that the purpose of the Committee was to give an "aspect of unity" to the Cubans opposed to BATISTA. [redacted] said that he did not remember the names of all who participated in the formation of this Committee, but that among them were [redacted] VICTOR FERRER, ANIBAL VELAZ, RODOLFO VAZQUEZ, and RAUL VIANA.

[redacted] participated in the founding of the Committee as an individual, but not as a representative of any group.

He said that [redacted]

[redacted] this group then consisted of from 10 to 12 members who meet at 8:00 P.M. each Monday at 1924 East Broadway, Tampa. He stated that these were essentially the same persons who formed the Committee for Revolutionary Unity, with the exception of [redacted] and VICTOR FERRER, neither of whom belonged to the 26 of July Movement. [redacted] stated that VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, who calls himself President of the 26th of July Movement, was the President when the organization was first formed about two years ago. [redacted] stated, however, that the organization had been completely inactive, and that he, himself, had never personally met MANTEIGA. He also identified [redacted] and [redacted] as other members of the July 26th Movement.

It is noted that the "Diario Las Americas" issue of October 10, 1957, carried an announcement in the

column "Reloj" that a ~~Committee~~ Committee for Revolutionary Unity had been established in Tampa, Florida, with VICTOR FERRER, Dr. FRANCISCO GARCIA MENENDEZ, and Dr. JORGE TRELLES as officers. It was stated that the purpose of this Committee was to unite the various factions of the Revolutionary Movement.

On November 18, 1957, VICTORIANO MANTEIGA was interviewed at his office, 2015 15th Street, Tampa, by SA [redacted] stated that he continued to act as President of the 26 of July Movement in Tampa, although the Movement had been split in two. He stated that the other group was headed by Dr. FRANCISCO GARCIA MENENDEZ, ANIBAL VELAZ and RAUL VIANA. MANTEIGA said that he had no respect for and did not wish to associate with the other group as their purpose was only to create "a fuss". MANTEIGA said that he and his associates in the July 26 Movement had had no part in the Tampa Committee for Revolutionary Unity, but that the GARCIA MENENDEZ faction had joined that Committee.

On January 17, 1958, VICTOR FERRER LOPEZ, [redacted] Tampa, advised SA [redacted] that he, as head of the Revolutionary Directory in Tampa, had participated in the founding of the Central Committee for Revolutionary Unity in October, 1957. He said that this Committee was composed of representatives from the various revolutionary groups, and that the faction representing the 26 of July Club consisted of Dr. GARCIA MENENDEZ, RAUL VIANA and Dr. VIRGILIO JACAS. FERRER stated that the sole purpose of the Committee was for the dissemination of propaganda. He said that the original manifesto of the Committee was published in book form and printed in a book shop located on 15th Street opposite the Gonzalez Clinic. He said that he believed the arrangements for the printing had been handled by [redacted] a member of the 26 of July Club, and [redacted] FERRER also stated that other leaflets had been published for the Committee by the ABC Printing Company located in the 1700 block on 28th Avenue. He said that he recalled one of these leaflets had called on the people in Tampa to unite in

opposition to BATISTA, and that another asked people to cooperate with the Committee in the sale of bonds.

On January 24, 1958, Dr. JORGE TRELLES, owner and operator of the Trelles Clinic, 1612 Eighth Avenue, Tampa, advised SA [redacted] that he had assisted in the founding of the Central Committee for Revolutionary Unity, and that he had actually written the original manifesto. He said that in addition to the Authentic Organization, of which he said he was a member, the Committee was represented by members of the 26th of July Club and the Revolutionary Directory.

On February 13, 1958, VICTORIANO MANTIEGA was reinterviewed by SA [redacted] at which time he stated that he had never taken part in the Committee for Revolutionary Unity, and that it was his belief that the Committee had been specifically repudiated by FIDEL CASTRO and had died. MANTIEGA said that he had resigned as President of the July 26 Movement of Tampa, and that he no longer was attending any meetings. He stated that he was personally disgusted with the so-called revolutionary activities because everyone interested had been soliciting contributions individually, and each wanted to be head of his own organization. He said that as a result the people of Tampa had no confidence in any of these organizations.

"La Gaceta" issue of January 17, 1958, on page 11 published a letter addressed to the director of that paper, which stated that "we are sending you the following declarations formulated by the July 26 Revolutionary Club of Tampa". This letter goes on to state that the decisions of the National Director of the July 26 Movement are to be followed without discussion or argument. It asked that all members and sympathizers who were not then in Cuba shedding blood to assist the Movement economically. This letter was signed by the Executive Committee of the ~~26 of July Revolutionary Movement of Tampa~~, and listed Dr. EDUARDO V. MIJARES PUJALS as President, and

July 26 Club Tampa
VIRGILIO JACAS ~~QUINTANA~~ as Secretary General. In a comment *Florida* on the letter, "La Gaceta" stated that it applauded statements of the Executive Committee representing the July 26 Club of Tampa, and mentioned that the director of "La Gaceta" had presided over that club until a few weeks ago.

On February 12, 1958, VICTOR FERRER LOPEZ was recontacted by SA [] and advised that at that time there was no organized revolutionary activity in Tampa due to the dissention within the July 26 Movement. He said that one club headed by Dr. GARCIA MENENDEZ had broken off from the original organization, and that to that date all efforts to resolve their differences had been unsuccessful.

On March 11, 1958, MM T-3 advised that in recent weeks the activity of the July 26 Movement in Tampa had come to a standstill with the exception of the distribution on March 8, 1958, of some circulars over the signature of the "Directing Committee, Patriotic Club of July 26 of Tampa", which appealed for contributions.

On December 31, 1958, MM T-3 advised that the July 26 Patriotic Club of Tampa had made plans to stage a demonstration on that date at 15th Street and 10th Avenue in Tampa to protest the bombing of the civilian population of Cuba by BATISTA.

At approximately 4:30 P.M., on December 31, 1958, SA [] observed a group of eight pickets parading back and forth on the sidewalk in front of the U.S. Post Office Building in downtown Tampa. These individuals carried placards identifying themselves as representatives of the July 26 Patriotic Club of Tampa, and protesting the bombing of Cuban civilians by Batista.

III. STATUS OF THE JULY 26TH MOVEMENT OF TAMPA
January 1, 1959, to May 31, 1960

MM T-1 advised that following the fall of the BATISTA regime "a number of figures of the July 26 Movement of Tampa were given important positions in the new Communist regime." MM T-1 also advised that the CALC was dissolved by order of CASTRO, and that the Patriotic Club of July 26 came back into existence with the following officers:

According to MM T-1, however, "the president of this organization is VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, although he appears retired from political activity."

It is noted that the government of FULGENCIO BATISTA was overthrown on January 1, 1959, and the forces of FIDEL CASTRO assumed control of the Cuban Government.

On January 3, 1959, Inspector [redacted] Chief of the Tampa Police Department Detective Bureau, advised SA STEPHEN J. LABADIE that on January 2, 1959, Tampa leaders of the July 26 Movement had been notified by the police that continuous police protection was being provided for the Cuban Consulate until such time as there had been a peaceful change in the Consulate. He said that the leaders of the July 26 Movement, RAUL VILLAMIA and GUS ~~RANDCLIFFE~~, had agreed that they would take over the Consulate without force or firearms.

The "Tampa Tribune" for January 5, 1959, contained an article and photographs under the caption "Tampa Followers of Castro Make Peaceful Invasion of Cuban Consulate Here". The article indicated that RAUL VILLAMIA, described as the local CASTRO leader, and GUILLERMO BOLIVAR had reached an agreement on joint occupancy of the Cuban Consulate until such time as the new Consul General had been named. The photograph accompanying this article showed four individuals at the Consulate, and described them as FIDEL CASTRO supporters. These four were identified as RAUL VILLAMIA, JUAN PEREZ, CARLOS SUREDA and JUAN TORRES. *FLC*

The "Tampa Tribune" for January 21, 1959, contained an article captioned "Two Rivals Still Share Cuban Consul Office Here". The article said that the Cuban Consulate in Tampa was still suspended between CASTRO and BATISTA, and that after a great deal of argument, but no violence, it had been agreed that the incumbent, GUILLERMO BOLIVAR, and RAUL VILLAMIA, representative of the 26 or July Group, would continue sharing the office until official word had been received from Cuba.

The April 8, 1959, issue of "Diario Las Americas" contained an article captioned "Cuba and the United States". This article consisted of a letter to that paper from the "Committee to Aid the Cuban Revolution" located in Tampa, Florida. This letter defended the Cuban revolution and CASTRO as an example of liberty, justice and dignity, and took exception to attacks on Cuba by the press in the United States and Latin America. This letter was signed for the Committee by the following: *members*

It is noted that MM T-1 furnished a "List of Members of the Communist Cell Inside 'The 26th of July Movement Club' of Tampa, Florida." In this list, which is set forth, beginning on page 20 of this report, MMT-1 has set forth the names of several of the above-mentioned individuals. He describes ENRIQUE MENDOZA, MARTA MENDOZA, and JOE ALVAREZ as CP members, and FELIPE JIMENEZ as "Head of the D. I. E. R. in Tampa". DIER is the Department of Investigations of the Revolutionary Army.

"La Gaceta" issue of August 7, 1959, contained an article reporting that a meeting of the July 26 Patriotic Club of Tampa took place on the preceding Tuesday. This article mentioned that the club had accepted the resignation of one member, and dissolved the membership of another.

The issue stated that the club was disposed to cooperate with those Cuban groups which accept with absolute sincerity the postulates of the revolution.

It was indicated that the information regarding this meeting had been received from [redacted]

The October 16, 1959, issue of "La Gaceta" carried an article reflecting that a meeting of the 26 of July Movement of Tampa had been held the previous Tuesday. The article related that a committee of the club had advised that they had carried out the agreement to plant rose bushes at Jose Marti Park, and that "Live Free Cuba" posters had been distributed in various parts of the city. It was stated that two new members who had previously been investigated, had joined the group. The information had been furnished by [redacted]

The February 26, 1960, issue of "La Gaceta" contained an article captioned "Secretary of July 26 Movement Miami Pays A Visit". The article related that JUAN RODRIGUEZ, the secretary of the July 26 Movement of Miami, had recently visited the office of "La Gaceta" and the headquarters of the July 26 Movement in Tampa. It was stated that he attended a meeting at the Tampa Office of the July 26 Movement, and that he had made a speech to the members. The article related that comments regarding the speech of RODRIGUEZ were also made by the President, VICTORIANO MANTEIGA.

On May 2, 1960, [redacted] INS, Miami, made available lists of passengers aboard Cubana Airlines Flights 809 and 811 of April 29, 1960, and Flight 811 of April 30, 1960. These flights were all destined to Havana. Included in the names which appear on these lists was that of VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, [redacted] Tampa, a United States citizen.

It is noted that on April 25, 1960, MM T-6, a person who is acquainted with numerous Cubans in the Miami area, advised that the 26 of July Club of Miami, chartered several Cubana Airlines flights to Havana on April 29, 1960, and that the individuals making these flights were going to Havana to attend the May Day Celebration there.

MM T-7, a Cuban who [redacted] [redacted] advised on November 29, 1960, that the July 26 Club of Tampa and the July 26 Club of Miami have never had a close affiliation. He said that the Tampa club's principal activities in the past have consisted of pro-CASTRO propaganda and fund collecting, but that this club has never been highly regarded by members of the Miami 26 of July Club. He said that this is due to the fact that the Tampa club has been the victim of frequent disagreements among club members, as well as with the Cuban Consulate in Tampa. As an example, MM T-7 cited a situation which developed in February, 1960, in connection with a celebration planned by the 26 of July Club in Tampa, for February 28, 1960, to commemorate the Cuban hero, [redacted] RENE DECHARD, the Cuban Consul in Tampa, would only agree to participate in this celebration if the July 26 Club of Tampa did not. 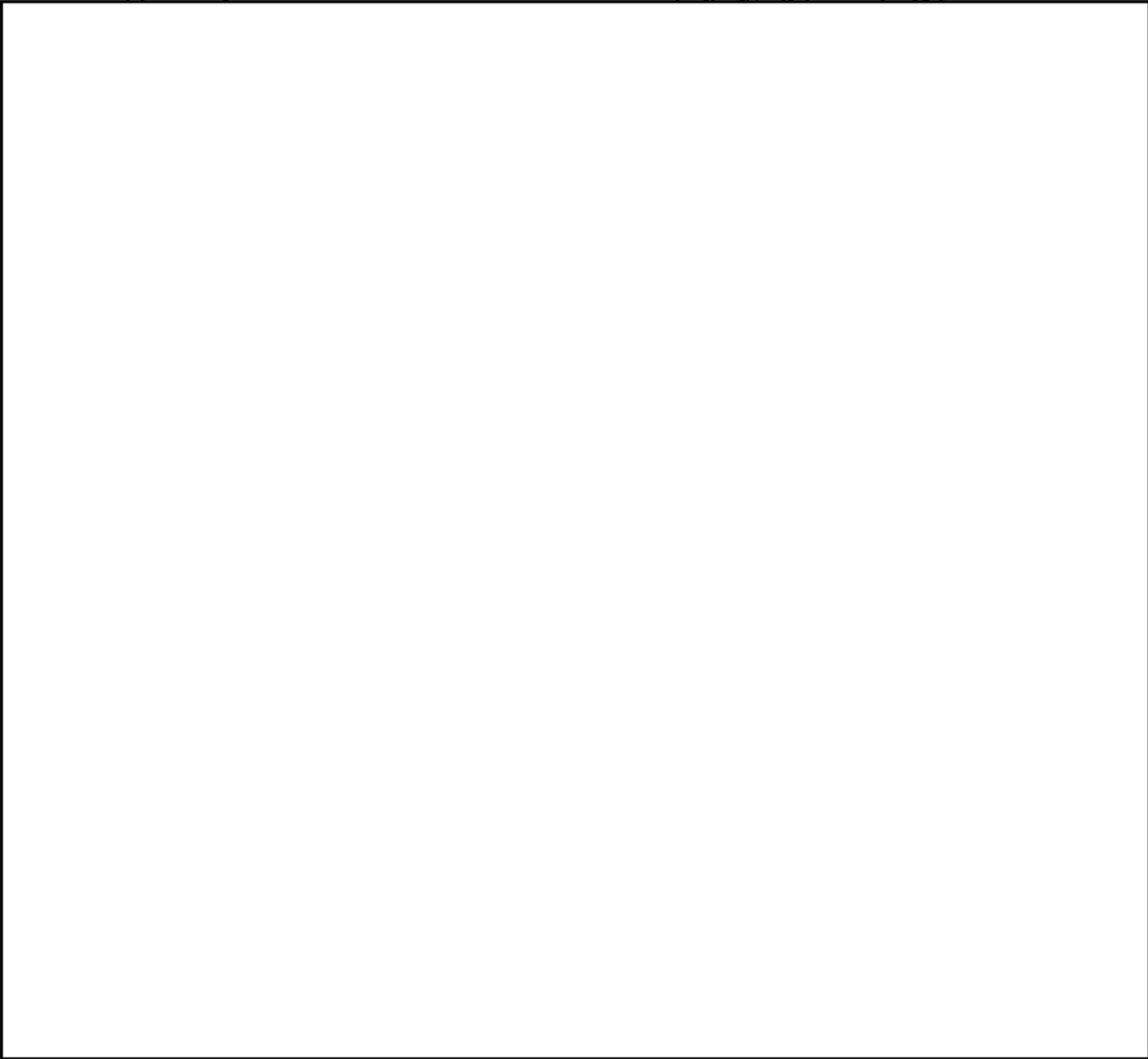

Regarding [redacted] MM T-8 advised in 1945 that the name [redacted] Florida, appeared on a list of subscribers to the "Worker". It was indicated that [redacted] subscription expired as of May, 1944.

Regarding [redacted] it is noted that the September, 1957, issue of "La Prensa", a Spanish language daily newspaper published in New York City, contained an article on page two captioned "July 26th Movement is Unified Here." This article stated that on September 8,

1957, the organizations known as the Democratic Labor Committee, the Cuban Civic Committee, and the Orthodox Committee had been united to form a single organization to be known as the July 26 Revolutionary Movement. The article set forth a list of individuals who were elected as secretaries of the new organization, and included in this list was the name [redacted]

[redacted] It is not known whether this [redacted] is identical to the person mentioned by MM T-1.

Regarding [redacted] MM T-9 advised on July 9, 1960, that the name [redacted] was then listed as a member of the July 26 Club of Miami.

Regarding [redacted] it is noted that MM T-15 advised on February 6, 1955, that on December 13, 1954, information had been received that [redacted] Florida, had been a subscriber to the "Proletarian News", but that his subscription had lapsed.

The masthead of the "Proletarian News" states that it is the official organ of the Proletarian Party of American (PPA).

The PPA has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

Regarding [redacted] it is noted that MM T-10, a person who is familiar with some CP activities and personalities in the Tampa area, advised in early 1945 that [redacted] Tampa, was then a member of the Tampa section of the National Council of American Soviet Friendship (NCASF).

The NCASF has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

Regarding [redacted] it is noted that MM T-11, a confidential source abroad, advised on July 26, 1944,

Regarding [redacted] it is noted that on October 12, 1949, MM T-12 made available information reflecting that [redacted] Tampa, was listed as a subscriber to "The Worker" in 1949.

"The Worker" is an East Coast Communist weekly newspaper.

Regarding VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, it is noted that the Office of Naval Intelligence, 6th Naval District, by letter dated August, 1940, furnished a list of persons who were suspected of being Communists. Included among the names appearing on this list was VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, [redacted] Florida. MANTEIGA was described as the publisher of a Spanish newspaper and as a rabid Communist, who had kept the Spanish element in Tampa in a turmoil for years. It was stated he had been the leader of a group of radicals who were active in obtaining funds for the Loyalists in Spain, and that [redacted]

[redacted] It was stated that at that time he was continuing to agitate among the Spanish element in Tampa.

MM T-13 advised on May 20, 1959, that as of February and March, 1958, there were 36 CP members in the State of Florida, and that of those 36, there were seven CP members in Tampa.

On March 10, 1960, MM T-14 advised that at that time there was no CP activity as such in Florida, although there were isolated groups and individuals who from time to time would contribute to the CP, but not as a part of any organized movement or club.

It is noted MM T-1 stated all officers and members of July 26 Club of Tampa "are active CP members or agents of CASTRO's G-2 Organization".

MM T-7 advised on November 29, 1960, that he was in possession of no information indicating that the members of the July 26 Club of Tampa were actually members of the CP or that they were operating as agents of DIER (Department of Investigations of the Revolutionary Army).

V. STATUS UNDER THE FOREIGN AGENTS REGISTRATION ACT OF 1948, AS AMENDED.

On May 8, 1957, [redacted] [redacted] Registration Section, Internal Security Division, Department of Justice, Washington, D.C., made available for review by SA LIONEL E. BELANGER, registration statement number 998 filed on February 6, 1957, by the Patriotic Club of July 26 of Miami, Florida, pursuant to Section 2 of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended. The following notation appeared on this statement:

"All answers apply to former activities of registrant - inactive since August 1, 1956."

According to this statement, the organization was created in approximately November, 1955, in Florida, and was a voluntary group with approximately 100 members in the United States. The address of the principal office was 2334 N.W. 7th Street, Miami, and JUAN V. CHEDA was listed as the person in charge of the office. The names of the foreign principals of the registrant were as follows:

This statement also listed three branch or local units of the registrant together with the name of the person in charge. One of these three was the Patriotic Club of July 26 of Tampa, Florida, and VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, [redacted] [redacted] Tampa, Florida, was listed as President.

On November 10, 1959, the Registration Section of the Department of Justice advised that information received indicated that the Patriotic Club of July 26 of Miami had suspended operations as of January, 1959, and that the leaders had returned to Cuba. Therefore, the registration number 998 of the club was being marked terminated as of January 1, 1959, the date of the change of government in Cuba.

Based on information available in Miami files, it has not been possible to substantiate allegations of CP membership or sympathy on the part of most of those mentioned.

The "Tampa Tribune", a daily newspaper, Tampa, Florida, on May 13, 1960, contained a news story to the effect that VICTORIANO MANTEIGA had resigned as President of the 26th of July organization in Tampa, shortly after he returned from May Day demonstrations in Havana. The story said ill health and the press of business were given as reasons for MANTEIGA's resignation, but it was added that he had stepped down in the wake of reports that United States Immigration and Customs Officials had intensified questioning of persons returning to the United States from Cuba.

TP T-2 stated on December 8, 1960, that since MANTEIGA's resignation, RAUL VILLAMIA has been identified as President, and CARLOS CARBONELL as Secretary of the 26th of July Movement. He added that in recent weeks the name of VILLAMIA has not appeared in connection with publicity for this organization, but only that of CARBONELL, the secretary. TP T-2 also expressed the belief that MANTEIGA continues to be the real leader of the 26th of July Movement, and he stated the reason for this belief is that both VILLAMIA and CARBONELL are seen almost daily visiting MANTEIGA in the offices of "La Gaceta".

TP T-3, who is also a [redacted] Tampa, stated on November 25, 1960, that RAUL VILLAMIA is reported to be the head of the organization now, but that he has observed VILLAMIA visiting the offices of "La Gaceta" almost every day, and he believes his activities are directed by VICTORIANO MANTEIGA.

MEMBERSHIP

TP T-3 on November 25, 1960, stated he has not been [redacted]

TP T-3 stated the 26th of July Movement is not very active and appears to have few members at the present time.

TP T-4, who is in contact with many of the [redacted]

[redacted] advised December 1, 1960, that early in 1960 he was told the captioned organization had a membership of around eighty members. He said a short time later he learned the membership only numbered about forty people.

In September when the organization summoned its members to a joint meeting with the Patriotic Movement of Tampa, only five or six showed up, and the remaining names were summarily stricken from the membership rolls. He said, to the best of his knowledge, there are still only five or six members, possibly even fewer at this time, and the organization has ceased to hold meetings or to have any activity. He said the only members at this time whom he knows by name are RAUL VILLAMIA and CARLOS CARBONELL. On December 3, 1960, he said CARBONELL had stated the Movement has ceased to exist.

[redacted] He said the organization had eighty members at one time, but in the latter part of April, 1960, an official delegate from the July 26th Movement of Cuba, came to Tampa with orders to dissolve the Club. He said at that time all the officers were relieved of their posts [redacted]

[redacted] He said he is aware that an office is still maintained in the name of the July 26th Movement, and that notices appear in "La Gaceta" from time to time under that name, but he cannot explain this. He said it is his impression that only a committee continues to function at this time.

TP T-2 advised December 8, 1960, concerning the delegate from Cuba in April, 1960, and identified this man as JINES JORRIN CASTROMAN. However TP T-2 said the purpose of this delegate's visit was to unify the pro-CASTRO groups in Tampa, FL. This source expressed the belief that the 26th of July Movement, although it gives the appearance of little activity and few members, actually has many members who never go near the club headquarters because their leaders want them to do their propaganda work under cover. TP T-2 said he has no proof of this, but has reached this conclusion because he knows some of the members who were formerly active in the organization, continue to make propaganda in favor of FIDEL CASTRO, although no longer maintaining any visible contact with the organization leaders.

[redacted]
[redacted] where the headquarters of the 26th of July Movement are located, stated December 8, 1960, that the rent for the headquarters is paid through December 15, 1960, and is payable each month in advance. He said there are very few people who go to the head-

quarters at the present time, but that he observed a group meeting there on the night of December 6, 1960, which group numbered some six persons. He said the only ones he knows by name are RAUL VILLAMIA and CARLOS CARBONELL.

ACTIVITIES

TP T-1 advised the present work of Tampa's 26th of July Movement Club is the same as in all the other clubs in different American cities. The objective is the distribution of Communist propaganda in this country, and the infiltration of Cuban G-2 that can spy on military installations, etc. The distribution of Cuban Communist propaganda in the Club in Tampa is received directly from the Cuban Consulate in Tampa. *FLA* The Consul, Mr. ALBERTO SACASAS, distributes the propaganda and also pays the members of the G-2 in the locality. Mr. MAXIMILIANO PEREZ, the Vice-Consul, is also a member of the D.I.E.R. and acts as a checking agent on the other G-2 personnel found in Tampa. *OR CLERK* *FLA* *WBA*

The D.I.E.R. is the Department of Intelligence of the Revolutionary Army.

G-2 is the term used to describe the Intelligence Section of the Cuban Army.

TP T-4 advised August 13, 1960, [redacted] in Tampa is [redacted] (not ALBERTO) and TP T-4 said he knew for a certainty that all propaganda material furnished by the Cuban Government to the Consulate up to that time, was in the Spanish language, principally the pamphlets titled "Obra Revolucionaria" and "Boletin Cultural". He stated he understood the Cuban Government intended to publish in the near future some propaganda pamphlets concerning the INRA (Agrarian Reform). He said the propaganda received by the Consulate is placed in the anteroom of the Consulate, where it can be readily picked up by any visitor who is interested. He stated the Consul has never made any other efforts to distribute this material. *FLA* *WBA*

On December 3, 1960, TP T-4 stated the Consulate has not received any propaganda from Cuba for more than two months.

The same source advised August 13, 1960, and December 1, 1960, he is not aware of the identity of any Cuban intelligence agents in Tampa and his information is to the effect no such agents are paid by the Cuban Consul or known to him. He further stated December 1, 1960, that

[redacted] or that he knows the identity of Cuban intelligence agents in Tampa.

TP T-2 on November 23, 1960, stated he has no information that members of the 26th of July Movement are affiliated with any intelligence organization of the Cuban Government.

On June 17, 1960, "La Gaceta" published a notice that the 26th of July Movement of Tampa continues to collect clothes and money for the victims of the Chilean earthquake. TP T-4 stated on December 1, 1960, the 26th of July Movement had made two shipments of old clothing to Cuba. One was on May 27, 1960, and consisted of forty-three boxes, the other was on July 8, 1960, and consisted of eighteen boxes. Both shipments were on the MV Privateer, and were directed to the Bienestar Social (Social Welfare), Havana. The shipper of record was CARLOS CARBONELL, Secretary of the 26th of July Movement. TP T-4 said he

On June 10, 1960, [redacted] turned over to SA [redacted] a 29-page pamphlet entitled, "The Revolution Has Not Betrayed Cuba" by Dr. OSVALDO DORTICOS TORRADO, President of Cuba, this being a letter directed by President DORTICOS to the students of Chile. The pamphlet contained both Spanish and English language texts of the letter. It was printed by the Ministry of Foreign Relations of Cuba, April 16, 1960. Dr. GONZALEZ stated it was distributed in Tampa by the 26th of July group.

On July 20, 1960, TP T-5, who is acquainted with many people in the Cuban community in Tampa, made available a pamphlet captioned "ADOLF EICHMANN and the Murderers Among Us". This pamphlet does not show where it was printed but states it was published by the 26th of July Movement in the United States. TP T-5 said he did not know the source of the pamphlet, but that some have been circulated in Tampa presumably by the 26th of July Movement of Tampa.

The "Tampa Times", a daily newspaper at Tampa, Florida, on August 23, 1960, reported that vandals had the previous night tossed red paint on the windows of the 26th of July Movement, as well as on the door and window of the newspaper "La Gaceta".

On September 23, 1960, "La Gaceta" carried an item captioned "Note from the 26th of July Movement of Tampa", which was over the signature of CARLOS CARBONELL, Secretary. This note criticized an organization of Cubans, which formerly supported CASTRO, but now oppose him and implies they were the persons responsible for two attacks on the headquarters of the 26th of July Movement when windows were broken and other damage done. The note states the 26th of July members have never wanted to indulge in violence, but that they know how to defend themselves when attacked. It calls upon Cubans and Tampans to support the Cuban Revolution, which it says is not Communist, but humane and Cuban. It states the 26th of July Movement supports the Revolution because it is giving the people of Cuba an honorable government, is concerning itself with the country people who have always been exploited, and is accomplishing many good works for the benefit of the majority of the Cuban people.

TP T-4 advised August 13, 1960, that as far as he could observe, the 26th of July Movement was not active and had barely been collecting enough money to pay the rent for its headquarters. He said no funds had been sent to Cuba in recent months, but that plans were under way for it to get together with other pro-CASTRO groups in Tampa to bring in some out-of-town speakers for a public rally in the near future.

On August 25, 1960, TP T-4 stated the public rally to whip up support for the present government of Cuba was being planned for September 30, 1960. He said that although the 26th of July Movement was active with other pro-CASTRO groups in planning this rally, it was to be advertised as sponsored by the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC), because it was felt this would have more appeal for the American public generally than the other groups made up primarily of Cubans or Cuban-Americans. A characterization of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee appears in the appendix hereto.

It was subsequently announced, the rally would be

postponed from September 30 to October 21, 1960, and would be held in the Municipal Auditorium.

On October 18, 1960, Deputy United States Marshal [redacted] turned over to the FBI a letter he received that date. The letter was not signed but it referred to the rally to be held October 21st in the Municipal Auditorium by friends of the Cuban Government, and it stated "an anti-Communist group" was planning to go to the rally and attack the pro-CASTRO men. It was stated the 26th of July Movement had given guns to three of their men to defend against such attack, and that the Patriotic Movement of Tampa had also armed some of its men for the same purpose.

The information in the above letter was furnished the Tampa Police Department October 18, 1960.

The "Tampa Times" on October 17, 1960, reported the city had cancelled the use of the Auditorium for the rally to avoid any possible trouble on city-owned property, in view of the strained Cuban-American relations.

TP T-4 advised October 22, 1960, that the rally, which had been scheduled for October 21st, was held at the headquarters of the 26th of July Movement of Tampa. He said he had understood it was cancelled until about 4:00 PM that date [redacted]

[redacted] He said approximately eighty people were present, and the press had reported faithfully the speeches that were made.

The "Tampa Tribune" on October 22, 1960, published an account of the rally. It identified the principal speaker as MERLE E. BYERS, of Mokena, Illinois, a spokesman for the U. S. Farm Association of Iowa, which organization BYERS described as an outgrowth of the Iowa Farmers Union with headquarters in Des Moines. It was reported BYERS claimed to be a "small businessman who is getting put through the wringer, one of the forgotten people, the unsubsidized, who are victims of our moronic national administration." BYERS was quoted as saying "The United States is a fortress of Fascism and the enemy of intellectualism;" also that Cubans are full of purpose as are millions of Chinese and Russians, but ours is a sick society with no meaning or purpose. He was further quoted as saying: "The people will lose no matter which candidate wins (in the 1960 Presidential elections) because they were not chosen by the

people but by a selected few representing the interests of the ruling economic oligarchy."

The "Tampa Tribune" report went on to say that BYERS indirectly praised Soviet Premier KRUSHCHEV, using an ironic tone in quoting a Chicago "Sun-Times" editorial accusing the Communist boss of being "a troublemaker who wants us to end the arms race." BYERS declared:

"We don't want to end the arms race because of the jobs and profits from the valuable munitions contracts which support our economic system. The pattern of the cold war has been set as has our attitude toward Cuba."

The last statement, noted the "Tribune", drew an outburst of rhythmic applause, as did BYERS' statement the U. S. sugar-land barons had grown fat on the bodies of the children of Cuba's slave workers. It was said BYERS had high praise for FIDEL CASTRO and that he said:

"The United States doesn't like to help under-developed nations like Cuba because this helps to build socialism which is wrong except where it benefits the oligarchy. That's why we are so hostile to CASTRO, because our heartstrings, I mean, our pursestrings have been hurt."

"La Gaceta" on October 21, 1960, published an item captioned "Note from the 26th of July Movement", which was over the signature of CARLOS CARBONELL, Secretary, a translation of which follows:

"We advise the people of Tampa that unscrupulous people have been threatening to get worthy Cuban fired from their jobs by denouncing them as Communists.

"Those people believe they are the law, in spite of their antecedents, and we advise them that they will be brought into court if they try to prejudice American citizens who sympathize with the Government of Cuba because it is honorable and seeks the well being of

the Cuban people.

"No member of this club is Communist and his civil rights cannot be trampled upon.

"We know of two cases, one a youth who works on Seventh Avenue, and the other a worker in an industry on 22nd Street."

On November 4, 1960, "La Gaceta" carried a notice addressed to the people of Tampa and stating that again vandals had broken the windows of the 26th of July Movement Headquarters and damaged the American flag inside the club. The notice concluded with the following statement:

"And if they really want to fight FIDEL CASTRO, remember that in Miami and Guatemala expeditions are being prepared against the Cuban Government in spite of the Organization of American States and the United Nations.

"By agreement of the 26th of July Club,
CARLOS CARBONELL, Secretary."

On November 18, 1960, "La Gaceta" carried an item captioned "Note from the 26th of July Movement" over the signature of CARLOS CARBONELL, Secretary, which warned that a man had announced in a local paper he would give Cuban money for American money on a basis of three for one. The note warned that people should not agree to such an exchange because it is not intelligent to go to visit a country, and fall into something which is unworthy, and for the further reason that they would be running a risk of being jailed.

On December 2, 1960, "La Gaceta" reported that the 26th of July Movement of Tampa had on the preceding Sunday placed a crown of flowers in the Jose Marti Park of Tampa. It was stated that although a daily newspaper had reported only two persons placed the flowers in the park, there actually had been more than twenty people present for the ceremony.

CONNECTIONS WITH CUBAN GOVERNMENT

TP T-4 reported September 12, 1960, that [redacted] whom he identified as a representative of the 26th of July Movement in Tampa, had that day been heard to state the Cuban State Department had directed a cable to an unnamed person in Tampa to obtain the names of the officers and leaders of both the 26th of July Movement and the Patriotic Movement of Tampa for Aid of Cuban Farmers, and forward same to Cuba so that they could be registered with the United States State Department as Cuban agents.

[redacted] was reported to have said he wanted to find out why the 26th of July Movement in Tampa is dead.

TP T-4 reported later the same week that [redacted] did not come to Tampa because he and the Consul General in Miami had received orders from the Cuban Government to stay in Miami in view of increased tensions due to the sending of American naval vessels to patrol the Caribbean.

ALLEGED COMMUNIST INFILTRATION OF
JULY 26 MOVEMENT OF TAMPA

It has been previously reported that TP T-1 made the statement that all the officers and members of the July 26 Movement are active Communist Party (CP) members or agents of CASTRO's G-2, and he furnished a list of individuals which he described as "List of Members of the Communist Cell Inside 'The 26th of July Movement Club' of Tampa, Florida."

This list is almost identical to a list of names furnished October 13, 1960, by TP T-2 except that TP T-2's list does not allege all the persons thereon to be affiliated with the CP or with Cuban intelligence organizations.

The Communist Party, U.S.A., has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On November 23, 1960, TP T-2 advised he personally prepared the list of names which he had earlier furnished the FBI, doing so from his own knowledge of the individuals or from information he has received concerning them from his associates in Tampa. He stated he knows a copy of his list subsequently reached the possession of [redacted]

On December 5, 1960, [redacted] attorney, Tampa, Fla., advised that [redacted] is his client and that he knows [redacted]

TP T-2 also stated November 23, 1960, he cannot identify any of the persons on the list he furnished as connected with the D.I.E.R. or G-2 for the reason he is not in a position to know who might or might not be so connected.

TP T-8, [redacted] on October 22, 1960, advised that in view of the turn of events in the Cuban Government it is his belief that all members of the July 26 Movement are necessarily communists. He furnished a list of persons in various cities of the United States said to be members of this organization, adding that he had compiled the list from information appearing in the newspaper "Revolucion", which is published daily in Havana as the official organ of the July 26 Movement.

The list furnished by TP T-8 contained the following names for Tampa, Florida:

Concerning VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, the former President and alleged to be possibly still the leader of subject organization, TP T-6, who has knowledge of some CP activities and personalities at Tampa, reported in December 1942 and on March 12, 1943, that MANTEIGA had at one time been a member of the CP and active in various front organization but that he had had some disagreement with the CP four or five years before that and had not been active since then. He further stated March 12, 1943, that during the preceding year or two MANTEIGA's writings in "La Gaceta" had been critical of the CP.

TP T-6 advised in February 1944 that MANTEIGA was not then active in the CP or any of its front organizations.

TP T-5 on September 3, 1953, reported that during the preceding week a newspaper editor named [redacted] in Havana stated in the presence of about ten persons that VICTORIANO MANTEIGA, of Tampa, Florida, is a member of the CP in Cuba. He allegedly stated he was going to write some articles about it and then turn over to the FBI his evidence.

[redacted] stated he considered MANTEIGA dangerous to this country because of influence ^{b6} has on the Spanish-speaking community through "La Gaceta", ^{b7C} he added a check into MANTEIGA's past would show he has had ^{b7D} communist sympathies since the 1920s or 1930s. On December 1, 1960, [redacted] stated he has no first-hand knowledge or evidence that MANTEIGA is or ever has been a communist, but his opinion is based upon MANTEIGA's writings in "La Gaceta" and his knowledge that the United States Government was investigating MANTEIGA in connection with communist activities at Tampa as far back as the 1930s.

Concerning [redacted]

TP T-6 reported in March 1942 this individual had been an active member of Unit #1 of District 25 of the CP, Tampa, and served as a Party "mailman" for about six months in 1939 but was no longer active in that respect. The same source in December 1943 stated [redacted] did not attend CP meetings and was not then known as a CP member.

In July 1942 [redacted] Tampa, AA stated [redacted] had been a CP member for many years and in a recent conversation stated that things were really going well for the Party and that people were going to be surprised at the rise of the CP.

On August 2, 1950, [redacted] Florida, reported that he was in [redacted] July 31, 1950, at which time [redacted] expressed his views in favor of communism.

[redacted] was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI February 28, 1957, at which time he denied membership in the CP although admitting he had been outspoken in his "liberal" ideas and he knew some acquaintances considered him a communist. At the same time he said he had read the "Daily Worker" and other communist literature in the past.

B. APPROX. 1937

Concerning [redacted] TP T-7 reported July 5, 1960, this person is a leader in the July 26 Movement, and he described him as anti-American and communist. Questioned concerning the allegation of communism on December 8, 1960, TP T-7 said he has no evidence of RODRIGUEZ' affiliation with the CP but based his allegation upon the man's fanatical support of the present Government of Cuba which TP T-7 considers to be communist.

In connection with the possibility this [redacted] might be identical with an individual of the same name who was reported by TP T-6 in early 1945 as a member of the Tampa section of the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship, TP T-2 advised that the [redacted] of the July 26 Movement is now [redacted]

The National Council of American-Soviet Friendship has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

[redacted] advised December 8, 1960, he never heard communism or Russia talked of in meetings of the organization and was never aware of any communist influence in the July 26 Movement.

APPENDIX
THE PATRIOTIC MOVEMENT OF TAMPA
FOR AID OF THE CUBAN FARMERS

The Patriotic Movement of Tampa for Aid of the Cuban Farmers (Movimiento Patriotico de Tampa de Ayuda al Campesino Cubano) (PMT) was formed in Tampa, Florida in August, 1959 by ROBERTO DE LOS RIOS, FELIPE JIMENEZ and ENRIQUE MENDOZA, Cuban nationals, for the ostensible purpose of aiding the Cubans peasants in the agrarian reform by the collection of money and goods. The bylaws state the purpose of the organization is to give moral and material aid to the Cuban farmers at the same time promoting a better understanding between the peoples of the U.S. and Cuba.

Although this was its ostensible purpose, sources, who are considered reliable and who were in a position to have this information, advised that it was common knowledge known to all members that the actual original purpose of the organization was to buy airplanes for Cuba for defense.

Investigation indicates that the PMT has had little success in its collections; however DE LOS RIOS, who has returned to Cuba, and his successor JIMENEZ, who distributes the Cuban newspaper "REVOLUCION" in Tampa, and other officers of the PMT have issued considerable propaganda in the form of speeches, press releases and pamphlets universally lauding FIDEL CASTRO and his policies and criticizing U.S. "Imperialism" and policies.

The PMT maintains its headquarters in an office rented at 2006 14th Street, Tampa, Florida, in the same building wherein the Tampa 26th of July Movement has its headquarters.

FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE

The April 6, 1960, edition of the "New York Times", a daily New York City newspaper, carried a full page advertisement captioned "What is Really Happening in Cuba?" The article maintained that the United States press has made certain charges against Cuba which are not true and the Fair Play for Cuba Committee was organized to tell the truth about Cuba in the interest of fair play. The advertisement closes with a note which states "This public appeal for Fair Play for Cuba has the support of a group of thinking individuals holding a variety of political persuasions, representing no one but themselves, linked here by a single common concern for the overriding principle of justice which is always at issue, whenever partisan interests clash with simple truth."

The [redacted] report, which was enclosed with reBuairtel,
shows a general knowledge of the Cuban community of Tampa and

and "International Communism" for which no factual basis is
given.

 "La Gaceta", a Spanish language newspaper at Tampa, reported on December 2, 1960, that CARLOS CARBONELL, President of the 26th of July Movement of Tampa, had represented his organization in placing a wreath at the statue of JOSE MARTI in Jose Marti Park, corner of 8th Avenue and 13th Street, Tampa, Florida, on November 27, 1960. This was in honor of the fifth anniversary of the founding of the movement and CARBONELL made a speech in memory of the medical

On January 4, 1961, the "Tampa Tribune", a daily newspaper, Tampa, Florida, published an article stating that police were hunting vandals who wrecked the clubrooms of the 26th of July Movement and the Patriotic Movement of Tampa on the night of January 3, 1961. It was stated the two clubrooms, located in the same building at the corner of 14th Street and 9th Avenue, had their windows and furniture smashed and that red paint had been smeared in the July 26th offices.

On January 9, 1961, Detective [redacted] Tampa Police Department, advised SA [redacted] that he had been assigned to investigative matters relating to Cuban activities in Tampa, particularly those investigations concerning acts of vandalism perpetrated on the Cuban Consulate in Tampa and the 26th of July and Patriotic Movement of Tampa for Aid to the Cuban Farmers (PMT) as well as to private residences.

During the course of investigation of vandalism at the 26th of July Club on 9th Avenue, [redacted] contacted RAUL VILLAMIA, a city employee and president of the 26th of July, and requested that he take down some signs displayed at the 26th of July which he considered inflammatory and might inspire further vandalism. These signs called attention to previous vandalism and their perpetrators in insulting terms. VILLAMIA took down the signs. From VILLAMIA and the manager of the building where the club is located, he learned that the 26th of July is closing its offices there. VILLAMIA said their lease was expiring January 15, 1961, and they were not renewing it. The manager said the 26th of July was being asked to move out January 15, 1961. The PMT, which has offices in the same building, but located on 14th Street, closed down the night of the breaking of relations between the United States and Cuba and moved into the 26th of July offices.

Furthermore, [redacted] told [redacted] on January 8, 1961, that [redacted] was writing or publishing a letter disbanding the 26th of July organization in Tampa this week.

On January 13, 1961, "La Gaceta" published an item captioned "For the People of Tampa -- About the 26th of July Movement", a translation of which follows:

"In a meeting that took place a few days ago, we decided to close the 26th of July Club, not for the depredations of some individuals that call themselves anti-communists in order to carry out criminal acts in Tampa, but because the government of the United States has broken off its relations with Cuba.

"Everyone was in complete accord with this decision to dissolve the Club and pray for better relations between the people and the governments of Cuba and the United States.

"In the 26th of July Club there were no communists but only civic-minded men, enemies of violence and defamation.

"Those who in Tampa and other places, wish to defeat FIDEL CASTRO by throwing stones and paint, destroying furniture and window glass, are fascists or anti-democratic. As far as the case of Consul SACASA goes, he has said that since last October he has been 'turning over the secrets' of the government that paid his salary and to which he had promised his loyalty.

"Any man can stop sympathising with another person, party, or government, but it is 'ugly', nauseating, that he be living off the man, business or government and at the same time, stabbing him in the back.

"With a hope for better relations between Cuba and the United States, we salute all, and especially the tobacco factory workers classified as communist by SACASA and other individuals that have come to this city during the last few months to disturb the tranquil life of Ybor City, West Tampa and of Tampa.

Pro-Castro Unit to Disband
 TAMPA, Fla., Jan. 14 (UPI) — The pro-Castro 26th of July Movement here, discouraged by the break in Cuban-United States relations, vandalism and defections, announced yesterday that it would disband.

The Tampa branch, founded personally by Fidel Castro in 1955 when he was in exile, had long been a stronghold of Cuban revolutionary sentiment in this country. At one time its membership was estimated at 20,000.

The article explained that all members of the Movement were in complete accord with the dissolution of the club and gave as their reason the recent break in diplomatic relations between the U.S. and Cuba. The article was signed by the July 26th Movement of Tampa. FLG

The April 6, 1960 edition of "The New York Times" newspaper contains a full page advertisement captioned, "What is Really Happening in Cuba," placed by the FPCC. This advertisement announced the formation of the FPCC in New York City, listed various sponsors of the Committee and declared the FPCC intended to promulgate "the truth about revolutionary Cuba" to neutralize the distorted American press on Cuban affairs.

"The New York Times" edition of January 11, 1961, reported that at a hearing conducted before the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on January 10, 1961, Dr. CHARLES A. SANTOS-BUCH identified himself as one of the organizers of the FPCC. Also Dr. SANTOS-BUCH identified ROBERT TABER as a co-organizer of the FPCC and said TABER drafted the aforementioned FPCC advertisement. Dr. SANTOS-BUCH further testified that he and TABER obtained \$3,500 from the Cuban Government through the son of Cuba's Foreign Minister, which funds, along with about \$1,100 collected from supporters of the FPCC, paid for the cost of aforementioned advertisement in "The New York Times."

On October 3, 1960, a source advised that the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) in New York had become active in the FPCC, and that SWP members, in a recent FPCC election, had been able to remove several Communist Party members who were on the Executive Board of the FPCC and gain control of organization. This source asserted that the SWP members believed that they had achieved a great influence in the course of the Cuban revolution through their control of the FPCC.

On February 10, 1961, a second source advised that PHIL BART, National Organizational Secretary and member of the National Committee, CP, USA, had reportedly stated recently that the FPCC had been captured by the Trotskyites, but that the CP had not given up in the FPCC.

The SWP and the CP, USA, have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The advertisement was signed "The Fair Play for Cuba Committee, 60 East 42nd Street, New York 17, New York," (FPCC).

Result of examination:

It was determined that Q1 through Q5, Q8, Q10 through Q13 (with exception of the top portion of Q10), Q15 and Q16 were mimeographed. No significant characteristics are present which would indicate the make of mimeograph machine; hence, it is not possible to state if two or more of these documents were prepared on the same machine.

Q14 was prepared by an offset printing process. No significant characteristics are present which would indicate the make of the printing equipment.

The typewriting on Q9 and the top portion of Q10 match the Laboratory standards for Corona elite style of type spaced twelve letters to the inch. The typewriting on the mimeographed documents and the photocopies is not sufficiently legible or detailed to determine the exact styles of type used, but set forth below are the styles of type which most closely match the questioned typewriting.

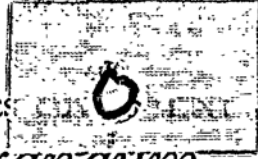



Dear Comrade:

The administration of the 26 of July Movement in Cuba indicates to us here in New York what measures should be taken, what agreements should be reached and what tasks are to be done.

According to the instructions which we have up to the present time, the 26 of July is a revolutionary organization which is striving peacefully to bring the truth of our revolution to the American people and it is registered in Washington under this form of principles. Since we defend the postulates of a foreign government, in the eyes of the United States and its laws, we are foreign agents; wherefore, every one of us who is an officer (literally, "mostly responsible") has to be registered in Washington as such.

Every meeting to be held and every task to be done should always be in the name of the Movement, since under any other name it could be a violation of the United States laws, because it has not been registered. We can make all types of propaganda, in writing, on the radio and on films; we can picket or hold meetings, provided they are of a revolutionary nature, in which the members acquire knowledge and revolutionary political indoctrination. We give you this information so that all may know fully what our duties are.

All these activities cannot be carried on in any other type of organization, like social or recreation clubs, since this type of organization has to be registered as a social or recreational one and cannot engaged in any type of propaganda in favor of the Revolution.

TP T-1 advised on September 11, 1961, that he believes that [redacted] was formerly some sort of officer in the July 26th Revolutionary Movement. [redacted]

[redacted] Source knew nothing further concerning these meetings.

A characterization of the July 26th Movement is contained in the appendix hereto.

TP T-2 advised on September 13, 1961, that he had heard from an unrecalled source that the 26th of July Club is holding meetings in a frame house across the street from the Gradiatz-Annis Cigar Factory on 14th Street in Tampa. This house is across the street from the main entrance to Gradiatz-Annis.

TP T-3 advised on September 29, 1961, that [redacted] [redacted] of the July 26th Movement in New York, was in contact with an unknown individual in [redacted]

The Monroe Defense Committee has headquarters at 53 W. 125 Street, New York City, and was founded, according to its press releases, to tell the story of Monroe, North Carolina, to the world, to raise funds for the legal defense of individuals currently under arrest in Monroe, N. C., and to provide financial assistance to members of Afro-American community in Monroe, N. C.

Characterizations of the FPCC and the Tampa Chapter of the FPCC (FPCC-TP) are contained in the appendix hereto.

TP T-4 further advised on October 3, 1961, that [redacted] [redacted] had stated that CARLOS CARBONELL, who is head of the July 26th Movement in Tampa, is old, going blind and in poor health. He said CARBONELL should be sent back to Cuba if possible.

TP T-1 advised on October 6, 1961, that it appeared that the FPCC and the 26th of July Movement have joined in their efforts on behalf of the CASTRO government. He said that meetings are held at 2513 13th Street every Thursday night, which are attended by CARLOS CARBONELL, [redacted] and other individuals known

to be associated with both of these groups. They are asking persons attending these meetings to write letters to "La Gaceta", supporting the Cuban Revolutionary Government as well as the activities of the FPCC and the 26th of July Movement so that these letters will be published in "Letters to the Editor" column.

TP T-5 advised on October 4, 1961, that it was rumored that CARLOS CARBONELL, the old man who sells Cuban crackers around Ybor City, is the new leader of the July 26th Movement of Tampa. However, nothing has been heard about any actual meetings of this organization or about any activities.

REGISTRATION OF CARLOS CARBONELL
AS COORDINATOR OF THE JULY 26TH
MOVEMENT

A short form registration slip with number 1379 was filed by CARLOS CARBONELL with the Registration Secretary, United States Department of Justice on August 21, 1961. This form showed CARLOS CARBONELL VALDEZ, born September 23, 1896, in Cuba, a United States citizen, employed at the None-Such Baking Corporation, 2111 15th Street, Tampa, Florida, and residing 3406 15th Street, Tampa, described his activities as follows:

To direct and coordinate the activities of the 26th of July Movement in the area of Tampa, Florida.

CARBONELL also admitted that he is an agent for the magazine "Bohemia" which he receives and distributes to newsstands in Tampa, Florida.

"Bohemia" is a Spanish language magazine printed in Havana, Cuba, which was expropriated by the government of FIDEL CASTRO.

Date October 13, 1961

~~CARLOS CARBONELL VALDEZ~~, 3406 15th Street, ^{FCA} was interviewed in a Bureau car in front of his residence. He was advised that he did not have to make any statement and that any statement that he did make could be used against him in a court of law. He was advised of his right to an attorney.

BORN 9/23/1896 - CUBA COORDINATOR ^{FCA}

CARBONELL claimed that the July 26th Movement was not now active in Tampa, nor has it been active since it disbanded the early part of this year. He stated that he had registered with the Department of Justice as an agent of a foreign government upon the instructions of JOSE SANCHEZ, President and Coordinator of the July 26th Movement in New York. He did not know the name of this New York attorney. He had been advised that as coordinator of the July 26th Movement in Tampa he should register with the Department of Justice and he had been sent the necessary form to complete this registration by JOSE SANCHEZ.

CARBONELL maintained that the July 26th Movement in Tampa, is not active at the present time nor has it been active since it disbanded around the first of the year. He claimed that there are no officers in this organization other than himself, the coordinator, nor are there any active members. He registered with the Department of Justice in order to be in a position if needed, to keep alive the feeling of the revolution and to combat lies about the present government of FIDEL CASTRO in Cuba which are being spread by exiles and other people in the United States.

CARBONELL stated that he did not think that the present government in Cuba was communistic, although he stated that to him the present government in Cuba was doing the same thing in Cuba which HENRY FORD had done when he started to build automobiles in Michigan. That is FORD put up the money and told the workers that if they would work they could share the profits of the business and the same thing is true in Cuba with the government putting up the money for various projects in Cuba and the poor people who never had anything under BATISTA were finding a better way of life. Possibly this was Socialism but he could not see where it could be called communism. Cuban ties with Russia were out of economic necessity.

CARBONELL stated that he had been fired from his job as a cracker salesman for the None-Such Bakery and produced a letter postmarked September 17, 1961, addressed to the None Such Bakery. The letter contained inside this envelope was dated January 11, 1960, Tampa, Florida, and was unsigned. This letter stated that CARBONELL as an employee of the bakery was losing the bakery money because he was a communist and everyone knew this. That he had formerly been employed by Have-A-Tampa Cigar Company in Tampa, and had been fired there because he was a communist. This letter indicated that there were many loyal Americans who should be working instead of a communist.

CARBONELL stated that he had been let go on the basis of this letter and at the present time he had no employment other than selling "Bohemia" around Tampa. He stated that he receives this magazine once a week, pays the freight on the magazine and then sells it to newsstands for \$.27 a copy and it in turn is sold for \$.35. His wife is no longer working and he claimed that he was already finding it hard to make ends meet.

CARBONELL claimed that he has no intentions of returning to Cuba unless he is deported by authorities. He maintained that this was his home and he planned to stay here and he would continue to try and combat the lies which are being spread about the present government in Cuba.

CARBONELL said that the only persons he knew of who recently have returned to Cuba were [redacted]

[redacted] He stated that they were presently in Cuba, but he did not know how they arrived there. [redacted]

[redacted] had just recently returned to Cuba, manner of departure was unknown.

Sources familiar with July 26th Movement activities in Tampa Bay area were contacted during September and October, 1961, and advised that to their knowledge no Cuban school bonds or stamps were being offered for sale, nor did they possess any information regarding loyalty pledges secured by this movement as there has been no activity on the part of this movement.

On November 2, 1961, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] advised SAs [REDACTED] and FREDERICK A. SLIGHT that he had been told by an individual, whose name he could not recall, that some of the personnel at the Tampa Shipyards on the night shift were holding firearms practice. He explained that this unrecalled individual told him that while a ship was in drydock there had been a crew sandblasting the bottom of the ship. While the ship was being sandblasted, several individuals on this ship had guns and would shoot them. He explained that he had been told this about four or five months ago and had reported this to a friend of his who said he would advise the proper authorities.

[REDACTED] claimed this had been so long ago he had forgotten the name of the person who had told him of this and had also forgotten the names of the individuals involved. He had only been advised of their nicknames for the most part and was not personally acquainted with any of them. This unrecalled individual had also told him that this group at one time had held firearms practice outside of town. He had explained that the area where the firearms training was held was out Highway 301, south of Highway 60, near the railroad track which is about one mile south of Highway 20; that the railroad track turned right on a small road and somewhere down this road is where the group reportedly held the firearms practice one Sunday.

He has heard nothing more concerning this group or about any additional firearms training since that time. He was unable to say if these men belonged to any organized group as they were described to him as being part of the crew at the Tampa Shipyards. In the event he received any additional information he would immediately notify the property authorities himself.
