It has provided the best immediate coverage of Balistrieri's activities of any source currently being utilized by the Milwaukee Office. It has confirmed that Balistrieri is the leading La Cosa Nostra representative in Milwaukee and maintains a strict control of this section of the underworld organization.

Of particular significance was information furnished by this source concerning [redacted] which confirms his La Cosa Nostra activity.

It is noted the Milwaukee Office reports no information of value from this source [redacted] and recommends that [redacted] In view of the past productivity of this source and its excellent potential to furnish valuable information, it is recommended that the Milwaukee Office be authorized to maintain it [redacted]

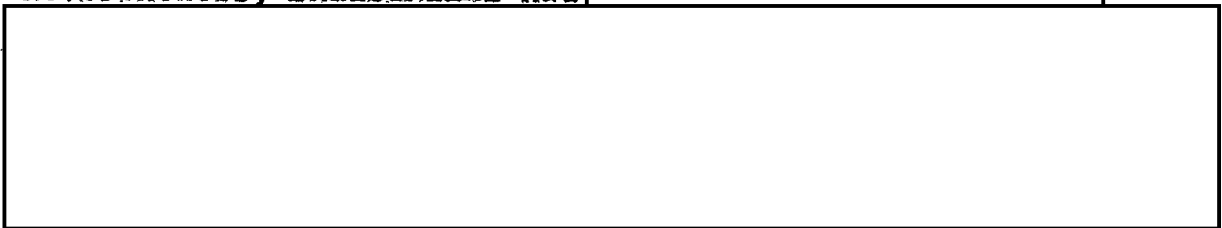

"The Milwaukee Sentinel" of November 11, 1964 in an article captioned, "DA Aide Bars Press in Cafe Case", states that agents of the State Beverage and Cigarette Tax Division have been investigating Gallagher's for a period of two months and claim that Gallagher's should not be allowed to permit minors on the premises since less than 50 per cent of its business is in food. Gallagher's maintains that it is a restaurant. The Wisconsin State Law allows minors on premises if more than 50 per cent of the business is in food.

An agent of the State Beverage and Cigarette Tax Division stated that on one occasion an agent asked for coffee with sugar and cream, but the waitress was unable to find sugar. On numerous occasions agents were unable to order food of any kind in the restaurant. During the entire period they were only able to purchase 3 hamburgers. At one point an examination was made of the freezer at the restaurant and only ten steaks could be found. On one occasion the waitress told them "there isn't any food".

DOMINIC FRINZI, attorney for PETER BALISTRIERI, produced at the hearing a series of newspaper advertisements dated in 1963 and earlier which featured steak and chicken dinners at Gallagher's; also a letter from the Continental Menu Club, 2040 West Wisconsin Avenue, which stated that between July 1, 1963 and June 30, 1964, 2,349 coupon books had been sold or given to the public, which included a coupon which had Gallagher's name on it, stating persons who produced it would be entitled to two dinners for the price of one.

"The Milwaukee Sentinel" for November 20, 1964 in an article captioned, "Balistrieri Tax Writs", stated that Deputy District Attorney BEN WEINER from Milwaukee County, said that figures presented to him for the period of November 1, 1963 to November 1, 1964 showed that 65 per cent of Gallagher's business was in food. The article also reported that tax warrants had been served at the hearing, charging PETER BALISTRIERI, operator of Gallagher's, with nonpayment of \$6,128.11 in state sales taxes and also with a warrant charging failure to pay \$13.49 state taxes as an officer of the Ben-Kay Corporation, which does business as the Downtowner Cocktail Lounge. PETER BALISTRIERI denied being affiliated with the latter, which is operated by his brother, FRANK BALISTRIERI.

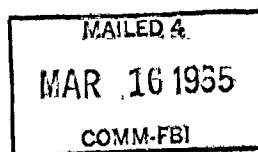

An FBI identification record dated January 14, 1965 for FRANK PETER BALISTRIERI, FBI Number 648 144 C, shows an arrest dated January 6, 1965 by the U.S. Marshal, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Number 00766, on the charge of conspiring to impede the government in its function to collect taxes and income tax evasion.

BALISTRIERI had been arrested January 6, 1965 on an indictment by a Federal Grand Jury, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, arraigned in U.S. District Court, Milwaukee, Wisconsin on February 15, 1965, pled not guilty to the charge and has had his trial set by the court for September 7, 1965. A copy of the indictment obtained from another government agency on January 6, 1965 showed that FRANK PETER BALISTRIERI had been indicted for violation of Title 18, U.S. Code, Section 371, and Title 26, U.S. Code, Section 7201.

Count One alleged 135 overt acts on behalf of BALISTRIERI for impeding an Internal Revenue Service function in assessing and collecting income taxes. Counts Two and Three charged evasion of a total of \$19,231 in taxes on a total of \$54,330 income for the years of 1959 and 1960.

The 135 overt acts of impeding the assessment and collection of taxes included the following charges: that BALISTRIERI and [REDACTED] conspired in preparing and maintaining a double set of books, that BALISTRIERI used fictitious names and dummy officers in business activities, that he intimidated, coerced and influenced individuals having knowledge of his financial transactions so as to obstruct the investigation of his tax liability.



The article states that RUDOLPH PORCHETTA, age 51, residence at 2848 North 46th Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, was a bartender at the Downtowner and was also named as a co-conspirator, but not a defendant in a tax case against FRANK BALISTRIERI and [REDACTED]. The paper said the police department will recommend that the license committee refuse to renew the license because of previous arrests on the premises and the fact that corporation members, BALISTRIERI and [REDACTED] are subject to a pending U.S. Federal income tax prosecution. While BALISTRIERI did withdraw as the agent of the Downtowner, he expected to continue as the President of Ben-Kay, Inc., the corporation which operates the tavern.

On June 28, 1965 MI T-3 advised that FRANK BALISTRIERI was anticipating the possibility that he would be sentenced on an income tax case and that upon conviction his license to the Downtowner would be cancelled. For that reason he was putting the license under the name of RUDOLPH PORCHETTA.

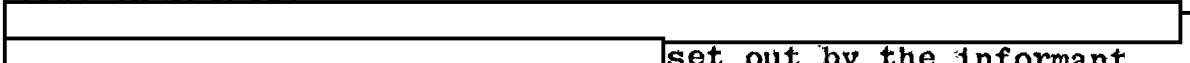

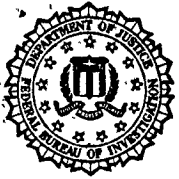

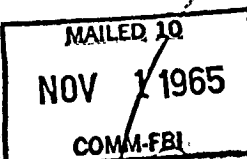

As previously reported, BALISTRIERI's trial on his income tax violation has been reset for February 7, 1966. No significant information has been obtained from confidential informants on BALISTRIERI's attitude concerning his chances in the forthcoming trial. He has at times expressed a very optimistic view and at others a somewhat pessimistic view. One significant act which he undertook in preparation of a possible conviction was the transfer in June, 1965 of a liquor license from himself to an associate, RUDOLPH PORCHETTA. If he had held the license upon conviction it would have been lost. It is believed, however, that June, 1965 was too early to have any bearing on the present situation.

Of some bearing might be FRANK BALISTRIERI's reluctance to disclose his connection with the prior office since it was maintained in the quarters of the Continental Music Company, a front operation of his, a connection which he might not be willing to acknowledge. In addition, he must realize that the only use which he made of this office was in connection with meetings of La Cosa Nostra, and even the possibility of any disclosure of this fact as a result of any protest made by him must be disturbing to him.

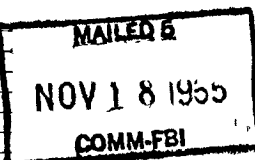

Balistrieri is the head of the organized crime element in Milwaukee. Through lieutenants who are a part of his criminal organization, he controls horse bookings and other forms of gambling in the entire Milwaukee area.

We have conducted an intensified investigation of him in the Criminal Intelligence Program and have developed information concerning his hoodlum associates and his racketeering activities. He has been identified as a member of La Cosa Nostra and the boss of the Milwaukee family of La Cosa Nostra. He is also an associate of Chicago hoodlum Milwaukee Phil Alderisio and through him receives orders from the Chicago underworld which has over-all control of the Milwaukee criminal setup.

Balistrieri has also been the subject of investigation by the Internal Revenue Service and is currently under indictment on a charge of violating Internal Revenue Service laws. Trial in this matter has been set for February 7, 1966.



For the information of the Bureau, United States Attorney JAMES B. BRENNAN, Eastern District of Wisconsin, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, advised on 5/27/66, that defense counsel in the IRS tax case pending against subject have filed a motion to delay the trial in this matter, which had been set for June 6, 1966. Mr. BRENNAN stated that the court will hold a hearing on the motion for delay of trial on 7/1/66, and that in all probability a prior motion submitted by the defense for a change in venue will also be heard on that date. With respect to the motion for a change of venue made by captioned subject concerning income tax charges filed against him, Special Agent in Charge Fields advised today that during the late afternoon of June 30, 1966, Judge Omer T. Poos who is in the Eastern District of Wisconsin on loan from the Southern District of Illinois held hearings. Representing Balistrieri were attorneys Morris Walsh, Dominic Frinzi, [redacted] and the subject's son Joe Balistrieri.

The judge at the outset of the hearing asked if there were any new motions or other matters to be considered with respect to the trial. When assured there were none, he made the comment that there definitely would be a trial and that it would be before him (Judge Poos). The judge said that he had discussed the matter with two other judges in the Eastern District of Wisconsin both of whom have exceedingly heavy calendars and were unable to see their way clear to handle the Balistrieri trial. Judge Poos, therefore, indicated that the trial would necessarily be before him and the only matter remaining was whether it would be in the Eastern District of Wisconsin or in the Southern District of Illinois.

After a brief discussion with respect to the unfavorable publicity concerning Balistrieri which frequently appeared in the Wisconsin Press, Judge Poos said that he certainly did not want another "Shepard case." He, therefore, ordered a change of venue and set the trial date for October 17, 1966, in Springfield, Illinois.

Special Agent in Charge Fields said the foregoing information has been obtained casually during conversation with a representative of the United States Attorney's Office. No other discussion or any other matters pertaining to the trial were entered into during the course of this very brief hearing.

Balestrieri was owner of the Roosevelt Hotel and had monetary interests in numerous downtown Milwaukee taverns including the Downtowner, Hillside Tavern, Towne Bar and the Club 26. Balestrieri was closely allied with Phil Valley in the promotion of prizefights under the name of the Badger Sporting Club. Balestrieri was previously mentioned by [redacted] as being in a position to receive stolen merchandise hijacked out of Chicago, and subsequently disposing of it in Wisconsin inasmuch as he had numerous Chicago contacts. b7D

Information ascertained in 1958 indicated that Valley and Balistrieri were very close and were active in the promotion of boxing. In February 1959, it was learned that Balistrieri had organized Gallagher's Meat Company, a wholesale house which did a large business. Background data on Balistrieri was also set out.

It was noted that the question of whether or not the practices carried on between Balistreri's two places of business was in violation of the law would become a moot one as the city had purchased the Roosevelt Hotel for razing in connection with the Civic Center Development Program. 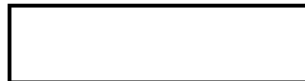

It was also stated that Enea's father, Jack Enea, had been murdered in "gangland style" allegedly on orders of Balistrieri. On 12/20/61, Enea was interviewed regarding his connections with Balistrieri. He admitted being employed by Balistrieri; however, he did not divulge any information about Balistrieri's illegal activities.

Balistrieri was considered a suspect in the murder of Biernat. It was reported that Biernat disappeared on 1/7/63 and his body was found on 1/28/63 in an abandoned farm house in Kenosha County, Wis. Data was set out referring to the possible implications of hoodlums in the Milwaukee area being involved in this murder which appeared to have syndicate connections. Balistrieri was closely associated with other hoodlums also considered suspects in the gang type killing of Biernat. Investigation disclosed the likelihood that Biernat was killed as an outgrowth of a refusal by Biernat to sell part of his jukebox business to a group of Milwaukee hoodlums closely associated with Balistrieri.

Information received and computed by Brodson was fed to Sorce, Raymond Hobert, reported mid-west bookmaker, and Frank Balistrieri, alleged to be a prominent member of the Mafia and to be behind much of the organized crime in Wisconsin.

Judge POOS granted the defense's request for a change of venue because of possible adverse publicity and because BALISTRIERI could obtain a "speedier" trial if the case was transferred to the SDI at Springfield, where judge POOS normally presides. It was indicated the trial would last for 3 or 4 weeks, beginning on October 17, 1966. Judge POOS indicated that due to the deaths of two Federal Judges in Illinois, it was impossible for him to hear the case in Milwaukee. 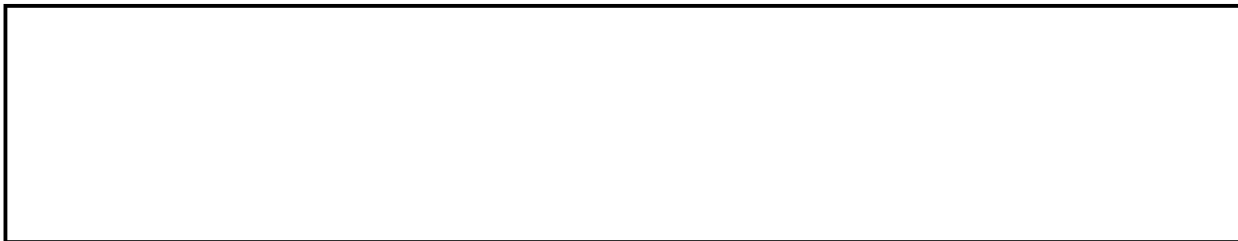

GIMBEL, EDW, Milwaukee, advised that the scheduled hearing for 7/1/66 in Federal Court, Milwaukee, on the pending income tax case against the subject was hurriedly changed to 6/30/66 by USDJ OMER T. POOS, Springfield, Illinois, who desired to be away from the city today and decided to hold the hearing yesterday afternoon.

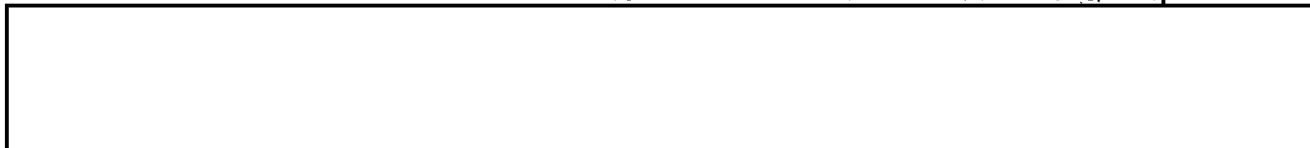

Post Office form reflecting results of the mail cover for both agencies was furnished to the FBI, and he requested that we review our files on the BALISTRIERI case to determine if we do have the original mail cover information.

On 9/26/66, Mr. GIMBEL stated he is extremely interested in two letters mailed to the addressee from Midwest Scrap Metal, 340 W. Wells Street, on 7/5/61, from P. O. Box 1205, Milwaukee, and Gallagher's, 829 North 3rd Street, from Altex Corp., 1426 Arcadian Avenue, Waukesha, Wisconsin, on 7/18/61. Mr. GIMBEL further stated that he fully expects defense counsel will deny the subject had any connection with the aforementioned firms and that he, GIMBEL, wants to be in a position to tell the court that FBI, as well as the IRS, has information that subject had correspondence with these firms.

For the information of the Bureau, the report of SA JOHN A. HOLTZMAN, Milwaukee, dated 8/23/61, in the case entitled, "FRANK PETER BALISTRERI, aka.; ANTI-RACKETEERING," Bufile 92-3116, MI file 94-316, Cover Page C under the Administrative caption, sets forth the results of mail covers placed on 829 North 3rd Street, which is subject's principal business address; namely, Gallagher's Steak House; and on 340 West Wells, which is the Downtowner Night Club, also operated by the subject. The two letters of interest to Mr. GIMBEL are described in this report.

Since the Milwaukee Office of the FBI, as well as IRS, had mail covers in effect at the same time at the same business addresses of the subject, the Post Office Department as a time-saving measure could possibly have furnished IRS with a carbon copy of the results of the mail cover, sending the original to the FBI. This appears probable, since the Post Office document which GIMBEL advises was received by IRS is a carbon copy and GIMBEL got the impression from IRS that they felt the FBI was sent the original.

Under procedures in effect when mail covers were being utilized, results of mail covers were placed in the administrative section of reports, as was done in this case, and the document received from the Post Office (tracing) was destroyed.

A review of files in the Milwaukee Office concerning the BALISTRERI case does not reflect the original document in which Mr. GIMBEL is interested. The Milwaukee Office does not intend to become involved in the tax case concerning BALISTRERI, and therefore no contact is being made with IRS concerning this matter.

In the event mail covers are again authorized by the Bureau, the Milwaukee Office will have a clear understanding with Post Office authorities that results of mail covers in which the FBI has made a request are furnished separately to this office, regardless of the fact that another Government agency may have a

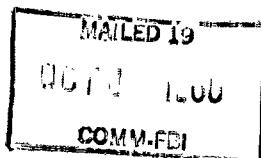

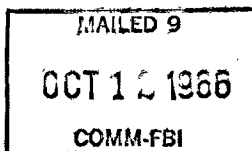

prosecutive action, unless there should be some specific instructions from the Bureau or the Milwaukee Division.

Regarding Bureau regulations that Bureau personnel not be present in court unless official business demands such presence, Springfield should not have any agent or other Bureau personnel in attendance at this trial. Also, Springfield personnel should avoid any discussion with Government attorneys or IRS officials in Springfield in regard to this trial.

Although there may not be any appreciable amount of local interest at Springfield at this trial, it is of considerable local interest at Milwaukee and, of course, to IRS and the Tax Division of the Department.
