Informant T-2 reports subject held Communist meetings at his home and passed out Communist literature on the Army project to fellow workers. Mail cover placed with negative results.

DR. MALINA spent five years in Czecho-Slovakia studying and is reported to speak and read both German and Russian. (Source of Information T-3.)

Criminal record: None known

Military record: Dr. MALINA held a Lieutenant's commission in the U.S. Army until

June 26, 1942, when his resignation was accepted by MACH EMERSON, Adjutant General, Washington, D.C., because subject had been classified as a key faculty member of California Institute of Technology. (Source of Information T-4.)

ORGANIZATIONS: Subject was reported to have attended Communist Party meetings, having been held at the home of [redacted] Pasadena, and having held Communist meetings at his home. (Source of Information T-2.)

LOYALTY AND ACTIVITIES: Source of Information T-2 advised that Dr. FRANK J. MALINA, Director of Gal-Cit Project No. 1, an Army Air Corps restricted project, has passed out Communist literature on this project to fellow workers. Dr. MALINA is reported by T-2 to have held Communist meetings at his residence up until about June of 1941, these meetings being held every Tuesday night. Informant advised that as far as he knows no meetings are being held at the present time.

T-2 advised also that MALINA was active at one time in receiving [redacted]

On November 4, 1942 reporting Agent and Special Agent [redacted] interviewed Confidential Informant T-1 who stated that he was well acquainted with the subject and knew considerable about the personal life of subject as well as his business. When T-1 was questioned concerning

the loyalty of the subject he voluntarily stated that, "MALINA was associated with groups of 'pinks' at Cal Tech about three years ago." When asked what he meant by "pinks" he stated "The group was radical but I believe them to have been merely philosophical in possessing their views and that they would never be active in doing anything to change the form of Government which we now have."

T-1 stated that about three years ago [redacted] to attend meetings at the home of [redacted] Pasadena. T-1 stated that [redacted] was at that time a [redacted] and that he was certain that [redacted] He stated that [redacted] and at these meetings there was a [redacted] (phonetic) who reported the Communist Party of Los Angeles at these meetings. T-1 stated that there were approximately six to eight other members of the faculty [redacted] at these meetings and that at that time at the meetings the group studied the writings of KARL MARX and STRACHEY, an English writer. (JOHN STRACHEY is a noted English writer and Communist lecturer.) T-1 stated that he attended several of these meetings [redacted]

T-1 stated that to his knowledge the subject has not been active at all in any radical or Communist activities in the past three years; [redacted]

T-1 stated that, "At present MALINA is out to win this war and is solidly behind the war effort". However, T-1 stated that the loyalty of the subject would be questionable if he had decide between our form of Government and that of Russia.

T-1 stated that the following are [redacted]

[redacted] mentioned by Confidential Informant T-1 is believed to be [redacted] California.

(Confidential informant T-5.)

On September 17, 1942 reporting Agent interviewed Confidential Informant T-6, who stated that it had been rumored among those working with the subject that the subject was a Communist and had at one time invited certain other persons to attend Communist meetings, but that he had no definite information that the subject was in any way connected with the Communist Party. However, T-6 stated that he had observed that the subject was a great believer in Russia and was often praising the Russians and that this had been going on for the past several years. T-6 has never seen any Communist literature passed out by the subject. T-6 stated that the subject was very capable and very efficient in the work in which he was doing, and that he believed him to be solidly behind the war effort.

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Confidential Informant T-7 advised that on or about September 17 that there was a large gathering at the home of the subject which lasted until about midnight, but except for this instance and a gathering on October 11, 1942 which was at approximately 5:15 P.M., no group had been noticed at the subject's present address, which is at 800 South Hudson Street, Pasadena.

Confidential Informant T-8 gave the following information concerning subject: T-8 stated that subject is a Doctor of Philosophy and is a professor at California Institute of Technology. T-8 advised that

T-9 advised that the subject lived at 1266 Cordova Avenue, Pasadena, California, from September 1, 1941 until June 10, 1942. T-9 had observed no meetings at the subject's home during this period, but stated they had only a normal number of visitors, these being mostly young couples. This was all the information that T-9 had concerning subject.

It was ascertained from Confidential Informant T-4 that the subject was born on October 2, 1912 at Brenham, Texas, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] T-4 stated that subject is employed:

- (1) as assistant professor of aeronautics, California Institute of Technology;
- (2) as Cooperative Agent for the Soil Conservation Service, Pasadena; and
- (3) as Secretary and Treasurer of the Aero-Jet Engineering Corporation.

On July 31, 1942 [REDACTED] of Guggenheim Aeronautics Laboratory, California Institute of Technology, filed an affidavit stating that the subject was employed as assistant professor in the Aeronautics Department and Chief Engineer of the Gal-Cit Project No. 1, and further stated "Several of our contracts have A-1-A and A-A-3 priority

ratings. Dr. MALINA is in charge of a research project considered of vital importance by the United States Army Air Force."

It was ascertained also from T-4 that by letter from headquarters, Ninth Corps Area, Fort Douglas, Utah, dated July 7, 1942 endorsing a letter of June 26, 1942 to Lieutenant FRANK MALINA from MACH EMERSON, Adjutant General, Washington, D.C., that the resignation of MALINA as a lieutenant of the United States Army had been accepted and that he had been classified as a key faculty member of California Institute of Technology.

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By letter dated September 24, 1942 it was requested of the [REDACTED]



Subject: FRANK J. MALINA

Information has been received by this Bureau that the captioned individual is reported to be in Europe as a scientist attached to the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization.

The files of this Bureau reflect that Malina was formerly a member of the Board of Directors of the Jet Propulsion Laboratory of the California Institute of Technology. He is reported to be no longer connected with this school at the present time.

A confidential and reliable informant of this Bureau has advised that Frank J. Malina joined the Communist Party in November, 1938. His Party name is Frank Parma. He was a member of the Pasadena Section, Professional Unit in 1939, and his Party Book Number was 1020 for that year. It has also been determined through confidential informants of this Bureau that Malina was friendly with members of the Communist Party and active in Communist Party activities in California in 1942.

It has recently been determined that Malina was one of the founders of the Aerojet Engineering Company, Azusa, California. However, it is stated that he takes no active part or interest in this company except that of a minor stockholder.

This data is being forwarded to you for your information.

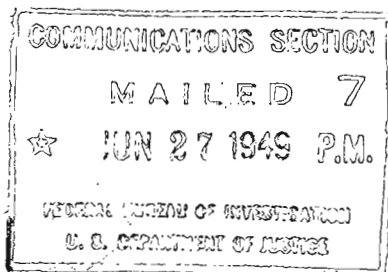

Reference is made to Los Angeles letter to Bureau dated May 26, 1949, in the matter entitled [REDACTED] ESPIONAGE - R.

For the information of the Bureau and the New York Office, MALINA arrived in Los Angeles at 11:25 p.m. on June 6, 1949 via American Airlines. He was accompanied by [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] MALINA [REDACTED] stayed in Los Angeles. They spent the first three days of their visit at [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] MALINA spent the remaining three days at the Huntington Hotel in Pasadena.

During his stay MALINA was entertained by [REDACTED]

From a highly confidential source it was learned that MALINA is scheduled to return to UNESCO in Paris via the QUEEN MARY which sails from New York on June 22, 1949. MALINA [REDACTED] left Los Angeles on Sunday, June 12, 1949 via American Airlines for New York.

From appearances MALINA's trip to the United States seemed to concern itself with visiting his family at Brenham, Texas, visiting Los Angeles to see old friends, and also to take care of certain personal business affairs with regard to the Aero-Jet Engineering Company of Pasadena.

The aforementioned communication advised that FRANK J. MALINA, who is presently employed in Paris, France, with UNESCO, was planning to visit Pasadena, California, in the near future. This letter also requested the Bureau's permission to conduct an active investigation on this individual during his stay here.

Agents had recently observed a group picture at the Laboratory which included among others a picture of MALINA.

The following information is being submitted in letter form to advise the Bureau of recent developments in this case and to request early favorable consideration of form letter FD-142 enclosed herewith.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent [REDACTED] dated April 7, 1949, at Los Angeles, captioned [REDACTED] "IAS., ESPIONAGE-R." Pages 70, 71, 72, 96 and 96A of that report set forth information from [REDACTED] indicating that [REDACTED] and subject, who was then [REDACTED] were involved in the Soviet espionage apparatus of [REDACTED] in New York in 1937. X (u)

He is the subject of Bureau file 100-16579.

[REDACTED] reportedly [REDACTED] in 1943. [REDACTED] It has been ascertained the [REDACTED] Pasadena, California, since sometime in 1946. Regarding this address it is interesting to note that FRANK JOSEPH MALINA (Bureau file No. 100-164610) resided at 800 South Hudson, Pasadena, from July 1, 1942 until he left Pasadena, presumably in 1946, and reportedly went with UNESCO. MALINA was formerly Director of the Jet Propulsion Laboratory at the California Institute of Technology, Pasadena. [REDACTED] has stated MALINA was a member in 1939 of the Professional Unit of the Communist Party, Pasadena Branch. There is no information in our files reflecting any previous connection between MALINA and the [REDACTED]

The most recent Pasadena City Directory (1947) in the cross-section shows MALINA as the occupant of 800 South Hudson. This property is owned by a [REDACTED] Los Angeles indices are negative concerning her. A recent check of Pasadena public utilities reflects all the utilities are still carried under the name of MALINA and the name [REDACTED] does not appear any place in the records.

The telephone at above address is RYAN 1-7844. This is an unpublished but not an unlisted number and is listed to both FRANK J. MALINA and [REDACTED]. The May, 1949, Northeastern Section of the Telephone Directory, as previously mentioned, contains no published number for either MALINA [REDACTED]. The previous directory of November, 1947, contained no listing for [REDACTED] but did have a listing for FRANK J. MALINA, 800 South Hudson, [REDACTED] 6-7655. On January 19, 1949 this number was changed to [REDACTED] 1-7844. On February 10, 1949 the additional name of [REDACTED] was listed to this new latter number in the Telephone Company records.

A local credit report on [REDACTED] made in September of 1947 contains his statement that he had lived at [REDACTED] for the preceding fifteen months. On April 6, 1949 he stated to the credit bureau he was a partner in [REDACTED] Los Angeles, telephone WYoming 7738, and had been so employed for one year and nine months.

A Dun and Bradstreet report on above [REDACTED] shows that [REDACTED] partner is [REDACTED] who came to Los Angeles in 1945 from New York. [REDACTED] claimed previous employment in the motion picture industry in New York. The firm produces commercial and educational 16 mm. films, equipment and stages being leased from various studios in this locality.

[REDACTED] appears in the indices of this office with the various first names of [REDACTED]. The current telephone directory lists him as [REDACTED] Gladstone 0964. Confidential informants have reported [REDACTED] as being in contact with the JAFRC, the Russian-American Club, the ARTS, SCIENCES and PROFESSIONS COUNCIL, and with [REDACTED] a Communist Party figure in the motion picture industry.

In April of 1949 this office ascertained that [REDACTED] is employed by the [REDACTED] Hollywood. [REDACTED] is the subject of Bureau file No. 100-340772. [REDACTED] has been in contact with [REDACTED] all being prominent in Soviet intelligence activities. [REDACTED] name also appeared in the address books of [REDACTED] all of whom have also figured in Soviet espionage systems. 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A highly confidential informant developed in the case of [REDACTED] ESPIONAGE-R, has advised of MALINA's intention to visit Southern California with [REDACTED] during the summer of 1949. It is, therefore, extremely likely that the above mentioned "FRANK" is identical with FRANK J. MALINA.

You are requested to give expeditious attention to the enclosed Form Letter FD-142 in order that as complete coverage as possible can be maintained on subject, particularly during the time MALINA is in this locality.

Reference is made to the report of SA [REDACTED] dated 5/16/49 at Los Angeles in this matter, in which mention is made of Dr. FRANK J. MALINA, subject of Bureau file 100-164610. According to [REDACTED] MALINA is employed by UNESCO in France. From other sources, it has been learned that MALINA has [REDACTED] abroad and is returning to the United States in June of this year.

On May 25, 1949, [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] in conversation with [REDACTED] mentioned that he had just received a wire from "FRANK" and that FRANK (who is believed to be MALINA) is arriving in Los Angeles via American Airlines at 7:50 p.m. on June 6, 1949, and that FRANK had requested [REDACTED] to meet him at the airport at Los Angeles. [REDACTED] that he wanted FRANK to stay with him while he was in Los Angeles.

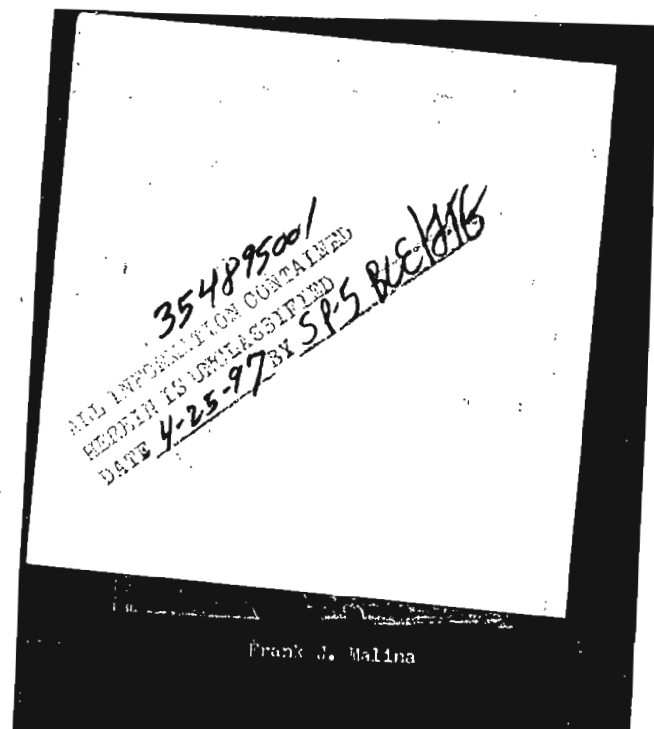
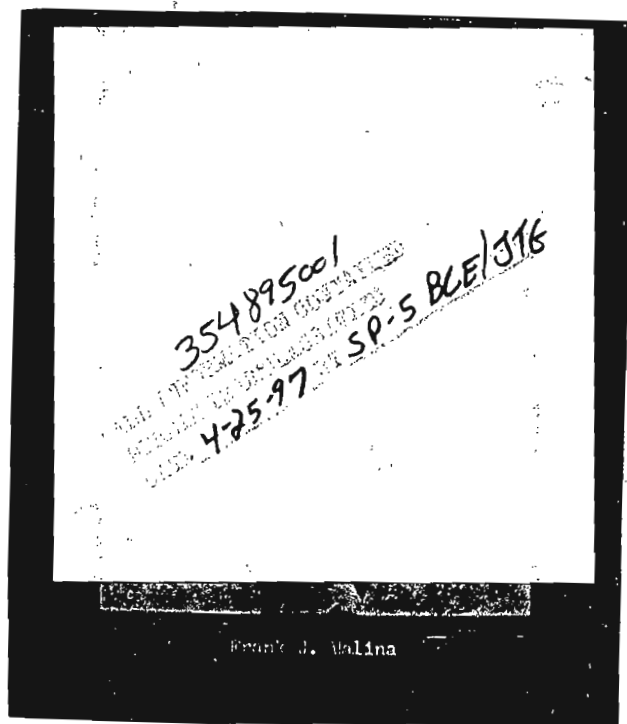

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS: Subject born Brenham, Texas, 10/2/12 of Czechoslovakian parentage. Education and employment background set forth. Subject released from military duty during war years to take charge of Galoit Project of U.S. Army Air Corps and was also Secretary Treasurer of Aero-Jet Corp. of Pasadena, Calif., 1942-1944. In 1939 subject is alleged to have been a member of the Professional Unit of the Pasadena Section of the LACP. Subject is also alleged to have held Communist Party meetings in his home till June of 1941. Comments regarding his loyalty to the U.S. are widely divided. Subject is presently an officer of UNESCO and is scheduled to return to Paris on June 22, 1949. He has been so employed for the past several years.

DETAILS: The title of this case is being marked changed to include the alias of FRANK PARMA which has been used by the subject.

PERSONAL HISTORY

From information of record, the following background information is set forth regarding MALINA:

He is a United States Citizen by birth having been born at Brenham, Texas on October 2, 1912. His father, FRANK J. MALINA, Sr., was born in Czechoslovakia and is now a United States Citizen through naturali-

zation. His mother is CAROLYN SOPHIE MAREK, born at Brenham, Texas. MALINA received part of his early education in Czechoslovakia and attended Brenham High School, Brenham, Texas. He graduated from Texas A and M College in 1934 majoring in mechanical engineering. He received his Masters Degree in this subject at the California Institute of Technology in 1935 and his Doctorate in 1937. MALINA was employed there after as a research assistant and later as Assistant Professor, Aeronautics Department, California Institute of Technology. MALINA took charge of Galcit Project No. 1 of the U. S. Army Air Force at the California Institute of Technology as Chief Engineer in 1941. In 1942 he became Secretary Treasurer of the Aerojet Engineering Company of Pasadena, California. On July 31, 1942, [redacted] who was then director of the Guggenheim Aeronautics Laboratory, California Institute of Technology, filed an affidavit stating that the subject was employed as Assistant Professor in the Aeronautics Department and Chief Engineer of the Galcit Project No. 1 and further stated that "several of our contracts have A-1A and AA3 priority ratings". Dr. MALINA is in charge of a research project considered of vital importance by the U. S. Army Air Force."

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From Source T-1 of known reliability it was learned that MALINA held a reserve Commission in the United States Army and by letter from the Adjutant General dated June 26, 1942 the resignation of MALINA as a Lieutenant in the U. S. Army was accepted inasmuch as he had been classified as a key faculty member of the California Institute of Technology.

From September 1, 1941 until June 10, 1942 the subject is known to have resided at 1266 Cordova Avenue, Pasadena and moved to 800 South Hudson Street, Pasadena on July 1, 1942. Subject resided at this last address from July 1, 1942 to 1945 or later [redacted]

[redacted] In this connection, the 1947 Pasadena City Directory shows the occupant of 800 South Hudson Street to be FRANK J. MALINA. The telephone at the above address is RYan 1-7844, and is listed to both FRANK J. MALINA [redacted]

MALINA left the employ of Galcit at Cal Tech and his employment as Secretary Treasurer of the Aerojet Engineering Company of Pasadena in 1945 to accept a position with the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization. According to Source T-2, of known reliability, MALINA continues to have an active interest in the affairs of the Aerojet Corporation of Pasadena and receives a regular financial return from his interests in this company.

Los Angeles T-2 advised that MALINA is a member of the Secretariat of ~~United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural Organization~~ and is employed as a Counsellor of the Natural Sciences Section and is domiciled abroad at 19 Avenue Kleber Paris 16, France, Telephone Kleber 52-00.

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T-2 also advised that MALINA remarried in the Spring of 1949 to a young English girl who had also been employed by UNESCO in

According to Source T-2 [redacted] MALINA left Paris on May 14, 1949 for Great Britain and on May 20, 1949 left London by air for Houston, Texas, arriving in Houston on May 21, 1949. They are believed to have spent a week or more in Brenham, Texas visiting MALINA's family at 618 South Baylor Street, Brenham, Texas. On June 6, 1949, MALINA and [redacted] arrived in Los Angeles via American Airlines. He remained in the Los Angeles area from June 6, 1949 to June 12, 1949 spending the first three days of his visit at his old address 800 South Hudson Street, Pasadena, and the remaining three days at the Huntington Hotel in Pasadena. MALINA [redacted] left Los Angeles on Sunday evening June 12, 1949 for New York and according to T-2 his address in New York was 405 East Sixty Second Street, New York City. On June 22, 1949 he is scheduled to leave New York on the Queen Mary to arrive in London on June 27, 1949 and Paris about July 1, 1949.

COMMUNIST PARTY ACTIVITY

On June 15, 1949 a United Press News story carried portions of the testimony of [redacted] before the House Committee on unAmerican Activities. In connection with this testimony, according to the United Press News release, [redacted] was asked about the possible Communist affiliations of FRANK J. MALINA, the subject of this report. To quote from the news release, [redacted] conceded they knew a FRANK J. MALINA but refused to say whether he was a Communist."

Los Angeles T-3 of known reliability obtained access to records of the Los Angeles County Communist Party in 1939. He advised that he had in his possession the following information concerning a FRANK J. MALINA. "Real name FRANK J. MALINA; Party name FRANK PARMA; address, 671 Catalina Street, Los Angeles; born United States; age 26, Czechoslovakian ancestry, student at Cal Tech. Communist - 1939 - registration,

Pasadena Section, Professional Group, New Member." [redacted]

[redacted] He advised that he has not had any additional information on MALINA since 1939. Informant was also aware of a [redacted] between MALINA [redacted]

This source also furnished the address of 800 South Hudson Street, Pasadena, for MALINA.

On May 10, 1946, [redacted]

[redacted] Los Angeles advised Special Agent [redacted] that he had been contacted by [redacted] for the rental of his studios on each Monday evening beginning at approximately 8:00 P.M. for discussion group purposes. The indices of this Division revealed that [redacted] a member of the 59th Assembly District Communist Party Clubs, was very active at that time in recruiting and organization work and was sponsoring orientation in new members classes for the Sixteenth Congressional District Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party.

Pursuant to this information, observations were conducted at 6121 Wilshire Blvd. on Monday, May 13, 1946 by Special Agents [redacted] and among others, observed a motor vehicle bearing California license [redacted] parked in the immediate vicinity of the hall and one woman and one man were observed entering the meeting hall from this car which was registered, according to the Department of Motor Vehicles, to FRANK J. MALINA, 800 South Hudson, Pasadena.

Subject first came to the attention of this office in 1941 when a request for investigation of him was requested by T-4 [redacted] on the basis of the following information. This information was to the effect that FRANK J. MALINA [redacted] employed at the California Institute of Technology were members of the Professional Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party. It was further alleged that the names of FRANK MALINA of 1288 Cordova Street and [redacted] appeared on the subscription list of "The Communist newspaper DAILY PEOPLES WORLD" as of September, 1939. Further that MALINA [redacted] were known to hold COMMUNIST meetings at MALINA's residence, 1288 Cordova Street, Pasadena and that the following individuals attended these meetings:



All of the above named persons with the exception of [redacted] were known to T-3 as members of the Communist Party. [redacted] has admitted membership in the Pasadena Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party and has identified the other persons mentioned as members also, with the exception of [redacted] FRANK MALINA [redacted] upon interview by Agents of this office does not have any recollection of MALINA's Communist Party activities.

[redacted] who is presently employed by the Jet Propulsion Laboratory has denied any connection with Communist Party activities during this period. However, a photostatic copy of his registration card with the Communist Party is available to this office. Moreover, another individual named [redacted]

[redacted] advised that he was a member of the Communist Party during this time. He identified [redacted] as the leader and Section organizer of this group during the years 1938-39. However he too has no recollection of any Communist Party Activities on the part of FRANK MALINA. FRANK OPPENHEIMER as has been mentioned previously, has admitted his past membership in the Communist Party but has declined to answer any questions regarding the Communist Party affiliations of any of the others in the group.

Confidential Informant T-5, considered reliable, advised in 1941 that Dr. FRANK J. MALINA, Director of Galcit Project No. 1 also known as the Jet Propulsion Laboratory had passed out Communist literature on this project to fellow workers. This same source reported that MALINA held Communist meetings at his residence up until about June, 1941, these meetings being held every Tuesday night. Prior to this time T-5 advised that MALINA was active in receiving money for Loyalist Spain.

On November 4, 1942, Special Agents of this office interviewed Confidential Informant T-6 who stated that he was well acquainted with the subject and knew a great deal about the personal life of the subject as well as his business. When this man was questioned regarding the loyalty of the subject he voluntarily stated that, "MALINA was associated with groups [redacted] at Cal Tech about three years ago."

When asked what he meant by [redacted]
I believe them to have been merely philosophical in possessing their views
and that they would never be active in doing anything to change the form of
Government which we now have."

T-6 stated that about three years ago he was invited by
the subject to attend meetings at the [redacted]
[redacted] T-6 stated that [redacted] was at that
time a professor at California Institute of Technology and that he was
certain that [redacted] was a Communist. He stated that [redacted]
[redacted] who
represented the Communist Party of Los Angeles at these meetings. [redacted]
stated that there were approximately six to eight other members of the
faculty of California Institute of Technology at these meetings and that
at that time at the meetings the group studied the writings of KARL MARX
and STRACHEY; an English writer. (JOHN STRACHEY is a noted English writer
and Communist lecturer.) T-6 stated that he attended several of these
meetings, [redacted]

T-6 stated that to his knowledge the subject has not
been active at all in any radical or Communist activities in the past three
years; that in the past three years he has been too busy and that he is
employed [redacted]

T-6 stated that, "At present MALINA is out to win this
war and is solidly behind the war effort". However, T-6 stated that the
loyalty of the subject would be questionable if he had to decide between
our form of Government and that of Russia.

RECENT INFORMATION REGARDING MALINA

INTERVIEW WITH CONFIDENTIAL INFORMANT T-7

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About the middle of March of this year, Agents of this office had occasion to talk with Confidential Informant T-7 who is considered reliable and who is well placed in [REDACTED]. During the conversation, this man related that he had in the past attended a cocktail party at the home of MALINA and the course of the conversation there, as he put it, "went from red to redder". This person went on to say that he had very definite reservations about the loyalty of MALINA, and without being solicited in any way said that he felt that in MALINA's position with UNESCO he is in an extremely good position to engage in espionage activity should he so desire.

Several days later, Agents of this office had occasion to speak with Los Angeles T-7 concerning MALINA. Just as the interview in question was being terminated and the Agents were taking their leave, the Informant stated that he has always been very curious as to what was behind an incident that had been called to his attention some time ago by a [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Informant would not state who might be responsible for the loss of these documents but did indicate that the loss of these plans, judging by the date of their recovery in France in the latter part of 1945 or early 1946, would have occurred during the directorship of FRANK J. MALINA at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory.

By letter dated June 8, 1949, the Bureau advised that preliminary inquiry on the part of confidential informant T-8 of known reliability, had established the fact that the French were known to have a copy of these plans. It was this source's observation that more complete information concerning this matter would have to come from military authorities abroad. Further inquiry developed the information that the French were known to have sent up such a rocket in 1945.

Los Angeles T-7 was re-interviewed on June 29, 1949 for more specific information concerning the loss of plans [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Informant was asked directly if he thought that MALINA may have been responsible for the loss of the plans [REDACTED]

in 1945. Informant answered that he could make no such assertion. He was then asked to elaborate on his original suspicions in this matter. Informant pointed out, to begin with, that the [redacted]

DISTINCTION BETWEEN AEROJET CORPORATION
AND
THE JET PROPULSION LABORATORY

Inasmuch as subject has been mentioned as being connected with both the Jet Propulsion Laboratory and the Aerojet Corporation of Pasadena during the war years, the following brief history of the two organizations is being set out to establish their identity as separate organizations. This history has been provided by [redacted] Aerojet Corporation.

Early in 1936, A group of graduate students of the California Institute of Technology at Pasadena, California, became interested in the field of jet propulsion as a possible military weapon.

This group was headed by FRANK J. MALINA. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] MALINA is generally credited with being the one who originally conceived the idea of the military application of the theory of jet propulsion.

These students, relying on a small grant from a private citizen, engaged in research on the [REDACTED] for a number of years and, in the course of so doing, were working under the direct supervision of [REDACTED] who is regarded as the world's outstanding aerodynamicists.

In about 1939, [REDACTED] who was then special advisor to General H. H. ARNOLD of the Air Force, realized the military significance of this research and it was through his instigation that General ARNOLD set up the Committee for Air Corps Research of the National Academy of Sciences to sponsor development of rockets. As a result of this small start, a special laboratory was set up in the nearby hills under the direct sponsorship of the Guggenheim Aeronautical Laboratory of the California Institute of Technology. It was in this manner that the present Jet Propulsion Laboratory obtained its original code name of Galcit, which, of course, is an abbreviation for the Guggenheim Aeronautical Laboratory, California Institute of Technology.

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Under Army Air Force sponsorship, the laboratory grew and considerable research was done along the lines of rocket and jet propulsion theory. In the early part of 1942, it became apparent that the pilot models developed at the laboratory would have to be manufactured. It was against the policy of the California Institute of Technology to engage in manufacturing of any type, so it was at this time that at the instigation of [REDACTED] together with sponsorship by the Air Force in the way of contractual commitments, that the Aerojet Engineering Corporation at Azusa, California, was formed. The original stockholders of this group were [REDACTED] FRANK J. MALINA, [REDACTED]

MALINA, who was then the director of the Jet Propulsion Laboratory (Galcit), continued in his capacity at Galcit while [REDACTED] who had been employed at the Laboratory, transferred to Aerojet as a full-time employee.

At no time was there any financial tie-up between these two organizations, but by reason of the fact that Aerojet came into being somewhat under [REDACTED] sponsorship, and inasmuch as employees from

Galcit went to Aerojet and, further, that MALINA remained at Galcit as director while acting in the capacity of Secretary-Treasurer of Aerojet. the two came to be identified as parts of the same organization. [redacted] advised that in the early stages Aerojet did manufacture most of the pilot models developed at the Laboratory, but as time went on, other local contractors bid and sometimes obtained the contracts for manufacturing the research developments.

RECENT ACTIVITIES OF MALINA - ASSOCIATION WITH [redacted]

As has been mentioned previously from interview of Confidential Source T-3 who [redacted] of the Communist Party affiliations of MALINA [redacted] they were participants in the same branch of the Communist Party of Pasadena during the year 1939 and possibly thereafter. [redacted] Party member of this group during the period 1937 - 1939 advised the [redacted]

RECENT ACTIVITIES OF MALINA - TRIP TO LOS ANGELES AREA

On May 25, 1949 T-9 reported that MALINA had been in touch [redacted] and was scheduled to arrive in Los Angeles on June 6, 1949 for a period of a week. On June 6, 1949 MALINA [redacted] arrived in Los Angeles via American Airlines at 11:25 P.M. They were met at the airport [redacted] Pasadena. The arrival of MALINA and the subsequent meeting was observed by Special Agents [redacted] and the writer. In response to an inquiry by [redacted] as to where he intended to stay during his visit MALINA was overheard by the writer to remark that he [redacted] going to stay at his old place at 800 South Hudson Avenue, Pasadena. [redacted] MALINA [redacted] to this address and the surveillance was discontinued. [redacted]

As mentioned previously MALINA spent the first three days of his visit to the Los Angeles Area at the home of [REDACTED] Pasadena. According to T-2 [REDACTED] who also have been in correspondence with MALINA, were aware of his impending visit and offered him the use of his old house and one of their automobiles during MALINA's stay in Pasadena.

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Regarding [REDACTED] the following information has been recently learned from Confidential Source T-10 who is considered reliable:



In connection with the results of the material obtained through T-2 mentioned in this report, besides correspondence, which was mostly of a social nature, subject had in his possession a number of photographs with accompanying text, regarding the testing of the "WAC Corporal" at White Sands, New Mexico. According to the title page of this report, the information contained therein was to be released to the Sunday papers of June 23, 1946.

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According to [redacted] the Swiss Government has or is building a similar rocket at the present time. In this connection [redacted] added that it is generally known that the Swiss frequently undertake such enterprises for the sole purpose of afterwards selling them to the highest bidder among the outside nations.

There does not seem to be much question that [redacted] feels that MALINA should, in view of his position at the laboratory, at least have had knowledge of the loss of these plans but [redacted] will not name MALINA or anyone else responsible for the loss. [redacted] position at the time of the loss was [redacted]

County Communist Party. [] said that he was [] of this unit and recalled that he was recruited by a Communist Party member from Los Angeles, the identity of whom he does not now recall. [] admitted that he was an officer of this unit, specifically that of [] and stated that he did not have any knowledge of recruiting anyone else into this branch of the Party. He specifically recalled that [] entered into membership in this unit shortly after he did.

[] stated that the only thing he recalls about the function of this unit is that it followed from a discussion group which existed on the California Institute of Technology campus and came about through the feeling of a need for membership in the Communist Party on the part of various members of this discussion group. In other words, [] said, during the year 1937 various members of the discussion group at the California Institute of Technology came to the realization that their principles and beliefs for economic and social reform could be best achieved through adherence to the principles of the Communist Party.

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[] was asked to recall to the best of his recollection the identity of those persons who were members of the unit following its transition from a discussion group stage to a unit of the Communist Party, and he named the following individuals:



FRANK MALINA

In the light of the above statement, [] was then asked if he had positive knowledge of the membership on the part of the persons he had mentioned of such nature that he could testify. [] immediately began to qualify his original statement by saying that if it came to a matter of testimony, he would be unable to state positively that any of the persons

mentioned were members of the Communist Party with the exception of [redacted]
[redacted]

[redacted] stated his position more or less as follows with regard to the above:

He stated that in the matter of positive affirmation of membership on the part of any person as a member of the Communist Party, he believed that he would have to be governed by what he considered to be scientific certitude; in other words, he maintains that his willingness to affirm the membership of [redacted] in this unit of the Communist Party is based primarily on their own admission of it publicly, and in the case of [redacted] he had been shown documentary evidence thereof at the trial of this individual.

With respect to Professional Unit 122 of the Pasadena Branch of the Communist Party, [redacted] said it never had much association with Los Angeles County Party headquarters and its members were never called upon to perform any special outside activity with the possible exception of selling the "Daily Peoples World", the West Coast Communist daily, and he added that even this activity was very haphazardly performed. [redacted] stated that he has no clear-cut memory as to when this particular group dissolved. He said he is quite certain that the dissolution of the unit, as such, never came about from any specific orders from Communist Party headquarters but rather happened as a gradual thing when people ceased to attend because of interest in other affairs.

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[redacted] stated that he was frank to admit that had the group continued their interest in the unit for several years, he would probably have remained a member of it. He said that he could not fix the date of the dissolution with any degree of accuracy but felt that he was reasonably certain that it was shortly prior to the outbreak of World War II.

With particular regard to the subject of this case, [redacted] stated that he did recall that he was present at meetings of the unit and also recalled that he dropped out of the unit sometime in 1939 or early 1940. When [redacted] was asked for an explanation as to how he could affirmatively state that a person such as the subject "dropped out" of the unit and not be able to state affirmatively that he was therefore a member of the unit, he replied that he was not the sort of person who was given to positive statements of any kind and stated that the only time he would be willing to make an affirmative statement with regard to another person's membership in the Communist Party would be if he were able to first view their Communist Party card and ascertain from it that the person was an active member of the Communist Party. In this connection [redacted] said that he could not, with any degree of certainty, place any persons in the Communist Party

outside of those two persons whom he first listed. He refused outright to execute any sort of a signed statement of his activities or the activities of other members of Professional Unit 122.

[] disclaimed knowledge of the Party aliases of any of the members of Professional Unit 122, to which he was attached.

INTERVIEW OF []

On January 6, 1951, [] was interviewed by Special Agents [] at her residence at []

At the outset of the interview, [] readily corroborated the information furnished by [] to the effect that they had been perhaps the original members of Professional Unit 122 in Pasadena [] [] having been preceded by a discussion group.

She said that she felt that it was entirely possible that an individual could have attended at least several meetings of the unit without having realized that it was actually a meeting of a formally organized unit of the Communist Party. She added, however, that she felt that anyone who attended at least several of these meetings would have known that the feelings expressed by those present coincided with the then current Communist Party thinking.

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[] stated that if she were called upon to testify, she could only state positively that the following individuals had been members of Professional Unit 122 of the Communist Party:

She said that she knew that [] had been a member in that he had told her so even prior to the time he had made a public announcement thereof. She said that she knew [] had been a member of the unit. She added in this regard that she was able to make such a statement with regard to [] because the basis of her association with him had been so intimate over so many years that based on this cumulative knowledge, she could make such a positive statement; otherwise, she said that she only knew positively of the membership of [] explaining this by the fact that they had both joined at the same time and that she had knowledge of [] membership by reason of their obvious very close association.

With respect to the subject of this case, [] said that she remembered him being present at various meetings of Professional Unit 122 together with [] in 1938 and 1939. Although [] would neither affirm or deny the membership of FRANK MALINA [] in Professional Unit 122 of the Communist Party, she did state that, comparatively speaking, MALINA [] were much more active at meetings

than [redacted] who has been mentioned previously, her exact words being. "Oh, he [redacted] was much more inactive than those two (MALINA and [redacted] as they are not the quiet type."

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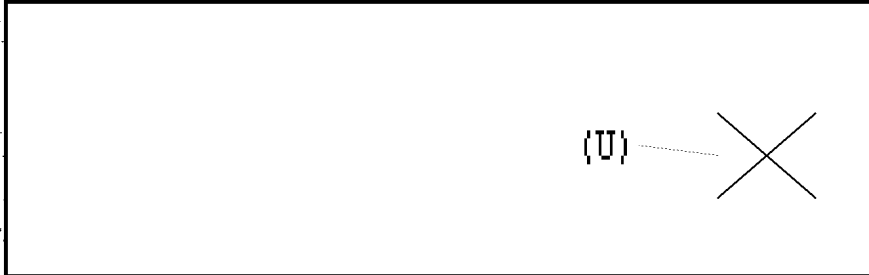

PURPOSE:

My memorandum to you dated July 27, 1951, containing information concerning Frank Joseph Malina as requested by [redacted] of the McCarran Committee, pointed out that Malina's current employment was being checked to resolve the discrepancy between Bureau files, which indicate that Malina is employed by U.N.E.S.C.O. in Paris, France, and the McCarran Committee request, which described him as "Now connected with Marshall Plan in Europe."

ACTION TAKEN:

Through established liason, on July 31, 1951, [redacted] advised that Malina is not employed by the State Department, but is employed by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization as assistant to the head of the Natural Sciences Office in Paris, France. [redacted] stated that U.N.E.S.C.O. is an international organization.

RECOMMENDATION:

(1) That this memorandum be forwarded to Mr. Nichols.

(2) That a copy of this memorandum be forwarded to the Loyalty Section in view of the fact that the employment given for Malina in the original McCarran Committee request indicated that Malina might be a government employee and therefore a proper subject for investigation under the Loyalty Program. As an employee of U.N.E.S.C.O., Malina does not come within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

SCOPE OF SEARCH:

This individuals name was searched as Molino, Malino, Malina, Parma and Palma, with the first names of Frank Joseph, Frank J., F. Joseph, Joseph, Frank, and the initials F.J., for subversive derogatory references. An Internal Security - R case was located on one Frank J. Malina, wa. Frank Parma, who is believed to be identical with the subject of this inquiry. The records of the Identification Division reflect three non-criminal identification records for Malina.

A blind memorandum is attached setting forth information suitable for dissemination. The information set forth below is not considered suitable for dissemination due to the nature of the information itself or the nature of the source.

BUREAU INVESTIGATION:

An Internal Security-R case was opened on Frank J. Malina in 1941 upon receipt of information that he had attended Communist Party meetings in Pasadena, California. During the investigation information was developed that Malina had been a Communist Party member in Pasadena, California, in 1939, and had attended meetings until 1941. No evidence was developed to show actual membership since 1939. The Security Index Card on Malina was cancelled in March, 1950, because of his residence and employment outside the United States. The case is now in Pending Inactive status. (100-164610)

BACKGROUND:

Frank Joseph Malina was born on October 2, 1912, at Brenham, Texas. After attending high school in Brenham he studied at Texas A. & M. College, receiving a Bachelor of Science degree in June, 1934. He then entered the California Institute of Technology, Pasadena, California, where he received a Master of Science degree in June, 1935, and a Ph. D. in September, 1937. After graduation Malina remained at the university as a research assistant and later as an Assistant Professor in the Aeronautics Department. He pioneered in the field of jet propulsion as a possible military weapon and in 1941 took charge as Chief Engineer of Gal-Cit Project No. 1 of the U. S. Army Air Force at the California Institute of Technology. In 1942 he was one of the founders of the Aerojet Engineering Company, Azusa, California, formed to manufacture models for the Air Force that had been developed in the Jet Laboratory at the California Institute of Technology. In about 1946 Malina accepted a position with the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization in Paris, France, where he is still employed. Malina [redacted]

An informant of unknown reliability recalled that in about 1938 or 1939 a group of students engaged in rocket research at the California Institute of Technology met together from time to time for discussion meetings on various subjects. At one of these meetings at Malina's home, Malina introduced one [redacted] who talked favorably on the subject of Communism and passed out Communist literature, including "Capital," "State and Revolution" and the "Manifesto of the Communist Party." At another meeting at Malina's home

[redacted] were present. Informant stated that he later discussed [redacted] with Malina, who was very antagonistic and defended [redacted]. Informant stated that he believed that Malina ceased his activities with this group in 1939.

A source considered reliable advised in 1941 that information had been brought to his attention (source and reliability not stated) to the effect that Dr. Frank J. Malina, Director of Cal-Cit Project No. 1, an Army Air Corps restricted project at the California Institute of Technology, had passed out Communist literature on the project to fellow workers and had held Communist meetings at his residence until about June, 1941. Malina was also alleged to have been active at one time in receiving money for Loyalist Spain.

[redacted] in testimony given on June 14, 1949, before the House Committee on Un-American Activities inquiring into Communist infiltration of the Radiation Laboratory and Atomic Bomb Project at the University of California, admitted their membership in the Communist Party in Pasadena, California, from 1937 to 1941. They stated that they had known Frank J. Malina in Pasadena, but refused to answer questions as to whether Malina had ever been a Communist Party member, or had attended Communist Party meetings.

In March, 1950, an informant of unknown reliability advised that he had been a member of the Professional Unit of the Communist Party in Pasadena, California, during 1938 and 1939 while a student at the California Institute of Technology, and while he could not state definitely that Malina had actually been a member of this unit, he recalled that Malina had attended at least two meetings of this unit.

An individual of unknown reliability advised in January, 1951, that he had been a member of the Professional Unit of the

Communist Party in Pasadena, California, starting in 1937. He stated that Malina was present at meetings of this unit until 1939 or early 1940, but was unable to state positively that Malina had been a member of the Communist Party.

In January, 1951, an informant of unknown reliability, [redacted]

[redacted] in Pasadena, California, states that Malina had attended various meetings of this unit in 1938 and 1939, but could not state positively that Malina had been a member of the Communist Party.

In March, 1951, an informant of unknown reliability, a [redacted]

[redacted] in Pasadena, California, from 1938 to 1942, stated that Malina had been a member of that unit during that period, and had attended meetings, some of which were held at Malina's home in Pasadena.

In August, 1949, an individual of unknown reliability, advised that he had visited Malina's home in Pasadena in 1946 and based upon conversations that took place at that time came to the conclusion that Malina was definitely pro-Communist in his beliefs. This individual could offer nothing specific to support his conclusion, except to say that Malina, in discussion of things political, gave every indication of closely adhering to the Communist Party line as it existed at that time.

Malina attended the First General Assembly of the World Federation of Scientific Workers in Prague, Czechoslovakia, from September 21 to September 25, 1948, as an observer for UNESCO from the United Nations. [redacted] French physicist and well known French Communist, was the president of this Federation, which has been cited by the House Committee on Un-American Activities as "another International Communist-front organization" which seeks to win scientists to the Communist cause.

The New York "World Telegram" in its issue of August 16, 1949, reported that the House Un-American Activities Committee had named forty-two persons, twelve of them university professors, in connection with a Communist apparatus which the committee said had succeeded in one of three attempts to get information on the atom bomb for Russia. The parent Communist organization, according to the committee, met in the homes of [redacted]

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The report of SA [redacted] dated July 26, 1949, at Los Angeles, California, reflects that Confidential Source T-3 [redacted] possesses documentary evidence of the Communist Party affiliations of Malina. The nature of this documentary evidence should be fully explained and photostatic copies of the document or documents should be secured and submitted to the Bureau as an enclosure with the next report.

Los Angeles should also attempt to secure copies of any available PSQ's or other similar questionnaires that may have been executed by the subject, for the completion of Bureau files.

The Washington Field Office should also inquire as to the availability of any [redacted]

[redacted] If any are available, copies should be secured and submitted to the Bureau. In this regard, WFO is advised that Malina held a reserve commission in the U. S. Army until June 26, 1942, when he resigned. Prior to 1945, Malina was Assistant Professor in the Aeronautics Department of the California Institute of Technology. He was also in charge of the Galeit (Guggenheim Aeronautical Laboratory, California Institute of Technology) Project #1, later known as the Jet Propulsion Laboratory, under the sponsorship of the U. With respect to the documentary evidence referred to in referenced report dated July 26, 1949, [redacted] who in 1938 were Communist Party functionaries, made available to [redacted] who was then head of the Intelligence Bureau of the Los Angeles Police Department, original Communist Party 1939 registration forms for Professional Unit 122 of the Los Angeles County Communist Party in Pasadena, California. At that time, [redacted] copied detail on a previously prepared facsimile registration form which states that MALINA, using the Party alias FRANK PARMA, was registered as a new member of the Communist Party in November, 1938; that he held no 1938 Communist Party book but was issued 1939 Communist Party book No. 1020. MALINA's address at that time was listed as 671 South Catalina, Los Angeles; born, U.S., age 26; male; Czech; student at Cal-Tech. A photograph of this facsimile registration form is being forwarded to the Bureau at its request. (A complete description of the procedure in obtaining this material, as outlined above, is contained in a report of SA [redacted] dated January 16, 1951, in the case of [redacted] AEA-A; FRAUD AGAINST THE GOVERNMENT.)

With further reference to [redacted] and the case referred to above, it will be recalled that [redacted] was interviewed by agents of the Albany Office on March 9, 1951. At the time of that interview, [redacted] was under indictment being charged with fraud against the Government. These charges arose because of the fact that in the completion of a Personnel Security Questionnaire for the Atomic Energy Commission [redacted] had failed to list thereon that he had been a member of the Communist Party.

ENCLOSURE ATTACHED

At the time of this interview, [redacted] executed 22 signed statements in which he identified other individuals who were likewise members of the same professional unit No. 122 of the Communist Party. Among the 22 individuals so named by [redacted] was an individual

In this connection, it should be noted that [redacted] was the only individual who has stated that [redacted] was a member of Professional Unit No. 122 of the Communist Party. The information which [redacted] made available to this office concerning the original membership list of Professional Unit 122, furnished this information for a period which included the 1939 registration. At the time [redacted] was interviewed he stated that he remained a member of this unit until late in 1941 or early 1942. For the information of the San Francisco Office, subject is presently residing in Paris where he is reported to be Deputy Director of the Natural Sciences Department of UNESCO. MALINA was reliably reported to have been a member of the Professional Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party in 1939. Prior to his appointment with UNESCO MALINA headed the Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, a facility of the California Institute of Technology. The personnel file for the subject maintained at the California Institute of Technology contains a memorandum indicating that MALINA executed a Personnel Security Questionnaire for this position on March 26, 1945. This memorandum indicated that this Personnel Security Questionnaire was forwarded to what is now known as [redacted] California, in 1945.

The enclosures to this report, which were furnished by [redacted] contain available documentary evidence of Malina's Communist Party membership. [redacted] who is mentioned in this report, secured his information from [redacted] William F. Hynes is identical with Confidential Informant Los Angeles T-3 mentioned in the report of Special Agent [redacted] dated July 26, 1949, at Los Angeles, California; with Confidential Informant T-4 mentioned in the report of Special Agent [redacted] dated December 13, 1950, at Los Angeles, California; and with Confidential Informant T-1 mentioned in the report of Special Agent [redacted] dated January 30, 1951, at Los Angeles, California.

Your attention is also called to the enclosures to the Washington, D. C., report dated January 31, 1952, containing copies of passport applications with oaths of allegiance subscribed and sworn to by Malina on August 28, 1941, April 11, 1949, and an undated passport application which was apparently executed immediately prior to April 9, 1947. An additional enclosure to this report is an undated Personnel Security Questionnaire executed by Malina. Question number 14 on the questionnaire states:

"Membership in organizations (list all organizations of which you are or have been a member since 1930.)"

Malina did not list membership in the Communist Party on this questionnaire.

Your attention is further called to the enclosures to the St. Louis report dated February 1, 1952, among which are:

- (1) Oath of Office, Affidavit and Declaration of Appointee, subscribed and sworn to by Malina on June 18, 1946.
- (2) War Department Affidavit subscribed and sworn to by Malina on August 2, 1946.
- (3) Application for Federal Employment (unsigned) dated May 16, 1946.
- (4) Application for Federal Employment signed by Malina and dated May 16, 1946. Question number 26 in the Application for Federal Employment asks:

~~SECURITY INFORMATION - CONFIDENTIAL~~

"Do you advocate or have you ever advocated, or are you now or have you ever been a member of any organization that advocates the overthrow of the Government of the United States by force or violence?"

The question was answered in the negative.

Also enclosed is one copy of a Personnel Security Questionnaire dated October 24, 1944, which was executed by Malina. Question number 14 asks:

"Membership in organizations (list all organizations of which you are or have been a member since 1930.)"

Malina did not list membership in the Communist Party on this questionnaire.

It is our understanding that the Wartime Suspension of Limitations Act suspended the running of the Statute of Limitations, applicable to offenses involving fraud against the United States, until three years after December 31, 1949, provided the fraud occurred prior to December 31, 1946.

In view of the above, it is requested that you furnish an opinion as to prosecution of Malina for a violation of 18 USC 1001 or related statutes.

If you consider that additional investigation in this matter is warranted, it is requested that you inform us of any additional specific investigation that you desire.

On November 15, 1950, the local office of Immigration and Naturalization Service conducted a deportation hearing for an individual known as [REDACTED]. It should be noted that by records obtained by [REDACTED] been identified as a member of Professional Unit Number 122 of the CP in Pasadena, California, during the year 1939.

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At this hearing, [REDACTED] appeared and after being placed under oath, stated that he, for approximately a three-year period, was a member of the CP in Los Angeles. He likewise added that he knew that during the latter part of 1938 that [REDACTED] performed certain clerical duties for the Party, the exact details of which he could not recall. At that time he stated that he had been requested by [] to contact me and to arrange for my enrollment in the Communist Party. and that he was engaged on secret and other classified contracts. He indicated that he desired to visit the European Theater of Operations on behalf of the Ordnance Department of the War Department. At that time he resided at 800 South Hudson Avenue, Pasadena, California, and he indicated that he had previously resided at 1288 Cordova Street, Pasadena. He also indicated that he received a Ph.D. in Aeronautics in 1940 from the California Institute of Technology.

He stated that from 1934 to 1942 he was a commissioned officer, Serial Number 316523, in the Corps of Engineers in the Officers' Reserve Corps, United States Army. For one month during the summer of 1934 he served on active duty. He reported that he resigned his commission as a First Lieutenant in accordance with instructions received from the Commanding General, Army Air Force Materiel Command, in order to continue research work connected with the war effort in a civilian status. Subject indicated that he was employed by the California Institute of Technology from 1934 to the date of his questionnaire and by the Aerojet Engineering Corps from 1942 until the date of his personnel security questionnaire.

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He indicated that he had visited Mexico for several days during the summer of 1933, 1934, 1936 and 1939.

MALINA:



T-1 also ascertained that the Czechoslovakian Press reported that on September 21, 1948, the Congress of the World Federation of Scientific Workers met at the Writers' Castle in Dobris near Paris, France. The Czechoslovakian Press reported that one DR. MALINA, United States citizen and a "UNESCO observer" attended that Congress.

Files of the Passport Division, United States Department of State, reflect that FRANK JOSEPH MALINA was issued United States passport number 805158 on August 31, 1944, by the Department of State at Washington, D. C., validated for travel to the British Isles and Ireland. Subject's passport application, dated August 28, 1944,

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reflected that he intended to visit the British Isles on business. He also reported that he had resided in Czechoslovakia from 1920 to 1925 with his parents. The California Institute of Technology (CIT), Pasadena, California, where MALINA was employed, and the Office of the Chief of Transportation, Army Service Forces, by letters dated August 25, 1944, and August 28, 1944, requested that MALINA be issued a passport to proceed to Europe at the request of the Chief of Ordnance, United States Army.

Subject's application for validation of passport dated December 2, 1944, at London, England, requested that his passport be validated for return to the United States by the Northern route. On the same day MALINA's passport was validated for return to the United States direct or via Canada and Newfoundland.

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On June 25, 1946, MALINA was issued special United States passport number 9630 by the Department of State validated for all countries except those occupied by the United States military authorities. His passport application dated June 18, 1946, indicated that he intended to visit England on official business. His passport was also requested by the Military Intelligence Service, War Department, in a letter dated June 17, 1946, which was prepared for the signature

Subject's application for amended passport dated September 19, 1946, requested that his passport be amended to transit Germany enroute to Czechoslovakia as he desired to visit relatives in Czechoslovakia. He listed his address at that time as the Astor Hotel, Paris, France. The American Vice-Consul at Paris, France, on September 19, 1946, amended subject's passport to indicate that he had been granted permission by the Joint Chiefs of Staff to transit Germany enroute to Czechoslovakia.

On March 13, 1947, MALINA was issued special passport 796 by the Department of State validated for travel in all countries except those occupied by the Armed Forces of the United States. His passport application dated March 6, 1947, reflected that he intended to visit France for the purpose "position with UNESCO Secretariat" and that he intended to leave New York City on April 9, 1947, on board the Queen Elizabeth. His passport was mailed to the United Nations, Transport Service, 350 5th Avenue, New York, New York. This passport was also requested by F. J. SAUNDERS, Chief, Transportation Service, United Nations, in a letter dated March 6, 1947, which indicated that subject was to proceed to Paris on official business for the United Nations as a counselor in the Secretariat of the

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United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organizations.

Subject's file contains a refusal notice dated November 13, 1947. The reason for refusal was listed as "member of Communist Party. Party named FRANK PARMA."

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[redacted] MALINA was issued passport number 8609 FS 261536 by the United States Consul at Paris, France, on April 11, 1949. Subject's passport application dated April 11, 1949, reflected that he resided in Czechoslovakia from 1920 to 1925; England and France from October, 1944, to November, 1944; England, France and Czechoslovakia from July, 1946, to November, 1946; France, April 17, 1947, to October 26, 1947; Mexico, November, 1947, and France, December, 1947, to the date of his passport application. [redacted]

On this passport application subject listed [redacted]

On March 16, 1951, subject's application for renewal of passport dated March 16, 1951, reflected that he resided at 89 rue Erlanger, Paris, France. By airgram dated May 26, 1951, the Department of State advised the American Embassy at Paris, France, that subject's passport renewal was to be refused. The American Embassy at Paris, France, was also instructed to hold subject's passport in the Embassy and to advise the Department of State of subject's return to the United States.

By letter dated September 27, 1951, the American Consul at Paris, France, advised the Passport Division that he had received a letter from subject dated September 21, 1951, which indicated that in April, 1951, subject's passport had expired and that in May, 1951, he had been informed that the renewal of his passport had not been granted. He also indicated that he had surrendered his passport to the American Consul. MALINA stated that he still held an appointment as an international civilian servant with UNESCO in Paris, France. He requested that he be informed of the reason for the refusal of his passport.

By telegram dated November 9, 1951, the Passport Division instructed the American Embassy at Paris, France, to advise MALINA that consideration had again been given to his request for renewal of his passport but that his passport was not being renewed since it was "considered that his further travel would be contrary to the best interests of the United States."

Subject's passport file also contains a telegram dated July 19, 1949, from [REDACTED]

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[REDACTED] at the California Institute of Technology and that it, therefore, may have been assumed that he was also a Communist. This communication also reported that no information had been received at Paris, France, which would indicate that MALINA had followed the Communist Party line during his employment as a member of the UNESCO staff.

The files of the Office of Special Investigations, Department of the Air Force, do not contain additional data concerning the subject.

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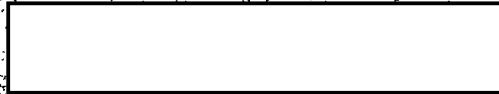

About three years prior to the above interview T-1 stated that he was invited by the subject to attend meetings at the home of [redacted] Pasadena, California. T-1 explained that [redacted] was at that time a professor at the California Institute of Technology and that he was certain that [redacted] was a Communist. T-1 stated that [redacted] was born in Russia and at these meetings there was [redacted]

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[redacted] According to T-1 there were approximately six to eight other members of the faculty at the California Institute of Technology at these meetings and that at that time at these meetings the group studied the writings of KARL MARX and STRACHEY, an English writer. T-1 advised that he attended several of these meetings and that he was invited to all of these meetings by the subject.

T-1 advised on November 4, 1942, that to his knowledge subject had not been active at all in any radical or Communist activities during the past three years. T-1 stated that as of November, 1942, subject was out to win the war and was solidly behind the war effort. However, T-1 stated that the loyalty of subject would be questionable if subject had to decide between our form of Government and that of Russia.

On September 17, 1942, T-6 reported that it had been rumored among those working with the subject that the subject was a Communist and had at one time invited other persons to attend Communist meetings but that he had no definite information that the subject was in any way connected with the Communist Party. However, T-6 had observed over a period of several years that MALINA was a great believer in Russia and was often praising Russia. Informant had never observed subject passing out Communist literature.

T-7 advised that on September 17, 1942, there was a large gathering at the home of the subject which lasted until about midnight. The only other gathering T-7 had noticed at subject's residence, 800 South Hudson Street, Pasadena, California, was one which convened at 5:15 P.M. on October 11, 1942.

A review of the Army service record on file at the AGO, Demobilized Personnel Records Branch, World War II Unit, Department of the Army, for FRANK JOSEPH MALINA, ASN O-316523, indicates that he was appointed Second Lieutenant in the U. S. Army, Engineer Reserve Corps on May 26, 1934. He resigned as a First Lieutenant, Corps of Engineers, on June 26, 1942, by reason of subject's classification as a key faculty member of the California Institute of Technology. Subject was on inactive status, except for the period from July 8, 1934, to July 21, 1934, at which time he was called to active duty.

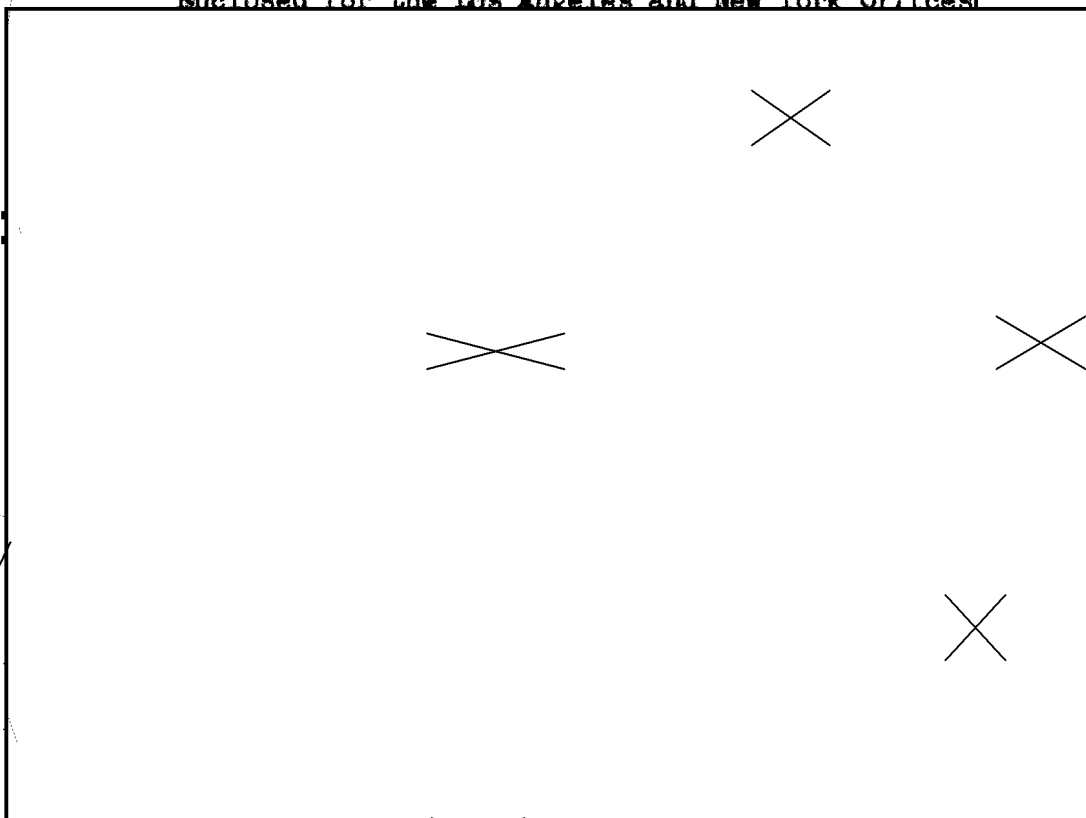

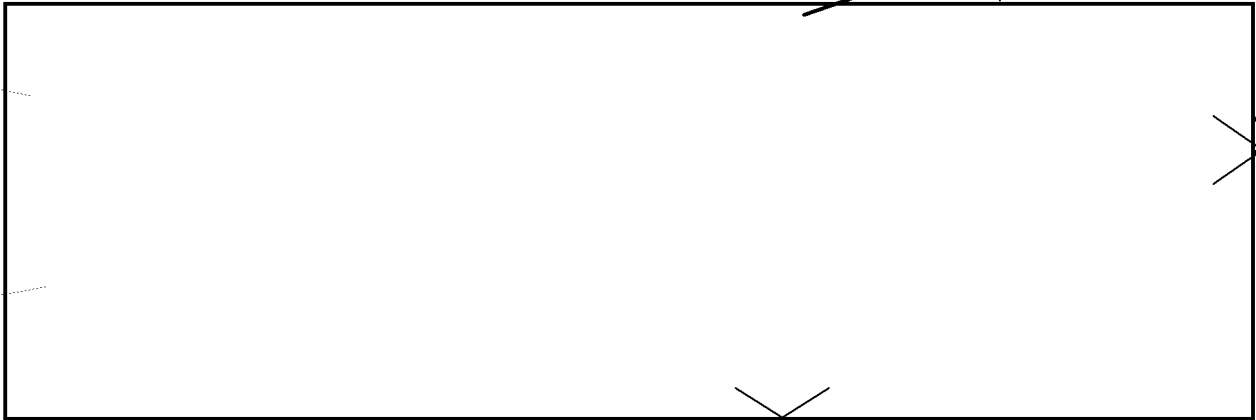

Mr. McInerney's reply of April 18, 1952, file JUM:JAC:bjn, 146-1-12-1769, stated that a review of the facts indicates there is a possible violation of 18 U.S.C. 1001. Mr. McInerney informed that the case was being referred to the U. S. Attorney at Los Angeles, California, for his opinion relative to prosecution.

As you are aware from our letter dated July 18, 1952, addressed to the Criminal Division, we have maintained contact with Assistant U. S. Attorney McEachen at Los Angeles for his opinion as to prosecution.

On August 7, 1952, Assistant U. S. Attorney McEachen advised he had reviewed this matter and declined prosecution for the following reasons:

- *(1) Insufficient available documentary evidence regarding Malina's membership in the Communist Party.
- *(2) Mr. McEachen stated that it is his belief that an omission to state membership in the Communist Party in a Personnel Security Questionnaire is not a sufficient basis to conduct a successful prosecution for perjury, or in this case, fraud against the government. He stated that in the

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situation at hand there is a lack of sufficient supporting evidence to successfully prove subject's membership in the Communist Party and pointed out that other than [redacted] there is no person available who can authoritatively testify as to Malina's membership in the Communist Party; and added that [redacted] himself could only do so in an indirect manner."

With respect to Mr. McEachen's opinion that there is insufficient documentary evidence to prove Malina's membership in the Communist Party, you will note from our letters of February 25, 1952, and July 18, 1952, and from the investigative reports previously furnished to the Criminal Division, that the Immigration and Naturalization Service

1952, at Los Angeles, California, a copy of which was furnished with our letter of February 25, 1952.

You will further note that our letter of July 18, 1952, reported that [redacted]

With respect to Mr. McEachen's opinion that there is a lack of sufficient supporting evidence to successfully prove Malina's Communist Party membership and that there is no person available to authoritatively testify as to Malina's former Communist Party membership, your attention is called

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to the signed statements by [redacted] which appear in Special Agent [redacted] report of January 25, 1952. [redacted] related in his statements that he was a Communist Party member, attended Communist Party meetings, and among others who attended the meetings was Frank J. Malina. [redacted] also related that he recalled Frank Malina as being a member of the same Communist Party unit that he, [redacted] was a member of and that some of the meetings were held at Malina's home on Cordova Street in Pasadena.

You will also note that the report of Special Agent [redacted] dated January 30, 1951, at Los Angeles, California, reports that [redacted] admitted that he was a former [redacted] Unit 122 of the Pasadena Branch of the Los Angeles County Communist Party and that he recalled that Frank Malina was a member of this unit and that Malina "dropped out" of the unit in 1939 or 1940. [redacted]

[redacted] also confirmed her former Communist Party membership and stated that she recalled Malina's being present at various meetings of Professional Unit 122 of the Los Angeles County Communist Party in 1938 and 1939.

In addition, you will also note that the report of Special Agent [redacted] dated July 13, 1950, at Los Angeles, California, reflects that [redacted] admitted his own former membership in the Communist Party and stated that in 1939, [redacted] told him that he had a new recruit (for the Communist Party) who was Frank Malina. [redacted] related that thereafter, he saw Malina at at least two meetings of the Communist Party which were held either at [redacted] quarters.

In view of the above, it is requested that this case be reconsidered by you and that this Bureau be informed of your opinion with respect to prosecution.

In accordance with our prior communication concerning this matter, it is our understanding that the Statute of Limitations will run on December 31, 1952.

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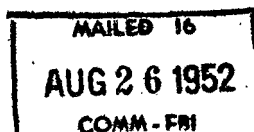

The Criminal Division advised evidence of subject's Communist Party membership would be inadmissible as hearsay evidence. Department has requested U. S. Attorney's views as to feasibility of securing an indictment in view of the expiration of the Statute of Limitations on December 31, 1952. In the opinion of the Criminal Division, the possibility of securing a conviction is doubtful because of the nature and quality of the evidence available and the prominence of the subject in the scientific world.

BACKGROUND:

FRANK JOSEPH MALINA - Summary

Subject, Frank Joseph Malina, born October 2, 1912, Brenham, Texas, received a Ph.D. Degree in aeronautics at California Institute of Technology in 1940. He was employed as Chief Engineer and Director of the U. S. Army Air Force Jet Propulsion Research Project from 1938 to 1946, and is presently Deputy Director of the National Science Division of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization. The subject and [redacted] are presently employed in their present positions in Paris, France.

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Results of Investigation:

An investigation of the subject was initiated on the basis of information received from [redacted] to the effect that the subject had held Communist meetings at his home and had passed out Communist literature.

Informants

[redacted] from a 1939 Communist Party Membership Book issued to Frank J. Malina reported that Malina was a Communist Party member of the Pasadena Section, Professional Unit, in 1939, and possessed Party Book No. 1020 under the name of Frank Parma.

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Several former Communist Party members have furnished statements to the effect that the subject attended Communist Party meetings in 1938 and 1939.

Prosecution:

The Criminal Division of the Department, in a memorandum dated February 25, 1952, was requested to furnish an opinion as to prosecution of the subject for making false statements on Personnel Security Questionnaires executed in 1944 in that he failed to admit membership in the Communist Party. A follow-up letter was sent to the Criminal Division on April 10, 1952, and a report was received on April 18, 1952, to the effect that the case was being referred to the U. S. Attorney at Los Angeles for his opinion relative to prosecution. On July 18, 1952, the Criminal Division was advised that frequent contacts with the U. S. Attorney at Los Angeles had been made but that he was unable to render an opinion as to prosecution due to an administrative project in his office. It was pointed out to the Department that several potential witnesses had died during May and June, 1952.

On August 7, 1952, the U. S. Attorney at Los Angeles declined prosecution for insufficient documentary evidence and in view of his belief that there was an insufficient basis to conduct a successful prosecution. The Criminal Division was requested to reconsider the decision of the U. S. Attorney in a communication dated September 12, 1952. In answer to the above communication, the Department advised on September 25, 1952, that a re-examination of the case had been made. The Criminal Division reported that it believed the Government would be unable to introduce into evidence documents prepared by deceased witnesses relating to subject's membership in the Communist Party under the hearsay rule. In addition, the Criminal Division stated that it was cognizant of the difficulty in prosecuting a case of this type because

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of the nature and quality of the evidence and due to the prominence of the subject in the scientific world. The Criminal Division stated, however, that it was of the opinion that adequate evidence existed upon which a true bill could be returned, and accordingly, the U. S. Attorney is being requested to furnish his opinion as to the feasibility of seeking an indictment with the evidence at hand in view of the expiration of the Statute of Limitations on December 31, 1952, and with the view that further evidence may be developed which would strengthen the Government's case.

ACTION:

There is attached a letter to the Los Angeles Office enclosing a copy of the Criminal Division's letter and instructing that it maintain contact with the U. S. Attorney at Los Angeles in order to obtain his opinion with regard to seeking an indictment.

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Reference is made to your memorandum of September 12, 1952, in which you request the Department to reconsider the record in the captioned matter and inform you of its opinion with respect to prosecution.

Upon re-examination of the subject's file, the Department is of the belief that the Government would be unable to introduce into evidence either the documents or the information contained therein which pertain to Frank Malina's membership in the Communist Party and which are now in the possession of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, in view of the prohibition against the admissibility of hearsay evidence and the recent deaths of the authors of these documents,

[redacted] The Department, therefore, agrees with Assistant United States Attorney McEachen that no documentary evidence is available pertaining to the subject's Communist Party membership. The Department was previously cognizant of the difficulty in prosecuting a case of this type because of the nature of the particular question posed and the quality of the evidence available but, due to the prominence of the subject in the scientific world, the Department was of the opinion that the United States Attorney's views concerning the feasibility of prosecuting the subject for fraud against the Government should be sought.

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On reconsideration of the evidence in the record at the present time, the Department is of the opinion that adequate evidence apparently exists upon which a true bill could be returned. The possibility of securing a conviction, however, is still doubtful in view of the acquittal received in the [redacted] case, the facts of which closely parallel those contained in the instant matter, the apparent hostility [redacted] inability to recollect Malina, and the absence of documentary proof.

The Department is furnishing a copy of the Bureau's memorandum of September 12, 1952, in order that the United States Attorney at Los Angeles may comment thereon. He is also being requested to furnish his opinion concerning the feasibility of seeking an indictment with

Assistant U. S. Attorney ANGUS D. McEACHEN, Los Angeles, California, was recontacted on 1/8/53, at which time he stated that he has no plans, proposals, or suggestions for subject's return to the United States, inasmuch as he has no plans for subsequent prosecution.

McEACHEN explained that notwithstanding his previously expressed opinion of weakness in this case and resulting difficulty of a successful prosecution, he had gone ahead and secured an indictment against MALINA because of the Department's communications to him and his awareness of a considerable interest in this matter by the Bureau. With reference to the latter comment, the Bureau's attention is called to the fact that a copy of the Bureau's letter, dated 9/12/52, addressed to Assistant Attorney General CHARLES B. MURRAY of the Department, setting forth a review of available evidence and requesting a reconsideration of this matter, was forwarded to Assistant U. S. Attorney McEACHEN by the Department and is now a part of his file.

Although no active steps will be taken by McEACHEN to secure MALINA's return to this country for prosecution, he stated that in the event MALINA voluntarily returns to the United States, the outstanding warrant would, of course, then be served on him, and the Department would then presumably proceed with prosecution or otherwise make a determination at that time.

As to the practical aspect of securing the return of a United States citizen to this country from abroad, McEACHEN advised that the matter is controlled exclusively by the International Extradition Treaty existing between the United States and the foreign country involved, and further, whether or not such treaty specifically covered the violation for which the citizen's return is sought. In this instance the existing treaty between the United States and France would necessarily have to include the violation of Fraud Against the Government or its equivalent. Whether or not it does in fact is currently unknown to him.

It has also been ascertained from the U. S. Attorney's Office that [redacted] indictment against MALINA was officially filed on [redacted] A Bench Warrant currently in possession of the U. S. Marshal's Office was issued [redacted] and bond set at \$10,000.00. Because of the impossibility of service of this warrant, MALINA is now considered a fugitive by the U. S. Attorney's Office.

In view of the above indicated attitude of Assistant U. S. Attorney McEACHEN toward prosecution in this matter, no further contact with him is contemplated by this office at this time. It is suggested that the Bureau may at a later date again desire to present this matter to the Department for its reconsideration as to active prosecution.

You will note that referenced letter dated January 12, 1953, from Los Angeles informed that following [redacted] indictment [redacted] a bench warrant was issued for the subject which is now in possession of the U.S. Marshal in Los Angeles, California, and bond was recommended at \$10,000. Inasmuch as it is known that the subject is presently located in Paris, France, he cannot be considered a Bureau fugitive. However, Los Angeles should consider placing a stop against the subject, in lieu of a fugitive form letter, with the Identification Division of the Bureau.

Washington Field Office should note that referenced letter dated January 9, 1953, from New York stated that if the subject is an employee of the United States Delegation to the United Nations, he would be "per se" a U.S. Government employee of the State Department. If this is true, Washington Field Office should also ascertain whether or not the subject is actually an employee of the State Department, where he was hired, when he was hired, who hired him, who recommended him, who pays his salary, the amount of his salary, and if he has returned to the United States on business or pleasure since his original employment in Paris, France.

Washington Field Office is also requested to ascertain if the United States has a treaty with France that is presently in existence and is valid which specifically contains extradition procedures of 18 USC 1001. If so, the provisions of this part of the treaty should be obtained.

This inquiry must be afforded expeditious and preferential attention, and the results submitted to the Bureau within five days of the receipt of this communication.

NOTE:

When above requested investigation is completed, all pertinent details will be submitted to the Criminal Division of the Department for opinion as to what steps should be taken to secure subject's return to the United States for prosecutive purposes.

[redacted] the French Government has been very lenient in permitting Americans to remain in France indefinitely without American passports. Also, the Department of State has attempted, on several occasions, to have United States citizens who are not in possession of valid passports returned to this country without "any luck". He knows of no reason why the French would consider subject's case in a different light than those of other Americans the Department of State requested returned to this country. In his opinion, MALINA may reside indefinitely in France without an American Passport as there is no way this government, without the cooperation of the French Government, can require subject to return.

[redacted] stated that MALINA can be requested to return to the United States but from a practical standpoint, such a request is of little value since the French will not cooperate in the event subject does not desire to comply with such a request. Without cooperation from the French Government, [redacted] stated he knows of no way to insure subject's return to the United States.

Since subject is a native born American citizen, his status as an American citizen cannot be jeopardized by his continued residence outside of the United States.

The subject's application for passport, dated April 11, 1949, at Paris, France, requested that his passport be validated for "France and other European countries" for the purpose of "official business". A letter dated March 11, 1949, from [redacted] Head of the Bureau of Personnel, United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, Paris, France, which accompanied subject's request for a passport, reflected that Dr. FRANK MALINA was a member of the Secretariat of UNESCO and "was still under contract". Special United States Passport #796 that had been issued on March 13, 1947, by the Department of State at Washington, D. C., was surrendered by MALINA to officials of the American Embassy in Paris when he applied for a passport on April 11, 1949.

On February 3, 1951, the American Embassy at Paris was instructed to refer to the Passport Division any request by MALINA for a renewal of his passport.

On March 16, 1951, subject applied for renewal of his Passport #8609 by completing an application for renewal of passport. This renewal application listed his legal residence as 618 South Baylor Street, Brenham, Texas; foreign address as 89 rue Erlanger, Paris 16, France, and indicated that he was still employed as a member of the Secretariat of UNESCO in Paris.

[redacted] a representative of UNESCO, by letter dated March 16, 1951, at Paris, certified that MALINA had been a member of the Secretariat since April 18, 1947, and that his contract "extends to January 15, 1953". His position as of March, 1951, was described by [redacted] as Division Head in the Department of Natural Sciences which entitled him to the privileges accorded to members of the Diplomatic Corps.

Subject's application for renewal of passport, dated March 16, 1951, was forwarded to the Department of State because of their prior instructions that a passport not be issued to the subject without the express authorization of the Department.

On May 26, 1951, the Department of State, in an air gram, advised the American Embassy at Paris that subject's renewal of

passport was to be refused. The American Embassy at Paris was instructed to hold MALINA's Passport #8609 at the Embassy.

By letter dated September 27, 1951, [REDACTED] American Consul, American Embassy, Paris, France, advised the Passport Division that the following letter dated September 21, 1951, had been received from MALINA:

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"Last April my passport expired. In May, you informed me that the renewal of my passport had not been granted and at your request I handed to you my passport.

"I have an appointment as an International Civil Servant with the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization in Paris. I have informed the authorities of UNESCO of the State Department's refusal, up to the present time, to grant me a renewal of the passport which I have held since 1946.

"UNESCO has made efforts to clarify this matter and was informed that the reasons for non-renewal of my passport up to the present time could only be given to me personally. I would, therefore, greatly appreciate a letter from you informing me of these reasons."

The Passport Division requested the American Embassy, on November 10, 1951, to inform MALINA that the Department had "again given careful consideration to his case but that it does not feel warranted in reversing its previous decision declining to renew his passport since it is considered that his further travel would be contrary to the best interests of the U.S."

Under date of 6/20/52 the [REDACTED] in response to our original inquiry on 5/6/52, that a search had failed to reveal subject's presence in the Paris area.

Subsequent inquiries furnishing subject's exact employment and place of residence have not yet been answered. Follow-ups to this inquiry have been made, and the entire inquiry was restated on 11/20/52. Upon receipt, the results will be furnished to the Bureau.

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(U) (S) [REDACTED] recently advised that the [REDACTED] into the activities and contacts of [REDACTED] described as a former State Department employee whose loyalty was declared to be beyond reasonable doubt by State's Loyalty Security Board in February 1952. The instruction reflected that [REDACTED] is presently employed by UNESCO in Paris, and that the Department had received information that [REDACTED] was associating in Paris with FRANK MALINA, cited by the HUAC in early 1950 as a Communist employed by UNESCO, and with [REDACTED] alleged Communist.

(U) (S) [REDACTED] said that his inquiries as a result of this instruction had been inconclusive, but had reflected that [REDACTED] and MALINA, being employees of the same rank at UNESCO in Paris, have been seen chatting together in the halls of UNESCO. [REDACTED] said that on a informant had been invited to a breakfast by [REDACTED] some time ago. According to this informant, [REDACTED] was at that time temporarily subleasing the home of [REDACTED] another American employed by UNESCO whose loyalty to the United States has been questioned.

[REDACTED] advised that in early November 1952, upon instructions from the Department of State, [REDACTED] of the permanent [REDACTED]

(S) U. S. Delegation to UNESCO, together with [redacted] Administrative Division, U. S. Embassy, Paris, had personally called on [redacted] of UNESCO, and presented him with the Department of State's urgent request that [redacted]

(U) [redacted] ELINK J. MALINA and [redacted] be discharged from their UNESCO positions because of the alleged Communist connections of these Americans. According to [redacted] had replied that definitive action could only be taken upon the expiration of the various work contracts of the individuals cited and had pointed out that one or two of them have clauses in their employment contracts which give them the right to renew the contract upon termination for a stated period of time.

It will be noted that, as the Bureau has already been informed, the UNESCO employment of the above-mentioned [redacted] has already been terminated, and he is scheduled to leave France on the SS Liberte on 12/2/52 for permanent return to the United States.
