etective Said Scientist Had 'Severe Psychosis'

A civilian scientist who had inwittingly participated in a Central Intelligence Agency drug experiment had been diagnosed as suffering from severe psychosis and delusions" before he plunged to his death from a 10th floor window of the Statler Hotel in mid-Manhattan 22 years ago, according to a police report of the incident.

The report said that the cause of the death was "multiple fractures". Detective Ward said in his report that "due to the important positions held by the deceased and Lashbrook with the U.S. Government, the facts of this case were related to F.B. I. 
