SAMUEL STOLITZKY was described as 63 years of age in 1962, and is a brother of MILTON STOLITZKY, an attorney by profession. MILTON STOLITZKY was born in the United States in 1893 and has been in the real-estate line since 1915.

In regard to [redacted] a stockholder of South Shore Lanes, Inc., an investigation was conducted in July of 1961 by the New York Office concerning a complaint reported to the Bureau of Labor Management Reports that eight contractors in the New York City area, including [redacted] [redacted] were not paying their full share into the Welfare Fund of the Mason Tenders Union. These contractors allegedly gave "kickbacks" to [redacted] for Local 13 of the Mason Tenders Union. During the course of this investigation, information was developed indicating connections between [redacted] and hoodlums in the New York City area, one of whom was identified as [redacted] an [redacted] attendee. During the course of this investigation, no additional allegations were developed concerning PAUL A. CARDONE, Inc., and prosecution was declined by the Assistant United States Attorney for the Eastern District of New York, as allegations made by the original complainant had not been substantiated by investigation. The correct address for PAUL A. CARDONE, Inc., is 570 Cherry Lane, New Hyde Park, Long Island, New York.

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On June 20, 1963, [redacted] Massachusetts, advised SA [redacted] ROCKY MARCIANO, is living in New York City at the Warwick Hotel and she did not know when he would return to the Boston, Massachusetts, area.

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On June 25, 1963, [redacted] Warwick Hotel, New York City, advised SA [redacted] that ROCKY MARCIANO was not staying in that hotel while in New York City but was visiting on a daily basis two men who were registered at the hotel. [redacted] identified the two guests as [redacted] and [redacted] from Buffalo, New York, and said that both men checked out of the hotel in the early morning on June 24, 1963. [redacted] stated that [redacted] of ROCKY MARCIANO, a guest at this hotel, had checked out on June 25, 1963.

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[redacted] stated that if MARCIANO returned to the hotel he would advise him to contact the FBI Office in New York City; however on June 27, 1963, advised that MARCIANO had not returned to the hotel.

On June 25, 1963, [redacted] Warwick Hotel, advised SA [redacted] that he has been a personal friend of ROCKY MARCIANO for a number of years. [redacted] mentioned that he did not know where MARCIANO was staying while in New York City but said he saw him in the Warwick Hotel on the morning of June 24, 1963, with a man named [redacted]

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[redacted] voluntarily stated that [redacted] who was staying at the Warwick Hotel up until June 24, 1963, was introduced to him by MARCIANO as a business friend from Florida. According to [redacted] MARCIANO advised him that [redacted] would make periodic business trips to New York City and would stay at the Warwick.

MARCIANO requested that [redacted] take care of [redacted] on these occasions.

ROCKY MARCIANO was interviewed and furnished the following information:

An attorney from Woonsocket, Rhode Island named [] contacted him in regard to lending his name to an enterprise in Buffalo, New York.

[] and a contractor named [] from Buffalo were adding motel units to a bowling alley and a swimming pool, a skating rink, and calling the project "Leisureland USA." It was formerly known as the South Shore Bowling Alleys and the Normandy Restaurant.

An individual named [] the restaurant and bowling lanes was negotiating with [] and [] but MARCIANO did not believe ownership had changed hands. MARCIANO said that he will have an option to buy shares when [] takes over "Leisureland USA." Also, MARCIANO will be the Physical Director of the project.

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He said that he went to Buffalo back in May and spent about five days there in connection with this project. He recalled that they were looking for a vending machine operator to put his machines in "Leisureland" but had made no definite arrangements with anyone. It is believed that they may have been asking about \$20,000 from prospective vending machine operators to put their machines in the place.

He did recall, however, meeting a [] whose last name he did not recall, at a luncheon in Buffalo but has had no out-of-town guests at fights in Boston for years.

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He said that [] has done most all of the negotiating in connection with "Leisureland" and, more or less, represents him. He suggested that [] might be contacted for further information at the Lord Amherst Motel, Buffalo, New York, where he is presently residing.

Reference is made to information previously reported that RANDACCIO loaned [redacted] night club operator, \$10,000 in the fall of 1961 and demanded repayment of \$15,000 in 30 days.

On May 29, 1963, the facts surrounding the activities of [redacted] as a possible violator of the Federal Reserve Act and the Interstate Transportation of Stolen Property Statute were discussed with Assistant United States Attorney CHARLES F. CRIMI, Buffalo, New York, by SA(A) [redacted] Mr. CRIMI advised that in view of the fact that [redacted] had been sentenced in State Court to a period of three to five years on charges stemming from the same acts as Federal charges would be based upon, he was declining prosecution as to both [redacted] and [redacted] at the Delevan State Bank, Delevan, New York. Mr. CRIMI said that since [redacted] was responsible for the loss he did not wish to proceed against [redacted]

At 11:59 AM July 8, 1963, SA [] observed [] and two other individuals who answered the descriptions of PASQUALE NATARELLI and FRED G. RANDACCIO leave Buffalo, New York, via the New York State Thruway in a 1963 four-door hardtop Chevrolet, tan and brown in color. This car, bearing New York license [] is registered to [] a known Buffalo gambler. Upon entering the New York State Thruway the car was observed traveling south and west towards Erie, Pennsylvania, and Cleveland, Ohio.

At 3:21 PM July 8, 1963, SAs [] and [] observed the 1963 Chevrolet bearing license [] on Interstate Route 90 at the intersection of Ohio Route 306. This vehicle was occupied by three white males. They were followed from this point via U.S. Route 20 to the Sahara Motel, 3201 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio. They checked into the motel at approximately 4:30 PM July 8, 1963.

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Desk Clerk [] Sahara Motel, was contacted later in an effort to determine the room occupied by the individuals from Buffalo. [] advised he had no record of RANDACCIO, []. He advised that any individuals checking in on that date would have to have had a reservation. He made available the registration cards, which were reviewed.

The occupants of the 1963 Chevrolet were described as follows:

1. The driver was a white male, early 30s, 5' 8" - 5' 9", tall, weighing 230-240 pounds, no hat, black hair, wore dark sunglasses. When observed later he was not wearing regular glasses and was wearing a sport shirt and no coat.
2. The individual occupying the front passenger seat was described as a white male, age 45, 5' 7", weighing

2. 180-185 pounds, medium complexion, dark hair - graying at temples, straw hat, and sunglasses. When this individual was observed later he was bald headed and wearing a maroon and dark plaid sport coat.
3. The third individual, occupying the rear seat, was described as white, male, late 40s, 5' 9" - 5' 10", 170 pounds, black hair, and some gray, full head of hair, wearing dark suit and sun glasses. He was further described as having no hat and a thin face and hunched shoulders.

During the evening of July 8, 1963, the occupants of this car visited the Malibu Bar, located in the vicinity of the motel. The bar is operated by [redacted] a Cleveland hoodlum and gambler.

At 11:00 PM on July 8, 1963, the three men were observed entering a 1961 light green Oldsmobile bearing Ohio license [redacted] which is listed to [redacted] [redacted], Ohio, and proceeded to the Theatrical Grill, 721 Vincent Avenue in downtown Cleveland, a well known downtown restaurant. The surveillance was discontinued at 12:30 AM.

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At about noon July 9, 1963, SA [redacted] observed the three individuals who arrived in Cleveland in the 1963 Chevrolet enter a cab in front of the Sahara Motel and proceeded downtown to the Cleveland Stadium. After the All Star Baseball Game these individuals were observed returning to the Sahara Motel in a taxi cab and were followed to Room 335.

At 8:40 PM July 9, 1963, these same three individuals, accompanied by a fourth white male described as in his 20s, 5' 6", 130 pounds, black hair and slender build,

entered a cab in front of the motel and proceeded to the corner of East Ninth and Superior Avenue, where the heavy set individual, who was previously observed as the driver of the Chevrolet, left the taxi and was observed making a telephone call in a corner drug store. After making the call he waited at the corner and at 8:50 PM a girl was observed approaching the cab and she talked with the occupants. This girl was observed entering the cab accompanied by the heavy set individual. The taxi was then observed proceeding to the Golden Bowl Italian Restaurant located at 12312 Mayfield Road in Cleveland, which they were observed entering at 9:07 PM. The surveillance was discontinued at this time.

At 8:00 AM July 10, 1963, SA [redacted] checked the Sahara Motel garage and was unable to locate the brown Chevrolet. He contacted the parking attendant and ascertained that that car left the motel with three individuals and their luggage at 4:30 AM on July 10, 1963. A check was made with the motel desk clerk and it was learned that the occupants of Room 341 had checked out sometime prior to 7:00 AM, but that Room 335 was still occupied. A check with the maid on that floor determined that Room 335 was still occupied.

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At 2:00 PM the heavy set fellow previously identified as the driver of the brown Chevrolet and the young fellow who was the fourth individual observed in the cab on the previous evening left the motel and went to Gallagher's Bar located across the street from the motel. An immediate check was made of room 335 and it was found to be empty. The maid advised that two males had left the room and that there were no other occupants in there.

[redacted] of the Sahara Motel, was contacted by SAs [redacted] and [redacted]. He stated that about two weeks previously he was contacted by a Cleveland bookmaker named CHARLES CASSARO, who wanted reservations at the motel for the All Star Baseball Game for six of his friends from Buffalo. He was told that

these six individuals would be all males and so reservations were made for Rooms 335 and 341. [] [] said that he has known CASSARO for several years and that he, CASSARO, is frequently observed at the Malibu Bar mentioned above. [] said that about 12:30 AM on July 10, 1963, he was in the lobby of the motel and observed CASSARO with three other individuals. CASSARO introduced these men to him as being from Buffalo, but [] could not recall their names. He said that arrangements were made for CASSARO to pay the bill for all six individuals. [] made a check of the statements for these two rooms and advised that no long distance telephone calls were made.

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On September 9, 1963, BU T-2 advised that DANIEL G. SANSANESE, SR. continues as a close associate of FRED G. RANDACCIO, PASQUALE NATARELLI, JOE FINO, and other Buffalo, New York, gamblers. BU T-2 stated that SANSANESE is maintaining an apartment on [redacted] who is employed [redacted]

[redacted] BU T-2 advised that several years ago FRED G. RANDACCIO, DANNY SANSANESE, JOE FINO, STEVE CANNAROZZO, and [redacted] went to New York City to see a prize fight. BU T-2 stated that while they were there they stayed at the Essex House and visited various night clubs in New York City. One of the night clubs visited was the "Latin Quarter" where they had reservations at a table next to the operator of Jimmy Foster's Supper Club in Buffalo. BU T-2 stated that [redacted] at the "Latin Quarter," was apparently acquainted with RANDACCIO and the others in the group from Buffalo as he engaged them in personal conversation while they were at the restaurant.

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BU T-2 advised the reservations for night clubs and tickets for the fights in New York City were handled by someone known to the informant as [redacted] and who is associated with a labor union in New York City.

BU T-2 stated that while RANDACCIO and his associates were in New York City they were observed by [redacted] who hangs out at TONY CANZONERI's Bar on Broadway, New York City. BU T-2 stated that [redacted] was formerly associated with the late WILLIE MORETTI and resided in Buffalo seven or eight years ago.

BU T-2 advised that a few years ago [redacted] SANSANESE, and RANDACCIO met in Miami Beach, Florida, at which time they were having a vending machine convention at the Hotel Fontainebleau. BU T-2 stated that SANSANESE and [redacted] stayed at the hotel, however RANDACCIO stayed with a friend who operated a restaurant or night club on Miami Beach.

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BU T-2 also stated that a little over a year ago New York State Police arrested SANSANESE because of his forged driver's license and the case was presented to the Erie County

Grand Jury. The day before the indictment was returned SANSANESE drove to Florida with [REDACTED] where they found an apartment in a private home in [REDACTED] Florida. BU T-2 stated that SANSANESE had in his possession at that time a State of Florida driver's license.

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HANGOUTS

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On September 17, 1963, [redacted]
[redacted] Buffalo Police Department, advised that one of his duties is the investigation of bookmakers, gamblers, and major hoodlums in the Buffalo, New York, area. He stated that during the course of his investigation he is called upon frequently to photograph hangouts being frequented by hoodlums in Buffalo. He stated that he has taken several photographs of FRED G. RANDACCIO and his associates while attending funerals, weddings, and suspected bookmaking establishments. He also stated that he has observed and photographed RANDACCIO on several occasions at the construction project in the area of Summit Avenue and Jewett Parkway, Buffalo, New York.

[redacted] stated that his office considers RANDACCIO to be a major hoodlum who exercises a great deal of influence and control over the bookmaking, policy making, and other gambling ventures in the Buffalo area.

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[redacted] stated that he has observed RANDACCIO on numerous occasions visiting the Rhode Island Lunch, also known as the Cozy Restaurant, next door to the old Madison Cab Company offices on Rhode Island Street in Buffalo. He stated that he has also observed the following associates of RANDACCIO frequenting this restaurant:

On September 17, 1963, [redacted] Central Investigation Bureau (CIB), Buffalo Police Department, advised that his assignments with the CIB are to investigate bookmaking and other gambling activities in the Buffalo area. He stated through his investigation into these activities he has become familiar with the activities of FRED G. RANDACCIO and his associates. He stated that in his opinion RANDACCIO is the Number One man in the organized criminal element on the West Side of Buffalo, New York. [redacted] stated that he has recently observed RANDACCIO, PASQUALE NATARELLI, DANNY SANSANESE, and SAM BONITO, whom he knows as "GEORGIE RAFT," frequenting a valet shop across the street from Present Jewellers on Chippewa Street near Franklin Street, Buffalo, New York. He stated that as of 3:15 PM September 17, 1963, he observed NATARELLI, [redacted] entering Vic Tanney's Health Studio on Delaware Avenue across the street from the Richford Hotel. He stated that he had obtained information that RANDACCIO and his associates are taking daily workouts at the Health Studio.

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[redacted] stated that he was not aware of any legitimate business activity on the part of RANDACCIO, NATARELLI, or SANSANESE. He explained that he has made it a policy to make frequent spot checks of the residences and hangouts of RANDACCIO, NATARELLI, and SANSANESE. Although RANDACCIO has been observed at the construction site of Jewett Arms Apartments, he has not observed RANDACCIO actually working.

On September 9, 1963, SALVATORE J. PIERI, also known as Sam Pieri, was located and interviewed in an upstairs apartment located at [redacted] New York.

PIERI was advised of the official identities as Special Agents of the FBI of [redacted] (A) and [redacted] PIERI was advised at the outset of the interview that he did not have to make a statement, that anything he might say could be used against him in court, and that he had the right to have an attorney before saying anything. PIERI was also advised that no promises or threats would be suggested to him during the course of this interview.

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PIERI was asked if he knew of the whereabouts of [redacted] to which question PIERI replied "Who is he?" PIERI was advised that [redacted] was reported to have been incarcerated at the Atlanta Penitentiary during the same time he, PIERI, was confined at this institution. PIERI responded "What makes you think I know where he is?" and "What makes you think I would tell you if I did?" It was pointed out to PIERI that as far as this office is concerned, [redacted] is not wanted as a fugitive however we were attempting to determine his present whereabouts. PIERI stated that he is no informer and that the FBI should know that he would not tell them anything. PIERI stated that he just spent 10 years of his life in the penitentiary because of "you guys" for doing nothing. PIERI was then advised that the investigations leading up to his convictions involved Federal narcotics charges and that this office was not aware of the details surrounding his arrest.

PIERI displayed a surly, belligerent and arrogant attitude during the interview and made it a point to impress upon the interviewing Agents that he had no intention of cooperating or furnishing information of public knowledge concerning his or anyone else's activities.

On May 23, 1963, Source Number 2 advised that a meeting took place in Buffalo, New York, which was attended by STEVE MAGADDINO, FRED RANDACCIO, and SALVATORE PIERI. Source Number 2 stated that the apparent purpose of this meeting was to remind PIERI of the recent decision of "Cosa Nostra" to strictly enforce a regulation prohibiting traffic in narcotics by the membership. RANDACCIO and MAGADDINO advised PIERI that a violation of this "general order" is applicable nation-wide and is punishable by death. MAGADDINO advised that failure to report knowledge of another member's traffic in narcotics is also subject to the death penalty. According to Source Number 2, MAGADDINO and RANDACCIO reminded PIERI that approximately three months ago, they had to enforce this regulation against a member of the "MAGADDINO Family" of "Cosa Nostra." Source Number 2 stated that both MAGADDINO and RANDACCIO indicated they were once involved in narcotics traffic themselves.

Source Number 2 explained that based upon the tone of voice and the language used by MAGADDINO and RANDACCIO at this meeting, there is an indication that the prohibition of narcotics traffic by members of "Cosa Nostra" was motivated by important narcotics arrests, aroused public opinion, and the increased Governmental pressure on "Cosa Nostra."

Source Number 2 stated that MAGADDINO expressed grave concern over the FBI's penetration and knowledge of the membership and organizational structure of "Cosa Nostra." MAGADDINO pointed out that they are in a bad situation, explaining that when JOSEPH PROFACI died, "Borgata" broke out, and that members of the FBI had been made "Amici Nostri."

FRED G. RANDACCIO, aka

It is noted that "Borgata," as used by MAGADDINO, means section or district in Italian; and in "Cosa Nostra" it is used interchangeably with "famiglia," which means a family within "Cosa Nostra."

With reference to the "Borgata" break-out, it is apparent that MAGADDINO is making reference to the PROFACI-GALLO war in Brooklyn, New York.

Source Number 2 stated that MAGADDINO made the remark that someone has made FBI "Amici Nostri," which reflects MAGADDINO's belief that members of the "GALLO Family" in New York have made "Cosa Nostra" members out of some individuals who are informers for the FBI or actually FBI Agents.

Source Number 2 stated that MAGADDINO pointed out to SAM PIERI that the FBI is well aware of the organization, including the "Amici," the "Capodecina," and that there is a "Commission."

Source Number 2 reported that MAGADDINO advised PIERI that he gives direction and has control over members of his family and made it clear to SAM PIERI that prior notification is to be made to him or RANDACCIO before PIERI transacts any type of business. MAGADDINO also indicated that he is to be notified of any travel and the identities of any contacts made by PIERI. In addition, MAGADDINO pointed out that visits by the members of "Cosa Nostra" from different "families" should have the approval of the "Reppresentante" (representatives) of both "families." Source Number 2 explained that MAGADDINO and RANDACCIO told PIERI that these requirements, wherein PIERI must advise them of any planned business activity, are not so they can take the business from him, but so they can determine if they have an interest in the business or can be of any help. Furthermore, MAGADDINO pointed out that they can aid PIERI by participating in a business with him or by helping avoid conflict of interests with others.

Source Number 2 explained that MAGADDINO and RANDACCIO were simply revealing their authority over PIERI and the fact that PIERI, as well as themselves, is a member of "Cosa Nostra." Source Number 2 stated that PIERI identified

FRED G. RANDACCIO, aka

a [redacted] as an "Amico Nostro" outside of the Buffalo area. Source Number 2 stated that MAGADDINO also commented that he trusts VITO GENOVESE with his life and feels sorry for him because LUCKY (LUCIANO) had double-crossed him.

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Source Number 2 stated that during the meeting of RANDACCIO, MAGADDINO, and PIERI, MAGADDINO pointed out to PIERI the trouble they were having in Youngstown, Ohio. MAGADDINO attributed the recent bombings in Youngstown as the work of some insane people who are planning to kill all the members of "Cosa Nostra." MAGADDINO pointed out that PIERI should know about this since [redacted] is living in Youngstown. PIERI informed MAGADDINO that his [redacted] was in Buffalo on the preceding Saturday and asked that he relay a message to MAGADDINO. According to Source Number 2, [redacted] was interested in learning whether or not the "MAGADDINO Family" has any connection with Sportservice Corporation. Source Number 2 stated that MAGADDINO informed PIERI that members of the "MAGADDINO Family" have got their interest in their own town and in Sportservice. He indicated that he was not going to permit anyone from the outside sticking his nose in their affairs. RANDACCIO also informed PIERI that PIERI's friends in Youngstown can do as they please as long as they do not come to Buffalo and bother anyone in this area. MAGADDINO advised PIERI that his brother, [redacted] [redacted] has his own bosses in the Youngstown area, and he should confer with these bosses before he does anything.

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Source Number 2 stated that during this meeting, MAGADDINO pointed out to PIERI that he loved peace; however, he was still good enough to fight with anyone. RANDACCIO told PIERI that whenever they have a double-crosser, they take care of him right away.

According to Source Number 2, MAGADDINO and PIERI discussed the health of VITO GENOVESE, and PIERI mentioned that GENOVESE is sick, and that he had been sent to Leavenworth Penitentiary about six months ago and has been in the hospital ever since. MAGADDINO pointed out to PIERI

that Mr. ROBERT KENNEDY, the Attorney General, had turned down [] appeal and commented that [] had the best lawyer in the country. PIERI identified the lawyer as [] b6 b7C

Source Number 2 stated that MAGADDINO also complained that he did not think it was right for the Government to spend \$50,000,000 to "crucify" JIMMY HOFFA, who has a 100 percent backing from the union.

During this meeting, RANDACCIO asked PIERI how much of a sentence [] would get. PIERI replied that [] and others involved with him had received a fifteen-year sentence. RANDACCIO mentioned that [] and FRANK CARUSO were among those picked up in Spain by the police to face narcotics charges. At this point, MAGADDINO advised that a boss, possibly in New York City, had footed the bill for either the defense or the planned flight of [] and CARUSO. PIERI responded that he knew about this matter and that "TONY BENDER" is dead. MAGADDINO indicated that because of TONY BENDER's deals in this matter, he was "not here no more." b6 b7C

On June 17, 1963, Source Number 2 reported that FRED RANDACCIO met that day with VINCENT A. SCRO, CHARLES A. MONTANA and JAMES V. LA DUCA, all sons-in-law of STEVE MAGADDINO.

According to Source Number 2, those present discussed the political situation in New York State. Both LA DUCA and RANDACCIO said the Buffalo Police Commissioner [redacted] is going to leave Buffalo for another job on July 1, 1963. LA DUCA speculated that Commissioner is going to receive an appointment to the Liquor Board in New York.

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RANDACCIO advised Source Number 2 that he did not know who would be the next Commissioner and he hoped it would not be [redacted]

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LA DUCA explained that he has learned from people who are supposed to know that as soon as Commissioner goes out, their next move is to sort of level the city off. He stated that this would mean getting the new commissioner paid off before they can start moving gambling-wise. He stated that this move is going to be controlled possibly with Senator WALTER MAHONEY's clique. LA DUCA told those present that whichever clique it is, the gambling moves will have to be controlled.

Source Number 2 advised that SCRO discounted LA DUCA's source of information and stated that he had heard this before and it had never panned out. He said it did not make any difference who becomes the police chief, since the Crime Commission can come into Buffalo at any time. Both SCRO and LA DUCA agreed that Buffalo, Syracuse, and Utica are closed tight at the present time.

Synopsis: Subject continues to maintain a residence at 562 Richmond Avenue, Buffalo, New York. BU T-2 advised subject was associated with construction business operated by [REDACTED] and ALBERT V. RANDACCIO known as Tur-ran Builders. [REDACTED] Woonsocket, Rhode Island, represents "Leisureland" as attorney for Barchris Construction Company of New York City which operates bowling alleys throughout the country. [REDACTED] recalls meeting RANDACCIO while in Buffalo, New York with ROCKY MARCIANO. [REDACTED] advised visit to Buffalo concerned installation of vending machines/at "Leisureland." [REDACTED] New Jersey, advised her husband, now in Attica Prison, borrowed funds from various sources to construct and operate a night club in [REDACTED] New York. She stated she does not know RANDACCIO, but does know individual called "FREDDIE THE WOLF." She stated never saw her husband or "FREDDIE THE WOLF" exchange any money, but that she saw them together frequently in the night club and overheard money discussed. Subject contacted at Cozy Restaurant, 12/19/63, where he was observed with PASQUALE NATARELLI, JOSEPH FINO, SAMUEL BONITO, ROY CARLISI, and several other associates.

Details:

PERSONAL HISTORY

Residence

During the months of October and November, 1963, spot surveillances disclosed that subject continues to maintain a residence at 562 Richmond Avenue, Buffalo, New York. This residence is a 2½ story home with a large porch and stone front in a neighborhood consisting of homes of similar construction. To the rear of the subject's home is a garage with an apartment on the second floor of the garage. The side entrance of subject's home leads to two small apartments on the second floor and the attic of the building.

On October 23, 1963, BU T-1 advised that he is acquainted with the activities of some of the hoodlums in the Buffalo area. He stated that FRED G. RANDACCIO, residing at 562 Richmond Avenue, employed several carpenters and laborers to build and set off the garage apartment behind his home and the two small apartments upstairs over that portion of the home where RANDACCIO lives. He stated that RANDACCIO originally tried to have one carpenter do the rough work on the apartment for nothing and that the carpenter after learning of this walked off the job and never returned.

Construction Business

On December 20, 1963, BU T-2 advised that RANDACCIO continues to list his employment or business activity as a contractor associated with "Tur-ran Builders," 160 Siegfried Drive, Amherst, New York. BU T-2 explained, however, that this business is operated primarily by [redacted] and ALBERT RANDACCIO.

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Pandoro Exterminators

As previously reported, RANDACCIO and several other members of the MAGADDINO Family were reported to have an interest in a business known as Pandoro Exterminators, Buffalo, New York.

It is noted that on September 27, 1963, BU T-3 reported that Pandoro Exterminators was being incorporated and that 20 shares of stock would be issued. Sixteen shares

of this stock would be turned over to VINCENT A. SCRO, the son-in-law of STEVE MAGADDINO, who will distribute these shares to the "unofficial" members of the corporation.

Since September 27, 1963, BU T-3 has furnished no information indicating that RANDACCIO is active in the management or operation of Pandoro Exterminators.

Leisureland, USA

As previously reported, ROCKY MARCIANO, former world's heavyweight boxing champion, visited Buffalo, New York with [redacted] in May of 1963. MARCIANO, during an interview on July 6, 1963, advised that [redacted] is expected to take over "Leisureland, USA" sometime in the future and that their visit to Buffalo in May was for the purpose of locating a vending machine operator to put vending machines in "Leisureland, USA."

[redacted] advised he is the attorney for Barchris Construction Corporation of New York City who operates bowling alleys throughout the country. Through his association with Barchris Corporation he now represents "Leisureland" at Buffalo, New York.

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He said that since he represents "Leisureland," he has checked into the operation of this organization, noticed that they have vending machines at this location and noted that "Leisureland" had not obtained any advance in funds on the installation of these vending machines. He said that it is common practice in the trade to obtain advance of funds from persons installing machines (vending) and that profits derived from these vending machines in the future can be applied to the advance in funds given by the person or organization that installs these vending machines.

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[redacted] said that this is one way in which to obtain working capital for investment purposes. He said that "Leisureland" is a large place and, for that reason, he felt that the vending machine company should at least give an advance of funds in the amount of \$20,000 to \$25,000.

On that basis he said he went to Buffalo, New York with ROCKY MARCIANO, former heavyweight boxing champion of the world, and while in Buffalo [redacted] felt that bids should be put out for the installation of vending machines at "Leisureland."

He said he did not know anyone in the Buffalo area and, for that reason, relied on the personnel at "Leisureland" to contact various individuals who could be contacted concerning vending machines as he, [redacted] desired to get the best offer available.

He recalled meeting with a man named [redacted] whose first name was unknown, and that [redacted] was not interested, and he also recalls meeting with a FRED RANDACCIO. However, he cannot recall how this contact was made as he did not know this person prior to this meeting.

[] said that he can recall that in talking to RANDACCIO he was told that RANDACCIO is no longer in the vending machine business.

[] said he had no further contact with FRED RANDACCIO but does recall that he did see RANDACCIO's son several times while in Buffalo. He said he saw this person during the day in that this person was a contractor and he showed [] a combination apartment house and motel that he was building in the Buffalo, New York area. [] did not recall the name of the street that this construction was on as he is not familiar with Buffalo, New York.

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[] did say that he was of the impression that FRED RANDACCIO's son had told him that his uncle, name not mentioned, was an official in the bricklayers union in Buffalo, New York.

[] said that Western Vending machine has the vending machines at "Leisureland" and that this company had the machines at this place prior to his attempt to negotiate for the vending machine contract. He said he feels that Western Vending has made an advance in funds, but he said that this would have to be verified through [] of "Leisureland" at Buffalo, New York.

[] said he had no additional information concerning FRED RANDACCIO or his son.

Cigarette Vending Business

As previously reported, FRED G. RANDACCIO and [redacted] operated a partnership in Buffalo, New York for approximately one year which was known as the Delaware Vending Company. This company placed cigarette vending machines at various taverns, restaurants and other business locations in the Buffalo area which they purchased from National Vendors and Sheldon Sales. Shortly after Delaware Vending began operating, [redacted] came to Buffalo, New York from Miami, Florida to negotiate the purchase of Delaware Vending for Continental Vending Company of Westbury, Long Island, New York. The details concerning the purchase, the background of [redacted] and the Continental Vending Company were previously reported in connection with this investigation. b6 b7C

During the month of November, 1963, [redacted] has been observed on several occasions in the company of [redacted] and the subject. Telephonic inquiry to the Empire Smokes Corporation, 2400 Walden Avenue, Buffalo, New York on December 5, 1963 disclosed that [redacted] who was also known as [redacted] of the Empire Smokes Corporation and that [redacted] is no longer associated with this company.

GAMBLING ACTIVITIES

As previously reported, RANDACCIO has been described as a member of "The Arm," which is made up of a group of bookmakers and gamblers associated with RANDACCIO. Three of these individuals have been identified previously as SAMUEL BONITO, JOSEPH FINO and PASQUALE NATARELLI. On several occasions during the first of October, 1963, RANDACCIO was observed with BONITO, FINO and NATARELLI frequenting Corky's Valetaria, 80 West Chippewa Street, Buffalo, New York.

On October 14, 1963, records of the Erie County Clerk's Office at Buffalo were reviewed by SAA [redacted] [redacted] These records show that a business name certificate dated May 23, 1963 was filed under the name of "Corky's Valetaria" by [redacted] [redacted] New York. b6 b7C

On October 14, 1963, [redacted] Central Investigation Bureau, Buffalo Police Department, advised that he has also observed the above individuals hanging out on Chippewa Street between Delaware and Franklin Streets. He stated that he was continuing to make spot b6 b7C b7D

surveillances of this area because he had reasons to believe that SAMUEL BONITO, DANNY SANSANESE and JOSEPH FINO were using an address in the neighborhood as a pickup spot for their bookmaking activities.

Shortly thereafter, SAM BONITO and [redacted] were arrested by members of the Central Investigation Bureau of the Buffalo Police Department on bookmaking charges.

[redacted] advised that a surveillance by members of his unit disclosed that BONITO while driving a car registered to [redacted] was picking up horse bets from various locations in Buffalo and that DANNY SANSANESE had been accompanying him on his daily runs. [redacted] further stated that shortly after the arrest of [redacted] members of the Internal Revenue Service had seized the car since it was used for gambling purposes.

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On September 25, 1963, BU T-4 advised that "The Arm" was now meeting at a cafe located next to the Madison Cab Company garage on Rhode Island Avenue in Buffalo. BU T-4 stated that "The Arm" no longer congregates at Dewey's Diner on Chippewa Street.

BU T-4 stated further that several members of "The Arm" have purchased the Lester Cleaner (phonetic) at Grant and Ferry Streets, Buffalo. It is noted that [redacted] a member of "The Arm," has purchased and is now operating a [redacted]

BU T-4 described "The Arm" as a group of bookmakers, gamblers and racketeers closely associated with or actually members of the MAGADDINO Family. BU T-4 further stated that there is a big gambling game being operated in a garage behind the residence of [redacted] Buffalo, New York, and that hoodlums handle thousands of dollars during these games. BU T-4 stated that FRED G. RANDACCIO and PASQUALE NATARELLI send out men to collect on loans made to bookmakers and if a loan payment cannot be made the interest on the loan is paid the collector. BU T-4 stated that whenever a bookmaker goes broke he borrows money from "The Arm" at a rate of "\$6.00 for \$5.00."

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On December 8, 1963, SA ELMER F. MOULIN, JR. and SAA [redacted] entered the Rhode Island Lunch, 530 Rhode Island Street, Buffalo, New York, located next door to the Madison Taxi Company garage in Buffalo. It is noted that this restaurant was formerly known as the Cozy Restaurant and is located within walking distance of the home of subject. Upon entering the restaurant the following individuals were observed sitting at tables in the area adjoining the lunch counter section of the restaurant dressed in overcoats, storm coats and hats, as though they were just leaving or had just arrived at the restaurant.

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It was noted that the tables occupied by the above individuals did not bear any food or drinks and a pinochle deck of cards was being dealt at each table. Those present at the tables immediately recognized SA MOULIN and SAA [redacted] and NATARELLI asked, "Well, who are you looking for today?" NATARELLI stated that he had noted recent publicity concerning some sort of dispute between the Los Angeles Police Department and the FBI. At this point, RANDACCIO was asked to accompany SAA [redacted] to the foyer of the restaurant. RANDACCIO was asked if he knew the whereabouts of ANGELO POLIZZI of Los Angeles, California. RANDACCIO was advised that it was not expected that he would volunteer any information to a law enforcement agency, however, the FBI had received information that there is a possibility POLIZZI is in the Buffalo area.

RANDACCIO replied that because of his position he did not feel that he should answer any questions, however, the Agents of the FBI could rest assured that "There ain't nobody from California visiting my boys." RANDACCIO was advised that ANGELO POLIZZI had served a prison sentence as a result of an armed robbery with DANNY SANSANESE approximately 30 years ago and it was possible that SANSANESE may know something of POLIZZI's whereabouts. RANDACCIO stated

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"I don't know no Polizzi. Honest to God. I ain't seen nobody from out of town in Buffalo." At this point of the interview the recent publicity concerning RANDACCIO as testified to by [redacted] of the Buffalo Police Department before the Permanent Investigations Subcommittee in Washington, D. C. was mentioned to RANDACCIO by SAA [redacted] RANDACCIO stated that [redacted] was a lawyer who was trying to "make himself look big," however [redacted] did not know anything about him or his friends. He stated that if he knew as much as the FBI did about him he, [redacted] would have to talk much longer on the radio. He stated that he did not feel the testimony was justified and it was not based upon facts, however, he was getting used to this sort of persecution and it no longer bothered him.

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It is noted that during the course of another investigation ANGELO POLIZZI was interviewed by officers of the Los Angeles Police Department and is considered a suspect in the murder of JAMES DELMONT, who was formerly employed by the Madison Taxi Company.

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SHYLOCKING ACTIVITIES

As previously reported, RANDACCIO loaned [redacted] [redacted] a former night club operator, \$10,000 in the fall of 1961 and demanded repayment of \$15,000 in 30 days. [redacted] is now incarcerated in the Attica Prison, Attica, New York, where he is serving a sentence of 3 - 5 years on charges involving check kiting activities at the Delevan State Bank, Delevan, New York, and the Marine Trust Company of Western New York.

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ASSOCIATES

On October 8, 1963, BU T-3 advised that at 7:00 p.m., October 6, 1963, a stag party honoring [redacted] of RANDACCIO, was held at Augustine's, 295 Washington Street, Buffalo, New York.

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As previously reported, [redacted] and [redacted] CHARLES A. MONTANA, were married in Niagara Falls, New York on October 19, 1963.

In regard to the stag party held at Augustine's on October 6, 1963, BU T-3 stated that the tables at Augustine's were arranged in such a manner that the table of prominence at the party was occupied by STEVE MAGADDINO and his party. The occupants of the tables closer to STEVE MAGADDINO were made up of those considered closer to STEVE MAGADDINO and each table was presided over by one of MAGADDINO's closest associates or a member of his blood family. There were six people seated at tables in the main dining room and the following individuals were seated at STEVE MAGADDINO's table:

to BU T-3, whom he believed were friends of the groom. BU T-3
stated that the table of JAMES V. LA DUCA was occupied by five
individuals whom he had never seen before.

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According to BU T-3, the stag party was well
attended and everyone present was well behaved. The food
was excellent and the drinks were plentiful. BU T-3 stated
that there were no speeches during the stag party and the
purpose of the party was to raise money for [redacted]
BU T-3 stated that 500 tickets had been sold for this stag
party at \$5.00 each and that approximately 260 people were
in attendance at this party.

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BU T-3 stated that at approximately 10:15 p.m.
STEVE MAGADDINO stood up at his table at which time all
those in attendance ceased their activities and preparations
began for MAGADDINO's departure. Two groups of men left the
stag party, one group going north and the other south and
each group examined the block prior to MAGADDINO's departure.
Shortly thereafter two more groups of men left and took
positions on both sides of the door and at the curbing which
separated the street traffic from the door of the restaurant.
At this point NATARELLI and LA DUCA left the cafe and walked
west to a nearby parking lot. SAM RANGATORE, who was acting
as a chauffeur for MAGADDINO, and another young man of

Italian descent left the cafe and proceeded to the parking lot. RANGATORE ordered the younger man to start the car and bring it to the edge of the parking lot. According to the informant this procedure was followed by RANGATORE in the event the automobile should contain a bomb inasmuch as the younger man was more expendable than RANGATORE or MAGADDINO. According to BU T-3, MAGADDINO then came out of the door of the restaurant supported by FRED RANDACCIO, who was holding MAGADDINO's left arm and VINCENT SCRO who was holding MAGADDINO's right arm.

On November 5, 1963, BU T-5 advised that during the wedding and wedding reception of [redacted] and [redacted] in Niagara Falls, New York on October 19, 1963 approximately 1,000 people were observed as guests. BU T-5 stated that after the wedding a reception was held at the Como Restaurant in Niagara Falls, New York. In addition to the wedding reception, STEVE MAGADDINO and his wife celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. BU T-5 stated that FRED G. RANDACCIO, PASQUALE NATARELLI, JOHN V. CAMMILLIERI and DANNY SANSANESE were observed attending the wedding or reception in Niagara Falls.

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During the course of another investigation the names of guests attending the aforementioned wedding and wedding anniversary party in Niagara Falls, New York were obtained through checks of automobile licenses observed in the area. The identities of the guests are being maintained in the files of the Buffalo Office.

LA COSA NOSTRA

In October, 1963, [redacted] inmate of the Federal Penitentiary at Atlanta, Georgia, appeared before the Permanent Investigations Subcommittee in Washington, D. C. [redacted] furnished information to this Subcommittee concerning the organization and activities of members of La Cosa Nostra. [redacted] testified in part that there are between 100 and 125 members of La Cosa Nostra in the Buffalo area. During the televised hearings of the Subcommittee, [redacted] was furnished photographs of several Buffalo hoodlums and was asked if he could identify these pictures. After observing the photographs [redacted] testified in substance that STEVE MAGADDINO is known to him as Head of the "Buffalo Family" of La Cosa Nostra. He also identified JOHN C. MONTANA, a Buffalo businessman, as a former lieutenant under STEVE MAGADDINO. [redacted] stated that

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he knew FREDRICO (FRED LUPO) RANDACCIO as a lieutenant under MAGADDINO. [] also testified that he knew SALVATORE "SAM" PIERI of Buffalo, New York, who was serving time in the Federal Penitentiary at Atlanta, Georgia with him. According to [] PIERI was a former underboss of STEVE MAGADDINO.

On October 1, 1963, []
[] Buffalo Police Department, furnished SA [] with a chart which he planned to present during his testimony before the Senate Permanent Investigations Subcommittee in Washington, D. C. This chart prepared under the direction of [] shows the breakdown of members of the MAGADDINO Family in Buffalo and Niagara Falls, New York, together with the relative importance and authority of the various members. According to the chart, the chain of command begins with STEFANO (STEVE) MAGADDINO and runs through FREDRICO RANDACCIO down through the lowest members of the organization as depicted on the bottom of the chart. This chart describes JAMES V. LA DUCA, ANTONIO MAGADDINO, JOHN C. MONTANA and SALVATORE PIERI as individuals who act as counselors to STEVE MAGADDINO. In describing the positions on the chart [] stated that ANTONIO MAGADDINO and JOHN C. MONTANA are "elder statesmen," who are used mostly in an advisory capacity. The name [] was included on this chart since [] exercises some degree of authority when he visits Buffalo.!

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On October 16, 1963, [] furnished the Senate Permanent Investigations Subcommittee thumbnail sketches of 21 leading members of the Buffalo underworld. These sketches, together with the charts prepared by the Buffalo Police Department, appeared in the "Buffalo Evening News," a local newspaper datelined October 16, 1963 at Buffalo, New York. In his testimony before the Senate Permanent Investigations Subcommittee on October 16, 1963, [] described STEFANO MAGADDINO as the irrefutable lord paramount and titler head of syndicated organized crime in the Buffalo-Niagara Falls and Toronto areas. []

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[] stated that STEFANO MAGADDINO is also known as the "Boss," "The Old Man," and "Don Stefano," who resides at 5118 Dana Drive with his wife in an exclusive residential area of Lewiston, New York. He further stated that MAGADDINO

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is known to be the "DON" and in absolute control of all illegal operations in the area as pertains to organized criminal activities. No crime by members of the organization is permitted without his permission and guidance.

[redacted] further stated that the close association of members of the STEFANO MAGADDINO Dynasty of criminal activity in the Western New York area has been more closely cemented by intermarriages among the families. He stated that MAGADDINO's present Chief Lieutenant in charge of Buffalo syndicate operations is FREDRICO RANDACCIO, who indisputably controls all gambling, labor racketeering and other illegitimate activities for the "Old Man." According to [redacted] the following individuals are the leading members of the Buffalo, New York underworld headed by STEFANO MAGADDINO:

BU T-1 is an individual who because of his association with FRED G. RANDACCIO and his associates is in a position to furnish information concerning certain aspects of their activities.

FRED G. RANDACCIO resides at 562 Richmond Avenue,
Buffalo, New York.

On November 13, 1963, Source Number 1 furnished information that FRED G. RANDACCIO had met that day in Buffalo with STEVE MAGADDINO and PASQUALE NATARELLI. According to Source Number 1, NATARELLI was concerned over the fact that a woman in Canada was attempting to have returned \$10,000 which she had borrowed from a friend and used to make bail for her husband. Source Number 1 speculated that NATARELLI was referring to bail money raised by the wife of ALBERT AGUECI, a Canadian narcotics smuggler, who was murdered around Thanksgiving of 1961 after fleeing New York City and coming to Buffalo, New York.

According to Source Number 1, [redacted] had hired [redacted] (phonetic) (possibly [redacted]), a Toronto, Canada attorney, who NATARELLI stated is very close to the PAUL VOLPE Family in Toronto.

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From information furnished by Source Number 1, NATARELLI told MAGADDINO that AGUECI's wife is entitled to have her bail money returned, however, she has been unable to contact her attorney over the past three months. NATARELLI explained to MAGADDINO that problems surrounding certain properties which had been used to raise bail for AGUECI was driving [redacted] crazy. NATARELLI stated that he learned that [redacted] had gone to see [redacted] about the matter and warned that unless her lawyer comes to see her, she is going to the police and inform them that [redacted] is responsible for what happened to her [redacted]. NATARELLI stated that [redacted] has threatened to tell everything she knows about ALBERT AGUECI's activities unless she receives some assurance that her bail money will be returned. Apparently in order to avoid trouble, [redacted] was instructed to get in touch with

[redacted] and if [redacted] " could not locate [redacted] he was told to contact [redacted] in Chicago who would know [redacted] whereabouts. [redacted] was to be told to get in touch with the lawyer. [redacted] in Toronto and have this lawyer contact [redacted] According to NATARELLI, certain people in Canada felt that the lawyer took the \$10,000 bail money and indicated that this is the reason he has been avoiding [redacted]

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According to Source Number 1, NATARELLI told his contacts in Canada that if they could not locate [redacted] they were to call him on the night of November 12, 1963. Source Number 1 stated that he learned from NATARELLI that his contacts did get in touch with [redacted] and that [redacted] was then taking care of things. NATARELLI pointed out to MAGADDINO, however, that [redacted] is not going to return the bail money to [redacted] NATARELLI stated that the situation is critical because of [redacted] threat to go to the police. He stated, however, that [redacted] could not say anymore than the police already know about the matter.

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Information previously furnished the Buffalo Office by the [redacted] concerning the activities of the VOLPE Family in Toronto indicates that [redacted] a Hamilton, Ontario attorney, represented ALBERT AGUECI prior to the time he was murdered. Information was also received that the person referred to as [redacted] may be identical with [redacted] an associate of the VOLPE Family, who frequently loans money to bookmakers who go broke in Toronto. He is also known to provide bail money for hoodlums in Toronto.

On October 9, 1963, Source Number 1 furnished information that STEVE MAGADDINO instructed FRED RANDACCIO to personally contact a man known as [REDACTED] (phonetic) and tell him to see MAGADDINO that evening.

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According to Source Number 1, MAGADDINO wanted [REDACTED] to contact the brother of [REDACTED] also known as [REDACTED] Russo, Federal Bureau of Investigation Number [REDACTED] who is Head of the East Side mob in Rochester, New York. RUSSO's brother is to advise JAKE RUSSO that he is not to say a word to anyone and that if he does not stand up well during the questioning, both he and his brother will be killed by MAGADDINO. Source Number 1 stated that MAGADDINO strongly and emphatically advised RANDACCIO to tell [REDACTED] that he is not to personally contact or speak to JAKE RUSSO, but he should speak only to JAKE RUSSO's brother. According to Source Number 1, MAGADDINO appears very concerned over the possibility that JAKE RUSSO is becoming an informant. He expressly mentioned that he does not trust JAKE RUSSO because of a previous incident and directed that JAKE RUSSO be advised that he should absolutely deny ever having known an unidentified man who is now deceased.

Upon his return to Niagara Falls, New York, STEVE MAGADDINO met with FRED RANDACCIO, PASQUALE NATARELLI, VINCENT A. SCRO and a man whom the informant tentatively identified as NINO MAGADDINO to explain the matters handled by the "Commission" at a meeting in or near New York City. MAGADDINO informed those present that one of the matters discussed at the meeting was the GALLO-PROFACI feud in New York City in which he, MAGADDINO, was acting as a peace maker. According to Source Number 1, MAGADDINO denounced JOSEPH MAGLIOCCO, pointing out to MAGLIOCCO that the "Commission" had never recognized him as a "Boss." MAGADDINO informed RANDACCIO and those present that in order to settle the GALLO-PROFACI feud in New York City those involved in this fight were ordered to meet in one place together with or without the GALLOs. At the meeting they should select a person they want to have as their "reppresentante." MAGADDINO informed RANDACCIO and those present that while at the meeting in New York he had trouble locating JOSEPH BONANNO whose presence was desired in connection with settling the GALLO-PROFACI feud. MAGADDINO also criticized JOSEPH BONANNO's appointment of his son as "reppresentante" of a "Borgata" in Los Angeles.

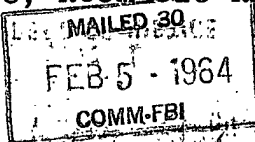

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


It should be noted that information has been reported in the past concerning RANDACCIO's association with an international narcotics smuggling ring. Specific contacts among RANDACCIO, MAGADDINO, ALBERT AGUECI, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] in connection with this narcotics smuggling operation had been reported in the past. Information has been received from highly confidential sources within the past few weeks that members of the MAGADDINO Family have expressed some concern over the possibility that the wife of ALBERT AGUECI may talk to the police. PASQUALE NATARELLI, a member of the MAGADDINO Family, has reported to MAGADDINO that ALBERT AGUECI's wife has been trying to recover the bail money she raised for her husband's release in New York City, without success. He indicated that [REDACTED] has threatened to go to the police with information which would involve all of them.

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On 2/19 and 20/64, [REDACTED] furnished information relating to a conversation among members of the MAGADDINO Family which indicated that some woman in Canada must be taken care of. It is the opinion of [REDACTED] that JOHN V. CAMMILLERI or DANIEL SANSANESE, SR. may go to Toronto, Ontario, Canada, with the individual who is selected to kill [REDACTED]. This information has been furnished to appropriate agencies in Canada, and surveillances have been set up in Toronto by members of the [REDACTED].

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It should be noted that the case captioned "UNSUBS; Murder of ALBERT AGUECI, AR" is a pending case of the Buffalo Office; wherein, leads have been set out and investigations are being conducted with the view in mind of identifying the subjects in this murder.

As previously reported, ROCKY MARCIANO and [redacted] visited Buffalo in May of 1963 and indicated they planned to take over "Leisureland, USA." [redacted] stated that his visit to Buffalo in May of 1963 was for the purpose of locating a vending machine operator to put vending machines in "Leisureland, USA."

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It was also reported that on October 2, 1963, [redacted] during an interview at Woonsocket, Rhode Island, stated in part that he had met with a man named [redacted] whose first name he could not recall, and with a FRED RANDACCIO, who was formerly in the vending machine business. [redacted] also mentioned having spent some time with [redacted] while in Buffalo.

During the course of another investigation, the New York Office determined that [redacted] while representing "Leisureland, USA," had submitted a plan of arrangement whereby "Leisureland, USA" would take over the operation of Bar Chris Construction Company.

Bar Chris Construction Company, 150-50 Fourteenth Road, Whitestone, Queens, New York, a builder and operator of bowling alleys, filed a voluntary petition of bankruptcy in United States District Court, Southern District of New York on October 29, 1962. Assets of \$19,184,919.78 and liabilities of \$17,948,109.58 were listed. [redacted] of the corporation, testified in bankruptcy proceedings on December 1, 1963 concerning his purchasing a bowling alley construction business at North Attleboro, Massachusetts for \$322,000.00 in May or June of 1962. He also testified concerning his, [redacted] personal interest

in Whitestone Lanes, Whitestone, Long Island, New York. He stated that approximately two weeks before [redacted] went into Chapter 11 proceedings under the Bankruptcy Act, [redacted] needed \$40,000.00 to handle attorneys' fees and other expenses in connection with the filing of the Chapter 11 petition. [redacted] in testifying, insisted on security for the loan and that the Board of Directors turned over to him the Whitestone property built at a cost of \$250,000.00 to secure the \$40,000.00 loan with the provision he would return the property to [redacted] any-time within one year. During the questioning by the attorney for the trustee in bankruptcy, [redacted] identified [redacted] of the law firm of [redacted] Watt and Pichochelli of Woonsocket, Rhode Island as representing a group incorporated as "Leisureland, USA, Inc.," Buffalo, New York. He stated that "Leisureland, USA" had submitted a plan of arrangement to the Bankruptcy Court which was not accepted by the Bankruptcy Court. [redacted] testified he first met [redacted] in Woonsocket, Rhode Island, approximately two years ago at which time [redacted] purchased three acres of land in Woonsocket from [redacted] and ROCKY MARCIANO, former heavyweight boxing champion. He stated that after the completion of the bowling alley on the property purchased from [redacted], [redacted] operated Woonsocket Lanes, Inc. as a wholly owned subsidiary until September 18, 1962 when the property was foreclosed by I.K., Inc., for \$1,000.00, subject to all liabilities of the plant. [redacted] stated that [redacted] had an interest in I.K., Inc. He also testified that he surveyed the operation of "Leisureland, USA," which was represented by [redacted] in view of "Leisureland's" interest in making an offer for [redacted]

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The Bankruptcy Court files in the Southern District of New York disclosed that Bar Chris Bowling Supplies, Inc., while operating a retail store selling bowling and billiard supplies at 123 Main Street, Hempstead, Long Island, filed a voluntary petition in bankruptcy under Chapter 11 of the National Bankruptcy Act in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York on December 5, 1962 and was assigned Docket Number 62B866. The petition was filed by

[redacted] Bar Chris Bowling Supplies, Inc. The petitioner informed that Bar Chris Supplies, Inc. is a subsidiary of Bar Chris Construction, which filed a voluntary petition in bankruptcy on October 29, 1962.

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On February 26, 1964, the records of the Erie County Clerk's Office, Buffalo, New York, relating to mortgages and deeds were examined by SAA [redacted]

Mortgage Liber 6372, Page 565, sets forth the description of a mortgage made October 31, 1963 by "Leisureland, USA, Inc.," with offices and principal place of business at 805 North Forest Road, Amherst, New York, identified as the mortgagor, and the Western Savings Bank (WSB) of Buffalo, 438 Main Street, Buffalo, identified as the mortgagee.

"Leisureland, USA" acknowledges indebtedness to the mortgagee bank in the sum of \$1,066,500.00, with the interest thereon to be computed from the date of mortgage at a rate of 6 per centum. The principal sum of the mortgage is in the amount of \$1,066,500.00 and becomes due on the first day of March, 1965. Four parcels of land situated in the vicinity of the New York State Thruway and Camp Road in the Town of Hamburg, New York, were described in this mortgage as security. The mortgage was signed by [redacted] of "Leisureland, USA, Inc."

It is noted that the records of the Erie County Clerk's Office also contain a mortgage made January 10, 1964, wherein "Leisureland, USA, Inc." (name of South Shore Lanes, Inc., was crossed out) gave a mortgage to Hoffman Roofing and Sheet Metal, Inc., 224 Watson Street, Buffalo, for \$8,056.25. This mortgage loan called for interest computed at 10 per cent per annum and payable monthly, beginning on February 1, 1964, and a principal payment of \$510.00 to be made semi-annually commencing July 1, 1964, and thereafter on the first day of each succeeding six-month period. On October 2, 1968, the balance of the principal will become immediately due and payable. This mortgagee loan was signed by [redacted] of "Leisureland, USA."

During the investigation relating to the bankruptcy matter involving Bar Chris Construction Corporation, the following interviews were conducted at Buffalo, New York, wherein information relating to the financial position of "Leisureland, USA" was developed.

[redacted] Western Savings Bank (WSB), Buffalo, New York, advised SA [redacted] that he has known [redacted] for many years. He stated that [redacted] is an official of Hewitt Robins, Inc., 240 Kensington Avenue, Buffalo. He stated that he has always found [redacted] to be a hard-working and reliable person.

[redacted] stated that [redacted] and [redacted] are officers of "Leisureland, USA, Inc.," and further stated that [redacted] and [redacted] have on occasion alternated as President of "Leisureland, USA, Inc."

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[redacted] stated that [redacted] of Santoro Construction, Inc., Buffalo, was the original contractor who started construction of "Leisureland, USA," at which time it was known as South Shore Lanes. [redacted] explained that [redacted] sold his interest in this recreational center to [redacted] who operated Cardone Construction Company, 570 Cherry Lane, Floral Park, New York, with an office at 68 Buell Street, Floral Park.

In regards to the bankruptcy of the Bar Chris Construction Corporation, [redacted] explained that [redacted] of the law firm of [redacted] and [redacted] Rhode Island, came to him as a representative of "Leisureland, USA, Inc.," at which time [redacted] presented a plan to the WSB of Buffalo whereby "Leisureland, USA, Inc." would absorb Bar Chris Construction Corporation. "Leisureland, USA, Inc." would then be able to claim business losses incurred by Bar Chris Construction Corporation on the income tax returns of "Leisureland, USA, Inc."

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[redacted] stated that WSB had advised against this arrangement since their investigation showed that Bar Chris Construction Corporation is a corporation that constructs bowling alleys. He further explained that the construction of bowling alleys in this country was great and that there are too many bowling alleys and that construction companies engaged in this business such as Bar Chris Construction Corporation have been losing money.

According to [REDACTED] "Leisureland, USA" never completed the above planned arrangements and the Bar Chris Construction Corporation went into bankruptcy.

"Leisureland, USA" at the time they submitted the mortgage
loan application. [redacted] pointed out that on the date
of maturity, March 1, 1965, the mortgage is to be assigned
to Central States, Southeast and Southwest Areas Pension
Fund, which maintains offices at 29 East Madison Street,
Chicago, Illinois.

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[redacted] further stated that "Leisureland, USA,
Inc." has monthly mortgage payments of \$4,700.00. He stated,
however, that "Leisureland, USA, Inc." has not made a mortgage
payment for December 1963 or January or February 1964. He
stated that the December 1963 check was returned twice to
"Leisureland, USA" because of non-sufficient funds and the
entry recording this payment was reversed on the bank's
ledgers.

[redacted] explained that one of the payments made
to creditors by the bank was made by their check number M54335,
dated October 31, 1963, to the order of [redacted] as

[redacted] Associate Attorney for the law firm of Diebold and Millonzi, advised that he is also an attorney for the Western Savings Bank (WSB) of Buffalo, New York.

[redacted] stated that on August 5, 1963, [redacted] President of "Leisureland, USA," submitted a mortgage loan application to the WSB for a property development loan of \$1,066,500.00. [redacted] explained that [redacted] Vice President of WSB, had personally handled this mortgage loan for the bank and is familiar with the initial discussions concerning this matter.

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[redacted] stated that prior to the bank's agreeing to loan "Leisureland, USA" \$1,066,500.00, arrangements were made whereby Central States, Southeast and Southwest Areas Pension Fund (hereafter referred to as Central States) would buy this mortgage in 1965. He stated that the mortgage loan matures on March 1, 1965, when it becomes due. He stated that after the loan was approved, WSB disbursed \$940,000.00 to creditors of "Leisureland, USA." He stated that [redacted] an attorney with offices at 266 Pearl Street, Buffalo, submitted a list of creditors against "Leisureland, USA" at the time the mortgage was granted.

In regards to the agreement whereby the mortgage loan will be sold to Central States, [redacted] stated that this organization had employed the Real Estate Research Corporation, 73 Monroe Street, Chicago 3, Illinois, to make an appraisal and inspect the plans and specifications of "Leisureland, USA." He further stated that [redacted] an attorney with offices at 1001 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., Washington, D. C., represented Central States during these negotiations.

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He stated that he, [redacted], had opposed granting this mortgage loan because of the requirements and restrictions set forth by Central States. He stated that [redacted] an attorney for the law firm of Jaeckle, Fleischman, Kelly, Swart, and Augspurger, Liberty Bank Building, Buffalo, represents the pension fund group in Buffalo.

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[redacted] made available a photostatic copy of a letter agreement dated July 8, 1963, and amended July 17, 1963, addressed to "Leisureland, USA," care of [redacted] Esq., 1001 Connecticut, N.W., Washington 6, D. C. This letter, with the attached amendment, was signed by [redacted] [redacted] for Central States, Southeast and Southwest Pension Funds. Pencilled notations appearing on this letter show the name [redacted] [redacted] and a telephone number [redacted] address [redacted]

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[redacted] stated he had no information to indicate that "Leisureland, USA" is on the verge of bankruptcy; however, he has just been informed that they may be in financial trouble. He further stated that although [redacted] of WSB, Buffalo, is Chairman of the Board of Directors of Consolidated Bowling Corporation, the latter corporation does not have any interest in "Leisureland, USA."

It is noted that the name of RANDACCIO and the names of his associates did not appear as lienors or mortgagees of the property held by "Leisureland, USA" and South Shore Lanes, Inc.

On March 16, 1964, a fire destroyed the bowling alleys of "Leisureland, USA" in the Town of Hamburg, New York.

On March 17, 1964, [redacted] New York State Police, advised that on Monday, March 16, 1964, a fire had started on the west side of the bowling alleys of "Leisureland, USA" and completely destroyed the building housing the alleys. It was estimated that the damage was about one and one-quarter million dollars and that the New York State Police and the Town of Hamburg Police Department were conducting an arson investigation of the matter. He stated that several witnesses to the fire stated that the fire had broken out shortly after midnight Monday morning, March 16, 1964, and the first alarm was sounded at 12:20 a.m. The fire was brought under control about three hours later. He stated that "Leisureland, USA" is owned by two sets of brothers, [redacted]

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[redacted] New York, [redacted] New York, [redacted] and [redacted] New York.

On March 20, 1964, Chief of Police ROBERT G. WILLIAMS, Town of Hamburg, New York, filed charges against [redacted] and three "Leisureland, USA"

[redacted] for permitting two emergency exit doors to be chain-locked at the time of the fire in violation of the town's building code. [redacted] and [redacted] were scheduled to appear before Justice of the Peace [redacted] and the case against [redacted] was adjourned until March 30, 1964.

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[redacted] New York State Police, advised that he had no information indicating that RANDACCIO or any members of the MAGADDINO Family have a direct interest in "Leisureland, USA."

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SHYLOCKING ACTIVITIES

On January 30, 1964, BU T-4 furnished information concerning his own gambling activities and advised that at this time he is not indebted to "The Arm" or the "6 for 5" boys. BU T-4 explained that over the past years he has borrowed and paid money to the following individuals whom he described as "6 for 5" boys and all of whom work for FRED G. RANDACCIO.

1. NICK FINO
2. JOSEPH FINO

5. SALVATORE "SAM" RIZZO
6. PASQUALE "TITTERS" NATARELLI

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BU T-4 stated that the FINO Brothers, [redacted] and NATARELLI are considered "Chiefs" in the shylocking activities and that they can be located every night at Dewey's Diner on Chippewa Street near Elmwood Avenue. He stated that during the day these men hang out at a restaurant on Rhode Island Avenue near the old Madison Cab Company garage. According to BU T-4, RIZZO hangs out at the Aragon Restaurant and the Jamestown Grill on Allen Street and [redacted]

[redacted] hangs out at a small restaurant on the corner of Georgia and Niagara Streets, Buffalo, and at the Atlantic Service Station across the street.

BU T-4 explained that when he needs a sizable loan he contacts one of the individuals listed above and lets it be known the amount of money he desires. This individual will usually ask him to come back the next night and at that time he will be advised whether or not he can borrow the money. BU T-4 stated it is his opinion that every loan must be approved by NATARELLI or RANDACCIO and that no one can obtain a loan on the same date it is requested. In every instance the borrower must repay on a ratio of \$6.00 for \$5.00 and although nothing is signed relating to this transaction, it is understood that the payments will be made on a \$6.00 for \$5.00 basis and if the borrower defaults he will get his head "smashed."

On March 20, 1964, BU T-5 advised that FRED G. RANDACCIO is a principal figure in the shylocking operations on the West Side of Buffalo. He stated that [redacted] who acts as a collecting agent for RANDACCIO. He stated that he has observed [redacted] on numerous occasions meeting with NATARELLI, RANDACCIO and JOSEPH FINO at Gino's Restaurant, 530 Rhode Island Avenue, Buffalo, New York.

On January 27, 1964, [redacted] Buffalo Police Department, advised that Gino's Restaurant is currently operated by [redacted] who reside at [redacted]. He stated that Gino's Restaurant is not a licensed liquor retailer and the restaurant simply serves coffee, sandwiches and some meals at this location. He pointed out that [redacted] having served some time at Attica Penitentiary on an unknown felony charge. He stated that [redacted] at Jo-Eli's Restaurant, resides upstairs over Gino's Restaurant. [redacted] stated that Gino's Restaurant continues to be the number one hangout for RANDACCIO and his gang. He stated that RANDACCIO and his associates can be observed at this location around three o'clock each day. Such meetings have previously been reported as being observed by Agents of the Buffalo FBI Office.

It was noted that on January 23, 1964, SAA [redacted] observed a red Thunderbird parked in front of RANDACCIO's home at 3:20 p.m. This car, bearing 1964 New [redacted] is registered to [redacted] New York, Telephone Number [redacted]. It was noted that this car was also observed at RANDACCIO's home on November 5, 1963 by SA ELMER F. MOULIN, JR.

On February 27, 1964, it was also observed, together with the following cars bearing 1964 New York State license plates, parked at Gino's Restaurant, 530 Rhode Island Avenue, Buffalo, New York:

As previously reported, [redacted] a former night club operator, reported that FRED G. RANDACCIO, whom he knows as "FREDDIE THE WOLF," loaned him \$10,000 in the fall of 1961 and demanded repayment of \$15,000 in 30 days.

[redacted] further stated that [redacted] and [redacted] were present when "FREDDIE THE WOLF" threatened him and his family if he, [redacted] could not make payment of \$15,000.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date 3/26/64

On March 20, 1964, [] was located at the Kenmore Bedding and Furniture Company, 2956 Delaware Avenue in Kenmore, New York. [] advised that he is the sole proprietor doing business under the name of Kenmore Bedding and Furniture Company and has been working in the furniture line for several years in the Buffalo, New York area. [] stated that sometime around 1961 while working [] for A. Victor and Company he met [] of the Crystal Inn in Arcade, New York. [] explained that in addition to his employment as a furniture salesman he was working as an individual selling party favors for Norman L. Etenger, Inc., carnival supplies, 349 Broadway, Buffalo, New York. At that time [] was just getting the Crystal Inn completed and offered him \$500.00 to decorate the night club for a Christmas party and ordered approximately \$250.00 worth of decorations and another \$250.00 worth of decorations for a New Year's Eve party.

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[] stated that he was rather surprised to obtain such a large order for a night club located in Arcade, New York, since this is considered a rural area and he did not believe that the area would support the expenditures [] was making at the night club. He further stated that [] boasted of knowing FRANK SINATRA personally, having played a trombone in TOMMY DORSEY's band when SINATRA was singing for DORSEY. He stated that [] told him that SINATRA was planning to come to the Crystal Inn after he opened and not charge him for his appearance. [] stated he did not believe [] at the time, however, when he opened the night club, most of the prominent businessmen in the area were present in formal evening clothes and LOUIE ARMSTRONG and his band were featured as entertainment. He stated it was common knowledge that [] was spending large sums of money financing, not only his night club, but some sort of construction business [] was operating in connection with the building of the Crystal Inn.

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by SA [] and SAA [] Date dictated 3/24/64
[] :mak

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[] stated that he had never transacted any other business than that related above with [] and he was positive that he had never borrowed or loaned [] any funds whatsoever. He stated as a matter of fact he did not have any funds to loan anyone when he was selling party favors to night clubs.

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[] stated that he never went to see [] with anyone attempting to collect funds and that he was not aware that anyone had made any threats to [] concerning unpaid bills. He stated he was aware of the fact that [] had jumped bail, however, he had no information that [] had fled to South America.

He stated that he knew for a fact that [] was trying to borrow money in Buffalo and had mentioned on one occasion that he had some large diamonds which were very valuable and that he, [], was planning on selling them to a jeweler in the Ellicott Square Building. He further stated that [] was trying to borrow funds and offered to pay a high rate of interest for ready cash. He stated that [] told him that he was willing to pay interest in the amount of \$1,000.00 for a \$5,000.00 loan for a period of only three or four weeks.

[] stated he did not know the identity of anyone who had loaned [] any money, however, he suspected that [] was deeply in debt to banks in the Arcade, New York area.

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[] stated that he did not know anyone by the name of "FREDDIE THE WOLF" or [] and had never heard that they had loaned [] any money. He stated that he recalled seeing [] on one occasion at Panaro's Lounge which is often referred to on the West Side of Buffalo as "Mike Snow's." He stated that he recalls this incident occurred around Christmas of 1961 and [] was alone at the time. [] advised that he is acquainted with FRED G. RANDACCIO and is familiar with shylocking operations of a group on the West Side of Buffalo known as "The Arm." He pointed out that he has never borrowed any funds from "The Arm" and he is positive he has never borrowed any funds from RANDACCIO. He stated that he has never known RANDACCIO to be referred to as "FREDDIE THE WOLF" and he has never heard of any information suggesting that [] had borrowed any money from RANDACCIO or "The Arm."

[redacted] commented during the interview that regardless of his financial plight he would never consider taking the risk of borrowing money from "The Arm," because of their high rate of interest. It should be noted that although [redacted] professed to knowing nothing about [redacted] borrowing funds from RANDACCIO or "The Arm," he made a comment at the conclusion of the interview that he, [redacted] must have been in real trouble financially. He followed this remark up by asking the question as to why would [redacted] borrow \$5,000.00 from "The Arm" at such a high rate of interest unless he was in real financial difficulty. When he was asked to elaborate or explain this comment, [redacted] stated that he had no comment to make, but was merely using this as an example of what a man will do when he is being pushed financially.

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[redacted] stated that he did not know anyone using the names of [redacted] [redacted] [redacted] or [redacted] who formerly worked for Bob Ford Provisions as a meat salesman.

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NARCOTICS

As previously reported, information was received by the Buffalo Office that certain members of the STEVE MAGADDINO Family, including FRED G. RANDACCIO, were working with an international narcotics smuggling ring.

During the hearings before the Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations on October 16, 1963, [redacted] Buffalo Police Department, presented a chart as Exhibit Number 66 captioned "Narcotics Distribution Chart for the Buffalo Area." This chart showed the name "Magaddino Empire" at the head of the distribution chart. In explaining the chart, [redacted] stated that he wanted to preface his remarks by saying that all narcotics certainly did not come from Canada. During this testimony, Lieutenant advised, in part, of the following relating to narcotics activities of this group:

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"Yes, sir, I will attempt to explain the chart. I might preface my remarks by saying that all of the narcotics certainly doesn't come from Canada. Much of it comes from New York City, and from other devious means and routes. This particular one we managed with information at our disposal to set up this chart and break it down in the fashion that it is.

"It is our information, and good information, that Magaddino's empire and Magaddino himself still has a lot to say with the narcotics flow in the city of Buffalo on a higher level. As a matter of fact, any activity in a higher level in narcotic area, without Magaddino's permission, and acquiescence or blessing, would meet up with sudden disaster, as will be explained.

"Albert Agueci and [redacted] are some top men in the Canadian area. These two gentlemen attempted to come to the United States and were refused admittance in about 1950. They made their way into Canada and they are citizens at this particular time and set up, because of their experience and because of their connections with the European Continent, a supply of narcotics.

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"We referred to them as smugglers, smuggling in an international scale from the Continent. At this juncture point, their following connections would be a group, one of any of the following: Albert Volpe, Paul Volpe, brothers, [redacted] and [redacted] to mention a few.

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"Our experience and actual information is that Mike Tascarella, who is depicted on our chart, very well known to us, and Joseph Augiello, who has been in the United States some 8 or 10 years, were couriers or smugglers insofar as narcotics was concerned from Canada to the Buffalo area."

In further describing various phases of narcotics investigations of the Buffalo Police Department with the help of the Federal Bureau of Narcotics, [redacted] then made reference to the testimony of JOSEPH VALACHI concerning ALBERT AGUECI. He pointed out that ALBERT and [redacted] were arrested as a result of a Federal Bureau of Narcotics investigation. He stated that he believed there were 16 other defendants who were arrested on a charge of conspiracy along with [redacted] and JOSEPH VALACHI. He stated that [redacted] is still in jail and ALBERT AGUECI was killed as a result of gangland vengeance. In describing the murder of ALBERT AGUECI, [redacted] testified, in part, as follows:

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"The information developed by our unit in conferences with other law enforcement units shows that Agueci had obtained the permission of the Magaddino clan or Magaddino himself to engage in narcotics in the Buffalo area. Of course, an agreement of this sort is provided for and part of it would be that Magaddino himself and the empire shall be the recipients of a certain percentage of the so-called profits.

"In return for these profits, the don, in this case Magaddino, his side of the agreement

"is that he will provide some kind of protection from interference from other mobsters, and some type of protection insofar as arrest is concerned to provide for the bail, and provide for possibly spending money, and provide for many other things.

"In his instance, our information developed that Magaddino after Agueci was killed, had reneged on his part of the bargain to help Agueci, at least to be bailed from his incarceration. Agueci finally made bail through his wife, and one of the first things he did was to return to Buffalo to vie for vengeance against the old man. I believe the Senators are in possession now of a picture that depicts what a gangland murder looks like. In this instance they sent a message, a very horrifying and shocking message. My report, if I can read from it, shows the following-----

"On November 23, 1961, the body of Albert G. Agueci, of 21 Armitage Drive, Scarborough, Canada, was found in a field near Rochester, N.Y. His hands were bound behind his back, and ankles were tied with long cord, and he was strangled. His jaw was broken, half his teeth had been kicked or knocked out. Substantial portions of meaty tissue were removed from the calves of his legs. His body was doused with gasoline, and ignited. His body was mutilated beyond recognition. This was not only to cause his death, of course, but this was to send a message to anyone else who had the temerity or the gall to try to resort to vengeance against one of the dons in the empire. I feel it truly depicts a typical gangland murder."

It should be noted that [redacted]
FBI Number [redacted] Ontario, Canada, was arrested
on July 31, 1963 by members of the [redacted]
[redacted] on narcotics charges. Information was
furnished previously by the [redacted] that [redacted] had a tie in
with the underworld in the United States.

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In connection with another matter, [redacted] advised SAA [redacted] on September 16, 1963 that he and [redacted] Ontario, Canada, are assigned to a unit currently investigating organized criminal activities in Ontario, Canada. He stated that on July 27, 1963, ANTONIO SILVESTRI, a suspected narcotics smuggler, died in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada. He stated that SILVESTRI was residing with his brother-in-law, [redacted] at the time of his death and that both [redacted] and SILVESTRI were suspected of being the leading narcotics smugglers in Ontario, Canada.

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[redacted] further stated that [redacted] was arrested in July of 1963 by members of his unit, and was closely associated with [redacted] also known as [redacted] " from Buffalo, New York. [redacted] was arrested on June 5, 1962 in the West Flamboro Township near Hamilton, Ontario, Canada. by the [redacted] He was arrested with one [redacted] New York.

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[redacted] stated that during the funeral of ANTONIO SILVESTRI in July of 1963 members of the [redacted] placed the funeral procession under surveillance in order to identify associates of both SILVESTRI and [redacted] [redacted] stated that a number of license numbers were recorded at the time of their surveillance and several New York license plates were observed at the time. There are listed below the names of the persons to whom cars bearing New York license plates are registered which were observed during the funeral procession.

1963 [redacted] which is registered to [redacted] New York, for a 1963 black Chevrolet.

1963 [redacted] which is registered to [redacted] New York, for a 1957 red and white Mercury. The 1963 [redacted] City Directory shows [redacted] as employed by the American Machine and Foundry Company, Broadway and Kennedy Road, Buffalo, New York. [redacted] an employee of Farrell-Birmingham Corporation, also resides at this [redacted]

1963 [redacted] which is registered to [redacted] New York, for a red and white 1955 Ford. It is noted that [redacted] also reside at [redacted]

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During the course of another investigation, [redacted] was interviewed on several occasions in an attempt to locate and interview [redacted] an associate of [redacted] of New York City. [redacted] at the time was being sought by the FBI as a fugitive because of his flight to avoid prosecution for committing an armed robbery of Brink's, Inc. at Buffalo, New York in 1955.

[redacted] further stated that [redacted] also known as [redacted] in Ontario, Canada, who not only represents, but is closely associated with hoodlums suspected of being engaged in narcotics smuggling. He stated that on June 2, 1963 a telephone call was placed from either the office or residence of [redacted] Telephone Number [redacted] He stated that this number is listed to THOMAS AGRO, 492 West Avenue, Buffalo, New York. It has been determined through other investigations that [redacted], a close associate and friend of [redacted] resides at [redacted] According to [redacted] both [redacted] and [redacted] have been suspected of smuggling narcotics from Canada into the United States and have been working with [redacted] FBI Number [redacted] of [redacted]

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On March 19, 1964, [redacted] United States Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), Buffalo, New York, made available his file pertaining to [redacted] Immigration File Number All [redacted]

A review of this file disclosed that [redacted] born [redacted] [redacted] Telephone Number [redacted] In addition to the usual background information concerning his citizenship, it is noted that [redacted] arrived in

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Miami, Florida, from Cuba on Pan American, Flight 416, on February 3, 1960. He was detained for a hearing by INS in Miami because of his prior criminal record.

[redacted] had made application to visit the United States, however, before his hearing could be held he voluntarily departed Miami for Toronto, Ontario, Canada. At that time [redacted] indicated that he wanted to stay over in Miami at the Castaways Hotel. Investigation by INS discloses that [redacted] had left Canada for Rome, Italy to attend some olympic event. He left Rome, Italy and travelled to Cuba before arriving in Miami, Florida on February 3, 1960.

By letter dated August 15, 1963, [redacted] wrote the INS Office on the letterhead stationery of "Gasbarrini General Contractors, 749 King Road, Burlington, Ontario," asking permission to visit the United States. He stated that he has been in the construction business for the past eight years and prior thereto he was in the aluminum window business. He stated that he would enjoy spending a few weeks in the State of Florida.

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On October 7, 1963, Immigration Form Number I-192, "Application for Advance Permission to Enter as Nonimmigrant" was sent to [redacted] by INS.

By letter dated January 28, 1964, [redacted] submitted his "Application to Enter the United States as a Nonimmigrant" to WILLIAM K. POWERS, Assistant District Director, INS, United States Court Court, Buffalo, New York. He pointed out in this letter that if the privilege of visiting this country was granted to him he would exercise it only when taking holidays with his family in this country. He also attached a list of individuals with whom he has done business in the construction field in the past five years. He also stated that he has been quite active in the building construction business throughout the Province of Ontario. Some of the corporate companies with whom he is associated are as follows:

[redacted] stated that he has taken a personal active interest in all of the above companies, consisting of consulting with architects, engineers and so forth. He states he also attends meetings of the Planning Board and Ontario Municipal Board when necessary, "submitting applications to building departments for permits required in construction, job supervising where construction is in progress, purchasing all materials that are necessary for any project, preparing general agreements with all such contractors, negotiating the sale and rental of properties with real estate offices, as well as making formal application to lending institutions such as Central Mortgage and House Corporation and private lending writers such as insurance companies, mortgage brokers and so forth."

In his letter, [redacted] stated that it is his opinion that he may be inadmissible to the United States because of his past record. He stated that in October, 1949 in the Province of British Columbia he was convicted on a charge of violating the Narcotics Act and was sentenced to seven years in the Federal Penitentiary in the City of New Westminster, British Columbia, which term he served, in all, five years and four months and was released on January 15, 1955.

On March 10, 1964, D. L. MC CLARAN, Acting Assistant Director, Buffalo District, INS, denied [redacted] application for admission into the United States and notified [redacted] "the reasons which he have advanced for visiting in the United States are not sufficiently compelling to warrant the exercise of this discretion."

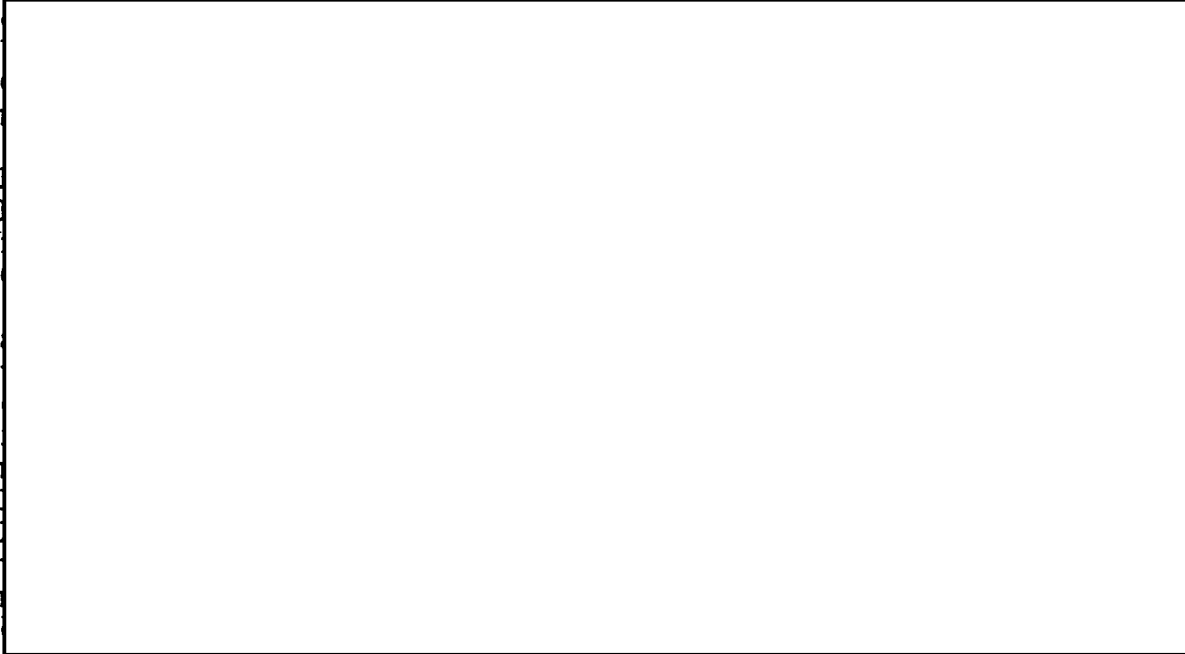

FRED G. RANDACCIO, also known as Fredrico G. Randaccio, was born July 1, 1907, in Palermo, Italy. At the present time he resides at 572 Richmond Avenue, Buffalo, New York.

On December 22, 1963, Source Number One advised that [redacted] met with [redacted] that day and had left two baskets of fruit for [redacted] and RANDACCIO. Source Number One explained that [redacted] had an employee of his [redacted] deliver one of the baskets to RANDACCIO's home that day.

Source Number One stated that [redacted] and RANDACCIO were planning to have a party at Augustine's Restaurant, 295 Washington Street, Buffalo, New York, which is operated by RANDACCIO's [redacted]

Source Number One stated that friends of [redacted] and RANDACCIO were going to close off a place at the restaurant and have a party by themselves. [redacted] expected 15 couples to attend the party.

On January 10, 1964, Source Number One advised that [redacted] had met with RANDACCIO that day and they discussed various political appointments in the Buffalo area. It was the opinion of Source Number One that RANDACCIO was inquiring as to the duties of [redacted] whom [redacted] indicated was finished as far as the Democratic Party was concerned. [redacted] stated that Erie County Democratic Chairman [redacted] had given instructions to the Party not to give certain individuals jobs and that [redacted] was one of those on the list. Source Number One stated that RANDACCIO informed [redacted] that he was interested in getting a man known as [redacted] who lives in the [redacted] an advance and

wanted [] to run for some political office. RANDACCIO, without identifying [] to Source Number One, described [] as being "strictly in our corner." Source Number One pointed out that after RANDACCIO left [] contacted [] of New York State Assemblyman STEVE GRECO, to obtain [] home telephone number. [] asked STEVE GRECO to stop by and see him and then made arrangements for [] to meet him, [] later.

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On January 13, 1964, Source Number One advised that [] was informed by RANDACCIO that there was going to be a big crackdown by the police in Buffalo and that he, RANDACCIO, was going to get off the streets by going to a movie.

Source Number One stated that on January 16, 1964 [] met with [] that day and told him that he was opposing the Governor of New York over the Governor's waste of money involved in the New York State Crime Commission. GRECO explained the details of a taped speech which he had made in Albany to be played on Radio Station WBEN. GRECO was particularly incensed about the waste of money expended by the New York State Crime Commission and the fact that the Governor was reappointing the same individuals to be members of the Crime Commission at a cost of \$72,000.00. Source Number One stated that [] was observed at Caruso's Restaurant that night with FRED RANDACCIO, PASQUALE NATARELLI and Buffalo attorney []

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Source Number One advised that RANDACCIO's [] was in the hospital on January 6, 1964 and the night before RANDACCIO and NATARELLI had taken their girl friends to Victor Hugo's Restaurant. Source Number One stated that [] and RANDACCIO were planning to have dinner at the Andrews Club that evening. Source Number One stated that the subject's [] was confined in [] because of some unidentified illness.

On January 7, 1964, Source Number One advised that [] had ordered two baskets of flowers to be sent to the [] where [] Gift cards accompanying the flowers were sent from [] FRED

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[redacted] formerly worked as a [redacted] for RANDACCIO when he operated the Delaware Vending Company in partnership with [redacted]. On November 19, 1963, Source Number Three reported that FRED G. RANDACCIO contacted PETER A. MAGADDINO that day in Niagara Falls, New York. RANDACCIO explained the recent changes in the Buffalo Police Department and commented that "we" had gotten rid of one individual and were going to get rid of another. According to Source Number Three, RANDACCIO was referring to personnel changes within the Intelligence Unit of the Buffalo Police Department.

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On December 10, 1963, Source Number Three reported seeing RANDACCIO with STEVE MAGADDINO and his son in Niagara Falls, New York, that day.

Source Number Three reported that RANDACCIO and PASQUALE NATARELLI went to Niagara Falls on January 16, 1964, to meet with STEVE MAGADDINO, ANTONIO MAGADDINO, PETER A. MAGADDINO, and SAM RANGATORE. At this meeting, RANDACCIO said he had received a telephone call on January 15, 1964, which indicated there were going to be arrests or raids on Friday, January 17, 1964. According to Source Number Three, someone known as [redacted] had learned of these arrests or raids from a man known only to Source Number Three as [redacted]. SAM RANGATORE indicated that possibly [redacted] could find out something more definite as to the identities of those to be arrested. RANDACCIO informed those present that he told the [redacted]

[redacted] of the Buffalo Police Department, what he thought of [redacted]. In connection with the anticipated arrests, NATARELLI explained what was necessary to conduct a legal search and pointed out that when he was arrested in connection with the state-wide lottery ring operating out of Utica, New York, the only evidence against him was a telephone conversation with one of those involved.

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
