As previously reported, VICTOR RANDACCIO, her of the subject, is Secretary-Treasurer of the International

Hod Carriers and Common Laborers Union of America, Local 210, Buffalo, New York.

On August 10, 1965, BU T-1 advised that the New York State Police is conducting an active investigation to develop information concerning the criminal element associated with organized labor unions in the Buffalo and Rochester areas. He stated that the New York State Police has assigned investigators to develop background information and current activities of the officers of Local 210 in Buffalo, New York, since this union has been alleged to be controlled by the MAGADDINO-RANDACCIO criminal element. BU T-1 stated that VICTOR E. RANDACCIO, born May 28, 1921, the brother of FRED G. RANDACCIO, is Secretary-Treasurer of Local 210.

BU T-1 stated that several sources have identified FRED G. RANDACCIO as the man who actually controlled the activities of Local 210 through the following individuals:

- 1. VICTOR RANDACCIO, his brother
 2. JOSEPH A. LATONA, born November 2, 1912
 3. SALVATORE PANTANO, born January 3, 1907
 4. SAM BONGIOVANNI







RANDACCIO was also asked whether the Tonawanda, New York Police Department, had questioned him regarding the "gangland type" slaying of CHARLES GERASS in Tonawanda previously. RANDACCIO replied in the negative stating that he had flown to New York on a Wednesday (believed to be the same day in which the body of GERASS was discovered) with a male companion whom he would not identify. RANDACCIO stated that he used a "fake name," but returned to Buffalo via air using his true name. While in New York, he only bought a pair of shoes. RANDACCIO further advised that he and his wife had driven to New York City about two weeks previously and while in that locale they took in the World's Fair. RANDACCIO admitted knowing GERASS since he went to school with the former's mother. When queried with respect to the identities of individuals who were responsible for this murder, RANDACCIO replied that he did not know, but implied that GERASS liked to "fool around with other men's wives" and did not care who these women were married to.

As far as his income was concerned, RANDACCIO stated that he reported all to the Internal Revenue Service on his income tax return which included gambling winnings. He volunteered that he made \$3,000, the past weekend while gambling, but did not describe this any further. RANDACCIO mentioned that he "loves to gamble" and will take advantage of every gambling opportunity afforded. He denied "having a piece" of the North Tonawanda, New York crap game and had no knowledge where this game had recently moved to. He stated he had no interest in anything in Buffalo, New York, but refused to discuss any of these local gambling operations.

RANDACCIO stated that ______ is a good friend of his, but he knew nothing about ______ operations and never asked him any questions along these lines.

RANDACCIO also admitted seeing STEFANO MAGADDINO in Niagara Falls, New York, on several occasions in the recent past and described him as a "very sick man."

During the course of interview with RANDACCIO, JOHN CAMMILLERI was observed driving by the locale on several occasions. RANDACCIO made the comment "none of the guys" will stop when the FBI car remains parked there. He also mentioned that CAMMILLERI was having a "rough time of 1t" financially and healthwise, indicating that the latter was to enter the local hospital the following week for an operation on his eyes.

As the interview of RANDACCIO was drawn to a close, DAN SANSANESE, SR. was observed entering Gina's Restaurant and RANDACCIO commented "there goes Danny the crazy man."

RANDACCIO then stated that if this is the situation and they subpoens him before the Federal Grand Jury, the only thing he could do is to stand on his Constitutional grounds of the Fifth Amendment and refuse to talk even if given immunity. RANDACCIO said that he would rather "breathe five breaths in jail for criminal contempt than to breathe nothing at all outside."

When asked whether this meant that he would not talk before a Federal Grand Jury investigating gambling, RANDACCIO stated that he would have to be crazy if he did. With this comment, RANDACCIO shook the handof both Agents and walked away saying that he did not wish to talk any further.

Murder of CHARLES GERASS

on September 22, 1965, advised that the body of CHARLES S. GERASS, age 36, of 85 Glenside Avenue, Town of Tonawanda, New York, was found in the trunk of his Cadillac parked in a shopping plaza parking lot in the suburban area of Buffalo, New York, at approximately 11:20 p.m., September 22, 1965.

On December 5, 1965, BU T-9 expressed his personal opinion that GERASS had been dating someone's wife and as a result had been killed. BU T-9 stated that GERASS was a man who would not hesitate to date anyone's wife if the opportunity arose, even the wife of his best friend. BU T-9 pointed out that in his opinion there were two organizations operating on the West Side of Buffalo, one of which was personally headed by FRED G. RANDACCIO. He stated, however, that another group existed in Buffalo which included "BABE" BILLITERI and AL and CHARLIE CACI. BU T-9 stated that the latter three individuals would not hesitate to commit murder if the matter arose or on behalf of RANDACCIO and members of "The Arm." BU T-9 pointed out that BILLITERI, although not employed or having any source of regular income, is well thought of by members of the RANDACCIO faction. BU T-9 expressed the opinion that this was due to BILLITERI's obedience to RANDACCIO's directions.

BU T-9 added that he observed FRED G. RANDACCIO, STEVE MAGADDINO and VINCENT A. SCRO on November 9, 1965, while they were attending the funeral of the son of ROY CARLISI at 20 Anderson Place, Buffalo, New York.

As previously reported, CHARLES S. GERASS was known to have left his home the night before his body was found in order to meet either both of whom are closely associated with the MAGADDINO family.

It is also noted that during the interview with RANDACCIO on October 12, 1965, RANDACCIO implied that GERASS liked to "fool around with other men's wives" and did not care who these men were married to.

On November 24, 1965,
38 caliber pistol had been found on November 23, 1965, in a City of Tonawanda sewer a few miles from where the body of GERASS was found. Two spent cartridges were found in the weapon, which was turned over to the FBI Laboratory in Washington, D. C., for examination.

C., was inconclusive, however, it was reported that the same type of ammunition and the same type of weapon was used in the gangland slaying of CHARLES GERASS. advised that further investigation also disclosed that about the time GERASS was killed, a car owned by the daughter of CHARLES A. MONTANA and the wife of was stolen. The car was later found within a short distance of where the .38 caliber pistol was found in the City of Tonawanda, New York. advised that the car owned by had been burned a short time after it had been stolen. advised that he did not know the significance of the stolen car being burned in the same area where the car was found; however, he was continuing to explore this new facet in the investigation.

Investigations conjucted under caption of "CAMBLING ACTIVITIES OF THE AFM!" as well as those in substantive cases have set forth information that RANDACCIO, as indeshoos to STEVE MACADOINO, is the "enforcer" or principal in the operations of "the Arm". Informants and sources have reported that in this capacity RANDACCIO is acting for STEVE MACADOINO in bookmaking, skylacking and gammaling sativities in the Buffalo area.

USA JOHN T. CURTIN, Neffalo, has advised that on 3/15/65, he is thying to dashington. D. C., to consult sith the Assistant Attorney General in charge of Criminal Division of the Department of Justice, in an effort to obtain departmental authority for the granting of insmunity to RANDACCIO. If the authority for issumity is granted, CURTIN has indicated he will recall RANDACCIO before the Grand Jury and it RANDACCIO continues to take the Fifth Assendment, CURTIN will proceed against RANDACCIO under the Civil Centempt Provisions of the Federal Gesmunications Act.

Information information indicating that there is a split within the "Magaddino Fimily" in the Buffalo area which was caused by the return of JOSEPH J. DI CARLO and SALVATORE P. PIEHI to the Buffalo area. There are indications that PIERI resents the authority and position held by RANDACCIO and has made him feelings known making his friends and associates on the West Side of Buffalo. Informants have conjectured that if RANDACCIO should go to jail as a result of the current Grand Jury proceedings, most of his bookmaking and gambling operations will regroup where the direction and control of DI CARLO and PIERI. It is sipperpected that MAGADDINO, due to his age and health, will accept this change of commune as a best way out of a "cold war" which he has been unable to control.

In the event RANDACCIO is round in contempt for falling to answer questions before the Grand Jury. It is believed that a number of bookwakers and gemblers who are suspected as being morbers of the Le Cosa Nostra (LCN), will be more susceptible to discussing RANDACCIO's past activities and his tie-in as Uncertooss with STEVE MACADDINO, particularly if RANDACCIO is incarcerated for a substantial period.

It is highly possible that if RANDACCIO is jailed on contempt charges in Buffalo, a number of the Lieutenants may realise that they too may end up in jail for not answering questions asked of them by the FBI and the Suderal Grand Jury. This is particularly true since to date no one has been jailed in Buffalo for failing to answer questions before the Grand Jury.

Request for additional subposes to be served on other hoodings associated with RANDACCIO is being held in absyance until the disposition of RANDACCIO's appearance before the Federal Grand Jury is concluded.

Informants as well as RANDACCIO himself, have recently voiced their opinions that they expect RANDACCIO to be sent to jail since it has become known that this investigation has been directed toward that end.

Incomuch as the basis for the immunity under the Federal Communications Act will involve the use of a telephone in some way, a thorough review was made of the investigations conducted regarding FRED G. RANDACCIO, as well as his associates, in order to select those questions which appear particent to this Grand Jury inquiry. There is set forth below a list of topics upon which questions were prepared by the Buffalo Office for use by the USA at Buffalo before the Grand Jury:

- 1) Murder of EDWARD POSPHICAL, 1/28/45, after leaving a party attended by RANDACCIO and several of his hooding associates.
- 2) Travel of RANDACCIO to the Basex House Hotel in New York City, New York, in Japuary 1959, with other members of "The Arm", at which time approximately 50 telephone calls from the hotel rooms occupied by RANDACCIO and his party were made to Duffalo area bookmakers and hoodlums.

- 3) Travel of RANDACCIO and PASQUALE NATARELLI on 4/21/64, to Suffolk Downs Race Track, East Boston, Massachusetts, where they met members of "The Arm" from Buffalo, as well as jockies and horse trainers in the Boston area. Prior to the departure of RANDACCIO those members of "The Arm" residing at a Providence, Rhode Islami, hotel were in daily contact with bookmakers and gamblers in the Buffalo area.
- in November, 1960, RANDACCIO, while operating a vanding machine company in the Buffalo area, traveled to Mismi Beach, Florida, with other members of "The Arm". Shortly thereafter RANDACCIO sold out to a syndicate which had previously purchased a vending machine business from ANGELO BRUNO of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and one from AUGUSTINE AMATO of Florida.
- 5) During the five year period 1954-1959, RANDACCIO reported income from gambling totaling \$31,246.00 in addition to other income.

During the hearings before the McClellan Committee in Washington, D. C., JOSEPH VALACHI testified that RANDACCIO is the Underboss of STEVE MAGADDINO. He also furnished information that RANDACCIO and MAGADDINO were involved in an international narcotics sauggling ring for which they received tribute from those actually involved in the sauggling operations.

During the past twenty years there have been several gang-land killings in the Buffalo and Niagara Falls,

New York, areas, the victims being known associates of RANDACCIO and members of "The Arm". To date no arrests have been made as a result of these gang-land killings.

In view of the above it is requested that the Bureau discuss with the Department the Bureau's position in having immunity granted to RANDACCIO, with particular emphasis on the fact that RANDACCIO is in a position to answer questions concerning the above mentioned-matters. If he does not, a jail sentence of RANDACCIO would deal a severe blow to the "Magaddino Family" and cause further dissension within the "Nagaddino Family".

> The Special Agent in Charge, Buffalo, has advised that the United States Attorney expects to consult personally with Assistant Attorney General Vinson on March 15, 1966, for the purpose of obtaining Departmental authority for granting immunity to Fred G. Randaccio, "enforcer" and underboss of La Cosa Nostra "Commission" member Steve Magaddino of Buffalo.

March 11, 1966

A Federal grand jury in Buffalo, New York, is currently hearing testimony in connection with activities of "The Arm," a group of individuals who have long dominated gambling action in the Buffalo area. Information developed through our investigation of this group and of Randaccio clearly indicates that "The Arm" is under the control of Randaccio who is acting for Steve Magaddino, head of the Buffalo "family" of La Cosa Nostra.

According to the Special Agent in Charge, Buffalo, the United States Attorney, if Departmental authority for immunity is received, plans to subpoena Randaccio before the grand jury and in the event he takes the Fifth Amendment, the United States Attorney will proceed against Randaccio under the civil contempt provisions of the Federal Communications Act. According to Special Agent in Charge, Buffalo, the United States Attorney has the complete support of the Federal judge in connection with this proposed action.

OBSERVATIONS:

As a result of information developed through our investigation, there is ample reason to believe that Randaccio will not answer questions asked of him before

This would, of course, deal a severe blow to the Buffalo faction of La Cosa Nostra and cause further dissension in the Magaddino "family." Additionally, it is felt that if Randaccio is jailed a number of heretofore reluctant La Cosa Nostra members as well as bookmakers and gamblers in the Buffalo area may be more susceptible to discussing Randaccio's past activities and his tie-in as underboss with "Commission" member Steve Magaddino. The United States Attorney, Buffalo, has indicated enthusiasm and aggressiveness in his approach to organized crime matters in the Buffalo area. It is felt that his anticipated action with regard to Randaccio is valid and merits support.

That if approved, the attached letter to the Attorney General urging his support of the proposed action concerning Randaccio by United States Attorney, Buffalo, be sent.

According to the informant, Gina's Restaurant is frequently checked by officers of the Buffalo Police Department and it is common knowledge among the customers of Gina's that they are under routine surveillance by various investigative agencies.

When the bookmaker demured, RANDACCIO threatened to kill the bookmaker. According to the informant, this bookmaker resisted RANDACCIO's efforts and RANDACCIO finally desisted in his demands.

As has been previously reported, the Federal Grand Jury at Buffalo has been conducting an investigation into the gambling activities of "The Arm."

On February 1, 1966, Special Agents of the FBI served subpoenas on DANIEL G. SANSANESE, SR., PASQUALE A. NATARELLI and BENEDETTO SPANO, and on February 2, 1966, on FRED G. RANDACCIO calling for their appearance before the Federal Grand Jury on February 23, 1966.

On February 23, 1966, RANDACCIO appeared before the Federal Grand Jury and refused to answer any questions availing himself of the protection granted by the Fifth Amendment. United States Attorney JOHN T. CURTIN advised that he would submit a request to the Department for authorization to offer RANDACCIO immunity under provisions of the Federal Communications Statute and that if authorized would proceed against RANDACCIO under the civil contempt provisions of the Federal Communications Act if RANDACCIO persisted in his refusal to testify. It should be noted that in connection with the aforementioned Grand Jury investigation that indictments were returned on March 2, 1966, charging

On February 8, 1966, BU T-7 advised that FRED RANDACCIO is the "wielder of the sword" for STEVE MAGADDINO's operation in the Buffalo and surrounding area. Although informant considers RANDACCIO to be stupid and an "egotistical nut," RANDACCIO still holds the group together with an iron fist. BU T-8 stated that from conversations with members of the organization, many of these members although they will not openly say so not only fear RANDACCIO but hate him as well.

It has been previously reported that some dissension may exist in the "Magaddino Family" of La Cosa Nostra (LCN) between the subject and SALVATORE J. PIERI, also known as Sam.

On January 5, 1966, BU T-1C advised that, according to a source who is very close to several leading members of the "Magaddino Family" in the Buffalo area, JOSEPH J. DI CARLO was "sent to Buffalo" as a "peace maker" in the "cold war" between RANDACCIO and SALVATORE J. PIERI. According to BU T-10, information received by him indicates that FRED RANDACCIO because of the poor health of STEVE MAGADDINO may possibly be receiving his "orders" from New York City. BU T-1C stated that his information indicates that RANDACCIO has been receiving long distance telephone calls at pre-arranged times from someone in New York City and taking monthly trips to New York.

On March 5, 1966, BU T-11 advised that he has been recently in contact with SAM PIERI. According to BU T-11, PIERI is still waging a cold war with RANDACCIO, and the "mob" on the West Side of Buffalo believes that RANDACCIO will go to jail after his next appearance before the Federal Grand Jury. According to BU T-11, some of RANDACCIO's closest friends are secretly hoping that RANDACCIO will be jailed and that PIERI and DI CARLO will take over the leadership. It was the opinion of the informant that PASQUALE NATARELLI will immediately go over to the DI CARLO faction in order to obtain protection for his gambling interests which NATARELLI alone cannot handle.

BU T-11 stated that the split between RANDACCIO and PIERI was obvious at the funeral of JO DI CARLO's wife. Informant pointed out that when RANDACCIO entered the funeral home, he shook hands with everyone at the wake except PIERI and two men who were with PIERI.

In discussing LCN on March 5, 1966, BU T-11 stated that there is an LCN in the Buffalo area which is often referred to as the "syndicate," "mafia" and "the organization." BU T-11 stated it is a well-known fact that STEVE MAGADDINO is the boss of this group and exercises control over it through the muscles supplied in the Buffalo area by RANDACCIO. Informant pointed out that no one in the Buffalo area, unless he is a member of LCN, can positively say whether or not another man is a member. BU T-11 stated that the old JOSEPH DI CARLO gang was represented in the Buffalo area at one time by people of Southern Italy origin. After DI CARLO and several of his lieutenants left the Buffalo area, those who remained and were considered members of the DI CARLO gang almost starved According to BU T-11, RANDACCIO was a member or to death. at least closely associated with DI CARLO when DI CARLO operated the vending machine rackets and horse rooms in the Buffalo area.

On March 8, 1966, BU T-3 advised that some years ago RANDACCIO and PAT NATARELLI had attempted to shake down a local businessman who was an associated of JIMMY LA DUCA for \$200.00 a month for each of them. This businessman told RANDACCIO in no uncertain terms what he thought of the attempted shakedown. RANDACCIO then threatened this businessman and made a veiled threat against the businessman's family. This businessman then told RANDACCIO that if any attempt were ever made to harm his family, he would reciprocate.

This businessman then contacted VINCENT SCRO and related what had transpired between RANDACCIO and himself. Subsequently, the businessman was summoned to a meeting at the home of STEVE MAGADDINO, at which time MAGADDINO, SCRO, JAMES LA DUCA, CHARLES MONTANA, RANDACCIO and others were present. After MAGADDINO had heard both sides of the story from RANDACCIO and the businessman and the threat made against the businessman, he had a private discussion with RANDACCIO ter which RANDACCIO made an apology to the businessman.

On June 6, 1966, in discussing the New York State Crime Commission hearings being held in Rochester, New York, BU T-5 noted that JOHN CAMMILLERI had been subpoenaed to testify. BU T-5 recalled that several years ago RONNIE VALLONE, who operates a billiard parlor at Main and Tupper Streets, Buffalo, had lost several thousand dollars to a local bookmaker. Unknown to the bookmaker, CAMMILLERI went to VALLONE and collected this money, which he kept and refused to give to the bookmaker. The bookmaker then contacted RANDACCIO and asked for assistance in getting his money from CAMMILLERI. According to the informant, the bookmaker was unsuccessful in his efforts in this regard.



With particular reference to monitor hyand 200487 Buffalo Office, this was done on six separate installations covering a period from 1961 to 1965. As a result of the monitoring, our Buffalo Office has 167 volumes containing in excess of 55,000 pages of hand-written material in addition to voluminous supporting memoranda and translations from the Italian language. The duplicating and administrative handling of this mass of material by our Euffalo Office, by TBI Headquarters, and by the Criminal Division of the Department in the event the material was shipped to Washington for review, would be extremely expensive, as well as time and space consuming. In view of this, it is believed that the review of the results of the monitoring by our Buffalo Office could much better be handled by the attorneys of the Criminal Division at our Buffalo Office. As you are avare, a staff of attorneys from the Criminal Division are in Duffalo as a special "task force" directed toward organized crime in that area. Therefore, we are not having the material relating to monitoring by our Buffalo Office forwarded to Washington.

On January 19, 1967, BU T-1, while discussing the La Cosa Nostra (LCN) membership of SAM PIERI, advised that PIERI has no territorial rights but is only tolerated by STEVE MAGADDINO. Every time PIERI's group makes a "score," RANDACCIO comes to PIERI and obtains a percentage of the "score" for the "MAGADDINO Family." According to the informant, MAGADDINO tolerates this situation to prevent friction between LCN families but according to the informant, there is a tremendous friction between RANDACCIO and PIERI.

On January 19, 1967, BU T-1 advised that several weeks before, RANDACCIO had introduced First Name Unknown (FNU) SCALISE, a brother of JOHN SCALISE of Cleveland, Ohio, to several individuals in the Buffalo, N.Y. area. According to the informant, FNU SCALISE and CHARLES J. CACI, also known as (aka) Bobby Milano, were en route to New York City where CACI was to open at a night club on or about January 29, 1967.

BU T-1 further advised that RANDACCIO and PASQUALE A. NATARELLI were planning to fly to New York City on the weekend of January 29, 1967, extensively for the purpose of attending the opening of BOBBY MILANO, who is well known as a professional singer, however, the informant conjectured that this trip might be for the purpose of meeting with New York City LCN members concerning the MAGADDINO-BONANNO dispute.

On January 27, 1967, BU T-1 advised that on that date RANDACCIO had abruptly changed his plans concerning the proposed trip to New York City on January 29, 1967, and that NATARELLI would not be making the trip either. Informant had no idea why RANDACCIO had changed his plans.



According to BU T-2, RANDACCIO's retention on the payroll can be explained by the fact that RANDACCIO's lis in the process of developing a large tract of land for industrial use, and the operator of the P.D.C. Land Development Corporation expects to obtain major work contracts as a result.
It has been previously reported that on October 11, 1966, RANDACCIO was observed meeting with an unidentified individual who was driving an automobile with 1966 New York registration 1F 7523.

On May 8, 1967, BU T-4 telephonically advised that on that evening a meeting was to be held by members of the "MAGADDINO family" at Panaro's Lounge, Hampshire and Grant, Buffalo. This meeting, which was to be held during the late evening hours, was for the purpose of honoring, in view of his recent elevation into the La Cosa Nostra (LCN). Informant stated that this meeting would take place under the cover of a "stag party" for He said that prior to this meeting, there would be a dice game in the basement of Panaro's Lounge to raise money for This dice game is to be banked by FRED G. RANDACCIO.
It is noted that BU T-4 has previously identified as a member of LCN.

On May 8, 1967, the above information concerning the LCN meeting and the dice game was discussed with Captain KENNETH P. KENNEDY, Gambling Squad, Buffalo Police Department, who advised that if this meeting did materialize, he would conduct a New York State Liquor Authority inspection of the premises at Panaro's Lounge.

On the night of May 8, 1967, surveillances by FBI Agents determined that many of the prominent members of the "MAGADDINO family" were present at Panaro's Lounge. This information was befurnished to At approximately 10:10 p.m., on bycome May 8, 1967, members of the Buffalo Police Department and the New York State Police conducted a New York State Liquor Authority inspection of Panaro's Lounge; and, subsequently, arrested the following individuals for violation of Section 722-11 of the New York State Penal Law (consorting with known criminals):

In addition, NICHOLAS RIZZO was charged with violation of Section 242-5 of the New York State Penal Law (assault of a police officer).

On May 12, 1967, BU T-4 advised that STEVE MAGADDINO is furious at members of the "MAGADDINO family" who were caught in the raid at Panaro's Lounge, particularly FRED G. RANDACCIO and JAMES V. LA DUCA. MAGADDINO blames RANDACCIO and LA DUCA for not having been previously warned by their political "stooges"

that this raid was to occur. According to BU T-4, MAGADDINO blames RANDACCIO for the current FBI pressure on the "MAGADDINO family" and feels that RANDACCIO has brought this "heat" because of his belligerent attitude toward Buffalo FBI Agents. BU T-4 said he heard that since the raid, RANDACCIO appeared unnerved and cursed several FBI Agents by name. BU T-4 also said he heard RANDACCIO was in hot water with the "old man," referring to MAGADDINO. BU T-4 further stated he has heard that New York State Assemblyman STEVE GRECO, at the request of RANDACCIO, is contacting the Anti-Defamation League for Italian-Americans in the City of New York for the purpose of having this organization protest police and FBI investigations of Italian-Americans in the Buffalo and Niagara Falls, New York areas. This step is being taken in an effort to curtail FBI investigations of LCN.

On May 16, 1967, BU T-5 advised as follows:

On the night of May 9, 1967, a meeting was held at STEVE MAGADDINO's residence in Lewiston, New York which was attended by FRED G. RANDACCIO, PASQUALE A. NATARELLI, VINCENT A. SCRO and JAMES V. LA DUCA, as well as PETER A. MAGADDINO and STEVE MAGADDINO. This meeting was held for the purpose of discussing the raid and subsequent arrests of RANDACCIO and NATARELLI, LA DUCA and other LCN members, on the night of May 8, 1967. BU T-5 said that STEVE MAGADDINO was extremely upset at both RANDACCIO and LA DUCA for this occurrence and stated that he desired that no action be taken by any of the hoodlums involved since this would only create more "heat" on the "MAGADDINO family."

According to BU T-5, MAGADDINO instructed RANDACCIO, LA DUCA and SCRO to have some of their political connections initiate action against the police by some of the legitimate Italian-American groups. On the morning of May 10, 1967, LA DUCA and SCRO met with Attorney JOSEPH RUNFOLA, who has previously represented STEVE MAGADDINO in legal matters. As a result of this meeting, with RUNFOLA, RUNFOLA and Attorney HAROLD J. BOREANAZ had made arrangements to meet with a number of business and professional men of Italian descent in an effort to initiate charges of police harrassment.

LA DUCA had also met with ANTHONY MANGUSO, Buffalo City Corporation Counsel, who advised LA DUCA that they should really try to "blast" the Buffalo Police Department.

BU T-5 commented that the arrests at Panaro's Lounge on May 8, 1967 infuriated STEVE MAGADDINO and all other members of the "MAGADDINO family" because of the wide-spread publicity and resulting embarrassment. BU T-5 noted that since the raid RANDACCIO has been having fainting spells and had passed out on one occasion at the Talisman Supper Club on Hertel Avenue, Buffalo, New York. Informant pointed out that prior to this time RANDACCIO had felt himself completely immune from any arrests.

It should be noted that on May 9, 1967, the charge placed against RANDACCIO on May 8, 1967 was dismissed in Buffalo City Court.

GAMBLING ACTIVITIES

On May 22, 1967, BU T-4 advised that FRED G. RANDACCIO is receiving a cut of sponsored junket flights to gambling casinos in London, England, which are backed by the "MAGADDINO family." BU T-4 said that the last flight he is aware of departed Idlewild Airport, New York City, on April 25, 1967, and arrived back in at New York City on May 7, 1967. BU T-4 could furnish no further details regarding these flights other than the fact that several individuals from the Buffalo, New York area took the abovementioned flight. He said that he has heard that JOEY DE JOHN, the former professional fighter, has some connection with the flights.

On April 18, 1967, BU T-5 advised he had learned that an unknown bookmaker was operating from Buffalo telephone number TL 2-9571. The informant did not know the identity of this bookmaker, but stated that this individual is part of the bookmaking operation of this area controlled by FRED G. RANDACCIO.

On April 18, 1967, this information was furnished to [NA], Gambling Squad, Buffalo Police b7C Department, Buffalo, New York.

It is noted that the above telephone number is publicly listed to Friar's Lounge, 110 Genesee Street, Buffalo, New York.

On subsequent contacts, has advised that his unit has conducted investigation in this matter, but he has not been able to identify as yet the bookmaker utilizing this telephone.




ADMINISTRATIVE

In view of the pending prosecution in District Court, Buffalo, and to preclude any possible embarrassment to the Bureau, no open investigation of the subject will be conducted in connection with this case which is an intelligence type case. Of course, in the event any information is received concerning a substantive violation on the part of the subject, immediate action will be taken. The subject's activities will be followed through established sources and police contacts until such the pending prosecution is completed.

The extended period of this report is noted and is extended to include information not available at the time of the preparation of the last report.

LA COSA NOSTRA ACTIVITIES

On August 25, 1967, BU T-1 advised that leadership in the La Cosa Nostra (LCN) is still vested in STEVE MAGADDINO. However, according to the informant, FRED RANDACCIO is next in line to assume command in the "MAGADDINO Family" as soon as his current legal difficulties are resolved. RANDACCIO's promotion will, of course, be contingent on the outcome of legal proceedings against him.

On May 31, 1967, BU T-2 advised that RANDACCIO continues to be extremely upset over the raid by local police at Panaro's

Lounge on May 8, 1967. According to the informant, RANDACCIO lost the respect of many of his subordinates because of the manner in which he handled himself after the raid.

On June 26, 1967, BU T-2 advised he had heard that RANDACCIO was having serious difficulty within the "MAGADDINO Family," because of the "heat" he had brought upon himself and other members of the "family." Informant identified the source of this later information as being

On June 9, 1967, BU T-3 advised that RANDACCIO was extremely embarrassed by his arrest at Panaro's Lounge and that there had been quite a bit of joding behind RANDACCIO's back about his arrest and the way he conducted himself after the arrest. Informant added that as a result of the raid most of the legitimate people are avoiding Panaro's and shying away from RANDACCIO and his faction.

On July 19, 1967, BU T-4 advised that RANDACCIO and the other individuals arrested on various Federal charges several weeks ago were very upset about the arrests. It was indicated to the informant by two of RANDACCIO's LCN associates that RANDACCIO is afraid that he will have to serve some time on these charges. According to the informant, because of all the unfavorable publicity brought on the "MAGADDINO Family" RANDACCIO is having very serious difficulty with SIEVE MAGADDINO.

On July 28, 1967, BU T-5 advised that RANDACCIO and the others who were arrested on Federal charges were extremely worried about the arrests. According to general information available to the informant, RANDACCIO expects to be convicted on these charges. The informant noted that this attitude of RANDACCIO's is unusual and contrary to the general attitude of innocence usually maintained by people of the character of RANDACCIO.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

FRED G. RANDACCIO observed the interviewing Agent in the vicinity of 1200 Niagara Street at approximately 11:18 AM. RANDACCIO waved to the interviewing Agent and motioned for the interviewing Agent to stop. The interviewing Agent parked the Bureau car on the sidewalk near 1200 Niagara Street and RANDACCIO approached the Bureau car. RANDACCIO called the interviewing Agent by name and exchanged greetings.

RANDACCIO began the conversation by stating that he wanted the FBI to know there was no personal animosity between he and the FBI and that he knew the FBI Agents investigating his activities were only doing their job.

RANDACCIO was then advised of his right to remain silent, that anything he said could be used against him in a court of law, that he had a right to talk to his lawyer for advice before any questions were asked of him, that he had the right to have a lawyer with him during any questioning, and that if he desires to answer any questions without his lawyer being present, he had the right to stop answering these questions at any time. When being advised of his rights, RANDACCIO interrupted the interviewing Agent several times and stated that this was unnecessary because he was well aware of his rights.

RANDACCIO was asked if he would sign a form waiving these rights which he declined to do, but agreed to talk to the interviewing Agent without his attorney being present. It was then pointed out to RANDACCIO that the interviewing Agent did not want to discuss any matters involving outstanding prosecution against him.

RANDACCIO was asked if he would like to discuss La Cosa Nostra (LCN), at which time he laughed and stated that all he knew about LCN was what he read in the newspaper.

It was pointed out to RANDACCIO that it was the understanding of the interviewing Agent that he, RANDACCIO, was the underboss of the "Magaddino Family" of LCN.
RANDACCIO then asked the interviewing Agent if he, RANDACCIO, was stamped "underboss of LCN." The interviewing Agent replied that perhaps one of those present when he was made "underboss" had talked. RANDACCIO then laughed and stated, "You don't expect me to believe that, do you?"

RANDACCIO was asked if he knew STEVE MAGADDINO. He replied in the affirmative, stating he had known STEVE MAGADDINO for approximately 40 years, having met him in Buffalo, New York. He said that until four months ago, he visited MAGADDINO frequently at Lewiston and Niagara Falls, New York. He denied that he has seen MAGADDINO during the last four months.

He was asked if he knows anyone else living on Dana Drive in Lewiston, New York. He replied that he knew quite a few people who live on Dana Drive, including VINCENT A. SCRO and JAMES V. LA DUCA. He cursed both SCRO and LA DUCA and commented that LA DUCA was only a "broken down bus driver" before he married STEVE MAGADDINO's daughter. He then continued cursing both LA DUCA and SCRO in the most obscene terms.

RANDACCIO then commented that he is guilty of nothing more than being a common gambler. He said that he loves to take part in all types of betting activities, but nothing more. He said that he feels complete disgust for anyone involved in narcotics and said he would never stoop that low.

RANDACCIO was asked if he had ever met VITO AGUECI. His facial expression abruptly changed, and he replied that he had not.

RANDACCIO was asked if he has any knowledge concerning the murder of CHARLES GERASS. He replied that there were numerous individuals in Buffalo who would have liked to kill GERASS and that any of these individuals could have been the one who committed the murder.

RANDACCIO volunteered that his brother, VICTOR RANDACCIO, was involved in an altercation with GERASS at the Glen Casino Night Club in Buffalo, New York, about three or four years ago. He said that GERASS had made improper advances to VICTOR's wife and that as a result of this, several blows had been struck between them before the fight was broken up. RANDACCIO said, however, that after this occurrence, GERASS and his brother had shaken hands, resolving the situation.



RANDACCIO was then asked if he had ordered GERASS killed. He replied that he knew nothing concerning the murder of GERASS, and this is not the way in which he settled his disputes.

RANDACCIO then commented that just because he was talking to the interviewing Agent, he was not going to "cop out" to anything.

RANDACCIO said that it was his opinion that FBI Agents had been following him for the past three or four months. He said that this should prove to the FBI that he is not involved in any illegal activities since he has not left the Buffalo area during this period.

During the above interview, two individuals, seeing RANDACCIO, approached the Bureau car and exchanged greetings with RANDACCIO. Both of these individuals, one of whom was introduced to the interviewing Agent as JOE NASCA, were asked by RANDACCIO to tell the interviewing Agent if RANDACCIO was a man of good character and reputation. Both of these individuals expounded that RANDACCIO was a good family man, and a legitimate businessman and said that they would be glad to be character witnesses for him at any time.

After the above two individuals departed, RANDACCIO asked the interviewing Agent if the interviewing Agent believed all that he had heard concerning RANDACCIO. The interviewing Agent commented that "Where there's smoke, there's usually fire." RANDACCIO then laughed and said that he considered himself to be the black sheep of his family. RANDACCIO volunteered that he came from a very good family and that his father was formerly a Professor at the University of Palermo.

The interview was thereafter terminated on amiable terms and RANDACCIO commenting that he would have no objections to talking to the interviewing Agent at a future time.

GAMBLING ACTIVITIES

It was previously reported that RANDACCIO was receiving a cut from sponsoring junket flights to gambling casinos in London, England, and that JOEY DE JOHN, a former professional fighter had some connection with the flights.

On July 14, 1967, BU T-6 advised that he had no knowledge that JOEY DE JOHN is connected in any way with gambling junkets from New York to London, England.

Confidential informants and local law representatives have advised the Albany Office within the last few months that DE JOHN is literally living the life of a bum. He does not have any funds and no means of support. DE JOHN continues to associate with local gamblers, but is unable to participate to any degree in local card and dice games. On numerous occasions he has slept on tables in various card rooms due to his lack of funds to rent a room.

On June 30, 1967, RANDACCIO was observed with other LCN members at Rinaldo's Three O'Clock Club, 955 Niagara Street, Buffalo. At this time a vehicle bearing Ohio license BM 471 was observed parked on the sidewalk in front of RANDACCIO's. The driver of the car was not observed.

"Magaddino Family"

A group of racketeers in the Niagara Falls-Buffalo area who received their instructions from Steve Magaddino, their leader.

The following reference in the main file of Charles Monazym contains considerable information pertaining to the Umberto Randaccia, father of Fred Randaccia, family which resided at 157 Auburn Ave., Buffalo, NY. Several neighbors were contacted regarding the appearance of Monazym and other individuals at the Randaccia residence with negative results. Fred Randaccia had been arrested on 5-26-30 on charge of Assault, First Degree, convicted on 9-11-30 and sentenced on 9-26-30 to an indeterminate term in the Elmira, NY Reformatory. On 2-4-38 his parole from the Elmira Reformatory was revoked and Randaccia was returned to the Reformatory. He had been characterized as "Public Enemy Number One" in Buffalo. During his incarceration his wife and son were on relief received from the county.

The following references in the file captioned "Mafia" contain information pertaining to the criminal activities of Frederick Gabriel Randaccio, which consisted of gambling and bookmaking, in the Buffalo, NY, area from approximately January, 1954 to April, 1959. No specific evidence had been established to prove that the Mafia had penetrated the criminal syndicate led by Steve Magaddino in the Niagara Falls and Buffalo areas with Randaccio being his top man in Buffalo, handling his gambling interests since March, 1958. Randaccio, as well as other Italian hoodlums in the Buffalo area, utilized the general fear among the criminal element of the Mafia to their own advantage, and found it convenient in their dealings with the criminal element, particularly gamblers of Jewish extraction, to let the word get around that they had Mafia connections. Biographical and background data on Randaccio was set out.

On December 11, 1967, he was sentenced by United States District Judge JOHN O. HENDERSON, Buffalo, to 20 years on count one of the indict-ment and 5 years on count two of the indictment previously returned, sentences to run concurrently.

Immediately following his conviction on November 21, 1967, Judge HENDERSON revoked bail



for the subject and remanded him to custody of the United States Marshal.

On January 8, 1968, Deputy United States Marshal New York, advised that RANDACCIO is incarcerated in the United States Penitentiary at Terre Haute, Indiana.

On September 18, 1967, BU T-1 advised he had learned that several weeks before, RANDACCIO, PASQUALE NATARELLI, BENNY SPANO, SALVATORE BONITO, and NICHOLAS MAURO had met and discussed the publishing of a football pool card. RANDACCIO commented that he wanted 50 per cent of the operation. It appeared to the informant that RANDACCIO was attempting to take over all of the pool card operations existing in Buffalo.

On August 15, 1967, BU T-2 advised that based upon conversations with RANDACCIO, it was his opinion that RANDACCIO expected to be convicted on the charges presently outstanding against him in United States District Court, Buffalo, and that this indictment had severely curtailed RANDACCIO's activities.

On September 22, 1967, BU T-2 advised that "The Arm" had taken over control of football pool tickets in the Buffalo area. According to the informant, there were two tickets being printed and distributed in Buffalo; one by _____ and the other by _____ According to the informant, _____ and ____ set up the line and distributed these pool tickets themselves, but they shared the winnings with "The Arm" through RANDACCIO and NATARELLI.

As the Bureau is aware from my previous communications, RANDACCIO's attorneys, pursuant to the mandate of the U. S. Supreme Court, have been attempting to obtain either a reversal of RANDACCIO's conviction or a new trial. RANDACCIO was convicted in 1967 as a result of testimony in USDC, Buffalo, by the Buffalo "Task Force," and most of the evidence consisted of the testimony of the Task Force's informant,

The RANDACCIO conviction was the first case in which the Task Force received any notoriety and it was on the basis of this conviction that the entire concept of the Task Force achieved credibility.

As the Bureau is aware, this conviction of RANDACCIO has been under constant attack by defense attorneys, first of all on the basis of a lack of substantive jurisdiction under the Hobbs Act, and secondly, because of alleged error on the part of the trial court in not permitting the introduction of testimony from FBI electronic eavesdropping which tends to prove an alibi for RANDACCIO.
