CONTEMPT OF ST. LOUIS FEDERAL GRAND JURY

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SAC Earl Milnes, St. Louis, called to advise that a Bureau Agent and a former Agent have been subpoensed by the Defense Attorney for Frank "Buster" Wortman, St. Louis hoodlum who has filed a motion to vacate his conviction for contempt before the St. Louis Grand Jury inquiring into racketeering. The first subpoena has been received by and calls for his appearance in the U. S. District Court 10:00 a.m., Tuesday. March 9. The second subpoena has been served on former Agent! and instructs what he appear at the same time. Both subpoenas were issued on behalf of wortman by Defense Attorney Morris Shenker.

Special Assistant to the Attorney General, Max Goldschein, who is at St. Louis directing the presentation of the witnesses before the St. Louis Grand Jury, has been advised of the issuance of these subpoenas. Goldschein stated that it is his opinion that Wortman's attorneys are attempting to prove that Wortman was under FBI investigation and that was the reason why he refused to testify before the Tederal Grand Jury. Agent has never investigated Wortman but has investigated certain labor racketeering cases in the St. Louis Former Agent has never investigated Wortman as such but made some inquiries concerning Wortman in the anti-racketeering investigation which he conducted when he was a Bureau employee.

Goldschein states that he will appear in Federal court tomorrow to represent Agent and former Agent and and former Agent attempt to have the motion to vacate the contempt of Wortman set over in view of the fact that Wortman has already entered a stay of execution by filing a petition with the U. S. Supreme Court in the alternative for a supersedeas bond or in the alternative for admission to bail pending appeal in the U. S. Court of Appeals for the 8th Circuit. His petition is addressed to the Honorable Tom C. Clark, Associate Justice of the U. S. Supreme Court.

Goldschein stated that if the court will not set over the defendant's motion and the Agents are called upon to testify, Department Order 3229 relating to the confidential nature of the Bureau's files will be invoked.



ACTION TAKEN:

The above facts were immediately related to Mr. Walter Yeagley in Mr. Olney's office who concurred in Goldschein's proposed handling of the subpoenas. Mr. Milnes was telephonically advised of the Department's approval for the handling of this matter. Kilnes was further instructed to send a complete teletype with the full facts on this matter to the Bureau tonight and to follow the outcome and let the Bureau know the results tomorrow.

SYNOPSIS

February 10, 1954, 31 subpoenas were issued to St. Louis hoodlum to appear before Federal Grand Jury looking into racketeering in St. Louis. Frank "Buster" Wortman was one of the 31 individuals to whom a subjoens wer issued.

On February 24, 1954, Wortman was cited for contempt by U. S. District Court Judge George H. Moore for refusal to answer a question before the Pederal Grand Jury. Wortman was incarcerated in the St. Louis city Jail where he is at the present time.

On February 27, 1954, the ". S. Court of Appeals for the 8th circuit, denied a motion on behalf of Wortman for stay of execution and denied application for bail.

On March 3, 1954, Wortman's attorney filed a motion before Judge Hoore seeking to vacate Hoore's order and Hoore set a hearing on the motion for March 9, 1954.

Attorney Shenker filed a petition before the U. S. Supreme Court in behalf of Wortman for a stay of execution or in the alternative for supersedeas bond or in the alternative for admission to bail pending an appeal. This petition was denied by the U. S. Supreme Court, 3-29-54.

on March 8, 1954, SA and former SA were subpoensed to appear in Federal Court. The hearing was postponed. and former SA's and and also SAC Milnes was to show the wortman was being investigated by the FBI. However, it will be noted that wortman was never investigated as a subject by the FBI but during the Anti-Packete ring case, investigated in 1953 (copies duly furnished to the Department), Edward J. Hare was interviewed by SA after Hare's appearance before the Federal Grand Jury. During the course of this interview, Hare admitted that Frank "Buster" Wortman was part owner of the Red Rooster Club, St. Louis Missouri, with him (Hare). Other questions were asked Hare concerning Wortman in regard to the case.

Therefore, it is further apparent that if the FBI were investigating Wortman, his attorney would attempt to show that this was justification for his refusal to answer questions propounded to him by the Federal Grand Jury at St. Louis. However, it should be further noted that the interview of Hare, whereby Wortman's name came up, was conducted during the Summer of 1953, whereas Wortman was cited for contempt on February 24, 1954.

At 9:38 A.M., April 1, 1954, SAC Milnes was telephonically contacted and instructed that he must personally make sure that Goldschein is in possession of all of the pertinent data concerning the Bureau's interview with Hare; that he must personally go over the affidavit which would be submitted by Agent to insure that a statement of own knowledge and personal activities is contained therein and in no way represents a statement on behalf of the St. Louis Division or the FBI as a whole; and that Milnes should submit to the Bureau promptly a teletype concerning the outcome of this matter.

Remorandum to Mr. Posen

In the afternoon of April 1, 1954, St. Louis advised that there will be no hearing on this matter April 1 and that Mr. Goldschein will file a motion on April 2, 1954, before Judge Moore seeking dismissal of the motion filed on behalf of Wortman to vacate the court order citing him for contempt. Coloschein will attach to his motion the affidavits provided by SACCOUNT and Assistant U. S. Attorney Robert Tucker. Goldschein believes that the court will take the matter under advisement. DETAILS

On February 10. 1954, the U. S. Attorney's Office at St. Louis, Missouri, issued 31 subpoenss to St. Louis hoodlums to appear before the Federal Grand Jury on February 15, 1954. The Federal Grand Jury is looking into the racketeering situation in St. Louis. Wortman was one of the 31 individuals to whom a subpoena was issued.

On February 24, 1954, Wortman appeared before the Federal Grand Jury at St. Louis, and when asked to give his name he complied; however, he refused to furnish his home address. Wortman was then ordered to furnish this information to the Federal Grand Jury by Federal District Court Judge George H. Moore. Wortman refused whereupon in the custody of the U. S. Marshal. Wortman was taken to the St. Louis City Jail where he is presently incarcerated.

On February 27, 1954, U. S. Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit, St. Louis, Missouri, denied a motion made on behalf of Wortman for a stay of execution, and denied application for bail.

On March 3, 1952, Mortmen's at orney, orris Shenker, filed a motion before Judge hours seeking to vacate Moore's order and Moore set a houring on the motion for Larch 9, 1954.

We were advised on Feron 4, 1954, by SAAG Max Goldschein hardling this matter in St. Louis, that Shenker filed a petition before the U. S. Supreme Court, for a stay of execution or in the alternative for a supersedeas bond or in the alternative for admission to bail pending an appeal. On March 29, 1954, St. Louis advised that Justice Tom Clark of the U. S. Supreme Court denied the motion of Wortman, and that Justice Black of the U. S. Supreme Court on the same date denied the motion.

on March 8, 1954, a subpoena was received by SA and former SA of our St. Louis Division directing their appearance in Federal Court on behalf of the defence of Wortman. The hearing was postponed. On March 10, 1954, former SA received a subpoena to appear in the St. Louis Federal Court concerning the Wortman hearing on behalf of the defendant Wortman.

on March 10, 1954, SA received a second subpoena to engeat in the state fourt and produce "all records or manoranda of your interview with Edward J. Hare in or about July of 1953." It will be noted that the interview with Hare was conducted by former SA at St. Louis, Missouri, and is incorporated in the report of SA dated August 24, 1953, entitled, et al - Anti-Packeteering; Obstruction of Justice; Perjury; Contempt of Court; Labor Management Relations Act, 1947; Mickback Packet Act; FAG." A copy of this report was duly furnished to the Department.

On March 10, 1954, SAC Milnes of St. Louis received a subpoena duces tecum requiring his production of "all records pertaining to the arrest, conviction and fingerprinting of Frank Wortman," in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Missouri.

advised that the Agents involved in this proceeding should not testify and that they should be represented by Mr. Goldschein, who should stand on Departmental Order 3229. However, neither SAC Milnes, Agent nor former SA's and were called to testify since the hearing was postponed and the case was taken under advisement by Judge Moore.

On Parch 31, 1954, our St. Jouis Division advised by teletype that Attorney Shenker filed an affidavit, in behalf of Wortman, in the U. E. District Court, to support a notion to vacate a provious contempt order citing Wortman for failure to answer questions before the Federal arand Jury. This teletype further states hat as one of the means of counteracting the efforts of Attorney Shenker, Mr. Goldschein desires to have an affidavit submitted by SA in which he states: (1) That Agent has no notes, records or memoranda concerning his having interviewed Edward J. Hare in or about July, 1953, and that Agent has never interviewed Hare.

At 9:38 a.m. April 1, 1954, SAC Milnes was telephonically contacted concerning this matter and he was instructed that he must personally make sure that Goldschein is in possession of all of the pertinent data concerning the Fureau's interview with Hare; that he must personally go over the affidavit which would be submitted by agent to insure that only a statement of own knowledge and personal activities is contained therein and in no way represents a statement on behalf of the St. Louis Division or the FBI as a whole; and that hilnes should submit a teletype to the Bureau promptly concerning the outcome of this matter.

The recalling of Mary Portell, who is held in the St. Louis jail for contempt of court for refugil to answer questions before the juny in December, looms as a possibility before the jury completes its wilk this week. Maag today said he is considering recalling the woman on Thursday.

She was committed to jail by Federal Judge William Juergens on Dec. 6 after she persisted in her refusal to answer questions on the grounds of possible selfincrimination. She is a close friend of Barney Barts, a Wortman associate sought as a witness in the probe. A motion for bail pending an appeal, filed by her attorney Morris Shenker, St. Louis criminal lawyer, was denied by the U.S. Supreme Court last Drc. 29.

The probe, which began as an inquiry into Wortman's income tax status, later developed into inquiry into all phases of his ported business interests and fairs. Wortman is under subpella but so far has not been called as a witness, Magin testified last At gust and it was this testimony which resulted in three of the counts of the indictment against him. These counts charge perjury and the fourth alleges he made false statements to Internal Revenue Service agents. Disposition is pending.

Magin Has 'Island'

Indications are that one phase of the jury's probe deals with construction on Magin's "moated" island near Collinsville. The Jourrial learned that bricklayers from St. Louis Local 1 "donated" brick work on the buldings without clearing with Local 30 here. Local 1 officials denied knowledge of the volunteer work. Local 30 officials said an investigation would be made and possible courses of action discussed. No result of the investigation has been announced.

Magin has denied reports that the buildings are being constructed for Wortman as a gambling casino. Magin said he purchaset the site and is building a clubhouse and remedon area for son and his friends.



It is additionally redized in connection with this report that additional investigation may indicate a number of separate violations perpetrated by the subjects or by additional subjects who might be associates of WORTMAN. In that instance

separate substantive case files will be opened reflecting individual investigations concerning each violation and/or victim. For the purposes of a review of this report by the United States Attorney and the Anti-Trust Division, however, no attempt has been made to separate each possible potential violation.

It is noted no extensive information is set forth in this report concerning the Plaza Amusement Company and its related companies nor of the subjects. It is pointed out that the United States Attorney's Office, Eastern District of Illinois, East St. Louis, has extensive information in this regard as a result of the Internal Revenue Service investigation.



This investigation was instituted to determine whether the expansion of the LEONARD WORTMAN in the coin machine industry in Southern Illinois constituted a violation of Federal statutes.

The following is a brief summary of FRANK LEONARD

FRANK LEONARD WORTMAN, Aka "Buster"

FRANK LEONARD WORTMAN was born December 4, 1904 at East St. Louis, Illinois and lived in the St. Louis, Missouri and East St. Louis, Illinois area practically all his life.

On September 25, 1934, he was sentenced to a ten year term on a charge of assault of a Federal officer which is his only felony conviction. He has had numerous arrests in the St. Louis, Missouri area between the years, 1926 - 1953, for charges of auto theft, robbery, concealed weapons and investigation.

He was released from Leavenworth Federal Penitentiary in 1941. According to newspaper publicity WORTMAN has become one of the leading gamblers and racketeers in the St. Clair - Madison County, Illinois area, virtually dominating gambling activities in these two counties. He has also, according to this publicity, significant influence in the underworld in the St. Louis, Missouri, area.

According to newspaper sources, WORTMAN has a group commonly referred to as WORTMAN and Associates which includes his principal lieutenant, ELMER SYLVESTER DOWLING, FBI Number 1644966.

FRANK WORTMAN has FBI Number 739186. He is stated to presently reside at a \$250,000.00 estate, surrounded by a moat, located in the Bethel School District, Madison County, Illinois, southwest of Collinsville, Illinois.

of FRANK LEONARD WORTMAN and various of his associates; that WORTMAN as well as many of his associates are presently under indictment in the Eastern District of Illinois, and, in fact, a number of the associates have been convicted in the recent past in the Eastern District of Illinois for various Internal Revenue law and income tax violations and allied charges. The information concerning this action has been furnished to the Bureau in report form in case entitled "FRANK LEONARD WORTMAN, aka; ET AL", Bufile 92-2810, Springfield file 92-112. The press of St. Louis, Missouri, and East St. Louis, Illinois, area on March 30, 1960, carried articles regarding WORTMAN'S association with the STEPHEN GORMAN Bricklaying Company of St. Louis, Missouri, and also WORTMAN's alleged influence with the Bricklayers Union in St. Louis, Missouri. The press has indicated that the McClellan Committee has issued a report critizing WORTMAN's connection and association with the Bricklayers Union and according to the press the Federal Grand Jury is to be called in St. Louis, Missouri, in the near future to look into this matter further and that it is anticipated WORTMAN will be called as a witness.




