POELKER (a former FBI Agent). This article stated that eighteen of the fifty cigarette machines in the city buildings are cwied by the W-R Cigarette Company.

The St. Louis and East St. Louis press, during August 1959, has carried numerous articles regarding the awarding of subcontracts to the Stephen Gorman Brick Laying Company of St. Louis, in connection with the construction of multi-million dollar federal office and federal records center buildings in St. Louis, Missouri. The press has stated that Senator JOHN L. MC CIELLAN of Arkansas has ordered an investigation into the awarding of the contracts.

Taverns

There has been set out previously information indicating WORTMANs and DOWLING, through the Plaza Amusement Company, have gained control or have financially supported various taverns, concessions and similar establishments. By communication dated August 3, 1959, the St. Louis Office advised that information was developed that FRANK WORTMAN had purchased the "Chi Chi" Room, however, that no change in the management was made.

Tt is noted that the Cleo Club operated by CRISOS is a well known hangeut of hoodlums and members of the WORTMAN gang and that this was previously one of the gambling casino locations operated by the WORTMANs for years.

F. PLACES OF AMUSEMENT AND HANGOUTS

There is no change under this subheading.

The principal operations of FRANK WORTMAN continue to be at the Paddock Lounge, East St. Louis, Illinois b20 b10

Other hangouts for various members of the WORTMAN gang and lesser members of the group include Bush's Steak House, the Playdium Club, both in downtown East St. Louis, and the Candlelight Tavern and the Club Club on Gillinaville Read, near East St. Louis.

I. COURT, GRAND JURY AND CRIMINAL COURT ACTIONS

As was previously set out, THOMAS D. CLANCY, JAMES A. PRINDABLE and DONALD KASTNER were convicted in United States District Court, East St. Louis, Illinois, May 15, 1959, for the North Sales Operation, a handbook establishment. The conviction was for internal revenue violations and furnishing Inlies abelements to internal revenue agents. These individuals all were given penitentiary sentences and they all have filed appeals. However, PRINDABLE has been the only one who elected to start serving his penitentiary sentence.

FRANK WORTMAN, ROPERT SHEER and THOMAS J. JACKSON were found gilty in United States District Court, East St. Louis, Illinois, for violation of internal revenue laws and furnishing faise information to internal revenue agents. The above individuals previously operated the B&F Distributing Company, a sering news wire service in East St. Louis. FOSTER and SHEER were sentenced, by Federal Judge VILLIAM G. JURRGENS, to five years in prison and fined \$5,000 esch. Asckson was sentenced to one year in prison and placed on probation for five years. FOSTER and SHEER were represented by St. Louis criminal attorney MCREIS SHENKER, and JACKSON was represented by TECHAS CODONNEL of East St. Louis, Illinois. All of these individuals have filed appeals.

On July 10, 1959, GEORGE STOFFEY was found galling in United States District Court, Hast St. Louis, Illinois, fur violating wagering haws and making false statements to historial revenue agents. His indictment was an outgrowth of WORTMAN'S investigation of the Internal Revenue Service and the Federal Grand Jury, Eastern District of Illinois over the past years. STOFFEY has also been sentenced to serve five years and pay a \$5,000 fine. STOFFEY was represented by East St. Louis absorber REX CARR. He has also filed an appeal.

On May 12, 1959, JOSEPH W. "JOE" JANKO, an associate of WORTMAN and employee, was convicted in United States District Court, St. Louis, Missouri, for income tax evasion. This was the second trial as the previous conviction had been set aside. On June 5, 1959, JANKO was sentenced to ten years in prison by United States District Judge RANDOLPH H. WEBER, St. Louis, Missouri.



Vending and Coin Machine Operations

During September of 1959, the St. Louis press carried extensive newspaper articles regarding cigerette machines of the W-R Cigarette Company of St. Louis, Missouri, that were to be removed from various St. Louis city buildings. Articles indicated that twenty of these machines were to be removed and that JAMES B. HINES was the Secretary-Treasurer of the Rite-Way Cigarette Sales Company and that W-R was an alleged subsidiary of Rite-Way distributors. The articles further stated that Plaza Amusement Company owned seventy-five shares of Rite-Way and that "BUSTER" WORTMAN was a director of Plaza and EDWARD "TED" WORTMAN was President and ELMER "DUTCH" DOWLING was Secretary-Treasurer of the Company.







During the course of MAGIN'S trial extensive publicity was given to the matter and extensive reporting of incomes "of WORTMAN and his associates from gambling activities" was publicized. This press reflected that from 1951 to 1953 FRANK WORTMAN reported an income of \$81,000 from an illegal gambling enterprises, including five dice games and one policy operation. WILLIAM J. STAILEY was the accountant for the various gambling operations and also for the Paddock Liquor Company. SAM MAGIN is presently on appeal bond and various motions have been filed in Federal Court and are awaiting disposition at this time in so far as the court's ruling is concerned regarding motion for acquittal or for a new trial. In the second count of this indictment, ELMER DOWLING was charged with evading taxes for the years 1953, 1954, and 1955. In the third count, FRANK WORTMAN, ELMER EDWARD WORTMAN, GEORGE FRANK, GREGORY MOORE, and SAM MAGIN were charged with conspiracy in connection with the tax violations.

In the second indictment of three counts, SAM MaGIN was charged with tax evasion for the years 1955, 1956, and 1957.



In view of indictments against the WORTMANS and DOWLING, and also in view of the various convictions and appeals of other members of the WORTMAN organization, this matter is being placed in a pending inactive status at this time. It is pointed out that the indictments and various convictions of WORTMANs and DOWLING and other associates resulted from income tax and internal revenue violations; motions filed by the WORTMANs and DOWLING at present have claimed prejudice against them because of extensive comments of the press. It would appear that possibly open and active investigation by the FBI at the present time may result in criticism and further claim by these individuals of prejudice, intimidation and pressure.

Through established informants the activities of these individuals will be followed and the Bureau will be advised of pertinent developments. The prosecutive action of these individuals will also be followed through regular contacts with the United States Attorney's Office at East St. Louis in connection with other matters.

I. COURT AND GRAND JURY ACTION

Re CLAUS E. TIETGE

The "Belleville News Democrat" of Belleville, Illinois, on November 24, 1959, carried a news article

stating that CLAUS E. TIETGE previously sentenced to six months in jail for contempt of court during the previous trip 1 of SAM MAGIN in United States District Court in East St. Louis, Illinois, had been ordered released on \$10,000 bond on November 23, 1959, by United States Supreme Court. It is noted that TIETGE pleaded the Fifth Amendment 48 times during the above mentioned trial and drew the senctence from United States District Judge WILLIAM G. JUERGENS who refused to allow TIETGE released on bail; the above United States Supreme Court order was based on an appeal regarding whether TIETGE could be released on bond or not. It is noted that the contempt order is also under appeal.

RES SAM WAGIN

On November 24, 1959, SAN MAGIN, a close associate of the WORTMANs and DOWLING was sentenced in United States District Court, at East St. Louis, Illinois, to three years in prison and fixed \$2,000 in costs as a result of his conviction on two counts of perjury in United States District Court, East St. Louis, on October 2, 1959. MAGIN has appealed and has been released on appeal bond. It is noted the perjury conviction of MAGIN resulted from charges that MAGIN lied before a Federal Grand Jury when he deined any business connections with ELMER "DUTCH" DOWLING and also that he had no business connections with FRANK WORTMAN.





RES FRANK LECNARD WORTMAN, TED WORTMAN, JR. ELMER SLIVESTER DOWLING, SAM MAGIN, GREGORY "RED" MOORE and GEORGE FRANK.

On January 11, 1960, the above mentioned individuals were indicted by the Federal Grand Jury, Eastern District of Illinois, at East St. Louis, Illinois, for a violation of income tax and various internal revenue laws. In one indictment on the first count which FRANK LEONARD WORTMAN was charged with tax evasion for the years 1953, 1954 and 1955, in the second count of this indictment ELMER SYLVESTER DOWLING was charged with tax evasion for the same years; in the third count all six of the above named individuals were charged with conspiracy in connection with tax violations.

In a second indictment of three counts SAN MAGIN was indicted for tax evasion for the years 1955, 1956 and 1957. All of the above individuals have been released on bond. The bond for FRANK WORTMAN and ELMER DOWLING was set at \$30,000 each and the bond for the other four individuals was set at \$10,000 each.

RAY FOREMAN a former Assistant United States

AUSTIN LEWIS, an attorney of Granite City and former State's Attorney of Madison County, Illinois, is representing GEORGE FRANK;

NORMAN LONDON, a criminal attorney and former associate of SHENKER of St. Louis, Missouri, is representing GREGORY "RED" MOORE and



The only known conviction for a felony on the part of WORTMAN is in connection with the assault on a Federal agent wherein WORTMAN was convicted on a trial in U.S. District Court, Springfield, Illinois, and was sentenced to serve ten years in the federal penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas, on June 25, 1934.

WORTMAN was arrested by the United States Marshal, St. Louis, Missouri, February 24, 1954, for contempt of court charge. According to the St. Louis and East St. Louis area press, WORTMAN was called before a Federal Grand Jury investigating labor racketeering in the St. Louis area and at the Grand Jury, WORTMAN refused to give the Grand Jury his address. As a result of this action, Judge MOORE ordered WORTMAN to jail and was held for contempt of court. According to the article, WORTMAN refused to give his address, stating that his personal life and business was under investigation by the Internal Revenue and that he would not answer the question because the answer might incriminate him. As a result of this, WORTMAN remained in jail until April 6, 1954. The press reported that while in jail, WORTMAN ordered special meals and paid for vafious meals and cigarettes and other luxuries for the prisoners in the city jail.





A newspaper article appearing in the St. Louis *Post Dispatch* in 1945, indicated that Sergeant ELMER DOWLING was arrested on May 20, 1945, in St. Louis, Missouri, by the St. Louis, Missouri Police Department. According to this article, DOWLING was described as a Sergeant, who had received a furlough from the Army the previous Friday after his liberation from a prison camp. He was arrested for careless driving, resisiting arrest, driving



while intoxicated, carrying concealed meapons, and passing three stop signs. DOWLING was in uniform at the time of his arrest and he was driving a late model Cadillac, with a license issued to FRANK "BUSTER" WORTMAN, East St. Louis gangster. According to this article, a leaded automatic pistol was found in a jacket in the back seat of the car when DOWLING was arrested.

On November 28, 1938, a complaint was filed before the United States Commissioner at St. Louis, Missouri, charging DOWLING with a violation with the Federal Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution Statute, in that DOWLING, in November, 1938, had fled from the State of Missouri to avoid prosecution for assault with a dangerous weapon. He was alleged to have assaulted LOUIS LEE BAKER on November 18, 1938. The latter was a Negro witness in the ISADORE LONDE bombing case in St. Louis, Missouri, wherein LONDE was facing trial for the bombing of the Howard's Cleaning Shop in St. Louis. DOWLING was arrested January 13, 1940, in St. Louis, and the same year was tried in Circuit Court, St. Louis County for assault with a dangerous weapon, at which time he was found guilty of assault with intent to kill with malicious afterthought and was sentenced to thirty years in the Missouri State Penitentiary. DOWLING appealed; was unable to make \$30,000 bond; and was incarcerated in the Missouri State Penitentiary.

On September 25, 1941, the Supreme Court of the State of Missouri, heard DOWLING's appeal and remanded the decision of the trial court, and he was removed to the St. Louis County Jail at Clayton, Missouri, to await a new trial.

On May 18, 1942, DOWLING was retried in St. Louis County, and the jury returned a verdict of not guilty on May 21, 1942, and DOWLING was discharged.



FRANK LEONARD WORTMAN, ELMER SYLVESTER DOWLING and EDWARD WORTMAN, JR. are considered the three principal members of the organization referred to as the Wortman Gang, Wortman and Associates or the Wortman Organization. These three individuals, over the years, have accumulated a large number of associates and contacts, covering not only the East St. Louis, Illinois and St. Louis, Missouri areas but also in their parts of the country. The associates and contacts of these three individuals vary from common thieves and exconvicts to alleged reputable businessmen and public officials. Many of the associates and contacts are individuals who have, at one time or another, been employed or on the payroll of the Wortman organization in various legal and illegal enterprises. Many of these individuals are exconvicts with lengthy criminal records and individuals who have served substantial prison sentences for serious offenses.



Associates and Contacts Among Public Officials

ORVILLE HODGE, former Auditor of the State of Illinois, presently serving a sentence in Illinois State Penitentiary, Menard, Illinois, as a result of his conviction during the so-called "Hodge Scandals" in Illinois. The press, in the St. Louis metropolitan area during the scandals, gave extensive publicity to association between HODGE and FRANK WORTMAN, indicating WORTMAN had paid HODGE some \$200,000 as campaign contributions so that HODGE would arrange for WORTMAN to operate his gambling cassinos in the Illinois east-side area. HODGE has steadfastly denied any such association but did acknowledge he was a personal friend of TOM BERRY, a WORTMAN associate. During the course of the HODGE investigation, it was brought out that EDWARD EPPING, convicted with HODGE, was associated with FRED MERSINGER in the operation of an accounting firm in East St. Louis.

It is noted in 1956 the East St. Louis Journal reported an incident when the police raided a race wire service operated by the Wortman arganization in East St. Louis and subsequently the charge was dismissed on the grounds the search warrant used by the police was faulty. BEEBE at the time made a statement to the pess that the evidence found by the police did not mean anything because many persons used the address where the raid occurred. The East St. Louis, Illinois and St. Louis, Missouri press have, over the years, commented on numerous occasions of the lax law enforcement by the East St. Louis police insofar as the Wortman gang is concerned and the fact that the police make no arrests or investigation regarding members of the Wortman organization.





D. <u>CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES</u>

Over the past years the press of the metropolitan area of St. Louis, and other sources, have furnished information that BUSTER NORTHAN is considered to be the biggest racketeer and hoodlum in the metropolitan St. Louis area. In this connection, it is pointed out that a Federal Grand Jury has been investigating FORTHAN and associates activities in the Eastern District of Illinois, since September, 1956.

The press of metropolitan St. Louis area for years has carried detailed articles regarding WORTMAN and associates and has labeled him as the downstate Illinois lieutenant of the old CAPONE gang and has also labeled him a leader of the EGAN Gang, formerly operating in St. Louis.


In connection with WORTMAN's association with the old CAPONE gang, the press has frequently printed articles stating that a halfsister of WORTMAN, one RUTH VIRGINIA WORTMAN, was allegedly arrested in Kennett, Missouri, in 1947, and charged with driving a stolen car across the state line. Miss WORTMAN, a Chicago resident, teld authorities in Kennett that she berrowed the car from BALPH CAPONE, a brother of AL CAPONE, to drive to the funeral of CARL SHELTON, who was murdered at Fairfield, Illinois, on October 28, and continued her trip to Missouri to visit friends. This woman allegedly explained that CARL SHELTON was her godfather. In further aligning WORTMAN with the CAPONE Gang, the press has frequently reported that after MONROE "BLACKIE" ARMES was killed in gangland style December 13, 1944, that WORTHAN then took over as downstate Illinois lieutenant of the CAPONE Gang. It is noted that ARMES was the one who was convicted with WORTMAN in Federal Court at Springfield in 1934. WORTHAN in press accounts is further linked with the CAPONE Gang as the result of the operation of the Trans-American News Publishing Company in St. Clair County in 1946. This organization allegedly attempted to muscle in on the Continental Press Service, which was operated by JAMES M. RAGEN, of St. Louis, and the Pioneer News Agency in St. Louis, headed by PAUL "BEY" BROWN and CLARENCE "GULLEY" OWENS. The press

reports the Continental Press had a nationwide monopoly on horse race results at this time and the Pioneer Agency served the St. Louis area with results after obtaining them from Continental in Chicago. The Trans-American Agency also became known as the Beliable News Agency and in 1956, was incorporated with GOBDON FOSTER as one of the incorporators. The press has pointed out that by 1943, the Beliable Agency had split the operators of Pioneer and apparently had a monopoly in the field. The press reports that in the late 1940s and 1950, this Pioneer-Beliable organization were doing a handbook business of a million dollars per year. It is noted that most of the above information was brought out during the course of the Kefauver Committee investigations in the St. Louis area in about 1950.

other information from the metropolitan St. Louis by area press reflects that WORTMAN and associates also operated an extensive policy business in the metropolitan St. Louis area, which grossed millions of dollars of business each year; also in operation were a number of gambling casinos, particularly in St. Clair and Madison Counties, Illinois.

At the present time, the WORTMAN and Associates organization is primarily concerned with four illegal types of operations - (1) policy, (2) gambling (dice, cards, etc.) (3) bookmaking and (4) bingo.

The following publicity regarding gambling operations in St. Clair County, Illinois, the Evening Journal, East St. Louis, carried an editorial dated July 2, 1959, which is entitled, "Same Old Story" and reads as follows:

> *AND so, the gamblers make another bid for profit in St. Clair County.

"On top of disclosures of hoodlums doing a thriving business inside race tracks comes the exposure of a big bingo game at the old Shamrock Inn, just outside East St. Louis city limits. The operator hurriedly assures newspapermen that 'part' of the profits go to charity.

*The only 'charity' we have detected in this whole situation is the continued telerance of such goings-on by St. Clair County low-enforcement officials.

"Buster! -- and we do mean Wortman -- still rides high in these parts."


It is noted that during January, 1960, the "Evening Journal" of East St. Louis, Illinois, published numerous articles regarding the operations of the Checker Inn and commented that the State's Attorney JOHN J. HOBAN and Sheriff DAN RING of St. Clair County, Illinois, have made no effort to curb the gambling operation and when contacted by the press on one occasion Sheriff RING made the statement, "I've got more important things to do. I've told you all I am going to say."


In connection with the coin machine business, the press of St. Louis and East St. Louis. in December 1957, have reported the alleged purchase of the W-R Cigarette Company of St. Louis, Missouri, by BUSTER WORTMAN and his brother, TED WORTMAN. The press reported that this cigarette company was previously operated by ROBERT BROWN of St. Louis, who was mysteriously slain in that city January 24, 1956. Subsequent to BROWN's slaying, the control of his company went to the hands of the

City of St. Louis alderman, A. BARNET MUELLER. MUELLER, according to the press, was reported to be a silent partner of BROWN in the cigarette business. The press reported that an estimated \$200,000 was placed on this particular transaction. The press has reported that there is apparently considerable friction between WORTMAN's purchase of the W-R Cigarette Company and the operation of other coin machine businessess in St. Louis, allegedly operated by gangsters JOHN VITALE, TONY GIARDANO, and ANTHONY LOPITARD.





United States Attorney RAEMER appeared before Federal Judge WILLIAM G. JUERGENS in United States District Court at East St. Louis, Illinois, on this same date, on an open hearing regarding the refusal of GORMAN to answer questions. The questions GORMAN refused to answer were stated by Mr. RAEMER in open court.

The questions asked of GORMAN related to his business association with WORTMANS, ELMER SYLVESTER DOWLING, or other WORTMAN associates; the interest that WORTMAN and associates had in GORMAN's business; the reason that numerous WORTMAN associates and contacts were on the payroll of Gorman Bricklaying Company when apparently not performing any work and the financial interest that WORTMAN and associates had in GORMAN's business and what influence they exerted in the actual operation of this business. The individuals listed as being on GORMAN's payroll, both in St. Louis and East St. Louis, include the following individuals:

"Moat" Property, Collingville, Illinois

The "Boys Club" or Moat Property, near Collinsville, Illinois, has been given considerable publicity of the St. Louis and E. St. Louis press over the past years. This property, allegedly in the name of SAN WAGIN, was reported to be a "Boys Club". From personal observation of agents it has been established that this contains a two-story brick building, which is built on a small man-made island, surrounded by a stream of water. The construction of this property went on for more than a year and





Agents ascertained that the records in the office of the Recorder of Madison County, reflect in Book 1602, on page 394, the record of a warranty deed filed June 1, 1955, wherein grantors WALTER A. SCHILLER and RUTH SCHILLER, his wife, conveyed to SAM MAGIN and ESTHER MAGIN, his wife, the following property:

West half (N) of southeast quarter (SE), northwest quarter (NN) and southwest quarter (SN) of the southwest quarter (SN) excepting a tract conveyed by LYDIA LEMEN, a widow to ALEXANDER SEEGER and LENA SEEGER, husband and wife, by W/D August 20, 1925, recorded in Book 553, Page 279, and the north half (N) of southwest quarter (SN), all in Section 36, Township 3 north, range 8, west of the 3rd PM.

The complete description is being retained in the files of this office. Conveyange excepted easements previously granted by the prior owner to a coal company and also right-of-way lease.

In addition to the above described property granted to MAGIN there is recorded in the Office of Recorded of Deeds for Madison County in Book 1636, Page 376, filed September 28, 1955, a conveyance by warranty deed from MARGARET MYER PAUSCH, a widow, and not remarried, of the city of Collinsville, and FLORENCE DIPPING TURNER and CARROLL TURNER, her husband, of Missouri, a small parcel of land approximately one acre in the southwest corner of the tract described above. 

From the above desciption, it would appear that the tract of land contains something more than 120 acres.

This instrument was acknowledged before a Notary Public, EDWARD G. HOLZWEG, on November 7, 1957, and was signed in the office of the Madison County Recorder on that date. 



On September 30, 1958, the records of the Recorder's Office, Madison County, Edwardsville, Illinois, were reviewed regarding the Prevue Club property. The complete legal description of this property has been obtained and is a part of this file; however, it is not being set out in detail in this report. Book 1783, page 132 in the above Recorder's office reflects transfer of title of this property on May 31, 1957, on which date the Illinois State Trust Company (First National Bank) of East St. Louis, as trustee under provisions of said deed to the trust company pursuant to trust agreement dated December 11, 1950, trust company #2667; conveyed to ALBERT WALTER of the City of St. Louis for \$1 and other considerations the Club Prevue, which is described in the deed as a tract of land described by metes and bounds. In Book 1880, page 151, there is recorded a warranty deed filed September 5, 1958, conveying the Club Prevue property from ALBERT WALTERS and CORRING WALTERS, his wife, of St. Louis, Missouri, for \$1 and other good and valuable considerations to JOHN W. HOLLEY of St. Louis, Missouri, the Prevue property. This deed is instrument number 143-2411 and was acknowledged before Notary Public BURNETT SCHWARTZ of St. Louis. The record shows that \$123.75 worth of internal revenue stamps had been affixed. This would reflect a sales price of \$112,375.00.



F. PLACES OF AMUSEMENT AND HANGOUTS FREQUENTED

The principal hangout for WORTMAN and DOWLING is the Paddock Loungeon 429 St. Louis Avenue in East St. Louis. Most of the business transactions are apparently handled here and whenever any of the WORTMAN crowd want to see either of these men, they come to the Paddock or make arrangements through this club to see WORTMAN or DOWLING.



Other hangouts for various members of the WORTMAN gang and lesser members of the group include Bush's Steak House, the Playdium Club, both in downtown East St. Louis, and the Candlelight Tavern and the Cleo Club on Collinsville Road, near East St. Louis.

G. TRAVEL

Information developed indicates that the WORTMANS and DOWLING very seldom leave the St. Louis and East Side Metropolitan area. Their travel is usually confined to their own automobiles, descriptions of which are furnished under the caption Personal History.

TED WORTMAN and DOWLING spend a considerable amount of time in St. Louis in connection with the coin machine operations. FRANK WORTMAN is regularly seen in the vicinity of the Paddock, although his visits to and contacts with associates at this place have been more limited since he moved to the Moat property.

During 1957, FRANK WORTMAN allegedly made about a two-week vacation trip to California with his children. When he was subpoenced to appear before the Senate Committee at Washington, D.C., July 3, 1958, FRANK WORTMAN together with SAM MAGIN and Attorney MORRIS SCHENKER flew to Washington on Trans-World Airlines.

Information was developed that FRANK WORTMAN took a vacation trip to Mackinac Island, Michigan, where he was supposed to stay until September 1, 1960. Information was developed, however, that he was to return on about August 25, 1960.

H. PERSONAL HABITS AND PECULIARITIES

Re: FRANK LEONARD WORTMAN

Information has been developed from numerous sources that FRANK WORTMAN drinks heavily both during the day and the night. When WORTMAN is drunk, he is alleged to get very mean with most anyone who tries to cross his path.

It is noted that WORTMAN very seldom leaves the Metropolitan area of St. Louis and East Side, and since moving to the Moat property, spends much of his time at his residence. He is not known to visit any of his subordinates and generally has them come to see him.

WORTMAN allegedly recently stated that he was extremely cautious concerning any visitors or unusual activity around his property and that he intended to install one or possibly two autronic eyes at turns in the road approaching his property which would signal inside the house upon the approach of an automobile.

Also during a general conversation, the subject of narcotics was brought up, and WORTMAN made statements that he wants nothing to do with narcotics. WORTMAN is allegedly deeply devoted to his children, and this is possibly one of the factors indicated for extreme dislike of the narcotics racket.

A number of sources have indicated that WORTMAN has a definite intention to remove his business activities from the Paddock Lounge to the Moat property in view of the exclusiveness of this property. It has been stated that there is a room at the Moat approximately 12 feet by 20 feet which will be converted into an office and the the Melman Fixture Company and the Duro-Chrome Corporation in St. Louis, Missouri, are supposedly drawing up plans for the new office.

Re: ELMER SYLVESTER DOWLING

DOWLING's activities are largely confined to the St. Louis and East Side area. He and his family seldom, if ever, have visitors at their residence other than a neighbor and associate, SAM MAGIN.

From DOWLING's activities, it appears that he is a hired lieutenant of FRANK WORTMAN and handles the overall liaison and contact with individuals on the second or lower level of the WORTMAN operation.

I. COURT. GRAND JURY. AND CRIMINAL COURT ACTIONS

THOMAS D. CLANCY, JAMES A. PRINDABLE, and DONALD KASTNER were convicted in United States District Court in East St. Louis, Illinois, May 15, 1959, for internal revenue violations and for furnishing false statements to internal revenue agents in connection with the North Sales Operation, a handbook establishment.

PRINDABLE was sentenced to three years in prison; CLANCY to four years in prison and \$5,000 fine; and KASTNER to three years in prison and \$2,000 fine. Of the trio, only PRINDABLE elected to start serving his penitentiary sentence.

The United States Supreme Court granted a petition for a hearing in connection with these convictions during June, 1960, after United States Appellate Court upheld their conviction.

On May 25, 1959, GORDON FOSTER,

ROBERT SHEER, and THOMAS J. JACKSON

were found guilty in United States District Court, East St.

Louis, Illinois, for violation of internal revenue laws

and for furnishing false information to internal revenue

agents. These individuals previously operated the B&F

Distributing Company, a racing newswire service in East St.

Louis. As a result of the conviction, FOSTER and SHEER

were sentenced to five years in prison and fined \$5,000,

while JACKSON was sentenced to one year in prison and placed
on probation for five years.

During June, 1960, the United States Circuit Court of Appeals reversed the conviction of these three persons and ordered a retrial. The reversal was based on the refusal of United States District Judge GEORGE H. MOORE to permit Defense Attorneys to inspect reports of internal revenue service agents.

Subsequent to the reversal, FOSTER, SHEER, and JACKSON were permitted to enter pleas of guilty in United States District Court, East St. Louis, Illinois, to a reduced charge of conspiracy to evade payment of gambling taxes which is a

misdemeanor rather than a felony for which they were originally tried. This action was taken to avoid another lengthy trial.

On July 10, 1959, GEORGE STOFFEY was found guilty in United States District Court, East St. Louis, Illinois, for violating wagering laws and making false statements to internal revenue agents. His indictment was an outgrowth of the investigation of WORTMAN by the internal revenue service and the Federal Grand Jury, Eastern District of Illinois. STOFFEY was sentenced to five years and a \$5,000 fine, and after conviction filed an appeal.

On May 12, 1959, JOSEPH W. "JOE" JANKO was convicted in United States District Court for income tax evasion. This was the second trial in this matter, the previous conviction having been set aside on appeal.

On June 5, 1959, JANKO was sentenced to ten years in prison.

During July, 1960, the ten-year prison sentence was reduced by the United States Court of Appeals in St. Louis to a term of four years. It is noted that JANKO has for years been a doorman and parking lot attendant at East St. Louis area gambling cassinos controlled by WORTMAN.

Mr. JOHN J. BURKE and his wife ROSE were convicted in United States District Court, St. Louis, Missouri, for income tax evasion. On July 31, 1959, BURKE was sentenced to four years in prison and fined \$15,500. His wife was sentenced to two years and fined \$2,500. The indictment of the BURKEs was a result of internal revenue service investigation in connection with WORTMAN. BURKE was the president of the Chicago-St. Louis Express Company, and the indictment charged evasion of \$26,000 in income taxes for the years 1951 through 1954.

During the BURKE trial, it was brought out in evidence that FRANK WORTMAN had furnished \$53,000 for the operation of the Chicago-St. Louis Express Company; that this money was given to GEORGE FRANK, an officer of the company.

During the trial, BURKE denied knowing the WORTMANS or DOWLING but evidence indicated that DOWLING went to Washington, D. C. on the same plane with BURKE several years before and that his expenses and plane ticket were paid for by the Express Company.

United States District Judge GEORGE MOORE who tried this case was very interested in the evidence and indicated that there would be possibly perjury action against some of the witnesses, including GEORGE FRANK who has been a well known WORTMAN auditor, bookkeeper, and tax consultant.

The evidence at the trial indicated that STEPHAN GORMAN of Gorman Britk-laying Company actually owned the Chicago-St. Louis Express Company in St. Louis, Missouri.

During June, 1960, the United States Circuit Court of Appeals reversed the conviction of Mr. and Mrs. BURKE on the grounds that Judge MOORE had erred by denying defense request for permission to inspect report of internal revenue service agents.

On October 1, 1959, SAM GEORGE MAGIN was found guilty by a jury in United States District Court, East St. Louis, Illinois, on two counts of an indictment charging him with three counts of perjury.

During the course of MAGIN's trial, FRANK WORTMAN, ELMER DOWLING, EDWARD J. HARE, and CLAUS E. TIETJE were called as witnesses for the prosecution and all took the fifth amendment.

he was cited for contempt of court by United States District Judge WILLIAM G. JUERGENS and received a six-month sentence on this charge.

Subsequently, this conviction and sentence was reversed on appeal and TIETJE was ordered released.

During the course of MAGIN's trial, extensive publicity was given the matter, and information concem ing WORTMAN and his associates' incomes from gambling activities was publicized. These newspaper articles reflected that from 1951 to 1953 FRANK WORTMAN reported an income of \$81,000 from an illegal gambling enterprise, including five dice games, and one policy operation.

SAN WAGIN was released on \$10,000 bond pending appeal of his conviction.

During June, 1960, United States Circuit Court of Appeals in Chicago affirmed MAGIN's conviction.

In early September, 1960, MAGIN filed an appeal with the United States Supreme Court at Washington, D. C., which has not been acted on to date.



On January 11, 1960, the Federal Grand Jury at East St. Louis returned an indictment naming FRANK WORTMAN, DOWLING, SAN MAGIN, GREGORY "RED" MOORE, GEORGE FRANK, and EDWARD "TED" WORTMAN. All six defendants were charged with violations of the internal revenue law.

All six defendants were released on substantial bonds. FRANK WORTMAN and DOWLING's bonds were set at \$30,000, MAGIN's at \$20,000, and the remainder at \$10,000 each.

The indictment of WORTMAN and his associates was followed by numerous motions on behalf of each of the defendants.

As a result of some of these motions, United States
Federal Judge JUERGENS granted venue changes to SAM MAGIN
and ELMER DOWLING, noting that they reside in Madison County
located in the Southern District of Illinois and will, therefore,
be tried in the Southern District rather than the Eastern District.
Apparently FRANK WORTMAN and EDWARD WORTMAN will be the only
two tried in East St. Louis since both reside in St. Clair County.
The other two defendants, MOORE and FRANK, both reside in St. Louis,
Missouri, and will be tried in the Southern District of Missouri.
These venue changes came about under a rather recen: Federal
law providing that persons indicted under the mail fraud act
for income tax evasion should be tried in their own district.

To date, no trial date has been set in connection with any of these trials and the court still has under consideration a number of motions made by defense counsel.


The Chicago Office, by communications dated October 27, 15 and 17, 1960, entitled ACTIVITIES OF TOP HOODLUMS IN THE CHICAGO AREA - ANTI-RACKETEERING, advised of

contacts of FRANK WORTHAN in the Chicago area and further identified individuals with whom the WORTMAN organization has done and
at present does business. Information was also furnished concerning political figures and political ramifications in the East St.
Louis and St. Louis areas insofar as the operations of the hoodlums
were concerned and, in particular, the WORTMAN organization.

It is noted that, from information furnished by Chicago, it is apparent FRANK "BUSTER" WORTMAN is obviously close to certain Chicago top hoodlums and maintains contact with them to discuss matters of mutual or similar interest in both legitimate and illegitimate operations.

It is pointed out that close coordination is being maintained by agents of the Springfield Division in the East St. Louis area working top hoodlum matters with agents of the St. Louis Office handling similar investigations, because the WORTMAN organization operates over the entire metropolitan St. Louis area, including the Illinois side of the Mississippi River covered by Springfield, as well as the Missouri side of the River covered by St. Louis. Investigation establishes there is constant traffic movement, contacts and operations of the WORTMAN organization on a daily and continuing basis on both sides of the River.



On October 7, 1960, the Evening Journal of East St. Louis, Illinois carried a news article that FRANK WORTMAN was again in court regarding a petition of the State Circuit Court of St. Clair County for the right to transfer the trusteeship of his four children's estate from his ex-wife DOROTHY to his brother, EDWARD "TED" WORTMAN. The news article stated that Circuit Judge QUINTON SPIVEY, through Circuit Clerk FRANK L. "RED" BAUER, told newsmen that WORTMAN's appearance in the courthouse "didn't amount to anything and nothing had been filed."

On October 31, 1960, the Belleville, Illinois News Democrat contained a news article entitled *SPIVEY Rules for WORTMAN in Trust Dispute". This article states that Judge SPITET ordered WORTHAN's brother to have the trusteeship for his four children changed from his former wife to his brother EDWARD "TED" WORTHAM. The trust is valued at more than \$90,000 and that, after hearing the arguments, the Judge set aside the default decree of June 16, 1960 and that nothing would be accomplished by opening up the matter and allowing Mrs. JENKINS to plead. WORTHAN's children were recorded as SUSAN, age 16, WILLIAM, age 13, WADONNA, age 10 and EDWARD, age 6. According to WORTNAM's attorneys who filed the suit to change the trusteeship, it was done not because his wife had remarried but because she had moved from the state where the true assets are out of the jurisdiction of the court where the trust estate is located. The article further reflected DOROTHY WORTMAN JENKINS married ROBERT J. JENKINS, a tool engineer, August 12, 1960 and lives in St. Louis, Missouri. In an affidavit, Mrs. JENKINS stated that since July 1960 FRANK WORTMAN had refused to contribute to the support of three of the children who reside with her and that the fourth, WILLIAM, lived with FRANK WORTMAN.



On November 2, 1960, Special Agent reviewed the records of the Circuit Court of St. Clair County, verifying information as set out above. The records show that DOROTHY WORTMAN, on June 25, 1952, was made trustee for a trust filed by WORTMAN for his four children, giving full power concerning property and monies involved; she was to distribute the corpus of the trust twenty-one years after WORTMAN's death to his and her children aforementioned, each to have an equal share. A complaint wanting a writ of injunction from the court to restrain DOROTHY WORTHAM JENKINS from disposing of or spending any monies described in the trust was filed on July 27, 1960. The records further revealed that, on July 29, 1960, an agent of WORTHAN appeared at the residence of DOROTHY WORTHAN and demanded entrance, which she refused. Later on the same day, FRANK WORTMAN and the agent returned and threatened her. It was stated that FRANK WORTHAN was under the influence of alcohol at the time. An order was issued by the St. Clair Circuit Court on September 16, 1960, ordering an attorney, ROBERT RUTLEDGE, of East St. Louis as guardian to represent the children. According to the Circuit Court records, DOROTHI WORTHAN JENKINS now resides at 374A Louisiana Avenue, St. Louis, Missouri with her husband ROBERT. According to the Court records, attorneys for WORTMAN were R. B. HENDRICKS and his partner, ROBERT RUTLEDGE, of East Attorney for DOROTHY WORTHAN JENKINS was BURTON C. St. Louis. In the complaint, WORTMAN charged BERNARD of East St. Louis. that his ex-wife DOROTHY had abandoned the house at Collinsville taking the furniture and children with her and further charged she withdrew the trust funds from a Collinsville bank. The property on Summit Drive in Collinaville was valued at \$77,000 and adjoining property at \$15,750. The St. Clair Circuit Court file number concerning this matter is 60-10414.

B. CRIMINAL RECORD AND CRIMINAL HISTORY

There is nothing further to report concerning the above at this time.

According to the files of the Springfield Office, BECKMAN has FBI Number 4702429 and was convicted of burglary in St. Louis, Missouri in 1958 and sentenced to two years in the Missouri State Prison, being released in 1960. Immediately on release, he started working for the WORTMAN organization. When convicted in St. Louis, co-defendants with him were MELVIN IN VENIONO of St. Louis, a former organizer of the Teamster's Union, and KENNY ALLEN, a well known St. Louis and East St. Louis hoodlum. In 1942, BECKMAN was investigated by the St. Louis and Springfield Offices in connection with the theft and interstate transportation of a 1936 Ford automobile. He was subsequently prosecuted

by local authorities in St. Louis and committed to the Belefontaine Farm, a Missouri Reformatory penal institution, as he was a juvenile at the time. BECINAR, in 1956, was employed at the Paddock Lounge, a WORTMAN organization nightclub and tavern, and worked at the old Terrace Lounge, another former WORTMAN establishment.

PECRNAN is observed by agents frequenting the moat property of FRANK WORTMAN, usually around noontime daily, and then he proceeds directly to the Checker Inn agabling establishment





Agents have observed that the bingo games are played each Sunday, Tuesday and Thursday nights and that special busses are used to bring customers to the game. The old location at the old Southern Inn Nightolub could seat approximately 500 people. Observations determined that on October 1, 1960 the operations were moved to a large metal warehouse building at 6503 St. Clair Avenue and from observation by Special Agent this place had seating arrangements for approximately 700 people. The building had been remodeled and heating equipment and furniture had been added to the location. A large sign appears on the cyclone fence around the building indicating it is the location of the VFW Post 6372. On the night of November 1, 1960, Special Agents observed approximately 500 people playing oingo, and four special busses were in the parking area.








F. PLACES OF ANUSEMENT AND HANGOUTS

There is nothing further to add under this section; however, it is noted that, as previously set out in this report, FRANK WORTMAN now spends most of his time at his moat residence, RFD, Collinsville, Illinois and has established an office at this location, where he has personal contact with various lieutenants and associates. The Paddock Lounge in East St. Louis still continues to be a meeting place and hangout of various members of the WORTMAN organization as agents observed known members of the gang moving in and out of the Paddock Lounge each day. The Paddock literally stays open 24 hours a day, and there is constant traffic in and out of this location.

G. TRAVEL

The Chicago Office advised on October 26, 1960 that FRANK WORTMAN was known to have been in Chicago on that date and, in the afternoon, left by GM&O Railroad to return to the St. Louis or East St. Louis area.



I. LEGAL ACTIONS

On November 6, 1960, the Sunday Journal of East St.

Louis, Illinois contained a news article reflecting that the preliminaries insefar as the WORTHAN organisation were concerned were ended and that they now faced federal court trials. According to this article, EDWARD "TED" WORTHAN, ELMER SYLVESTER DOWLING, SAM GEORGE MAGIN, GREGORY "RED" MOORE and GEORGE FRANK, as well as FRANK "BUSTER" WORTHAN had all of their motions overruled seeking dismissal or nullification of indictments; further, that one defense motion sustained by the court provides that MOORE will be tried in St. Louis, Mis souri wherein venue lies and that DOWLING will be tried in the Southern District of Illinois at Springfield.



The press alleges that he is the major racketeer in the metropolitan St. Louis area which also covers the St. Clair County, Illinois area on the east side of the Mississippi River.


